

Virginia Tech Baseball
Head Coach John Szefc Q&A Highlights
Game Three
Sunday, June 11

Opening statement:

"Well, first off, I just want to congratulate Oklahoma. They're a very good team, very well coached by Coach Johnson and their staff. I'll give them a lot of credit and they're just very good. This is the only home series we lost the whole year, so I give them credit. I want to thank our administration for running a first-class event here, from a regional last week to a Super Regional this week. I know our players and our coaches and everybody in our team greatly appreciate what they did to put this event on and keep us at home in a first lass manner. Lastly, I would just really thank our players. I don't even really know what to say about this group of guys. I've been around some pretty good teams over the years and every team is somewhat special in their own way. This one, I got a real problem with this season ending. Eventually it ends, I get that, but this group of guys is a very special group of guys. Not necessarily just how they play the game, but who they are. They've really changed me a little bit as a coach, as far as how I go about things and how I handle young players. So, in that respect, I really have to thank them and I will thank them in about a half hour here. It's been a very good year for our team; we won the ACC championship, we won a regional here, we went to the final of the Super Regional. We're playing a home game on June 12. I've never done that before in 30-something years, so it's been a very good year for our players. I know it stinks right now, but eventually they will look back on this very, very fondly.

On the bullpen running out of gas:

"That's a good point you bring up there. I don't think we really had to lean on any one pitcher in that pen. I think throughout the year we didn't use the pen all that much throughout the whole year so we could go to the tank when we needed to. We had to go to the pen pretty early. It's tough because you're facing a really good team. I think our guys were pretty effective in how they pitched the last couple of days, but it just didn't happen today. I don't know whether it was guys being tired or not. That didn't help obviously, but it wasn't like we had a whole lot of traffic on the basis. Give their guys credit, their pitchers are very good. They pitch and play defense. Every ball we hit seemed like it was in a shift or Pettis made that diving catch. Gavin hits one on two strikes and it dies right at the wall. Their two strikes ones we're leaving the park with the wind going out. It just seemed like everything that could have gone negative for us today did. One negative, It seemed like the opposite for those guys. That's gonna happen from time to time, unfortunately, and it happened to us today."



On continuing to be successful:

"If we're not losing a good chunk of players in the draft, we're not doing our job as coaches. We fully expect to lose a half dozen or so guys. That's just the way things are but you have to plan for that. College baseball is tough because the draft is not till July so you don't know exactly what's going to happen. It'll get done one way or another. We figured it out with this group and they were awesome. The coaching staff we have are incredible. I wouldn't trade any single one for anybody. They're very good at what they do in their area. There's no way we have the success we have without those guys preparing these guys to play. I will go to the wire with that statement."

On the legacy of this team:

"When I came here I knew what the legacy of the 2013 team was. I was able to watch them play when I was at Maryland. I knew how good they were and what they had accomplished. I think everyone within our baseball program has always respected that group. As we still do, but I think every future player, coach, etc. will look back at this year with a very high reverence. When these guys come back to work out and to talk you're gonna roll the red carpet out for these guys. They set a humongously high standard that you strive for a long time. The last time I had a team like this was eight years ago with Maryland and every time I talk to those guys it's special. It will be the same way with these guys."

On the team changing him:

"I think over time, as a coach, you get older and the players get younger. In the past maybe I made the mistake of being too businesslike, so to speak. This team brought me back to being a lot more personal with our players. I spent more time doing things off the field, having more conversations with them. I'm very thankful for this group of guys. They've really helped me personally. I think they probably changed me a little bit as a person, certainly as a coach, but I think definitely as a person. I don't know a whole lot of 50 plus year old guys that can say that. Once you get to be our age, you kind of get set in your ways. These guys changed my ways in a very good way and that's something I'm really thankful for."
