### **HOKIES HOST NCAA FIRST ROUND MATCH - FIRST TIME SINCE 2015**

### Tech in the NCAA postseason

- Overall, the Hokies own a 12-10-1 record in their 10 previous appearances in the NCAA Championship, which includes a 5-1-1 mark in matches played in Blacksburg.
- Friday's match will mark the fifth first round game played at home for Tech, with the Hokies posting a 3-1 mark in the prior four. The last NCAA match Tech hosted in Blacksburg resulted in a 4-0 win over Cincinnati, Nov. 14, 2015.
- Overall, the Hokies have won four straight first round matches, including last year's 1-0 upset victory at No. 4 seed and 17th-ranked Texas. They are 6-4 in their previous 10 first round battles.
- Tech is making its 11th NCAA appearance as a program, its second straight and the seventh under head coach Chugger Adair.
- In his six previous trips to the NCAAs, Adair is 10-6-1 and has just one loss in a first round match.
- Under Adair, Tech has been knocked out three times by ACC teams, twice by Big 10 foes and once by a Big EAST team - Georgetown, Nov. 11, 2012 (a 3-2 OT first round loss).
- That defeat to the Hoyas is the only loss Tech has suffered in the NCAAs in Blacksburg and are unbeaten in its last six.
- Tech has outscored its opponents 17-4 in NCAA home matches with five shutouts. In first round matches, Tech has a 12-3 edge with three clean sheets
- The Hokies have not allowed a goal in an NCAA first round match since the Hoyas overtime game winner back in 2012 (270 straight minutes).
- Tech has not allowed a goal at home in an NCAA match overall since the 63:20 mark versus No. 9 Santa Clara on Nov. 24, 2013. The Hokies held the Broncos scoreless the rest of the way and have not yielded a goal since (316:40 straight minutes).

### Tech versus the Musketeers

- All-time, the Hokies are 0-5-1 against their former Atlantic 10 opponent Xavier as the teams played each other six times from 1995-2000 with the Musketeers having won the last five.
- Putting that in perspective, not a single one of Tech's freshmen were born when the two teams faced each other the last time (Oct. 29, 2000) and sophomore Emily Gray was just 24 days old.
- Interestingly, Tech has played only one other team in its history (Florida State, 0-18-2 all-time) more than three times without ever earning a win, while they seem to struggle against New Jersey based teams (0-3 all-time versus Rutgers and Seton Hall and 0-2 against Monmouth).
- Xavier comes in ranked No. 24. All-time, Tech is 4-8-2 against teams ranked between No. 21-25, but under Chugger Adair, the Hokies are 2-1-1.

### Double figures in wins and shutouts

- Prior to 2008, Tech reached the 10-win plateau just once (2004, 11) and has since posted at least 10 victories in a season 11 times, including a nine-year stretch from 2008-16. The 12 wins this season are the most since the 2015 season.
- Chugger Adair has won at least 10 matches in eight of his nine season at Tech.
- The Hokies have 10 shutouts this year marking just the sixth time they have recorded 10+ clean sheets in a single season (2011-14, 2018-19).
- The 10 shutouts through 18 matches is tied for the second most at this point in a season with the 2011 and 2014 squads, while the 2012 team had 11 at this point and 12 after its 19th match.
- The 14 goals allowed by Tech this year are the third fewest 18 matches in (12, 2013; 13, 2014), while the 2014 squad posted a shutout in its next contest to keep its number at 13 through 19.

### **WHAT IS A HOKIE?**

Probably the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics and the answer dates back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With it came a contest held by the student body for writing a new cheer and senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull said the words had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. "Hokie" soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Below is the "Old Hokie" yell:

### JUST "VIRGINIA TECH", PLEASE!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech." Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as "Virginia Tech." VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT, VA Tech or Virginia Tech University are not recognized names and should not be used.



### Facing ranked foes, four straight, all in top 10

- This season, the Hokies completed a four-match stretch when they faced four straight ranked teams, which marked just the fifth time in program history during the regular season, the eighth time overall.
- Three times Tech played four straight, the last Sept. 16-Oct. 1, 2016 (0-3-1), while its longest was a six-match span from Sept. 23-Oct. 17, 2010 and included three straight against top 10 teams at No. 1 North Carolina (L, 2-1), No. 7 Maryland (W, 1-0) and at No. 4 Boston College (W, 2-1).
- This year's stretch marked the first time Tech faced four straight programs ranked in the Top 10.
- All-time, Tech is now 30-89-14 (133 games 27.8 win percentage) against ranked foes. Under **Chugger Adair** (nine years), the Hokies are 17-41-8 (31.3), while they were 13-47-6 (24.2) prior.

### More on the Hokies versus ranked teams

- The Hokies' 1-0 win over No. 6 Virginia last year (Sept. 27) marked the team's first victory over a top 10 program since Nov. 8, 2013 vs. No. 1 Virginia, 4-2 at the ACC Championship semifinal in Cary, N.C.
- Prior to the 2018 win, the Hokies had not beaten a ranked foe in 14 attempts since Oct. 4, 2015, when Tech went on the road and beat No. 22 Duke (4-2). The team was 0-9-5 between the two wins.
- Last season, the Hokies were 2-6-1 versus ranked teams, last beating No. 17 Texas (1-0) on the road in the first round of the NCAA Championship, while they are 0-4-1 this season.
- In its history, Tech is 11-58-5 against programs ranked in the top 10 and 5-36-3 vs. the top 5.
- Tech's last six losses, and 10-of-11, have been to ranked teams, including four times to North Carolina, who was ranked No. 3 each time three times last season, and once in 2019.
- Tech's last win on the road over a top 10 team was Oct. 24, 2012, at No. 7 Wake Forest (3-0).

### Tech success under Adair while ranked

- As a ranked team under **Chugger Adair**, the Hokies have an overall mark of 74-30-9 in 113 matches for a 69.5 winning percentage.
- As a ranked team against ranked opponents, Tech holds a 14-34-5 overall mark and are 11-26-4 under Adair. In such matches, Tech is 0-9-3 since a win at No. 22 Duke on Oct. 4, 2015.
- As a ranked team against an unranked opponent, the Hokies are 63-4-5 (91.0%) with three home losses: Nebraska (Sept. 9, 2011, 4-3, 20T), Wake Forest (Oct. 18, 2014, 1-0) and Ohio State (Sept. 1, 2016, 2-1). The fourth loss was also to the Buckeyes (Nov. 20, 2015, 1-0) at a neutral site.
- In matches against unranked opponents overall under Adair, Tech holds a mark of 100-10-12 in 122 matches for an 86.9 winning percentage.

### Tech success under Adair - non-conference

- Tech has lost just 13 non-conference matches under **Chugger Adair**, nine of those have been in the postseason six in the NCAA Championship and three in the ACC tournament.
- At Tech, Adair is 10-6-1 in the NCAA postseason and 2-3 in the ACC postseason.
- The four losses in the regular season include at Tennessee, Sept. 10, 2017 (3-1), and at Alabama, Aug. 30, 2018 (1-0). There were also two matches in Blacksburg Ohio State on Sept. 1, 2016 (2-1) and Nebraska on Sept. 9, 2011 (4-3, 20T).
- In nine seasons under Adair, Tech is 65-4-6 in nonconference regular-season matches.

### Nine straight wins/unbeaten all-time

- For the third time in program history, Tech opened its season with nine straight wins and finished its non-conference, regular-season slate perfect.
- The nine-match winning streak is tied for the second longest all-time and is also tied for the second longest unbeaten streak in program history.

### Starting Streaks for the Hokies

- During the 2018 season, five players started all 22 matches current seniors **Jordan Hemmen**, **Kelsey Irwin**, **Mandy McGlynn** and **Jaylyn Thompson**, and current sophomore **Emily Gray**.
- Only McGlynn and Thompson have extended their streaks to all 18 this season.
- Thompson currently holds the longest consecutive starts streak on the team at 68 straight matches.
- The last Tech player to start at least 60 straight was Candace Cephers (2013-15, 61).
- McGlynn's streak is the second longest, now at 59 straight starts, while Hemmen's streak ended at 50, due to missing the NC State match (Oct. 13).
- Gray became the first freshman at the school to start every match since 2013 (*Murielle Tiernan*) and was at 32 straight before missing the match at Clemson (Sept. 29) due to a season-ending injury.
- From 2013-15, Tiernan went on to start the first 55 matches of her Tech career, while *Kelsey Mitchell* (2009-12) and *Carmen Chestnut* (1998-01) are the only Hokies (min. 75 games) to start every one of their matches at Tech 88 and 77, respectively.
- In all, five players have started all 18 matches this year, which includes sophomores **Emmalee McCarter** (38 straight), **Molly Feighan** (21 total) and **Grace Sklopan** (21 total).

### Breaking into Top 10 in starts

- With a start in goal against Xavier, **Mandy McGlynn** will start the 75th match in her Tech career, good for a tie for 10th all-time at the school with *Brittany Michels* (2008-11) and *Krista Dooley* (1999-02).
- Dayle Colpitts (2010-13) is the all-time leader at the school for starts as a goalkeeper with 82.
- No player since 2016 has reached the top 10 in starts. The last two were *Murielle Tiernan* (2013-16) and *Candace Cephers* (2013-16) at 83.

# THOMPSON FIELD HOME OF THE HOKIES

Thompson Field serves as the home of the Tech men's and women's soccer teams as well as the lacrosse team. Located in the center of the Tech athletics complex, the facility ranks as one of the finest for both soccer and lacrosse in the ACC.

Located across from Lane Stadium, the Hokies' football home, Thompson Field was completed in the fall of 2003 and dedicated in 2008 in the name of Sandra D. Thompson, a longtime supporter of women's athletics at Tech.

The field is a bluegrass playing surface and measures approximately 75 by 120 yards. It is equipped with an underground irrigation and drainage system that allows for it to be ready for play quickly following rainstorms.

The athletics department has gradually made improvements since the venue opened in 2003. The most recent updates to the complex includes new light fixtures and a video board for the start of the 2019 soccer season and access to upgraded team rooms for use during pregame and halftime of matches played at Thompson Field.

In 2005, workers completed a new restroom facility for the complex, and during the summer of 2008, a new game operations center was erected atop the stadium above the grandstand.

The approximately 900-square foot facility now includes one dedicated broadcast booth for ACC Network TV broadcasts. The area also has two covered areas on each end devoted to camera operations for these broadcasts. There is a similar booth on the opposite side of the center, where working media members who are covering the Hokies have access along with the opportunity for teams to record their video as well.

In the main area of the center is a large working area for game operations, which includes the scoreboard and video board, PA, official statistics and visiting school officials.

The climate-controlled facility contains a state-ofthe-art sound system and Ethernet capability The Internet-ready facility allows Tech's official athletics website, hokiesports.com, to originate live stats of the Hokies' matches from the press box. Above the grandstand is a wired camera deck.

Between each team's bench area is the Sandy D. Thompson Press Box. Formerly the press operations center for the field, the facility is now used as a halftime room for game officials and as an auxiliary area for press and game operations. This is also were the replay monitor is housed for ACC Broadcasts.

Thompson Field, which has been expanded since it was opened, now features approximately 2,028 bench-back seats, where each fan has an unobstructed view of the playing surface. Spacious area around the field allows for nearly 1,500 more fans to watch games.

### Tech's Ironwomen

- Kelsey Irwin started 35 straight and played every minute of them until this year's home opener.
- Dating back to Sept. 4, 2017 vs. Longwood, the last match she did not start, Irwin played the final 66:05 minutes of that contest and 3,302:05 straight minutes entering the season.
- In the waning minutes of the 3-0 Liberty win (Aug. 22), Irwin was taken out for the first time in 35 contests, ending her streak at 3,386:27.
- Mandy McGlynn's consecutive minutes streak is even longer, as she has not been subbed out since Aug. 25, 2017 - vs. the College of Charleston - a string of 55 straight matches.
- McGlynn did not play the final 14 minutes against the Cougars that day, but has played every one since - a streak of 5,165:20 straight minutes.

### McGlynn school record for career shutouts

- Behind a seven-save performance against No. 10 Duke (Oct. 6), Tech's Mandy McGlynn posted the 30th shutout of her Tech career breaking the school record in the process.
- McGlynn, who has cemented her place among Tech's all-time goalkeepers, needed to make four saves in the final 10 minutes of action to preserve the shutout. Her eighth shutout of the season broke the career mark, which she had shared at 29 with Davle Colpitts (2010-13) entering the match.
- Since setting the mark, McGlynn has posted clean sheets against Wake Forest (Oct. 18) and then in Tech's last match at Pitt (10/31) to increase her career school record to 32.

### Give McGlynn a lead, Tech is almost unbeaten

- In Mandy McGlynn's first 68 career starts as Tech's goalkeeper, the team had never lost a game after giving her a lead (38-0-2).
- That streak ended against No. 5 Florida State on Oct. 10, when the Hokies led 1-0 just 10 minutes in, but lost in double overtime to the Seminoles.
- Only four other times Tech took a lead with McGlynn, and relinquished it. The Hokies went on to win two of them, while earning a tie in the other two.
- She now holds a 41-1-2 record in her career (74 starts) when Tech has taken a lead in a game.

### Opening the season with a pair of shutouts

- For only the third time in school history, the Hokies recorded back-to-back shutouts to start the season (2012, 2014), with the 2014 squad posting three.
- The 2019 squad equaled the three straight shutouts and then set the school record for longest consecutive scoreless streak (by minutes) to start a season at 326:12 before allowing the first goal of the year in the 56th minute against Auburn (Sept. 1).
- The longest scoreless streak (by minutes) to start a season prior was 322:38 in 2014. Tech lost that streak on Aug. 31 in a 3-1 win at Ohio State (goal was scored in fourth match at 52:38).

### Goalkeeper scoreless streaks to start the year

- In the 2012 and 2014 seasons, Tech's starting goalkeeper was Caroline Kelly, meaning she had held the two longest scoreless streaks to start a year.
- Her longest consecutive span of scoreless minutes is 245:49 (2012), due to a substitution in the second

half of the third match in 2014.

- That year's streak did reach 277:38 (nonconsecutive) before she allowed the first tally of the year, but she played the first 225:00 consecutively.
- Mandy McGlynn bested both of those marks, setting the a school record at 326:12 straight scoreless minutes to start a season.
- Interestingly, McGlynn has posted a shutout in the season opener all four years at the school and went at least 129 minutes of each scoreless.
- Her longest streak before this season was 171:52 that opened 2016, her freshman year.

### McGlynn is ACC Defensive Player of the Week

- Announced by the ACC on Sept. 17, Tech's Mandy McGlynn was chosen as the ACC Women's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week after helping the Hokies remain perfect on the season.
- McGlynn earned the honor after posting shutouts No. 5 and 6 of 2019 in Tech's 1-0 wins over the College of Charleston and UNCW at the Battle by the Beach in Wilmington, N.C.

### McGlynn's notable efforts to end September

- At No. 1 Virginia (Sept. 26), Mandy McGlynn held the Cavaliers scoreless until the 70:10 mark, which ended a consecutive scoreless streak of 398:33, a new program record for a single goalkeeper.
- The previous mark was held by Mallory Soldner, who posted a 383:37 straight scoreless streak from Sept. 2-Sept 14, 2003.
- At No. 9 Clemson (Sept. 29), McGlynn posted a career-high (in a 90-minute match) 11 saves, which was the most since Dayle Colpitts had 11 on Aug. 27, 2010 against No. 9 Texas A&M in a 5-3 loss.

### McGlynn ACC Defensive Player, again

- Announced by the ACC on Oct. 8, Tech's Mandy McGlynn was chosen as the ACC Women's Soccer Defensive Player of the Week after posting her eighth shutout of the year against No. 10 Duke (Oct. 6).
- The honor was the fifth of her career, which is the most ever for a soccer player at Tech. McGlynn picked up her first on Oct. 3, 2017 as a sophomore, and was twice chosen last year (Aug. 21 and Oct. 2).
- The only other Hokie with multiple selections by the ACC is Murielle Tiernan, who earned the last of her three offensive awards on Sept. 6, 2016.
- She earned the award after a seven-save, 110-minute effort against the Blue Devils, of which four came in the second OT period as Duke posted five of their 15 shots in the final 10 minutes.
- It was the 30th shutout of her career, breaking the school record she shared with Dayle Colpitts (2010-13) entering the match.
- The chart on the right displays where she currently stands in the school's record books.

### McGlynn named a Senior CLASS candidate

- Tech's goalkeeper Mandy McGlynn was named one of 30 candidates for the 2019 Senior CLASS Award for her achievements both on and off the field, the organization announced back in September.
- McGlynn was one of four keepers to be selected to the initial list and the only ACC player chosen.
- Unfortunately, the candidates were narrowed down to 10 finalists, who were all placed on the official ballot, and McGlynn was not chosen.
- The Jacksonville, Florida native was also one of 11 named to the 2019 Preseason All-ACC Women's Soccer Team (Aug. 8), voted on by the conference's coaches. She was also named to the preseason team before the 2018 season.

# **Charles "Chugger" Adair**

## **Virginia Tech Head Coach - Ninth Season**

On December 7, 2010, Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Jim Weaver announced the hiring of Tech's fourth head women's soccer coach Charles "Chugger" Adair, the associate head coach for the team the previous five seasons. The 2018 season marked Adair's 13th season in Blacksburg and his eighth year as the Hokies' head coach. In that time, he's become the all-time wins leader in program history, ending the 2018 campaign with a 106-48-18 overall record, and became just the second soccer coach at the school to reach the 100-win milestone with the team's victory at Miami on Sept. 23 (Jerry Cheynet, 238 wins, 28 seasons for Tech men's soccer). He's also just the 10th women's soccer head coach to reach the 100-win mark in the ACC.

Prior to Adair's arrival on campus, the women's program just once (2004) made the postseason - playing a match in both the ACC and NCAA tournaments. Since, the team has qualified for six ACC tournaments, playing for the conference title twice (2008 & 2013), earned eight straight bids to the NCAA championship (2008-15) and nine overall, as the Hokies made it back to the tournament in 2018. Tech

has reached the Round of 16 four times with Adair on the sidelines (2009, 2011, 2014, 2018), but enjoyed its greatest success in 2013. That record-setting season included the Hokies posting a school-record 19 wins (most by any soccer team at the school), playing for the ACC title and advancing to the NCAA College Cup, where their season ended with a 3-2 loss to Florida State in a national semifinal game.

Along with the great strides the Hokies have made on the field, the Tech women's soccer program is also known for producing outstanding students who are major contributors off of it. Each year, the Hokies boast a high team grade point average and have student-athletes who compete for state, regional and national academic recognition. In fact, during the 2017-18 academic season, the team posted a program-tying best ever team GPA of 3.53 in the spring semester. Also, in the past three years, Ashley Meier (2015) and Alani Johnson (2017) have received an ACC Postgraduate Scholarship, with Meier also earning an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship as well. Lastly, in 2018, Heather Timothy became Tech's sixth women's soccer player to earn the Skelton Award for Academic Excellence in Athletics - the highest designation handed out by the Tech athletics department

In his eight seasons at Tech, Adair has led his program to a winning record each year, but saw a streak of double-digit win totals come to an end in 2017 as the team posted a 7-6-5 mark, with the five ties setting a program record. Despite an 11-win season in 2016 - the team's ninth straight year with at least 10 wins - the Hokies saw their eight-year run of making the NCAA championship come to an end.

In 2018, Tech returned to the 11-win mark and the NCAA tournament and reached the Round of 16. Along the way, the Hokies were one of two teams to knock off a nationally-seeded team in the opening round - defeating No. 17 Texas (a four seed) 1-0 in Austin, Texas - the Longhorns lone home loss of the year. Another 1-0 victory, this one in double overtime, in round two over Arkansas advanced Tech to its fourth ever Sweet 16. The Hokies ended the year ranked in two major polls - 21st by the United Soccer Coaches and 23rd by Top Drawer Soccer. Adair was also on the sidelines as the Hokies played the program's 500th career match (August 19 versus Georgetown) and recorded its 250th career victory (Sept. 23 at Villanova).

In 2015, the Hokies went 15-4-2 and won their opening round game in the NCAA championship, while in the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the third time in school history. During that season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62, and fewest goals allowed in a season, surrendering just 18, and reached a program-best No. 2 ranking in the country after starting the season at 10-0-0.

In their record-setting 2013 campaign, the Hokies beat three ranked teams during the regular season and then blew out then-No. 1 Virginia 4-2 in the ACC Tournament semifinals. They added two more ranked foes to their list of conquests when they downed West Virginia 1-0 and knocked off Santa Clara by advancing on penalty kicks in the NCAA Championships. The Hokies were a No. 1 seed in the tournament and hosted four games in Blacksburg. The Hokies scored a then school-record 56 goals, breaking the mark of 45 set by the 2012 team, and shut out 12 opponents, tying the mark also set by the 2012 squad. They finished the season with a school-best No. 4 ranking in the country.

In 2012, Adair, in his second season as the head coach, led the Hokies to a 13-6-1 record, which marked the program's fifth straight 10-win season. Tech's six losses were the fewest in program history, at the time, and 12 of the 13 wins were shutouts. The team started 9-0-0, climbing into the Top 10 in the national rankings for the first time in school history, reaching the No. 8 spot in late September. The Hokies played host to their first NCAA Championship game in Blacksburg, as they welcomed No. 14 Georgetown to Thompson Field, though it resulted in a 3-2 loss in overtime.

In Adair's first season as the head coach (2011), Tech matched its best finish in program history (at the time), making it all the way to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Championship. Adair led the Hokies to a 14-8-1 overall record, which included 11 shutouts.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under previous head coach Kelly Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since. In 2008, the Hokies advanced to the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time, falling to North Carolina 3-0, and in 2009, the Hokies won 16 games, then a school record, and earned a final ranking of No. 12.

Adair came to Tech after holding the associate head coaching position at UC Santa Barbara for two seasons. While at UCSB, his role involved all aspects of the soccer program, including recruiting, coaching, scouting, player management, community relations and camps. Prior to his arrival at UCSB, he worked a six-year stint as Youth Soccer Coach/ Assistant Director of Competitive Older Ages for the Del Mar Sharks.

He served as an assistant for the University of San Diego's men's soccer team from 1998-2000. From there, he spent a season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at Pacific University in Portland, Ore.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team. He also spent time playing for the San Diego Sockers, Wichita Wings, Portland Timbers, San Diego Flash, Minnesota Thunder, Seattle Sounders, Milwaukee Wave, Carolina Dynamo and A.A. Ghent (Belgium) from 1993-2003.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate. He also has two other daughters Alexandra and Madeline, and a son Jack.

### In 2018 Tech games, scoring first was critical

- In Tech matches last season, only once did the team that scored the day's first goal not go on to win the match, and that was then-No. 22 Georgetown, which resulted in a 1-1 draw on Aug. 19.
- Since then, the team that scored the match's first goal was 19-0, with the Hokies holding an 11-0 record while the opponents were 8-0, with one double overtime 0-0 tie in the mix (Sept. 2 at Georgia).
- In fact, once the first goal of a match had been netted, the team who scored never relinquished the lead and had gone on to register a shutout in 15 of those contests, with Tech earning eight of them.
- In all, Tech and its opponents combined for 19 shutouts in 22 matches (Tech 10, Opp 9) during the 2018 season, which surpassed the most prior of 17 in 2011 (Tech 11, Opp 6).
- Last year, when the Hokies scored a goal, they are 11-1-1. This season, the Hokies are 12-2-1 when scoring a goal and have been shutout just three times.

### That trend ended against Yale

- Through five matches this season, the 2018 trends continued, as Tech scored first in each, never gave up the lead, won all five while posting four shutouts.
- So, the team scoring first, in a Tech game, had won 25 straight matches with 19 shutouts.
- That ended Sept. 8, when Yale took a 1-0 lead into halftime. **Nicole Kozlova** would score twice in the second half as the Hokies pulled out the 2-1 victory.
- It was the first comeback win for Tech since Oct. 15, 2017 at Notre Dame, when the Hokies scored twice in the second half after trailing 1-0 at the break.
- Between the two Tech comebacks, a span of 30 matches, the team that netted the first goal was 26-0-1 (with three double overtime ties).

### Yale takes first lead on Tech

- It's worth noting, the Yale goal in the 32nd minute marked the first time this season the Hokies had trailed in a match.
- In fact, except against the Bulldogs, Tech held at least a one-goal lead heading into the intermission during its nine-game winning streak.
- The latest goal scored by Tech in a match, in that stretch minus Yale, was against Cincinnati (Aug. 25) with just 1:23 left before the break.
- No. 1 Virginia then shut out the Hokies (Sept. 26) for the first time this season, while No. 9 Clemson held Tech without a goal until the 88th minute.
- Kozlova's goal in the 65th minute evened the match against Yale, meaning Tech had trailed for only 32:24 seconds its entire non-conference season.
- Below is a breakdown for Tech (minutes and percentage) in non-conference matches and overall.

### Timely scoring for Hokies as well

- This season, Tech has outscored its opponents by a 26-14 count with the Hokies netting 13 goals in each half compared to 5/8 for its foes.
- Of note, though, it's also the timeliness of Tech's goals, which has helped the team to its 12 wins and two ties this season.

### Team attack on offense

- A total of 11 different Tech players have scored this season, with eight Hokies having registered a game winner three players have at least two.
- Twelve Hokies have recorded an assist this year and, in all, 15 Tech players have at least one point.
- The last team with more than 10 players with at least one goal was the 2014 squad (14), while in 2014 and 2016, 17 players had at least one point.
- Lastly, no during no season has Tech had nine players score a game winner as this year's team tied the 2013 for the most ever with eight.

### Mance scores three times in four matches

- **Mikayla Mance** scored a goal in each of Tech's first two wins in the opening weekend of the season.
- Her first goal came in the 30th minute against Liberty (Aug. 22), the first insurance tally, in a 3-0 victory. It was her first goal since Sept. 7, 2017.
- Against Cincinnati (Aug. 25), just 83 seconds before halftime, Mance gave Tech a 1-0 lead with her second of the weekend, and the third of her career.
- Mance became the first Tech player to score a goal in the first two games of the season since *Murielle Tiernan* started off the 2015 campaign by scoring a goal in the first three matches of the season.

### **Seniors carry Tech in Athens**

- Seniors **Lilly Weber** and **Bridget Patch** scored both goals in Tech's 2-0 win at Georgia (Aug. 30), while senior **Jaylyn Thompson** and graduate **Kelsey Irwin** had the two assists.
- **Mikayla Mance** and Irwin each scored against Auburn (Sept. 1) in a 3-1 win, with Mance netting the game winner (the third of her career), as seniors accounted for 4-of-5 goals tallied and 2-of-4 assists

### Two goals in one match

- Against Yale on Sept. 8, Tech faced its first deficit of the season, trailing 1-0. However, **Nicole Kozlova** found the back of the net twice in the second half to lift the Hokies to the 2-1 victory.
- Kozlova became the first player since **Kelsey Irwin** to score a brace for Tech. Irwin scored her two at Villanova on Sept. 7 of last year in a 3-0 victory.

### Irwin notches second career brace

- Trailing 1-0 with just 15 minutes left against Boston College (Oct. 24), **Kelsey Irwin** turned the deficit into a 2-1 victory with two goals in a span of eight minutes (75:28 and 83:22) both on free kicks.
- Her first, from 22 yards out to the left side of the goal, was shot over the wall and into the near post to tie the match. Her second, from 30 yards out on the right side of goal was sent to the far post, almost the exact same spot, giving Tech the lead with 6:38 left.
- For Irwin, it was her second and third goals of the season and gave her eight for her career.
- Candace Cephers was the last Hokie to tally a pair of goals faster vs. Mississippi State (Aug. 21, 2016) just 47 seconds apart. The first was a penalty kick at 88:18, the second was a header off (ironically) an Irwin free kick (89:05).

- Murielle Tiernan was the last Hokie to score a pair of goals faster in an ACC match, at Syracuse (Oct. 23, 2014) 4:21 apart (12:04 and 16:25).

### Back-to-back game-winning goals

- In scoring the game winner vs. Yale (Sept. 8), **Nicole Kozlova**, who also had the game winner against Alabama (Sept. 5), became the first Hokie to score back-to-back game winners since 2016, but it was the 11th time since 2010 (by eight players).
- Tech's *Alani Johnson* was the last one to net back-to-back game winners, scoring hers on Aug. 26-28.

### **Kozlova is ACC Offensive Player of the Week**

- Announced by the ACC on Sept. 10, Tech's **Nicole Kozlova** was selected as the ACC Women's Soccer Offensive Player of the Week after helping the Hokies remain perfect on the season with a pair of wins over Alabama (Sept. 5) and Yale (Sept. 8).
- She was the first Tech field player to earn an ACC Player of the Week honor since *Murielle Tiernan*, who earned the last of her three on Sept. 6, 2016.
- Kozlova is the third Tech freshman to garner the award since the Hokies joined the ACC. Ashley Stinson was the first, being named on Sept. 4, 2004, while Marika Gray was chosen on Sept. 10, 2007.

### Back-to-back-to-back game winners

- Just a week after Kozlova's efforts, **Emily Gray** equaled Kozlova's feat of scoring back-to-back game winners, when she did it for the Hokies at the Battle by the Beach in Wilmington, N.C.
- Gray scored her first two goals of the season, the first against the College of Charleston (Sept. 13) and the second vs. UNCW (Sept. 15) in 1-0 wins over both teams, to help Tech to the 2-0 weekend.
- With the performance, Gray was named the MVP of the tournament as the Hokies won the event. **Jordan Hemmen, Grace Sklopan** and **Mandy McGlynn** joined her on the all-tournament team.
- Gray then matched Kozlova's brace with one of her own in Tech's 2-0 ACC home-opening win over Miami (Sept. 21), including another game winner.
- She became the first Hokie to score goals in three straight matches since *Murielle Tiernan*, who scored in five straight from Sept. 19 through Oct. 8, 2015.
- Gray also became the first Tech player to score three straight game-winning goals *Murielle Tiernan*, four straight from Sept. 24-Oct. 8, 2015.

### **Kozlova converts PK at Clemson**

- In the closing minutes of Tech's loss at No. 9 Clemson (Sept. 29), **Jordan Hemmen** was fouled inside the box on a free kick, awarding the Hokies their first penalty kick since 2017 (*Alani Johnson, Sept. 21, at Pitt, missed*).
- **Nicole Kozlova** converted her attempt to avoid the shutout and, in turn, scored Tech's first PK in five tries (Tech had converted 23-of-25 penalty kicks prior to an 0-for-5 stretch since the last make).
- Candace Cephers was the last Hokie to convert a PK, on Aug. 21, 2016 against Mississippi State.

### Feighan and McCarter are dual threats

- With her output this season, **Molly Feighan** became the first Tech player to register three or more goals and assists in a single season since 2015 *Ashley Meier* (6g, 5a).
- **Emmalee McCarter** matched Feighan's output in Tech's last match at Pittsburgh, scoring her third goal of the year off a corner which held for the game winner.
- The pair have each scored three times and dished out four assists for 10 points.

- Of note, Feighan's goal in the 10th minute versus Florida State (Oct. 10) was the team's first against the Seminoles since Oct. 12, 2014 (Kallie Peurifoy).
- It also gave the Hokies their first lead over Florida State since Dec. 6, 2013 when *Ashley Manning* gave Tech a 1-0 lead in the 32nd minute in the College Cup semifinal match.

### One assist in three straight matches

- **Molly Feighan** became the sixth Hokie this decade to register at least one assist in three straight matches, and the first since *Katie Yensen*, who accomplished the feat from Sept. 12-19, 2014.
- Tech's last player with an assist in four straight matches was *Jazmine Reeves* from Aug. 28-Sept. 9, 2011. She actually had six in those four contests.
- Tech's all-time leader in assists, *Julian Johnson* (2006-09, 31) holds the record, as she went six straight matches with an assist (Aug. 25-Sept. 10, 2006), notching eight in that span.

### Two assists in one match

- **Emmalee McCarter** tallied a pair of assists in Tech's season-opening win over Liberty (Aug. 22), marking the first Hokie to have two assists in a match since **Lilly Weber** had two in a 2-0 win over James Madison on Aug. 28, 2016.

### Gray tallies fastest goal since 2014

- **Emily Gray** scored her first of the year against the College of Charleston (Sept. 13) in the first match of the Battle by the Beach in Wilmington, N.C.
- Her tally came 4:57 into the contest which held for the game winner in Tech's 1-0 win over the Cougars.
- It was the fastest goal scored by a Tech player since *Murielle Tiernan* found the back of the net in 2:27 in a match against Georgetown (Nov. 21, 2014).

### Quick goal to start the season

- **Molly Feighan** scored the first goal of her career to open the Liberty contest (Aug. 22) just 8:43 into the match and it held for her first game winner as well.
- It was the fastest goal to start a season since 2014, when *Shannon Mayrose* found the back of the net at the 6:33 mark in Tech's 6-0 season-opening win vs. VCU, ironically, on Aug. 22 as well.
- During the 2018 season, Tech scored two goals faster than Feighan's, **Kelsey Irwin's** game-winner (5:38) versus Notre Dame (Oct. 18) and **Allyson Brown's** game-winner (8:32) at Miami (Sept. 23).

### First-time goal scorers in 2019

- In all, five Hokies have tallied their first collegiate goal this year, including **Mak Graham** in the season opener, the third in the 3-0 win over Liberty (Aug. 22).
- **Nicole Kozlova** had the second in a 2-0 victory against Cincinnati (Aug. 25), **Emmalee McCarter** had the first of the day in a 3-1 victory over Auburn (Sept. 1) and **Grace Sklopan** tallied the game winner in a 1-0 win versus Wake Forest (Oct. 18).

### First-time assisters in 2019

the season opener versus Liberty (Aug. 22), the firsts of their Tech careers.

- In Athens, senior **Jaylyn Thompson** recorded her first collegiate point with an assist on the gamewinning goal against Georgia (Aug. 30).
- **Nicole Kozlova** (vs. College of Charleston, Sept. 13) and **Grace Sklopan** (vs. Florida State, Oct. 10) have also tallied their first collegiate assists this year.

### Tech in season and home openers

- Overall, the Hokies are now 17-7-3 in season openers, are unbeaten in 11 straight (10-0-1; had won nine straight before last year's season-opening 0-0 tie to San Diego) and are 8-0-1 under head coach **Chugger Adair**.
- In home openers, Tech is 8-0-1 under Adair and is unbeaten in 19 straight (15-0-4; had won 11 in a row before last year's home-opening draw) dating back to 2001. Overall, the team has posted a 21-2-4 mark in home openers, losing just the 1993 and 2000 home openers.
- The Hokies are unbeaten at 7-0-3 when their season opener coincides with their home opener.
- In nine seasons under Adair, Tech has outscored its opponents 25-2 in season openers and 31-3 in home openers.

### Tech results in ACC openers - overall, at home

- In its 16 years in the league, the Hokies are now 5-10-1 in ACC openers, which includes ending a four-match losing streak with their 2-0 win over Miami (Sept. 21).
- Before that win, Tech was outscored 10-1 in its last four openers, however, those were at No. 7 Florida State (3-0, 2018), at No. 4 Duke (3-0, 2017), at No. 4 Virginia (2-0, 2016) and versus No. 3 North Carolina (2-1, 2015).
- In ACC home openers, the Hokies are now 8-7-1, which included a 1-0 win last year over No. 6 Virginia and now three matches against Miami, which includes a 5-0 win in 2005 and a 1-1 tie in 2007.
- The Hokies are 4-4 in matches when the ACC opener is also their home opener
- Overall, Tech has been outscored 27-17 in openers, but hold a 26-22 edge in ACC home openers.
- When facing an unranked foe in ACC openers, the Hokies are 4-0 (9-1 scoring advantage) and are 5-0-1 (16-2) in ACC home openers.

### Hokies played three straight overtime matches

- After not playing a single overtime match through its first 11 contests, the Hokies had gone to overtime in three straight, including two double overtime games against a pair of top 10 programs.
- Their last one, at NC State, ended just 2:48 into the first overtime session as severe thunderstorms halted play. After more than one hour of waiting, the decision was made to call the game.
- The three straight overtime matches were the most since Tech played in four straight overtime games from Oct. 9-23, which all went to double overtime.
- The Hokies won at Boston College (3-2), tied both Louisville (1-1) and No. 14 Notre Dame (0-0) and then lost at Miami (2-1).

### **Hokies success in August**

- In its history, Tech now holds an overall mark of 44-9-8 in matches played in the month of August, including marks of 25-1-6 at home, 13-7-0 on the road and 6-1-2 in neutral site matches.
- The last time Tech lost in August before last year at Alabama (1-0, Aug. 30) was a neutral site game

- vs. Long Beach State (2-1) on Aug. 29, 2010 at the Aggieland Invitational Tournament in College Station, Texas.
- Their previous road loss was two days earlier, against the host Texas A&M Aggies on Aug. 27 (5-3).
- Tech's lone home loss in the month was back on Aug. 27, 2000 - 3-2 to Seton Hall. The team is now unbeaten in its last 30 matches at home in the month.

### First time opponents in 2019

- Tech scheduled two new opponents for the 2019 season which the team had never faced before.
- The Hokies and Auburn Tigers battled for the first time on Sept. 1 at a neutral site in Athens, Georgia one of three SEC opponents for Tech this year. The Hokies came away victorious, 3-1.
- A week later (Sept. 8), Tech welcomed Yale to Blacksburg, the first ever lvy League school to face the Hokies. Tech eventually pulled out a 2-1 comeback win over the Bulldogs.

### **Battling the SEC**

- For the second straight year, the Hokies faced three SEC opponents, however this year it was scheduled. Last season, the Hokies played two in the regular season and third in the NCAA's second round.
- Dating back to that victory over Arkansas in 2018, Tech is now winners of four straight against the SEC, its longest stretch against the conference.

### Home weekend draws impressive crowds

- Helped out by move-in day in Blacksburg for Virginia Tech's largest freshman class ever, Tech's home opener on Aug. 22 against Liberty, a 3-0 victory, brought out the fourth largest crowd in Thompson Field history at 1,667 fans.
- The crowd for the following Sunday's game was a bit less, announced at 863, however that figure was still greater than any home attendance during the 2018 season, and would have been the third largest crowd to watch a Tech women's soccer match last year behind the 976 fans at Louisville (Oct. 25) and the 932 at Georgia (Sept. 2).

- Tech is averaging close to 1,000 fans a game this year, the most since the 2014 season, when the average attendance was 1.052.
- Side note: the announced crowd at this year's Georgia match (Aug. 20) in Athens was 1,687.

### Hokies finished preseason with 2-0 record

- Tech played two scrimmages during the preseason and won both, shutting out Marshall 3-0 on Aug. 10 and defeating George Mason 2-1 on Aug. 17.
- At Thompson Field against the Thundering Herd, the Hokies held a 10-2 advantage in shots in the first half but the match was scoreless at the break.
- Holly Weber quickly changed that scoring 1:42 after the break and then 83 seconds later to put the Hokies up 2-0. Her first goal was off a pass from Mikayla Mance and Emily Gray set up the second.
- **Allyson Brown** provided the final tally five minutes later, off her own rebounded shot.
- Tech played three of its goalkeepers, with **Mandy McGlynn** getting a bulk of the time (42 minutes) and making a save, while **Alice Hamel** played 28 minutes and **S.A. Phillips** closed the game with one save.

- At George Mason, Tech needed a game winner from **Emma Steigerwald**, assisted by **Sydney Ash**, to break a 1-1 tie and leave Fairfax with the win.
- Stats were not kept in the match, however, **Emmalee McCarter** opened the evening's scoring in the second half as she scored the Hokies' first goal, assisted by **Molly Feighan**.
