Virginia Tech Lacrosse Head Coach John Sung Highlights on the 2020 Schedule

On the schedule this year we've got some really exciting things. Obviously, the way our schedule lays out is a little bit different this year. Opening up at home is always nice to get a nice home game in front of us. Getting Davidson here will be a great way to open up the season. We put some teams back on our schedule that we haven't had. Obviously our JMU game is always important.

Winning the state is something that we've always talked about, making sure that we can take care of all those teams that live in Virginia is really important for us. I think if we can do that and win the state, you're going to be pretty successful. James Madison has a national championship, UVA has won championships in the past and they've been two teams that have made the tournament consistently. If we can knock James Madison off, I feel like that's been something that's been kind of on our back the whole time but every year we've gotten better and every year we've gotten closer. That's a game that's definitely circled on our schedule. We're not looking past Davidson; all of our effort right now is to be prepared for that February 8th game. Right after that, we've got to turn around and get ready for James Madison.

We've got a couple of trips planned this year. One to see Cincinnati and Louisville which I think will be a good test for us to be on the road for a couple of days and really having to prepare on the road. That's tough but that will help us when it comes down to the months of April if we've got to go on the road for ACC's I think being able to prepare and travel to have a little week like that will be good to get that under our belts.

We've got something really exciting in participating in the Crown Classic in Charlotte to play Syracuse in between two men's lacrosse games. I think that is really going to be a ton of fun, being able to have Penn State and Cornell play after us and having Limestone College and Lenoir-Rhyne play before us and kind of being a part of a day of lacrosse is going to be great.
