THE SERIES

- Virginia Tech is 10-20 all-time against the Tar Heels.
- VT is 4-10 against UNC on the road and has won each of the last three times at Carmichael Arena.
- VT is 8-13 against UNC in ACC play.

A WIN WOULD...

- Help the Hokies to a 4-0 start in ACC play for the first time in program history. VT last started conference play 4-0 in 2001-02 when they were 5-0 in BIG EAST play.
- Be Tech's fifth consecutive victory after suffering back-to-back losses in early December.
- Be Coach Brooks' 450th career victory as a head coach.
- Be VT's second against a ranked team this season. The last time thatt VT beat multiple ranked teams was 2004-05 when they defeated three.

MISCELLANEOUS PROGRAM NOTES

- Aisha Sheppard's 140 games played is a program record.
- Elizabeth Kitley's 156 blocks are fourth alltime and her 26 double-doubles rank T-2.

- The Hokies posted a 3.60 GPA in the fall semester, setting a program record.
- Tech is 3-0 in ACC play for the first time.
- VT owns three consecutive conference wins by 10+ points for the first time since leaving the BIG EAST conference.
- Tech's active streak of five consecutive ACC road wins is a program record.
- The Hokies are shooting 67% from the free throw line this season but have produced from the line in ACC play. The squad is 55-83 (87%) which leads the league in conference games.
- Tech's All-Conference center Elizabeth Kitley has opened the conference season with three terrific performances, all double-doubles. She is averaging 24.7 points, 14.7 rebounds and 3.0 blocks per game while shooting 55% from the field and 87% from the free throw line. Kitley was named the ACC's Player of the Week for the fourth time this season, the first player since Alana Beard in 2002-03 to win four of the league's first eight POW awards.
- PG Georgia Amoore has been a revelation in the last few games, averaging 18.0 points, 5.7 assists and 3,7 rebounds while shooting 51% in the three ACC victories.

MORE ON TECH IN THE NON-CONFERENCE

- Since his arrival in 2016, Coach Brooks has owned the non-conference portion of the schedule, accumulating a 74-15 record.
- He has reached the ACC season unbeaten in the non-conference four times at VT.
- VT is 12-6 against schools from the other Power Five conferences during his tenure, including an impressive 7-2 mark vs. the Big Ten, 4-2 vs. the SEC and a 1-2 record vs. the Big 12. He is yet to face a squad from the Pac 12.

BROOKS LEADS A VETERAN GROUP

 Virginia Tech's roster heads into the 2020-21 season with a combined 14,343 minutes of D1 action under its belt; Sheppard (3,349), Lytle (2,679), Traylor (2,431), Kitley (1,695), Cayla King (1,189), Baines (886), Amoore (787), Norris (607), Gregg (422), Geiman (251), Brooks (47).

MORE ON SHEPPARD AND KITLEY

- The Hokies could boast two All-Americans by March in guard Aisha Sheppard and center Elizabeth Kitley. Sheppard was an AP Honorable Mention selection in 2021. That duo is one of the best in the nation, combining for an ACChigh 35.9 points per game last season.
- They combined to score 30 or more in 20 of Tech's 25 games last season, helping the team go 14-6 in those situations.
 When they were held below 30, Tech was just 1-4. Their combined point total was between 21 and 54 points in every game.
- Kitley will once again be in the conversation for the Lisa Leslie Award, honoring the nation's top center, which she was a finalist for in 2021. During that season, Kitley averaged 18.2 points, 10.4 rebounds and shot better than 53% from the field. In fact, she was the only Power Five sophomore to average 18 and 10 and furthermore was one of six P5 athletes to score 455 points and pull down 259 rebounds.
- Sheppard led the ACC and was fifth nationally with 87 made 3's on the season, breaking her own VT singleseason record. Already a 1,000-point scorer, Sheppard moved into sixth alltime at VT with 1,445 career points and stands 347 points away from breaking Hall of Famer Renee Dennis' (Class of 1987) record of 1,791 points.

MULTIPLE 1,000-POINT SCORERS THIS YEAR

 In addition to Aisha Sheppard and Emily Lytle who came into the season with 1,000 career points, Elizabeth Kitley has also reached the mark and Kayana Traylor (919) could reach the milestone this season. It will be the first time in three seasons that the Hokies have put multiple 1,000-point scorers on the court at the same time.

BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE RENEWED

- After a one-year hiatus, the Big Ten/ACC Challenge was renewed this season with a full slate of matchups.
- Tech defeated Wisconsin 70-60 for their sixth condecutive victory in the competition, helping the ACC secure another win in The Challenge.
- The Hokies are one of two programs across the leagues to boast a six-game streak in The Challenge (Florida State).
- Coach Brooks is 5-0 in the competition, owning wins over Nebraska, Illinois, Rutgers, Purdue and Wisconsin by an average margin of 19.0 points.

SCOORING NOTES ON THE HOKIES

- Tech scored 92 in the ACC opener against FSU. That total is the second-most ever scored by the program in an ACC contest
- The last time that the Hokies scored 90 in consecutive games was in December of 2016 when they scored 98 against Bowling Green and then 92 at Auburn. The feat has never been achieved in ACC play.
- In the ACC era, VT WBB has scored 90+ on 20 occasions, winning each time. Kenny Brooks has been the head coach for 13 of those games.
- Brooks has had at least one such game in each of his six seasons in Blacksburg, including four each during the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.

LISA LESLIE IS WATCHING

- For the second conseuctive season, C Elizabeth Kitley is on the Lisa Leslie Award Watch List, which honors the nation's top center. In 2020-21 she played her way onto the list and was a finalist in March for the accolade.
- Now in her junior season, Kitley is on the initial Watch List of the season along with 19 other student-athletes from across the country.

TECH EARNS VALIDATION AFTER SENSATIONAL 2020-21 SEASON

- For the first time since 1999, VT is ranked in the preseason AP Poll, coming in at No. 24.
- It is the first time that the Hokies have been ranked since January 23, 2017, which was Coach Brooks' first season in charge in Blacksburg.
- The Hokies not only earned the respect of the national media, but they were voted fourth in the preseason ACC Poll, representing the highest preseason predicted order of finish for the program since joining the conference in 2004. Tech has never earned the four seed at the ACC Tournament, although they did finish T-4 in 2019-20 when they set a program record with 11 ACC victories.

DANCING AGAIN

- Tech ended a 15-year drought with its 2021 NCAA Tournament appearance, the program's 10th overall.
- In a unique Tournament played in the greater San Antonio region, the Hokies, a seven seed matchup up with Marquette in the first round. The Hokies earned a 70-63 victory behind 23 points and eight rebounds from Elizabeth Kitley and timely 3-point shooting from Da'Ja Green who made her only two shots of the game. Tech led by 15 with 5:28 to play in the game but the Eagles made a furious rally to cut the lead to just three in the final minute before Tech put the game away from the free throw line.
- Tech was beaten 90-48 in the second round by defending NCAA Champs Baylor who shot 50% from the field and had a +30 advantage on the glass. In that game Georgia Amoore led the Hokies with 18 points on 4-for-9 shooting from beyond the arc.

KITLEY A DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

- After registering 13 her sophomore season, Kitley owns six already this season, a mark that is tops in the league.
- Her 25 career double-doubles are fifth most all-time at VT.
- She owns a streak of three consecutive double-doubles.

CAYLA THE KING OF THE LONG BALL

• Junior G Cayla King scored 60 3-pointers last season and upped her scoring average to 8.7 points per game.

- For her career, 115 of her 124 field goals have come from beyond the arc where she shoots better than 38%.
- After not registering a game of 10+ points in her freshman season, King eclipsed double figures nine times in 2020-21. In those games VT was 8-1, with the only loss coming at No. 2 NC State by two points.

SHEPPARD'S CAREER SENIOR SEASON

- Aisha Sheppard scored 20 or more points in nine contests last season, second-most in the conference behind only ACC Player of the Year Dana Evans. Like Evans, she scored in double figures in every regular season contest prior to playing the conference tournament in Greensboro.
- Her Honorable Mention All-America nod made her the first Hokie to earn the accolade since 1999 and just the fourth overall.

GREGG MAKES AN IMPACT OFF THE BENCH

- F D'asia Gregg suffered several DNP's (coaches decision) early in the 2020-21 season as she became acclimated with the Hokies' system on the court.
- Coach Brooks later praised Gregg, affectionately called D-Mo, for her patience and perseverance. She is frequently the loudest player on the bench, calling out plays, screens and cheering on her teammates.
- She began to play a greater role on the court in the middle of the season and ended up securing her first career doubledouble in the ACC Tournament victory over Miami with 13 points and 10 rebounds.
- VT is 5-2 when D-Mo plays 20+ minutes.
- VT is 4-1 when D-Mo grabs 5+ rebounds.

JUNIOR TAYLOR GEIMAN BACK ON THE FLOOR FOR BROOKS AND CO.

- Hanover, Pennsylvania native Taylor Geiman has played in just 19 career games, suffering season-ending knee injuries in both of her seasons in Blacksburg.
- Back healthy, the G/F is poised to make an impact once again on the court for the Hokies.
- Praised as a 'Swiss Army' knife by Coach Brooks, Geiman can play nearly any poistion on the floor.

EMILY LYTLE. A FAMILIAR FACE NOW IN MAROON AND ORANGE

- Graduate student Emily Lytle joined the Hokies in the summer of 2021 after a stellar career at nearby Liberty. While with the Flames, she faced the Hokies three times.
- In those contests, all VT victories, Lytle averaged 15.3 points and 3.6 rebounds.

KITLEY ON NUMEROUS WATCH LISTS THIS SEASON

 Center Elizabeth Kitley has been included in the following already this year; Preseason All-ACC, Lisa Leslie Award Watch List, ESPN Top 25, Wade Watch List, Wooden Award Top 50, Naisimith Trophy Women's Watch List.

SHEPPARD ON THE WOODEN AWARD AS WELL

 G Aisha Sheppard is also a Preseason All-ACC selection and was placed on the Wooden Award Top 50, making VT one of 12 schools and three in the ACC with multiple athletes on the list.

SHEPPARD A SENIOR CLASS AWARD NOMINEE

- The Senior CLASS Award announced their top 30 candidates on December 7, with Hokie guard Aisha Sheppard amongst that group.
- Virginia Tech is one of three schools to have a candidate on both the men's and women's side (F Justyn Mutts).

BIOGRAPHY IN BULLETS

- Kenny Brooks was named the seventh head women's basketball coach in Virginia Tech women's basketball history on March 28, 2016 and concluded his fifth season at the helm of the Hokies' program in 2021. He won his 100th game as a Hokie at the 2021 ACC Tournament with a 72-64 victory over Miami.
- Since Brooks' arrival in Blacksburg, the Hokies have enjoyed five consecutive winning seasons, and made a return to the NCAA Tournament in 2021 after a 15-year absence.
- Tech's 2020-21 season was a special one in several regards, with the
 Hokies winning their First Round NCAA Tournament game against
 Marquette, the team securing the program's first win over an AP top
 four team, a program record six-game winning streak in ACC play, and
 for the first time, two student-athletes were honored as First Team AllACC performers.
- The Hokies set numerous program records in 2019-20, most notably winning 11 ACC games for the first time and earning the five seed at the conference's tournament.
- To begin his tenure, Brooks and the Hokies reeled off 15 straight wins to open the 2016-17 season, Tech's strongest start to a season in 18 years.
 Behind that strong start, Tech climbed to as high as No. 15 in the AP Poll.
- Brooks has ushered in a new era of uptempo basketball at Virginia Tech, as his Hokies have reset the program scoring record twice and surpassed the mark for 3-pointers made.
- During his time in Blacksburg, brooks has recruited and developed All-ACC performer Taylor Emery, who set the single season scoring record in 2017-18 at 667 points. She also scored the most field goals in a single campaign with 236. She became the fastest player to 1,000 points (55 games) and was the first Hokie to earn first team All-ACC honors when she did so in 2019.
- Five Hokies have reached 1,000 points since Brooks joined Tech including All-ACC performers Emery, Regan Magarity, Aisha Sheppard and Elizabeth Kitley. Magarity graduated in 2019 with her name imprinted all throughout the record book, with over 1,600 points and an ACC record 1,299 rebounds.
- Brooks joined the Hokies after an impressive 14-seasons at his alma mater, James Madison. He compiled a record of 337-122 (.756) making him the winningest coach in JMU program history. He guided the Dukes to 11 consecutive postseason appearances that included six NCAA bids and five trips to the WNIT.
- Over an 11-year stretch (2005-16), Brooks' squads never won fewer than 24 games, averaging 26.3 wins per year. The Dukes won three consecutive CAA championships under Brooks' tutelage (2014-16) and captured a total of five conference titles.
- During those final three seasons in Harrisonburg, Brooks and the Dukes compiled an impressive 60-3 record in conference play.
- He was named CAA Coach of the Year for a fourth time in 2015-16, while his student-athletes also garnered CAA Player and Rookie of the Year

honors

- Under Brooks, JMU tallied six CAA Players of the Year, three Rookies
 of the Year and two Defensive Players of the Year. The Dukes also
 recorded 31 All-CAA selection, 11 Defensive Team and 10 All-Rookie
 Team selections during his tenure.
- The Waynesboro, Virginia native has coached four WNBA Draft picks; Tamera Young, Lauren Okafor anf Jazmon Gwathmey from JMU and Regan Magarity from Tech (2019).
- BA 1992 graduate of JMU, Brooks played for three seasons under legendary coach Lefty Driessel and made two NIT appearances while earning a degree in business management. He began his coaching career as a part-time assistant for the 1993-94 JMU men's squad that won the CAA Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.
- After four seasons as an assistant for the men's program at VMI (1994-98), he moved back to his alma mater as a men's assistant from 1998-2002. He was named interim women's head coach on Dec. 6, 2002 before taking over those duties on a full-time basis on March 21, 2003.

STATISTICALLY THE BEST

 Brooks has coached his team to leading the nation in a statistical category at both schools: JMU led D1 in rebound margin (+12.9) in 2008 and VT led D1 in free throw percentage in 2019 at 80%.

DEFENDING CASSELL, KENNY'S FORTRESS

- In his six seasons in Blacksburg, Coach Brooks has enjoyed a 69-23 (.744) record in home games played on Carilion Clinic Court at Cassell Coliseum.
- He owns 21 victories by 30+ points against non-conference foes at home and is 48-1 against them in all competitions.

COMMONWEALTH COMPETITION

- Brooks is 13-8 against the eight in-state foes that he has faced while at VT.
- This season the Hokies will face George Mason, Liberty and Virginia
- He is 4-0 against Radford, 3-0 vs. George Mason, 3-1 against Liberty, 2-0 vs. Richmond, 1-0 against Longwood and VCU, 2-6 vs. Virginia and 0-1 against JMU.
- Including games played at Cassell, Brooks is 72-28 (.717) in the state of Virginia as the head coach of the Hokies.

MR. JANUARY

- Brooks' career record in the month of January is 102-56 (.643).
- In his 19 completed seasons of being a head coach he has finishedJanuary unbeaten twice (2007 and 2015 with James Madison).





"I know that Coach Brooks is a family man, a man of faith and I felt at peace throughout the whole recruiting process at Virginia Tech. I am excited to start this next chapter!" Lytle, a 5-foot-11 guard/forward from Memphis, led the Flames to a 19-8 record in 2020-21, earning First Team All-Conference honors after averaging 14.7 points per game and 5.0 rebounds, both career highs. For her career in Lynchburg, Lytle started in 86 of 90 games played, scored 12.8 points per game and pulled down 4.4 rebounds. She has a career shooting percentage of 42%, which includes 35% from 3-point range. Lytle suited up against the Hokies in each of the last three seasons, scoring 13, 19 and 14 points respectively in those contests.

Her name is plastered across the Flame record books as she occupies 13th all-time in scoring, owns the single season record for 3-pointers with 64 in 2019, her 39.1% mark from beyond the arc in 2021 is the best for a single campaign and her 34 consecutive made free throws in 2020 are also a program best.



MADISON, WI --The Virginia Tech women's basketball team got a 29-point showing from the bench on the way to a 70-60 victory over the Wisconsin Badgers on the road Wednesday.

The Hokies (7-1) had four players score in double figures, led by Azana Baines, who notched a double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds. Elizabeth Kitley tacked on 13 points and Kayana Traylor helped out with 10 points off the bench.

Virginia Tech forced 14 Wisconsin turnovers while committing 13 themselves in Wednesday's game. The Hokies turned those takeaways into 13 points on the offensive end of the floor. Baines' one steal led the way for Virginia Tech.

How It Happened

After playing to a 3-3 tie early in the game, Virginia Tech went on an 8-0 run with 8:42 left in the first quarter, culminating in a three from Aisha Sheppard, to take an 11-3 lead. The Hokies then added two points to that lead by the end of the period and entered the quarter break with a 27-17 advantage. Virginia Tech relied on its three-point shooting in the period, knocking down six shots to account for 18 of its 27 points.

Virginia Tech kept its first quarter lead intact before going on an 8-0 run starting at the 6:26 mark in the second period to increase its lead to 37-23. The Hokies kept that lead for the remainder of the period and enjoyed a 41-27 advantage heading into halftime. Virginia Tech forced three Wisconsin turnovers in the period and turned them into four points.

Virginia Tech continued to preserve its halftime lead before going on a 5-0 run, punctuated by a basket from Kitley, to expand its lead further to 57-43 with 1:21 to go in the third. Before the conclusion of the third period, the Badgers had cut into that lead somewhat, but the Hokies still entered the fourth quarter with a 57-45 edge. Virginia Tech played well near the basket, scoring 14 of its 16 points in the paint.

Virginia Tech kept its lead intact before going on a 5-0 run, finished off by Cayla King's three, to grow the lead to 62-47 with 5:44 to go in the contest. The Badgers narrowed the margin somewhat before the game was over, but the Hokies still cruised the rest of the way for the 70-60 win. Virginia Tech took advantage of its opportunities in the post, scoring eight of its 13 points in the paint.

BLACKSBURG, VA --Aisha Sheppard collected 30 points, but the Virginia Tech women's basketball team fell to the No. 11 Tennessee Lady Volunteers 64-58 at home Sunday.

The Hokies (7-2) had two players score in double figures, led by Sheppard, who had 30 points and two steals. Georgia Amoore tacked on 12 points and Elizabeth Kitley added four points, nine rebounds, two steals and three blocks.

The Virginia Tech offense was strong from deep, pouring in 12 threes on 29 attempts. Sheppard hit seven treys for the Hokies in the contest.

The Virginia Tech defense was a problem in Sunday's game, forcing 17 Tennessee turnovers while committing 14. Those takeaways turned into 20 points on the offensive end of the floor. Kitley's two steals led the way individually for the Hokies.

How It Happened

After falling behind 9-6, Virginia Tech went on a 10-0 run with 3:26 left in the first quarter, culminating in a three from Sheppard, to take a 16-9 lead. The Hokies then lost some of that lead, but still entered the quarter break with a 16-12 advantage. Virginia Tech relied on its three-point shooting in the period, knocking down four shots to account for 12 of its 16 points.

The Hokies could not maintain their lead in the second quarter and entered halftime trailing 27-25.

Tennessee continued to increase its lead after halftime, building a 29-25 advantage before Virginia Tech went on a 7-0 run, punctuated by a basket from Azana Baines, to grab a 32-29 lead with 7:10 to go in the third. The Hokies held onto that lead for the rest of the frame and entered the fourth quarter with a 42-39 edge.
