**GREENSBORO, N.C.** – For the third year in a row, North Carolina has been chosen as the ACC volleyball preseason favorite in a vote by the league's 15 head coaches.

It was unanimous as the reigning ACC Champion Tar Heels garnered all 14 first-place votes and 196 points. Coaches were not allowed to include their own team in their predicted order of finish.

#### LAST TIME OUT

- Performing at their best out the gate, numerous Hokies stepped up and achieved career highs in guiding Tech to the Pepsi Panther Invitational title.
- First-year head coach Jill Wilson started the year off 3-0 and saw three players make the All-Tournament Team - Stacey Christy, Rhegan Mitchell and Kaity Smith.
- · Down 2-1 in its final match against Milwaukee entering set four, Tech dug deep and won 25-21 and used that momentum to win the final set, 15-10. to claim the tournament crown.
- · When it mattered most, in the fifth set, the Hokies defense came to play holding the Panthers to a .050 hitting clip.
- Three Hokies paced Tech against UWM posting 10-plus kills in Smith (20), Christy (13) and Jaila Tolbert (13), while Mitchell, the tournament's MVP. tallied 56 assists.

#### **CAREER HIGHS FOR DAYS**

- The first week of the season was quite the start for returners on the Virginia Tech squad as five players set new career highs at the Pepsi Panther Invitational in Milwaukee.
- · Libero Carol Raffety achieved career bests in assists (7) and service aces (4) against Milwaukee.
- · Middle blocker Stacey Christy posted a career-high 11 kills in the opener and followed it up in the third match with a new career-high 13 kills. Christy also had a career-high six blocks.
- · Middle blocker Cara Cunningham tallied a Virginia Tech career-high 12 kills versus SDSU.
- · Right side hitter Jaila Tolbert earned her first-ever ace against SDSU.
- Setter Rhegan Mitchell opened up the season with a career-high 65 assists against Idaho State.

#### **SOMETHING ABOUT OPENERS**

- · Rhegan Mitchell has had her A-game in back-toback years in the opening match, setting new career highs in the 2016 and 2017 openers.
- She posted 57 kills against Appalachian State on Aug. 26, 2016 and followed it up with 65 versus Idaho State on Aug. 25, 2017.
- The 65-kill performance against Idaho State also included 14 assists, marking her first double-double of the season and the 11th in her storied

#### A DEBUT FOR THE AGES

- Freshman Kaity Smith placed her self in the record books on Aug. 25 when she led the Hokies to a 3-2 victory over Idaho State.
- · Smith's 30 kills against the Bengals did the following in Tech's storied history:
- · Most ever in a debut since the NCAA implemented rally scoring in 2001.
- Second freshman in school history to have over 30 kills in a match in their first season. Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Famer Lisa Pikalek racked up 38 against Southern Miss on Nov. 7, 1992.
- Tied for the seventh-most kills in Hokie history.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**

• Tech collected 18 blocks against Milwaukee as defense led the way to winning the Pepsi Panther Invitational.

- It marked the first time Tech has done so since it tallied 18 against Virginia on Sept. 30, 2016.
- · Four players had four or more blocks Cara Cunningham (5), Stacey Christy (6), Ester Talamazzi (4) and Jaila Tolbert (4).

#### THE SIX

- Virginia Tech is one of six schools from the Atlantic Coast Conference which went perfect opening weekend
- The following schools accomplished the feat -Duke, No. 15 Florida State, Miami, Notre Dame, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest.
- · On the losing end, Louisville, No. 16 North Carolina and NC State went winless opening weekend, however, the three teams did play three ranked opponents in No. 2 Minnesota, No. 6 Wisconsin and No. 9 Kansas.

#### **ACC RANKS**

- The Hokies currently sit atop three statistics in the ACC as a team and one player does indiviually in the conference.
- · Assists per set (13.62), hitting percentage (.353) and kills per set (14.38).
- Redshirt senior Stacey Christy leads all ACC players in hitting percentage with .462.

#### **RETURNING NUMBERS FOR HOKIES**

• To open the 2017 season, Virginia Tech returns almost all of its assists and blocking personnel, but will need a push in the kills department with departing outside hitters Amanda McKinzie and Lindsey Owens.

#### THE SCHEDULE

- Of the 25 teams on Tech's schedule this fall, 12 squads posted 20-plus win seasons last year.
- Of the 12, four made the NCAA Tournament and 11 finished in the top-100 in RPI.

#### **RACKING IT UP**

- · With trips to the states of Wisconsin, Arkansas and West Virginia for non-conference tournaments, the Hokies will rack up over 1,600 miles of travel.
- The closest of the three trips is to Huntington, West Virginia (190 miles), where Tech will play on the campus of Conference USA member Marshall.

#### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

• Tech will play its first 13 of 15 matches on the road and won't host its first conference match until Oct. 6.

#### **FALL FAMILY WEEKEND**

- On Oct. 6 when Virginia Tech takes on Louisville in its first home conference match of the season, will be Tech's annual Fall Family Weekend. Additionally, it will be the first time first-year head coach Jill Lytle Wilson coaches against an ACC opponent on her home floor.
- Some of the highlights of the weekend include President Tim Sands' state of the university address, family movie night in Lane Stadium, open houses and information sessions.

#### What's a Hokie?



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".


#### **HOKIES IN SEASON OPENERS**

#### MAROON VS ORANGE SCRIMMAGE

- The inaugural scrimmage took place on Saturday, Aug. 19, as the Hokies split up into two teams in front of their home fans. The Orange team won 4-0.
- It was the first time the five newcomers saw action and they did not disappoint with outside hitters Kaity Smith (15 kills) and Ester Talamazzi (12 kills) posting strong performances and middle blockers Kai Young (three solo blocks) and Marisa Cerhio (six kills) standing tall. Libero Kylie Thomas tallied 10 digs, respectively.
- · Junior Jaila Tolbert had a match-high 18 kills.

#### **BACK FOR MORE**

- · Last year for Haley Price didn't go as smooth as she would have hoped, as the libero and defensive specialist had season-ending surgery on her hips prior to the first match.
- Price, a four-year letterwinner at Sullivan South High School in Tennessee, performed well her freshman year in 2015 by posting two assists, six service aces and 11 digs in 15 matches played.

#### **PRO CIRCUIT**

- · Announced on Aug. 24, alum Amanda McKinzie ('17) signed with VBC Val-de-Travers located in Couvet, Switzerland, to play professional volleyball.
- The outside hitter is the second pro to come out of Tech in the last two years. Kennedy Bryan ('16) plays

in Palmi, Italy, for the club Golem Volley.

 McKinzie is just the latest as 12 former Tech volleyball student-athletes have played pro in the last decade.

#### **DOUBLING DOWN**





Jill Lytle Wilson was named the head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball program on Jan. 12, 2017.

Wilson joins the Hokies after an extremely successful run on the bench in LSU where, as the recruiting coordinator, she signed five top-30 recruiting classes according to PrepVolleyball.com. She also helped lead the Tigers to six NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2009 SEC Championship, as well as 25-win seasons in 2007, 2009 and 2010. The Tigers averaged over 20 wins per season during her time on the LSU staff.

"We are excited to welcome Jill and her husband, Jared, to Virginia Tech," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said after the announcement of her hiring. "Jill served as an integral component of an LSU program that became a perennial NCAA tournament team during her tenure in the highly-competitive Southeastern Conference. We heard from some of the most respected coaches in the country about Jill's many talents, and their sentiments were very consistent that the school that recruited her away from her alma mater was going to be fortunate to have Jill lead their volleyball program."

Along with her reputation as a staunch recruiter, Lytle Wilson helped produce 15 All-SEC selections, four American Volleyball Coaches Association All-South Region First Team picks and an AVCA First Team All-American and SEC Player of the Year in middle blocker Brittnee Cooper.

No stranger to the ACC, Wilson was an assistant at North Carolina from 2002-04 before serving as the top assistant at Wake Forest in 2006. She coached two All-Americans, an ACC Player of the Year and helped lead the Tar Heels to the 2002 regular season ACC Championship and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance. With the Demon Deacons, Wilson trained outside and right side hitters along with assisting in recruiting prospective student-athletes and organizing all team travel.

Lytle Wilson broke into coaching in 2001 as a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin. The Skyhawks finished the campaign with a 24-7 record and won the Ohio Valley Conference regular season championship.

A four-year starter at outside hitter at LSU from 1997-2000, Wilson ranked sixth in the SEC with 23 service aces during her senior campaign that also saw the Tigers appear in the 2000 SEC Tournament finals.

Lytle Wilson exemplified the Virginia Tech spirit of Ut Prosim while she was a student-athlete. She was the Tigers' representative on the women's at-large SEC Good Works Team in 1999-00 and she was named the LSU Student-Athlete Volunteer of the Year in 2000.

The Richmond, Texas, native graduated from LSU with a B.S. in business administration with concentration in pre-law. While at UT-Martin, Wilson pursued graduate studies in health and human performance.
