

Virginia Tech Baseball Head Coach John Szefc Q&A Highlights Game Two Saturday, June 11

Opening statement:

"I think obviously—probably a really fun game to watch for a lot of people. [The game had] a lot of offense, a lot of different pitching changes. I think it was like an exercise in toughness for our guys. They showed you how tough they are [and] how good they are, again. They've been showing that for a long time. A lot of different contribution [from] DeMartini, Hunter and Biddison. Hurney was tremendous, among others. Higgins was good, too. We've got a lot of guys that contribute, but again, you don't get to this stage with one or two guys. Just happy for our guys that we get to host a game three at our place. [I'm] happy for the fans [and] I really look forward to tomorrow.

On what his message is to the team:

I just keep saying the same thing. Advice-wise, if you get caught up in the emotion that Carson's talking about, you're done. We've got a lot of stale toast in our dugout. Stale, dry toast. The drier the toast, the better the performance. If you're going to go up and down on a roller coaster or a ferris wheel, it's not going to be good.

On Biddison's early homerun setting the tone:

I mean, it was good that that happened and it takes a little bit of the air out of the balloon so to speak. A guy like Nick [Biddison] has been here before in these types of situations and he can handle whatever you throw at him situation-wise, but it was in the first inning and we've got a long way to go in a game like this. This is every bit of a marathon, as any one of these NCAA Tournament games are, but it was important for us to get off to a good start. He gave us that good start and it was good from there.

We're just gonna try to stay on the same ride, not on the roller coaster of emotions, just as plain as possible."
