OPENING TIPS

SERIES HISTORY AGAINST GARDNER-WEBB

- » Virginia Tech boasts a record of 5-0 against the Runnin' Bulldogs with their last meeting ending in a 73-39 result on Dec. 6, 2020.
- » This game marks Virginia Tech's first matchup against a Big South opponent this season. The Hokies are currently 9-0 all-time versus Big South teams
- » Gardner-Webb and Virginia Tech have never faced each other with their current head coaches, as this marks the first season for Gardner-Webb's new coach and the second for Coach Duffy

A WIN WOULD...

- » Improve Virginia Tech's record against Gardner-Webb to 6-0 and maintain the Hokies' perfect record against Big South squads
- » Propel the Hokies to a 3-0 start of the season, the first time since the 2022-23 season
- » Move Coach Duffy's record at Virginia Tech to 22-13 and mark her first 3-0 start in her tenure at Virginia Tech

CHASING 1,000 POINTS

- » No Hokie has reached the 1,000-point mark in their career yet.
- » Graduate student Mel Daley is the closest to reaching the elusive 1,000-point scorers club
- » Daley is 45 points away from reaching the milestone

RECAPING THE WIN OVER LOYOLA MARYLAND

- » It was the first time the Hokies held an opponent to under 49 points since their 81-46 victory over Campbell on Dec. 21, 2024
- » Tech out-rebounded the Greyhounds, 38-30
- » The Hokies did not allow Loyola Maryland to score off a fastbreak
- » Guard Carleigh Wenzel led the Hokies in scoring with a season-highs in points (18) and rebounds (6)
- » Forward Carys Baker made big contributions with 17 points and three steals
- » Guard Mackenzie Nelson recorded a career-high 11 assists on the night
- » Sophomore Kayl Petersen was one rebound shy of her second consecutive double-double going for 10 points and nine boards
- » Seven Hokies put up points in the win

IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- » Individually...
- » Mackenzie Nelson is third with nine assists per game, 15th with 18 total assists, and 49th with a 4.5 assist-turnover ratio
- » Kilah Freelon and Kayl Petersen are both tied 34th with their respective double-doubles on opening night
- » The Hokies rank top 50 in free throw attempts per game (10th, 28.50), free throws made per game (11th, 20.50), rebound margin (25th, 18.0), defensive rebounds per game (27th, 32.5), rebounds per game (35th, 48.50), and assists per game (45th, 19.0)

NOTES

A PROVEN WINNER AT THE HELM

» Heading into the season, Coach Duffy's 0.687 career winning percentage is the sixth-best amongst the 18 head coaches in the league (Jeff Walz 0.769, Wes Moore 0.765, Niele Ivey 0.755, Kara Lawson 0.701, and Courtney Banghart 0.694).

THE HOTTEST SHOW IN TOWN

- » Hokie Nation showed up in force last season, averaging 5,142 fans per game — ranking 23rd nationally in attendance and 19th in attendance relative to arena capacity.
- » Cassell Coliseum figures to continue being an intimidating venue for opponents as season tickets sold out in October.
- » Tech is 28-7 at home the last two seasons.

WHO'S BACK FOR THE HOKIES?

- » Six athletes: Carleigh Wenzel, Leila Wells, Mackenzie Nelson, Carys Baker, Samyha Suffren, and Kayl Petersen return for the Hokies
- » The returning student-athletes combine for 67 starts and 54 percent of the team's scoring
- » Tech returns their top two leading scorers from 2024-25 in Carleigh Wenzel (448 points) and Carys Baker (403 points)
- » Wenzel also topped all players with 117 assists while Mackenzie Nelson and Kayl Peterson led in steals (39) and blocks (31), respectively

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- » Virginia Tech brings in seven newcomers for 2025-26: Kilah Freelon (Texas Tech), Spela Brecelj, Kate Sears, Mel Daley (Northwestern), Amani Jenkins, Aniya Trent, and Sophie Swanson (Purdue)
- » Freshmen Amani Jenkins and Kate Sears enter Blacksburg ranked 74th and 82nd, respectively, in SportsCenter's 2025 NEXT 100
- » Aniya Trent, alongside Jenkins and Sears, is a four-star prospect
- » Spela Brecelj brings international experience having participated in six European Championships and one World Cup with the Slovenian Youth National Team

50 SEASONS OF WOMEN'S BASKETBALL AT VIRGINIA TECH

- » The 2025-26 season marks the 50th of varsity women's basketball at Virginia Tech
- » Tech's first season was in 1976-77 when the Hokies went 7-9 including a 4-3 mark in home games played at Cassell Coliseum
- » The Hokies did not play any conference games until 1981-82 when they were a part of the Metro Conference

TOP 50 FINISH IN THE NET

- » In 2025, the Hokies owned a final NET ranking of 47. Since the inception of the NET and its use throughout five full seasons, Tech has been in the top 50 each time
- » For Coach Duffy, the 2024-25 season was her fourth in the last five finishing in the top 50

MILESTONES ACHIEVED IN THE 2024-25 SEASON

- » Virginia Tech scored 80 or more in six ACC contests last season, setting a new program record for a single season.
- » The Hokies committed the least total turnovers in program history with just 5 against Cal
- » The 105 points scored in the thrilling double OT win against No. 13 Georgia Tech are the most in an ACC contest in program history.
- » In her first season in Blacksburg, Megan Duffy has led the Hokies to six games scoring 80 or more in ACC play (4-2 record in those contests).
- » The Hokies scored 68 points in the paint which ranks second most all-time last opening night against UNCW
- » Set a program record for points scored in the ACC season with 1,347

NELSON HONORED AS KAY YOW STUDENT LEADER

- » Redshirt sophomore Mackenzie Nelson was recognized as one of 64 Kay Yow Servant Leaders early in the month of October.
- » She is one of four players in the ACC to be recognized for the 2025-26 season.
- » The Kay Yow Servant Leader Award honors Coach Yow's legacy and the young people who carry the fight forward, inspiring others through their actions and leadership. It is presented annually to student-athletes who demonstrate extraordinary dedication to making a positive impact in their communities – people with a servant's spirit and a commitment to selfless leadership both on and off the court or athletic field.

WELCOME (BACK) HOME, LIZ KITLEY!

- » Elizabeth Kitley joins the Virginia Tech Women's Basketball staff this season as the Assistant to the Head Coach, External Operations
- » She will work closely with Coach Duffy and General Manager Stephen Fishler on key strategic initiatives, including community outreach, fundraising, and NIL efforts
- » Kitley will also have Women's Basketball home event broadcasting roles with the Virginia Tech Sports Network radio and ACC Network Extra (ACCNX) teams
- » Her time will also be spent in Blacksburg preparing for her return to professional basketball after stints with the Golden State Valkyries and Las Vegas Aces

KNOWLEDGE OF THE CONFERENCE

- » Virginia Tech features five staff members (four coaches and one staff) with experience playing in the ACC
- » The playing experience is brought in from Notre Dame (Duffy), Clemson (Coleman), Wake Forest (Hoover), Virginia (Zoll), and Virginia Tech (Kitley)

FROM THE WNBA TO THE COLLEGIATE SIDELINES

- » Virginia Tech's staff has been well represented on the national stage as four staffers (three coaches and one support staff) have experience playing in the WNBA
- » Coach Duffy spent time with the Minnesota Lynx (2006-07) and the New York Liberty (2008), Itoro Coleman with Houston Comets (2003), Sharnee Zoll with the Lynx (2008) and Chicago Sky (2013), and Elizabeth Kitley at the Las Vegas Aces (2025)
- » Tech is one of two schools in the NCAA to have four former WNBA players on their staff

GETTING TO THE NEXT LEVEL

- » Virginia Tech was one of six programs in the country to have a WNBA Draft selection in each of the 2022, 2023 and 2024 drafts joining Stanford, Tennessee, LSU, UConn and South Carolina.
- » The Hokies have the most selections in the ACC in that period with four (Aisha Sheppard, Kayana Traylor, Taylor Soule and Elizabeth Kitley).
- » Tech had four of the ACC's 13 selections from 2022 to 2024.

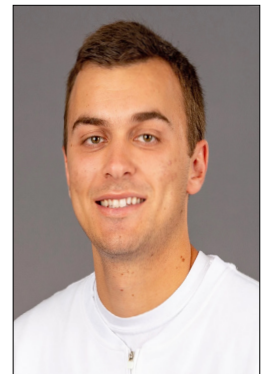

"VPI," which was the university's acronym/nickname from 1896 to 1970, should be used only in historical contexts. The same is true for "VAMC," the university's acronym/nickname before 1896.

HEAD COACH MEGAN DUFFY

Megan Duffy was named the eighth head women's basketball coach at Virginia Tech, Director of Athletics Whit Babcock announced on April 3, 2024.

A proven winner, Duffy has averaged 22 victories per season as a head coach, boasting an impressive 70% winning percentage. She has led her teams to the postseason in seven of her eight seasons at the helm, including in her inaugural campaign in Blacksburg. The cornerstone of Duffy's success in year one at Virginia Tech was her commitment to player development. Several players made significant strides in performance throughout the season, highlighted by Matilda Ekh and Rose Micheaux who continued their basketball journeys professionally after graduation.

That development translated into on-court success as the Hokies won 19 games, including defeating previously undefeated and thirteenth-ranked Georgia Tech. Duffy also guided the team to nine ACC wins, the most for a first year Virginia Tech head coach, earning the eight seed at the conference tournament in Greensboro. The season concluded with an appearance in the WBIT.

In 2024-25 Carys Baker blossomed into one of the best young players in the country, averaging 12.6 points per game and 6.3 rebounds in her sophomore season, tripling her scoring output from a year earlier. Under Duffy, she led the team in minutes played while showcasing impressive efficiency, shooting 46% from the field and 41% from beyond the arc. She posted 23 games of 10 or more points, three 20-point performances and recorded two double-doubles. Baker increased her numbers in ACC play averaging 14.1 ppg. and 7.3 rpg. while shooting better than 48% including a 44.4% mark from deep.

Duffy's focus on player development was also evident in the progression of Carleigh Wenzel, who led the team at 14.0 points per game her redshirt sophomore season after just 4.2 points per game the year before. Wenzel scored 20 or more points four times throughout the season and recorded two double-doubles. She led the Hokies in assists with 117, including two double-digit assist performances. Another athlete who excelled in ACC play, Wenzel's numbers improved against the best competition, averaging 15.3 ppg throughout the 16-game conference slate.

Mackenzie Nelson also saw drastic improvement under the tutelage of former point guard, Duffy. She finished her freshman season seventh in the conference in assist to turnover ratio, serving as a steady presence at the point for the Hokies.

In the post, senior forward Rose Micheaux produced the best season of her career highlighted by recording just the second triple-double in program history with a 19-point, 14-rebound and 10-assist performance against Elon. Micheaux started every game she played under Coach Duffy and saw her scoring average soar from 4.1 the year prior to 12.2 points per game her senior season. Micheaux led the Hokies in rebounds at 7.4 and had the third-best shooting percentage in the conference at better than 58%.

Prior to Virginia Tech, Duffy guided Marquette University to the NCAA tournament in 2024, after spending five years in Milwaukee where she accumulated a 110-46 record that included a 64-30 mark in BIG EAST play.

Duffy's head coaching career now spans eight seasons, five at Marquette, two at Miami (Ohio) and the 2024-25 season at Virginia Tech. Her resume features six seasons of 20 or more wins – leading to an impressive career record of 173-79 (.686). She has reached the postseason in every year that she has led a program. In five seasons at the helm at Marquette, Duffy owned the best winning percentage of any coach in that program's history at 70.5% (110-46). During Duffy's tenure, the Golden Eagles made four postseason appearances, including three trips to the NCAA tournament, and earned a pair of runner-up finishes in both the regular season and BIG EAST conference tournament. Marquette had a notable beginning to the 2023-24 season with the best start in program history at 12-0. The Golden Eagles were one of 10 teams in the country to go undefeated in nonconference play, including winning the Fort Meyers Tip-Off with two wins over Power Five foes – defeating Boston College and Arkansas. She also guided MU to a win over Illinois and her squad earned a ranked victory over No. 20 Creighton.

Under Duffy's leadership, nine different athletes garnered All-BIG EAST accolades, including the first duo to collect first team nods in the same season from Marquette in Jordan King and Chloe Marotta. Other highlights of her tenure in Milwaukee include becoming the fastest coach in Marquette history to the 100-win mark, owning the most road wins in a season in program history, securing the most home wins in a single season in program history and defeating multiple AP top five foes in the same season (No. 3 Texas and No. 4 UConn in 2022-23).

Duffy was a four-year letterwinner at Notre Dame (2002-06), helping the Irish to four straight NCAA appearances and two Sweet 16 berths. She is one of six players in school history to total at least 1,000 points, 500 assists and 200 steals.

The Dayton, Ohio, native has translated her extensive playing career, which included All-America selections (finalist for national player of the year awards), USA Basketball participation (Gold medalist) and professional experience in the WNBA (Minnesota and New York) and overseas, into success in the coaching ranks.

Duffy arrived at Marquette after leading Miami (Ohio) to a pair of WNIT appearances during her two-year tenure with the program. Miami finished the season with a 23-9 overall record and a 13-5 Mid-American Conference mark in 2018-19 and reached 20 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since the 1980s. She was one of just four rookie head coaches in 2017-18 to collect at least 20 wins and the only female to accomplish the feat. The RedHawks finished 21-11 that season, the largest improvement in the nation from the previous season in terms of total victories (nine more than 2016-17, 12-21). Duffy guided the program to a 44-20 (.687) record during her two years, making her the winningest active coach in the MAC at the time.

Under Duffy's tutelage, Miami produced two all-conference performers, while the team's successes carried into the classroom as well. Miami had a program-high eight student-athletes tabbed Academic All-MAC and the RedHawks were named to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Honor Roll in 2018 after earning the sixth-best team grade-point average in the nation among all Division I schools.

Prior to her time in Oxford, Duffy owns stops at BIG EAST school St. John's (2009-12, assistant coach), George Washington (2012-14, associate head coach) and Michigan (2014-17, assistant coach). She helped lead each of the three programs to the postseason (seven total appearances), highlighted by a trip to the Sweet 16 with the Red Storm in 2012 and the WNIT title with the Wolverines in 2017.

Duffy graduated from Notre Dame in 2006 with a double degree in psychology and computer applications. She is married to Kevin Hoyng.

- » Her fifth ranked win came at No. 13 Georgia Tech 105-94 (2 OT) on Jan. 9, 2025.

ON THE SIDELINES FOR THE HOKIES

**ITORO COLEMAN - ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH**

- » A veteran of the Atlantic Coast Conference, Coleman coached at UNC for three seasons and as a player at Clemson, she was a three-time All-ACC selection and earned All-America honorable mention accolades. A member of the Clemson Athletic Hall of Fame, she led the Tigers to the 1999 ACC title and was named tournament MVP.
- » Coleman enjoyed a long professional career and played in the WNBA for the Indiana Fever and the Houston Comets. She was a member of Team USA in the Pan American Games and at the FIBA World Championships. Coleman played for the Nigerian National Team in the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens and was captain of that team that gave Nigeria its first-ever Olympic victory.
- » She graduated from Clemson in 2000 with a degree in communications with her name etched in the Clemson record books with top-10 marks in scoring (1,409 points), assists (459) and steals (265). In 2008 Coleman was inducted into the Clemson Athletic Hall of Fame.

**JEN HOOVER - ASSISTANT COACH**

- » Hoover, who most recently was an assistant at Kentucky for two seasons, is the all-time winningest coach at her alma mater, Wake Forest, where she led the program for 10 years.
- » In her tenure at Wake Forest, which spanned from 2012-22, Hoover led the Demon Deacons to four postseason appearances, including an NCAA Tournament berth in 2020-21.
- » Hoover has an impressive reputation for developing forwards at the highest level, in part because of her own playing career. A post player herself, she starred for Wake Forest from 1987-91. She was a three-time All-ACC selection and is still second on the school's career charts for points (1,728) and rebounds (1,006). Hoover led the Demon Deacons to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1988, and the next year, she helped the South Team win a bronze medal at the Olympic Festival in Oklahoma City, Okla., in 1989. Hoover was later inducted into the Wake Forest Sports Hall of Fame in 2007.

**SHARNEE ZOLL - ASSISTANT COACH & RECRUITING COORDINATOR**

- » A veteran of the professional ranks, Zoll was drafted in the WNBA where she played for three seasons before continuing her pro career overseas.
- » Zoll was the 29th overall pick in the 2008 WNBA Draft by the Los Angeles Sparks. She also spent time with the Minnesota Lynx.
- » Zoll graduated from Virginia in 2008. As a Cavalier, Zoll was a 1,000-point scorer and started every game of her career. She's the only woman in ACC history to record at least 200 assists in three straight seasons and broke the Virginia and ACC record with 785 assists, both previously held by Dawn Staley. She won a gold medal as a member of the Team USA U19 team in 2005.

**DARREN GUENSCH - ASSISTANT COACH**

- » With the Hokies, Guensch will play a key role in recruiting, player development, scouting and game planning.
- » A 20-year veteran on the sidelines of D1 women's basketball programs, Guensch brings decades of experience and ties to the Commonwealth. Raised in Leesburg, Guensch owns degrees from two different institutions in the state (Radford and George Mason) and has also spent time coaching at Mason, VCU and Richmond.

**JEROD MCCULLEN - DIRECTOR OF RECRUITING, ASSISTANT COACH**

- » McCullen comes to Blacksburg after spending one season at the University of Kentucky as the women's basketball coaching video coordinator. In his one season in Lexington, he assisted the Wildcats with coordination of film, scouting, video projects and assisting coaches in various aspects of the program including assistant coach Jen Hoover.
- » Prior to Kentucky, McCullen spent three seasons as the director of operations at Central Michigan, his alma mater (2020-22).
