• Keve Aluma posted a career-high 30 points on Wednesday at Pitt, marking the first time a Hokie has done so since Nov. 5, 2019 when Landers Nolley II had 30 at Clemson.

• Tech let up a season-high 83 points to Pitt, which was the fifth-most allowed in the Mike Young Era. Since his arrival, the Hokies are 0-5 when allowing 80 or more points.

AT THE RIM

- Continuing its two-game road swing, the No. 16/16 Virginia Tech men's basketball team will travel to Miami (Fla.) and play on Saturday at noon ET on RSN inside the Watsco Center.
- Tech, which is 18-24 in the all-time series with Miami, is a perfect 5-0 when ranked versus the Hurricanes and is 5-12 on the road.
- The last time these two teams faced off, the Hokies almost let a 17-point lead slip away, but ended up winning by two at home this past December, 80-78. (More on page 5)
- Tech coach Mike Young is 2-3 all-time versus Miami's Jim Larrañaga. When Young was at Wofford and Larrañaga at George Mason, Young's Terriers defeated the Patriots 82-79 in overtime in 2010 in Charleston.

WHO TO WATCH



- Continuing his hot streak, reigning ACC Player of the Week Keve Aluma dropped a career-high 30 points at Pitt.
- He did so thanks to a perfect 6-for-6 mark from the free-throw line and was 10 of 16 from the floor. He had 10 rebounds, too.

- Turning in his most points as a Hokie, forward Justyn Mutts poured in a season-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting at Pitt.
- The redshirt junior also pulled down six boards and had a block and a steal in 37 minutes (second-most played this season).



LAST TIME OUT

- Despite getting 47 points from its starting bigs and it being a two-point game with seven minutes left, the Hokies fell short after a large Pitt run to lose 83-72 on Wednesday.
- Tech shared the rock well, dishing out 19 assists for its most since Dec. 21 (Longwood).

A WIN WOULD

- Snap Tech's one-game losing streak and its one-game losing streak in Coral Gables (L, 71-61 on Jan. 28, 2020).
- Keep the Hokies' perfect record in tact of being undefeated when taking on Miami when ranked.
- Make coach Mike Young an even 2-2 against the Hurricanes and 3-3 versus Miami's Jim Larrañaga.

AN ELITE TRIO

- Over the last three seasons in college basketball, only three high-major players had two or more games of owning at least 29 points, 10 rebounds and four assists.
- Wisconsin's Ethan Happ (3 times), Duke's Zion Williamson (2 times) and the Hokies' Keve Aluma (2 times) are the lone ones to accomplish the feat.
- Both Williamson and Happ, who would go on to be first- and second-team All-Americans, did it in the 2019-20 season.
- However, to put Aluma's in perspective, unlike the other two, he did it in back-to-back games and also did so against a ranked opponent – something the other two players did not.
- Williamson did his against Wake Forest (Jan. 8, 2019) and UCF (March 24, 2019), while Happ put it together against Xavier (Nov. 13, 2018), Marquette (Dec. 8, 2018) and Purdue (Jan. 11, 2019).

JUST ME & YOU

- When Keve Aluma had a 30-point, 10-rebound, 5-assist outing at Pitt this past Wednesday, he became just the second-ever Hokie in the ACC era (2004-present) to accomplish the feat.
- The other Hokie was A.D. Vassallo back in 2009 when he did so against Duquesne in the first round of the NIT and had 33 points, 12 rebounds and five assist on March 18.
- However, that game went into double-overtime, meaning that Aluma is the first-ever to do so in a regulation game.

BACK TO BACK

- Keve Aluma has now scored 28 or more points in two straight games, marking the first time a Hokie has done so since Erick Green in 2013.
- Green, who would go on to win ACC Player of the Year that season, had 29 points versus Maryland on Feb. 7 and followed it up with 28 against Georgia Tech on Feb. 9.

YOU SEE A TREND?

- The Hokies have four losses on the season, with three of those being blowouts (double-digit losses).
- Ironically in three of those setbacks that got out of hand, Tech allowed its opponent to shoot better than 50 percent, with Penn State (50.0%), Syracuse (50.9%) and Pitt (50.0%) doing so, as well at Tech shot under 41 percent in each game.
- In its other loss, a two-point game, 73-71, at then RV/No. 25 Louisville, Tech let the Cardinals shoot 47.3 percent. But, Tech was able to counter with being over the 40-percent mark (42.6%).
- Since coach Mike Young has gotten to Blacksburg, his teams have allowed seven opponents to shoot greater than 50 percent and he's 1-6 in those games. The lone win was against Miami (Fla.) this past December when it shot 53.6 percent.

HE DON'T MISS AFTER AN L

- Young is 3-0 this season after a loss, bouncing back in a big way with beating then-No. 24/RV Clemson and, ironically, Notre Dame twice.
- Last season, Young had five wins following a loss.

50 SPOT

- Tech shot over 50 percent in a game for the fourth time this season when it did so against No. 14/15 Virginia and is a perfect 4-0 this season when doing so.
- Since Young got to Blacksburg, the Hokies are 7-1 in contests shooting 50 percent or greater, with the lone loss coming to BYU on Nov. 27, 2019 in the fifth-place game of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.
- Over the last decade (2010-11 season to present), Tech is 78-12 when shooting 50 percent or better.

MR. ADJUSTMENTS

- After trailing at halftime this past Saturday versus the ACC's top team in the standings, coach Mike Young went to work on adjustments and tightened the belt defensively, holding the Cavaliers to just 22 points in the second half.
- With the deficit at halftime, it marked the fifth time that Young and his Hokies would come back to win since his arrival to Blacksburg and marked the second time this season (Notre Dame, Jan. 10).
- The other three instances last season took place against North Carolina (Jan. 22), at Syracuse (Jan. 7) and at Clemson (Nov. 5).
- However, of all of the halftime deficits in those five contests, the eight-point deficit to UVA Saturday was the biggest.

HITTING HIS STRIDE

- Hunter Cattoor has been feeling it as of late, hitting 13 3-pointers his last five games.
- The 6-foot-3 sharpshooter has hit his stride during his sophomore year, improving his points a contest by four and his percentage from beyond the arc to roughly three percent, while getting more time off the bench by nine minutes his last four outings.
- He also is one of only five high-major players nationally to shoot greater than 46 percent from downtown (minimum 30 3s). He's hit 30 triples and is shooting 46.2 percent from 3 on the year.

TWICE IS NICE

- Picking up his second weekly honor from the conference office this past Monday, Keve Aluma became just the fourth player in school history to win two ACC weekly honors in a single season.
- Aluma joins Zabian Dowdell (2007-07), Jeff Allen (2010-11) and Nickeil Alexander-Walker (2018-19).
- The Wofford transfer also earned the Naismith Trophy Player of the Week, becoming just the second Hokie to do so (Justin Robinson, Feb. 12, 2018). The award is in its fourth season.

What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

WHERE THEY AT

- Tech has 15 players on the squad who represent 10 states and two international countries (Netherlands, Nigeria), making it tied for eighth in the country for most states and countries represented on a roster this season.
- Virginia leads the way with three players – Joseph "Joe" Bamisile, Gill Williamson, Grant Yates – while Maryland has two players – Keve Aluma and Darius Maddox.
- New Mexico, Penn and UT Martin are No. 1 nationally with 15 players from different states and countries, while in the ACC, Boston College (13) is first and Florida State is tied with the Hokies for the second most in the league with 12.
- Of the 23 schools that have 12 or more players from different spots, nine are from high-major conferences, including BC, Kentucky, Butler, FSU, Iowa State, Nebraska, Tennessee, Tulane and the Hokies.

'19 CLASS OF HIGH-MAJOR COACHES

- Out of the seven high-major conferences (ACC, American, BIG EAST, B1G, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC), there were 14 head coaches hired for the 2019-20 season.
- Virginia Tech coach Mike Young was just one of six coaches that were a mid-major coach to jump up to the big leagues, joining Alabama's Nate Oats (Buffalo), Arkansas' Eric Musselman (Nevada), Tulane's Ron Hunter (Georgia State) and Washington State's Kyle Smith (San Francisco).
- Of the 14 new coaches, Young was the longest-tenured coach to leave, following his 17-year stint as the head guy at Wofford.
- The NBA saw three of its coaches jump into the college ranks, with Michigan's Juwon Howard (Miami Heat), Nebraska's Fred Hoiberg (Chicago Bulls) and Vanderbilt's Jerry Stackhouse (Memphis Grizzlies).
- In this cycle, only one assistant coach was promoted from within and that was Temple's Aaron McKie, who served as an assistant under Fran Dunphy for five seasons in Philadelphia.
- Former Hokie coach Buzz Williams, who is at Texas A&M, was one of just two coaches to jump ship and go high-major for high-major, with UCLA's Mick Cronin (Cincinnati) being the other.
- A full breakdown of the 14 coaches in the cycle is below, with the SEC welcoming the most among the seven leagues with four. The Big 12 was the lone conference not make coaching change heading into the 2019-20 season.

LAST TIME vs. MIAMI (FLA.) RECAP

- Leading by as many as 17 points in the second half, the Hokies squandered their lead to just one point with 28 seconds left and were fortunate in the final seconds as Miami's Isaiah Wong's 3-point attempt rimmed out, thus the Hokies escaping with a close, two-point win at home.
- A big reason why they got up so big was behind the stellar play of redshirt junior Keve Aluma and his game-high 26 points. The forward shot 9 of 16 from the floor and made seven free throws and had seven board, three blocks and a steal on the night.
- Justyn Mutts also played well, posting a season-high 15 points and owned nine rebounds in the near double-double performance.

SCOUTING MIAMI (FLA.)

- Miami is coming off close, two-point win at home over Duke (7-6, 5-4) this past Monday, winning 77-75 despite only making four of its final eight free-throw attempts down the stretch. The win, which was done with only six scholarship players available, snapped a four-game losing streak.
- Jim Larrañaga enters his 10th season as the head coach in Coral Gables, following a 14-year stint at George Mason where he took the Patriots to the Final Four in 2006. With the 'Canes, he has led them to four NCAA Tournament appearances and an ACC title in 2013.
- The Hurricanes are paced by guard Isaiah Wong, who is averaging the fifth-most points in the ACC (17.3) and 5.4 rebounds per game, and guard Harlond Beverly, who is averaging a steady 7.2 point and team-high 3.4 assists per game.
- Blocking shots and playing fundamental defense by not committing fouls are two key strengths for Miami. It is 55th nationally and sixth in the ACC in blocked shots per game (4.2) and is fourth overall and third in the league in fouls committed per game (13.5).



RANKED WINS BECOMIN' COMMON

- Tech now has four ranked wins this season, tying the most-ever in school history (set 2017-18).
- It's upcoming matchup with a ranked foe has been postponed (Feb. 9, No. 20/19 Florida State). So, it will have to wait a little longer to see if it can top the record and get to five.
- How many teams nationally have four or more ranked wins? Eight, which includes the Hokies. But Tech is the lone ACC team to have four or more.
- The other seven teams are No. 1/1 Gonzaga, No. 8/8 Iowa, No. 23/22 Kansas, [RV/RV] Minnesota, No. 7/9 Ohio State, No. 9/14 Oklahoma and No. 24/RV Purdue.

GETTIN' TO THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Coach Young was not happy with how little the Hokies got to the free-throw line last year, with an average of 13.4 per game, which ranked second-to-last in the ACC and was in the bottom 25 nationally.
- So, now, with not being as dependent on the 3-ball and having more players that can get to the rim, Tech has increased that average to 19.8 this season. That 19.8 average is tied for third in the ACC with No. 20/19 Florida State, trailing North Carolina (22.1) and Pitt (22.0).
- Last year, the Hokies only had eight games (out of 32) of having 20 or more free throw attempts. When doing so, they were 7-1, with the lone loss being against Miami (Fla.) in triple overtime.

NOTRE DAME TIDBITS

- Tech held the Fighting Irish to zero 3-pointers in the second half and also held them to shooting 35.7 percent for the game, which is a season low for Tech's opponent this season.
- The Hokies owned the boards, getting 46 rebounds, including 38 of those being defensive, which is a season high.

ON HIS BACK

- If Keve Aluma ends up being ACC Player of the Year, that train started its engine last Saturday when No. 14/15 Virginia put four bigs on him and none could slow the guy down, getting to the rim at will (8 FTs) and finishing with a career-high 29 points on 10-of-15 shooting.
- Aluma did about anything he wanted, hitting two 3s, a couple mid-range jumpers, hook shots, and-1s and some emphatic dunks.
- After not scoring in double figures the previous week (Wake Forest, Syracuse), he started to get back to his ways at Notre Dame (14 points, 12 rebounds), last Wednesday which led to the confidence to let it rip against the Cavaliers three days later.
- The redshirt junior averaged 21.5 points, 11.0 rebounds, 2.0 blocks and 2.0 assists, while shooting 60 percent and 91.7 percent from the free-throw line for the week against the Fighting Irish and Cavaliers.

THE BOARDS

- Last season, Tech was the second-shortest high-major team in the land (Utah) and consistently got outrebounded night in and night out.
- It was such a norm, that in of Tech's 21 games against ACC opponents last year, it only outrebounded them three times.
- Now, with an added presence down low in 6-foot-9 Keve Aluma and 6-foot-7 Justyn Mutts, Tech has been able to win the glass a whole lot more.
- The Hokies outrebounded Notre Dame by 10 (46-36) last Tuesday and did so again versus then-No. 8/8 Virginia, giving them already more than last year (4 to 3) and they still have over a handful games of left.

'BOUT TIME

- When Tech won at Wake Forest on Jan. 17, it snapped a seven-game losing streak on the road for the Hokies.
- The last time Tech won on the road was at, ironically, Wake Forest on Jan. 14, 2020, an 80-70.
- During that seven-game stretch, Tech's average margin of defeat was 12.0 points per game. It squeaked out a four-point win to end it, 64-60.

NA STAYIN' STEADY

- Sophomore Nahiem Alleyne, who has led the team in scoring in two straight games (Syracuse, ND), has been pretty steady this season from downtown.
- The guard had made at least one triple in all but three games this year, with those coming against Louisville, Notre Dame and VMI, out of 16 contests.
- If you remember last season, the Georgia native made a 3 in 13 consecutive games, which tied for the fifth-longest of any ACC player last year. And of that group, only him and Syracuse's Buddy Boeheim returned this season.

NOT SO FAST, MY FRIEND

- After scoring 10 or more fastbreak points in four straight games for the first time in the Mike Young era, Tech was held to a then-season-low two fastbreak points at Louisville (Jan. 6) and hasn't really recovered.
- Over its last eight games, it has only cracked double figures in fastbreak points once (15 vs. Duke), including six games of only two buckets (had zero at Pitt).

PUTTIN' ON THE CLAMPS

- Tech accomplished something for the first time since it joined the prestigious ACC (2004-05), with holding an opponent to two made field goals in a half versus the Fighting Irish on Jan. 10.
- The feat topped the previous best of holding its foe of three made shots in a half, which came against NC State in 2019, Arkansas Pine Bluff in 2015 and Eastern Michigan in 2011.

SWAT CITY

- Tech had a season-high nine blocks at Wake Forest on Jan. 17, marking the most for the Hokies since 2014 (Morgan State). To make it even more impressive, they did it by halftime.

ON THE BLOCK

- Tech racked up 36 points in the paint against No. 19/23 Duke, marking the second-highest paint point total in the Mike Young era during a regulation game.
- The high? Ironically, it came against Duke as well, when the Hokies had 40 paint points on Dec. 6 in Blacksburg.
- Including overtime games, Tech had 38 versus Miami (Fla.) at home in triple overtime.

STRONGER TOGETHER

- At Louisville, the Hokies had four players score in double figures, showcasing a balanced attack, and still ended up losing.
- That marked just the second time in the Mike Young era in which that happened, with the other instance being Tech's setback to BYU (90-77) in the fifth-place game at the Maui Jim Maui Invitational last season.
- The Hokies are 10-2 under Young when having at least four players score in double digits, and it was only just the second time that Tech had four or more players do so in an ACC game (Wake Forest, Jan. 14, 2020; an 80-70 win).

CLOSE, BUT NO CIGAR

- Tech lost a close one at Louisville, 73-71, coming up short for the fifth time in the Mike Young era in a game decided by four points or less.
- The Hokies are 4-5 in those types of games over the last two seasons, winning their most recent one, a four-point win at Wake Forest on Jan. 17.
- Last year, the Hokies had four contests in league play that were decided by four points or less, with winning at Syracuse by four (67-63), beating UNC in double overtime at home (79-77), losing to Boston College in overtime at home (77-73) and falling to in-state rival Virginia at home (56-53) for a 2-2 clip.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

- Displaying his versatility to close 2020, Keve Aluma put together one of the better games this season by any player nationally.
- Aluma against Miami (Fla.) put together a 26-point, six-rebound, four-assist, three-block outing, making him the lone high-major player to have at least that stat line in a game and just one of four players in all of DI.

CHECKING IN ON NET

- The first NET rankings came out on Monday, Jan. 4 and the Hokies came in at No. 34, the fourth best in the ACC.
- In the first NET rankings of the 2019-20 season, the Hokies were at No. 62. Tech went 3-7 against quadrant I teams last year and went 4-9 the year before that.
- Tech's best win of the season came against then-No. 3/3 Michigan St, which finished seventh in NET.
- Tech finished the 2019-20 season ranked No. 92.
- In 2018-19, the Hokies, after making a run to the Sweet 16, finished in the final NET rankings at 12th.
- Ironically, Wofford, which was coached by Mike Young at the time, came in two spots below (14).

DOUBLE TROUBLE

- Forwards Keve Aluma and Justyn Mutts sure came to play against Miami (Fla.), carrying Tech to a victory with not its best play out of its guards.
- The two combined for quite the stat line: 41 points, 15 rebounds, six assists, four steals and three blocks.
- In doing so, the two set some career and season highs, including Aluma's career high in points (26), assists (4, tied) and blocks (3, tied) and Mutts' career best in 3s made (3) and season highs for points (15), rebounds (9, tied) and steals (3).

CAUSING HAVOC DEFENSIVELY

- Tech forced Miami (Fla.) into committing 19 turnovers on Dec. 29, which was a season high for the 'Canes, as well as a season high forced by Tech.
- Over the last seven seasons, Tech has only done that (forced 19 or more TOs against an ACC team) five times, making it a first in the Mike Young era and for the first time since 2017.

80 THE SWEET SPOT

- The Hokies are 8-1 when scoring 80 or more points in the Mike Young era.
- Tech dropped 80 on Miami, marking only the third time its scored 80 or more against an ACC team the last two seasons, and just the second in a regulation game (80 vs. WF, 95 vs. Miami in 3OT).
- Therefore, Tech tied its ACC high in the Young era for a regulation game.

WAS A FUN RIDE

- Tech played all of its December games in the friendly confines of Cassell Coliseum, taking on six foes in total.
- December treated the Hokies well, winning five of those six contests, with its lone loss coming to Penn State in the ACC/B1G Challenge.

DUNK CITY

- The rim was rocking quite a bit in Tech's last game, with the Hokies tallying seven dunks against Longwood on Dec. 21.
- The seven dunks marked the most in the Mike Young era, topping the previous high of five set against Maryland Eastern Shore last year (Dec. 29).
- Keve Aluma had multiple dunks (2x) and then Nahiem Alleyne, David N'Guessan, Hunter Cattoor, Tyrece Radford and Justyn Mutts all had one and joined in on the 'dunk party' as well.
- To put it in perspective of how rare that instance was, Tech had three games this early this year (Coppin St, Villanova, USF) that it didn't get a single dunk.
- Last year, Tech had five games of three dunks, six games of two dunks and 11 games of just one.

DON'T MAKE 'EM LIKE ME ANYMORE

- Keve Aluma has been arguably Tech's best player so far this season, with being the team's leading scorer and rebounder, and put it all together in Tech's against Longwood on Dec. 21.
- Against the Lancers, the redshirt junior put together quite the stat line, registering 14 points, four rebounds, three blocks, two steals and an assist in just 24 minutes of action.
- Because of that outing, he is just one of five ACC players and only 13 high-major guys, including Iowa's Luka Garza, to do that stat line or better.

SOMETHING 'BOUT THOSE TWO

- When you look at the shortest players on the rosters for Virginia Tech and Miami (Fla.), it's not your typical 6-foot walk-on, as Tech's Jalen Cone (5'10") and Miami's Chris Lykes (5'7") are pretty short considering DI averages.
- But, despite their challenges of that, the two have formed a bond with one another and consider each other friends off the court.
- The two text regularly and Lykes has given Cone tips on best practices of overcoming his lack of height in the ACC, with Lykes being a couple of years older than Cone and sharing words of wisdom of what has worked for him over the years.

SMALL BUT MIGHTY

- Among high-major conference teams, there are only 35 players that are less than six feet tall, including Tech's Jalen Cone, standing at 5-foot-10.
- Of those 35, 19 of them are walk-ons, while the other 16 are on scholarship.
- In the ACC, Cone is one of eight players shorter than six feet, and is just one of five scholarship players in the league.
- Cone will go against two of the more famous shorter guys in the league, including Miami (Fla.)'s Chris Lykes and UVA's Kihei Clark.

UPTICK IN SHARING THE ROCK

- Sophomore guard Hunter Cattoor has improved his ball handling and decision making from last year, and it really has showed here the last couple of games for the Hokies.
- With Cartier Diarra opting out of the season (since Dec. 15), Cattoor has filled in as the secondary point guard, spelling Wabissa Bede, and did a nice job, as he turned in eight assists in the two games immediately following Diarra's departure.
- That two-game stretch of eight dimes is his best two-game stretch yet as a Hokie, topping his previous high of seven assists last season versus Delaware State on Nov. 20 and then-No. 3 Michigan State on Nov. 25.
- Versus Coppin State on Dec. 19, he dished out a career-high five assists – not bad for a guy who is known as a catch-and-shoot specialist.

NBA & G-LEAGUE

NAW IN YEAR 2

- Nickeil Alexander-Walker has left his mark on Virginia Tech and is working on making a name for himself at the next level with the New Orleans Pelicans.
- A first-round draft pick in 2019, the Toronto native played in 47 games for the Pels in the 2019-20 NBA season. On Feb. 26, he was moved down to the Erie Bayhawks, then came back up when the bubble in Orlando started.
- His best game his rookie year came on Nov. 16, 2019, when he scored a then-career-high 27 points against the Miami Heat. So far this season, his top one came on Jan. 13 at the Clippers, owning a career-high 38 points and eight rebounds.
- This season, NAW has played in 18 games for the Pelicans and is averaging 21.3 minutes.

20-ASSIST PLATEAU

- Tech has had six games of 20 or more assists in the Young era and is 5-1 in those games, with the lone loss coming to Syracuse at home last year in a close one, 80-78.
- The Hokies had 20 assists against Coppin State for a season high, with three players owning at least four, including Wabissa Bede (5 ast.), Hunter Cattoor (5) and Jalen Cone (4).

TOP ITEMS IN YOUNG ERA

- To give perspective on how well the Hokies were clicking on all cylinders against Coppin State on Dec. 19, here are how some key items that stand out in the Mike Young era.
- Tech's bench exploded for 51 points, which is the most in the Young era, topping the previous high of 49, which was set twice - Delaware State (Nov. 20) and Maryland Eastern Shore (Dec. 29).
- Tech's 20 3s were the second most in school history, as well as the Young era (21 vs. Delaware St).
- The 97 points were the second most in the Young era, topping the triple OT game against Miami (Fla.) last year of 95 points, but being a triple short of the Delaware State game's 100-point outing.
- Also, Tech had eight players make a 3 versus Coppin State, which hasn't happened at Tech since Nov. 21, 2017 against Houston Baptist (8 as well).

NOT GREAT, BOB - OH WAIT

- Tech had not been shooting the ball well from downtown early in the season, making just five 3s versus then-No. 24/RV Clemson, six 3s against Penn State, four triples versus VMI and only five the one before that (USF) for a combined 20-of-81 clip (24.7%).
- In the Mike Young era, that was the fewest 3s made in a four-game stretch.
- So, after hitting just 20 3s its last four games heading into Coppin State, Tech ripped off the exact amount in just one game.

FALLING BUT WINNING THE GLASS

- Tech coach Mike Young is 15-2 at Tech when his Hokie team out-rebounds the opponent, with one of those two losses another happening versus Penn State (39-33) on Dec. 8.
- It marked just the second loss when his group has outrebounded its opponent, with the only other loss coming last season against Boston College on Feb. 8, 2019, with a +1 differential.
- In fact, out of Tech's 20 ACC games last year, it only out-rebounded its league opponent three times, with two of those being versus Clemson.

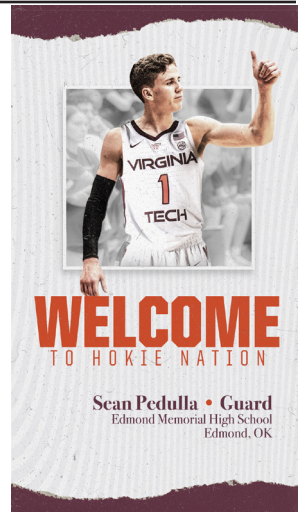

Having just three players returning who saw minutes the previous year in 2018-19 on the team, Young had to act quickly when hired on April 7, 2019 and build a roster to compete in the best conference in the nation. Adding a staff and six scholarship players in a hurry, Young's first season in Blacksburg started off with a bang, as the Hokies went down to South Carolina and defeated Clemson in style to give Young his first Hokie and ACC win, as well as his 300th career victory.

Another big-time W came at the prestigious Maui Jim Maui Invitational against then-No. 3 Michigan State. On ESPN2 with Dan Shulman and Jay Bilas on the call, the young Hokies (7 of the 9 rotation players were underclassmen) pulled off one of the bigger upsets of the season with a 71-66 win. With the upset of Sparty, it marked the first time since 1964 that Tech beat a top-five team in nonconference play.

Despite being the shortest and second-youngest squad among high-major conference teams, Young and Co. tallied 16 wins to make it the most victories by a first-year head coach at Tech since 1999-00 and tied for the fifth-most wins ever by a first-year Hokie coach. He also became the first coach to win two of his first three road ACC games in school history.

Leaning on a mix of young and old in his first season, Young developed junior Wabissa Bede into one of the finer point guards in the country, as Bede would go on to finish with the sixth-best assist-to-turnover ratio nationally (3.34) and first in the ACC. And under Young's tutelage, redshirt freshman Tyrece Radford blossomed into one of the better all-around players in the league, with being one of only two players in the ACC to average 10 points, six rebounds and shoot over 60 percent from the field.

Under the direction of Young, the Hokies put together some new records during the 2019-20 season. On Nov. 20 versus Delaware State, Tech racked up 21 3-pointers, marking the most in school history and the most ever by an ACC team. Speaking of 3s, the 315 hit last season were the second-most in school history.

Four freshmen hit 49 or more 3-pointers, which was the most by any program in over the last 25 years. Behind the young bucks, Tech finished 13th nationally in 3-pointers made per game with 9.9 triples a contest, which was the most in school history.

Utilizing its freshmen on the offensive end last year, Tech finished with its freshmen averaging 50.7 points per game, which is the fourth-most in ACC history behind Duke's 2018-19, 2017-18, 1982-83 teams.

Making sure his team played the game the right way by limiting miscues, Young's prowess showed on Dec. 29 when Tech committed only two turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore to tie a school record. The Hokies would go on to finish fourth in the nation in fewest turnovers committed per game (9.9).

The Radford, Virginia native joined the Hokies after a record-setting 17-year tenure as the head coach at Wofford. The Terriers posted a 30-5 overall record in 2018-19, including a perfect 18-0 mark in Southern Conference play, and registered a convincing 84-68 win over Seton Hall in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

The 2019 Sporting News Coach of the Year, Young built the Terriers into one of the Southern Conference's preeminent programs and a perennial NCAA Tournament participant. He guided Wofford to five NCAA Tournament berths over the past 10 seasons and five Southern Conference championships.
