TECH OPENS 127TH SEASON AT BRITAIN RESORTS BASEBALL AT THE BEACH

Tech in season openers: The Hokies have posted a 64-60-2 record in their previous 126 season openers. The last time a Tech season opener was played at home was in 1995, and in the 24 years since, the Hokies have gone 13-11 - with 11 of those games being played in South Carolina, seven in North Carolina, three in Georgia, twice in Florida and once in Virginia.

Overall, the Hokies are 20-15 in those previous 11 trips to the Palmetto State that opened a season, which includes a 1-3 record at the 2018 Britain Resorts Baseball at the Beach tournament hosted by Coastal Carolina - head coach John Szeffc's first season with Tech.

Under Szeffc, the Hokies are 1-1 in season openers and 4-3 in season-opening weekends, as Tech went 3-0 last year at the Stetson Tournament in DeLand, Florida en route to a 7-0 start to the 2019 season.

Playing in the Palmetto State: In its program history, Tech has played 170 games in South Carolina and has compiled a 79-88-3 (.474) overall record, but have not played there since that 2018 tournament.

No stranger to the tournaments hosted by Coastal Carolina, Tech is 14-13 combined in games in Conway and Myrtle Beach. However, that record includes a 12-6 mark in neutral site games, as the Hokies are just 2-7 against the Chanticleers in South Carolina.

Tech against the field: Overall, against this weekend's field, Tech is 10-8 all-time, however, not a single one of those are against season-opening opponent San Diego State. The Aztecs are the first of two new teams Tech will face during the 2020 season - the other is Louisiana next weekend in a three-game set.

Against the Spartans, Tech is 6-1 overall (3-0 at home, 2-0 on the road and 1-1 on a neutral field) with a four-game winning streak. The Hokies beat UNCG twice last year in Blacksburg - 12-4 (Feb. 24) and 2-1 (Feb. 25) - but had not faced each other since 1992, when they played against each other four times.

Versus the Chanticleers, Tech is 4-7 (2-0 at home, 2-7 on the road) and had won three in a row before the 2018 meeting won by the hosts 17-2 in Coach Szeffc's first game as Tech's head coach. Of the 11 games between the two teams, five have been decided by one run, including two in extra innings.

2019 pitching staff turns in one of its best seasons ever: Last year, the Hokies enjoyed one of their most successful pitching seasons ever turned in by a Tech staff in its history since the program joined the ACC (15 years). First, the team's final overall ERA of 3.98 was the best ever in that time frame. In fact, the Hokies had not posted a sub-4.00 ERA since 1984 (3.80) - the lowest since was 4.10 in 1995.

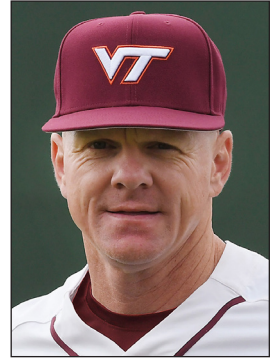
The team also finished second all-time in strikeouts (495), with the 2010 squad holding the top mark ever with 530. The previous high was 461 (1988). Below are other notables for the staff (since 2005):

2019 team fielding sets records, too: Tech fielded one of its best defensive teams ever in 2019. Its fielding percentage of .975 was four points better than the previous school record of .971 set by the 2012 squad. The Hokies' 49 errors were the fewest since the team has been playing in the ACC (2012, 62).

#14 John Szefc

Virginia Tech Head Coach - Third Season



Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced the hiring of Tech's 25th head baseball coach on June 9, 2017 and formally introduced John Szefc as the head coach of the baseball program at a press conference a few days later on June 15. The 2020 season will mark his third as the Hokies' head coach.

Szefc (pronounced SHEFF), who won his 400th career game on March 10, 2018 guiding the Hokies to a 3-1 victory over Pitt, accepted the position at Tech after leading Maryland to three NCAA appearances and a 180-122 (.596) overall record as the Terrapins' head coach. Before arriving in Blacksburg, Szefc owned a 392-259-3 (.602) career record in 12 seasons as an NCAA head coach, producing 10 campaigns with 30 or more wins.

In addition to ending a 43-year NCAA tournament drought and becoming the fastest coach to 100 career wins at Maryland, Szefc spent seven seasons (1996-2002) at the helm of the Marist College baseball program, where he led the team to four conference championships, four NCAA Regional appearances and a 212-137-3 (.607) overall mark. Szefc earned Northeastern Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and was the American Baseball Coaches Associate Northeast Region Coach of the Year in 2001.

The first coach in Maryland history to ever take the Terrapins to an NCAA Super Regional, Szefc accomplished the feat twice in 2014 and 2015 as he guided the program to the first two 40-win seasons in school history and claimed Maryland's first two NCAA Regional crowns. Maryland achieved a final No. 14 ranking both seasons, the highest finishes in school history.

He guided the Terrapins to the ACC Tournament final for the first time in 38 years in 2014 and then took Maryland to the Big Ten tournament final in the school's initial season in that conference, winning a program-best 42 games in 2015.

Szefc has coached 107 players that have been drafted or signed professional contracts since 1997, including four in 2018 and five in 2019. Over the last seven drafts, 34 of his players have been selected, including the 45th pick of the 2014 draft Jake Stinnett, the highest pick of a Maryland player in almost a decade. Almost a dozen have gone on to play in the Major Leagues, including most recently, Mike Shawarzyn (Red Sox) and Lamonte Wade (Twins) in 2019. He has also helped develop 23 All-Americans, including 10 of the 20 players in Maryland history to earn that distinction.

The Middletown, N.Y. native arrived at Maryland after a two-year stint as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas State (2011-12) and a two-season stay as assistant head coach and recruiting coordinator at Kansas (2009-10). He also enjoyed a six-season tenure as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette (2003-08). Szefc began his coaching career as an assistant at Sacred Heart (1995) and at Drexel (1990-93).

Szefc managed the New York Generals in the Atlantic College Baseball League during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He led the club to a 47-28 record, earned two consecutive division titles and took the Generals to the ACBL title game in 1996.

Collegiately, he played two years at Connecticut before transferring in 1987 to Drexel. During his senior campaign for the Dragons, he was tabbed an All-East Coast Conference outfielder.

He graduated from Drexel University with a degree in corporate communications in 1989. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Temple University.

Szefc and his wife, Barbara, have a daughter, Anna, and two sons, John Michael and Sam.

Quick Notes

- Arrived in Blacksburg after one season as Maryland's pitching coach under Coach Szefc
- In 2018, staff had the most strikeouts in a single season (462) and in ACC play (242) since 2010
- Posted its best overall ERA and opponents' batting average since 2015
- Had a 8.58 K/9, 77th in the nation, and the 2nd-best mark ever for a staff in its history in the ACC.
- Spent six years at Bryant, winning 226 games and helped Bulldogs to three NCAA tournaments

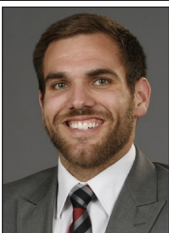

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not **recognized names and should not be used.**

ENGLISH FIELD AT ATLANTIC UNION BANK PARK



On March 21, 2016, Virginia Tech renamed its baseball stadium to English Field at Union Park in recognition of a generous commitment of support to the athletics department from Union Bank & Trust. The stadium received substantial upgrading with help of \$3.5 million committed by the Richmond-based bank. On the date, Tech's Board of Visitors approved extending naming rights to the stadium to Union Bank for 10 years in recognition of the company's financial support. The stadium was later renamed English Field at Atlantic Union Bank Park on May 20, 2019 to align with the rebranding of Virginia's largest financial institution.

Located at the intersection of Southgate Drive and Duck Pond Drive, English Field at Union Park is an incredible new home for Virginia Tech baseball. Designed by Cannon Design and built by Whiting-Turner, the \$20 million renovation project added a new grandstand area - with new press-level premium suites - 1,132 permanent chair-back seats in concrete stands and a club level above the first-base dugout, along with a social picnic area down the right-field line. The terracing along the third-base line remains.

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for its initial construction.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on Tech's football team from 1930-33 and graduated in 1934. He contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 31 seasons at here can be seen on the right. Prior, the Hokies played home games at Tech Park, where the team was 431-122-1 (.779) over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,275-586-12 (.684) in games played in Blacksburg.

Facing any ranked opponents: The chart on the left shows how the Hokies have fared against any ranked opponent in their history as a member of the ACC (since 2005).

Over the past two seasons, Tech has played 30 games versus ranked opponents and are a combined 5-25, which includes a 3-13 mark in 2019.

Entering the first weekend of 2020, there are seven teams on the Hokies' schedule that are ranked in one of the preseason polls, including six ACC teams, for a total of 21 possible games against ranked opponents this year - which can obviously change over the course of 15 weeks.

A number of new faces: Tech, who featured 20 new players on the 2019 roster, has welcomed 20 new faces to the 2020 squad - 16 freshman and four transfers - while sporting just four seniors.

Starting streaks to open the year: Two of those new faces from a season ago - Nick Biddison and Kevin Madden - return for their sophomore seasons and are the only two Hokies, of four, to start and play in 50 or more games in 2019.

Kerry Carpenter (53/53) and Nick Owens (52/52) are gone, which leaves Biddison (52/52) with the longest current consecutive starts streak on the team as he enters 2020 at 46 straight, missing only the Feb. 26 start versus Radford.

Carpenter started every game last year (53 straight), while the next longest milestone streak to surpass is the 99 straight starts by Jack Owens from Feb. 17, 2017 through May 1, 2018.

The last Tech player to start more than 100 straight was Sam Fragale, who played 126 straight from April 23, 2016 through the end of his Tech career - May 19, 2018.

Tech's earliest start to a season: The Hokies have opened a season just twice before Feb. 14, with the first one occurring during their first season of baseball at the school, which started in 1892.

The same two teams faced off the next day in Blacksburg and the Hokies won again, 8-0, and concluded their season 2-0.

In 2015, Tech traveled to Macon, Georgia to take on the Mercer Bears in a three-game series that started on Feb. 13. The Hokies lost their season opener 9-1, but took the final two games of the set.

Happy Opening Day: For just the fourth time in program history, the Hokies will play a baseball game on Valentine's Day (Feb. 14). The first game played on Feb. 14 was back in 2003, when the Hokies beat Campbell, 6-4, in Buies Creek, N.C.

D1Baseball recognizes three Hokies: Over the past few weeks, D1Baseball has announced the nation's top players by position and three Tech players were among those recognized.

Tech walk-off wins: In his first home game as Tech head coach and his eighth game overall, John Szeffc saw his team win in walk-off fashion in extra innings against Radford, 3-2 in 12 frames (Feb. 27, 2018).

Since joining the ACC (15 seasons), the Hokies have had 36 walk-off wins (15 in ACC games) - with the most occurring during the 2012 season, when they had seven.

The earliest walk-off in that span (by date) was Feb. 25, 2012 - a Chad Morgan sac fly in the bottom of the ninth gave Tech a 4-3 win over Iowa in Conway, S.C.

In the prior five seasons, the Hokies have 14 walk-off wins, eight against ACC opponents. Below is a list of Tech's walk-off victories the last five seasons.
