AT THE RIM

- Kicking off the 2020-21 season Wednesday in front of the Hokie Faithful, all 250 of them, Virginia Tech will play host to Radford at noon.
- Tech, which has won two in a row against the Highlanders, leads the all-time series 8-2, which dates back to 1988.
- In the last meeting, Tech won 95-68 in 2017 behind 20 points apiece from Justin Bibbs and Kerry Blackshear Jr. (More on page 5)
- Tech has fared well in season openers since 2000, owning an 18-2 record its last 20 games.
- Tech coach Mike Young is 15-3 in home openers, including last year's 74-42 win over Coppin State on Nov. 8.
- Young has never faced Radford or RU coach Mike Jones in his 18 years of coaching.

WHO TO WATCH



- The longest-tenured Hokie, grad student Wabissa Bede returns to Blacksburg after leading the ACC in assist-turnover ratio last season (3.34).
- He also finished with the second-most assists ever by a Tech junior with 177 (Justin Robinson, 185).

- After redshirting in 2018-19, guard Tyrece Radford came upon the scene with some flash last year and returns as the Hokies' leading scorer from a year ago.
- Averaging 10.2 points and a 60.4 FG%, look for "Boots" to be one of the ACC's most efficient players this season.



LAST TIME OUT

- The Hokies took on 14th-seeded UNC in the ACC Tournament in Greensboro, North Carolina, and lost 78-56 in the first round despite 14 points from Hunter Cattoor.
- Tech did not shoot it well (29%) and was outscored in the paint 32-12.

A WIN WOULD

- Make the Hokies win their fifth straight season opener and Coach Young 2-0 in openers at Tech.
- Would extend their winning streak over Radford to three games, dating back to 2015.
- Would make Young 2-0 on Nov. 25 at Tech, as the Hokies defeated then-No. 3 Michigan State on Nov. 25 last year in Maui.

NOT THE FIRST TIME

- This will mark the second time the Hokies have opened their season taking on the Highlanders.
- The last time it took place was on Nov. 10, 2005, which was an 80-50 win for Tech in an NABC Classic game in Cassell.

MY TURN

- Coach Young this fall created a non-profit called MY TURN, which is an anti-bullying organization.
- Through this organization, Coach Young hopes to bring attention and awareness to bullying in schools, as well as prevention tactics to the community at Tech and the surrounding areas.
- Growing up in Southwest Virginia, Coach Young spent a lot of time in Cassell Coliseum with his late father, Bob Young, whose service and dedication as an educator and coach impacted many young lives in the new river valley community.
- Following in his father's footsteps, Coach Young's passion for coaching and teaching makes him a great advocate for promoting change and equality.

THAT NEW, NEW

- Tech is tied for the 12th-most newcomers in the nation, bringing in nine players this past offseason.
- Two of those guys were already on campus in Keve Aluma and Grant Yates, but had to sit out last year due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Speaking of transfers, Tech welcomed three this past summer in Cartier Diarra (Kansas State), Justyn Mutts (Delaware) and Cordell PemsI (Iowa). Mutts has two years of eligibility, while Diarra and PemsI each have one season left. However, the NCAA waived the players' eligibility that compete in winter sports, therefore all three could return an additional year.
- Then the other four players are freshmen, with three being on scholarship and one is a walk-on.
- The Hokies have the most newcomers of any team in the ACC.
- Here is how Tech ranks among high-major conferences with bringing in new players:

NOT TOO SHABBY

- Tech ranked highly in a few categories nationally last season and hopes to do the same this season, with those including being fifth in turnovers per game (9.9), fifth in assist-turnover ratio (1.48), 13th in 3-point field goals per game (9.8) and 17th in personal fouls per game (14.8).

OLDER AND WISER

- Last season, Tech was one of the youngest teams in the country (second among high-majors, trailing Utah), playing seven underclassmen in its nine-player rotation.
- This season, it got a little older and wiser with the addition of three grad transfers, as well as its core of now-sophomores having a year of experience, which should equate to a more poised Hokie bunch.
- The three grad transfers have combined for 252 games under their belts, giving the Hokies some much-needed experience.

WHAT'S NOT TO LIKE?

- KenPom has the Hokies at No. 32 out of 351 teams in its preseason rankings, which are based off of adjusted efficiency margin.
- Out of the ACC, it has Tech tabbed as the seventh best team in the league.

SMALL BUT MIGHTY

- Among high-major conference teams, there are only 35 players that are less than six feet tall, including Tech's Jalen Cone, standing at 5-foot-10.
- Of those 35, 19 of them are walk-ons, while the other 16 are on scholarship.
- In the ACC, Cone is one of eight players shorter than six feet, and is just one of five scholarship players in the league.
- Where does Cone rank among the group in points per game? He ranks sixth, averaging 8.0 last year.
- The other two in the league above him you likely have heard of – Miami (Fla.)'s Chris Lykes (15.4 ppg, 5'7") and UVA's Kihei Clark (10.8 ppg, 5'9").

FIRST-YEAR WINS

- Tech coach Mike Young tallied 16 wins his first year in Blacksburg, making him tied for the fifth-most wins by a first-year Tech coach in school history.
- The 16 wins were the most by a first-year Tech coach since 1999-00 when Ricky Stokes had 16 as well.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Wrapping up nonconference play with a win over Maryland Eastern Shore, the Hokies extended their home nonconference winning streak to 32 games, which is a school record.
- Tech is in elite company among high-major schools, sitting with the third-best win streak.

BOOTS ON THE BOARDS

- For just the third time in school history since joining the ACC in 2004, Tech had a freshman lead the team in rebounding last season when Tyrece Radford brought down 199 boards.
- The other two instances were done by household names as well, with Dorian Finney-Smith (232) in 2011-12 and Jeff Allen (251) in 2007-08 doing so.

What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

WHERE THEY AT

- Tech has 15 players on the squad who represent 10 states and two international countries (Netherlands, Nigeria), making it tied for eighth in the country for most states and countries represented on a roster this season.
- Virginia leads the way with three players – Joseph "Joe" Bamisile, Gill Williamson, Grant Yates – while Maryland has two players – Keve Aluma and Darius Maddox.
- New Mexico, Penn and UT Martin are No. 1 nationally with 15 players from different states and countries, while in the ACC, Boston College (13) is first and Florida State is tied with the Hokies for the second most in the league with 12.
- Of the 23 schools that have 12 or more players from different spots, nine are from high-major conferences, including BC, Kentucky, Butler, FSU, Iowa State, Nebraska, Tennessee, Tulane and the Hokies.

'19 CLASS OF HIGH-MAJOR COACHES

- Out of the seven high-major conferences (ACC, American, BIG EAST, B1G, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC), there were 14 head coaches hired for the 2019-20 season.
- Virginia Tech coach Mike Young was just one of six coaches that were a mid-major coach to jump up to the big leagues, joining Alabama's Nate Oats (Buffalo), Arkansas' Eric Musselman (Nevada), Tulane's Ron Hunter (Georgia State) and Washington State's Kyle Smith (San Francisco).
- Of the 14 new coaches, Young was the longest-tenured coach to leave, following his 17-year stint as the head guy at Wofford.
- The NBA saw three of its coaches jump into the college ranks, with Michigan's Juwon Howard (Miami Heat), Nebraska's Fred Hoiberg (Chicago Bulls) and Vanderbilt's Jerry Stackhouse (Memphis Grizzlies).
- In this cycle, only one assistant coach was promoted from within and that was Temple's Aaron McKie, who served as an assistant under Fran Dunphy for five seasons in Philadelphia.
- Former Hokie coach Buzz Williams, who is at Texas A&M, was one of just two coaches to jump ship and go high-major for high-major, with UCLA's Mick Cronin (Cincinnati) being the other.
- A full breakdown of the 14 coaches in the cycle is below, with the SEC welcoming the most among the seven leagues with four. The Big 12 was the lone conference not make coaching change heading into the 2019-20 season.

LAST TIME OUT VS. RADFORD

- Tech stormed off to a big halftime lead, going up 17 points at the break in Cassell and never looked back, outscoring the Highlanders by 10 points in the second half.
- Tech's Justin Bibbs and Kerry Blackshear Jr. led the charge on the offensive end, scoring 20 points each to combine for 42 percent of the Hokies' scoring.
- Though he didn't play too much, the lone Hokie that played in the game and is still on the roster is guard Wabissa Bede, who played in 10 minutes of action and did fairly well with limited minutes off the bench, tallying six points and a rebound when he was a freshman.
- The Hokies did about whatever they wanted on offense, shooting a blistering 62 percent in the win.

SCOUTING RADFORD

- The Highlanders, in somewhat similar shoes to the Hokies, welcome a bunch of newcomers to their squad this year with eight. Losing all five starters from a year ago, Radford was picked to finish sixth in the preseason Big South standings out of 11 teams.
- Mike Jones enters his 10th season as the head coach at Radford, following a two-year stint at VCU where he saw great success working under then-head coach Shaka Smart, contributing to a Final Four run in 2011. Since his arrival to the NRV, Jones has led Radford to three conference championships (two regular season) and 159 wins for the red and white.
- Radford's returning leading scorer is Chyree Walker, a 6-foot-5 forward who averaged 3.1 points and 2.7 rebounds per game last season.
- Last season, one of the reasons the Highlanders went on to win 21 games was because of their offensive rebounding ability, averaging 10.7 offensive boards a game.



GET 'EM FROM DEEP

- Hunter Cattoor started to get into a rhythm from the perimeter closing the season last year.
- The guard, who was averaging 1.4 3-point makes per game before Feb. 15, finished another level since that game versus Pitt Feb. 15 with a 2.9 mark on a 47.4 percent clip over his last eight outings.
- So, though his attempts were about the same with one more a pop, he made more at a higher rate, making him a reliable threat off the bench, and is someone to watch heading into this year for another jump in shooting percentages coming most likely.
- In his last game, with maybe a glimpse of what's to come, he hit four 3s against North Carolina.

TEAM ON THEIR BACK

- Of the 51.7 points from last season, the Hokies return 36.2 points from that (70.0 percent) bunch.

THE LONE SWEEP

- Last season, Tech swept Clemson with defeating the Tigers once on the road (Nov. 5) and once at home (March 4) for its lone sweep of a team on the year.
- It marked just the second-ever over the Tigers (2017).
- The Hokies had six players hit a 3-pointer, including four players hitting at least two.

MAKE IT RAIN

- Tech let it rip with six guys hitting a 3-pointer against Clemson in its final home game of the 2019-20 season, which is a trend it accomplished a few times that season.
- In their 32 games last season, the Hokies had nine games with six or more guys hitting a triple and went 6-3 in those games.
- Tech had six guys hit a 3 against Coppin State (11/8) and USC Upstate (11/13), marking the first time that has happened in consecutive games since December 2018 vs. Central Connecticut State (1st) and VMI (5th).
- Since 2010, the Hokies have had 31 games in which they have had at least six players make a 3. In those games, they are 26-5 (.839).
- The most they've had hit a 3 is eight players in a game, which has happened just once since 2010 (Houston Baptist on Nov. 21, 2017).

LEADIN' OFF THE BENCH

- Last season, Tech had two players come off the bench and score in double figures seven times in the Mike Young era.
- Interestingly enough, it did not happen at all in 2018-19 and just once the year before in 2017-18 (vs. Iowa in ACC/B1G Challenge).
- So, expect more of the same with a deeper bench in Young's second season in Blacksburg.

STEPPING UP DOWN THE STRETCH

- Guard Tyrece Radford put together his best stretch towards the end of the season, leading the Hokies in scoring five of their last 12 games since Jan. 28, 2019 at Miami (Fla.).
- Radford played well above his averages over the last 12 games, especially in scoring, with being more aggressive (hence the uptick in attempts).

A NEW RECORD

- Though it's not one to bang your chest about, the Hokies did set the most 3-point attempts taken in school history last year with 896. The previous high was set in 2018-19 of 831.
- However, it did not accumulate to the most made 3s in school history, though, with it being the second most ever made with 315, which led the ACC.

BENCH MOB

- The Hokies' bench scored 30 points in three straight ACC games (Miami, Duke, UVA), which is something that had happened only twice in the ACC era ('04). They had an ACC-high 36 points vs. UVA on Feb. 26, 2019.
- The other occasion took place in 2015 during a four-game stretch (UVA, Pitt, WF, 'Cuse).
- Some of that bench will be expected to take on a larger this season, with potentially starting.

- Before the matchup with the Cavaliers, that was the longest active streak in the ACC. It would go on to finish tied for the fifth-longest in the league.
- Of those streaky shooters last year, only two return in Alleyne and Syracuse's Boeheim.

LET IT GO

- Tech went 14-2 last year when holding a lead with five minutes to go. The two losses came at Boston College on Jan. 25 and Feb. 19 vs. Miami.

LAST TIME UPDATE

- The last time section of the notes took a dent after the triple-overtime thriller versus Miami (Fla.) that got over at 11:46 p.m.
- The Hokies scored 90-plus points for the second time in 2019-20 and first since their 55-point win over Maryland Eastern Shore on Dec. 29, 92-37.
- On the other end of the spectrum, Tech gave up over 100 points for the first time since Jan. 21, 2019 at North Carolina, a 103-82 loss. Forty-two games had passed in between that time frame.

DISHIN' THE ROCK

- The Hokies went 4-1 last year when racking up more than 20 assists as a team in a game.
- Of the five, two of those came against Syracuse, which, likely, was due to the Orange's 2-3 zone.
- The Highlanders are expected to play a little bit of 2-3 zone on Wednesday, so look for Tech to potentially hit its stride when Radford does so.

OVERTIME HISTORY LESSON

- When the Hokies played in their first overtime game in 2019-20, it had been a while since they last played some 'free basketball.'
- The extra session vs. UNC on Jan. 22 marked the first time Tech played OT since the 2019 ACC Tournament against Florida State, a 65-63 heartbreaking loss.
- When the Tar Heels and Hokies went into double overtime, it marked the first time since 2017 versus Virginia, an 80-78 win, that it went into two OTs.
- Tech two weeks later played in overtime with Boston College and fell at home.
- Then against Miami (Fla.), the Hokies went into triple overtime for the first time since 1983, a four-point loss at West Virginia, 90-86.
- It was Tech's fourth triple overtime (it has never been to four or more), tying its longest game ever. In real time, the game went 2 hours & 41 minutes.
- The contest was the longest game ever at Cassell, as the other three 3OT games were not at home.

ON THE GLASS

- The Hokies went a solid 8-1 when out-rebounding their opponents on the glass last season.
- With more added depth down low, expect those nine instances last year to increase, with the addition of Keve Aluma (6-9, Wofford), Justyn Mutts (6-7, Delaware) and Cordell Pemsil (6-9, Iowa) making their presence felt on the boards.

PRETTY RARE

- Tech, which averaged 68.8 points per game last year, went 11-3 when it scored 70 or more.
- The Hokies scored 70-plus versus Boston College and lost on Feb. 8, marking their first time doing so since Nov. 27 when they took on BYU at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational in a 90-77 setback.
- Then when they scored 95 against Miami (Fla.) in a triple-overtime thriller, it marked their third loss in that fashion.

CHECKING IN ON NET LAST YEAR

- The NET rankings came out on Monday, Dec. 16, 2019, and the Hokies were at No. 62. Tech went 3-7 against quadrant I teams last year and went 4-9 the year before that.
- Tech's best win of the season came against then-No. 3/3 Michigan State, which finished seventh in NET.
- Tech finished the season ranked No. 92.
- In 2018-19, the Hokies, after making a run to the Sweet 16, finished in the final NET rankings at 12th.
- Ironically, Wofford, which was coached by Mike Young at the time, came in two spots below at No. 14.

WELL DONE, NAW

- Former Hokie and New Orleans Pelican Nickeil Alexander-Walker was named to TeamWorld in the 2020 NBA Rising Stars Game last year, which he played on Valentine's Day in Chicago.
- Alexander-Walker tallied six points, two rebounds, four assists one block and a steal in 20 minutes off the bench.
- Team USA won 151-131 in front of over 20,000.

GET IT GOING FROM DOWNTOWN

- Tech was one of the better shooting teams from beyond the arc in the country last season and a big reason why is because it had multiple guys that can stroke it.
- Tech ranked 13th nationally in 3-point field goals made per game with 9.8 and was one of only four schools in a high-major conference to average 9.8 or more makes a game.

BENCH MADE STRIDES

- After Tech's bench was essentially non-existent vs. Chattanooga on Dec. 11 (season-low 5 points), it woke up and ripped off three straight games of scoring 30 or more points on Dec. 15, 21 & 29.
- During that stretch, the Hokies' reserves averaged 40.3 points per game after scoring a combined 121 points, including tying a season-high 49 vs. UMES.
- Tech's bench was made up of four players, with three of the four being freshmen.
- In ACC play, the Hokies' bench averaged 21.7 points per game during the 20-game stretch, with an ACC-high of 36 points at versus [RV/RV] Virginia on Feb. 26.
- With much added depth and potentially rotating 10 players a game, watch out for Tech's bench to be a strong suit once again in 2020-21.

DISHIN' IT OUT

- Tech's Wabissa Bede showed his flashes of being one of the better point guards in the land, racking up seven games of owning eight or more assists last season.
- The mark made him one of only 14 high-major players to do so, and was one of only two in the ACC. He tied for 23rd nationally among all players.

COMEBACK KIDS

- Though it was tough on the fans, with all the ups and downs that come with digging yourself out of a hole, the Hokies found a way to do so, facing double-digit deficits in three ACC games and completing the comeback last season.
- The Hokies came back from a 12-point deficit vs. North Carolina. And then previously double-digit deficits two games in a row (at 'Cuse, vs. NC State), marking the first time doing so since 2017.
- Tech trailed 10-0 to start NC State, then ripped off a 13-0 run to take a lead it would not relent.
- Earlier in the week at Syracuse, the 11-point deficit was Tech's largest comeback of the season and marked its biggest comeback since Nov. 18, 2018 versus then-No. 23 Purdue (12 points).
- The last time Tech had consecutive games of trailing by 10 or more and coming back to win was on Feb. 12, 2017 versus Virginia (14 points) and Feb. 14, 2017 against Pitt (13).

NBA & G-LEAGUE

NAW'S FIRST SEASON

- Nickeil Alexander-Walker has left his mark on Virginia Tech and is working on making a name for himself at the next level with the New Orleans Pelicans.
- A first-round draft pick last summer, the Toronto native played in 47 games for the Pels in the 2019-20 NBA season. On Feb. 26, he was moved down to the Erie Bayhawks, then came back up when the bubble in Orlando started.
- He scored a career-high 27 points against the Miami Heat on Saturday, Nov. 16. He followed it up the next game on Sunday, Nov. 17 with 19 points, five rebounds and four assists versus the Warriors.
- The guard had a big summer with the team, starring on its NBA Summer League squad with having numerous 20-point performances in Las Vegas.

- Robinson, who signed as an undrafted free agent after the NBA Draft concluded with the Washington Wizards, was waived on Jan. 4.
- Hill signed with the Hornets this summer on a two-way deal, but was released in early November. However, he landed nicely on his feet, with now playing on the NAZ Suns, the G-League affiliate of the Phoenix Suns.
- Justin Bibbs, who plays for the Boston Celtics' affiliate (Maine Red Claws), hit a game-winner on Jan. 19, 2019, finishing with 15 points and six assists.

MEDIA GAMEDAY PROCEDURES

Parking

Media members who have been approved to come to Cassell Coliseum and work on gamedays will have their names placed on an approved parking list for Lot 1, which is across from Cassell off of Washington Street and Beamer Way.

Health and Safety Protocols

Temperature checks will be administered at the west entrance of Cassell Coliseum (which is across the main parking lot - Lot 1) and individuals must affirm that they do not feel ill or have been in contact with an individual who has the COVID-19 virus.

A mask must be worn at all times on the arena grounds and in the press area. Media representatives must bring their own mask that fully covers their nose and mouth, plus any other personal protective equipment they wish to use.

All media will be required to enter Cassell Coliseum through the west entrance.

Credentials

Outside media and one pool videographer and photographer are currently permitted at Cassell Coliseum in a limited capacity.

There will be no season credentials for the 2020-21 season, with single-game credentials made available on-site and will not be mailed.

Media, after getting their temperature checked outside of Cassell at the west entrance and it being a successful screening, will receive their credential and may enter the arena. Please bring your own lanyard. The media entrance/credential pickup area will open 90 minutes prior to tipoff.

Refreshments/Food

Upon entering the facility, media will proceed to the section 18 concession stand. A box meal and drink will be distributed pregame.

Seating

Individuals must sit in their assigned seat at the location of their place card on press row. Seats will be properly distanced. To the greatest extent possible, everyone must adhere to physical distancing guidelines while moving within the press area and must wear a mask at all times - this is non-negotiable, and failure to adhere will result in your ejection from the press area.

Media Room

Please note, the media workroom will not be available for use this season. All work pregame and postgame must be done at the media member's assigned seat on press row. Please plan for very limited media services on press row. Each individual will receive a flip card and game notes for both teams at their seat location. Paper copies of stats will not be distributed during or after the game.

ACC Video Portal

The pool videographer, which will rotate between WDBJ, WSL5 and WFXR, will provide video highlights postgame to the ACC's media portal. Media must follow the ACC's guidelines for use of highlights.

ACC Pool Photography

The ACC will operate a Box account for sharing pool photography from each game. Matt Gentry of the Roanoke Times, like Tech football home games, will upload and share photos that media will be able to use.

Court Enclosure Access

Aside from the pool photographer and videographer, approved university staff and the televising network approved personnel, no other media representatives are permitted within the court enclosure. This includes all times, including pregame, halftime and postgame, as well as during the competition.

Wi-Fi

For the pool photographer and videographer that may be shooting on the court, please use the network called 'Courtside' (password is VTCourtside2016!!). And for the media up in press row, please use the network called 'Pressrow' (password is VTathletics2019!).

Postgame Interviews

All postgame interviews will be conducted through Zoom, with no in-person interviews taking place. Select student-athletes (go first) and head coach Mike Young (second) will be available roughly 10 minutes after the game for both home and away events.

Links for the video conference will be provided to media ahead of time. The visiting team postgame press conference Zoom link will be distributed to media ahead of time as well.

Please utilize headphones to listen to the postgame media sessions to eliminate background noise. Tech athletics will be sure to have no music played in Cassell during the postgame interviews.

- Tech's Wabissa Bede was one of the best point guards in the nation in sharing the rock and limiting his miscues last year, boasting the sixth-best assist-turnover ratio nationally with a 3.31 mark.
- All six players return this year.

EFFICIENT AS THEY GET

- If you throw minimums out the window (at least 20% of possessions used, eg.), Tyrece Radford ranked No. 17 in the country in offensive efficiency rating last year with a 126.1 clip, according to KenPom. He finished shooting a team-high 60.4 percent on the year.

SOMETHING CLICKED

- When Jalen Cone subbed in at the Dome Jan. 7, 2020, he caught fire and hasn't slowed down since.
- Cone went on to score a career-high 19 points on 5-of-7 shooting, with two four-point plays.
- Before he went scoreless at Miami (Fla.), he averaged 13.7 points and shot 50.0 percent over those six games, way up from his season total of 8.1 points a game and 46.4 % from the field. He scored in double figures in five of the six games.
- So what clicked? Cone said in his postgame interview on ACC Network at Syracuse that he stayed patient and his confidence grew with each shot after preparing for moments like that.

THE FIRST

- Since the Hokies joined in the ACC in 2004, Mike Young became the first Tech coach to win two of his first three road games last year.
- Young earned wins on the road at Clemson on Nov. 5 in the season opener and at Syracuse Jan. 7.

FRESHMEN LEADING THE CHARGE

- Tech has had its freshmen carry the load last year, with the Hokies finishing ranked fourth nationally in highest percentage of minutes played by freshmen (63.9%) and second among high-majors (Memphis).
- The Hokies also ranked second nationally in percentage of points scored by freshmen (74.8%), which was first among high-majors.
- With majority of those freshmen back, now as sophomores, expect big things from the sophomore class this season.

ONE OF THE BEST IN 2019

- Tech coach Mike Young fielded one of the better records in the 2019 calendar year, sitting tied for second in Division I versus Division I games.
- Young racked up 20 wins at Wofford, getting 16 in conference play, three in the SoCon tourney and one in the NCAA Tournament, while 10 Ws at Tech.

VERY FEW MISCUES

- Over the last 11 seasons in Division I, there have been 85 games when a team commits two or less turnovers, including Tech's game against Maryland Eastern Shore last year. It only happened nine times that season.
- Tech played 35 minutes of turnover-free basketball before it coughed up its first miscue, as it was on pace to be just the second team in the last decade to complete a game with zero TOs (Wisconsin, 2015 vs. Iowa).
- A staple of Mike Young's system, Tech finished second in the ACC last year in turnovers per game with 9.9, trailing Notre Dame (9.8).

FRESHIES BEYOND THE ARC

- Since 1992, according to Sports-Reference, Tech became the only team to have four freshmen make at least 49 triples in a single season last year.
- Of the mighty four, three return with Landers Nolley II transferred to Memphis this past offseason.
- As said on page one, those three, now sophomores, are in the top 12 of the ACC coming back this year of made 3s.

RECAPPIN' THE MSU WIN

- The win over then-No. 3/3 Michigan State in Maui last year marked coach Mike Young's first ranked win at Tech, his first win over coach Tom Izzo and the Hokies' first-ever victory over Michigan State.
- It was Tech's second straight win over a ranked Big Ten team, ironically, following its win over then-No. 23/22 Purdue last season at the Charleston Classic in the title game.
- Marked Tech's second straight game of coming up with a win against the AP's No. 3 team, which it hadn't done since 1962 (Kentucky) and '64 (Vandy).
- First win over a top-10 team during a nonconference game since Dec. 3, 1983 vs. No. 7 NC State and its first over a top-five team since Dec. 12, 1964 vs. No. 3 Vanderbilt.

ACC REPPIN' WELL

- When the Hokies took down then-No. 3/3 Michigan State in Maui in 2019, they joined two other ACC teams that have taken down a top-10 foe, joining then-No. 4/4 Duke over then-No. 3/3 Kansas and then-[RV/RV] Florida State over then-No. 6/6 Florida.
- However, Tech was the only team of the three to not be in either (AP, Coaches) Top 25 poll or receiving votes, thus the biggest upset.

ON COVER OF LETHAL WEAPON

- The Hokies started 5-0 in back-to-back seasons in 2018-19 and 2019-20, marking the first time Tech has done that since the falls of 1981 and 1982.
- The starts for those teams were 9-0 ('81) and 7-0 ('82), while Tech began 2018-19 5-0 before falling at Penn State in the ACC/B1G Challenge.
- Tech started last season 6-0 before losing to Dayton in the semifinals of the Maui invite.

565 AND COUNTING

- Tech has hit a 3-pointer in 565 straight games.
- Since the 3-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one 3 in all but three games.
- The last time Tech didn't record a 3-pointer in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

EIGHT-HUNDID

- In November of 2019, when the Hokies took down USC Upstate, it marked the 800th men's basketball contest in Cassell Coliseum.

RAINING 3s

- The Hokies were pretty good from downtown last season, hitting the most 3s in the ACC (315).
- On Nov. 20, 2019, they broke two records with their 21 triples against Delaware State.
- The school record, which stood at 18 against Central Connecticut State on Dec. 1, 2018, fell, while the ACC record of 20 set by Florida State against Maine on Dec. 8, 2007, was broken too.
- And, to top it off, Tech did its feat of 21 with a longer way to go, with the new 3-point line distance put into play last season.

LET'S KEEP IT GOING

- Tech hasn't lost a home nonconference game since Dec. 30, 2015 against West Virginia (88-63), owning a 32-game streak.
- The previous best was 23, which was set twice from 1980-84 and 2005-09. The current streak began on Nov. 11, 2016, against Maine.

CARRY THE LOAD

- When Tech had three players (Jalen Cone, Nahiem Alleyne, Isaiah Wilkins) hit five 3-pointers against Delaware State, it marked the first time that three players have hit at least four 3s in a game since Nov. 17, 2017, when Tech beat Washington 103-79 in Madison Square Garden.
- It also was the first time in at least a decade Tech had three players with five triples to their name.
- It marked the first time a high-major has had three players with five or more 3s in a game since March 4, 2019, when Virginia had Kyle Guy (8), De'Andre Hunter (5) and Ty Jerome (5) accomplished the feat against Syracuse.
- Wilkins has transferred to Wake Forest, but both Cone (64 3s) and Alleyne (49) return.

SHARING THE ROCK

- According to KenPom, a Virginia Tech alum by the way, Wabissa Bede was one of the best in the nation in assist rate (assists divided by FGs made by player's teammates while he is on the court.)
- He ranked 29th nationally and eighth among high-majors with a 34.9 assist rate.

SO, WHY DID THEY PLAYING WELL?

- If you look at how the Hokies played Mike Young's first season, one thing stood out - very few turnovers.
- According to KenPom, Tech had a turnover percentage of 14.7, good for fifth nationally.
- Tech got a good amount of its points from the 3-point line, sitting No. 5 for averaging 42.8 percent of its points distribution from 3-land in 2019-20.

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

- Mike Young grew up in Radford, Virginia, which is approximately 20 minutes away from Blacksburg, the home of the Hokies.
- Ironically enough, one of Young's first-ever college basketball games as a kid was a Virginia Tech game inside Cassell Coliseum, a place where Young now calls his home.

HE'S MORE THAN A POINT GUARD

- Known as a stocky guy, weighing 200 lbs and being called a fire hydrant by Jay Bilas, Wabissa Bede has been a force on the boards so far, as well as playing the distributor role, a role he played sparingly the last two years with the all-time assists leader, Justin Robinson, running the point.
- In his game against Coppin State in 2019, Bede almost did something that hasn't happened in three years, a double-double with just rebounds and assists, collecting 10 assists and nine rebounds. (Chris Clarke on Dec. 17, 2016, triple-double).
- And speaking of Robinson, the last time a player had 10 assists after Bede's night versus Coppin State was when Robinson tallied the single-game school record with 13 versus Central Connecticut State on Dec. 1, 2018. Bede dished out 10 again a few weeks later vs. Delaware State on Nov. 20.

TIME TO STEP UP

- The Hokies lost four letterwinners from a year ago, including their leading scorer in Landers Nolley II (15.5 ppg), who ended up at Memphis.
- Tech coach Mike Young welcomes nine newcomers, including three grad transfers who are poised to contribute right away.

- The Hokies sold out 11 games last season, including eight ACC games. The eight were Duke, NC State, Syracuse, UNC, Pitt, BC, FSU and UVA.
- Virginia Tech ACC home games against Virginia, Wake Forest, Syracuse, Duke, Louisville, Georgia Tech and Miami (Fla.) sold out in 2018-19.
- The Hokies sold out nine games in the 2017-18 season, including seven of the nine home ACC games, a mark that equaled 2018-19.
- Now, with Covid-19 in play, the Hokies will not be selling out any games this season, with a capacity set at 250 people, per a mandate by the Commonwealth of Virginia.

- When Mike Young and Co. took down the Tigers in Clemson in last year's season opener, he became just one of 71 active coaches at the time in Division I to have 300 or more wins.

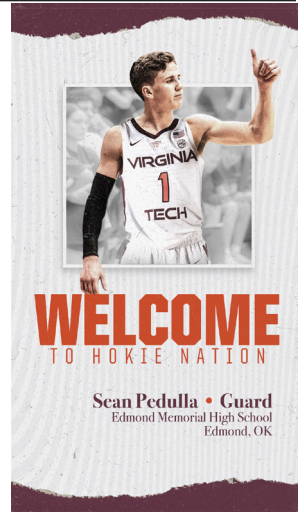

Having just three players returning who saw minutes the previous year in 2018-19 on the team, Young had to act quickly when hired on April 7, 2019 and build a roster to compete in the best conference in the nation. Adding a staff and six scholarship players in a hurry, Young's first season in Blacksburg started off with a bang, as the Hokies went down to South Carolina and defeated Clemson in style to give Young his first Hokie and ACC win, as well as his 300th career victory.

Another big-time W came at the prestigious Maui Jim Maui Invitational against then-No. 3 Michigan State. On ESPN2 with Dan Shulman and Jay Bilas on the call, the young Hokies (7 of the 9 rotation players were underclassmen) pulled off one of the bigger upsets of the season with a 71-66 win. With the upset of Sparty, it marked the first time since 1964 that Tech beat a top-five team in nonconference play.

Despite being the shortest and second-youngest squad among high-major conference teams, Young and Co. tallied 16 wins to make it the most victories by a first-year head coach at Tech since 1999-00 and tied for the fifth-most wins ever by a first-year Hokie coach. He also became the first coach to win two of his first three road ACC games in school history.

Leaning on a mix of young and old in his first season, Young developed junior Wabissa Bede into one of the finer point guards in the country, as Bede would go on to finish with the sixth-best assist-to-turnover ratio nationally (3.34) and first in the ACC. And under Young's tutelage, redshirt freshman Tyrece Radford blossomed into one of the better all-around players in the league, with being one of only two players in the ACC to average 10 points, six rebounds and shoot over 60 percent from the field.

Under the direction of Young, the Hokies put together some new records during the 2019-20 season. On Nov. 20 versus Delaware State, Tech racked up 21 3-pointers, marking the most in school history and the most ever by an ACC team. Speaking of 3s, the 315 hit last season were the second-most in school history.

Four freshmen hit 49 or more 3-pointers, which was the most by any program in over the last 25 years. Behind the young bucks, Tech finished 13th nationally in 3-pointers made per game with 9.9 triples a contest, which was the most in school history.

Utilizing its freshmen on the offensive end last year, Tech finished with its freshmen averaging 50.7 points per game, which is the fourth-most in ACC history behind Duke's 2018-19, 2017-18, 1982-83 teams.

Making sure his team played the game the right way by limiting miscues, Young's prowess showed on Dec. 29 when Tech committed only two turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore to tie a school record. The Hokies would go on to finish fourth in the nation in fewest turnovers committed per game (9.9).

The Radford, Virginia native joined the Hokies after a record-setting 17-year tenure as the head coach at Wofford. The Terriers posted a 30-5 overall record in 2018-19, including a perfect 18-0 mark in Southern Conference play, and registered a convincing 84-68 win over Seton Hall in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

The 2019 Sporting News Coach of the Year, Young built the Terriers into one of the Southern Conference's preeminent programs and a perennial NCAA Tournament participant. He guided Wofford to five NCAA Tournament berths over the past 10 seasons and five Southern Conference championships. In addition to the on-court success, 100 percent of Young's student-athletes at Wofford who completed their eligibility graduated.

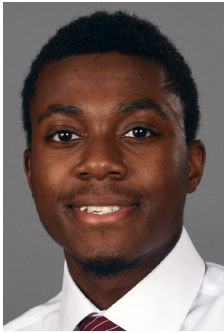
