HOKIES TO OPEN 2020 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP AGAINST NO. 1 NORTH CAROLINA

Tech makes late run for Cary

- The Hokies closed out their regular season with wins at both Wake Forest (Oct. 29) and Boston College (Nov. 1) to complete their run at qualifying for the 2020 ACC Championship.

- With those two victories, the Hokies climbed into a three-way tie for the sixth spot in the ACC standings as they recorded their first back-to-back road wins since 2016 - at Syracuse (Oct. 6, 2-1) and at Boston College (Oct. 9, 3-2).

- Since Oct. 4, Tech had won five-of-seven matches overall, which included a 4-1 mark in conference play and the team outscored its opponents 19-8 overall during that span and 17-6 in ACC action.

Powell honored by the ACC

- Announced on Nov. 3 by the Atlantic Coast Conference, **Tori Powell** was chosen as the ACC Women's Soccer Offensive Player of the Week.

- For Powell, it's her first weekly honor from the league and for Tech, it was the third player of the week honor this season, earned by three different

- That number ties for the most weekly honors from the ACC in a single year at Tech (2019), but is the most in terms of individuals. Last year, **Mandy McGlynn** earned two defensive and **Nicole Kozlova** had one offensive nod.

- Powell scored twice in the win at Wake Forest, including the game winner, and also had an assist. She added an assist on the second goal in the win at Boston College to complete a six-point week.

- Powell finished the ACC regular season tied for fourth in goals scored in ACC-only matches with four and her 10 points was tied for fifth.

- Among those competing for the ACC title this week, her overall 12 points is tied for third and her five overall goals is tied for second.

Assists for **Emily Gray**, who leads the nation. Her four versus Miami (Oct. 15) broke the school record for a single match - previous high was three (4x), most recently by **Kelly Conheaney** (Clemson, Oct. 13, 2011). Her next one ties her with **Jasmine Reeves** (2011) for the fourth most ever in a single season and **Erin Moore** (2004-07) for the sixth most in a career at the school.

Points for **Tori Powell** (5G, 2A) over Tech's last seven matches in which the Hokies have gone 5-2-0. She was held scoreless through the first five matches of the year, but has had at least one point in the last three games. Tech is 5-0 in games in which she tallies a point.

Hokies - **Emmalee McCarter**, **Emma Steigerwald**, **Karlie Johnson**, **Tori Powell**, **Allyson Brown**, **Taylor Bryan** and **Makenzie Graham** - who scored versus Miami marking the first time in program history. WHAT IS A HOKIE?

This is probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah! Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

JUST "VIRGINIA TECH", PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech." Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became

Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as "Virginia Tech." VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT, VA Tech or Virginia Tech University are **not recognized names and should not be used.**

Powell adds a couple national honors

- The United Soccer Coaches on Nov. 3, also named Powell its National Player of the Week, while she was also on the teams of the week released by College Soccer News and TopDrawerSoccer.com.

- Powell joined **Alia Skinner**, who was named the organization's National Player of the Week earlier in the season.

Facing an "unranked" Tar Heel team

- Due to the United Soccer Coaches not releasing its first poll until Sept. 22, Tech's Sept. 20 match at North Carolina marked the first time ever the Hokies faced an "unranked" Tar Heel team.

- In its history against UNC, the Tar Heels have been ranked no lower than 18th (twice), ranked in the top 10, 18 times and in the top 5, 15 times.

- Not surprisingly, in the first poll of 2020, UNC was the top-ranked team in the nation.

Holding down the UNC offense

- Despite the 1-0 loss at North Carolina (Sept. 20), the Hokies did something they've rarely done against the Tar Heels, holding them to a goal or less - it was just the fourth time in 21 meetings.

- Two of those matches were shutouts in Blacksburg, including a 1-0 win on Oct. 4, 2009 vs. No. 1 UNC and a 1-0 win on Oct. 23, 2011 vs. No. 8 UNC.

- The only other time it happened before 2020 was on the road when Tech held UNC to one goal in Chapel Hill on October 15, 2006 in a 1-0 loss.

- **Alia Skinner's** nine saves in that match against the Tar Heels was the most by a Tech freshman goalkeeper in a match since *Dayle Colpitts* stopped 11 shots in a 5-3 loss at No. 11 Texas A&M on Aug. 27, 2010. Skinner would later surpassed that total in Tech's win over Pittsburgh (Oct. 4).

- Of note, the one goal UNC scored against Tech was its lowest output of the 2020 season, which was tied by Duke (Oct. 23) in a Blue Devil 1-0 loss.

Starting Streaks for the Hokies

- During 2019, five players started all 19 matches, with departed seniors *Jaylyn Thompson* (69) and *Mandy McGlynn* (60) leading the way.

- Among returners, junior **Emmalee McCarter** now holds the longest active starting streak on the team at 51 straight, followed by **Grace Sklopan** (31) and **Emma Steigerwald** (20).

- Then, there's **Emily Gray** who has started every game she has played for the Hokies. In 2018, she started 22 times, becoming the first freshman at Tech to start every match since 2013 (*Murielle Tiernan*).

- Gray was at 32 straight starts before missing the match at Clemson (Sept. 29) in 2019 due to a season-ending injury. She has now started in 44 matches, the second most on the team, but not consecutive.

Sklopan's minutes streak comes to an end

- **Grace Sklopan** was Tech's lone Hokie to play every single minute of the 2020 season (634 straight minutes) entering the Miami (Oct. 15, 2020) contest.

- However, she did not play at all in the second half, which ended her streak for this year and a string that dated back to Sept. 13, 2019 against the College of Charleston.

- Sklopan's minutes played streak ended at 1,798 straight minutes, every one of the previous 19 matches

- The last Tech field player to play every minute of the first eight matches was *Kelsey Irwin*, who played every minute (2,057) of 2018. Her total consecutive streak lasted 3,386:27 straight minutes (36 matches).

The Gauntlet to start 2020

- The Hokies faced seven straight ranked opponents to start the year and went 1-6.

- This year marked the first time Tech faced seven straight ranked foes. The longest stretch prior was playing six straight ranked teams from Sept. 23 to Oct. 17, 2010 - and the Hokies posted a 2-3-1 record.

- All-time, Tech is 31-97-14 (142 games - 26.8 win percentage) against ranked opponents.

- Under head coach **Chugger Adair** (10th season), the Hokies are 18-50-8 (28.9), while they were 13-47-6 (24.2) prior.

More on the Hokies versus ranked teams

- Tech's 1-0 win over No. 6 Virginia on Sept. 27, 2018 marks the team's last win over a top 10 foe.

- In 2018, the Hokies were 2-6-1 versus ranked teams, last beating No. 17 Texas (1-0) on the road in the first round of the NCAA Championship, while they were 0-5-1 in 2019.

- Tech was 0-11-1 between the Texas win and Oct. 4's 2-0 home win over 14th-ranked Pittsburgh. The tie was vs. No. 10 Duke on Oct. 6, 2019.

- In its history, Tech is 11-59-5 against programs ranked in the top 10 and 5-36-3 versus the top 5.

- The Hokies last 14 losses, and 17-of-18, have been to ranked teams.

- Tech's last win on the road over a top 10 team was Oct. 24, 2012, at No. 7 Wake Forest (3-0).

Hokies closed out home slate with victory

- Against Navy (Oct. 24), Tech played its final home match of the 2020 season and before it, honored five seniors pregame.

- It was then senior **Allyson Brown**, who delivered the game winner in the 2-1 win.

- Opening the scoring in the contest was **Tori Powell**, who like Brown, scored her third goal of the year off an assist from **Emily Gray**.

- The assist to Brown was Gray's third game-winning assist of the year and seventh of her career.

Gray honored by the ACC

- Announced Oct. 27 by the Atlantic Coast Conference, **Emily Gray** was chosen as the ACC Women's Soccer Co-Offensive Player of the Week.

- Gray earned her first weekly honor from the ACC and became just the second midfielder at the school to earn the award - Jennifer Harvey (Sept. 13, 2009).

Joining **Alia Skinner** (Oct. 6), it marks just the fifth time in Tech history, the Hokies have had two different ACC honorees in the same season.

- For her effort, Gray was also named to the College Soccer News - Women's National Team of the Week, and to the TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Week.

Gray among nation's leaders

- Gray leads the nation in total assists with eight, two better than the next closest player - Duke's Marykate McGuire.

- She also leads the conference in assists per game (0.67), but sits second nationally to Houston Baptist's Tayah Reynolds.

- Gray sits tied for sixth in the country in points, with 14, which is good for third in the conference.

- For the season, she has already notched the fifth-most ever recorded in a single season at the school, tied with both *Marika Gray* (2010) and *Wendy Kotwas* (1999) and one behind *Jasmine Reeves* (2011) for the fourth most.

- She also has 16 career assists which is good for seventh on Tech's all-time career list and one behind *Erin Moore* (2004-07) for the sixth spot.

Record-setting night for Tech

- It was a record-setting night at Thompson Field when the Hokies took down visiting Miami with a decisive 8-2 victory on Oct. 15.
- The Hokies lit up the scoreboard early and often, netting four goals through 16:02 of action - the fastest Tech had ever scored four goals to start a match (Nov. 15, 2014 vs. Dayton, 29:58).
- Before the first half was done, Tech had six goals marking the most ever scored in any half all-time at the school (five, vs. VMI, Aug. 31, 2004)
- In the column on the right (on front page), displayed many of the records that were either tied or set.

A tale of two matches that weekend

- It was like night and day (also when the games were competed) for the Hokies in that ACC weekend, as they started it with the offensive explosion Thursday night against Miami, in which eight of their 17 shots found the back of the net.
- On Sunday afternoon (Oct. 18) though, Tech took a season-high 18 shots, but No. 13 Louisville would not surrender a goal as the Cardinals came away with the ACC win by a 1-0 count.
- The 18 shots were the most since attempting 20 last year versus Boston College (Oct. 24, 2019), while the Hokies also had nine corners, the most since versus Xavier last year (Nov. 15, 2019).

Familiar faces with helpers against Panthers

- Recording the team's first assist of the 2020 season was, unsurprisingly, **Emily Gray**, who challenged Pitt defender Hailey Davidson for possession inside the box, stole the ball, then poked a short pass to **Karlie Johnson** for her left-footed strike in the 76th minute.
- For Gray (at the time), it was her ninth career assist and her 23rd career point.
- **Emmalee McCarter**, who found **Tori Powell** after an unsuccessful goalkeeper clear, registered her sixth career assist and 12th career point (at the time).

Johnson returns to the scoring column

- Before her game-winner against the Panthers, it had been 716 days since **Karlie Johnson's** last tally.
- The team's leading scorer in 2018 (six goals) last scored a goal on Oct. 18, 2018, the game winner versus Notre Dame.
- She leads the team with five career game winners.

Feighan and McCarter dual threats in 2019

- With her output last season, **Molly Feighan** became the first Tech player to register three or more goals and assists in a single season since 2015 - **Ashley Meier** (6g, 5a).
- **Emmalee McCarter** matched Feighan's output in Tech's last match at Pittsburgh (Oct. 31), scoring her third goal of the year off a corner which held for the game winner.
- The pair each scored three times and dished out four assists for 10 points.

Powell nets first of career

- In the waning minutes against No. 14 Pittsburgh on Oct. 4, Tech freshman **Tori Powell** scored the first goal of her Hokies' career - settling a pass from **Emmalee McCarter** just outside the box, turning and burying a shot in the 89th minute to provide the second goal in a 2-0 victory.
- Powell now has a team-high five goals, one ahead of **Allyson Brown**.
- Of note, since Tech has been a member of the ACC (2004), freshmen have led the team at the end of the season in goals scored eight times, including

the last two seasons - **Nicole Kozlova** (5, 2019) and **Karlie Johnson** (6, 2018).

- The other seasons include **Murielle Tiernan** (11, 2013), **Ashley Meier** (8, 2012), **Marika Gray** (8, 2007), **Emily Jukich** (7, 2006), **Laurie Beth Puglisi** (5, 2005) and **Ashley Stinson** (17, 2004).
- During the same time frame, Tech has been led by freshmen in points seven times - **Kozlova** (12), **Johnson** (12), **Tiernan** (27), **Meier** (19), **Gray** (22), **Puglisi** (11) and **Stinson** (39). P

Skinner saves a dozen versus No. 14 Pittsburgh

- In Oct. 4's win over No. 14 Pittsburgh, Tech's **Alia Skinner** posted a career-high 12 saves, the most ever for a Hokies' goalkeeper in an ACC contest.
- The 12 saves are the third-most in 25 years of Tech women's soccer, and the most since Robin Chidester had 13 saves versus No. 4 Stanford on Sept. 6, 2009.
- With the effort, Skinner also recorded her first career shutout for the Hokies.

Skinner earns national recognition

- Announced Oct. 6 by the United Soccer Coaches, **Alia Skinner** was chosen as the National Player of the Week after her efforts in the Hokies first win of the season on Oct. 4.
- With the honor, she became just the third women's soccer player ever at the school to garner the weekly honor from the coaches association.
- Back when it was the NSCAA, **Kristin Carden** earned the award on Oct. 4, 2009, while **Ashley Kinser** was recognized with the honor on Nov. 5, 2007.

Skinner honored by the ACC

- Also announced Oct. 6 by the Atlantic Coast Conference, **Alia Skinner** was chosen as the ACC Women's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week.
- With the honor, she became the fourth Tech freshman to garner either an offensive or defensive weekly award since the Hokies joined the ACC, but the first goalkeeper.
- The other three honorees were forwards - **Ashley Stinson**, Sept. 4, 2004; **Marika Gray**, Sept. 10, 2007; and **Nicole Kozlova**, Sept. 10, 2019.

Different faces against No. 2 Florida State

- Despite the lopsided loss to the second-ranked Seminoles on Oct. 1 - two Hokies will remember it for personal reasons.
- Both goalkeeper **S.A. Phillips** and **Caroline Cipolla** made their first career starts for Tech, while **Sydney Ash**, **Calista Heister** and **Karlie Johnson** made their first starts of the 2020.
- A game later, freshman **Erin Carleton** made her first collegiate start against No. 14 Pittsburgh.

Freshmen starts/appearances for Tech

- At Clemson (Sept. 17), Tech started five freshmen - **Alia Skinner**, **Taylor Bryan**, **Victoria Haugen**, **Tori Powell** and **Averi Visage** - for the first time since 2018.
- Ironically, the last time Tech started five freshmen in a match was, versus Clemson on October 21, 2018 when **Karlie Johnson**, **Grace Sklopan**, **Emily Gray**, **Emmalee McCarter** and **Kiersten Hening** were all in the starting lineup and a total of seven played in the game (**Molly Feighan** and **Emma Steigerwald**).
- Tech started those same five freshmen in games at North Carolina (Sept. 20) and against Virginia (Sept. 25), while at UNC freshmen **Erin Carleton** and **Ayden Yates** both came in as a subs, marking a season-high seven freshman to see action in a game this season.

**THOMPSON FIELD
HOME OF THE HOKIES**

Thompson Field serves as the home of the Tech men's and women's soccer teams as well as the lacrosse team. Located in the center of the Tech athletics complex, the facility ranks as one of the finest for both soccer and lacrosse in the ACC.

Located across from Lane Stadium, the Hokies' football home, Thompson Field was completed in the fall of 2003 and dedicated in 2008 in the name of Sandra D. Thompson, a longtime supporter of women's athletics at Tech.

The field is a bluegrass playing surface and measures approximately 75 by 120 yards. It is equipped with an underground irrigation and drainage system that allows for it to be ready for play quickly following rainstorms.

The athletics department has gradually made improvements since the venue opened in 2003. The most recent updates to the complex includes new light fixtures and a video board for the start of the 2019 soccer season and access to upgraded team rooms for use during pregame and halftime of matches played at Thompson Field.

In 2005, workers completed a new restroom facility for the complex, and during the summer of 2008, a new game operations center was erected atop the stadium above the grandstand.

The approximately 900-square foot facility now includes one dedicated broadcast booth for ACC Network TV broadcasts. The area also has two covered areas on each end devoted to camera locations for broadcasts or team use. There is a similar booth on the opposite side of the center, where working media members who are covering the Hokies have access along with the opportunity for teams to record their video as another option.

In the main area of the center is a large working area for game operations, which includes the scoreboard and video board, PA, official statistics and visiting school officials.

The climate-controlled facility contains a state-of-the-art sound system and Ethernet capability. The Internet-ready facility allows Tech's official athletics website, hokiesports.com, to originate live stats of the Hokies' matches from the press box. Above the grandstand is a wired camera deck.

Between each team's bench area is the Sandy D. Thompson Press Box. Formerly the press operations center for the field, the facility is now used as a halftime room for game officials and as an auxiliary area for press and game operations. This is also where the replay monitor is housed for ACC Broadcasts.

Thompson Field, which has been expanded since it was opened, now features approximately 2,028 bench-back seats, where each fan has an unobstructed view of the playing surface. Spacious area around the field allows for nearly 1,500 more fans to watch games.

Charles "Chugger" Adair

Virginia Tech Head Coach - 10th Season



On December 7, 2010, Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen its only two draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning a NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

In his nine seasons at Tech, Adair has led his program to a winning record each year, but saw a streak of double-digit win totals come to an end in 2017 as the team posted a 7-6-5 mark, with the five ties setting a program record. Despite an 11-win season in 2016 - the team's ninth straight year with at least 10 wins - the Hokies saw their eight-year run of making the NCAA championship come to an end.

In 2018, Tech returned to the 11-win mark and the NCAA tournament and reached the Round of 16. Along the way, the Hokies were one of two teams to knock off a nationally-seeded team in the opening round - defeating No. 17 Texas (a four seed) 1-0 in Austin, Texas - the Longhorns lone home loss of the year. Another 1-0 victory, this one in double overtime, in round two over Arkansas advanced Tech to its fourth ever Sweet 16. The Hokies ended the year ranked in two major polls - 21st by the United Soccer Coaches and 23rd by Top Drawer Soccer. He was also on the sidelines as the Hokies played the program's 500th career match (August 19 versus Georgetown) and recorded its 250th career victory (Sept. 23 at Villanova).

The team followed that performance up racing out to a 9-0 start to the 2019 campaign, which was tied for the second-longest all-time streak to start a season at the school. However, injuries plagued the Hokies as they entered ACC play, but still posted a 4-4-2 mark, its fifth .500 or better record in league play under Adair. The team did not make the ACC tournament, but won 12 matches and hosted an NCAA first round match, both were firsts since 2015.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championship. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking.

In 2012, Adair's second season as the head coach, he led Tech to a 13-6-1 record, which marked the program's fifth straight 10-win season. Tech's six losses were the fewest in program history, at the time, and 12 of the 13 wins were shutouts. The team started 9-0-0, climbing into the Top 10 in the national rankings for the first time in school history, reaching the No. 8 spot in late September. The Hokies played host to their first NCAA Championship game in Blacksburg, as they welcomed No. 14 Georgetown to Thompson Field, though it resulted in a 3-2 loss in overtime.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair came to Tech after holding the associate head coaching position at UC Santa Barbara for two seasons. While at UCSB, his role involved all aspects of the soccer program, including recruiting, coaching, scouting, player management, community relations and camps. Prior to his arrival at UCSB, he worked a six-year stint as Youth Soccer Coach/ Assistant Director of Competitive Older Ages for the Del Mar Sharks.

He served as an assistant for the University of San Diego's men's soccer team from 1998-2000. He moved from there and spent a season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at Pacific University in Portland, Ore.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack..

Gray converts PK for Tech's first goal of 2020

- With less than six minutes left in Tech's season opener at Virginia (Sept. 12), Emily Gray converted on a penalty kick (after a Cavalier handball in the box) to avoid the team's first shutout loss in a season opener since 2002 - 5-0 at Notre Dame on Sept. 1. - The Hokies have been shutout four times in season openers - at American, Sept. 2, 1995, 2-0; at UNCG, Aug. 29, 1997, 1-0 and at San Diego, Aug. 17, 2018, a 0-0 double overtime draw.

Tech back to successful on PKs

- Gray's successful penalty kick at Virginia (Sept. 12) coupled with Nicole Kozlova's converted PK at Clemson last year (Sept. 29) now has Tech 2-for-2 with current players, while Kozlova's make ended a string of five straight misses by Hokies. - In its history, Tech is 25-for-32 on PK attempts in the regular season and had converted 23-of-25 prior to that 0-for-5 stretch. - In the postseason, Tech has gone to a shootout in three matches - twice in the 2008 ACC tournament and once in the 2013 NCAA Championship. The team won all three while converting 9-of-11 attempts.

Tech versus Virginia - Rounds 1 & 2

- Tech and Virginia opened its 2020 campaigns on Sept. 12 against each other in the first nonconference regular season match between the two teams since 1996, a 1-0 Cavaliers win in Charlottesville (Sept. 24). - Before Tech joined the ACC, the two teams played a total of three nonconference matches with Virginia winning all three (1994 and 1995). - The Cavaliers won the first of the two scheduled matches by a 3-1 count in Charlottesville and then had the overtime win in Blacksburg. - Oddly, the teams were each others home openers. - Only four times in the series history prior to 2020 have the two squads squared off twice during a season with mixed results - and prior to this year, the second match had always been in a postseason tournament.

Tech in season openers

- Overall, the Hokies are now 17-8-3 in season openers and were unbeaten in 11 straight (10-0-1) until the loss to Virginia (Sept. 12). The Hokies had won nine straight before a 2018 season-opening 0-0 tie to San Diego. - Under head coach Chugger Adair, the program is 8-1-1 in season openers and has outscored its opponents 26-5 in those 10 matches.

Season openers away from Blacksburg

- Overall, the Hokies are 10-8-0 in season openers played away from Blacksburg and had a five match winning streak, until this year's defeat. - Tech had not lost a season opener since a 2-1 defeat at Davidson on Aug. 23, 2008. - On the road, Tech has an 8-8 mark, while the Hokies are 2-0 at a neutral site. - Under Adair, the program is 4-1-0 in season openers away from Blacksburg and has outscored its opponents 9-4 in them.

Noting the Hokies in home openers

- In home openers, Tech is now 8-1-1 under head coach Chugger Adair. Overall, the Hokies were unbeaten in 19 straight (15-0-4) before its 1-0 loss in overtime to No. 11 Virginia (Sept. 25). - In the 10 home openers under Adair, Tech has outscored its opponents 30-4 with six shutouts. - The Hokies have trailed for just 38 minutes, 37 seconds in their home openers under Adair - East Carolina's Courtney Cash scored 5:33 into the match on Aug. 26, 2016 before Tech got an equalizer. - The Cash goal was the last scored on Tech in a home opener, as the Hokies were riding a 467:57 consecutive scoreless streak in home openers, before the golden goal by Virginia in overtime. - Overall, the program is 21-3-4 in home openers, losing just the 1993 (Detroit, Sept. 18, 4-0) and 2000 (Seton Hall, Aug. 27, 3-2) home openers as well. - Only once before had Tech hosted a ranked opponent for its home opener - Sept. 2, 2007 versus No. 13 Tennessee. Marika Gray scored twice (17:07 and 19:30), Ashley Owens saved seven shots and Tech held on for a 2-1 victory. - The Hokies latest home opener before this year was competed on Sept. 24, 2002 when Tech shut out Liberty 5-0. In that contest, Kjersti Trout set the school record for goals scored (4) and points (8) in a single game. Neither of those has yet been matched.

A September start to the season, nothing new

- For the first time since the 2002 season, the Hokies kicked off the year with its first match of the season in the month of September. - Tech opened that campaign as a member of the BIG EAST on Sept. 1, under head coach Jerry Cheynet, with a 5-0 loss at No. 7 Notre Dame. - In all, the Hokies have started their season eight times in September including their first seven seasons as a program (1993-99). - The latest start to a Tech season, before the 2020 campaign, goes all the way back to its first year of competition - 1993 under head coach Sam Okpodu. The Hokies opened on Sept. 6 with a 4-3 victory at Liberty and actually won four straight to start the year.

Tech in ACC openers - overall and on the road

- In 17 years in the league, Tech is 5-11-1 in ACC openers, 1-7-1 in ACC openers on the road and has faced a ranked opponent in eight straight. - The Hokies won their first ever ACC opener at Maryland, 2-0, on Sept. 3, 2004 and earned a draw at No. 25 Miami (1-1) on Sept. 25, 2008. - Tech has been outscored 19-5 in nine road ACC openers, have not scored since the opener at No. 6 Maryland (Sept. 18, 2011) in a 2-1 loss and have been shutout in four straight.

Facing Clemson in the ACC opener

- Sept. 17's match at Clemson marked the third time Tech opened its ACC season against the Tigers, but it was the first time on the road. - On Sept. 24, 2009, Tech's Julian Johnson scored in the 97th minute for a 2-1 Hokies' victory. - Five years later, on Sept. 19, 2014, No. 2 Tech and No. 17 Clemson met in Blacksburg with the Hokies winning 2-0 despite playing the final 40 minutes with just 10 players.

Tech success under Adair - nonconference

- Tech has lost just 17 nonconference matches under head coach **Chugger Adair**, 10 of those have been in the postseason - seven in the NCAAs and three in the ACC - and three this season to ACC opponents.

- The seven losses in the regular season include four on the road at Tennessee (Sept. 10, 2017, 3-1), Alabama (Aug. 30, 2018, 1-0) and this year at Virginia and Duke.

- The other three losses have been in Blacksburg - Ohio State (Sept. 1, 2016, 2-1), Nebraska (Sept. 9, 2011, 4-3 2OT) and Virginia this year (1-0 OT).

- In 10 seasons under Adair, Tech is 66-7-6 in nonconference regular-season matches.

Double figure win streak, RS-NC

- Coupling last year's 8-0 start with two wins before the start of its 2018 ACC slate, Tech had won 10 straight nonconference, regular-season matches between a loss at Alabama (Aug. 30, 2018) and this year's Virginia (Sept. 12, 2020) defeat.

- That streak matched the third longest span in Tech history, and all four have occurred with head coach Chugger Adair on staff.

- During a remarkable run from Sept. 11, 2011 until Aug. 28, 2016, the Hokies were unbeaten in 39 straight nonconference regular season matches that included win streaks of 15 (Sept. 13 to Aug. 28, 2015), 13 (Sept. 11, 2011 to Aug. 25, 2013) and nine (Sept. 2, 2015 to Aug. 28, 2016).

- Tech's first 10-match nonconference regular season streak started Sept. 5, 2010, when Adair was the associate head coach, and ended on Sept. 4, 2011, his first year as the head coach.

Tech's national team experience

- Four current Hokies have national team experience under their belts including two with the United States, one with Ukraine and the fourth with Norway.

- **Alia Skinner**: Her last experience was with the U.S. U-18 National Team, a 39-player ID camp from Oct. 1-8, 2019 at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla.

- **Emily Gray**: Her last experience was her second camp with the U-20 squad in March 2019 at the Women's U-19 La Manga Tournament in La Manga, Spain, starting a match against France.

- **Nicole Kozlova (Ukraine)**: Her parents are both Ukrainian, and she earned her most recent CAPS (nine total) with the Ukrainian Women's Senior National Team, helping the squad to 12 points in four UEFA Women's Euro 2021 qualifiers.

- She started the match on Sept. 18, a 3-1 victory over Montenegro, then came off the bench against Greece on Sept. 22 to score twice, including the game winner, in a 4-0 victory over Greece.

- Kozlova also started matches against Ireland (Oct. 23, 1-0 win) and Greece (Oct. 27, 3-0 win).

- The results moved Ukraine into third place in group standings with its final qualifier set for Nov. 11 against Montenegro, a win and an Ireland loss to Germany advances Ukraine into the next round.

- **Victoria Haugen (Norway)**: Her father Nils is a native Norwegian who immigrated here at age 21 and she has dual citizenship. She has trained with both the U-16/17 and U-19 National Teams.

- In October 2019, she helped Norway finish first in Group 5 at the U-19 UEFA Euros qualifying round and first overall, as she played in all three matches, totaling 225 minutes of action. The subsequent rounds were all cancelled due to world-wide pandemic.

Tech Athletics announces #LOVE initiative

- After consulting with Tech student-athletes, coaches and staff, the athletics department created the #LOVE initiative for the 2020-21 season. This unique logo features a VT embedded within the word LOVE. This design signifies and represents the values of our university and our Athletics community. LOVE conquers hate. LOVE respects and empowers. LOVE conquers all. LOVE simply 'does'.

- Warm-up shirts, with the LOVE logo on the front, have been provided to all seven fall sports currently competing and will be given to all teams.

- Additionally, each team selected a meaningful word or phrase to appear on the back of their shirts to signify their stand for love, unity and equality, as well as their collective desire to witness the end of racism and discrimination. Words or phrases selected by the teams include: Unity, Justice, Love your Neighbor, Equality, 22Sports1Team and Hokies.

Hokies earn national academic recognition

- In September, United Soccer Coaches announced the Team Academic Award winners at the college level, recognizing exemplary performance in the classroom during the 2019-20 academic year. For the fourth straight year, and eighth time in 10, the Tech women's soccer team earned the award.

- A total of 914 collegiate teams (345 men, 569 women) earned the Team Academic Award, including 188 schools who had both their men's and women's programs among the recipients, including Tech.

- The Hokies were honored for four straight years from 2011-14 and have now been recognized the last four seasons. United Soccer Coaches annually celebrates the academic achievements of high school and college soccer teams whose student-athletes collectively demonstrate a commitment to excellence in their studies over the course of a full school year.

- College Team Academic Award recipients are active members of the United Soccer Coaches College Services Program with a composite grade point of average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale for all players on the roster.
