AT THE PLATE

- The new era of Virginia Tech softball begins this weekend in Charleston, South Carolina, as first-year coach Pete D'Amour leads the Hokies into 2019 at the Cougar Classic.
- Tech will take on four opponents it has already faced in previous seasons, including Purdue and Wichita State which it played last year. It swept the Boilermakers and fell to the Shockers.
- The Hokies bring back 13 letterwinners, including six starters, while welcoming nine newcomers.
- Of the 24 players on the team, 15 are underclassmen.
- Though the Hokies will be youthful, they do have one of the most experienced middle infielders in the ACC, returning two players – seniors Olivia Lattin and Caitlyn Nolan – who have combined for 215 hits, 122 RBIs and 635 assists.

NUMBER TO KNOW

15

- Tech is 15-8 in season openers, including winning nine of its last 10 games. It's the third time it has opened with a tournament in South Carolina.

WHO TO WATCH



- Preseason All-American and All-ACC pick Carrie Eberle will be in the circle, boasting a 1.72 ERA last season to rank third in the ACC.

LAST TIME OUT

- Tech, which finished 10th last season in the ACC, got hot down the stretch and won a game at the league's tournament in Atlanta.
- It took down seventh-seeded Duke 4-0 behind a four-hit shutout from Eberle in the first round at Mewborn Field.
- The following game, the Hokies faced second-seeded Pitt in the quarterfinals and led 6.1 innings before falling by a score of 6-4 to the Panthers.

GREENSBORO, N.C. – Reigning national champion Florida State leads all ACC teams with five selections to the inaugural Preseason All-ACC Softball Team and has been chosen as the 2019 ACC softball preseason favorite in a vote of the league's 12 head coaches.

The Seminoles have won five straight ACC Softball Championships, and received all 11 possible first-place votes, as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own teams.

Louisville, North Carolina and Syracuse have two representatives each on the preseason team, with Duke, Notre Dame, Pitt and Virginia Tech earning one selection each.

The preseason squad includes nine members named 2018 First Team All-ACC, and five named Second Team All-ACC last year.

SEASON OPENERS

- Last season against 14th-ranked Ole Miss, Tech's nine-game winning streak in season openers was snapped in Alabama.
- Tech hasn't lost consecutive season openers since 2001-02.
- With the Hokies' matchup with [RV] Wichita State, it marks the second straight season they have opened the slate with a team either receiving votes or are ranked in the NFCA's Preseason Top 25 Poll.

- While at Kennesaw State, Coach D'Amour had a knack for winning against teams from a Power Five conference.
- D'Amour took down four Power Five schools, including two in extra innings.

A TOP-100 PLAYER

- Pitcher Carrie Eberle was named to Softball America's inaugural top-100 players lists, as announced by the newly formed organization on Feb. 7.
- The junior was one of 10 players from the ACC and one of 35 pitchers.

EBERLE NAMED AN ALL-AMERICAN

- After a breakout season in the circle in 2018, Carrie Eberle was named a preseason All-American by Justin's World of Softball (JWOS).
- Eberle boasts the second-best returning ERA and opponent batting average in the ACC.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

- For the first time in ACC history, the league office asked the conference's coaches to submit a preseason ballot naming an all-conference team.
- Tech's Carrie Eberle found her name on the preseason all-conference team, being one of four pitchers named to the prestigious list. The Hokies were picked 10th in the preseason poll, including a first-place vote.

THE RETURN

- After deciding not to play last season, catcher Lauren Duff makes her return to the team this season.
- The 2016 ACC Freshman of the Year should contribute immediately behind the plate. During her rookie campaign, the Chesapeake, Virginia native batted .347 with 43 hits, 20 RBIs and five home runs, while throwing out 13 runners.
- Her sophomore season saw similar success, as Duff hit over .300 for the second consecutive season, drove in 21 RBIs and belted seven home runs behind a career-high 48 hits.

NEW YEAR, NEW FACES

- Tech's Pete D'Amour became only the second coach in school history this past summer and he brought in a new staff with him.
- His first hire came on June 27, 2018, when he tabbed Kirin Kumar as an assistant coach. Kumar, who has ties to the ACC, comes most recently from NC State and played at Georgia Tech.
- Coming with him from the Peach State, Doug Gillis was hired on August 10, 2018, after being the pitching coach at Kennesaw State. He holds the same role in Blacksburg.
- On Aug. 30, 2018, D'Amour added his volunteer assistant in Matt Guemmer. Guemmer, who graduated from Missouri, worked with D'Amour in Columbia as a student manager from 2012-13. He most recently comes from DeSoto High School, where he was the head softball coach and won a state title in 2014.
- Former All-American at Missouri Sami Fagan joined the staff in the winter after playing professionally in Japan and the United States. She holds the title of coordinator of player development.

STOMPING GROUNDS

- Two Hokies are from the Palmetto State in sophomore Darby Trull and senior Caitlyn Nolan.
- Trull is from Fort Mill, roughly 2 hours and 45 minutes away from Charleston, while Nolan is from Bennettsville, which is 2 hours and 30 minutes away.

NEW POWER FIVE HEAD COACHES

- The offseason was an eventful one for the coaching carousel, especially in the Power Five. There were 58 coaching changes in Division I, including 11 in the Power Five.
- D'Amour was one of the 11 and he is one of seven that came from a mid-major as a head coach. Two were sitting Power Five head coaches (Texas' Mike White and Louisville's Holly Aprile) and two were Power Five assistant coaches (Oregon's Melyssa Lombardi and Kansas' Jennifer McFalls).
- Interestingly enough, of the 11 Power Five head coaching moves, the ACC is the conference with the most change (5 moves), making up 45 percent.

What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

SOFTBALL INDOOR FACILITY

- The facility, which is attached to Rector Field House (track & field) and immediately adjacent to Tech Softball Park, opened this fall and provides the Hokies with an indoor infield for practice during inclement weather, along with four cages for hitting and pitching practice.
- The one-story building also features two coaches rooms, an equipment room, a team room, a film room, a mudroom and team facilities. The facility will be available to the program year-round and will have uses for practice, team events and gameday necessities. The new facility will encompass more than 16,000 square feet.
- The facility was designed by Cannon Designs and was built by Branch Associates of Salem, Virginia. This project was a part of a larger plan that vastly improved Rector Field House (track & field) and all of the adjacent athletics facilities. Total cost was roughly \$18 million.

Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced on May 31, 2018, the hiring of head softball coach Pete D'Amour.

D'Amour joins the Hokies after two seasons as the head coach at Kennesaw State, where he led the Owls to a 79-37 record and two postseason appearances. Before taking over the Kennesaw State program in 2017, he earned a reputation as one of the nation's premier recruiters during his 10-year tenure as assistant coach at the University of Missouri, a perennial NCAA tournament participant.

D'Amour coached Kennesaw State to the 2018 Atlantic Sun Conference regular season and tournament championships en route to the program's first NCAA Regional appearance since transitioning to the Division I level in 2006, as the Owls finished the year with a 39-17 record. In his inaugural year as head coach at Kennesaw State in 2017, he guided the Owls to a 40-20 overall record and a berth in the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Prior to accepting the head coaching job at Kennesaw State, D'Amour spent a decade at Missouri as an assistant coach, serving as associate head coach for his final two seasons in 2015-16. During his tenure in Columbia, the Tigers qualified for the NCAA tournament in each of his 10 seasons on the staff, reaching five NCAA super regionals and earning three consecutive trips to the Women's College World Series from 2009-11.

Kennesaw State went 39-17 and 14-3 in the ASUN this past season and earned a No. 3 seed in the Tallahassee Regional. D'Amour was named ASUN Coach of the Year and seven Owls earned ASUN all-conference accolades, including ASUN Pitcher of the Year Alley Cutting and ASUN Freshman of the Year Patricia Awald. Awald was one of 25 finalists up for NFCA National Freshman of the Year. Kennesaw State entered this year's NCAA tournament ranked No. 34 in the RPI, a program-best, while competing in arguably the best mid-major conference in the country.

In D'Amour's first season at Kennesaw State, the Owls went 40-20, the program's first ever 40-win season, and reached the quarterfinals of the National Invitational Softball Championship. The Owls peaked at No. 47 in the RPI and led the ASUN in all major offensive categories, including batting average (.303), runs scored (302), hits (505), doubles (83), triples (19), home runs (45) and slugging percentage (.456). D'Amour also helped Courtney Sutter and seven other student-athletes earn ASUN postseason accolades.

The Monrovia, Maryland native made a name for himself nationally as a staunch recruiter and a developer of pitchers and catchers in his decade on the coaching staff at Missouri. D'Amour, who called pitches for 11 no-hitters with the Tigers, mentored 11 NCAA Division I All-Americans, two SEC Freshmen of the Year, three conference pitchers of the year, a national earned run average leader and a defensive player of the year. The Tigers won two Big 12 championships in 2009 and 2012 and finished in the top three of the SEC twice thanks in large part to D'Amour's connections in the fertile recruiting grounds of California. In two seasons as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator, D'Amour put together FloSoftball's third-ranked recruiting class in 2017, and the Tigers went to back-to-back super regionals. D'Amour was a part of three coaching staffs that earned NFCA Midwest Staff of the Year honors.

D'Amour earned a bachelor's degree in general studies with an emphasis in business, English and history, and a master's degree in sports psychology from the University of Missouri. He started throwing underhand at the age of four while serving as batboy for his father's fast-pitch team. He played shortstop and pitched men's fast pitch for seven seasons, including three in the ISC Travel League and was the MVP of the NSA World Series in 2007. During his last ASA National Tournament, D'Amour hit .500 (7-for-14) with three home runs. He also played one year of college baseball at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, where he was an infielder, in addition to a one-year stint at Frostburg State.

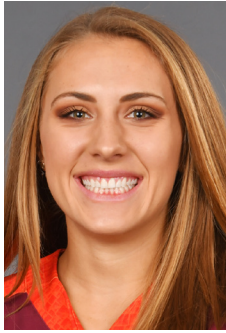
