MIKE YOUNG NAMED HEAD COACH

Mike Young has been named to the men's basketball head coaching position at Virginia Tech ... The Radford, Virginia native returns to the New River Valley following 17 highly-successful seasons as the head coach at Wofford ... Young compiled a 299-244 (.551) overall record at Wofford and earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors four times (2010, 2014, 2015 and 2019) ... Under his guidance, the Terriers registered an impressive list of non-conference wins over the likes of Auburn, Cincinnati, Clemson, Georgia, Georgia Tech, North Carolina State, Purdue, Seton Hall, South Carolina, Virginia Tech, Xavier and Wake Forest ... Arguably the most compelling non-conference victory of his tenure at Wofford came on Dec. 20, 2017 when the Terriers faced No. 5 North Carolina at the Dean Smith Center in Chapel Hill, N.C. and registered a 79-75 victory over head coach Roy Williams and the Tar Heels ... Prior to assuming the head coaching reins for the Terriers in 2002-03, Young was an assistant coach to current Wofford athletics director Richard Johnson ... Young came to Wofford after serving as a graduate assistant for one year under Oliver Purnell at Radford University ... A 1986 graduate of Emory & Henry College, he was a four-year letterman in basketball for coach Bob Johnson and the team captain his junior and senior seasons. He credits Johnson for having a major influence on his playing and coaching careers ... Upon his graduation, Young became a full-time assistant coach for two years at Emory & Henry before moving on to Radford ... Another mentor in his coaching philosophies is Fletcher Arritt, longtime coach of Fork Union (Va.) Military Academy ... Young played one season for him before attending Emory and Henry ... In the summer of 2015, Young was inducted into the Emory & Henry College Sports Hall of Fame, as well as the Radford High School Hall of Fame.

Being Ranked

The Hokies ended the season ranked 16th in the AP poll, the 20th consecutive week (including the preseason poll), the longest streak in preseason and the regular season in school history ... Tech was ranked for 17 consecutive weeks in the 1995-96 season, plus the Final AP Poll of that season.

The Hokies This Year

- ✓ The Hokies earned an NCAA bid in three consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.
- ✓ The Hokies set a new school record for wins in a season, with 26.
- ✓ The Hokies reach the Sweet 16 for the first time since the tournament format expanded.
- ✓ The Hokies won two games in an NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1967.

Tech's seven home ACC wins are tied for the most home ACC wins along with the 2016-17, 2015-16 and 2009-10 seasons.
- ✓ The Hokies defeated a Top 5 team in each of the last four seasons for the first time in school history.
- ✓ The Hokies defeated a Top 5 Duke team at home in each of the last three seasons for the first time.
- ✓ The Hokies earned a first round bye in the ACC Tournament for the fourth consecutive season, the first time the Hokies have achieved that mark.
- ✓ The Hokies played in three "Big Monday" games for the first time in school history.
- ✓ The Hokies had players win the ACC Player of the Week (Justin Robinson and Nickeil Alexander-Walker) for the first time since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season.
- ✓ The Hokies placed two players on one of the three All-ACC teams (**Kerry Blackshear Jr.**, 2nd team; **Nickeil Alexander-Walker**, 3rd team) for the first time since 2011.
- ✓ The Hokies placed four players on the All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball team, second-highest number in the league.

- ✓ The Hokies earned a 3.22 cumulative grade point average in the first semester, highest in program history.
- ✓ **Ty Outlaw** received the Bob Bradley Award from the ACC and ACSMA.

The win over Florida State in 2011 was the 500th victory in Cassell and the win over Georgia Tech this season was the 600th victory in the building ... Tech was 14-2 this season on its home court.

Selling Out the Cassell

Virginia Tech ACC home games against UVa, Wake Forest, Syracuse, Duke, Louisville, Georgia Tech and Miami sold out this season ... Earlier this season, the CCSU game was a sell out ... The Hokies sold out nine games in the 2017-18 season, including seven of the nine home ACC games, a mark equaled this season.

About Attendance

Virginia Tech has increased percentage of capacity in each of the last four seasons ... Tech ranked seventh in percent of capacity in the ACC last season at 83 percent ... The year before, the Hokies were eighth at 76 percent ... This past season, the Hokies had an average attendance of 7,678, up from 7,476 the year before and 5,744 in the 2014-15 season ... Tech is second in average attendance growth in the ACC over the past four seasons, with a 34 percent increase in attendance, trailing only Miami ... Season ticket sales increased by more than 1,000 last season and has a 62 percent increase in sales in the past four seasons ... Tech had an all-time high of 6,107 season tickets sold last season ... Tech is averaging 8,237 in Cassell Coliseum this season and 8,882 for the nine home ACC games.

It's Been a Long Time

The Hokies defeated Saint Louis, 66-52, in the first round of the NCAA East Regional in San Jose, California on March 22 ... The win marked the Hokies' first NCAA Tournament victory since defeating Illinois, 54-52, on March 16, 2007.

It's Been an Even Longer Time

The Hokies defeated Liberty, 67-58, in the second round of the NCAA East Regional in San Jose, California on March 24 ... The win earned the Hokies' first trip to the Sweet 16 since the tournament format expanded.

5's Return

Sunday, March 17 was a day of big news for the Hokies ... Not only did Tech receive its third consecutive NCAA Tournament bid, the Hokies also received word that senior point guard, **Justin Robinson**, had been cleared by the medical staff to return to action ... Robinson had missed the last 12 games with a left foot injury ... The school's all-time leader in assists, Robinson played more than 27 minutes in the win over Saint Louis and scored 13 points in the win over Liberty in 29 minutes of play ... Robinson concluded his Virginia Tech career with 14 points and five assists in the Sweet 16 loss to Duke.

Thank You Seniors

In the Hokies' 84-70 win on March 8 in the team's Senior Night game, two seniors came up BIG for Tech ... Making their final appearance on Carillon Clinic Court at Cassell Coliseum, both **Ahmed Hill** and **Ty Outlaw** lit up the arena ... Outlaw was 5-of-9 from three-point range, scoring 19 points and Hill was 5-for-5 from three, scoring 17 points ... The duo shot a combined 61.1 percent from the field, including 71.4 percent from beyond the arc ... **Justin Robinson** got the ceremonial start after missing the last nine games with a foot injury.

Ty's Double-Double

Ty Outlaw had 10 points and tied a career-high with 11 rebounds in the Hokies' NCAA Tournament win over Liberty on March 24 ... This marks his first career double-double ... It is the Hokies eighth double-double in NCAA Tournament play and its first since Bobby Beecher had 15 points and 12 rebounds against Villanova in the 1986 NCAA Tournament.

Big Wins

The Hokies defeated Miami, 84-70, on Friday night, March 8, 2019 ... In doing so, **Buzz Williams** earned his 250th career victory ... Williams earned his 200th career win in 2017, in a home win over Boston College ... Williams earned his 100th victory at Virginia Tech in the NCAA Tournament win over Liberty.

They Are the Champions

The Hokies had great success against conference champions this season ... Tech was a combined 8-4 against both tournament and regular season champions from Division I conferences, including 5-1 against tournament champions ... Although it doesn't count, Tech defeated the ASUN champion, Liberty, in an exhibition game on the Flames' home court.

A New High

The Hokies were the fourth seed in the East Region ... That marks the highest the Hokies have ever been seeded in an NCAA Tournament ... The previous high was a fifth seed in the 2007 tournament.

Tech on a Neutral Court

Following the loss to Duke in the Sweet 16, Tech was 7-2 in neutral court games this season, with all but two games coming against NCAA Tournament teams ... The Hokies are 31-23 in neutral site games since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season and 34-27 since 2000-01, the season Tech joined the Big East Conference.

This is New

Two years ago, the Hokies made the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 10 years ... Last year made it two in a row ... With this season's bid, Tech makes an NCAA appearance in three consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.

Last Time We Won Two In the NCAAs

The last time the Hokies won two games in the NCAA Tournament was 1967 and things were a little different then ... Tech was one of 23 teams spread over the four regions ... By winning two games, Tech played Dayton in the Round of Eight ... Tech was one of six teams in the Mid East Region and defeated Toledo and Indiana to advance.

Big Classroom Honor

Four Hokies are on the 25-man All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball team ... Graduate students **Ahmed Hill** and **Justin Robinson**, along with sophomores **Nickeil Alexander-Walker** and **Wabissa Bede** were honored for their work in the classroom ... Tech's four players on the team is the second-most of any ACC team, trailing only Louisville's six honorees ... This is the second time that Robinson has been named to the team.

Climbing the Lists

Ahmed Hill finished his Virginia Tech career in 17th place in career scoring at Virginia Tech with 1,473 career points ... **Justin Robinson** wound up 22nd in career scoring at Virginia Tech with 1,383 points ... **Kerry Blackshear Jr.** is in 40th place with 1,152 points.

That Makes 3

The Hokies defeated Miami, 71-56, in the ACC Tournament ... This marked the Hokies' third win over the Hurricanes in as many tries this season ... It is the first time Tech has a 3-game season sweep on an opponent since Tech joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season and the first time since Tech beat Southern Miss three times in the 1982-83 season while a member of the Metro Conference.

A New Mark

Ty Outlaw finished his Virginia Tech career 136-of-291 from three-point range, for 46.7 percent ... He became the Virginia Tech career leader in three-point percentage, surpassing former teammate Justin Bibbs' record of 42.4 percent.

ACC Honors KJ & NAW

Kerry Blackshear Jr. and Nickeil Alexander-Walker were named to All-ACC teams, in voting by a panel of coaches, media and broadcasters ... Blackshear was named to the second team All-ACC, while Alexander-Walker was named to the third team ... This is the first time either player has been named to an All-ACC team.

KJ in February

Kerry Blackshear Jr. averaged 20.5 points and 9.4 rebounds per game in the month of February ... He scored in double figures in all eight games in February and scored at least 20 points in four straight of the eight games ... Blackshear played all 40 minutes against Duke for just the second time this season and the second time in the past three games.

Uncharted Territory

The Hokies finished the regular season 12-6 in ACC action ... That marks the most ACC wins in a season for the Hokies since joining the league in the 2004-05 season ... Tech had won 10 games in an ACC season five times previously, including each of the last three years.

Regular Season Wins

The Hokies finished the 2018-19 regular season 23-7 overall ... The 23 victories are tied for the most victories in a regular season, tying the 23 regular season wins in the 2009-10 season.

More About the Numbers

With the 26 wins this season, Tech has recorded four consecutive 20-win seasons, second-best in school history ... Tech recorded five consecutive 20-win seasons from the 1981-82 season through the 1985-86 season ... With the 12 conference wins, Tech has a winning conference record for the fourth consecutive season ... That is the longest such streak since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season.

Big Honor on a Big Day

Ty Outlaw was named the recipient of the 13th annual Bob Bradley Spirit and Courage Award from the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSMA) and the Atlantic Coast Conference ... A joint venture of the ACC and ACSMA, the Bradley Award is given annually in memory of Bob Bradley, the Hall of Fame sports information director at Clemson University whose positive attitude inspired all who knew him as he battled cancer ... The award goes to an ACC student-athlete, coach, administrator, or other personnel in men's or women's basketball who has overcome significant hardship to contribute to his or her team, or to society as a whole ... The award was presented before the Hokies' game against Miami in the second round of the ACC Tournament.

From The Line

The Hokies have made 461 of 606 free throw attempts, for 76.1 percent ... This sets a new school record for highest free throw percentage in a season ... The old school record for overall field goal percentage in a season was 75.0 percent, set in the 1980-81 season ... Tech shot 78.2 percent from the line in ACC regular season competition, setting a new school record ... This broke the old mark of 75.5 percent set in the 2010-11 season.

About 5

In the record-breaking night against Syracuse, **Justin Robinson** also set a new Tech record for three-point field goals in a game, with nine ... The nine 3s is tied for fourth-best in ACC history ... That breaks the old mark of eight, set two seasons ago against Miami by teammate **Ty Outlaw** ... Robinson's 35 points is also a career-high and is tied for second in Virginia Tech school history for points in an ACC game, trailing on Malcolm Delaney's 37 points against Clemson in 2009 ... The 35 points is tied for the fourth-highest total by an ACC player this season and the nine three-pointers are the most by an ACC player this season.

Take a 3, Make a 3

Virginia Tech finished eighth nationally and second in the ACC in three-point field goal percentage, at 39.4 percent ... Tech made at least 10 three-pointers in 17 of the 35 games this past season, including a school-record 18 made three-pointers in the win over Central Connecticut State.

Looking in the Mirror

This past season, the Hokies had Georgia Tech and Notre Dame as its mirror opponents, along with permanent rivals Virginia and Miami ... Tech finished the regular season 6-2 in those eight games and swept the Yellow Jackets, Fighting Irish and Hurricanes in the process ... Tech added to that with a win over Miami in the second round of the 2019 ACC Tournament.

Board Talk

Virginia Tech grabbed an ACC game season-high of 18 offensive rebounds at Notre Dame ... The last time Tech had more than 18 offensive rebounds in an ACC game was Feb. 27, 2010, when it grabbed 20 offensive rebounds at home against Maryland, in double overtime ... The school record for offensive rebounds in a regulation ACC game is 20, set on Jan. 26, 2008 at Boston College ... Tech grabbed a season-high 49 rebounds at Notre Dame ... The last time Tech grabbed at least 49 rebounds in a non-overtime ACC game was on Feb. 17, 2005, 49 rebounds in a home win over Duke ... The last time the Hokies had more than 49 rebounds in a non-overtime ACC game was on Feb. 26, 2008, 50 rebounds in a road win at Boston College.

KJ Doubles

In the win over Central Connecticut State, **Kerry Blackshear Jr.** recorded his first double-double of the season, with 12 points and 13 rebounds ... It was the first for the Hokies this season and the first by any Hokie since **Justin Robinson** had 10 points and 12 assists at Boston College on Jan. 31, 2018 ... With his 18 points and 16 rebounds in the Sweet 16 loss to #1/1 Duke, Blackshear finished with nine double-doubles this season ... He had seven of his double-doubles this season against ACC competition and has 12 double-doubles for his career ... This year was the first time a Hokie has had double-doubles in three consecutive games since Jeff Allen in the 2010-11 season.

Sharing is Good

Virginia Tech recorded a season-high 28 assists on 36 made baskets in the win over Central Connecticut State ... Tech has had 20-or-more assists seven times this season, plus four more games of 19 assists.

Dishing It Out

In the home win over Georgia Tech, **Kerry Blackshear Jr.**, led the Hokies with a career-high-tying eight assists (also his high in an ACC game) ... **Nickeil Alexander-Walker** dished out seven assists that game ... It was the second time this season that Tech has had two players with at least seven assists in the same game ... Tech made its three times this season when NAW had eight assists and Blackshear added seven assists in the home win over Miami.

Now Boarding

Ty Outlaw, who missed last season with a knee injury, averaged 2.8 rebounds per game in the 2016-17 season, but has increased that to 5.2 boards per game this year ... He grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds against VMI and an ACC-game high nine rebounds at Pitt ... Outlaw had 93 rebounds in all of the 2016-17 season; he had 183 this past season, second-most on the team.

More from the Line

Virginia Tech set a season high at Clemson, making 16 of 17 from the line for 94.1, bettering the game at North Carolina, when Tech was 15 of 16 from the line, for 93.8 percent ... The 94.1 percent is the second-highest free throw percentage for the Hokies in an ACC game and the best percentage when attempting at least 15 free throws ... Tech shot 92.3 percent from the line in the regular season finale win over Miami, seventh-best in school history in ACC games ... The free throw percentages of the Clemson, North Carolina and Miami games are in the Hokies' top ten in ACC games ... Tech made better than 80 percent from the line in 13 games this season and seven of its ACC games.

More on KJ's Rebounds

Kerry Blackshear Jr., had 17 rebounds at North Carolina on Jan. 21 ... That is the third-highest rebounds in an ACC regular season game in school history ... Jeff Allen had 19 rebounds at Boston College on Feb. 5, 2011 and Coleman Collins had 18 rebounds in a win over Duke on Feb. 17, 2005 in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 rebounds marks the first time a Hokie has had more than 15 rebounds in an ACC game in more than five years ... He grabbed his 500th career rebounds in the win over Liberty in San Jose.

The meeting before that on Feb. 26 was a 64-60 Virginia Tech win over top-ranked Duke in Cassell Coliseum in 2011 ... Duke defeated Virginia Tech, 23-16, on Feb. 26, 1913.
