FINAL SCORE: Virginia Tech 66, No. 24 Clemson 60

RECORDS AND NOTABLES

- Virginia Tech improves 5-1 on the season and Clemson falls 5-1.
- Tech still leads the all-time series against Clemson 22-16.
- Virginia Tech head coach Mike Young is now 3-2 versus Clemson's Brad Brownell and is 3-7 all time versus the Clemson Tigers.
- The Hokies gain their second win over a ranked team this season (No. 3 Villanova).
- Attendance was 250.
- **UP NEXT:** The Hokies will play Coppin State, taking on the Eagles (1-5) at 5:30 p.m. ET on Saturday, Dec. 19 on RSN.

TEAM NOTES

- Virginia Tech used the starting lineup of Nahiem Alleyne, Keve Aluma, Wabissa Bede, Justyn Mutts and Tyrece Radford. It marked the fourth straight game Tech has used that starting lineup and is 3-1 in those games when doing so.
- **KEY FIRST HALF RUN:** The Hokies maintained a lead over the Tigers through the entirety of the first half. Alleyne hit a 3-pointer at the 16:19 starting off Tech. Alleyne remained the leading scorer for first half securing 9-points for the Hokies.
- **KEY SECOND HALF RUN:** The Hokies started the 2nd half with an 11-point run, gaining a 16-point lead over the Tigers. Tech continues its lead over Clemson for the duration of the second half. With the Tigers securing an 11-point run, the Hokies called a timeout, ending Clemson's run. Tech gained another run finalizing the win over Clemson.
- Tech shot 40.9 percent for the game (18-for-44), 31.3 percent from 3-point range (5-for-16) and 80.6 percent from the free-throw line (25-for-31).
- The Hokies have made a 3-pointer in 571 straight games. The last time they didn't hit a 3 in a game was on Feb. 1, 2003 versus Providence.
- Tech had a season low of six second chance points

- The Hokies out-rebounded the Tigers, obtaining 33 rebounds.
- Tech had a balanced attack in the paint, outscoring the Tigers off fast breaks, on second chance points and points off turnovers.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

NAHIEM ALLEYNE

• Alleyne Scored 13 points, nine of which were points earned from three 3-pointers.

KEVE ALUMA

• Aluma scored 13 points for the Hokies, tying a career high of nine free throws.

HUNTER CATTOOR

• Cattoor was the leading rebounder for the Hokies, tallying six rebounds.

TYRECE RADFORD

• Radford was the leading scorer for the Hokies securing 15 points, his second time being the leading scorer for Tech. Radford now has four double scoring game this season.
