TECH IS ON THE ROAD FOR THREE OF ITS NEXT FOUR ACC WEEKENDS

Road Warriors: During the month of April, Tech is scheduled for 19 games with 14 of those being contested on the road – including three of its four ACC weekend series. In contrast, Tech will close out the regular season in May without having to leave Blacksburg, with a seven-game homestand.

The Hokies opened the month on Tuesday at VMI, taking the game by a 13-1 score, and will stay on the road this weekend, heading to Winston-Salem, N.C. to take on Wake Forest at David F. Couch Ballpark.

Home Runs a plenty at VMI: In that 12-run victory in Lexington, the Hokies blasted a season-high five home runs, the most by the team in a single game in two years. Tech last hit at least five home runs on March 28, 2017 at home versus Campbell (interestingly enough in a 15-8 loss). The last time they hit at least five on the road was February 26, 2017 at Nevada - the Hokies hit six in a 24-10 win.

There were three other noteworthy events that took place with the home run onslaught on Tuesday.

1) Dalton Harum hit three home runs in the win, marking the first Tech player to hit three in a game since Rahiem Cooper belted three in that win over the WolfPack in Nevada on Feb. 27.

2) Harum's second home run followed Kevin Madden's three-run shot, which marked the first Hokies to hit back-to-back home runs since May 2, 2018 - Tom Stoffel and Sam Fragale at Liberty.

3) Nick Biddison started the fireworks show in the third inning with a grand slam, the third of the season hit by the team. The 2017 squad was the last team to hit three grand slams in a single season.

Strikeouts a plenty at VMI: It wasn't just a home run party in Lexington on Tuesday, the Tech pitching staff combined to strike out 16 Keydets in the victory, with Luke Scherzer striking out the side twice en route to a career-high nine-strikeout performance. Peyton Alford (4), Jack Goonan (1) and Dillon Larsen (2) contributed to the season-high tying 16 K-effort. At Florida State on March 8, the Hokies also struck out 16, but in 10 innings (the team had 15 through nine).

Since 2005, when Tech joined the ACC, the pitching staff has struck out 16 or more batters just six times in a nine-inning game with the high being 18 vs. Navy on Feb. 20, 2005. The other five were 16-K games, a total of three times vs. VMI (also on April 4, 2007 and March 30, 2010), vs. Savannah State (May 8, 2010) and the last time - and only time in ACC play - was on April 10, 2011 at Wake Forest.

Winning big, playing close: Eleven of Tech's 17 wins have been decided by five or more runs, the team is 11-2 in such games, opposed to 8-14 last year. Meanwhile, of Tech's 12 losses, seven have been decided by one or two runs. The Hokies are 4-3 in one-run games and 1-4 in two-run games - they were 5-11 and 5-4 last year. And until last weekend, Tech pitching had not allowed an opponent to reach double figures in scoring - Clemson did it twice. At this point last year, opponents reached 10 runs six times.

Virginia Tech Head Coach - Second Season



Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9 and formally introduced John Szefc as the head coach of the baseball program on June 15. The 2019 season will mark his second as the Hokies' head coach.

Szefc (pronounced SHEFF) accepted the position after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. He owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins before arriving in Blacksburg.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szefc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szefc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szefc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szefc has coached 102 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including six selected in the 2017 MLB draft and four in 2018 (including Tech pitchers Connor Coward and Andrew McDonald). Over the last six drafts, 29 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. He has also helped develop 23 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szefc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szefc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szefc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.

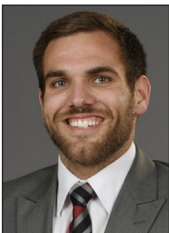

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not **recognized names and should not be used.**

ENGLISH FIELD AT UNION PARK



On March 21, 2016, Virginia Tech renamed its baseball stadium to English Field at Union Park in recognition of a generous commitment of support to the athletics department from Union Bank & Trust. The stadium received substantial upgrading with help from the \$3.5 million committed by the Richmond-based bank. On the date, Tech's Board of Visitors approved extending naming rights to the stadium to Union Bank for 10 years in recognition of the company's financial support.

Located at the intersection of Southgate Drive and Duck Pond Drive, English Field at Union Park is an incredible new home for Virginia Tech baseball. Designed by Cannon Design and built by Whiting-Turner, the \$20 million renovation project added a new grandstand area - with new press-level premium suites - 1,132 permanent chair-back seats in concrete stands and a club level above the first-base dugout, along with a social picnic area down the right-field line. The terracing along the third-base line remains.

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for its initial construction.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on Tech's football team from 1930-33 and graduated in 1934. He contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 30 seasons at English Field at Union Park can be seen on the right. Before it, the Hokies played home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,270-579-12 (.686) in games played in Blacksburg.

Facing any ranked opponents: The chart on the left shows how the Hokies have fared against any ranked opponent in their history as a member of the ACC (since 2005). Currently, there is just one team left on the Hokies' regular-season schedule that is nationally ranked.

Last season, Tech played 14 games versus ranked opponents and were 2-12. In 2019, the Hokies have faced three ranked teams - Florida State (ranked No. 1 by Collegiate Baseball at the time), No. 8 North Carolina (Baseball American) and Clemson (No. 51 by Collegiate Baseball). Tech has gone 2-7 against those teams with a win over the Seminoles and Tar Heels.

Series wins over nationally-ranked ACC opponents: In its history, Tech has won 11 ACC series over ranked teams, eight of which have come at home. Tech's last series win over a ranked ACC opponent was No. 1 Florida State, March 17-19, 2017. After dropping Game 1, the Hokies won the final two games of that set.

The Hokies' last series win on the road against a ranked ACC team was at No. 3 Georgia Tech, April 23-25, 2010 when the Hokies won the first two games before dropping the final. They also beat No. 4 Florida State that year as well - April 2-4, again taking the first two. The only other ACC series win on the road was at No. 21 Georgia Tech in 2007 (March 9-11). The teams split the first two before the Hokies registered a 5-4 comeback victory in Game 3.

Facing a top-ranked ACC team: Since the Hokies joined the ACC, they've played 11 series against a No. 1 team, seven of which have been at English Field at Union Park.

Overall, Tech is 7-13 in home games and includes series wins in its last two. In 2015, Tech swept Virginia (March 13-15) and the 2017 squad took two-of-three from Florida State (March 17-19). The other top-ranked teams to visit Blacksburg were UNC (2013, 0-3), Virginia (2011, 0-3), UNC (2009, 0-2), Miami (2008, 1-2) and Florida State (2006, 1-2).

However, the Hokies have not been as successful on the road against top-ranked ACC teams, as they are just 2-10 in four sets. They were swept at Florida State (April 13-15, 2007) and Virginia (March 28-30, 2014) and went 1-2 at Virginia (April 16-18, 2010) and this year at Florida State.

The Hokies in the Sunshine State: The 2019 season-opening weekend marked the first of three trips for Tech to the state of Florida - as the Hokies returned to face No. 1 Florida State March 8-9 and will make a return trip to Miami in late April. Their nine games in the Sunshine State will be the most since the 1996 season, when Tech played nine times there as well - three at South Florida and six in Winter Park, but the team went just 1-8 in that span. They opened this nine-game stretch 3-0 in the RyCass Classic in DeLand, with wins over Stetson, Manhattan and Sam Houston State.

The Hokies have played 10 or more games in a single season in the state of Florida on three occasions, playing 11 in both 1994 - eight in DeLand, three in Tampa and the team went 6-5; and 1980 - seven in DeLand, four in Tallahassee (Metro Tourney) and the team went 7-4. In 1986, Tech played 10 games, going 3-7, in eight games in DeLand and two in the Metro Tourney in Tallahassee.

Overall, Tech has a 55-101 record in 156 games in the Sunshine State - which included a 3-2 record last year in DeLand. The Hokies are now 16-67 on the road, but hold a 39-34 edge in neutral site contests, which included six straight wins in the Sunshine State before the Florida State series.

Speaking of the season opener: The Hokies have posted a 64-60-2 record in their 126 season openers, which includes a 5-0 decision at Stetson to open the 2019 season. The last time a Tech season opener was played at home was in 1995, and in the 24 openers since, the Hokies have gone 13-11 - with 11 of those games being played in South Carolina, seven in North Carolina, three in Georgia, two in Florida and one in Virginia.

In the school's 126-year history, Tech has opened the season in the state of Florida just once before, back in the 2004 season. The Hokies took part in a season-opening tournament in DeLand that year as well, and suffered a 15-2 loss in the opener to the host Stetson Hatters on Friday, Feb. 27. Tech split its final two games, beating South Florida, 4-3, before dropping a 2-0 contest to Oklahoma State.

More on the 2019 season opener: The 5-0 shutout victory over Stetson on Feb. 15 to open the season was just the sixth season-opening shutout recorded by a Tech pitching staff and the first since 1997 - Feb. 21 at NC A&T, a 10-0 victory. It was also just the 14th shutout during the month of February and the earliest by date - Feb. 16, 2013 at UNC Wilmington (the third game of the season).

The other years Tech had a shutout on Opening Day - 1909, 1945, 1950, 1978 (Game 2 of a doubleheader) and 1996.

The team, which features 20 new players on the roster (11 freshman, nine transfers), had seven different Hokies in the starting lineup compared to the 2018 season opener. According to SID research, the 20 newcomers are the fourth most for 2019 NCAA baseball teams. ETSU leads with 25 (16 F/9 T), followed by Kentucky (16/5) and Western Kentucky (6/15) with 21 each.

Pitching notes from the opening weekend: Tech jumped out early and never trailed in its three-game tournament in DeLand, Florida and turned in some solid pitching performances as a staff.

The Hokies held their opposition scoreless through the first 17.0 innings pitched, the longest stretch ever in program history to start a season. They also allowed just three runs through the first two games, the fewest since 1991, when the team surrendered just two.

The following day, they allowed two runs to Sam Houston State, making it five overall, the fewest to start a season through the first three games since the 1987 season, when that staff allowed single runs in each of its first three victories. Starters combined to throw 15.0 innings and allowed one run.



2019 VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES - WEEKEND NO. 8



Starting 5-0 and beyond: Tech started the 2019 season with seven straight wins for the first time since 1987 and just the fourth time in program history, however, even a 5-0 start to the season is rare at the school. Only 13 times in 126 seasons of baseball has the team been 5-0, and only six of those teams won their sixth game of the year to get to 6-0.

Of those three other teams, the 1987 team started the year 8-0 before its first loss, while both the 1920 and 1915 squads raced out to 10-0 marks. Only the 1915 team, which finished a perfect 21-0, won its first 11 games of the year. Throwing a monkey wrench into the equation, in 1992, the Hokies were 5-0, tied their sixth game and were unbeaten after 11 games holding a 10-0-1 mark before their first loss.

Of the 13 teams that started the season 5-0 and played at least 20 games, all except one (2017) finished 10 or more games above .500 and the last five (minus that 2017) won at least 32 games. Currently, the Hokies have 17 victories and are plus-five in the win column.

Winning seven straight at any point: For the first time since the 2015 season, the Hokies put together a winning streak of at least seven straight when they also won seven from April 26 through May 5. The team also had a seven-game win streak from Feb. 26 through March 9, 2012.

At his previous stop, head coach John Szefc's best start at Maryland was 4-0 to open the 2015 season and after 10 games, his best record was 8-2 which opened the 2014 campaign. His 2019 Tech team started 8-2 as well. Also, at Maryland, Szefc coached his teams to six winning streaks of seven games or more, with a long of 11 straight games in 2014 (May 2 through May 23).

Taylor sets a Tech and ACC record: In just his second collegiate game, freshman Carson Taylor tied both a Virginia Tech school record and an ACC record when four of his five hits against Manhattan (Feb. 16) that day went for doubles.

It had been done just two other times at the school. Bryan Thomas first set the mark with four versus Savannah State on Feb. 21, 2005 and it was matched by Chad Pinder versus Bradley on Feb. 18, 2012.

Only eight ACC players (listed on the right) have ever accomplished the feat and Pinder was the last.

Horanski with the walk-off home run: With his team trailing by a run and looking to stay perfect on the season, Luke Horanski blasted his third home run of the season, a two-run shot in the bottom of the ninth inning, to lift the Hokies to an 8-7 victory over Radford (Feb. 26).

For Horanski, it was his second walk-off hit as a Hokie, as he also had a bases-loaded RBI single in the 10th frame against Old Dominion on April 18, 2018 as Tech beat the Monarchs 6-5.

Since 2009, a Hokie has hit a walk-off home run seven times, but this was just the second when the team was trailing in the home half. The other time was Senior Day at English Field at Union Park when Brendon Hayden hit a two-run home run to walk off Boston College 2-1 on May 3, 2015. That was also the last walk-off home run hit by a Hokie before this year.

Tech's walk-off wins: In his first home game as Tech head coach and his eighth game overall, Szefc saw his team win in walk-off fashion in extra innings against Radford, 3-2 in 12 frames (Feb. 27, 2018). It took just seven games in 2019 to see his team register its first walk-off of this year, again against Radford, as Luke Horanski hit a two-run walk off home run in the bottom of the ninth.

Over the past 11 seasons, the Hokies have had 30 walk-off wins - with the most occurring during the 2012 season, when they had seven.

The earliest walk-off in that span (by date) was Feb. 25, 2012 - Chad Morgan sac fly in the bottom of the ninth that gave Tech a 4-3 win over Iowa in Conway, South Carolina.

In the last five seasons, the Hokies have 14 walk-off wins, eight against ACC opponents. Below is a list of Tech's walk-off victories the last four seasons.

2019 VIRGINIA TECH GAME NOTES - WEEKEND NO. 8



Tech playing ACC Doubleheaders: With the change in the schedule at Florida State, it's interesting to note Tech's history in the ACC when it comes to playing doubleheaders. After March 9, Tech has now played 27 doubleheaders and overall has won two, lost nine and has split 16.

Of the 27 doubleheaders, it's almost split right down the middle with 14 of them being played on the road and 13 at English Field at Union Park. Last season, the Hokies played two at home (Pittsburgh and Louisville) and two on the road (at Boston College and Virginia) splitting three of four.

On the road, the Hokies are now 0-5-9 in DHs, while they are 2-4-7 in ACC DHs at English Field at Union Park.

Overall, Tech played five doubleheaders last year and with the DH at Florida State, it was the team's second in 2019.

Homestand comes to an end: Due to the weather that was hitting the mid-Atlantic region in late February, Tech found itself with an unexpected seven-game homestand, which came to its conclusion after its three-game set with Bryant, which again, due to weather became a two-day event with the team splitting a doubleheader on March 2, the team's first DH of the year.

Home Sweet Home in February: The calendar turned to March 1 for the opening of that series with Bryant and unfortunately for the Hokies, they had to say goodbye to the month of February. Overall in program history in the month, Tech holds a 111-56 record (.665 winning percentage), but when it comes to playing in Blacksburg during February, the team is much better.

The Hokies have posted a 27-3 record (.900 winning percentage) in home games played in the month and have won 13 straight dating back to their 2013 home opener against Temple (Feb. 23 a 7-3 defeat) and includes a program tying best four this season - the team also won four at home in February 2009.

Szefc at English Field at Union Park: All-time, coach Szefc is 20-22 at the home of the Hokies, which includes an 19-20 mark as the head coach of Tech, including 8-2 in 2019.

As the head coach at Maryland, Szefc won his first game at English Field at Union Park on April 12, 2014 as the Terrapins beat Tech, a 4-2 decision. However, his Terps lost that ACC series to the Hokies two games to one (April 11-13).

For the second straight year, Szefc and the Hokies won their home opener, this

time defeating ETSU by a count of 9-3. The team is 8-2 in its last 10 home openers and includes winning four straight.

Tech on ACC Opening Day and opening weekend: Despite playing 11 of its last 15 ACC Opening Days on the road, the Hokies overall are 6-9, have won three of their last five and are 4-7 on the road.

However, stretching its record out to the entire three-game weekend, Tech is 14-31 overall, 8-25 on the road (have been swept four times) and has won just one of those 11 road opening sets - back in 2007 at No. 21 Georgia Tech, two games to one - opposed to at home, where the Hokies are 6-6 overall and 2-2 in a series.

No-hit bids come up short: This season, two Tech pitchers have taken no-hitters further than any pitcher before in ACC action.

First, Chris Gerard tossed six no-hit frames at No. 1 Florida State before allowing a leadoff single in the seventh (more on that game later) and Ian Seymour went the furthest, allowing an infield single with one out in the ninth that broke his up.

The furthest prior on the road was Devin Burke (May 4, 2013) at Boston College, who took a no-hitter into the sixth. The latest in a home game was Packy Naughton (May 3, 2015) who was perfect after 5.2 innings before a two-out hit in the sixth.

One last note, Seymour had a no-hitter through five frames last year against Kansas State on February 19, 2018 in Myrtle Beach, S.C.

The last known no-hitter thrown by a Tech pitcher was Jon Hartness, a nine-inning no-hitter versus Utica College on March 18, 1984 (a 1-0 victory)

Gerard was named the ACC Pitcher of the Week and the NCBWA National Pitcher of the Week for his effort, while both he and Seymour were both honored by Collegiate Baseball as one of several National Players of the Week.

A one-hitter in ACC action: Gerard combined with Jack Dellinger, who threw the final two innings without allowing a hit in that March 9 game at FSU, to record Tech's first ever ACC one-hit game for the Hokies. In 15 years, the fewest hits ever allowed in an ACC game prior was three, six times - four times on the road and twice at home and that list includes:

- vs. NC State - March 29, 2018 at Boston College - May 3, 2013*
- at Maryland - April 20, 2013 at Florida State - March 31, 2012*
- at Boston College - March 27, 2011 vs. Maryland - March 13, 2010

* - May 3 game went 12 innings, but all three hits were through 9, while the March 31 game was only 8 innings
