NOTABLES

• **TEXAS IN THE BIG DANCE:** Texas is making its 36th trip to the NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns are one of eight schools to appear in at least 20 of the last 23 NCAA tourneys. Texas is one of six schools to appear in at least 28 of the last 33 NCAA tourneys.

• **BEARD'S SUCCESS IN THE DANCE:** Chris Beard is 10-4 in his previous four NCAA Tournament appearances. He led Texas Tech to the 2018 Elite Eight and the 2019 NCAA Championship Game. Beard is 4-0 in First Round games in the NCAA Tournament.

• **IT'S ABOUT DEFENSE:** Texas ranks **SIXTH** in the nation in scoring defense (59.6 ppg) entering the NCAA Tournament. UT is a perfect **17-0** this season when holding its opponent below 60 points.

• **RAMEY RAMPS UP:** Senior Courtney Ramey has averaged a team-best 16.5 ppg and 8.0 rpg while hitting 6-of-12 from three-point range in his last two games.

TEXAS IN THE BIG DANCE

- This marks the 36th overall appearance by the Longhorns in the NCAA Tournament (35-38 record).
- Texas has now advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 20 of the last 23 seasons (not including the 2020 postseason which was canceled due to COVID-19). **UT is one of EIGHT schools to appear in at least 20 of the last 23 NCAA tourneys.**
- Texas has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 28 of the last 33 seasons (not including the 2020 postseason which was canceled due to COVID-19). **UT is one of SIX schools to appear in at least 28 of the last 33 NCAA tourneys.**

BEARD IN THE BIG DANCE

- This marks **Chris Beard's** fifth NCAA Tournament appearance as a Division I head coach. He owns a **10-4** mark in his previous four NCAA tourney appearances.
- **Beard is a perfect 4-0 in First Round games in the NCAA Tournament.**
- In his first appearance at the Big Dance in 2016, he guided No. 12 seed Little Rock to an 85-83 double-overtime victory against No. 5 seed Purdue in the First Round.
- Beard went 9-3 during three trips to the NCAA tourney while at Texas Tech. He led the Red Raiders to the 2018 Elite Eight and the 2019 NCAA Championship Game.

VIRGINIA TECH SERIES INFO

- Friday's contest marks the first meeting on the court between Texas and Virginia Tech.

IN THE POLLS

- The Longhorns are ranked No. **25** in the final AP poll (March 14) and No. **25** in the latest Ferris Mowers coaches poll (March 14).
- UT earned a spot in the final AP rankings for just the second time since the 2010-11 season. Texas was No. 9 in 2020-21 and No. 8 in 2010-11.
- The Longhorns have now made 13 appearances in the final AP poll since the wire service started its college basketball rankings in 1949.

20 WINS IN FEBRUARY

- With the home victory against TCU (Feb. 23), the Longhorns reached the 20-win mark in the **month of February** for the first time since the 2013-14 season. That year, they accomplished the feat on Feb. 15, 2014 and went on to record 22 regular-season victories.
- UT reached the 20-win mark in the regular season for the first time since the 2015-16 season. That year, the Longhorns accomplished the feat in the final game of the regular season on March 4, 2016.
- Texas has now reached the 20-win plateau a total of 33 times in its 116 seasons of basketball.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

- Texas improved to **4-1 this season in games decided by three points or less** with its 82-81 win at West Virginia (Feb. 26).
- All four of the victories have come since the end of January.
- Texas has earned recent nail-biter wins against No. 18/20 Tennessee (52-51), No. 8/8 Kansas (79-76) and at Oklahoma (80-78 in overtime) in addition to the 82-81 victory at West Virginia (Feb. 26).

DOUBLE-DIGIT SECOND-HALF COMEBACKS

- In Austin on Feb. 23, UT trailed TCU 48-38 with 13:20 remaining in the game. The Longhorns finished the contest on a 37-18 run to earn the 75-66 victory.
- In Morgantown on Feb. 26, West Virginia held a 64-54 with 10:31 left. Texas closed the game with a 28-17 run to claim an 82-81 win.

PLAYING THE BEST

- UT had an earlier stretch of **five consecutive games and six-of-seven contests** against ranked opponents.
- The Longhorns faced No. 18/20 Tennessee (52-51 win), at No. 14/14 Texas Tech (77-64 loss), No. 20/22 Iowa State (63-41 win), No. 8/8 Kansas (79-76 win) and at No. 10/10 Baylor (80-63 loss) in a five-game gauntlet from Jan. 29-Feb. 12.
- This marked just the **second time in UT history** that the Longhorns played five straight games against AP Top 25 foes since The AP poll began in the 1948-49 season. Texas also played five-consecutive games against AP Top 25 opponents during the 2014-15 season.
- After an overtime win at Oklahoma (Feb. 15), UT then faced No. 11/11 Texas Tech on Feb. 19 (61-55 loss).
- By facing back-to-back ranked foes in No. 3/4 Baylor (Feb. 28) and No. 6/7 Kansas (March 5), **the Longhorns concluded the regular season by playing ranked opponents in eight of their final 11 contests.**

TCU RECAP

- Texas had its seven-game win streak against the Horned Frogs snapped in the loss.
- The Longhorns held a 20-point lead (40-20) with 45 seconds left in the first half.
- UT held the lead for a total time of 28:23, while the Horned Frogs had the lead for a combined time of 4:59.
- Texas converted 65.2-percent from the field (15-23), including a 7-of-11 mark (.636) from three-point range, in the first half.
- The Longhorns limited TCU to 22 points on 29.0-percent shooting from the floor (9-31), including a 2-of-9 mark (.222) from three-point range, in the opening 20 minutes.
- Texas closed the first half with a 20-3 run over the final 5:38 to take a 40-22 lead into the break.
- Eight of UT's nine players who saw game action in the first half scored, and six different Longhorns converted a three-pointer in the opening 20 minutes.
- **Timmy Allen** reached double figures in scoring (team-high 16 points) for the 21st time this year (32 games) and 92nd in his career (117 games). He tied his season high in steals (three). Five of his nine rebounds came off the offensive glass.
- **Christian Bishop** has now posted at least one block in 10 consecutive games.
- **Jase Febres** tied his career high and set his season high in assists (three) without a turnover in seven minutes of action.
- **Courtney Ramey** set his season high in rebounds (nine), one shy of his career high (10 vs. Northern Colorado on Nov. 5, 2019). He reached double figures in scoring (15 points) for the 13th time this season (32 games) and 70th in his career (126 games). He tied his season high in field goals made (6-14) and assists (three) against just one turnover in 37 minutes.

TOURNEY TESTED

- The Longhorns have faced **eight** opponents during the 2021-22 season who have advanced to the NCAA Tournament (Baylor, Gonzaga, Iowa State, Kansas, Seton Hall, Tennessee, TCU and Texas Tech).
- Texas has played a total of **14** games against NCAA Tournament teams this year.
- The Longhorns have recorded **five** wins against NCAA tourney opponents (73-50 at TCU on Jan. 25, 52-51 vs. Tennessee on Jan. 29, 63-41 vs. Iowa State on Feb. 5, 79-76 vs. Kansas on Feb. 7, and 75-66 vs. TCU on Feb. 23).

YEAR ONE OF THE CHRIS BEARD ERA

- **Chris Beard** was introduced as the 25th head basketball coach at The University of Texas on April 2, 2021.
- Beard is a 1995 graduate of The University of Texas with a degree in Kinesiology. During his undergraduate time, he worked as a student assistant under head coach Tom Penders.
- **In his 12 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Beard has a 273-114 (.705) record** and advanced to four NCAA Tournaments.
- Beard inherited a program at Texas Tech that was coming off five losing seasons in the six years prior to his arrival, and he guided the Red Raiders to a 112-55 (.671) record, including a 9-3 mark in NCAA Tournament games.
- Texas Tech advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time in program history in 2018 and returned the following year with a trip to the 2019 National Championship Game.
- The 2019 Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Beard is a two-time Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year (2018 and 2019).
- In addition to his five years at Texas Tech, Beard has also led five other programs, serving as head coach at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock (2015-16), Angelo State University (2013-15), McMurry University (2012-13), Seminole State College (2000-01) and Fort Scott Community College (1999-2000).

HOW THE ROSTER CAME TO BE ...

- When Chris Beard was introduced as the head coach of the Longhorns on April 2, his roster was essentially blank.
- **Night of April 2: Brock Cunningham** (who was on a road trip at the time of the hire) talked with Beard on the phone and committed to returning.
- **April 13: Jase Febres** and **Andrew Jones** decide to return and Beard/staff began group workouts with those three players.
- **April 16: Devin Askew** signs paperwork to transfer to Texas.
- **April 17: Timmy Allen** and **Christian Bishop** both sign paperwork to transfer to Texas.
- **April 27: Dylan Disu** signs paperwork to transfer to Texas.
- **April 28: Courtney Ramey** announces his return for his senior season.
- **June 1: Avery Benson** and **Gavin Perryman** arrive in Austin and begin summer workouts later that week.
- **June 19: Tre Mitchell** signs paperwork to transfer to Texas.
- **July 19: Marcus Carr** signs paperwork to transfer to Texas.

DID YOU SAY 'EXPERIENCED' ???

- The average age of UT's 14-man roster is 21.7 years old.
- **EIGHT Longhorns are currently at least 22 years old.**
- The 12 players who brought previous collegiate experience to the 2021-22 roster have combined career totals of **1,228** games played (772 starts), **11,683** points, **4,654** rebounds and **2,384** assists.
- **SIX** players on the roster have reached the 1,000-point mark, including **THREE** with over 1,600 points in their collegiate careers.
- **EIGHT** players on the roster have posted at least 400 career rebounds, and **FIVE** players have tallied at least 250 career assists.
- **EIGHT** of UT's 12 players who have previous collegiate experience averaged double figures in scoring last year: Timmy Allen (17.2), Christian Bishop (11.0), Marcus Carr (19.4), Dylan Disu (15.0), Andrew Jones (14.6), Tre Mitchell (18.8), Courtney Ramey (12.2) and Tristen Licon (20.4).
- **FIVE** players have earned their degrees: Avery Benson (Texas Tech), Marcus Carr (Minnesota), Jase Febres (Texas), Andrew Jones (Texas) and Tristen Licon (Sul Ross State).

EXCITEMENT IN THE FAN BASE

- Texas set a single-season record for **most season tickets distributed** with a total of **9,287**. The Longhorns topped the previous mark of 8,882 set in 2004-05.
- The **sellout crowd of 16,540** against No. 18/20 Tennessee (Jan. 29) marked **UT's first sellout** at the Frank Erwin Center since **Feb. 29, 2016** against No. 1/1 Kansas.
- Texas registered its second sellout of the season against No. 11/11 Texas Tech (Feb. 19) and its third sellout of the year in the final regular-season home game against Baylor (Feb. 28).
- The attendance of 14,683 (tickets distributed) for the season-opening doubleheader on Nov. 9 marked the fourth-largest home-opening crowd in the 45-year history of the Frank Erwin Center. It also marked the largest home-opening crowd since UT drew 15,291 fans on Nov. 17, 2001 against Arizona.
- In the 18 games at the Erwin Center this season, the Longhorns averaged **12,929** fans per game.
- The total attendance at the Erwin Center in the 2021-22 season was 232,729 fans. That marked the fourth-highest single-season total attendance in Erwin Center history and most since the 2010-11 season (246,044).

ALL-BIG 12 AWARDS

- **All FIVE Texas starters** earned spots on the 2021-22 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Award teams (March 6). The official All-Big 12 awards are selected by the league's head coaches who are not allowed to vote for their own players.
- **Timmy Allen** earned All-Big 12 Second Team honors and claimed a spot on the five-person Big 12 All-Newcomer Team.
- **Marcus Carr** garnered All-Big 12 Third Team accolades.
- **Christian Bishop, Andrew Jones** and **Courtney Ramey** each were selected Honorable Mention All-Big 12.
- Jones earned his third All-Big 12 Conference selection, as he was All-Big 12 Second Team in 2020-21 and Honorable Mention in 2019-20.
- Ramey also claimed his third All-Big 12 Conference selection, as he was All-Big 12 Third Team in 2020-21 and Honorable Mention in 2019-20.

DEFENSE WINS

- Texas has limited its first 32 opponents to an average of 59.6 ppg. **UT ranks SIXTH in the nation in scoring defense through games of March 13.**
- UT has held nine of its first 32 opponents to 50 points or below.
- **Texas is 17-0 this season when holding its opponent below 60 points.**
- UT has held its opponent to 20 points or below in a half a total of **10** times this year.

... AND MORE DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- In the most recent KenPom rankings (through games of March 13), UT is No. **13** in the nation in defensive efficiency (91.4).
- Texas has allowed just 293 assists while forcing 481 turnovers in its first 32 games.
- The Longhorns lead the Big 12 and rank 22nd nationally in turnover margin (+3.3).

A LOOK INSIDE THE OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- In the most recent KenPom rankings (through games of March 13), Texas is No. **32** in the nation in offensive efficiency (111.8).
- UT leads the Big 12 in free throw percentage (**74.9**). **The last time Texas converted at least 75-percent from the line was in 1977-78 (76.0).**
- UT ranks second in the Big 12 in fewest turnovers per game (11.8).

DEPTH & BALANCE

- **SEVEN** different players have led the team in scoring in its first 32 contests.
- **TEN** players have reached double figures in scoring in a game this season.
- **TEN** players average at least 10.9 minutes per contest.

TIMMY IS TOUGH

Senior F **Timmy Allen** has played in 117 career games (114 starts) during his four years at Utah and Texas. He has registered career totals of 1,717 points, 743 rebounds and 328 assists. Allen has reached double figures in scoring 92 times and topped the 20-point mark 25 times in his career. He has reached double digits in rebounds 15 times in his career. Allen has recorded 14 career double-doubles.

- Through the first 32 contests (32 starts), Allen leads the team in scoring (12.3 ppg), rebounding (6.5 rpg) and steals (40) and ranks second in assists (67) and third in minutes (29.2 mpg).
- He has converted 50.5-percent (145-287) from the floor and 73-percent (100-137) from the free throw line this year.
- Allen posted 16 points (6-11 FG, 4-4 FT), nine rebounds (five offensive), three steals, two assists and one block in 36 minutes against TCU in the Phillips 66 Big 12 quarterfinals (March 10).
- He tallied 10 points, seven rebounds (four offensive), three assists and one steal in 36 minutes against No. 3/4 Baylor (Feb. 28).

Andrew Jones is in his sixth season with the UT program in 2021-22. He was diagnosed with leukemia in January 2018 but underwent successful treatment at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston. Jones re-joined the team for the 2018-19 season and played in two games, as he continued his treatments throughout the year. **He completed his final treatment in September 2019.** Jones was granted a medical redshirt for both the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons and is classified as a redshirt senior (still has one year of eligibility remaining due to COVID). Here's a timeline of Andrew's battle and inspirational recovery:

- May 2017: Went through NBA Pre-Draft Combine following his freshman season but decided to withdraw his name from the draft pool and return to UT for his sophomore season.
- Dec. 5, 2017: Suffered a fracture in his right wrist during the final minutes at VCU and missed the next four games.
- Dec. 29, 2017 and Jan. 1, 2018: Returns to the court but only plays limited minutes (nine vs. Kansas, 11 at Iowa State).
- Jan. 9, 2018 (night): Shaka Smart informs the Texas team that Jones had been diagnosed with leukemia.
- Jan. 10, 2018: Andrew's family (through UT) publicly announces Jones' diagnosis.
- Jan. 19, 2018: Moved to The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston.
- Feb. 24, 2018: Released from MD Anderson Cancer Center and began receiving treatments on an outpatient basis.
- June 7, 2018: Jones is approved to enroll in web-based coursework for first session of summer school at UT. Allowed to move into a dorm room and uses the room during the times he is on campus.
- Aug. 24, 2018: Finishes round of treatment at MD Anderson Cancer Center and heads to Austin to move back into the dorm.
- Aug. 29, 2018: Began fall classes at UT and allowed to participate in basketball-related activities.
- Nov. 6, 2018: Entered the Eastern Illinois game at the 11:40 mark of the second half. Saw nine minutes of playing time and recorded one point (1-2 FT), one rebound, one assist and one steal in his first game action since Jan. 1, 2018 at Iowa State.
- Nov. 16, 2018: Plays two minutes and scores two points (2-2 FT) and grabs one rebound vs. The Citadel.
- Dec. 11, 2018: Returned to MD Anderson to begin next round of pre-scheduled treatment.
- Jan. 10, 2019: Re-joined the team at practice but did not see game action for the remainder of the year.
- Spring/Summer 2019: Continues several additional cycles of treatment while remaining a full-time UT student and practicing with the basketball team.
- September 2019: Completes final round of treatment while on the UT campus and participating in preseason team and individual basketball workouts.

PERRY WALLACE MOST COURAGEOUS AWARD

- **Andrew Jones** has been selected as this year's co-winner of the United States Basketball Writers Association's (USBWA) Perry Wallace Most Courageous Award.
- Jones and co-winner Justin Hardy will be honored at the Final Four during an awards luncheon on Monday, April 4 in New Orleans. Hardy is a Division III player at Washington University in St. Louis who is battling Stage 4 stomach cancer while still competing with his team.
- Dating back to 1978, the USBWA annually recognizes a player, coach, official or administrator who has demonstrated extraordinary courage reflecting honor on the sport of amateur basketball. Along with the award, the USBWA presents a \$1,000 check to the charity or scholarship fund as selected by the recipient.
- Jones' impact following his recovery from leukemia has stretched well beyond the court. He has inspired many through sharing his journey and has shown additional courage through his leadership.
- Jones recently announced he is donating a portion of the money received through his name, image and likeness deals to the V Foundation for cancer research.
- Last year, this prestigious award was named in honor of Perry Wallace. Wallace was the first African-American basketball player in the Southeastern Conference and the first Black athlete to play a full four-year career in the SEC in any sport.
- During Wallace's time at Vanderbilt at the height of the Civil Rights movement, Wallace displayed tremendous courage in the face of vicious threats around the South and social isolation on campus, and equal courage in speaking up against racism and injustice throughout his life before his passing in 2017.

CHRISTIAN'S CAUSE

Senior F **Christian Bishop** has played in 122 career games (83 starts) during his four seasons at Creighton and Texas. He has recorded career totals of 941 points, 600 rebounds and 111 blocked shots. Bishop has converted **63.3-percent** (376-594) from the field over his **career**. He has reached double figures in scoring 48 times and double digits in rebounds 10 times in his career. Bishop has tallied seven double-doubles in his collegiate career.

Senior G **Jase Febres** (pronounced: JAYCE FEB-rus) has played in 133 career games (68 starts). He has reached double figures in scoring 33 times in his career, including four 20-point efforts. Febres has registered 826 points and converted 35.8-percent from three-point range (216-603) during his career.

- Through his first 29 games (six starts), Febres ranks tied for seventh on the team in scoring (3.8 ppg) in 13.4 mpg.
- He posted a season-best 14 points (5-6 FG, 4-5 threes) in 21 minutes at West Virginia (Feb. 26). He had a team-best plus-minus total of plus-16 in his 21 minutes played.
- Febres tallied eight points, two boards and one blocked shot in 20 minutes against No. 11/11 Texas Tech (Feb. 19).
- He recorded eight points (2-4 threes, 2-2 FT), two boards and one steal in 21 minutes at No. 10/10 Baylor (Feb. 12).
- Febres tallied 10 points (3-6 FG, 2-4 threes, 2-2 FT) and four rebounds in 27 minutes at No. 1/1 Gonzaga (Nov. 13).
- He graduated in May 2021 with a degree in Corporate Communication and is continuing his studies in personal branding.
- Febres missed the first 12 contests of the 2020-21 season while completing his rehabilitation from microfracture surgery on his left knee (suffered the injury on Feb. 8, 2020).

CUNNINGHAM BACK FOR YEAR FOUR

Junior F **Brock Cunningham** is in his fourth season in the UT program. Cunningham has played in 73 career games (four starts) and reached double figures in scoring once and double digits in rebounds three times. A three-time Academic All-Big 12 selection, he elected to redshirt the 2018-19 season.

- Through the first 32 contests (three starts), he is averaging 2.3 points and 2.2 boards in 11.6 minutes per game.
- Cunningham has converted 26-of-53 field goals (.491), including 10-of-20 threes (.500), and 13-of-16 free throws (.813) this year.
- He recorded seven points (2-3 FG, 1-1 three), six rebounds, one assist, one steal and one block in 18 minutes against No. 11/11 Texas Tech (Feb. 19).
- Cunningham tied his career high with four assists and set season highs in rebounds (seven) and minutes (24) at TCU (Jan. 25). Five of his seven boards came off the offensive glass.
- He set career highs in scoring with 10 points (2-2 FG, 1-1 three) and free throws made (5-5) while adding two steals in 14 minutes against San Jose State (Nov. 20).

FRESH START FOR ASKEW

Sophomore G **Devin Askew** has played in 57 career games (23 starts) during his first two years at Kentucky and Texas. The consensus No. 1 point guard in the class of 2021, he reclassified to be a part of the class of 2020.

- Through the first 32 games (three starts), Askew is fifth on the team in steals (26) and assists (44) in 15.0 mpg. He has a 1.83 assist-to-turnover ratio (44 assists, 24 turnovers).
- He tallied six points (3-3 FG), one rebound and one steal in 11 minutes against No. 3/4 Baylor (Feb. 28).

- Askew had five points (2-3 FG, 1-2 threes), tied a season high with three boards and two assists in 25 minutes at West Virginia (Feb. 26). He recorded a plus-minus total of plus-10 in his 25 minutes played.
- He posted six points (3-4 FG), one board, one assist and one steal in 12 minutes at TCU (Jan. 25).
- Askew set a season high in minutes (26) and registered three assists without a turnover against K-State (Jan. 18).
- He had five points (2-2 FG, 1-1 threes) and one block in 17 minutes at Oklahoma State (Jan. 8).
- Askew earned his first start at Texas against Arkansas-Pine Bluff (Dec. 14) and had a game-high three steals in 18 minutes.
- He posted a season-best nine points (4-6 FG), two rebounds and a steal in 15 minutes at No. 1/1 Gonzaga (Nov. 13).

BENSON FOLLOWS BEARD ... AGAIN

Senior G **Avery Benson** has played in 87 career games during his time at both Texas Tech and Texas. He has registered career totals of 92 points and 77 rebounds while converting 40.5-percent (15-37) from three-point range. Benson, who elected to redshirt the 2017-18 season, helped Texas Tech post a total of 94 wins during his four years in Lubbock.

- Benson graduated in August 2021 from Texas Tech with a degree in Management and is pursuing a graduate certificate in Strategic Communications.
- While at Southwest Christian Academy (Springdale, Ark.), he was offered a scholarship by Coach Beard while Beard was at Little Rock.
- When Beard left Little Rock to take the job at Texas Tech, Benson elected to join the Red Raider program as a walk-on and earn his way into receiving a scholarship.

LICON'S LEAP OF FAITH

Senior G **Tristen Licon** has played in 115 career games (65 starts) over the last five seasons at Sul Ross State (NCAA Division III school in Alpine, Texas) and Texas. Licon has career totals of 1,601 points, 555 rebounds and 256 assists.

- He and Cole Bott recently earned scholarships at The University of Texas (Feb. 10).
- Licon recorded season highs in minutes (11) and steals (two) at No. 15/16 Iowa State (Jan. 15).
- He posted six points (2-2 threes), two rebounds and one steal in six minutes against Houston Baptist (Nov. 9).
- Licon joined the Texas program in the summer for his super senior season. He originally enrolled at Texas with the intention of joining Coach Beard's coaching staff as a graduate assistant. Licon worked Coach Beard's camp at Texas Tech in the summer of 2019.
- He ranks second in Sul Ross State program history in career scoring (1,579 points) and career rebounds (548).
- Licon earned his bachelor's degree in May 2020 from Sul Ross State in Kinesiology and Human Performance.
- He earned his master's degree in August 2021 from Sul Ross State in Education and is currently pursuing a master's degree in Sport Management at Texas.
- During the 2020-21 season at Sul Ross State, Licon led the team in scoring (20.4 ppg), rebounding (8.3 rpg) and steals (45) while converting 39.5-percent from three-point range (34-86).

TRE MITCHELL STATUS UPDATE

Junior F **Tre Mitchell** did not travel with the team to Oklahoma (Feb. 15) due to personal reasons. He has missed UT's last seven contests. There is no timetable for his return.

MITCHELL BY THE NUMBERS

Tre Mitchell has played in 68 career games (60 starts) during his three seasons at UMass and Texas. He has registered career totals of 1,001 points, 410 rebounds and 68 blocks. Mitchell has reached double figures in scoring 50 times, topped the 20-point mark 16 times and recorded five 30-point efforts in his career. He has recorded nine career double-doubles.

- Through his first 24 games (17 starts), he ranks third on the team in blocks (16) and rebounding (4.0 rpg) and fifth in scoring (8.7 ppg) in 18.7 mpg.
- Mitchell has converted 47.8-percent (77-161) from the floor and 80-percent (40-50) from the free throw line.
- He recorded 17 points (8-8 FT) and four rebounds (three offensive) in 22 minutes against No. 8/8 Kansas (Feb. 7).
- Mitchell registered 12 points (2-4 threes), three rebounds, one steal and one block in 24 minutes against Oklahoma State (Jan. 22).
- He tallied 14 points (6-8 FG, 2-3 threes), six boards, three steals and two blocks in 20 minutes vs. Incarnate Word (Dec. 28).
- Mitchell posted a game-high 14 points (4-7 FG, 2-3 threes, 4-6 FT), five boards and one block in 22 minutes vs. Arkansas-Pine Bluff (Dec. 14).
- He recorded his first double-double as a Longhorn with 19 points (9-17 FG) and 11 rebounds to go along with two blocks and two steals in 35 minutes at No. 23/25 Seton Hall (Dec. 9).
- Mitchell tallied 13 points (6-10 FG, 1-2 threes), five rebounds and tied his collegiate high with five assists against no turnovers in 23 minutes against UTRGV (Dec. 3).
- He recorded 14 points (6-8 FG), eight boards and two steals in 22 minutes against San Jose State (Nov. 20).
- Mitchell posted a game-high 16 points (7-11 FG, 1-2 threes), seven rebounds (four offensive) and one block in 21 minutes versus Northern Colorado (Nov. 17).
- He tallied 10 points (3-6 FG, 4-4 FT), five boards, two blocks and two steals in 20 minutes against Houston Baptist (Nov. 9).

MITCHELL REACHES 1,000-POINT MILESTONE

- On his layup with 15 seconds remaining during the game at No. 10/10 Baylor (Feb. 12), **Tre Mitchell** topped the 1,000-point mark in his collegiate career.
- Mitchell has scored **1,001** points in 68 career collegiate contests (14.7 ppg).

IMPRESSIVE THREE-POINT STREAK

- The last time Texas did NOT convert a 3-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc that day.
- **The Longhorns enter Friday's contest having hit at least one 3-pointer in 1,052 consecutive games.**
- UT has converted at least one 3-pointer in 1,180 of 1,188 games since the 3-pointer was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season.
- The Horns have failed to ATTEMPT at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988 in a 69-55 win at TCU).

EXPERIENCED COACHING STAFF

UT's three assistant coaches, Managing Director and Special Assistant to the Head Coach have a combined **97** years of coaching experience and have coached in **37** NCAA Tournaments and developed **42** NBA Draft picks. **This five-man group has made a total of 13 NCAA Sweet 16, nine Elite Eight and two Final Four appearances.** The group also has extensive experience in the state of Texas as well as the Big 12 Conference, including two staffers who have a combined 21 years of service working for Texas Basketball.

- Associate Head Coach **Rodney Terry** was a former head coach at UTEP and Fresno State for the previous 10 seasons. He brings 26 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Texas staff, including nine as an assistant previously with the Longhorns from 2002-11. He has made 12 appearances in the NCAA Tournament and produced 14 NBA Draft selections. The Longhorns had 13 players chosen in the NBA Draft in the nine seasons with Terry, including nine first-round selections and five lottery picks.
- Assistant Coach **Jerrance Howard** was an assistant coach at Kansas for the last eight years. He brings 17 years of collegiate coaching experience to the UT staff and has made nine NCAA Tournament appearances and developed 12 NBA Draft picks.
- Assistant Coach **Ulric Maligi** (YUR-ick MAL-uh-ghee) was an assistant coach under Chris Beard at Texas Tech for the previous two seasons. He brings 14 years of collegiate coaching experience to the UT staff and has made four NCAA Tournament appearances and developed five NBA Draft picks.
- Managing Director **Chris Ogden** is a former UT player and assistant coach who spent the last three years as head coach at UTA. He brings 18 years of collegiate coaching experience to the UT staff and has made 11 NCAA Tournament appearances and developed eight NBA Draft picks.
- Special Assistant to the Head Coach **Bob Donewald Jr.** is an experienced coach at the professional, international and collegiate levels who worked under Chris Beard at Texas Tech the past two seasons. He brings 22 years of coaching experience to the UT staff and has made one NCAA Tournament appearance and developed three NBA Draft picks.

HORNS INK DUO IN FALL SIGNING PERIOD

A pair of high school standouts signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. **Dillon Mitchell** (Tampa, Fla.) and **Arterio Morris** (Dallas, Texas) will join the Longhorns for the 2022-23 season.

- **Dillon Mitchell** (6-7, 195), a forward from Tampa, Fla., who is playing his senior year at Montverde Academy (Montverde, Fla.) under coach Kevin Boyle, is ranked as the No. 7 prospect in the nation by ESPN and No. 16 by 247 Sports. Mitchell was one of 10 semifinalists for the Jersey Mike's Naismith National High School Boys Player of the Year honor.
- **Arterio Morris** (6-3, 175), a guard from Kimball HS (Dallas, Texas) who plays under coach Nicke Smith, is ranked as the No. 6 prospect in the nation by Rivals and No. 17 by 247 Sports.

PAIR OF MCDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

UT signees **Dillon Mitchell** and **Arterio Morris** are two of the 24 players selected to compete in the 45th annual McDonald's All-American Game this March in Chicago. The McDonald's All-American Boys Game will be played at Wintrust Arena on Tuesday, March 29 at 8 p.m. Central and televised by ESPN.

- Mitchell and Morris will become the 21st and 22nd players in UT history to play in the McDonald's All-American Game.
- This marks just the fifth time in program history that the Longhorns have had at least two signees named to the prestigious roster in the same year (2004, 2006, 2010, 2016 and 2022).

HORNS IN THE NBA

A total of 14 former University of Texas players appeared on NBA rosters when the league opened the 2021-22 regular season on Oct. 19.

- Texas ranked **THIRD** nationally in most players on 2021-22 NBA opening-night rosters, trailing only Kentucky (27) and Duke (22).
- In addition to the 14 former Longhorns on NBA rosters, Matt Hill is an assistant coach with the Atlanta Hawks and Royal Ivey is an assistant coach for the Brooklyn Nets.

FOUR NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-BIG 12 TEAM

- A quartet of Texas players earned spots on the 2022 Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team, the league office announced Feb. 22.
- Seniors Andrew Jones and Courtney Ramey along with junior Brock Cunningham were named to the First Team, while senior Jase Febres was selected to the Second Team.
- Cunningham earned his third career selection to the academic all-league team, as he also received second-team mention in 2020 and 2021. Febres, Jones and Ramey each garnered their second career selections to the squad, as all three were first-team honorees last season.

NEW ARENA NEARING COMPLETION

The University of Texas and a group led by the Oak View Group (OVG) is completing a world-class arena on campus that will be the home to Texas Men's and Women's Basketball games, graduations, concerts and other events.

- **The arena will open in April 2022.**
- The innovative 35-year agreement between UT and ArenaCo - which includes OVG, Live Nation, C3 Presents and Matthew McConaughey - will provide a public benefit for UT and the City of Austin. The \$338 million venue will be constructed on land fully owned by UT without using any university or public money.
- The 10,000-seat arena will provide an intimate, state-of-the-art men's and women's basketball fan experience and feature student seating surrounding the court. The new arena is designed to expand to 15,000 seats to provide a world-class venue for touring concerts and shows.
- UT's new basketball arena and events center will be named **Moody Center** in honor of a \$130 million grant to The University of Texas at Austin from the Moody Foundation.
- The grant to support Texas Athletics is the single-largest gift from a foundation in the university's history and brings to more than \$200 million the donations to UT Austin from the Galveston-based foundation. Previously, the foundation contributed \$50 million to support the Moody College of Communication and \$20 million to reimagine and transform the exterior spaces at the Blanton Museum of Art. Overall, the foundation has contributed more than \$260 million to institutions in the University of Texas System.

His mom, Elise Allen, passed away after a seven-year battle with breast cancer on Dec. 3, 2016 at the age of 49 (during Timmy's junior year of high school). His godfather, Ray Arvizu, has served as a father figure to Timmy for the last decade.
- **Devin Askew's** dad, Brian Askew, played soccer at Fresno State and went on to play professionally for the San Francisco Seals (USISL).
- **Avery Benson's** dad, Andy Benson, played basketball at John Brown University (Siloam Springs, Ark.). His grandfather, Randy Benson, was a high school basketball coach.
- **Christian Bishop** was born in Sacile, Italy. His father, Jerry Bishop, played basketball at Abilene Christian. His older brother, Grant, played basketball at Missouri Baptist. He wears jersey No. 32 to honor Jerry and Grant, who both wore the number.
- **Cole Bott** chose to come to Texas because of the opportunity to play for a great basketball coach while pursuing his MBA with an interest in the stock market.
- **Marcus Carr's** brother, Duane Notice, played on South Carolina's 2017 NCAA Final Four team and has gone on to play professionally internationally and with Raptors 905 (Toronto affiliate in the NBA G-League).
- **Brock Cunningham's** dad, Ed Cunningham, was a football offensive lineman at The University of Texas (1985-89) who earned All-America honors in 1989.
- **Dylan Disu's** mother, Michelle Anderson, played basketball and volleyball at William Penn University (Oskaloosa, Iowa). His father, Rodney Anderson, football at Texas A&I University (now Texas A&M-Kingsville).
- **Jase Febres' father**, Orlando Febres, passed away in September 2015 at the age of 51 after a bout with cancer. Orlando played college basketball at New Mexico State (1982-86) and went on to play professionally in Puerto Rico and for the Puerto Rican national team.
- **Andrew Jones' sister**, Alexis Jones, played basketball at Baylor (2014-17) and was selected as the No. 12 overall pick of the 2017 WNBA Draft by the Minnesota Lynx. Andrew is in the process of launching the "AJ1 Foundation" which aims to inspire and mentor the future generation who do not have access to benefits or resources.
- **Tristen Licon** grew up as a Longhorn fan, as his uncle attended UT as a student. His father, Al Licon, is the head boys track coach and assistant football coach at Parkland HS in El Paso. Al was a long jumper at New Mexico State. Tristen worked Coach Beard's camp at Texas Tech in the summer of 2019.
- **Tre Mitchell** was born in Bamberg, Germany. His family moved from Germany to Pittsburgh when Tre was one year old.
- **Courtney Ramey** wears jersey No. 3 in honor of three people who were close to him that passed away (his mother, his grandmother, and his close friend while in high school).
- **Gavin Perryman's father**, Brandy Perryman, was a four-year letterwinner in basketball at Texas (1995-98) and finished his career as UT's all-time most accurate free throw shooter (89.7-percent, 183-204). His mother, Mandie Perryman, worked in the Texas Basketball office as a student assistant. His late grandfather, Dennis Perryman, was a longtime AD at Garden City Community College (Garden City, Kan.).
