RHODE ISLAND VS. VIRGINIA TECH - SERIES NOTES

- Saturday is the second game between the teams. Virginia Tech won the first 34-7 on Oct. 11, 1980.
- Though the schools have played just once in football, Virginia Tech and URI were both members of the Atlantic 10 in all other sports (except wrestling for the Hokies) from 1995 through 2000.
- This is URI's second FBS game this season. Rhody lost at Ohio, 41-20, on Aug. 31.
- Rhode Island is 1-17 all-time against FBS level teams. Rhody's lone victory against an FBS level program was against Connecticut in 2000, the first of two seasons the Huskies spent as an independent program before becoming a full-fledged Division I-A program.
- URI is 0-2 all-time against the ACC teams, losing at Syracuse (9/4/2018) and at Boston College (9/27/2008). Rhody is 2-9 all-time against BC (2-5), Syracuse (0-3) and Virginia Tech (0-1), but the majority of those games were played before the respective schools joined the ACC.

PRIORE NAMED CAA FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Redshirt junior quarterback **Vito Priore** was named the CAA Football Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Rams to a comeback win last Saturday. Priore was 31-of-44 for 389 yards and three touchdowns in a 31-28 win at Brown.
- With his team trailing 28-24 with 8:13 remaining in the fourth quarter, Priore went 4-of-5 for 62 yards and hit Aaron Parker for a 14-yard touchdown pass for the game-winning score. The touchdown capped a 6-play, 63-yard drive on which Priore accounted for all 63 yards. It was the third 300 yard passing yardage game and third three-touchdown game of the season for Priore.
- One of the nation's top passers, Priore ranks fourth in the country in passing yards per game (343.4), eighth in total passing yards (1,717), 17th in passing touchdowns (12) and 25th in passing efficiency (149.2). With his three touchdown passes Saturday, he moved into eighth place in Rhode Island history with 19 career touchdown passes.
- Priore is the second Rhode Island player to win a weekly honor from the CAA this season. Senior wide receiver Aaron Parker also earned Offensive Player of the Week honors for the week of Sept. 9.

PARKER NEARING 30 TOUCHDOWN CATCHES

- With two touchdown catches at Brown, senior **Aaron Parker** now has 27 touchdown grabs in 37 career games.
- He passed **Bobby Apgar** (26 from 1993-95) for third place in URI history.
- Parker needs three more touchdown catches to join **Dameon Reilly** (38 from 1983-85) and **Brian Forster** (32 from 1983-85, 87) as the only URI players with 30 touchdown catches.
- The Brown game marked the second straight week Parker has caught two touchdown passes in a game.
- In his career, Parker has five games with two or more touchdowns, including a personal best three scoring grabs against Elon last season.

3,000 YARDS IN REACH FOR PARKER

- With 87 receiving yards last week, senior **Aaron Parker** now has 2,918 for his career.
- He ranks second in team history, and needs just 82 more yards to join tight end **Brian Forster** (1983-85, '87) as the only 3,000-yard receivers for the Rams.
- Forster had 3,944 receiving yards.
- Parker needs 1,026 yards over the final seven games to reach Forster's total. He needs to average 146.6 yards per game to do so.
- Through the first five games of the season, Parker is averaging 136.4 yards per game, which is second in the country.
- He is second nationally in receiving yards (682) and sixth in receptions per game (8.4).
- The only player in the country with more receiving yards this season is Tennessee State's **Chris Rowland** (875).
- Parker's 227 receiving yards against Delaware were the fourth-highest single-game total among all FCS players this year. Eastern Washington's **Dre' Sorton Dorton** (289), Albany's **Juwan Green** (245) and Illinois State's **Andrew Edgar** (228) are the only players with more in a game.

PARKER FOURTH ALL-TIME IN RECEPTIONS

- With seven grabs against Brown, senior **Aaron Parker** now has 177 in his career, which ranks fourth in team history.
- He joined **Brian Forster** (284 from 1983-85, 87); **Brandon Johnson-Farrell** (198 from 2008-12); **Cy Butler** (189 from 1993-96); **Dameon Reilly** (165 from 1983-85) and **Darren Rizzi** (160 from 1989-92) as the only URI players with 150+ career catches.
- Parker needs 318 yards over the final seven games to reach 1,000 in a single season for the first time.

CAREER DAY FOR COULTER AT BROWN

- Junior wide receiver **Isaiah Coulter** set career highs Saturday at Brown by catching 12 passes for 171 yards.
- It was the second time this season Coulter has had double-digit receptions in a game. He had 10 catches at New Hampshire.
- After catching seven passes combined in the first two games of the season, Coulter has averaged nine catches per game over the last three contests, catching 27 passes in the span.
- Coulter has caught a touchdown pass in three straight games, and has four scores overall this season, setting a new career high.
- He ranks seventh in the country among FCS players with 101.0 receiving yards per game.
- Over his last three games, Coulter has averaged 125 yards receiving per contest.
- The 171-yard performance last week was the fifth 100-yard receiving game for Coulter.
- Coulter is cousins with senior **Aaron Parker**.
- Both had touchdowns against Brown, the seventh time that Coulter and Parker have caught a touchdown pass in the same game.
- This season, Coulter and Parker have combined for 1,187 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns.
- The combined yardage is the most by any wide receiver pair in the CAA.
- Parker and Coulter rank first and second, respectively, in receiving yards per game among CAA Football players.
- Coulter and Parker both came to URI from Gwynn Park High School in Maryland.
- Despite coming from the same high school, Parker and Coulter had never been teammates before playing together at URI.

DORSEY AN ALL-PURPOSE WEAPON

- Senior **Ahmere Dorsey** Dorsey is fifth in the nation with 165.2 all-purpose yards per game.
- He also is 11th in the country with a 28.6 yard per kick return average.
- Dorsey returned a kick 99 yards for a touchdown against Stony Brook, marking the third kick return score of his career.
- He and **Harold Cooper** (2004-07) are the only Rhode Island players with three kick returns of 90+ yards.
- In 16 career games, Dorsey has scored nine touchdowns. He has rushed for four, returned three kickoffs for scores, returned one punt for a touchdown and caught one touchdown pass.
- Dorsey had 1,085 combined kick and punt return yards last year, making him the first player in Rhode Island history to top 1,000 special teams yards in one year.
- With 444 special teams yards through five games, Dorsey is on pace to reach the 1,000-yard mark again.

RAMS WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

- Rhode Island ranks 11th in the nation and second in CAA Football with a +1.0 turnover margin thus far.
- The Rams have won or been even in the turnover battle each week thus far. They were +1 against Brown, Stony Brook and Ohio, +2 against Delaware, and even against New Hampshire.
- Through five games, the Rams have recorded eight interceptions and two fumble recoveries.
- Rhody has turned the ball over just five times, which ranks 17th in the country and leads in the conference. One of the turnovers came when the Rams fumbled the ball on an interception return.
- Three of Rhode Island's turnovers have been on interceptions, and one was a lost fumble.
- Rhode Island is 30th nationally in turnovers gained.
- Redshirt senior safety **Momodou Mbye** is second in the country with 0.8 interceptions per game. He picked off a pass in each of the team's first four contests.
- URI ranked 13th in the nation last season with a +0.73 per game turnover margin.
- Rhode Island has a 17-3 edge over opponents in points off turnovers this year.

MBYE LEADS LEAGUE IN INTERCEPTIONS

- Redshirt senior safety **Momodou Mbye** has recorded four interceptions through the first five games.
- He leads the CAA and is second in the nation with 0.8 interception per game.
- He is one of just four FCS players nationally with four picks. Only Monmouth's **Anthony Budd** (5) has more.
- A turnover machine throughout his career, Mbye now has eight career interceptions and six fumble recoveries. The fumble recoveries are tied for ninth most in program history.
- Mbye has had a direct role in five of the 10 turnovers Rhode Island has forced this year.
- With 22 career passes defended, Mbye is tied for fifth in program history. He needs four more to tie the Rhode Island career record of 26, owned by **Virgil Gray** (2003-06).
- Mbye is the only player in program history who is in the URI top 10 for both interceptions and fumble recoveries. He is tied for ninth in fumble recoveries with six.
- With seven tackles last week, Mbye reached 160 for his career.
- Mbye is one of three team captains this season. He initially made the team as a walk-on before earning a full scholarship and eventually being voted unanimously by his teammates as a captain.

JAVIER-CASTILLO LEADS CAA IN TACKLES

- Rhode Island linebacker **Brnayan Javier-Castillo** is averaging a league-best 10.4 tackles per game, which ranks 13th among all players nationally.
- Javier-Castillo had 14 tackles against Delaware, which is tied for the most by any CAA Football players in a game this season.
- It was the second time in his career he has recorded at least 14 stops in a game.
- In addition to the 14 tackles, Javier-Castillo had an interception that he returned 16 yards. He also had a sack in the game.
- Javier-Castillo has started all 16 games he has played for the Rams.

SCHAUM-BARTOCCI KEY TO FIELD POSITION

- Redshirt sophomore punter **Davey Schaum-Bartocci** ranks fourth in CAA Football with a 37.5 yard net punting average.
- Opponents have averaged just 1.0 yard per punt return, a tribute to the hang time Schaum-Bartocci gets with his kicks.
- He has placed six of his 20 punts inside the opposing 20-yard line and has just one touchback.

PRIORE AMONG NATION'S BEST PASSERS

- Redshirt junior quarterback **Vito Priore** ranks fourth among all FCS quarterbacks with 343.4 passing yards per game.
- His 430-yard performance against Delaware was the seventh-highest single game total in Rhode Island history.
- Priore ranks eighth in the country in total passing yards with 1,717.
- His 64.9 completion percentage ranks 17th nationally. He also is second all time in URI history with a career 61.4 percent completion mark.
- Priore needs 283 more yards to become the first Rhode Island player since **Derek Cassidy** to throw for 2,000 in a single season. Cassidy passed for 2,759 yards in 2007.
- In nine career starts, Priore has already recorded four games with 300 yards or more. He had 389 at Brown last week, 312 at New Hampshire on Sept. 21, 430 against Delaware on Sept. 7 and 310 against Brown last season.

CAMPBELL MAKES PRESENCE FELT

- Senior safety **Brian Campbell** has had double-digit tackles in two straight games, getting 10 at Brown and a career-high 11 against Stony Brook.
- Campbell has started every game for the Rams this season.
- He is second on the team with 46 tackles, has 2.5 TFLs, and leads URI with 1.5 sacks.

CARRICK CONTINUES STRONG CAMPAIGN

- Junior kicker **C.J. Carrick** is averaging 7.2 points per game, which ranks eighth among CAA Football players
- He is fourth in the league with 1.4 field goals per game.
- Carrick is 7-for-8 on field goal attempts this season, and 22-of-31 for his career.
- Against Delaware, Carrick tied his career high with 12 points, making three field goals and three extra point attempts.
- Among his field goals was a career-long 44-yard make with 19 seconds remaining in regulation to send the game to overtime.
- Carrick joined **Louis Feinstein** as the only URI players with multiple games with 12 or more points. Feinstein did it three times.
- Carrick ranks fourth in URI history for points by a kicker with 147.
- He is seventh place in program history with 22 field goals.
- Next up are **Matt Walker** (24 from 1995-97) and **Chris Cassara** (25 from 1988-91).
- Carrick is fourth in program history with 81 career extra points.

BRYANT SOLID IN THE BACKFIELD

- Redshirt senior **Zoe Bryant, Jr.** ranks 10th in the CAA with 60.8 rushing yards per game.
- Bryant has accounted for 304 of Rhode Island's 378 rushing yards this season. He also has 80 of the Rams' 129 total attempts.
- Against Delaware, Bryant caught his first career touchdown pass.
- He is fourth on the team with 15 receptions.
- Bryant has touchdowns in three of his last four games after not scoring in the season opener.
- He had three touchdowns all year in 2018.
- Bryant led URI with 467 rushing yards last season.

MURPHY, PARKER NAMED TO STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAM

- Seniors **Kyle Murphy** and **Aaron Parker** were named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Team.
- Murphy earned a spot on the first-team offensive line, while Parker garnered second-team recognition at wide receiver. Murphy also was a first-team honoree by Hero Sports.
- Murphy - who has started 30 consecutive games for Rhode Island - earned CAA Football First Team All-Conference recognition, as well as a spot on the New England Football Writer's Association All-New England Team last season.

JIM FLEMING

Head Coach - Sixth Season

Jim Fleming was named the 20th head coach in Rhode Island football history in December of 2013. He enters his sixth season at the helm in 2019.

Fleming has turned the Rhode Island program around, leading the Rams to their first winning season in 17 years in 2018. Rhody was 6-5 overall, including a 4-1 record at Meade Stadium. Fleming's team broke into the STATS FCS Top 25 on Sept. 10 for the first time for the program since 2005, and the team got as high as No. 16 in the STATS poll and No. 15 in the AFCA FCS Coaches poll during the season. It was the first time URI was above .500 since 2001. The team also was 4-4 in CAA Football action, the first time the program was .500 in league play since 2010. Junior tackle Kyle Murphy and junior wide receiver Aaron Parker both earned CAA Football First-Team All-Conference and NEFWA All-New England recognition. Receiving second-team all-conference nods were senior quarterback JaJuan Lawson, senior tight end Tyler Burke and junior punt returner Ahmere Dorsey.

In 2017, Fleming saw six of his players earn all-conference honors. Harold Cooper earned CAA Football All-Conference Second Team honors as a running back and third-team recognition as a kick returner. Wide receiver Aaron Parker was named to the second team, while wide receiver Marven Beauvais, defensive tackle Brandon Ginnett, offensive tackle Dino Boyd and punt returner Matt Pires were all on the third-team. The Rams also had their most victories in seven seasons.

For the second consecutive season, Fleming's team set a program mark for number of players to earn CAA Football Academic All-Conference recognition. The Rams had 22 players earn the honor in 2016, after having 18 receive the recognition in 2015. In 2016, Fleming had two

players earn CAA Football All-Conference honors, as kick returner Harold Cooper was named to the second team and defensive end Jose Duncan took home third-team honors. Fleming also led the team to its first Governor's Cup victory since 2011 as the Rams defeated Brown 28-13 in the annual in-state battle.

In his second season the Rams earned eight spots on the CAA Football All-Conference Team, the most for Rhode Island since 1995. Sophomore Harold Cooper was a first-team selection as a kick returner and a third-team pick at running back. He also was named to the 2015 Division I All-New England Football Team as a kick returner. Also earning CAA Football All-Conference honors were left tackle Tyler Catalina (second team), linebacker Adam Parker (second team), safety Tim Wienclaw (second team), defensive lineman Mike Ezirike (third team), tight end Charlie McKeeman (third team) and cornerback Myles Holmes (third team).

Though the Rams went 1-11 mark in Fleming's first season in Kingston, the team improved as the year moved along. Five players - linebacker Andrew Bose, fullback Justin Favreau, wide receiver Robbie Jackson, offensive tackle Tyler Catalina and kick returner Myles Holmes all earned a spot on the CAA Football All-Conference Team. Bose was the first Rhody linebacker to earn first-team honors in 16 seasons. He and freshman tight end Charlie McKeeman earned All-America honors from TonySoftli.com. Rhode Island also had 12 players earn a spot on the CAA Football Academic All-Conference Team.

Following the season, Bose signed as an undrafted free agent with the NFL's Baltimore Ravens, while running back Lyle McCombs signed with the Canadian Football League's Toronto Argonauts.

Fleming came to Rhode Island from the University of Central Florida, where he was the defensive coordinator for the No. 15 Knights. In 2013, Fleming helped UCF earn a spot in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

The 2013 season marked the second straight year that Fleming has helped guide UCF to a bowl game. In 2012, the Knights had the top-ranked scoring and pass defense in Conference USA and were ranked 29th nationally in scoring defense en route to a spot in the Beef O'Brady Bowl, where they defeated Ball State, 38-17.

Fleming has a track record of success, including as a head coach. In two seasons at Sacred Heart, he was a two-time Northeast Conference Coach of the Year while posting a 21-1 record. His team won the 2001 Mid Major I-AA National Championship to cap off a perfect 11-0 season. In his first year with the Pioneers, Fleming orchestrated the nation's best turnaround. Inheriting a team that had gone 2-9 the previous season, Fleming led Sacred Heart to a 10-1 mark in 2000, ending the season ranked No. 5 in the nation.

A veteran of 29 seasons of college football, Fleming has coached for teams in CAA Football, the AAC, the ACC, Conference USA, the MAC, the former Atlantic 10 (now CAA Football), the NEC, the Ivy League and the Big Sky Conference.

Fleming's defense in 2012 included safety Kemal Ishmael, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year who was a seventh-round draft pick for the Atlanta Falcons. Defensive end Troy Davis was placed on the All-C-USA First Team, cornerback A.J. Bouye grabbed a spot on the second team and lineman Deion Green was voted on to the all-freshman team. Bouye, Davis, Cam Henderson and Ray Shipman all signed rookie free-agent deals.

At Kent State in 2010, Fleming coached the linebackers for the Mid-American Conference's top-ranked defense. The Golden Flashes led the conference in sacks and tackles for loss, and Fleming's linebackers were a major reason. Middle linebacker Cobrani Mixon earned a spot on the All-MAC First Team by collecting 11.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, one interception, two forced fumbles and 82 overall tackles, while All-MAC Third Team selection Dorian Wood led the Golden Flashes with 96 tackles (11.5 for loss). Luke Batton delivered 68 tackles at the other outside linebacker position.

Fleming spent six seasons at Akron (2004-09) as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach. He helped the Zips win their first MAC Championship and qualify for the Motor City Bowl in 2005. Under Fleming, the defense produced four All-MAC honorees, including the league's second-leading tackler in freshman Brian Wagner and the program's second-ever three-time All-MAC selection in Almondo Sewell. Fleming's defenses at Akron consistently performed among the nation's best, ranking 32nd in total defense in 2005, and 31st in passing defense in 2009.

Prior to Akron, Fleming spent two years (2002-03) as the defensive backs coach at North Carolina. That stint came after his remarkable two-year run as the head coach of Sacred Heart. During their championship run, the Pioneers ranked second in the nation in scoring, pass efficiency and turnover margin, fourth in total defense and seventh in scoring defense and passing yards allowed. Fleming was named the Northeast Conference Coach of the Year in both 2000 and 2001.

A native of New York, N.Y., Fleming also spent two years as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Villanova (1998-99) and four years (1994-97) coaching linebackers (1994) and defensive backs (1995-97) at East Carolina. His 1997 squad ranked second in Conference USA in pass defense, while in 1995, the Pirates finished 9-3 and earned a berth in the Liberty Bowl where they defeated Stanford, 19-13. That season, the ECU defense ranked seventh nationally in pass efficiency defense, producing 33 takeaways and 19 interceptions.

No stranger to the Ocean State, Fleming spent the 1993 campaign as the defensive coordinator at Brown where the Bears went from 0-10 and last place in the Ivy League, to 4-6 and a tie for fourth place in the conference. From 1987-92, he had a successful six-year stretch at Boise State, including the final three seasons as defensive coordinator. His 1991 Broncos' defense led the nation in rushing defense, was third in turnover margin and led the Big Sky Conference in every statistical category. In 1990, BSU finished 10-4 and advanced to the semifinals of the Division I-AA playoffs, leading the conference in scoring defense.

Fleming is a 1982 graduate of the University of the South with a degree in English. While there, he was a four-year starter in football and baseball, earning all-conference honors as a tight end in 1981. Fleming began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at South Carolina in 1985.

He and his wife, Leslie, have four children: Jimmy, Will, Kate and Meg. Will played tight end/fullback for Akron from 2009-12 and is now on the Rhode Island staff.
