HOKIES HEAD TO ATLANTA, GEORGIA FOR FIRST ACC WEEKEND SERIES

Hokies take on Yellow Jackets to open ACC: For the 12th time in its 16 year-history in the conference, Tech will start ACC play on the road, and for the seventh time it will be against a ranked opponent. The Hokies will take on No. 29 Georgia Tech (by NCBWA), the most common of their nine opponents they've faced on ACC Opening Day.

This will be the fourth time Virginia Tech will play Georgia Tech on ACC opening weekend - and the third time on the road - and breaking a tied with Miami, who VT has played three times (twice on the road, once at home). Tech has twice played Duke on the road and former ACC member Maryland twice as well (one home, one away). The Hokies have also opened against Virginia, Clemson, Wake Forest and Florida State (all on road) and Pittsburgh (at home).

Tech on ACC Opening Day and opening weekend: Despite playing 11 of its last 15 ACC Opening Days on the road, the Hokies are 6-9 overall, won three of their last five and are 4-7 on the road.

However, stretching its record out to the entire three-game weekend, Tech is 14-31 overall, 8-25 on the road (have been swept four times) and has won just one of those previous 11 road opening sets.

That only win was back in 2007 at No. 21 Georgia Tech, 2-1. In 2008, No. 19 Georgia Tech swept the Hokies, while the Yellow Jackets won the 2013 ACC opening series 2-1 in Blacksburg. Against ranked opponents on ACC opening weekend, Tech is 5-13 overall and have lost their last five series.

At home, the Hokies are 6-6 overall and 2-2 in a series.

Seven-game winning streaks: After a 1-3 start, the Hokies have won seven straight, including three of the last four by scoring at least 10 runs. Tech's seven-game winning streak is the longest since the team opened the 2019 season on a seven-game winning streak (Feb. 15-Feb. 26).

It's been more than six years since the Hokies have won eighth in a row - May 8 through May 24, 2013, which included two ACC regular-season victories and three wins in the ACC Tournament.

The last time Tech won eight straight games during the regular season was during the 2010 season, from Feb. 21 through March 9, when the Hokies rattled off nine straight wins.

At his previous stop, head coach John Szefc coached his teams to six winning streaks of seven games or more, with a long of 11 straight games in 2014 (May 2 through May 23).

2019 pitching staff turned in one for the ages: Last year, the Hokies enjoyed one of their most successful pitching seasons ever accomplished by a Tech staff in its history since the program joined the ACC (15 years). First, the team's final overall ERA of 3.98 was the best ever in that time frame. In fact, the Hokies had not posted a sub-4.00 ERA since 1984 (3.80) - the lowest since was 4.10 in 1995.

The team also finished second all-time in strikeouts (495), with the 2010 squad holding the top mark ever with 530. The previous high was 461 (1988). Below are other notables for the staff (since 2005):

#14 John Szefc

Virginia Tech Head Coach - Third Season



Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9, 2017 and formally introduced John Szefc as the head coach of the baseball program at a press conference a few days later on June 15. The 2020 season will mark his third as the Hokies' head coach.

Szefc (pronounced SHEFF), who won his 400th career game on March 10, 2018 guiding the Hokies to a 3-1 victory over Pitt, accepted the position at Tech after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Before arriving in Blacksburg, Szefc owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szefc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szefc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szefc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szefc has coached 107 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including four in 2018 and five in 2019. Over the last seven drafts, 34 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. Almost a dozen have gone on to play in the Major Leagues, including most recently, Mike Shawarzyn (Red Sox) and Lamonte Wade (Twins) in 2019. He has also helped develop 23 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana (2003-08). Szefc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szefc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and took the Generals to the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szefc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.

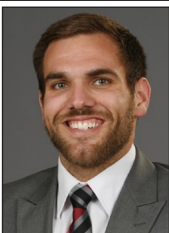

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not **recognized names and should not be used.**

ENGLISH FIELD AT ATLANTIC UNION BANK PARK



On March 21, 2016, Virginia Tech renamed its baseball stadium to English Field at Union Park in recognition of a generous commitment of support to the athletics department from Union Bank & Trust. The stadium received substantial upgrading with help of \$3.5 million committed by the Richmond-based bank. On the date, Tech's Board of Visitors approved extending naming rights to the stadium to Union Bank for 10 years in recognition of the company's financial support. The stadium was later renamed English Field at Atlantic Union Bank Park on May 20, 2019 to align with the rebranding of Virginia's largest financial institution.

Located at the intersection of Southgate Drive and Duck Pond Drive, English Field at Union Park is an incredible new home for Virginia Tech baseball. Designed by Cannon Design and built by Whiting-Turner, the \$20 million renovation project added a new grandstand area – with new press-level premium suites – 1,132 permanent chair-back seats in concrete stands and a club level above the first-base dugout, along with a social picnic area down the right-field line. The terracing along the third-base line remains.

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for its initial construction.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on Tech's football team from 1930-33 and graduated in 1934. He contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 32 seasons at here can be seen on the right. Prior, the Hokies played home games at Tech Park, where the team was 431-122-1 (.779) over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,281-586-12 (.685) in games played in Blacksburg.

Facing any ranked opponents: The chart on the left shows how the Hokies have fared against any ranked opponent in their history as a member of the ACC (since 2005).

Over the past two seasons, Tech has played 30 games versus ranked opponents and are a combined 5-25, which includes a 3-13 mark in 2019.

Entering 2020 ACC play, there are five teams on the Hokies' schedule that are ranked in one of the five major polls, all ACC teams, for a total of 15 possible games against ranked opponents this year - which can obviously change over the course of 15 weeks.

All-time, Tech has played a team ranked No. 29 twice, and are 2-0 against those teams.

Series wins over nationally-ranked ACC opponents: In its history, Tech has won 11 ACC series over ranked teams, eight of which have come at home. Tech's last series win over a ranked ACC opponent was No. 1 Florida State, March 17-19, 2017. After dropping Game 1, the Hokies won the final two games of that set.

The Hokies' last series win on the road against a ranked ACC team was at No. 3 Georgia Tech, April 23-25, 2010 when the Hokies won the first two games before dropping the final. They also beat No. 4 Florida State that year as well - April 2-4, again taking the first two.

D1Baseball recognizes four Hokies: Prior to the start of the season, D1Baseball announced the nation's top collegiate student-athletes by position and four Hokies were among the players recognized. Zach Brzykcy was No. 14 among Top 50 relievers, Kevin Madden was No. 17 among top 30 third basemen, Nick Biddison was ranked No. 42 among the Top 100 outfielders and Ian Seymour was slotted at No. 41 among starting pitchers.

Seymour recognized for performances last week: Due to a rainout on Feb. 16, Sunday starter Ian Seymour made his 2020 debut against ETSU two days later and tossed three innings in Tech's home opener, then made his Sunday start against Louisiana on Feb. 23.

Overall, Seymour posted a 2-0 mark, threw 9.0 innings, allowed just four hits, one walk and one earned run while striking out 17 batters - including a career-high tying 11 Ragin' Cajuns in six innings of work. He struck out 11 Miami Hurricanes over 7.1 innings on April 26, 2018.

For his effort, Seymour was named one of 15 Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week.

The Tech pitching staff was dominant on the mound the entire weekend as nine Hokies combined to allow just one earned run and strike out 41 batters in 26 total innings of work as the team won their first road series since at Pitt (March 15-17) last year.

A number of new faces: Tech, who featured 20 new players on the 2019 roster, welcomed 20 new faces to the 2020 squad - 16 freshmen and four transfers - while sporting just four seniors. The quartet of final-year players on this year's roster marks the fewest for a Tech squad since the 2014 season, when the Hokies had just two - pitchers Tanner McIntyre and Brad Markey.

Starting streaks continue into new year: Two of those new faces from a season ago - Nick Biddison and Kevin Madden - returned for their sophomore seasons and are the only two Hokies, of four, to start and play in at least 50 games in 2019.

Kerry Carpenter (53/53) and Nick Owens (52/52) are gone, which left Biddison (52/52) with the longest consecutive starts streak on the team as he now stands at 57 straight, missing only the Feb. 26 start versus Radford. Madden (50/50) now has the second longest streak at 37 straight - all at third base, after last missing a start on March 30 versus Clemson.

Carpenter started every game last year (53 straight), while the next longest milestone streak to surpass is the 99 straight starts by *Jack Owens* from Feb. 17, 2017 through May 1, 2018.

The last Tech player to start more than 100 straight games was Sam Fragale, who played 126 straight from April 23, 2016 through the end of his Tech career - May 19, 2018. Ryan Tufts did him one better, posting a 127-game streak started on April 15, 2015 and ended with the final game of his career - May 20, 2017.

Home Sweet Home in February: Since the 2010 season, Tech is now 9-2 in home openers and have won five straight after its 10-3 victory over ETSU (Feb. 18). In those five wins, the Hokies have outscored their opponents by a 40-8 count and have tossed two shutouts. Of note, Tech's 2020 home opener was the earliest for the Hokies since their first ever season of baseball. Tech played Newports in Blacksburg on Feb. 2, 1892 and had not played a home game earlier then Feb. 21 before last year - a 9-3 win over ETSU on Feb. 19.

Overall, in program history in February, Tech holds a 115-59 record (66.1%), but when it comes to playing in Blacksburg during the month, the team is far better. The Hokies are now 29-3 (90.6%) in home games played in the month. Tech has won 15 straight dating back to its 2013 home opener (a 7-3 loss to Temple on Feb. 23) and included a program-tying best four wins last year (also accomplished in 2009) - they won three this year. Tech's last home-opening loss was back on March 4, 2015, losing to the College of Charleston 8-3.

Szefc at English Field at Atlantic Union Bank Park: All-time, coach Szefc is 31-29 at the home of the Hokies, which includes a 30-27 mark as the head coach of Tech.

As the head coach at Maryland, Szefc won his first game at English Field on April 12, 2014 as the Terrapins beat Tech, 4-2. However, his Terps lost that ACC series to the Hokies two games to one (April 11-13).

For the third straight year, Szefc and the Hokies won their home opener, this time defeating ETSU by a count of 10-3.



Tech in season openers: The Hokies are now 64-61-2 in their 127 season openers. The last time a Tech season opener was played at home was in 1995, and in the 25 years since, the Hokies have gone 13-12 - with 12 of those games being played in South Carolina, including this season, seven in North Carolina, three in Georgia, twice in Florida and once in Virginia.

Overall, the Hokies are now 20-17 in those 12 trips to the Palmetto State that opened a season, which included a 1-3 record at the 2018 Brittain Resorts Baseball at the Beach tournament hosted by Coastal Carolina - head coach John Szeffc's first season with Tech.

Under Szeffc, the Hokies are now 1-2 in season openers and 4-5 in season-opening weekends, as Tech went 3-0 last year at the Stetson Tournament in DeLand, Florida. The Hokies went 0-2 in this year's Brittain Resorts Baseball at the Beach tournament to open the 2020 season.

Tech's earliest start to a season: The Hokies have opened a season just twice before Feb. 14, with the first one occurring during their first season of baseball at the school, which started in 1892. Tech played Newports in Newport, Va. on Feb. 1 and were victories, 18-8.

The same two teams faced off the next day in Blacksburg and the Hokies won again, 8-0, and concluded their season 2-0.

In 2015, Tech traveled to Macon, Georgia to take on the Mercer Bears in a three-game series that started on Feb. 13. The Hokies lost the season opener 9-1, but took the final two games of the set.

Happy Opening Day: For just the fourth time in program history (and the third time as a season opener), the Hokies played a baseball game on Valentine's Day (Feb. 14). The first game played on Feb. 14 was back in 2003, when the Hokies beat Campbell, 6-4, in Buies Creek, N.C. In 2014, the Citadel defeated Tech 6-2 in Charleston, S.C. (both seasons openers) and the Hokies took care of Mercer 11-4 in 2015 in Macon, Ga. - game two that year.

Strikeouts a-plenty in Louisiana: As stated before, the Hokies pitching staff struck out 41 batters during the 26 innings pitched against the Ragin' Cajuns this past weekend.

Friday starter Chris Gerard struck out a career-high 12 batters over seven innings of work, which included at least two in four innings and striking out the side in his final inning of work in the seventh. He is the first sophomore at Tech (since 2005) to strike out a dozen or more batters in a single game. It's the most since Connor Coward struck out 12 Pittsburgh Panthers on March 9, 2018.

Saturday, four Tech pitchers (of six in the game) struck out a combined 16 batters, a season high and the most since the staff combined for 16 at VMI last year (April 2). At Florida State (March 8, 2019), the Hokies also struck out 16, but in 10 innings (the team had 15 through nine).

Since 2005, when Tech joined the ACC, the pitching staff has struck out 16 or more batters just seven times in a nine-inning game with the high being 18 vs. Navy on Feb. 20, 2005. The other 16-K games include a total of three times versus VMI (April 4, 2007, March 30, 2010), versus Savannah State (May 8, 2010) and the only time in ACC play - April 10, 2011 at Wake Forest.

And then there was Seymour, see next note.

Seymour strikes again: In all, a total of 17 Hokies have struck out 10-plus batters in a game since 2005 and only 12 have done it in an ACC game. Seymour became the first to do it as a freshman, when he struck out 10 Pitt Panthers on March 10, 2018. The last freshman with 10+ Ks in a game was Pat Pinkman, vs. Liberty, when he struck out 12, March 3, 1998.

Last year, Seymour became just the fifth Hokie pitcher with two 10+ strikeout performances against ACC opponents in a regular-season game with his career-setting effort against Miami, when he struck out 11 Hurricanes on April 26, 2018.

After Sunday's career-tying outing, Seymour is now just the fourth Tech pitcher with three overall games with at least 10 strikeouts and is one shy of being the only Tech pitcher since the team joined the ACC to have four.

Of note, on Seymour's heels is Chris Gerard, who is now one of nine Tech pitchers with two or more 10+ strikeout games in a career (since 2005).

Hokies running wild in 2020: The Hokies stole 13 bases in their three-game sweep of Bryant over the weekend which included eight in the series opener on Friday night.

The eight stolen bases are the most for the team since joining the ACC (2005) and one more than the previous high of seven versus Richmond (April 10, 2007). The school record is 10, set on April 2, 1981 against Saint Louis.

Brennan Reback stole three of those bases in the game, becoming the first Hokie to swipe three bags in a game since Saige Jenco (Feb. 25, 2014 versus Radford).

In all, Tech has 18 stolen bases so far this season (through 10 games), which is more than half the number of stolen bases last year (30). Since joining the ACC (2005), the high-water mark for stolen bases is 82 (2007) while the team hasn't stolen more than 40 in a season since 2014 (60).
