

KEY STORYLINES

OPENING WEEKEND

- The Hokies remain unbeaten after their first 2 matches of the season conceding zero goals against their opponents (Butler and Indiana).
- Goalkeeper Alia Skinner returns to Tech's starting lineup recording her second shutout of the season with 4 saves against Indiana, and 3 against Butler.
- Skinner is one of only two goalkeepers in the ACC who have recorded 2 shutouts so far this season.
- Tech tied Indiana 0-0 in Bloomington, Ind. after defeating Butler 3-0 in the season opener in Indianapolis, Ind.
- Sophomore Natalie Mitchell recorded her first goal and first assist of the season, both during

the Hokies season opener against Butler. She is leading the Hokies in shots with 3.

- The Freshman duo of Sam DeGuzman and Anna Weir started in their first collegiate game. The pair logged 1 goal (DeGuzman) and 1 assist (Weir).
- Tech scored 3 goals in 21 minutes in the second half, and held a shot advantage of 11-8 versus the Bulldogs.
- Tech was challenged by the Hoosiers defense in Game 2, as the Hokies were held to 3 shots in the first half and only 1 in the second.

2022 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

- Haugen was recently named to the NCAA DI Women's Players to Watch List. She has been a key part of the Hokies

success having started in 52 matches since 2020. Haugen was also named to the All Atlantic Region Second Team at the end of the 2022 season.

- 2022 lead scorer Taylor Price returns to the pitch after most recently being called up to the US U18-19 Youth National Team camp. Price ended her freshman season with 8 goals and 3 assists. Named TopDrawerSoccer First Team Freshman Best XI.
- Price was named to the All-ACC Third Team and All-Freshman Team at the end of her first season.
- Sophomore Natalie Mitchell led the team last year in assist (8), the most assists made by a Tech freshman since 2006, and ended the regular season ranked 4th in the ACC.

- The Hokies bring 9 newcomers to the team including 8 freshman and 1 transfer student. The freshman class was ranked 7th by TopDrawerSoccer last November.

- The Hokies started the 2022 season unbeaten after the first five games against non-conference teams.

- The Hokies won 3 of their first 4 conference matches last season, including two shutout victories over ACC opponents, #22 NC State (1-0), and Wake Forest (2-0).

- The Hokies' win against the Wolfpack marked the team's first win over a nationally ranked team this season.

- Tech held #22 NC State down to 1 shot on goal, with a shot advantage of 21-7. Tech won the match 1-0 with a goal from Taylor Price in the 63rd minute.

- Tech went on to defeat #3 North Carolina 2-1 with both Tech goals in the final 17 minutes. Tori Powell scored the game winning goal in the 85th minute, her 5th game-winning goal in her career.
- The Hokies tied Virginia in the Commonwealth Clash 3-3, with 2 goals from Taylor Bryan in the final 10 minutes. Taylor Price scored the first goal of the match at 30:27, her 8th goal of the season.

- Taylor Price scored the only goal of the game vs. NC State, her sixth goal of the season. Price ended the season ranked second in the ACC among freshmen with 8 goals and 3 assists.

- Taylor Price and Natalie Mitchell were named to the midseason TopDrawerSoccer Freshmen Top 100 list. Price ranked fifth, Mitchell 11th.

2022 REGULAR SEASON STATS

- Tech showed reliance on dominating in the second half of the game, scoring over half their goals in the last 45 minutes (24 of 37).

- The Hokies scored 37 goals in 18 games averaging 2.06 per game.

- Tech's scoring offense was ranked tied for 39th in the NCAA with a scoring average of 2.06. Tech ended the regular season fifth in the ACC with 279 shots, and ranked 6th in Goals.

- Tech's goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove recorded her sixth clean sheet of the season with the win over Syracuse. Hargrove is tied for fourth in the ACC for shutouts, and seventh in saves (51).

- Virginia Tech ended the non-conference portion of their schedule 6-1-1.

SCOUTING THE DUKES

- The Dukes opened their season 2-0 at home with a 3-2 win over Charlotte, and 3-0 shutout versus UNC Greensboro.

- JMU won the match against Charlotte despite a 15-6 shot deficit, with both teams logging 4 shots on goal.

- The Dukes scored 3 goals within 20 minutes into the second half versus Charlotte.

- Redshirt Senior Ellie Johnson scored 2 goals in the 3-0 match against UNC Greensboro, and leads the Dukes in points (4).

- Shea Collins and Alba Fernandez Almargo have each recorded 1 shot and 1 assist this season. Collins was named to Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team in 2021.

- The Dukes Goalkeeper Alexandra Blom has recorded 2 saves and 2 goals against in 180 minutes of play this season. Blom has logged 41 career starts with over 3,800 minutes of game play and 177 saves.

- James Madison tied South Alabama for first in the Sun Belt Conference preseason poll. Amanda Attanasi, Lexi Vanderlinden, Brittany Munson, and Alexandra Blom were named to the All-Sun Belt Team.

SUN BELT RECORD

- The Hokies have an overall Sun Belt conference record of 24-15-1. The Hokies last defeated Old Dominion in 2022 with a 3-0 score in Norfolk, Va.

ATTACK

- Virginia Tech averaged 15.2 shot attempts per match last season, keeping opponents down to an average of 10 shots. The Hokies finished the regular season ranked fifth in the ACC in total shots (251), fifth in points (102), and sixth in goals (34).

- This season, the Hokies trail their opponents in shots 15 to 19.

HOKIES AT HOME

- Virginia Tech went 5-3-2 at home last season. Hokies tied with Indiana 0-0 in the home opener, and then went on to beat Delaware 2-0 later in the week. Tech then went on to take down Charlotte 3-0, before falling to #4 South Carolina 1-2.

- In perhaps the biggest win of the season, Virginia Tech defeated #3 North Carolina 2-1. Tori Powell scored the game winning goal in the 85th minute.

- Hokies scored 20 goals at away matches during the 2022 season.

- Virginia Tech compiled a 10-7-2 record during

the 2022 season, scoring 37 goals at a +11 goal differential.

THE SECOND

- The Hokies proved to be a second half team last season scoring 24 of their 37 goals in the last 45 minutes.

- Tech tied Virginia in the final 10 minutes of the game with two goals.

- Hokies defeated North Carolina in the final 18 minutes of the match with two goals.

- Tori Powell scored her second goal of the game in the 86th minute of the match versus Charlotte.

- In their toughest non-conference match, the Hokies held off the #4 Gamecocks for 56 minutes before allowing a goal. After South Carolina's second goal, the Hokies continued to stop the Gamecocks from scoring in the final 30 minutes.

PRICE

- Freshman Taylor Price scored the first goal of the game for the Hokies four times last season each time leading to a Tech victory.

- Price led the team with eight goals and ended the season with 19 points. Price was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team and All-ACC Third Team.

- As a freshman, Price made a huge impact on the team with 41 shots, 8 goals, 3 assists, and 19 points.

On December 7, 2010, former Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2019 season marked Adair's 14th season in Blacksburg and his ninth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2019 campaign with a 118-53-20 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach that mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a game in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), and earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and 10 overall, as the Hokies made back-to-back trips in 2018 and 2019. Tech has reached the Sweet 16 four times under Adair (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Under Adair, Tech has seen the program's three draft choices selected in the NWSL draft. Jazmine Reeves was the 21st overall pick by the Boston Breakers in 2014, while Mandy McGlynn was chosen one spot higher with the No. 20 pick by Sky Blue FC in 2020. Emily Gray made history in 2021 becoming the highest drafted pick at number three by North Carolina Courage. Tech has also had its only three All-Americans under Adair's tutelage - Reeves (1st, 2013), Murielle Tiernan (3rd, 2015) and McGlynn (2nd, 2019) - and two of its three Academic All-Americans - Katie Yensen (3rd, 2014) and McGlynn (1st, 2019).

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the pitch, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. In addition, both Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department.

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA Championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.

- Price was named to the College Soccer News National Women's Team of the Week on Oct. 3 for her game winning shot against NC State.

POWELL

- Tori Powell scored her 21st career goal vs. North Carolina, her sixth goal of the season in 2022.

- Powell scored the game winning goal against North Carolina in the 85th minute of the match (2-1).

- Powell scored the third and final goal at the Charlotte match with less than 4 minutes remaining in the game. She scored 2 of 3 shots on goal.

- Powell became the 11th Virginia Tech player to notch the program's 13th all-time hat trick on Oct. 10 at Wake Forest (2021).

- Powell's hat trick marked Tech's first against a Power Five opponent (fifth during the program's ACC tenure).

MITCHELL

- Natalie Mitchell took 52 shots in her freshman season, making 3 goal and 8 assists.

- Mitchell went two-for-two on penalty kicks last season, scoring the first goal of the match vs. South Carolina.

BRYAN

- Taylor Bryan was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week after recording a brace against Virginia in the final minute. Bryan scored the equalizer twice last season, first against North Carolina. Her goal changed the tide, and helped the Hokies comeback for a 2-1 victory.

HARGROVE

- Sophomore goalkeeper Lauren Hargrove made her first career start at the Indiana match allowing zero goals in her first full 90 minutes of play against the Hoosiers. Hargrove went on to play 300 minutes last season before allowing one goal.

- Hargrove recorded 6 shutouts, including 3 in the ACC.

PRESEASON POLLS

- Virginia Tech was voted to finish ninth in the preseason ACC standings this season by the league's head coaches.
