#### TECH TO BE TESTED ON THE ROAD THIS WEEK VERSUS RANKED FOES

##### The Hokies continue a tough stretch with four ranked foes in five matches

- Virginia Tech is in the midst of a four-ranked opponents in five-match stretch that started with the team registering a 1-0 shutout against No. 6 Virginia last Thursday. It marked the team's first victory over a top 10 program since Nov. 8, 2013 (vs. No. 1 Virginia, 4-2 in the ACC Championship semifinal).

- Prior to that victory, the Hokies had not beaten a ranked foe since Oct. 4, 2015, when Tech went on the road and beat No. 22 Duke (4-2). The team was 0-9-5 since.

- All-time, the Hokies are 29-80-13 (29.1 win percentage) against ranked foes, but have been better under Adair over the past eight seasons at 16-33-7 (34.8).

- This will be the 15th all-time meeting versus Boston College and the 17th against the Blue Devils.

##### McGlynn is Defensive Player of the Week, continues shutout streak

- With her efforts last week, clean sheets over No. 6 Virginia and Pittsburgh, Tech goalkeeper Mandy McGlynn was named the league's Defensive Player of the Week.

- It was the second ACC Defensive Player of the Week honor this year for McGlynn, as she earned the first on Aug. 21. It's the third of her career, as she was once named last year on Oct. 3.

- With the selection, McGlynn became the first Tech women's soccer player ever to earn two "player of the week" honors in the same season, regardless of conference, while the three in her career match her for the most ever, as well, regardless of league.

- Only two other Hokies have ever earned multiple honors in their careers - Murielle Tiernan, who picked up three ACC weekly awards at Tech (Sept. 16, 2014, Aug. 24, 2015 and Sept. 6, 2016), and Mallory Soldner, who earned a BIG EAST (Sept. 15, 2003) and an ACC (Oct. 24, 2005) weekly honor.

- McGlynn has posted six shutouts in her last seven matches and has increased her career total to 19 to go along with 25 wins. Both are third all-time at the school and closing in on Soldner, who sits second in both at 20 and 28 respectively.

- McGlynn has not been scored on in almost 296 minutes - the third longest streak ever for a Tech goalkeeper against ACC opponents. However, it's not her longest stretch, which is 309:16 set last year (Sept. 24-Oct. 8). The all-time leader is Dayle Colpitts, who went 359:34 during the 2013 season (Sept. 12-26) and also owns the school record for most shutouts in a single year with 11 that season.

##### Hokies post three straight victories, all by shutout

- The Hokies were the only ACC team to pick up six points over the past week and have now won three straight ACC matches, all by shutout.

- The Hokies three-match winning streak in conference is the team's longest since 2015, when they won four straight, and the three consecutive clean sheets marks just the second time ever Tech has shut out three straight ACC foes (Sept. 15-22, 2013).

- Tech's 3-1 record to open the ACC schedule ties for its second-best ever start in league play (2009, 4-0; 2013 and 2015, 3-1).

## WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

## JUST "VIRGINIA TECH", PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech." Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as "Virginia Tech." VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT, VA Tech or Virginia Tech University are **not recognized names and should not be used.**



McGlynn up to seven clean sheets in 2018

- This season, Hokies' goalkeeper Mandy McGlynn has allowed just seven goals through 1,140 minutes played, notching seven wins and seven shutouts.

- Her seven clean sheets tie her for the second-most ever in a single season at the school, behind Dayle Colpitts (11, 2013), and ties her season-high best of seven, which she posted last year.

- Of note on those seven goals surrendered, one of them was a penalty kick (vs. High Point, 8/26), one was an own goal (at Alabama, 8/30) and one was off a free kick (at Florida State, 9/20).

- Already this season, McGlynn tied a career-best of three straight shutouts (done twice), Sept. 2-10 and her current streak. During the first run, she did not allow a goal in 368:24 consecutive minutes (Aug. 30-Sept. 20), a career long, regardless of opponent.

- McGlynn's longest overall stretch of not allowing a goal (non-consecutive playing minutes) is 469:13 from Aug. 20 to Sept. 4, 2017.

- McGlynn has been climbing the Tech all-time charts for goalkeepers in six overall categories (see page 5 for current list).

Brown, Gray and Diana net their firsts of 2019

- In Sunday's win at Miami (9/23), Allyson Brown and Emily Gray each scored their first goals of the 2019 season.

- For Brown, her tally came 8:23 into the match, the fastest goal for the Hokies this season. The previous best was scored by Jordan Hemmen (22:52) versus High Point (8/26).

- Brown's goal was the fastest goal scored by Tech versus an ACC opponent since Candace Cephers' goal versus Miami on Oct. 17, 2015 (5:55).

- It was also the fastest goal scored on the road versus an ACC opponent since Laila Gray's goal at Wake Forest on Oct. 8, 2015 (6:39).

- It was Brown's fourth goal of her career and it was her first game winner.

- Gray scored her first collegiate goal off an assist from classmate Emmalee McCarter, who notched her first collegiate point.

- Kristina Diana notched an insurance goal in Sunday's win over Pittsburgh (9/30), her first of the year, but fourth of her career. She also added an assist on the game winner, to give her a career-best three-point game against the Panthers.

- Diana leads the team in career points with 14, which includes six career assists. She and Gray are tied for the team lead with three assists this season.

Starting Streaks on the line

- Last year, six Hokies started all 18 matches for the team, however just half of those players returned for the 2018 season.

- Junior Jaylyn Thompson currently holds the longest consecutive starts streak on the team at 40 straight matches, starting the final 10 during the 2016 season, all 18 last year and all 10 of 2018.

- Junior Mandy McGlynn and senior Alia Abu El Hawa were the other two returners who started all 18 contests in 2017

- McGlynn's streak is now at 30 - having started the last match of 2016 and all 12 this season, however Abu El Hawa's streak ended at 23 after missing the Georgia game (9/2).

- Junior Jordan Hemmen started all 17 matches she appeared in last season, while starting the last 16 consecutively and is now at 28 straight starts.

Playing all 1,140 minutes

- With three double overtime ties this season for

Tech, the team has logged 1,140 minutes of action on the field in 12 matches, an average of 95 minutes per match, the most in the ACC.

- Miami has played 1,128:25 minutes this season (four overtimes, two ties) in 11 matches, for a 94 per game average.

- Two Hokies have played every minute of those matches - Mandy McGlynn and Kelsey Irwin.

- Jaylyn Thompson (1,135), Jordan Hemmen (1,105) are the only other Hokies to top more than 1,000 minutes played this year.

Freshmen starts and appearances

- Twelve games into the 2018 season and five players have started every match - the four in the previous note and freshman Emily Gray.

- The Hokies welcomed 11 freshmen into the program for the season and nine have combined to make 88 appearances, including 43 starts.

- Kiersten Hening, Karlie Johnson, Emmalee McCarter and Emma Steigerwald have each played in all 12 matches, while Molly Feighan and Grace Sklopan have 11 games played.

- McCarter has started 10 times, Hening nine, while Steigerwald has five and Feighan and Johnson have three starts

- Mathilda Lindström made her collegiate debut at Alabama (8/30) and has played four games. Sarah Smith saw her first action against ETSU (9/10) and has appeared in two matches.

Johnson scores Tech's first goal of 2018

- After the Hokies were held scoreless in their first match, freshman Karlie Johnson ended Tech's scoring drought in the second game of the season with an equalizing goal in the 38th minute against the Hoyas.

- For Johnson, it was the first goal of her collegiate career, but she also became the first freshman to score Tech's first goal of the season since 2009.

- To open that season, Kelly Conheaney tallied the first Hokies goal of the year in the ninth minute in the season opener on Aug. 23 against High Point.

- Johnson currently leads the Hokies in goals (5) and points (10) also leads the team with two game winners.

Freshman leading the team in goals/points

- Speaking of Johnson leading the team in both goals and points, the last freshman to do that was the Hokies' all-time leading scorer Murielle Tiernan (2013-16) who had 11 goals and 27 points in her first season on campus.

- Interestingly, since Tech has been a member of the ACC (since 2004), freshmen have led the team at the end of the season in goals scored six times - Tiernan, Ashley Meier (8, 2012), Marika Gray (8, 2007), Emily Jukich (7, 2006), Laurie Beth Puglisi (5, 2005) and Ashley Stinson (17, 2004).

- During the same time frame, Tech has been led by freshmen in points five times - Tiernan, Meier (19), Gray (22), Puglisi (11) and Stinson (39).

Irwin registers multi-goal game

- Kelsey Irwin scored a pair of goals in the Hokies' 3-0 win at Villanova (9/7), which included her first ever game-winning goal, and her first ever multi-goal match effort.

- She became the first Hokie with a multi-goal game since Oct. 9, 2016 when Murielle Tiernan scored twice in a 3-2 victory at Boston College, the last of the nine in her collegiate career.

- Of note, Tiernan is the Hokies' all-time leading scorer with 49 and is first in points (112) as well.

THOMPSON FIELD HOME OF THE HOKIES

Thompson Field serves as the home of the Tech men's and women's soccer teams as well as the lacrosse team. Located in the center of the Tech athletics complex, the facility ranks as one of the finest for both soccer and lacrosse in the ACC.

Located across from Lane Stadium, the Hokies' football home, Thompson Field was completed in the fall of 2003 and dedicated in 2008 in the name of Sandra D. Thompson, a longtime supporter of women's athletics at Tech.

The field is a bluegrass playing surface and measures approximately 75 by 120 yards. It is equipped with an underground irrigation and drainage system that allows for it to be ready for play quickly following rainstorms. The complex also features a wireless scoreboard, and a permanent Hubbell lighting system allowing for night games.

The athletics department has gradually made improvements since the venue opened in 2003. In 2005, workers completed a new restroom facility for the field, and during the summer of 2008, a new game operations center was erected atop the stadium above the fans.

The approximately 900-square foot facility includes two broadcast booths for TV or radio broadcasts. The center has two covered areas devoted to broadcasting and/or videographers' cameras, and there is a large working area for media members covering the Hokies.

The climate-controlled facility contains a state-of-the-art sound system and Ethernet capability. The Internet-ready facility allows Tech's official athletics website, hokiesports.com, to originate live audio broadcasts and live stats of the Hokies' matches from the press box. Above the grandstand is a wired camera deck.

Between each team's bench area is the Sandy D. Thompson Press Box. Formerly the press operations center for the field, the facility is now used as a halftime room for game officials and as an auxiliary area for press and game operations.

Thompson Field, which has been expanded since it was opened, now features approximately 2,028 bench-back seats, where each fan has an unobstructed view of the playing surface. Spacious area around the field allows for nearly 1,500 more fans to watch games.

McGlynn's first ACC DPW honor

- Announced on Aug. 21 by the ACC, Tech junior goalkeeper Mandy McGlynn shared the ACC Women's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week honor with North Carolina senior defender Julia Ashley.

- McGlynn posted her 13th career shutout at Tech saving seven shots in a 0-0 double overtime draw in the Hokies' season opener against San Diego (8/17).

- Her seven saves were tied for the third-most in a match in her career and was the most in the ACC opening weekend. She followed that up with four saves against No. 22 Georgetown in a 1-1 tie (8/19).

- The Jacksonville, Florida native was the only goalie in the ACC to play back-to-back double overtime games in the first weekend leading all goalkeepers with 220 minutes played. The effort came off her just returning to Blacksburg on Aug. 15 and first training with the team on Thursday (8/16) after her U-20 FIFA World Cup appearance in France.

Hokies started 2018 with two draws, added a third at Georgia

- In their prior 25 seasons, the Hokies had never opened a campaign with back-to-back ties.

- Tech has already played three overtime matches this season after setting a school record with seven overtime games last year, going 1-1-5. The five ties set a single-season school record.

- The Hokies have already earned a draw in each of their three overtime matches and sit at 0-0-3.

- In its history, the school record for back-to-back draws is two, now done six times, while Tech has played back-to-back overtime matches 13 times.

- The most consecutive overtime games played in a single season is four - from Oct. 9-23, 2016 (Tech went 1-1-2 in those four) and IF you went back to last season, when the Hokies finished the season with back-to-back overtime matches in their last two, the streak also reached four as well (Tech is 0-1-3).

Three milestones reached this season

- Sunday's win at Miami (9/23) was Tech head coach Chugger Adair's 100th victory in his coaching career. His overall mark at the times was 100-42-18.

- With its 3-0 victory at Villanova on Sept. 7, the Hokies chalked up their 250th career win in program history, reaching the milestone in its 505th overall match.

- Tech opened its 26th season of women's soccer with a pair of draws against San Diego (8/17) and then-No. 22 Georgetown (8/19). The Sunday match against the Hoyas was the 500th match in school history. In those first 500 games, Tech held a 247-210-43 overall record.

Tech in season and home openers

- Overall, the Hokies are now 16-7-3 in season openers, are unbeaten in 10 straight (9-0-1; had won nine straight before this year's season-opening tie) and are 7-0-1 under head coach Chugger Adair.

- In home openers, Tech is 7-0-1 under Adair and is unbeaten in 18 straight matches (14-0-4; had won 11 in a row before this year's home-opening tie) dating back to 2000. Overall, the team has posted a 20-2-4 mark in home openers, losing just the 1993 and 2000 home openers.

- The Hokies are unbeaten at 6-0-3 when their season opener coincides with their home opener.

- Over the past eight seasons under Adair, Tech has outscored its opponents 22-2 in season openers and hold a 28-3 edge in home openers during the same span.

Adair faces his alma mater in opener

- In the 2018 home opener, Tech played to a 0-0 double overtime draw versus San Diego, marking the second straight year Tech head coach Chugger Adair faced his alma mater, the University of San Diego.

- The Hokies won last year's match 1-0 in double overtime. Tech pulled out the win, as Alani Johnson scored the game winner with less than two minutes to go in the contest (108:14).

- Adair is a San Diego native who graduated from USD in 1993.

- When he played for the Toreros, Adair was a two-year captain, an All-American, and helped lead USD to the NCAA Finals in 1992. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD.

- He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and his MBA from USD in 1996. He served as an assistant for the USD's men's soccer team from 1998-2000.

No start earlier than 2018

- In their prior 25 seasons, the Hokies had never opened a campaign earlier than this year's start on Aug. 17. Tech has only once opened the year on this date prior, back in 2012, when the team hosted UNCW in that year's season opener.

- The Hokies won the game 1-0, as Shannon Mayrose headed home the game winner off a cross from Morgan Conklin in the 102nd minute of action.

Tech with a win and a draw in the preseason

- The Hokies played two scrimmages during their preseason, a home contest against George Mason and a match at Liberty.

- Mikayla Mance scored Tech's lone goal in a 1-0 win over George Mason (Aug. 7), while goalkeepers S.A. Phillips and Zoe Foxhall split time in net for the Hokies, helping post back-to-back shutouts.

McGlynn named Preseason All-ACC

- Following back-to-back quality seasons in goal for the Hokies, junior Mandy McGlynn was named to the 2018 Preseason All-ACC Women's Soccer Team, as announced by the league office on Aug. 6.

- McGlynn is one of 11 student-athletes to make the preseason team, which was voted on by the conference's coaches.

- Tech's starting goalkeeper the past two years, McGlynn entered 2018 having made 34 career starts, posting 18 career wins, already tied for fourth all-time at the school, and 12 career shutouts (third-best).

- The Jacksonville, Florida native sported a career .769 save percentage and a 1.10 goals against average, with her 1.03 GAA in 2017 ranking the sixth-best single season mark ever for the Hokies.

Tech welcomes a dozen newcomers

- Again, glancing over the Tech roster, it's apparent that the Hokies brought in 11 freshmen for the 2018 season, but a 12th newcomer also joined the team.

- Senior Abby Dolgos is a new face as well, as she tried out during the spring and earned a walk-on spot to the team for the fall.

- Prior to joining the Hokies, she played club soccer at Tech in the fall of her freshman through junior years, which was highlighted by the team making both the 2015 Regional Club Tournament final and the 2015 Club National Championship final, in the championship bracket, in Phoenix, Arizona.

- She made her season and collegiate debut on Sunday, Sept. 30 against Pittsburgh, playing the last four minutes of the match.

# Charles "Chugger" Adair

## Virginia Tech Head Coach - Eighth Season



On December 7, 2010, Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2018 season marks Adair's 13th season in Blacksburg, as he enters his eighth season as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's already become the all-time wins leader in program history, entering this year with a 95-40-15 overall record, and is poised to become just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He will also be just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach the mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for five ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15). Tech made three runs to the Sweet 16 (2009, 2011 & 2014), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. Also, in the past three years, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department

In his previous seven seasons at Tech, Adair has led the program to a winning record each year, but saw a streak of double-digit win totals come to an end in 2017 as the team posted a 7-6-5 mark, with the five ties setting a program record. Despite an 11-win season in 2016 - the team's ninth straight year with at least 10 wins - the Hokies saw their eight-year run of making the NCAA championship come to an end. In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In 2012, Adair, in his second season as the head coach, led the Hokies to a 13-6-1 record, which marked the program's fifth straight 10-win season. Tech's six losses were the fewest in program history, at the time, and 12 of the 13 wins were shutouts. The team started 9-0-0, climbing into the Top 10 in the national rankings for the first time in school history, reaching the No. 8 spot in late September. The Hokies played host to their first NCAA Championship game in Blacksburg, as they welcomed No. 14 Georgetown to Thompson Field, though it resulted in a 3-2 loss in overtime. In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair came to Tech after holding the associate head coaching position at UC Santa Barbara for two seasons. While at UCSB, his role involved all aspects of the soccer program, including recruiting, coaching, scouting, player management, community relations and camps. Prior to his arrival at UCSB, he worked a six-year stint as Youth Soccer Coach/ Assistant Director of Competitive Older Ages for the Del Mar Sharks. He served as an assistant for the University of San Diego's men's soccer team from 1998-2000. He moved from there and spent a season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at Pacific University in Portland, Ore.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.

- Looking over the Tech roster and glancing at hometowns, it's quickly evident the Hokies have two players who were born outside the United States, freshmen Nicole Kozlova (Canada) and Mathilda Lindström (Sweden).
- However, did you know that the Hokies have a third? Tech senior Zoe Foxhall was also born outside of the U.S. - in Suffolk County, England.

Hokies with International Experience

- During the 2018 season, four current Hokies played internationally, representing three different countries at four different events.
- Junior Mandy McGlynn trained with the U.S. U-20 Women's National Team most of the year and helped the team to a runner-up finish in the 2018 CONCACAF qualifier held in Couva, Trinidad back in January.
- She posted a 3-1 record in four starts, as the team advanced to the 2018 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in France, a team she was also on.
- Senior Alia Abu El Hawa spent a good part of the spring with the Jordan Women's National Team, as it prepared and attempted to qualify for the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup.
- During the Asia Cup, which was held April 6-20, Abu El Hawa started all three matches (against China, Thailand and the Philippines), but Jordan went winless during the competition and did not advance.
- Freshman Emily Gray did not play in any World Cup qualifying matches, but in March 2018, played with the U.S. U-18 Women's National Team in the La Manga Tournament in Spain, seeing action in matches against England and Norway
- She was also with the team for an April 2018 trip to Bern, Switzerland, playing two matches against the Swiss U-19 squad.
- Lastly, freshman Nicole Kozlova has been with the Ukrainian National Team for two years.
- Most recently, she played with the U-19 Ukrainian team in two friendlies against Azerbaijan in March 2018, scoring three times.

A trio of Hokies study abroad in Rwanda

- Juniors Jaylyn Thompson and Jordan Hemmen, along with sophomore Olivia Odle, had the opportunity to study abroad the past two summers as part of UAP 3984: Sport, Policy and Society - a study abroad course that explores different sectors of international development and how sports can support such development.
- Hemmen took the course and traveled to Rwanda in 2017, while Thompson and Odle were among the 15 students who took the course this past May.

Timothy named 2018 Skelton Award winner

- Tech women's soccer player Heather Timothy and wrestler Brooks Wilding were announced as winners of the 2018 Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics at the Athletics Director Honors Celebration held in March at the Inn at Virginia Tech.
- Their academic successes, along with their success on the field and in the community, led to both receiving the award - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.
- The Skelton Award is named after Dr. Bill and Peggy Skelton. The late Dr. Skelton served in the Corps of Cadets and graduated from Virginia Tech

in 1940. He later worked as a dean of the Virginia Cooperative Extension division at Tech.

- The late Peggy Skelton was a faculty member and director of the Cooperative Extension Family Resource Program in the College of Home Economics at Virginia Tech. Both were charter members of the Ut Prosim Society and its President's Circle and combined for more than 100 years of support to the university in various capacities.
- The award goes each year to a rising junior, senior or fifth-year male and female student-athlete who has participated in intercollegiate athletics for at least two seasons at Tech and who hold an overall grade-point average of 3.40 or better. Each recipient receives a scholarship of \$5,000.
