### TOP STORYLINES

- For the first time in two years, Georgia Tech renews its rivalry with Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division foe Virginia Tech on Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech only met once prior to the Hokies joining the ACC in 2004 but squared off for 16-straight seasons from 2004-19 before last year's matchup was not part of the teams' reconfigured schedules due to Covid-19.
- Most notably, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech have combined to win 10-of-15 ACC Coastal Division championships (GT - four; VT - six) since the conference went to a two-division format in 2005 (2005-19 — there were no divisions in 2020 due to Covid-19).
- Georgia Tech has alternated wins and losses in its seven games this season. The Yellow Jackets are one of only three NCAA Division I FBS teams that have not won or lost consecutive games this season (Boise State - 3-4 and Northwestern - 3-4 are the others).
- The Yellow Jackets are coming off a hard-fought 48-40 defeat at Virginia (6-2, -2 ACC) last Saturday. The Jackets trailed 48-27 with less than four minutes to play but, thanks in large part to back-to-back successful onside kicks by ACC Specialist of the Week **Jude Kelley**, they pulled within eight points with less than 30 seconds to go and had the ball at the UVA 31 yard line when the potential game-tying touch-down pass was batted down in the end zone as time expired.
- Georgia Tech Fr. QB **Jeff Sims** threw for three touchdown passes in last Saturday's defeat at Virginia, marking the third time in only 15 career games that he has thrown for at least three touchdowns. He is just the fourth Yellow Jackets QB since 2000 to throw for at least three touchdowns in a game as many as three times.

**GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS**

# 4

Georgia Tech is coming off a stretch in which it faced four-straight opponents that currently rank in the top 15 nationally in total offense — North Carolina - 15th, Pitt - fifth, Duke - 14th and Virginia - fourth). The Yellow Jackets went 2-2 in those three games.

# 6.9

Georgia Tech is averaging 6.9 yards per play over the past three games (Oct. 2 vs. Pitt, Oct. 9 at Duke, Oct. 23 vs. Virginia), which is tied for 11th nationally over that span.

# 13

Georgia Tech's roster includes just 13 seniors eligibility-wise, which is the fourth-fewest among all Power Five-conference teams (Colorado - 6, Oregon - 8, Utah - 11).

# 13

One of college football's most dangerous weapons with the ball in his hands, Georgia Tech Fr. RB **Jahmyr Gibbs** ranks 13th nationally in all-purpose yardage with 141.7 yards per game.

# 14

Georgia Tech continues to be one of college football's most disciplined teams this season, as it ranks 14th nationally in penalty yards per game (40.4). That's nearly a 50% improvement from last season, when the Yellow Jackets ranked 119th out of 127 NCAA Division I FBS teams with 74.9 penalty yards per game.

Eighteen Georgia Tech football student-athletes have already achieved the goal of earning a bachelor's degree.

Seventy-four of the 123 student-athletes on Georgia Tech's 2021 roster are freshmen, eligibility-wise. The roster also includes 22 sophomores, 14 juniors and 13 seniors.

Last Saturday at Virginia, Georgia Tech set season highs with 570 yards of total offense (prev.: 440 at Duke, Oct. 9), 7.3 yards per play (prev. 7.0 vs. Kennesaw State, Sept. 11), 7.9 yards per rush (prev.: 6.1 vs. North Carolina, Sept. 25) and 28 first downs (prev.: 25 vs. NIU).

**A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...**

- even its record at 4-4 overall and 3-3 in ACC play;
- continue the Yellow Jackets' pattern of not having any consecutive wins or losses this season;
- give the Jackets their most wins in a season under third-year head coach **Geoff Collins** with four regular-season games still to play;
- be its fourth win in its last five meetings with Virginia Tech and fifth win in its last seven matchups with the Hokies;
- move it to 8-10 all-time versus Virginia Tech;
- be its first homecoming win since a 38-24 victory over Wake Forest on Oct. 21, 2017, snapping the Yellow Jackets two-game losing streak in homecoming games (there was no official homecoming contest in 2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic);
- up it to 54-17-1 all-time in homecoming games (dating back to 1949).

**A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...**

- drop it to 3-5 overall and 2-4 in ACC play;
- give it consecutive losses for the first time this season;
- be only its second loss in its last five meetings with Virginia Tech and its third loss in the past seven matchups with the Hokies;
- drop it to 7-11 all-time versus Virginia Tech;
- be its third-straight homecoming defeat;
- drop it to 53-18-1 all-time in homecoming games.

## GEORGIA TECH THIRD-YEAR HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, is in his third season as Georgia Tech football's head coach. He was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018.

Despite the challenges associated with overhauling Georgia Tech's football culture, including installing a pro-style spread offensive attack after 11 years of option football at Tech, as well as the unprecedented and unexpected obstacles presented by the Covid-19 pandemic, Collins' two-year tenure as the Yellow Jackets' head coach has been marked by a bevy of accomplishments. They include:

- Back-to-back nationally lauded recruiting classes. Collins' first full recruiting class at Georgia Tech in 2020 was ranked No. 24 nationally by *Rivals*, then re-ranked No. 8 nationally by *Bleacher Report* during the '20 season based on the impressive play of Tech's newcomers, which included three true-freshman starters on offense: RB Jahmyr Gibbs (who earned freshman all-America recognition from The Athletic), QB Jeff Sims and RT Jordan Williams. It was only the second top-25 recruiting class in Georgia Tech history, and the first since 2007, a class that was compiled when Collins served as the Yellow Jackets' director of player personnel. His second recruiting class at Tech in 2021 is also a top-20 class when including the rankings of eight highly ranked transfers, six of which have multiple seasons of eligibility remaining. In all, Georgia Tech has added 18 four- or five-star recruits and 13 of the 45 highest-ranked recruits in program history (according to *247Sports*) since the arrival of Collins and his staff in January 2019.

- The development of three NFL Draft picks in two seasons — TE Tyler Davis (2020), WR Jalen Camp (2021) and P Pressley Harvin III (2021). Davis, who was recruited by Collins to come to The Flats as a graduate transfer in 2019, became Georgia Tech's first NFL Draft pick at any position in three years, the first non-specialist to be drafted from Tech in four years, the first Yellow Jacket tight end to be selected in 28 years and, as a sixth-round pick, the highest selection ever for a GT tight end in the NFL Draft. When Camp and Harvin were both selected in 2021, it marked the first time that Tech had multiple picks in the same NFL Draft since 2016.

- Harvin winning the 2020 Ray Guy Award as college football's top punter. Under Collins' tutelage, Harvin became the first Yellow Jacket to win one of college football's major individual awards since Durant Brooks won the Guy Award in 2007 and only the third unanimous All-American in Georgia Tech history, joining Calvin Johnson (2006) and Ken Swilling (1990)

- Memorable victories, including a 28-21 overtime win at Miami in 2019 (Tech's first-ever win over the Hurricanes at Miami's Hard Rock Stadium), a thrilling 16-13 come-from-behind triumph at Florida State to open the 2020 season (the Yellow Jackets' first season-opening true road win since 2007) and a perfect record in nationally televised primetime contests — a 28-26 win over NC State in 2019 and a 46-27 victory over Louisville in 2020.

Prior to taking the reins at Georgia Tech, Collins put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in Temple's 121-year football history. Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th — 2013) and scoring defense (23rd — 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU — 2010, Mississippi State — 2014 and Florida — 2015).

Collins' coaching career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three-consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins has also served on the staffs at Western Carolina (student assistant — 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach — 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach — 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator — 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel — 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator — 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City. Under Collins, Tech became only

the second college football program in the nation to partner with renowned creative agency J1S and the first program in the nation to enter into a partnership with best-selling author and branding consultant Jeremy Darlow. Collins' focus on giving his student-athletes the resources and tools to assist in building their personal brand is a main reason that Georgia Tech is widely expected to be a place where student-athletes can maximize opportunities in the name, image and likeness era.

Collins' innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts have not only helped Georgia Tech land the two highest-rated recruiting classes in school history, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 50, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (5).

**GEORGIA TECH-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES HISTORY**

• Saturday's meeting is the 18th all-time between Virginia Tech and Georgia Tech. VT leads the all-time series, 10-7, including a 6-3 advantage in games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

• The series dates back to 1990, when Georgia Tech topped Virginia Tech in a 6-3 nailbiter on Nov. 10 at Bobby Dodd Stadium. One week after GT kicker Scott Sisson kicked a 37-yard field goal with seven seconds remaining to top No. 1 Virginia, 41-38, Sisson made a 38-yarder with eight seconds to go to lift the Yellow Jackets to the non-conference win over VT. The Jackets would go on to finish 11-0-1 and win their fourth national championship.

• Ironically, the 30th anniversary of the Yellow Jackets' 1990 national title will be celebrated during Saturday's game, with the team being recognized at halftime. The 30th anniversary celebration was delayed one year due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

• From 2004 (Virginia Tech's first season in the ACC) through 2019, Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech played each other every season for 16-straight years. The annual series was interrupted in 2020 due to the ACC's reconfigured schedule caused by Covid-19.

• Georgia Tech won three-straight versus Virginia Tech from 2016-18 (30-20 in 2016, 28-22 in 2017 and 49-28 last season), which was good for its longest winning streak in the series. Prior to the three-game winning streak against the Hokies, Georgia Tech had never won consecutive games against VT.

• Virginia Tech snapped Georgia Tech's three-game winning streak in the series with a 45-0 win in Atlanta in 2019 (Nov. 16).

• Despite the defeat in 2019, Georgia Tech has still won three of the last four and four of the last six games in the series.

• Prior to winning four of the last six games in the series, Georgia Tech was just 3-8 all-time against Virginia Tech.

• Nailbiters have been a staple of the Georgia Tech-Virginia Tech series. Twelve of the 16 games between the schools have been decided by 11 points or less, nine have been decided by seven points or less and four have been decided by three points or less.

• Georgia Tech is 6-3 against VT on Saturdays and 1-7 on weeknights.

• In 15 seasons since the ACC began divisional play in 2005 (not counting 2020, when the conference did not split into divisions due to Covid-19), either Virginia Tech or Georgia Tech has won the Coastal Division 10 times (VT — 2005, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2011 and 2016; GT — 2006, 2009, 2012 and 2014).

**HOMECOMING AT GEORGIA TECH**

• Saturday marks Georgia Tech's 72nd homecoming game. The Institute began celebrating homecoming in 1949.

• Last season was Tech's first season without a homecoming contest since 1949, as homecoming festivities were canceled due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

• Georgia Tech is an impressive 53-17-1 all-time in homecoming contests.

• For the first time since 1994-95 and only the seventh time since homecoming began at Tech in 1949, the Yellow Jackets have lost consecutive homecoming games (28-14 vs. Duke in 2018, 20-10 vs. Pitt in 2019).

• Despite the consecutive defeats, the Yellow Jackets have won five of the last seven, eight of the last 11 and 20 of their last 24 homecoming games.

• The Jackets are looking to avoid only the second three-game homecoming losing skid in school history (Tech lost three-straight homecoming games from 1980-82).

• Virginia Tech is Georgia Tech's homecoming opponent for only the second time. On Oct. 17, 2009, the Yellow Jackets topped the Hokies, 28-23, in GT's homecoming game.

**OFFENSE**

• For the majority of observers, the most noticeable change when head coach **Geoff Collins** took the reins at Georgia Tech prior to the 2019 season was the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.

• Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave Patenaude**. Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins for two seasons at Temple (2017-18). With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).

• For the third-straight game, Georgia Tech set a season high for total yardage with a whopping 570 yards in last Saturday's 48-40 defeat at Virginia.

• Georgia Tech's season-high 570-yard performance at Virginia marked the fifth time in seven games this season that the Yellow Jackets have surpassed the 400-yard plateau in total offense. Last season, the Yellow Jackets had six 400-yard performances in 10 games. Prior to the beginning of the 2020 season, the Jackets had gone 16 games without compiling 400 yards of total offense (dating back to Nov. 3, 2018).

• Tech's 570 yards at Virginia were its most in three seasons under Collins and the Jackets' highest total since they had 602 yards in a 49-38 loss at USF on Sept. 8, 2018.

• In addition to the 570 yards of total offense (prev. season high: 440 at Duke, Oct. 9), Georgia Tech also set season highs with 7.3 yards per play (prev. 7.0 vs. Kennesaw State, Sept. 11), 7.9 yards per rush (prev.: 6.1 vs. North Carolina, Sept. 25) and 28 first downs (prev.: 25 vs. NIU) last Saturday at UVA.

• The Yellow Jackets' 7.9 yards per carry at UVA was their highest yard-per-rush average in three seasons under Collins. Tech is 3-1 in games it averages at least 6.1 yards per rush since Collins took the helm (2021 vs. UVA - 7.9; 2021 vs. UNC - 6.1; 2020 vs. Duke - 7.9; 2019 vs. NC State - 6.2).

• The Yellow Jackets' 270 rushing yards at Virginia were just one yard shy of their season-high 271 (vs. Northern Illinois, Sept. 4) and marked the seventh time since Collins took the helm at Georgia Tech in 2019 that the Yellow Jackets have rushed for at least 260 yards, which is good for second-most in the Atlantic Coast Conference since the beginning of the '19 season (Boston College - 8; **Georgia Tech - 7**; North Carolina - 6, Clemson - 6, Syracuse - 6; Virginia Tech - 6).

• Georgia Tech's 28 first downs at UVA were its most in three seasons under Collins and its most in a game since it had a school-record 35 at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2018.

• Georgia Tech also set a season high with 27 pass completions against Virginia. The 27 completions are tied for Tech's most completions in a game since 2002.

• In all, 15 of the Yellow Jackets' 22 highest completion totals since the beginning of the 2002 season have come in their last 28 games.

• On Oct. 9 at Duke, Georgia Tech scored the game-winning touchdown on a 36-yard pass from **Jeff Sims** to **Adonias Sanders** with 51 seconds left in the game. It marked the first time that the Yellow Jackets scored a go-ahead, game-winning touchdown with less than a minute to go in regulation for the first time since Dedrick Mills' 4-yard touchdown run with 35 seconds left in a 17-14 win over Boston College on Sept. 3, 2016 in Dublin, Ireland.

• In the thrilling win at Duke, Tech got the ball back on its own 12 with 1:42 to go and no timeouts remaining, trailing 27-24. The Yellow Jackets needed only 51 seconds to march 88 yards in six plays for the winning score.

• On Oct. 2, Georgia Tech passed for 359 yards against Pitt, which was the Yellow Jackets' most passing yards in a game since they threw for 365 against Western Carolina on Sept. 1, 2011 and their most against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since they had a school-record 486 passing yards at Virginia on Nov. 10, 2001.

• The Yellow Jackets' 359 passing yards against Pitt rank 10th in Georgia Tech history.

• Georgia Tech amassed 313 of its 394 total yards and scored 32 of its 45 points in the second half of its 45-22 victory over No. 21/20 North Carolina (Sept. 25).

• Tech's 17-play, 97-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter against Northern Illinois matched the 11th-longest scoring drive by yards in program history (longest since a 99-yard TD drive at Pitt on Sept. 15, 2018) and the 21st-longest scoring drive by plays in program history (longest since a 17-play field goal drive and 18-play TD drive vs. North Carolina on Sept. 30, 2017).

• Georgia Tech was one of only six NCAA Division I FBS teams with three players that rushed for at least 350 yards through 10 games last season — QB **Jeff Sims** (492), RB **Jahmyr Gibbs** (460) and RB **Jordan Mason** (352). The other teams on the list were Appalachian State, Coastal Carolina, Florida State, Kentucky and Nebraska.

• Through seven games this season, Tech is on pace to have four players eclipse 400 yards rushing — Sims (64.0 ypg), Gibbs (58.7 ypg), **Dontae Smith** (35.6 ypg) and Mason (34.0 ypg). Sims and Gibbs are both on pace to surpass 500 rushing yards each.

• After ranking 125th out of 127 teams nationally last season with 25 turnovers (2.5 per game), Georgia Tech has improved to 46th nationally (fifth in the ACC) with just eight turnovers through seven games this season (1.1 per game).

• Since the beginning of last season, Georgia Tech has had an average of 1.3 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged 2.2 turnovers per game in losses.

**OFFENSE**

- According to a formula developed by ESPN, Georgia Tech returned 84% of its offensive production from 2020 in 2021, which ranked 21st nationally.

- Statistically, Georgia Tech returned 96% of its passing yards, 98% of its rushing yards, 69% of its receiving yards and 85% of its scoring from a season ago in 2021.

**QUARTERBACKS**

- After taking the college football world by storm as a true freshman last season, quarterback **Jeff Sims** missed what basically amounted to three full games this season due to an injury sustained in the first half of the season opener versus Northern Illinois (Sept. 4).

- Sims missed the next two full games while recovering from the injury — vs. Kennesaw State (Sept. 11) and at Clemson (Sept. 18).

- Sims returned to game action late in the first half versus No. 21/20 North Carolina (Sept. 25) and in just over a half of play, accounted for 240 yards of total offense and four touchdowns to help lead Tech to a 45-22 win.

- When Sims entered the game versus UNC, Tech trailed 7-6 with 3:23 to go in the first half. Sims led the Yellow Jackets to scores on six of their remaining seven possessions (five touchdowns and one field goal - kneel-downs at the end of each half notwithstanding).

- Sims was especially impressive in the running game against North Carolina, amassing 128 yards and scoring three touchdowns (11, 1 and 50 yards) on just 10 carries (12.8 avg.).

- In the passing game, Sims was an ultra-efficient 10-of-13 for 112 yards and a touchdown against the Tar Heels.

- Despite only playing a little more than a half against UNC, Sims set career highs for rushing yards (128), rushing touchdowns (3) and touchdowns responsible for (4).

- Sims' 174.68 pass-efficiency rating against North Carolina was the second-highest of his career, behind only the 183.41 rating he compiled in last season's 46-27 home win over Louisville.

- Sims' .769 completion percentage against UNC is tied for the 14th-best single-game completion percentage in Georgia Tech history (min. 10 attempts).

- The .769 completion percentage was the highest by a Yellow Jacket (min. 10 attempts) since Joshua Nesbitt completed 78.6% of his passes (11-of-14) against Mississippi State on Oct. 3, 2009.

- Sims is one of only three NCAA Division I FBS student-athletes this season (and one of only two from a Power Five conference) to run for 100 yards, pass for 100 yards, score at least three rushing touchdowns and throw for at least one touchdown in a game.

- In recognition of his performance versus North Carolina, Sims was named to both the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 and Manning Award Stars of the Week lists. Both recognize the top eight performances by college quarterbacks each week.

- The O'Brien and Manning Award weekly honors were the second of Sims' career. He also earned both recognitions after leading Georgia Tech to a 16-13 win at Florida State in his first collegiate game on Sept. 12 of last season.

- Sims put together one of the most prolific passing performances in school history versus Pitt (Oct. 2), completing 24-of-33 passes for 359 yards and two touchdowns. His 24 completions and 359 passing yards were both career highs, while his .727 completion percentage and two touchdown passes both rank second in his collegiate career.

- Sims' 359 passing yards against Pitt were the eighth-most by an individual in Georgia Tech history, and the most by a Yellow Jacket since George Godsey threw for a school-record 486 yards against Virginia on Nov. 10, 2001.

- Last Saturday at Virginia, Sims also moved into Georgia Tech's all-time top 10 for single-game completions, as his 27 completions against UVA were the fifth-most in Tech history.

- Despite missing what basically amounted to three full games earlier this season, Sims still ranks No. 1 nationally in rushing yards (320), No. 2 in yards per rush (6.7) and No. 5 in pass-efficiency rating (151.9) among quarterbacks that are freshmen eligibility-wise in 2021.

- Last season, Sims ranked sixth and eighth, respectively, among all freshmen nationally in 2020 in touchdown passes (13) and passing yards (1,881).

- Sims' 1,881 passing yards last season were the most by a Georgia Tech quarterback through just 10 games since George Godsey had 2,631 yards through 10 games in 2001.

- Since 2000, Sims, Godsey and A.J. Suggs are the only Tech QBs to throw thrown for at least 1,800 yards through 10 games of a season (Sims: 1,881 - 2020; Suggs: 1,844 - 2002; Godsey: 2,684 - 2000 and 2,631 - 2001).



**OFFENSE**

• In addition to leading Georgia Tech in all passing categories last season, Sims also led the Yellow Jackets in rushing yards (492) and rushing touchdowns (6).

• Sims was one of only 10 NCAA Division I FBS players and the only freshman (true or redshirt) with 100 rushing yards and three touchdown passes in a game last season, a feat he accomplished against Duke (Nov. 28).

• Sims had at least 240 passing yards and 60 rushing yards three times last season (Sept. 12 at Florida State, Sept. 19 vs. UCF and Oct. 9 vs. Louisville). It was an accomplishment that was only achieved 42 times in NCAA Division I FBS over the course of the 2020 season. Sims was one of only two players from a Power Five conference to do it three times, one of only 11 players to do it multiple times and the only true freshman that did it even once.

• Last season, Sims became only the third Yellow Jacket to ever be named ACC Rookie of the Week as many as three times and the fifth to earn the honor multiple times.

• After Sims left the 2021 season opener versus Northern Illinois (Sept. 4) due to injury, redshirt freshman **Jordan Yates** saw the first significant action of his collegiate career.

• Yates responded in a big way, completing 12-of-18 passes for 135 yards and a touchdown and running nine times for 27 yards and another score (all career highs) against NIU. He nearly led the Yellow Jackets to victory after entering the game facing a 14-0 deficit in the second quarter.

• Yates led Georgia Tech to three touchdowns in his eight possessions at the helm against NIU, including a 17-play, 97-yard touchdown drive in his first series behind center.

• Yates was even more impressive the following week in his first-career start versus Kennesaw State (Sept. 11), completing 17-of-23 passes (.739) without an interception for a career-high 254 yards and four touchdowns.

• Yates' four touchdown passes against KSU are tied for the third-most in Georgia Tech history and were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Justin Thomas also threw for four TDs against Georgia Southern on Sept. 13, 2014.

• For his career, Yates has seen action in 10 games (two as a true freshman in 2019, three in 2020 and all five this season) and completed 60-of-101 passes (.594) for 667 yards and five touchdowns. He has also run for a score.

• Georgia Tech added another reserve quarterback in the offseason in **Trad Beatty**, a graduate transfer from Temple. Beatty, who was recruited to Temple by Collins in 2018, played in five games over three seasons with the Owls (2018-20), including starts versus Tulane and No. 18 SMU in 2020.

**RUNNING BACKS**

• Joining Sims in taking the college football world by storm as a true freshman in 2020 was running back **Jahmyr Gibbs**.

• Through seven games this season, Gibbs leads Georgia Tech in rushing yards (411), kickoff return average (23.7 ypr - second in ACC/26th nationally) and all-purpose yards (141.7 ypg - third in ACC/13th nationally).

• Gibbs eclipsed the 100-yard mark for all-purpose yards for the fifth time in seven games this season when he registered 151 all-purpose (132 rushing, 19 receiving) last Saturday at Virginia.

• Gibbs' 132 rushing yards last Saturday at UVA were a career high (prev.: 105 at Syracuse, Sept. 26, 2020).

• Gibbs' 132-yard rushing performance against Virginia was highlighted by a 71-yard touchdown run early in the second half. The 71-yard TD run was the longest rush by a Yellow Jacket since QB TaQuon Marshall had a 78-yard touchdown run at Virginia on Nov. 4, 2017.

• Gibbs has had a 70-yard play from scrimmage in each of Georgia Tech's last three games. In addition to last week's 71-yard touchdown run at UVA, he had a 77-yard touchdown reception the previous game at Duke (Oct. 9). The previous week against Pitt (Oct. 9), he had a 71-yard reception.

• Two games prior to his career-high 132 rushing yards at Virginia, Gibbs had a career-high 125 receiving yards against Pitt (Oct. 2).

• Gibbs' 125 receiving yards against Pitt were the most by a Georgia Tech player since DeAndre Smelter's 132 yards against Wofford on Aug. 30, 2014 and the most by a Yellow Jacket against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Stephen Hill's 151 yards against North Carolina on Sept. 24, 2011.

• Gibbs' 125 receiving yards against Pitt were the most by a Georgia Tech running back in 51 years, since Steve Harkey's 132 yards against South Carolina on Sept. 12, 1970.

• Gibbs' 197 all-purpose yards against Pitt (125 receiving, 82 kick return, -10 rushing) were the second-most of his collegiate career, behind only his 219 all-purpose yards vs. UCF on Sept. 19 of last season.

• In his 2021 debut (and only the eighth game of collegiate career) against Northern Illinois (Sept. 4), Gibbs recorded 178 all-purpose yards — 99 rushing, 17 receiving and 62 on kickoff returns.

• Against Kennesaw State (Sept. 11), Gibbs tallied 142 all-purpose yards — 56 rushing, 44 receiving and 43 on kick returns.

• Gibbs needs just 40 all-purpose yards to reach the 2,000-yard mark for his career.

• If he maintains his current career pace of 140 all-purpose yards per game, Gibbs will move into Georgia Tech's all-time top 20 for all-purpose yards by the end of the regular season (No. 20 Cory Collier amassed 2,514 career all-purpose yards at Tech from 1983-86).

**OFFENSE**

• Despite playing in just six-and-a-half games last season, Gibbs became the first NCAA FBS Division I true freshman this millenium with at least 450 rushing yards, 300 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games of the season.

• Since 2000, Gibbs is one of only seven Power Five players overall with 450 rushing yards/300 receiving yards/200 kickoff return yards in his team's first eight games, joining Reggie Bush (USC - 2004), Marion Grice (Arizona State - 2013), Christian McCaffery (Stanford - 2015), Joe Mixon (Oklahoma - 2016), Saquon Barkley (Penn State - 2017) and Lynn Bowden, Jr. (Kentucky - 2019).

• Last season, Gibbs became the first Georgia Tech player with 450 rushing yards, 300 receiving yards and 200 kickoff return yards in a single-season since Orwin Smith in 2011.

• Twice in his seven games last season, Gibbs had at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards, one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown (Sept. 19 vs. UCF and Oct. 9 vs. Louisville). It was an accomplishment that was only achieved 14 times in NCAA Division I FBS in 2020. Gibbs and Clemson's Travis Etienne were the only Power Five conference players to do it multiple times.

• In last season's collegiate debut against UCF, Gibbs became only the third ACC player since 2000 to compile at least 60 rushing yards, 60 receiving yards and 90 kickoff return yards in a game, joining Duke's Deon Jackson (Oct. 27, 2018 vs. Pitt) and Clemson's C.J. Spiller (Oct. 24, 2009 vs. Miami).

• The second head of Georgia Tech's multi-headed monster at running back is Jr. **Jordan Mason**. Mason ranks fourth on the squad with 238 rushing yards through seven games this season.

• Rounding out perhaps the deepest stable of running backs in all of college football are sophomores **Dontae Smith** and **Jamious Griffin**.

• On just 37 carries this season, Smith has registered 249 yards (6.7 avg.) and four touchdowns.

• Smith's four touchdowns this season give him seven career touchdowns in just 90 carries (one TD every 12.9 carries).

• Smith is averaging a gaudy 6.8 yards per rush for his career (610 yards on 90 carries).

• Smith is currently leading Georgia Tech's running backs in yards per rush (6.7 avg.) for the second-straight season. He led the Yellow Jackets with a 6.9 yards-per-carry average in 2020 (min. 10 carries).

• Head coach **Geoff Collins** has dubbed the Yellow Jackets' top trio of running backs Thunder (Mason), Lightning (Gibbs) and Dynamite (Smith).

• Griffin rushed for 229 yards last season (fourth on the team) and two touchdowns despite playing in only seven games.

**WIDE RECEIVERS**

• Jr. **Malachi Carter** and Sr. **Kyric McGowan** have been an impressive one-two punch at wide receiver for Georgia Tech through seven games this season.

• Carter leads the team in receiving yards (390), is second in receptions (25) and leads all wideouts in yards per reception (15.6 - min. six receptions).

• Carter made one of college football's top catches of the season versus North Carolina (Sept. 25), when he leapt high over a UNC defensive back to haul in a fade pass in the end zone from QB Jeff Sims. Carter made the catch over the defender but, as the defender was riding him out-of-bounds, had the wherewithal to find the end zone with his toe as he fell to the ground for the acrobatic touchdown reception.

• Carter put up one of the best recent performances by a wide receiver by a Georgia Tech receiver in a season opener when he caught six passes for a career-high 92 yards and a touchdown against Northern Illinois (Sept. 4).





**OFFENSE**

• Carter's 92 receiving yards against NIU were the most by a Georgia Tech wide receiver in a season opener since DeAndre Smelter had 132 yards in the 2014 opener against Wofford and the most by a Yellow Jacket wideout in a season opener against an NCAA Division I FBS opponent since Calvin Johnson had 111 yards against Notre Dame in 2006.

• McGowan, a graduate transfer from Northwestern, leads Georgia Tech with six touchdown receptions in six games this season (he missed the Oct. 2 game vs. Pitt due to injury).

• Despite missing a game, McGowan's six touchdown catches are tied for fifth in the ACC and 18th nationally this season.

• McGowan had two touchdown receptions and four total touchdowns (two rushing) in four seasons at Northwestern (2017-20) before his arrival at Georgia Tech as a graduate transfer this season.

• McGowan has two games this season with multiple touchdown receptions (two apiece vs. Kennesaw State - Sept. 4 and at Virginia - last Saturday). Since 2000, he is one of only eight Yellow Jackets to haul in multiple touchdown catches in more than one game.

• In addition to his six touchdown catches this season, McGowan also leads the team with 26 receptions, is second in receiving yards (369) and is third in yards per reception (14.2 - min. six receptions).

• McGowan became only the third Yellow Jacket with three touchdown catches in the first two games of a season since 2000, joining Stephen Hill (3 - 2011) and Calvin Johnson (3 - 2006; 3 - 2004).

• With 91 receiving yards and two touchdowns versus Kennesaw State (Sept. 11), McGowan became the first Yellow Jacket with at least 90 receiving yards and two touchdown catches in a game since Clinton Lynch versus Duke on Oct. 29, 2016.

• R-Jr. **Adonias Sanders** has become one of Georgia Tech's most reliable receivers with 50 receptions for 676 yards over the past 25 contests (beginning with the fifth game of the 2019 campaign vs. North Carolina). Prior to his current 25-game stretch, Sanders had just three receptions for 25 yards over the first two-plus seasons of his collegiate career.

• Sanders made one of the biggest catches by a Georgia Tech wideout in recent memory when he hauled in a 36-yard touchdown reception with 51 seconds remaining in the Yellow Jackets' 31-27 win at Duke (Oct. 9).

• Sanders was the hero of Tech's game-winning six-play, 88-yard touchdown drive in the waning minutes at Duke. In addition to his 36-yard touchdown catch, he also hauled in a 37-yard reception on the third play of the series. In all, he accounted for 73 of the Yellow Jackets' 88 yards on the game-winning drive.

• Fr. **Nate McCollum** had a breakout performance against Pitt (Oct. 9) with three receptions for 49 yards, both career highs.

• Sanders and McCollum accounted for Georgia Tech's two touchdown receptions against Pitt. Sanders' 4-yard touchdown catch was his first of the season and second of his career, while McCollum's 44-yard score was the first of his career.

• True Fr. WR **Malik Rutherford** also had a breakout performance versus Pitt. The 5-9, 138-pounder hauled in the first five receptions of his career for 62 yards against Pitt.

**TIGHT ENDS**

• In 2019, Georgia Tech reintroduced the tight end position to its offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

• The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster that had any collegiate game experience at the position going into the 2019 season was **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn, who wound up catching 17 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown for Tech in '19.

• Davis went on to become the first Georgia Tech tight end selected in the NFL Draft in 28 years (since Tom Covington — San Francisco 49ers, 1992) when the Jacksonville Jaguars took him with their sixth-round pick (No. 206 overall) in the 2020 draft. No Tech tight end has ever been selected higher in the NFL Draft than Davis.

• Davis' departure left Tech with only two tight ends on its roster with any game experience at the position in 2020 — true sophomores **Dylan Deveney** and **Dylan Leonard**.

• For the second-straight season, the injury bug has bit Georgia Tech's tight ends corps in 2021. Most notably, Deveney, who missed four of the Yellow Jackets' first six games this season due to injury, underwent surgery during the Jackets' bye week and will miss the remainder of the season.

• Leonard has also missed a game due to injury (Tech's Oct. 9 win at Duke).

• Due in large part to the missed time for Deveney and Leonard, Tech's tight ends have combined for just seven catches for 30 yards this season.

• Leonard's two receptions last Saturday at Virginia were a career high (prev. 1 - three times).

• One of the best stories on Georgia Tech's roster is Jr. TE **Jack Coco**, who lost 40 pounds in the 2020 offseason to transition from offensive line to tight end. Coco, who caught four passes for 22 yards while playing all 10 games last season, received a scholarship during the 2021 offseason.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

• Georgia Tech's offensive line has paved the way for an offensive resurgence that has seen the Yellow Jackets post the 10 highest yardage totals of the **Geoff Collins** era over the past 15 games.

• The offensive linemen on Georgia Tech's 2021 roster have combined for a whopping 261 collegiate games played and 186 starts.

• The offensive front has paved the way for Georgia Tech to rush for 250-plus yards three times this season — 271 vs. Northern Illinois (Sept. 4), 261 vs. 21/20 North Carolina (Sept. 25) and 270 at Virginia (Oct. 23).

• Tech averaged better than five yards per carry three times this season — vs. NIU (5.3 avg.), vs. UNC (6.1 avg.) and at UVA (7.9 avg.).

• Perhaps no Georgia Tech position group has been besieged by injuries this season like the offensive line. While LT **Devin Cochran**, RG/RT **Ryan Johnson** and C **Mikey Minihan** have all made all seven starts this season, the vast majority of the Yellow Jackets' top seven linemen coming into the season (a group that also includes RT **Jordan Williams**, LG **Kenny Cooper** and reserves **Nick Pendley** and **Kenneth Kirby**) have missed time or played through significant injuries this season.

**DEFENSE**

**TEAM**

• Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past nine seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18) and Georgia Tech.

- Over the past 10 seasons, Collins' defenses have:
  - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
  - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
  - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
  - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
  - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained six times (twice in top 6)
  - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
  - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

• For much of the season, Georgia Tech's defense was one of the top units in the country statistically, as it ranked in the top 35 nationally in seven different statistical categories through four games.

• However, the Yellow Jackets' defense went through perhaps the most challenging stretch in all of college football this season over the past month, as it faced four-straight opponents that are currently ranked among the top 15 nationally in total offense — No. 15 North Carolina, No. 5 Pitt, No. 14 Duke and No. 4 Virginia.

• Thanks in large part to the yeoman's work turned in by the defense, Tech went 2-2 during the gauntlet of four-straight games against top-15 offenses.

• Georgia Tech still ranks among the top 40 nationally this season in fumble recoveries (t-25th - 6), defensive touch-downs (t-27th - 1) and tackles for loss (t-40th - 5.7/gm).

• Prior to ranking among the top 25 nationally in fumble recoveries this season, Collins' and Thacker's aggressive, attacking style of defense was also on display last season, when Georgia Tech finished among the national leaders in fumble recoveries (12 - No. 2 nationally) and turnovers gained (18 - No. 25 nationally) in 2020.

• Since the beginning of 2019 (Collins' first season at Georgia Tech), the Yellow Jackets' 26 fumble recoveries rank fourth nationally.

• Since the beginning of last season, Georgia Tech has forced an average of 3.0 turnovers per game in wins but has averaged just 0.8 takeaways per game in losses.

• Yellow Jackets that record takeaways have the opportunity to sign the "Get The Ball Board" on Georgia Tech's sideline. Introduced by Collins when he was the defensive coordinator at Western Carolina in 2002, the "Get The Ball Board" has evolved from players simply adorning the board with their signatures to signing with their social media handles, an incentive that has become even more valuable with the dawn of name, image and likeness opportunities for student-athletes.

• Georgia Tech recorded eight sacks in the win over North Carolina, its most in a game since it had eight at Duke on Nov. 10, 2007. Five of the Yellow Jackets' eight sacks came in the first half.

• Tech's eight sacks against UNC are tied for fifth in single-game program history.

**DEFENSE**

• Prior to the stellar defensive performance against North Carolina, Georgia Tech's defense also turned in a memorable performance when it limited No. 6 Clemson to 14 points and 284 yards of total offense in the narrow 14-8 defeat (Sept. 18).

• Clemson's 14 points against Georgia Tech marked the first time that the Tigers scored fewer than 20 points in an ACC game since a 28-6 loss to Tech on Nov. 15, 2014.

• Clemson's 284 yards of total offense against Georgia Tech marked the first time that the Tigers were held to under 300 yards in an ACC game since they managed just 190 yards during the 28-6 loss to Tech in 2014.

• Georgia Tech limited Clemson to just 126 passing yards, marking the first time since 2018 (118 passing yards in ACC championship game vs. Pitt), the first time in a regular-season game since 2015 (97 passing yards vs. Notre Dame) and only the 15th time since 2000 that the Tigers were held to 130 passing yards or less in a game.

• Of the 16 times since 2000 that Clemson has had 130 passing yards or less, Georgia Tech has been the opponent four times (2006, 2009 ACC championship game, 2014).

• Georgia Tech's safety with seven seconds to go in the fourth quarter at Clemson was the Yellow Jackets' first safety since Sept. 29, 2019 at Temple.

• On Sept. 11, Georgia Tech limited Kennesaw State's high-powered option offense to just 272 total yards, including just 161 on the ground (3.7 avg.), well below its current season averages of 372.0 total yards per game, 277.3 rushing yards per game and 4.7 yards per rush.

• The Yellow Jackets' stout defensive effort versus KSU was buoyed by their 10 tackles for loss, which at the time was their most in a game since they also had 10 TFL versus Alabama A&M on Nov. 23, 2013.

• For much of the season opener against Northern Illinois (Sept. 4), Tech's defense turned in one of its best performances of the Collins' era. Most notably, at the time, NIU's 301 yards were the second-fewest that the Yellow Jackets have allowed in three seasons under Collins, behind only the 261 surrendered against USF on Sept. 7, 2019.

• Additionally, Tech did not allow NIU to pick up a first down on eight of its 12 defensive series. The eight defensive series without a surrendering a first down were the Yellow Jackets' most in a game since it held Virginia without a first down on eight different series on Nov. 4, 2017.

• Since the beginning of the 2019 season, Georgia Tech has held 13-of-28 opponents to 200 passing yards or less (169 vs. USF, Sept. 7, 2019; 30 vs. The Citadel, Sept. 14, 2019; 124 at Temple, Sept. 28, 2019; 176 at Duke, Oct. 12, 2019; 200 at Miami, Oct. 19, 2019; 198 at Florida State, Sept. 12, 2020; 194 at Syracuse, Sept. 26, 2020; 145 at Boston College, Oct. 24, 2020; 199 vs. Notre Dame, Oct. 31, 2020; 196 vs. Pitt, Dec. 10, 2020; 136 vs. Northern Illinois, Sept. 4, 2021; 111 vs. Kennesaw State, Sept. 11, 2021; 126 vs. No. 6 Clemson, Sept. 18, 2021).

• Late last season, Georgia Tech also held consecutive opponents to less than 100 rushing yards (68 vs. Duke on Nov. 28 and 88 on Dec. 5 at NC State) for the first time since it limited Mercer and Vanderbilt to 85 yards on the ground apiece on Sept. 10 and 17, 2016.

• Prior to last season, Tech had not held NCAA Division I FBS opponents to less than 100 yards on the ground in consecutive games since 2013, when it achieved the feat against Virginia (68 yds. on Oct. 26) and Pitt (-5 yds. on Nov. 2).

• Georgia Tech boasts one of the nation's most experienced secondaries in 2021. The Yellow Jackets' defensive backs have combined to make 144 career starts (**Tariq Carpenter** - 37, **Tre Swilling** - 35, **Juanyeh Thomas** - 28, **Zamari Walton** - 22, **Wesley Walker** - 11, **Myles Sims** - 3, **Tobias Oliver** - 5, **Jaylon King** - 2 and **Derrick Allen** - 1). That ranks third nationally among all Power Five conference teams, behind only Indiana (172) and Oklahoma State (149). (credit: Penn State Athletics).

**INDIVIDUAL**

• Three Georgia Tech linebackers — Jr. **Quez Jackson**, r-Jr. **Ayinde Eley** and Jr. **Charlie Thomas** — all rank among the top 15 in the ACC and the top 85 nationally in total tackles.

• Most notably, Jackson leads the ACC and is tied for 14th nationally with 67 tackles in six games (9.6/gm). He is followed by Eley's 60 stops (8.6/gm - fifth in ACC, 34th nationally) and Thomas' 53 (7.6/gm - 11th in ACC, 81st nationally).

• Additionally, Jr. DB **Juanyeh Thomas** has 50 tackles on the season, giving Georgia Tech four student-athletes with at least 50 tackles, which leads all Power Five conference teams.

• Of the three only NCAA Division I FBS teams that have four or more players with 50 tackles this season (Georgia Tech, Bowling Green and Toledo), Tech is the only team that has only played seven games.

• Jackson has recorded double-digit tackles four times this season (10 vs. Kennesaw State on Sept. 11, 10 vs. North Carolina on Sept. 25, 14 vs. Pitt on Oct. 9, 12 at Duke on Oct. 9) and six times in the last 10 games, dating back to last season vs. Notre Dame (Oct. 31, 2020).

• Jackson's 14 tackles versus Pitt were a career high (prev.: 11 vs. Notre Dame - Oct. 31, 2020).

• In addition to leading the ACC and ranking t-14th nationally in tackles (9.6 per game), Jackson is also tied for fourth nationally with two fumble recoveries this season.

• Eley, a graduate transfer from Maryland, has made an impressive debut in White and Gold, leading Georgia Tech in tackles in 3-of-7 games this season — 11 vs. Northern Illinois (Sept. 4), 10 vs. Kennesaw State (Sept. 11), 14 at Duke (Oct. 9).

• Eley was named ACC Linebacker of the Week after recording a game-high 14 tackles, including 1.5 for loss and a half-sack, in the Yellow Jackets' 31-27 win at Duke (Oct. 9).

• Eley's 14 tackles at Duke were a career-high, topping 12 he had vs. Rutgers while playing for Maryland in 2019 and 11 he had in his debut with the Yellow Jackets vs. Northern Illinois on Sept. 4.

• Eley, who made 11 starts over three seasons at Maryland, was an honorable mention all-Big Ten selection as a sophomore in 2019 after recording 79 tackles, four tackles for loss, a half-sack, two fumble recoveries, an interception and five passes defended in 11 games (nine starts).

• Eley was one of only three Power Five conference players to record at least 75 tackles, four TFL, two fumble recoveries and five passes defended in 2019, joining Miami's Shaq Quarterman and Utah's Terrell Burgess.

• Jackson and Eley are two of only five ACC players with at least 14 tackles in a game this season.

• Charlie Thomas has also been a force to be reckoned with throughout this season, particularly during Georgia Tech's three-game stretch that included games vs. Kennesaw State (Sept. 11), at No. 6 Clemson (Sept. 18) and vs. No. 21/20 North Carolina (Sept. 25).

• Against No. 21/20 UNC and its potent offense, Thomas recorded 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles, en route to being named ACC co-Linebacker of the Week.

• Thomas' 2.5 sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss were both career highs.

• Thomas became one of only two players from a Power 5 conference and four NCAA Division I FBS players overall with 2.5 sacks, 4.5 tackles for loss and eight total tackles in a game this season.

• On Sept. 18 at No. 6 Clemson, Thomas racked up a career-high 12 tackles (prev.: 9, 2X - last vs. USF, Sept. 7, 2019), which helped limit the Tigers to their lowest points (14) and yardage (284) totals in an ACC game since 2014.

• Thomas nearly matched his previous career high for tackles by halftime at Clemson, as he racked up eight stops in the first half alone.

• On Sept. 11 versus Kennesaw State, Thomas became the first Georgia Tech linebacker since at least 2000 with two interceptions in a single game.

• For the season, Thomas leads Georgia Tech in both sacks (3.0) and tackles for loss (8.0).

• Thomas ranks fourth in the ACC with 1.1 TFL per game this season.

• R-So. DL **Jordan Domineck** went viral and was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the third time in his career following his performance against Kennesaw State (Sept. 11).

• Domineck's award came on the strength of him filling the stat sheet with five tackles, three tackles for loss, a sack, two forced fumbles and a 70-yard fumble return for a touchdown against KSU.

• Domineck became the first NCAA Division I FBS student-athlete since 2009 to record a sack, three tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and a fumble return for a touchdown in a single game, and only the third FBS player to accomplish the feat since 2000.

• Domineck scoop-and-score came in the first quarter with Georgia Tech leading but Kennesaw State driving deep in Tech territory. Domineck forced a fumble on an attempted pitch by Kennesaw State QB Xavier Shepherd, picked up the loose ball and ran 70 yards for the score, dropping Shepherd with a vicious stiff arm along the way.

• Domineck's fumble return went viral on social media, sparked by an admiring mention on Twitter from Baltimore Ravens QB Lamar Jackson.

• Domineck's 70-yard fumble return was the third-longest official fumble return in Georgia Tech history, behind only Jr. DB **Zamari Walton's** 93-yard return for a touchdown last season versus Notre Dame (Oct. 31, 2020) and a 90-yard return by Kofi Smith vs. Wake Forest on Nov. 21, 1998 (*note: fumble returns became an official NCAA stat in 1992*).

• Domineck picked up third forced fumble of the season in the 45-22 win over No. 21/20 North Carolina (Sept. 25).

• For the season, Domineck is tied for seventh nationally in forced fumbles (0.43/gm) and tied for 57th in fumble recoveries (1). He's second the ACC in forced fumbles and is tied for sixth in the conference in fumbles recovered.

• Domineck ranks fifth among all active FBS student-athletes in career forced fumbles per game (.23).

• Last season, Domineck's three forced fumbles (.38/gm) ranked third in the ACC and 16th nationally, while his two fumble recoveries were tied for third in the ACC and 12th nationally with teammate **Tre Swilling**.

• According to ESPN Stats & Info, Domineck pressured the quarterback on 15.2% of his pass rushes in 2020. That was tops among all returning ACC student-athletes in 2021 and eighth among all returning Power Five conference players.

• Four Power Five conference players that entered the 2021 NFL Draft had a better pressure rate than Domineck's 15.2% last season. All four were selected in the first 118 picks of the draft. (credit: ESPN Stats & Info)

• Fr. DEs **Kyle Kennard** and **Jared Ivey** teamed up to combine for 3.0 sacks and 4.0 tackles for loss in Georgia Tech's win over North Carolina (Sept. 25).

• Kennard set career highs with 2.0 sacks and 3.0 tackles for loss against UNC.

• Ivey registered the first sack and forced fumble of his career in the win over UNC.

• In his sixth season with the Yellow Jackets, r-Sr. DT **Djimon Brooks** recorded his first-ever forced fumble and only the second fumble recovery of his career against North Carolina.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

• In addition to bursting on the scene as one of college football's most dynamic running backs as a true freshman in 2020, **Jahmyr Gibbs** also established himself as one of the nation's top kickoff returners.

• Reprising the role this season, Gibbs ranks second the ACC and 26th nationally in kickoff returns, averaging 23.7 yards per return.

• Last season, Gibbs averaged 25.6 yards per kickoff return, which would have ranked second in the ACC and 23rd nationally if he qualified for the official statistical rankings (with eight returns, he fell just two returns short).

• In kickoff coverage, Georgia Tech is allowing just 20.7 yards per kickoff return this season. The 20.7-yards-allowed average in kickoff coverage continues an upward trajectory since the Jackets ranked 126th out of 129 NCAA Division I FBS teams after allowing 26.3 yards per return in 2018, the season before Collins' arrival on The Flats.

• Georgia Tech has rarely needed to cover a kickoff in 2021, as Fr. PK **Gavin Stewart** has put 24 of his 37 kickoffs this season into the end zone for touchbacks, while seven others have been fair-caught and only six have been returned.

• On the strength of three outstanding fourth-quarter kickoffs in last Saturday's 48-40 defeat at Virginia – including two successful onside kicks in the final 80 seconds of the game – Georgia Tech Fr. PK **Jude Kelley** was named the ACC Specialist of the Week.

• Kelley perfectly executed a pair of onside kicks – one with 1:16 remaining in the game and one with 20 seconds to go – that helped the Yellow Jackets nearly erase a 21-point deficit in the final four minutes of their 48-40 defeat at UVA.

• Thanks in large part to the successful onside kicks, which were recovered by **Malachi Carter** and **Juanyeh Thomas**, respectively, Tech was able to rally from a 48-27 deficit with 3:50 remaining in the game to cut it 48-40 and had the ball at the UVA 31 yard line as time expired.

• Earlier in the fourth quarter of last Saturday's game at Virginia, Kelley also executed a perfectly placed sky kick that pinned UVA at its own 4 yard line.

• Kelley and the Yellow Jackets also pulled off a perfectly executed onside kick in the fourth quarter of its upset bid at No. 6 Clemson (Sept. 18). With the Yellow Jackets trailing 14-6 with 1:19 to go in the ballgame, Kelley's onside kick was recovered by Carter to give the Jackets possession with an opportunity to tie the game (Tech drove 51 yards in 1:04 after recovering the onside kick, but its potential game-tying drive stalled at the 1 yard line with 15 seconds left on the clock).

• Kelley is an astounding 5-for-5 for his career and 3-for-3 this season on onside kick attempts.

• As a team, Georgia Tech has had six successful onside kicks in its last 18 games. The Yellow Jackets also recovered onside kicks by Kelley last season against Notre Dame (Oct. 31, 2020) and Boston College (Oct. 24, 2020) and one by former GT PK Brenton King in the 2019 season finale versus Georgia (Nov. 30, 2019).

• R-Sr. PK **Brent Cimaglia**, a graduate transfer from Tennessee, has gone from being one of the top kickers in the SEC to one of the top kickers in the ACC.

• With nine made field goals in 12 attempts this season, Cimaglia ranks second in the ACC in field goals made (1.29/gm) and third in the conference in field-goal percentage (.750).

• After missing both of his attempts in the season opener versus Northern Illinois (Sept. 4), Cimaglia has split the uprights on nine of his last 10 field-goal tries.

• Cimaglia is a perfect 9-for-9 on field-goal attempts from inside 40 yards this season.

• Last year, Georgia Tech was just 3-for-8 for the season on field-goal attempts.

• Just seven games into his American football career, Fr. P **David Shanahan** is averaging a solid 43.2 yards per punt over 30 attempts.

• Shanahan launched a 71-yard punt at Duke (Oct. 9), which is tied for the eighth-longest punt in Georgia Tech history and is the longest by a Yellow Jacket since Ray Guy Award winner Durant Brooks booted a 77-yarder against North Carolina on Nov. 17, 2007.

• Shanahan averaged a whopping 52.7 yards per punt in his debut against Northern Illinois (Sept. 4). The 52.7-yard average spanned three punts and included a 63-yarder.

• Shanahan's 52.7-yard average vs. NIU is tied for the seventh-best single-game punting average in Georgia Tech history.

• Georgia Tech r-Sr. PR **Azende Rey's** 35-yard punt return, which set up a Georgia Tech field goal in the second quarter of its 31-27 win at Duke (Oct. 9), was the longest punt return by a Yellow Jacket since Jamal Golden had a 44-yard return versus Tulane on Sept. 12, 2015.

• Head coach **Geoff Collins** states repeatedly that special teams are the No. 1 priority within Georgia Tech's program, a philosophy that is highlighted by the fact that a student-athlete cannot earn playing time on offense or defense if they aren't able to contribute on special teams.

• The emphasis on special teams has paid dividends since his arrival in 2019, most notably in blocked kicks.

• Georgia Tech has blocked four kicks in the last 23 games.

• Prior to blocking four kicks in the past 23 games, Georgia Tech had gone 21 games between block kicks.

• Georgia Tech has blocked 23 kicks since the beginning of the 2013 season, which is tied for the eighth-most by an NCAA Division I FBS team during that span.

• The nation's most blocked kicks over the past eight seasons (since 2013) belong to Temple (30). Six of those came in the last two seasons of Collins' tenure as the Owls' head coach (2017-18). Temple blocked five kicks in 2018 alone, which was good for a tie for fifth nationally.

**MISCELLANEOUS**

• Perhaps Georgia Tech's biggest focuses throughout the offseason were to improve its turnover margin and cut down its penalties from a year ago. Through seven games, they are one of the nation's most improved teams in both areas.

• Through seven games this season, Georgia Tech ranks 13th nationally with just 283 penalty yards (40.4 per game). The Jackets have committed a total of just 37 penalties through seven contests (5.3/gm).

• Last season, Tech ranked 119th out of 127 NCAA Division I FBS teams in penalty yardage per game (74.9 ypg).

• Tech also currently ranks 55th nationally in turnover margin at plus-two (+0.14/gm). The Yellow Jackets have nine takeaways (84th nationally) and just eight giveaways (46th nationally) through seventh games.

• Last season, Tech ranked 111th out of 127 NCAA Division I FBS teams in turnover margin at minus-seven (-.70/gm).

• As is often the case, turnover margin has been a strong indicator of whether Georgia Tech wins or loses since the beginning of last season. In their six wins since the beginning of last season, the Yellow Jackets have won the turnover battle in five of six games and are plus-10 overall in turnover margin. On the flip side, Tech has not won the turnover battle in any of its 11 defeats since the beginning of last season and is minus-17 overall in turnover margin in those 11 losses.

• Georgia Tech outgained each of its first four opponents this season (429-301 vs. Northern Illinois on Sept. 4; 412-272 vs. Kennesaw State on Sept. 11; 298-284 at No. 6 Clemson on Sept. 18; and 394-369 vs. No. 21/20 North Carolina).

• Tech outgained Clemson this season for the first time since the Yellow Jackets had a 353-190 advantage in total yards during a 28-6 victory over the Tigers on Nov. 15, 2014. In the previous six meetings (2015-20), Clemson had outgained Georgia Tech by an average of 532-214.

• Georgia Tech outgained each of its first two opponents of the season by at least 100 yards (182 yds. vs. NIU, 140 yds. vs. KSU), which marked the first time since 2018 that Tech outgained consecutive opponents by 100-plus yards since 2018 (465-323 at Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 565-374 at North Carolina on Nov. 3).

• Prior to the first two games of this season, Georgia Tech had only outgained an opponent by 100-plus yards twice in the past two seasons (the Yellow Jackets had yardage advantages of 438-307 at Florida State on Sept. 12, 2020 and 523-382 vs. Duke on Nov. 28, 2020).

• Georgia Tech had 10 more first downs than Northern Illinois in the season opener (25-15), which tied for Tech's largest advantage in first downs in three seasons under head coach **Geoff Collins** (the Yellow Jackets also had 10 more first downs than USF — 21-11 — in a 14-10 win on Sept. 7, 2019).

• Despite returning 17 student-athletes that started at least half of last year's games on offense or defense, Georgia Tech remains one of major college football's youngest teams.

• Two years after having just eight seniors on its roster (which was the second-fewest in NCAA Division I FBS in 2019), Tech has just 13 seniors on its 2021 roster, which is the fourth-fewest in the nation among Power Five conference teams and tied for the eighth-fewest among all FBS teams (credit: Old Dominion athletics).

• One of the nation's youngest rosters faces one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2021. Most notably, Tech was the only team in the nation that had four of the AP's preseason top 10 teams and five of the top 15 on its schedule (Clemson, UGA, ND, UNC and Miami).

• Pundits and ratings systems were unanimous in ranking Georgia Tech's schedule among the three toughest in the nation.

• The preseason prognostications about the difficulty of Georgia Tech schedule have proven to be true. The Yellow Jackets' official NCAA strength of schedule is tied for sixth nationally based on all opponents' winning percentage (.684).

• Georgia Tech's first seven opponents have combined to list just 16 games this season (2.3 losses/opponent), including a 23-8 combined record for the four teams that the Yellow Jackets have lost to (Northern Illinois, Clemson, Pitt and Virginia).

• Georgia Tech's five remaining opponents have combined to lose just 12 games (2.4 losses/opponent).

• As part of Georgia Tech athletics' ongoing partnership with Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, the organizations have teamed up once again to have the Yellow Jackets' success on "Money Down" — head coach **Geoff Collins'** term for third and fourth downs — benefit Children's this season.

• Fans are encouraged to make pledges to Children's based on the Jackets' success on "Money Down." To lead the way, Collins' has pledged for the second-straight year to donate \$10 to Children's for every "Money Down" stop that the Yellow Jackets make on defense and each "Money Down" that the Jackets convert into a first down on offense this season.

• So far, Collins' 2021 pledge stands at \$1,000, thanks to the Yellow Jackets' 60 "Money Down" defensive stops and 40 "Money Down" offensive conversions this season.

• Last season, Georgia Tech had a total of 162 "Money Down" defensive stops and offensive conversions (93 defensive stops, 69 offensive conversions). Including Collins' \$1,620 donation, the Money Down benefit raised a total of \$10,404 for Children's.
