» Junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, has six games this season with at least 10 points, five rebounds and five assists -- tied for the NCAA lead and the most among power conference players.

### » THE OPENING TIP

- » No. 2 Duke caps a four-game holiday home stand when it welcomes Virginia Tech to Cameron Indoor Stadium for the Blue Devils' ACC opener Wednesday night.
- » Duke is 50-18 all-time in ACC openers, including 31-10 in ACC openers under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**. The Blue Devils have won three straight and five of their last seven ACC lid lifters.
- » Junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, is the nation's only power conference player -- and one of two in D-1 -- averaging 16.0+ points, 5.0+ rebounds, 5.0+ assists and shooting .500+ from the field (16.9/5.6/5.1/.581).
- » Moore's six 10-5-5 games are tied for the NCAA lead and the most among power conference players.
- » Moore leads the ACC in assists, is second in assist/turnover ratio (+2.83), sixth in scoring, third in field goal pct. and 18th in rebounds.
- » Duke leads the ACC in field goal percentage (.491, ranked 17th in the NCAA), scoring margin (+21.7, 7th), scoring offense (86.1, 6th), blocked shots (5.2, 34th) and fewest personal fouls (13.5, 19th).
- » One of the nation's best ball-handling teams, Duke ranks third in the NCAA in assist/turnover ratio (+2.01), seventh in fewest turnovers (9.2), ninth in turnover margin (+6.5) and ninth in assists (18.5).
- » **Trevor Keels** is the third different Blue Devil to be named ACC Freshman of the Week this season, earning the honor this week after averaging 14.7 points and shooting .522 from the field in Duke's three victories in five days last week.
- » Keels' 2.0 steals per game lead the team and rank fourth in the ACC, while his +2.5 assist/turnover ratio is fourth in the league. He is the only Blue Devil with a three-pointer in every game this season.
- » Sophomore **Mark Williams** leads the ACC and is ranked 13th in the NCAA with 3.0 blocked shots per game. Williams has swatted multiple shots nine times this season and 19 times in 34 career games.
- » Freshman **AJ Griffin** is averaging 11.7 points over Duke's last three games and shooting .632 from the field, .545 from three-point range with 11 rebounds, seven assists and no turnovers in that stretch.

» GAME NOTES

**117TH SEASON OF DUKE BASKETBALL**

- » The 2021-22 campaign marks the 117th season of Duke Basketball.
- » The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,224-905 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- » Only Kentucky (2,337), Kansas (2,332) and North Carolina (2,301) have more all-time wins than Duke.
- » Duke's all-time .711 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.762), North Carolina (.734) and Kansas (.728).

**ACC OPENERS**

- » Duke is 50-18 all-time in ACC openers, including 31-10 in the 41 ACC openers under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**.
- » Wednesday's game marks just the second time in the past seven seasons that Duke has opened its ACC schedule at home.
- » Duke is 18-4 when opening ACC play at home under Coach K and has won seven straight and 13 of the last 14 ACC openers at home.
- » The Blue Devils have faced the Hokies five times previously to open ACC play, winning at Cameron Indoor on Dec. 4, 2005 with Sean Dockery's 45-footer at the buzzer (77-75) and Jan. 4, 2009 (69-44) and in Blacksburg on Dec. 6, 2019 (77-63).
- » The Hokies won in Durham in overtime on Jan. 4, 2006 (69-67) and in Blacksburg on Dec. 31, 2016 (89-75).

**DUKE VS. VIRGINIA TECH**

- » Wednesday's game is the 62nd meeting between Duke and Virginia Tech, with the Blue Devils leading 50-11.
- » In Durham, Duke leads the series 21-1 and has won eight consecutive. The Hokies' lone win at Cameron Indoor came in overtime in the ACC opener on Jan. 6, 2007 (69-67).
- » A freshman has led Duke in scoring in each of the last five games against Virginia Tech, including **Jeremy Roach's** career-high 22 points last season in Blacksburg on 6-of-14 shooting.
- » Third-year head coach **Mike Young** spent the previous 17 years as head coach at Wofford, where he was 299-244 and took the Terriers to the NCAA Tournament five times.
- » Young faced Duke just once in his time at Wofford -- an 84-55 Blue Devil win at Cameron Indoor on Dec. 31, 2014.

**ABOUT THE HOKIES**

- » Virginia Tech is 8-4 overall and opened its ACC schedule with an 80-61 loss to Wake Forest on Dec. 4 in Blacksburg.
- » The battle-tested Hokies faced Memphis, Xavier, Maryland, Dayton and St. Bonaventure during their non-conference schedule and are coming off an 86-49 rout of the Bonnies on Dec. 17 in Charlotte.
- » Their ninth-ranked defense allows just 56.5 points per game. Opponents are shooting .396 from the field and just .255 from three-point range (No. 8 nationally).
- » Senior Keve Alluma, who has a pair of double-doubles this season, leads the team in scoring at 14.2 points, while grad student Justyn Mutts pulls down a team-best 7.4 rebounds per game.
- » Junior Hunter Cattoor is making 2.3 three-pointers per game.

**ON THIS DATE**

- » Duke is 12-3 all-time when playing on Dec. 22, and has won 11 straight on this date (8-0 in the Coach K era).
- » The Blue Devils are 4-0 at Cameron Indoor.
- » Duke last played on this date in 1998 -- a 71-60 win over Kentucky in a battle of AP No. 2 vs. 3 in East Rutherford, N.J.

**OFFENSE IN RHYTHM**

- » Duke is averaging 86.1 points and out-scoring opponents by 21.7 points per game, both lead the ACC and rank top seven nationally.
- » The Blue Devils lead the conference and are top 25 nationally in a number of other offensive categories, including field goal shooting, assists, assist/turnover ratio, turnover margin, fewest turnovers and fewest personal fouls.
- » Additionally, Duke is second in the ACC in made three-pointers per game (8.9) and steals (9.5), third in free throw percentage (.755) and leads the conference in blocks (5.2).
- » Duke is +11.9 in points-off-turnover scoring per game and has not been out-scored in that category in a game this season

**VALUING THE BALL**

- » One of the nation's best ball-handling teams, Duke ranks third in the NCAA in assist/turnover ratio (+2.01), seventh in fewest turnovers (9.2), ninth in turnover margin (+6.5) and ninth in assists (18.5).
- » The Blue Devils have posted a positive assists-to-turnover ratio in each of the last 10 games after starting minus-1 in the opener against Kentucky (eight assists, nine turnovers).
- » Duke has assisted on at least 44 percent of its field goals in every game since the opener (eight assists, 25 field goals vs. Kentucky) -- and has been 64 percent or better six times this season.
- » Duke is forcing 15.6 turnovers, averaging 9.5 steals and owns a +131 margin in points-off-turnover scoring for the season.

**MOORE DOES IT ALL**

- » Junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, is proving early to be among the nation's most complete -- and improved -- players as the co-captain is the only power conference player averaging 16.0+ points, 5.0+ rebounds, 5.0+ assists and shooting .500+ from the field.
- » Moore has six games this season with at least 10 points, five rebounds and five assists (10-5-5 games) -- tied for the NCAA lead and the most among power conference players.
- » The Charlotte native leads the ACC in assists (5.1), is second in the conference and 19th nationally in assist/turnover ratio (+3.11), is sixth in scoring (16.9) and fourth in field goal percentage (.581).
- » With his 19-10-10 vs. Army, he has one of the seven triple-doubles in the nation this season. It marked just the fifth triple-double in Duke history and the third under **Mike Krzyzewski**.
- » Moore has scored 11 or more points in every game this season.
- » The junior flirted with another triple-double against The Citadel, dropping 22 points, eight rebounds and nine assists.
- » He was named the MVP of the Gonzaga game with 20 points, six rebounds, six assists and a career-high six steals.

- » Moore is the only power conference player -- and one of just two players in Division-I -- averaging 16.0+ points, 5.0+ rebounds, 5.0+ assists and shooting .500+ from the field.

- » Associate head coach **Jon Scheyer** has announced the first four members of the Blue Devils' 2022 freshman class with the signing of **Kyle Filipowski**, **Dereck Lively II**, **Jaden Schutt** (pronounced "shoot") and **Dariq Whitehead** ("DA-reek") during the NCAA's early signing period.
- » The Blue Devils' incoming class is ranked No. 1 currently by ESPN in its 2022 class rankings.
- » With Scheyer tapped as the successor to head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** following Coach K's retirement at the end of this season, Duke has finished in the top four in each of ESPN's class rankings since 2014, including a streak of seven consecutive seasons (2014-20) in which the Blue Devils inked a top-two class.

- » Opening his career with a 22-point, seven-rebound effort to help Duke beat No. 10 Kentucky, freshman **Paolo Banchemo** was named the ACC Freshman of the Week on Nov. 15.
- » After a career-high 18 points from **AJ Griffin** in the win over Lafayette, Griffin was named ACC Freshman of the Week on Nov. 22.
- » Duke swept the weekly awards Nov. 29 with junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, earning his first Player of the Week honor and Banchemo his second after the duo each scored 20+ points in the win over No. 1 Gonzaga.
- » **Trevor Keels** is the latest Freshman of the Week for Duke after he averaged 14.7 in three wins last week.
- » Since 2013-14, a Duke freshman has won nearly 50 percent of the ACC Freshman of the Week awards -- 68 of a possible 142 weeks.

- » Duke has posted an all-time record of 923-168 (.846) at Cameron Indoor, including 565-73 (.885) under Coach K.
- » Duke is 258-62 (.806) in ACC regular-season games at Cameron Indoor in the Coach K era.
- » Duke has won more games at its current home venue than any team in college basketball.
- » Now in its 83rd season as the home of the Blue Devils, Duke has averaged 11.1 wins since the venue opened January 6, 1940 -- a 36-27 win over Princeton.
- » The Blue Devils have 18 undefeated home seasons, including 11 under Coach K.

## SELLOUT STREAK

- » Duke has sold out 478 consecutive games at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The last time Duke did not have a sellout at home was on Nov. 16, 1990, against Boston College.
- » The sellout figure is the longest current streak (by time) in either men's college basketball or the NBA.
- » Duke's record at Cameron during the sellout streak is 436-42 (.913).

## DUKE AWAY FROM CAMERON

- » In the Coach K era, Duke is 263-153 (.632) in true road games and 279-77 (.784) in neutral site games, for a combined mark of 542-230 (.706) in all games outside of Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » In ACC regular season play, Duke is 192-127 (.602) away from home under Coach K.
- » Coach K's 192 ACC road wins are a conference record.
- » Coach K has also won 16 road games against AP top five teams, the most in the history of the AP poll.

## AP POLL DATA: DUKE RANKED NO. 2 THIS WEEK

- » Duke enters the week ranked No. 2 in the AP poll, the seventh consecutive week the Blue Devils have been ranked in the top 10.
- » Duke opened the season at No. 9 in the preseason poll, climbed to Nos. 7 and 5 before reaching No. 1 on Nov. 29 following the win over then No. 1 Gonzaga.
- » In the program's history, it marked the 145th week that Duke had been ranked No. 1 in the AP poll -- the most weeks ranked No. 1 all-time.
- » Duke has been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll now 90 times since the start of the 1998-99 season, far and away the most in the nation in that span (North Carolina is second, 39).
- » Duke's 284 games (243-41) at No. 1 are the most all-time.
- » Under Coach K, Duke has played 255 of those games -- also the most in NCAA history for one coach. The Blue Devils are 219-36 under Coach K at No. 1.
- » Under Coach K, Duke has played more games as a No. 1 team (255) than as an unranked team (161).
- » At No. 2 this week, Duke is ranked second for the 87th time, and is 136-22 when playing as the No. 2 ranked team.
- » The Blue Devils have also been ranked in the top 10 at least once in 26 consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak nationally.

## DUKE VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- » Duke is 238-155 (.606) vs. ranked teams under Coach K, with a 158-83 (.655) mark since the 1996-97 season.
- » In the Coach K era, Duke is 223-126 (.639) overall when each team is ranked in the Top 25 ... 146-87 (.629) overall when each team is ranked in the top 15 ... 89-63 (.586) overall when each team is ranked in the top 10 ... 34-18 (.654) when each team is ranked in the top five.
- » He has more wins over the AP No. 1 team (seven) than any active coach.
- » With the win over No. 3 Virginia on Feb. 9, 2019, Coach K broke a tie with **Dean Smith** for most wins in top-three games (11).

## DUKE VS. NO. 1

- » Including the win over Gonzaga, Duke has faced the nation's No. 1 team 18 times under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** and is 7-11 in those games. Duke is 6-4 against the nation's top-ranked team since a March 26, 1988 win against Temple.
- » Duke is 10-21 all-time against the AP's No. 1 team.
- » Duke has won five of its last eight and six of its last 10 versus No. 1 -- all under Coach K.
- » Coach K's seven wins over No. 1 are second most in NCAA history and lead all active coaches.

- » Duke was selected as the favorite to win the 2021-22 ACC Championship, as chosen by media members.
- » Picked as the preseason ACC favorite for the seventh time in the last nine years, the Blue Devils received 47 first-place votes to top the poll, followed by Florida State, North Carolina, Virginia and Virginia Tech.
- » **Paolo Banchemo** swept the individual awards, as the newcomer from Seattle, Wash., was tapped both the Preseason Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year while landing on the Preseason All-ACC First Team.
- » Banchemo becomes the conference's first player to sweep both Preseason Player and Freshman of the Year accolades since at least 2000.
- » Junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, and sophomore **Mark Williams** each earned a spot on the Preseason All-ACC Second Team, while **Trevor Keels** was second behind Banchemo in Preseason Freshman of the Year voting.

- » The Blue Devils most recent selections are **Paolo Banchemo**, **AJ Griffin** and **Trevor Keels**, while current Blue Devils **Jeremy Roach** and **Mark Williams** were tapped to the 2020 team.
- » Duke joined Kentucky and Michigan as the only programs with multiple selections to the 2021 team.
- » **Mike Krzyzewski** has now signed 85 McDonald's All-Americans -- the most all-time by a coach -- and has added at least one to his roster in 37 consecutive years.

## DUKE ADDS VETERAN PRESENCE

- » Coach K added a pair of grad transfers this offseason with forward **Theo John** from Marquette and forward **Bates Jones** from Davidson.
- » The 6-9, 242-pound John, who played for **Steve Wojciechowski** at Marquette and for **Chris Carrawell** while he was an assistant coach, racked up 191 blocks in his career -- the second most in program history.
- » Jones, who checks in at 6-8, 222, came to Duke after four years for the legendary Bob McMillip at Davidson. He is the brother of both former Duke and current NY Giants quarterback **Daniel Jones** and current Duke women's soccer goalkeeper **Ruthie Jones**.

## COACH K'S COACHING TREE

- » Long-time Duke Associate Head Coach **Nate James** was announced as the head coach at Austin Peay on April 2, after spending nearly two decades with the Blue Devils as a player and coach.
- » James is the 11th former Duke player or staff member under Coach K currently serving as a head coach at the Division I level or the NBA, joining **Tommy Amaker** (Harvard), **Kenneth Blakney** (Howard), **Mike Brey** (Notre Dame), **Jeff Capel** (Pittsburgh), **Chris Collins** (Northwestern), **Johnny Dawkins** (UCF), **Bobby Hurley** (Arizona State), **Greg Paulus** (Niagara), **Mike Schrage** (Elon) and **Quin Snyder** (Utah Jazz).
- » On the current staff, **Chris Carrawell** was promoted from Assistant Coach to Associate Head Coach, while **Nolan Smith** was moved from Director of Operations to Assistant Coach.
- » Duke also added former national champion **Amile Jefferson** to the staff as Director of Player Development.
- » With Jefferson, Duke's coaching and support staff is comprised of all former captains under **Mike Krzyzewski**.

## ACC DOMINANCE

- » Duke has won 319 league games and eight regular season ACC championship titles since 1997. Duke is the only league team to win at least 70 percent of its conference games in that span.
- » The Blue Devils have also been outstanding in ACC Tournament play with 12 crowns in the past 23 seasons in what is considered the nation's toughest conference.
- » Duke's 12 ACC crowns since 1997 are seven more than the next closest program and more than all of the other league schools combined (11 by six programs).
- » Duke is also the only ACC program to win at least three league tournament titles in succession during that stretch. The Blue Devils won five straight ACC titles from 1999-2003 and three in a row from 2009-11.

## » DUKE IN THE NBA



- » A total of 87 former Duke players have appeared on NBA rosters.
- » Overall, 42 Duke players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft in the Coach K era, including 24 in the past 10 years.
- » There are 21 Duke players on current NBA rosters (including inactive and two-way players) -- the most currently by any ACC school.
- » Duke had an ACC record 27 NBA players last season, breaking the previous record of 25, set by Duke in 2019-20.
- » Four Duke players have been selected No. 1 in the NBA Draft -- **Art Heyman** (1963), **Elton Brand** (1999), **Kyrie Irving** (2011) and **Zion Williamson** (2019).
- » Duke now boasts 68 players drafted under head coach **Mike Krzyzewski**.
- » Duke has had at least one player selected in 34 of the 41 drafts under Coach K, including at least one in 11 consecutive drafts. In that span since 2011, 28 Blue Devils have been drafted.
- » Coach K's 42 first-round selections remain a Draft record.
- » Duke has had 28 players selected in the NBA Draft Lottery, the most in the nation since the system was put into place in 1985.
- » Overall, between Duke and USA Basketball, Coach K has coached 113 NBA players.
- » In 1999, Duke became the first program in the history of the NBA Draft to have four players from the same school selected in the first round. Three of the four -- **Elton Brand** (Chicago), **Trajan Langdon** (Cleveland) and **Corey Maggette** (Seattle) -- were lottery picks.
- » In 2002, **Jason Williams** (2nd overall) and **Mike Dunleavy** (3rd) became the first college teammates in the history of the NBA Draft to be the first two collegians selected.
- » Six former Duke players -- **Jeff Mullins** (Golden State, 1975), **Danny Ferry** (San Antonio, 2003), **Shane Battier** (Miami, 2012 and 2013), **Kyrie Irving** (Cleveland, 2016), **Dahntay Jones** (Cleveland, 2016) and **Quinn Cook** (Golden State, 2018; L.A. Lakers 2020) -- have been part of NBA championship teams.
- » Through the 2020-21 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated more than \$2.5 billion in NBA contracts.
- » Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn more than \$2 billion in contracts, an average of nearly \$70 million per individual.
- » Duke's and Coach K's ties to the NBA run deeper than just the players on the floor. Including former Blue Devil **Quin Snyder** as the head coach of the Utah Jazz, more than 20 of Coach K's former players, assistant coaches, staff and managers occupy positions on NBA coaching staffs or in front offices.

It does not take long for a conversation about the highest levels of success in the basketball world to turn to the name Krzyzewski. In 41 seasons at Duke, Mike Krzyzewski - a Naismith Hall of Fame coach, five-time national champion and 12-time Final Four participant - has built a dynasty that few programs in the history of the game can match.

No coach in Division I men's basketball history has won more games than Coach K's 1,180.

Announcing his retirement in June ahead of his 42nd season at Duke, and 47th overall as a head coach at both Duke and Army West Point, Krzyzewski owns an 1,180-362 record as a head coach, including a 1,107-303 mark at Duke.

The numbers that illustrate Coach K's career are simply staggering:

- Five national championships (1991, 1992, 2001, 2010, 2015)
- Six gold medals as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team
- Nine National Players of the Year (11 honors)
- Six National Defensive Players of the Year (nine honors)
- 10 consecutive top-10 AP poll finishes (1997-06)
- 12 National Coach of the Year honors (eight seasons)
- 12 Final Four appearances (tied for most in NCAA history)
- 12 ACC regular season championships
- 15 ACC Tournament championships (most in league history)
- 28 NBA Lottery picks (most in Draft history)
- 35 NCAA Tournament bids (most by one coach)
- 37 All-America selections (51 honors)
- 67 ACC Tournament wins (most in league history)
- 68 NBA Draft selections, including 42 first-round picks
- 97 NCAA Tournament wins (most in NCAA history)
- 127 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 517 ACC wins (most in league history)
- 563 weeks ranked in the top 10 of the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 656 weeks ranked in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 1,107 victories at Duke (most in NCAA history at one school)
- 1,180 career wins (most in NCAA history)

Coach K became the Division I men's career wins leader on Nov. 15, 2011, at Madison Square Garden, moving past his former coach Bob Knight with his 903rd victory. His historic 1,000th career victory came against St. John's at The World's Most Famous Arena on Jan. 25, 2015, as he became the first Division I men's basketball coach to achieve a four-figure win total.

Krzyzewski's 1,107 victories at Duke are an NCAA record by a coach at one school. With 1,107 of the Blue Devils' 2,224 all-time victories, Coach K has presided over nearly half (49.6 percent) of the men's basketball wins in Duke history.

Krzyzewski has won a league-record 517 ACC games (regular season and tournament), passing former North Carolina head coach Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015. He has also won an ACC-record 192 conference road games.

Coach K's five national championships are the second-most in NCAA history. Krzyzewski and former Connecticut coach Jim Calhoun are the only coaches in NCAA history to win national championships in three different decades.

Coach K has led the Blue Devils into the NCAA Tournament 35 times - more than any other coach in history. His streak of guiding Duke to 24 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances from 1996 to 2019 ranked as the longest streak in NCAA history, surpassing Dean Smith's 23 consecutive appearances from 1975 to 1997.

Krzyzewski holds NCAA Tournament records for games coached (127) and wins (97) while ranking second all-time and leading active coaches with a .764 NCAA Tournament winning percentage (min. 20 games). He has reached the Sweet 16 on 25 occasions, six more than any other coach in NCAA history, and has advanced to the Elite Eight 16 times.

Of the 1,410 games Krzyzewski has coached at Duke, 1,249 - 88.5 percent - have been as a ranked team. The Blue Devils are 1,017-232 (.814) as a ranked team under Coach K.

Coach K has taken top-ranked Duke teams into games on 255 occasions and compiled a 219-36 (.859) record as the AP's No. 1 team, ranking first in poll history in both number of games and wins as coach of a top-ranked squad.

Krzyzewski has tutored 68 NBA Draft picks during his time at Duke, including a total of 42 first-round selections that leads all active coaches. Duke has had at least one player taken in 34 of the 41 NBA Drafts during the Krzyzewski Era.

Since the inception of the NBA Draft Lottery in 1985, Coach K and Duke have produced 28 lottery picks - a draft-record total for both a school and a coach.

Through the 2020-21 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated more than \$2.5 billion in NBA contracts. Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn more than \$2 billion in contracts, an average of nearly \$70 million per individual.

Under Coach K's watch, Duke has produced multiple All-ACC Academic selections in 12 of the last 13 years. The 2015 NCAA championship team featured a program-high five All-ACC Academic honorees. Quin Snyder, Amile Jefferson and Grayson Allen are the only players in Duke history to earn All-ACC Academic honors four times. Jefferson, a three-time captain, departed the university in 2017 with both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Krzyzewski has had six players collect a total of nine CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, headlined by two-time first-team honorees Battier (2000, 2001) and Mason Plumlee (2012, 2013). Allen became the sixth in 2016 when he garnered second-team accolades.

Fittingly, Coach K has earned nearly every award imaginable. The crown jewel of that haul, however, came in 2001 when he was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Since his enshrinement in Springfield, Mass., Krzyzewski has also been inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame (2009), the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame (2010) and the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame (2011).

While establishing Duke as one of college basketball's dynastic programs, Krzyzewski simultaneously spent more than a decade as one of the architects of the revitalization of USA Basketball. During his tenure at the helm of the program, the U.S. National Team amassed an extraordinary 88-1 record and claimed gold medals at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship, 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championship, 2012 London Olympics, 2014 FIBA World Cup and 2016 Rio Olympics, as well as a bronze medal at the 2006 FIBA World Championship.

Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the USMNT and his time at the helm ended with the team in the midst of a National Team-record 76-game winning streak that began in 2006.

Sustained success under Coach K has resulted in coaching opportunities for several of his former players, as well as his former assistant coaches from both Duke and Army. More than 25 of Coach K's former players or assistants are currently either coaching or working in front office roles across professional and college basketball.

**The Coaching Tree**

Ten of Coach K's former players or staff are currently Division I head coaches: Tommy Amaker (Harvard), Kenneth Blakeney (Howard), Mike Brey (Notre Dame), Jeff Capel (Pittsburgh), Chris Collins (Northwestern), Johnny Dawkins (Central Florida), Bobby Hurley (Arizona State), Nate James (Austin Peay), Greg Paulus (Niagara) and Mike Schrage (Elon). James assumed the Austin Peay position following the 2020-21 season.

Quin Snyder is currently the head coach of the NBA's Utah Jazz, headlining a long list of former players, staff and managers that are connected to the NBA. That list also includes Grant Hill as part-owner of the Atlanta Hawks, Elton Brand as general manager of the Philadelphia 76ers, Trajan Langdon as general manager of the New Orleans Pelicans and Shane Battier as vice president of analytics and development for the Miami Heat.

Krzyzewski has shown a firm commitment to taking care of his own, having at least three former Duke captains on his staff every season since 1996-97. The Blue Devils have won three NCAA titles, 12 ACC Tournament championships and eight ACC regular season crowns during that time.

The 2020-21 staff of Jon Scheyer, Chris Carrawell and Nolan Smith all held the captain role during their playing careers at Duke.

**Giving Back**

Krzyzewski has been diligently committed to public service, both locally and nationally, throughout his coaching career. He is currently serving on boards for, while also assuming vital roles with, the Duke Children's Hospital, the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research, the NABC Foundation, the CEO Roundtable on Cancer and the Emily Krzyzewski Center.

Coach K's philanthropic activities also include the establishment and funding of the Emily Krzyzewski Center, a community center in Durham named in honor of his late mother. The Center's mission is to inspire economically disadvantaged students to dream big, act with character and purpose, strive for academic excellence and reach their highest potential as future citizen leaders.

In May 2018, Coach K and his wife Mickie announced their single-largest philanthropic gift, a \$3 million donation to the Emily K Center to kick start a \$15 million fundraising campaign for the Durham-based Center. That campaign concluded on December 31, 2020 and raised \$18.85 million to exceed the goal.

## What's behind Duke's improved 3-point shooting? Better ball movement and focus, for starters

DURHAM, N.C. – Simple play, simple result.

As a normal pick-and-roll should be, right? So it wasn't strange when, midway through No. 2 Duke's 87-56 win over Elon on Saturday, Trevor Keels initiated the standard set. With the ball in his hands just outside the top of the key, Keels made the universal "come here" sign with his cupped hand, calling for Theo John to jog out of the post. John obliged, and the P&R played out as it so often does: Keels going around the screen, then a hedging defender, and side-passing the ball back inside to a cutting John. Everything according to plan.

Only, then the plan differed. John didn't put the ball straight up for an easy layup, didn't even stop to scan the floor and plan his next step. Instead, the second the rock touched his hands, it became a hot potato, with John immediately re-directing the pass to the far corner and to a wide open Jeremy Roach, who promptly drilled a 3.

Simple play, simple result.

But something sustainable?

Increasingly for these Blue Devils, yes. Sequences of that sort are slowly becoming the norm for Duke, at least if last week's three games are any indication. Now, it's fair (and somewhat necessary) to consider the caliber of opponent before drawing any grand conclusions – at No. 175 overall in KenPom's ratings, Appalachian State was the "best" of the three December opponents thus far – but don't dismiss the results flatly. Because it's clear that since bricking 28.6 percent from 3 in their lone loss this season, to Ohio State, Duke's shooting has just gotten straight-up better.

Sounds easy, right? "Just make more shots!"

Oh, if only.

That's one element of the shooting equation, sure ... just, the most unpredictable one. But there are many others, though, that Mike Krzyzewski's team has harped on during its two off weeks for finals following that Ohio State loss. Namely? Better set-up before the ball even leaves a shooter's hands – even if that's as simple as making the extra pass whenever possible.

"Really, I think we were doing that except for Ohio State," Krzyzewski said postgame. "But that's gonna be the nature of our team, and especially if you can push. And our guys like it. To me, it's the most beautiful part of the game. The most beautiful part of our game is passing, and there's connecting baskets (as a result)."

Some context: Entering last week, Duke was only making 32.8 percent of its 3s. No. 182 nationally. For a team with clear national championship aspirations, shooting looked like the swing skill upon which this team's hopes would sink or swim. And through the first eight games of the year, frankly, Duke's perimeter prowess was closer to "needs pool floaties" than Michael Phelps; in just two of those first eight contests (versus Gardner-Webb and Lafayette) did Duke shoot at or better than 40 percent from 3. The season opener against Kentucky produced a 1-of-12 effort on 3s. In the second half against Ohio State, the Blue Devils went 1-of-8 from 3 and, accordingly, let the Buckeyes chip their way back from a double-digit deficit.

Duke's focus entering its finals break was on finding, and taking, better shots, especially in the halfcourt. Assistant coach Nolan Smith said after re-watching the Ohio State tape, and seeing how many missed kick-out opportunities Duke had, shot selection stood out as something in need of sharpening.

"Obviously a lot of teams going into each game are gonna say, 'We have to make Duke make shots.' But if we make the right kicks and our shots are wide open, we know we have guys who should be shooting close to 40 percent from 3," Smith said via Zoom. "But it has to be connected shots, where it's a team shot, not individually."

And then ... this week happened. Against South Carolina State, en route to scoring a season-high 103 points, Duke drained 15 of its 27 3-point attempts. Against Appalachian State two nights later, 15 made triples. (This was just the second time in program history that Duke made 15 3s in consecutive contests.) Saturday's win over Elon wasn't quite as predicated on 3-pointers – Duke's substantial size advantage over the Phoenix meant plentiful post touches, not to mention heavy minutes for the team's reserves – but the Blue Devils still made eight deep attempts.

In late November, that would've been considered a solid outing. Now, in a week's time, it seems subpar.

That says something about how Duke's offense has shifted, noticeably, in such a short period of time. The statistics back that up, too; on the season, Duke has now made 37 percent of its 3s, good for a top-50 national ranking. But how?

First, as Smith said, taking better shots. "Taking tough 2s, or taking a wide-open 3: which one is the better shot?" Smith said. "We feel like all of our guards can get their own shot, but is that the best shot?" As it turns out, usually not. Now, that's not to say Duke's individual talents cannot make tough 2s – there are likely four, if not five, first-round NBA draft picks on this roster – because they clearly can. And they did so with ease against Elon, scoring 44 points off layups (!) against a vastly undersized opponent. "We just got in the lane more today and got more layups," Keels said postgame. "So the 3-ball, we didn't really need it as much." That, though, won't be the case as early as next week, when Duke is scheduled to open conference play against Virginia Tech.

Against ACC opponents – even this year, given the sordid state of the league – Duke is going to need the 3-ball to drop. And while it would be unwise to expect this team (or any) to suddenly start draining 15 treys every night – the current Division I leader is Eastern Kentucky, which averages 13.2 made 3-pointers per game – that element of Duke's offense is critical to the rest of it functioning at full capacity. For as good as Duke's drivers are, no college player can reasonably be expected to finish against five defenders in the paint. And as Keels says, "a lot of teams are gonna pack in on us. I mean, when you've got a (guy who is) 6-10 and a 7-1, they're gonna." The 3-pointer, then, becomes the great equalizer offensively, the looming threat that forces opponents to play Duke normally on defense instead of with some gimmick.

"If you've gotta respect them from 3 all the time," said Elon coach and former Duke staffer Mike Schrage, "it's gonna be really tough."

This is not to say that suddenly Duke is suddenly going to become 3-point thirsty. Per KenPom, only 37.3 percent of the team's field-goal attempts come from behind the arc, which is just about in the middle (No. 190 nationally) of all Division I teams. So the strategy is more about making those looks as efficient as possible, and making sure they're coming from the right people.

Making the extra pass is one way to increase the odds of those deep shots dropping; that message from the finals break has seemingly gotten through, given Duke assists on 58.2 percent of its made shots, which ranks top 50 nationally per KenPom. "We could have some hockey assists in how we play," Krzyzewski adds, "and I like that." Another such way is taking those 3s when the defense isn't set to stop them – aka, in transition. Considering Duke averages 1.209 points per possession (PPP) in transition, one of its most efficient offensive settings, that idea tracks.

As Krzyzewski said after the Appalachian State win, "because we have four ball-handlers in the game and we can advance the ball very quickly and space the court, the defensive rebound can naturally lead to the open 3, if we do it the right way."

And it absolutely can, especially on cross-court passes against a scrambling, retreating opponent. Whether it be Keels, or Roach, or Wendell Moore Jr., or even Paolo Banchemo, all have been the beneficiary at times this season of missed switches or slow runbacks. Then there's the matter of who is actually taking those 3s ... and here is where we mention that, of all those listed beneficiaries, another new one is steadily inserting his way into the conversation.

A.J. Griffin's recent emergence has given the Blue Devils another perimeter scoring option. (Rob Kinnan / USA Today) That would be A.J. Griffin, Duke's second-highest ranked recruit entering this season, but someone who also hadn't played competitive basketball the last two years due to a variety of injuries; prior to this season, Griffin's last organized game came in late February of his junior year of high school. So, yeah, it has taken him some time to ramp back up to full-speed, if one could even say he's there yet. (An October knee injury set Griffin back a few extra weeks.) This week, though, Griffin has looked as much like his old self as he has thus far in college – and he very quietly is making a claim to being Duke's best 3-point shooter. It's a small sample size, yes, but Griffin has made 46.2 percent of his 3s this season, easily the best percentage on the team. That none of his makes came against Kentucky, Gonzaga, or Ohio State is important context, but also some that should be taken with a grain of salt, considering his improving health and physical fitness. But the point is, a one-time projected top-five pick is finally getting back to his old self ... and well, well, well, what do you know? The dude can still play a little.

Even beyond Griffin, Duke now has four rotation guys hitting above or around 35 percent from 3: Joey Baker (40.5 percent), Moore (38.6), Roach (36.8), and Banchemo (34.4). Those look like sustainable figures, both individually and collectively.

Getting to this point, though, did require a serious uptick in efficiency this week. And that's where those two weeks off were so valuable. Smith said he tries not to discuss he and coach-in-waiting Jon Scheyer's 2010 title team often with Duke's current players, but in this situation, he did.

"I actually mentioned that to them. I was like, in 2010, Scheyer, (Kyle) Singler, and myself, we scored together, all three of us," Smith said. "You know, one dribble-penetration, kick. We have a good core of guards that can be exactly like that, but they have to see that. They have to know that they need each other."

- » Moore has six games this season with at least 10 points, five rebounds and five assists (10-5-5 games) -- tied for the NCAA lead and the most among power conference players.

- The freshman flexed his muscle during a critical stretch in the second half with his classmate **Paolo Banchemo** getting treated for cramping.
- Banchemo left at the 17:29 mark after Kentucky had seized a 46-45 lead. When he returned six minutes later, Duke was up 63-52 thanks to Keels, who scored 10 of Duke's 18 points in that 18-6 run and assisted on a Theo John dunk as the Blue Devils took control.
- His 25 points were tied for the third most by a Duke freshman in their debut game.

### BANCHERO, MOORE MAKE HISTORY

- Banchero and junior **Wendell Moore Jr.**, became the first teammates in the NCAA in at least the last 25 years to each have 20-5-5 with no turnovers in the same game.
- The duo's history making effort came on 11/22 vs. The Citadel as Banchero had career highs in points (28) and assists (six) with eight rebounds, while Moore scored 22 with eight boards and nine dimes. Neither committed a turnover as the Blue Devils committed three turnovers as a team -- tied for the fewest in school history.
- At Duke, Moore and Banchero are the first in history to go for 20-5-5 with no turnovers, and the fourth duo to go for 20-5-5 -- the last occurrence came in 2009 when current staffers **Nolan Smith** and **Jon Scheyer** did so vs. Charlotte.
