The Charlemagne Award is a lifetime achievement award given to an individual with a distinguished history of service to the community where men can live, work, can be educated, worship and play. This prestigious award was created in 1968 based upon the legend written by C.V. Amenoff, who served as mayor of St. Charles from 1969-1973.

This award will be presented on February 5th, 2021 at the 99th Annual Charlemagne Award Dinner.

Nominations will be accepted until November 13th, 2020; only individuals nominated are considered by the Awards Committee. Membership in the St. Charles Chamber of Commerce is not a requirement; however, the individual must be a current St. Charles area resident.
