KEY STORYLINES

2023 ACC RECORD

- The Hokies recorded their third straight loss of the season, falling 1-0 to Duke on Thursday, Oct. 19 at Thompson Field. Tech was challenged by a 13-4 shot deficit, recording zero shots in the first half of the match.
- Tech fell 3-0 to rival Virginia in Charlottesville on Oct. 15 marking the first time the Hokies have conceded three goals in ACC play this season. Alia Skinner recorded a season best, nine saves.
- On Oct. 8, Tech dropped a 1-0 decision at home to No. 9 Clemson in the 28th minute.
- Clemson outshot the Hokies 9-2 in the second half, resulting in the Hokies defeat at Thompson.
- The Hokies rallied together in the second half to defeat NC State 4-1 on Oct. 5, logging three goals in the final 30 minutes of play.

- Eden Skyers recorded her first career goal, Olympico, in the 14th minute. Taylor Bryan, Natalie Mitchell, and Samantha DeGuzman secured the win for the Hokies in the second half scoring one goal each.
- The Hokies have scored nine of 20 goals in the first half, and have a 6-1-1 record when scoring the first goal of the match.
- Virginia Tech fell to No. 25 Wake Forest 2-0 in the Hokies' ACC home opener, giving up two goals in the second half.
- Hokies were challenged by a 11-3 shot deficit taking zero shots on goal throughout the match.
- On the road, the Hokies defeated Syracuse 4-0 and Boston College 2-1.

- Junior Emma Pelkowski recorded her first career brace against Syracuse scoring in the sixth and 48th minute of the match. Pelkowski was named to TopDrawerSoccer Women's Team of the Week.
- Sophomore Natalie Mitchell's first career brace led the Hokies to a victory versus Boston College 2-1.
- Mitchell scored the first goal of the match in the sixth minute and the game winner in the 71st as the Hokies claimed their first ACC victory of the season.
- Tech opened ACC play against No. 2 North Carolina on Sept. 15 dropping the match 1-0. Despite an 8-4 shot advantage in the first, the Tar Heels shutout the Hokies with a 13-0 shot deficit in the second. UNC scored the lone goal of the match in the 67th.

NONCONFERENCE PLAY

• Natalie Mitchell led the Hokies to victory on Sept. 7 scoring the lone goal of the match in the fourth minute against Navy, assisted by Samantha DeGuzman.

• With less than five minutes remaining in the match, the Hokies gave up their second goal of the season in a 1-1 draw against Charlotte on Sept. 1. Tech held a 13-2 shot advantage.

• DeGuzman scored Tech's lone goal versus the Niners in the 20th minute.

• Hokies played Old Dominion on Aug. 31 battling to a scoreless draw in Blacksburg. Tech and ODU kept the match even with 11 shots each.

• The Hokies conceded their first goal of the season in the 49th minute versus No. 20 Georgetown, resulting in a 1-0 loss.

• The Hokies were unbeaten after their first three matches of the season conceding zero goals against Butler, Indiana, and JMU.

• Tech delivered James Madison their first loss of the season in a 3-0 shutout in the Hokies home opener. Tech held a 20-7 shot advantage over the Dukers.

• Tech scored three goals in 21 minutes in the second half vs. Butler, and held a shot advantage of 11-8 versus the Bulldogs.

• Tech was challenged by the Hoosiers defense in the second match of the season, as the Hokies were held to three shots in the first half and only one in the second.

• Tech tied Indiana 0-0 in Bloomington, Ind. after defeating Butler 3-0 in the season opener in Indianapolis, Ind.

PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

MITCHELL

• Sophomore Natalie Mitchell scored her second goal of the season on a penalty kick vs. JMU. Mitchell has gone 3 for 3 on penalty kicks in her collegiate career. She leads the Hokies with five goals and one assist.

• Mitchell's brace against the Eagles led the Hokies to a 2-1 victory in Newton, Mass.

• Mitchell is tied for sixth in the ACC with seven goals. She has taken 26 shots this season with 17 on goal.

• Natalie Mitchell took 52 shots in her freshman season, making three goal and eight assists.

• Mitchell went two-for-two on penalty kicks last season, scoring the first goal of the match vs. South Carolina.

DEGUZMAN / WEIR

• The Freshman Samantha DeGuzman and Anna Weir have quickly learned how to play together. The duo started in their first collegiate game in the Hokies season open versus Butler. The pair logged one goal (DeGuzman) and one assist (Weir).

• DeGuzman is second in points (10) for the Hokies having made three goals and four assists. She has logged a team-high 34 shots this season.

• DeGuzman recorded one goal and assist in the Hokies 4-1 victory over Wake Forest.

• Versus JMU, Weir scored her first collegiate goal chipping the ball over the goalkeepers head roughly 30 yards out from the goal, assisted by DeGuzman.

• Weir logged her second goal of the season against in the match against Syracuse in the 45th minute of the match. Hokies won 4-0.

SKINNER

• Goalkeeper Alia Skinner recorded her sixth shutout of the season against Syracuse, tied for second in the ACC.

• She has made 71 saves in 16 games, ranked second in the conference with a saves percentage of .826.

• Skinner recorded a season best, nine saves, in the match against Virginia.

PELKOWSKI

• Emma Pelkowski recored her first career brace in the Hokies 4-0 shutout against Syracuse. She logged two goals and one assist in the match earning her a spot on the TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Week.

• Virginia Tech has taken 81 shots on goal this season, while allowing 87 from their opponents. Tech is ranked ninth in the ACC in overall shots (172).

• The Hokies have scored 11 of 20 goals in the second half, and have a 6-1-1 record when scoring the first goal of the match. Tech has logged 93 shots in the first and 79 shots in the second.

• The Hokies are ranked seventh amongst the conferece leaders with a goals against average of 0.94. They have allowed, 15 goals in 16 games, and are fifth in saves (72).

• Tech recorded five shutouts during nonconference play.

• Hokies have an RPI ranking of 70 having already played five top-25 ranked teams.

SCOUTING THE HURRICANES

• Miami is 2-5-1 in the conference having most recent lost to Virginia 1-0. Miami has not won an ACC matchup since Sept. 24th falling 1-0 to Louisville.

• The Hurricanes are 1-6-1 on the road this season, and have an overall program record of 1-10-2 while playing at Thompson Field.

• Miami dropped a 7-2 decision to Notre Dame on Oct. 8 after heading into the half scoreless, 4-0.

• Caroline Hood leads the Hurricanes with two goals, Emma Tucker leads in assists with three.

•The Hurricanes trail behind in the conference recording 69 shots in 15 matches. The team sits last in goals in the ACC with 11. Miami has also conceded 23 goals this season, 11th in the conference.

• Miami's goalkeeper Melissa Dagenais has recorded four shutouts this season. Dagenais ranks eighth in the ACC with a goals-against-average of 1.31.

• Miami was predicted to finish 13th in the conference preseason poll.

2022 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- Haugen was recently named to the NCAA DI Women's Players to Watch List. She has been a key part of the Hokies' success having started in 52 matches since 2020. Haugen was also named to the All Atlantic Region Second Team at the end of the 2022 season.

- 2022 leading scorer Taylor Price returns to the pitch after most recently being called up to the US U18-19 Youth National Team camp. Price ended her freshman season with 8 goals and 3 assists. Named TopDrawerSoccer First Team Freshman Best XI.

- Price was named to the All-ACC Third Team and All-Freshman Team at the end of her first season.

- Sophomore Natalie Mitchell led the team last year in assists (8), the most assists made by a Tech freshman since 2006, and ended the regular season ranked 4th in the ACC in assists.

- The Hokies bring nine newcomers to the team including eight freshman and one transfer student. The freshman class was ranked seventh by TopDrawerSoccer last November.

- The Hokies started the 2022 season unbeaten after the first five games against non-conference teams.

- The Hokies won three of their first four conference matches last season, including two shutout victories over ACC opponents, No. 22 NC State (1-0), and Wake Forest (2-0).

- The Hokies' win against the Wolfpack marked the team's first win over a nationally ranked team this season.

- Tech held No. 22 NC State down to one shot on goal, with a shot advantage of 21-7. Tech won the match 1-0 with a goal from Taylor Price in the 63rd minute.

- Tech went on to defeat No. 3 North Carolina 2-1 with both Tech goals in the final 17 minutes.

- The Hokies tied Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash 3-3, with two goals from Taylor Bryan in the final 10 minutes. Taylor Price scored the first goal of the match at 30:27, her eighth goal of the season.

- Taylor Price scored the only goal of the game vs. NC State, her sixth goal of the season. Price ended the season ranked second in the ACC among freshmen with eight goals and three assists.

- Taylor Price and Natalie Mitchell were named to the midseason TopDrawerSoccer Freshmen Top 100 list. Price ranked fifth, Mitchell 11th.

- Tech showed reliance on dominating in the second half of the game, scoring over half their goals in the last 45 minutes (24 of 37).

- The Hokies scored 37 goals in 18 games averaging 2.06 per game.

- Tech's scoring offense was ranked tied for 39th in the NCAA with a scoring average of 2.06. Tech ended the regular season fifth in the ACC with 279 shots, and ranked 6th in Goals.

- Tech's goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove recorded her sixth clean sheet of the season with the win over Syracuse. Hargrove is tied for fourth in the ACC for shutouts, and seventh in saves (51).

- Virginia Tech ended the non-conference portion of their schedule 6-1-1.

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen the program's three draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Emily Gray made history in 2021 becoming the highest drafted pick at number three by North Carolina Courage. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn Mc-Bride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.
