BULLDOG BITES...

- ▶ Mississippi State hits the road to open the 2012-13 SEC slate, heading to Vanderbilt on Thursday.
- ▶ Thursday's game is State's second true road game of the season. The Bulldogs fell 61-59 to Southern Miss in Hattiesburg on Dec. 1.
- ▶ MSU is opening the SEC slate on the road for the sixth time in the last seven seasons, and in Nashville for third time in six years.
- ▶ Mississippi State closed the 2011-12 season against Vanderbilt, falling 67-51 in the opening round of the SEC Tournament in Nashville.
- ▶ The Commodores lead the overall series 34-14 and have won the last five meetings.
- ▶ The Bulldogs have won five-straight games after wrapping 2012 with wins against Northwestern State and Troy.
- ▶ Sophomore Martha Alwal recorded a double-double in each contest last weekend, while redshirt sophomore Carnecia Williams claimed her first in the win against Troy.
- ▶ State scored a season-high 82 points against Troy and held its eighth-straight foe below 40% from the field.
- ▶ The Dawgs lead the SEC in 3-point FG percentage defense (.241) and blocks (5.9).

VIC SCHAEFER HEAD COACH

A veteran coach of 28 seasons, Schaefer embarks on his journey as head coach of the Bulldogs looking to build a program that consistently rates among the best in the nation.

That is something Schaefer has done at every stop in his coaching career, including his most recent stops at Arkansas and Texas A&M. He has helped construct winners by teaching intense, high-pressure defense, and compiling some of the nation's top-ranked recruiting classes.

In those 15 seasons in Fayetteville and College Station, Schaefer's defenses helped his squads to the postseason all but once (his first season at Texas A&M) while averaging 22 wins a year. Schaefer, who has been part of 413 wins in his 25-year collegiate coaching career, has become one of the nation's premier teachers of defense, earning the moniker the "Secretary of Defense."

His defenses helped Arkansas and Texas A&M to 11 NCAA Tournament appearances. In his first season in Fayetteville, the Razorbacks advanced to the Final Four before making three more trips to the second round. With his alma mater, he won a national championship while helping the program to a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, an Elite Eight showing, two trips to the second round and a first-round berth.

In his nine years as associate head coach to friend and mentor Gary Blair at Texas A&M, his teams consistently were atop the Big 12 in turnovers caused, steals, turnover margin and assist-to-turnover ratio.

In 2011, his smothering defense topped the nation in turnover margin en route to guiding the Aggies to the NCAA national championship in the program's first trip to the Women's Final Four. That squad also earned Texas A&M's first No. 1 national ranking while finishing the season with a 33-5 record, the most wins in school history.

The following season, his final Texas A&M squad finished first in the Big 12 in turnover margin en route to advancing to a fifth-straight conference tournament title game and the Sweet 16 in the team's seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance.

Schaefer was also part of Texas A&M squads that won two Big 12 Tournament titles (2010 & 2008) and the conference regular season title in 2007. In addition to the 2011 national championship, Schaefer helped coach the Aggies to the 2009 Sweet 16 and the 2008 Elite Eight.

Not only has Schaefer proven himself as one of the nation's premier defensive coaches, but he has also been one of the top recruiters in women's basketball, helping ink nine Top 20 recruiting classes during his tenures at Texas A&M and Arkansas. His strong reputation as a coach and recruiter earned him BasketballScoop.com's 2009 Assistant Coach of the Year.

While at Texas A&M, he played an integral role in the Aggies finishing among the country's Top 10 signing classes four-straight years. His final class with the Aggies rated as the nation's No. 2 signing class, and he helped land the nation's top class during the 2011 national championship run. In addition to 2012's No. 2 class and 2011's top-rated class, the Aggies' 2010 signing class ranked No. 5 nationally and tops in the Big 12. A year earlier, he helped ink the Big 12's No. 2 class and the sixth-best in the country.

In 2007, Schaefer earned the opportunity to coach the United States William Jones Cup Team, leading that squad to a bronze medal in Taipei, Taiwan. He also joined with Athletes in Action to coach some of the top women's college players in the nation. The only associate head coach to be named head coach of the USA Jones Cup Team, Schaefer guided Team USA to a 4-2 record in pool play with wins against Japan, New Zealand, Korea and Chinese Taipei.

The opportunity to earn international coaching experience came a year after Schaefer helped lead the 2005-06 Aggies to the first round of the NCAA Tournament. That season saw the program finish third in the Big 12, its highest finish at the time, and sign the Aggies' first McDonald's All-American.

The 2004-05 season saw Texas A&M advance to the WNIT Elite Eight, the first postseason appearance under Blair and Schaefer. That season, Schaefer helped ink the nation's 20th-best signing class, a year after their initial class rated No. 27 in the country.

Schaefer had the opportunity to accompany Blair to his alma mater following a six-year stint as associate head coach at Arkansas from 1997-2003. During that run, he helped the Razorbacks to four NCAA Tournament appearances, including a Final Four berth in his inaugural season. The following year, Arkansas went on to claim the WNIT national championship. While in Fayetteville, he helped tutor Shameka Christon, who would go on to earn SEC Player of the Year and First Team All-SEC honors.

Schaefer went to Arkansas after serving as head women's coach at Sam Houston State from 1990-97. In his next-to-last season there, he was tabbed the Southland Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Bearkats to their most wins in a decade (18). During his tenure at SHS, he tutored either the SLC's Freshman or Newcomer of the Year in three of his final four seasons. In his first year at the school (1990-91), he coached Sierena Autman to Southland Conference Player of the Year accolades.

A native of Austin, Texas, Schaefer served as a men's assistant coach at Sam Houston State (1987-89) between stints as the assistant boys basketball coach and head tennis coach at Houston's Milby High School. As a player, Schaefer was an all-state performer at Houston Lutheran High School before going on to play two seasons at Alvin Community College.

Schaefer is a dedicated family man. He is married to the former Holly Davis, who played basketball at Arkansas State and later served as an assistant coach at UT Arlington. The couple has 17-year-old twins, Blair Nicole and Charles Logan.

LOOKING AT VANDERBILT

- ▶ Vanderbilt returns home to host the Bulldogs with a 10-3 overall record on the season. The Commodores are 6-0 inside Memorial Gymnasium.
- ▶ Vandy is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today/WBCA Top 25 polls.
- ▶ Vanderbilt closed 2012 with a 74-56 win at Southern Cal on Dec. 29. Christina Foggie and Tiffany Clarke paced the Commodores in the win, scoring 28 and 24 points, respectively.
- ▶ The Commodores have won seven-straight games since suffering their three losses in consecutive games at Dayton, and against Virginia and Florida State in the San Juan Shootout.
- ▶ Vanderbilt is averaging 70.1 ppg this season and shooting 43.6 percent from the field. The Commodores are a 35.7-percent team from 3-point range and 69.9 percent from the free-throw line.
- ▶ The Dores rank second in the SEC in 3-point shooting.
- ▶ Clarke and Foggie lead the Commodores in scoring with 15.8 and 15.7 averages, respectively.
- ▶ Vandy is third in the conference in rebounding margin with a +7.9 tally. Clarke paces her team on the boards with 8.0 per game.

DAWGS VS. COMMODORES

- ▶ Mississippi State and Vanderbilt are meeting on the basketball court for the 49th time.
- ▶ The Commodores lead the overall series 34-14 and have won the last five contests.
- ▶ State has won just twice in Nashville as the teams meet in Memorial Gymnasium for the 20th time on Thursday.
- ▶ The Bulldogs won three-straight games against Vandy in the 2009-10 seasons.

ON THE ROAD TO OPEN SEC SLATE

- ▶ Mississippi State is no stranger to opening SEC play on the road.
- ▶ Thursday's game against Vanderbilt will be the sixth time in seven seasons that the Bulldogs begin league play on the road.
- ▶ When the teams tip-off Thursday to start the SEC slate, it will mark the third time in a six-year span that Mississippi State has opened the league slate in Nashville.
- ▶ Since the 2006-07 season, MSU has opened the league slate at home the fewest times of any of the SEC squads.

LAST TIME OUT

- ▶ Mississippi State put together its most complete basketball game in the final game of 2012 and the non-conference slate, defeating Troy 82-60 to wrap a season-long, five-game homestand.
- ▶ The Bulldogs scored a season-high points while holding Troy to its second-lowest output of the season.
- ▶ Martha Alwal scored 17 of her 21 points in the opening half, and Darriel Gaynor hit four of her five 3-pointers in the period as MSU took a 48-27 advantage to the intermission.
- ▶ In the first half, State broke open a 4-4 game by out-scoring Troy 20-6 over a seven-minute span.
- ▶ Carnecia Williams, who recorded her first double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, scored six-straight points to open the second half. A Troy run cut the Mississippi State lead to 16, but the Dawgs ran the lead back out with eight-unanswered points from Williams.
- ▶ Alwal also recorded a double-double, her second straight, as she hauled in 12 rebounds to go with her 21 points.
- ▶ The Bulldogs held Troy to 37.9-percent shooting while connecting at a 44.9 clip. State tied a season high with five 3-point baskets.

3-POINT LINE BATTLE

- Thursday's game features one of the SEC's top 3-point shooting team in Vanderbilt against the best team in the league at defending the arc in Mississippi State.
- The Commodores have hit 75-of-210 3-point baskets for a 35.7-percent tally that is second only to Texas A&M in the league.
- State is holding opponents to just 24.1 percent from 3-point range, the top mark in the league ahead of Alabama. The Bulldogs have limited six of their last seven opponents below 30 percent from long range.
- MSU is 21st nationally in 3-point field goal percentage defense, while Vandy's shooting percentage behind the arc is 27th in the nation.
- State has taken the fewest 3-point attempts of any team in the league, connecting on 36-of-111 for a 32.4-percent clip that is fourth in the SEC.

STATE WRAPS PERFECT HOMESTAND

- Mississippi State's 82-60 win against Troy wrapped the non-conference slate on a strong note as the Bulldogs went perfect in their five-game home-stand.
- State closed the non-conference slate having won seven-straight games at Humphrey Coliseum. The Dawgs are 8-1 at the Hump this season.
- MSU has won 19 of its last 20 non-conference home games.

DAWGS HAVE STRONG FINISH TO 2012

- Mississippi State hopes a strong finish to 2012 carries over into the new year. The Bulldogs closed December with five-straight wins and capped the month with a 5-1 record.
- In December, MSU shot 42.7 percent from the floor and averaged 66.8 ppg. State shot 34.4 percent from the field and averaged 57.9 ppg over a seven-game span in the month of November.

STATE RACKS UP THE POINTS VS. TROY

- Mississippi State closed the non-conference slate with 82 points, the most points this season and the most since the 2010-11 squad opened with 87 against USC Upstate.
- MSU's 22-point margin of victory was its biggest of the year, and the 48 points in the first half were State's most in a half this season.

DAWGS SHUT DOWN TROY OFFENSE

- Not only did the Bulldogs put up their best points tally of the season, they also limited a Trojans offense that had been scoring in bunches this season.
- Troy entered the contest averaging 79.9 ppg, the best tally in the Sun Belt Conference and in the Top 10 nationally, but the Bulldogs held the Trojans to 60 points, their second-lowest scoring total of the year.

STATE WINS THE BOARDS BATTLE

- Thanks to double-doubles from Martha Alwal and Carnecia Williams, Mississippi State won the rebounding battle against Troy, the second-straight game State claimed the advantage.
- It was the first time this season MSU has won the battle of the boards in back-to-back games. State is 5-0 when claiming the rebounds edge.

SUFFOCATING DEFENSE

- Head coach Vic Schaefer's squad turned up the defensive intensity against Northwestern State, holding it to 27.8-percent shooting for the game. It is the lowest percentage MSU has held an opponent to this season.
- Mississippi State has prevented three of its last five opponents from reaching 30 percent from the floor. During that five-game stretch, foes are connecting at a 31.7-percent rate (100-of-315).
- NWSU shot 23.1 percent in the second half and had 13 of its 20 turnovers in the game's final 20 minutes.

MSU TAKES CARE OF THE BASKETBALL

► State committed a season-low 12 turnovers against Northwestern State. MSU won the turnover battle again the following night, giving it a positive assist-to-turnover ratio in consecutive games for the first time this season.

BENCH PRODUCTION

► During December's 5-1 stretch, the Bulldogs' bench has out-scored its opponents 124-56. In the current five-game win streak, the Dawgs' reserves have claimed a 105-51 edge.

BULLDOGS FORCE TURNOVERS VS. JSU

► Mississippi State forced Jacksonville State into 35 turnovers in the Dec. 20 meeting, the most for a Bulldog defense since Dec. 7, 2008, when Nicholls State committed 44 miscues.

► In the last three games, Mississippi State has forced 80 turnovers and scored 77 points off those miscues.

BULLDOGS CONVERTING "TRAIN WRECKS"

► Head coach Vic Schaefer wants his players to attack the bucket and cause "train wrecks," meaning the Dawgs score, draw a foul or both.

► After going 13-for-22 (59.1 percent) at the stripe against Northwestern State, the Bulldogs were back to their solid free-throw shooting against Troy, knocking down 15-of-20 attempts for 75 percent.

► Saturday's effort improved MSU to 73 percent on the season, third-best in the SEC and No. 55 nationally.

DOMINATING THE PAINT

► Mississippi State won the battle in the paint for the fifth-straight game against Troy. State is 7-1 this season when out-scoring its opponent in the lane. During the current five-game win streak, the Bulldogs have claimed a 180-112 advantage in the paint.

BULLDOG SWAT TEAM

► Not only does MSU lead the SEC in 3-point defense, but it also paces the league in blocked shots with 5.9 blocks per game. That tally is 15th in the nation.

► Mississippi State rejected 13 shots against Florida Atlantic on Dec. 7, the most since last season's squad swatted 14 in the opener against Jacksonville State.

ALWAL BLOCKS WITH THE BEST

► Sophomore Martha Alwal blocked four shots against Northwestern State and Troy. Alwal rates third in MSU career annals, five back of second place.

ALWAL, CARNECIA POST DOUBLE-DOUBLES

► Martha Alwal and Carnecia Williams each posted double-doubles against Troy, the first time MSU has had two players record one in the same game since Jan. 14, 2010, when Chanel Mokango and Armelie Lumanu each had one against Arkansas.

► For Williams, it was her first double-double, while Alwal recorded her sixth, tying her for the most in the SEC this season.

ALWAL POSTS BACK-TO-BACK DOUBLE-DOUBLES

► Saturday's double-double was the second in as many games for Alwal. She was the last Bulldog to accomplish the feat as she record two-straight to begin her career last season.

► Alwal's eight double-figure rebounding games are the most in the SEC, and her 9.7 rebounds per game are best in the league and 55th nationally.

► Her 18 rebounds in the season-opening win against Houston are the most by an SEC player this season.

MARTHA MAKING THE FREEBIES

► Against NW State and Troy, Alwal was 7-of-9 at the free-throw line for 77.8 percent. After shooting at a 59-percent clip (25-of-42) last season, she has hit 54-of-63 this year for an 85.7-percent tally that is second in the SEC behind Arkansas' Sarah Watkins.

BIG WEEKEND FOR CARNECIA

► Her first double-double on Saturday capped a splendid weekend for Carnecia Williams. She scored 20 points, including 14 in the second half, against Troy after hitting a game-high 16 in Friday's win against Northwestern State.

► The Memphis native averaged 18.0 points and 9.0 rebounds in the two games. She matched her career rebounding high against the Lady Demons before setting a new standard with 10 vs. Troy.

► After averaging 0.6 points in 4.3 minutes last season, Williams is playing 23.2 minutes per game this year and averaging 8.9 points and 5.2 boards. She scored a career-high 26 points against Savannah State earlier this season.

DARRIEL SPARKS THE DAWGS

► Senior Darriel Gaynor returned to the starting lineup against Troy after a four-game absence, and she made it count, scoring a career-high 15 points.

► Gaynor scored 12 points in the first half, and all of her points came off a personal-high five 3-point baskets.

► The Las Vegas native made all of MSU's 3-pointers in the game, matching the team's season high set in a Dec. 1 setback at Southern Miss.

GRANT OFF TO STELLAR START

► The Mississippi State coaches have stressed that Kendra Grant needs to score and create opportunities on offense. The Richland, Miss., native has answered, leading the team with a 13.2 scoring average.

► Grant scored nine points each against Northwestern State and Troy to have her run of consecutive double-digit scoring games halted at seven. She has tallied double figures in 10 of the squad's 13 contests this season.

► Grant recorded her first double-double (16 points, 15 rebounds) against Savannah State. She scored 20 points against Louisiana Tech after tallying a career-best 22 points in the season opener against Houston.

KATIA DISHES AND SCORES VS. LADY DEMONS

► Junior point guard Katia May scored a season-high 11 points against Northwestern State, two shy of matching her career high.

► The York, Ala., product also matched her career high with six assists on Friday and added four on Saturday. After assisting on 16 buckets in the first six games, she has tallied 35 assists in the last seven contests.

► Her 3.9 assists average is tied for ninth in the SEC.

SHERISE WILLIAMS EARNS SEC HONOR

► Freshman Sherise Williams had the best game of her young career against Florida A&M, scoring a personal-best 21 points to go along with seven rebounds and three blocks to earn SEC Co-Freshman of the Week laurels.

► Williams' personal high bettered her previous best of 15 points in the win against Florida Atlantic.

SHAMIA HAS A CAREER NIGHT AGAINST JSU

► In just her second game back from an injury that forced her to miss the year's first nine games, sophomore Shamia Robinson posted the first double-double of her young career against Jacksonville State, scoring a game- and career-high 17 points to go along with 10 rebounds.

► The Maben, Miss., native was 7-of-10 at the line en route to the first double-digit scoring game of her career. She tied her career high for rebounds set last season against Nevada in Reno.

STARKVILLE, Miss. —New Mississippi State women's basketball coach Vic Schaefer has promised a squad which competes with relentless effort and plays hard on both ends of the floor.

Fans of the Bulldogs saw all that and a victory Friday night in Schaefer's coaching debut. Behind a double-double from Martha Alwal, MSU opened the season with a 72-66 win over Houston in the Humphrey Coliseum.

Alwal finished with a career-high 23 points and 18 rebounds, including 11 on the offensive end. Alwal's big night included four blocked shots on the defensive end and 9-of-10 foul shooting on the offensive end. Kendra Grant also tallied a career-best points tally, notching 22 in the contest.

Alwal also blocked four shots, giving her 86 for her young MSU career to tie Sharon Thompson for fourth in the school record books.

State built an early seven-point lead and led by four points at halftime. MSU only trailed twice in the game's final 20 minutes.

The Bulldogs grabbed their first lead at 4-3 on a layup by Alwal. Houston regrouped for a 9-2 run and a 12-6 advantage. The Bulldogs then got a lift from the second-five as it helped piece together a 7-0 run for an 18-17 lead. Jessie Ward's first-career three-pointer brought the Maroon and White within one, and an Alwal layup pushed the squad ahead.

MSU held Houston to 28 percent first-half shooting from the field and led 32-28 at the intermission.

A basket by Grant ran the MSU advantage to nine points at 38-29 with 17:45 left to play. Houston rallied for a 43-42 advantage and also led 49-47 with 10:36 remaining.

A 3-point play by Alwal gave the hosts the lead for good with 9:42 left in regulation.

Houston got as close as three, 63-60, with 3:12 to play, but senior Darriel Gaynor drained a three from the left corner to give MSU a two-possession lead it would not relinquish.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 22 of 69 shots from the field (31.9 percent), 3 of 8 shots from 3-point range (37.5 percent) and 25 of 34 shots from the foul line (73.5 percent). The Cougars hit 25 of 79 shots from the field (31.6 percent), 5 of 26 shots from 3-point range (19.2 percent) and 11 of 15 shots from the foul line (73.3 percent).

MSU held a 65-39 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had 11 assists and 26 turnovers, while the Cougars had 11 assists and 17 turnovers.

The 65 boards and 34 trips to the charity stripe were the most since the 2009-10 team had 71 rebounds and 37 free-throw attempts against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Grant and Sherise Williams each had nine rebounds for MSU. Katia May had four assists, and Darriel Gaynor had two of her squad's four steals.

Houston received 16 points from Porsche Landry, 12 points from Marissa Ashton and 10 points from Jessieka Palmer.

STARKVILLE, Miss. — A second-half comeback fell short Monday night as the Mississippi State women's basketball team dropped a 56-48 decision to Hampton in the Humphrey Coliseum.

The Bulldogs trailed 44-32 with 9:14 left in regulation. MSU scored the game's next 10 points, with eight-straight points of the run coming from senior Darriel Gaynor. After cutting the deficit to two points, the Bulldogs missed on a potential game-tying possession before turning the ball over on the game's next possession.

Gaynor finished the night with 10 points, one shy of matching her career high.

Three days after tallying a game- and career-high 23 points, sophomore Martha Alwal finished one rebound shy of a second-straight double-double as she scored a team-high 13 points to go along with nine rebounds.

Fellow sophomore Kendra Grant added 11 points, including 2 of 3 from three-point range.

Hampton scored the game's first six points and set the tone early with its physical, rugged style of defensive play. In the first half alone, the Bulldogs had 16 turnovers.

MSU answered with a tenacious defensive effort of its own. Two free throws by Martha Alwal tied the contest at six apiece. She then followed with a jumper that gave the Bulldogs their first lead of the night.

A basket by Gaynor placed the Bulldogs on top 15-12, but Hampton's defense stiffened, allowing only one field goal over the final 7:49 of the half.

The Lady Pirates ended the half on a 14-3 run to take a 26-18 halftime advantage.

In the second half, the Bulldogs improved their ball movement and cut the turnover total down to seven. Still, Hampton enjoyed a 10-point lead at 34-24 with 13:38 left in regulation time.

The Bulldogs closed within five on an old-fashioned 3-point play by Kendra Grant. The Lady Pirates ran the lead out to 12 points on two different occasions midway through the second half.

Down 44-32, the Bulldogs began their rally with two free throws from Carnecia Williams. After Gaynor's spree brought the Maroon and White within 44-42, Hampton answered with the game's next five points.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 13 of 44 shots from the field (29.5 percent), 4 of 7 shots from 3-point range (57.1 percent) and 18 of 23 shots from the foul line (78.3 percent). The Lady Pirates hit 19 of 55 shots from the field (34.5 percent), 1 of 6 shots from 3-point range (16.7 percent) and 17 of 29 shots from the foul line (58.6 percent).

Hampton held a 44-29 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had six assists and 23 turnovers, while the Lady Pirates had 12 assists and 21 turnovers.

Hampton received 19 points from Keiara Avant, 14 points from Alyssa Bennett and 14 points from Nicole Hamilton.

November 16, 2012 — Starkville, Miss.

STARKVILLE, Miss. — Sophomore Kendra Grant scored 20 points, two shy of her career high, and senior Darriel Gaynor added 11 as the Bulldogs rallied from down 12 points in the second half to post a 57-55 victory over Louisiana Tech Friday night at the Humphrey Coliseum.

MSU coach Vic Schaefer was not pleased with his team's toughness in Monday night's 56-48 loss against Hampton, but the Bulldogs' new mentor thought a 180-degree turnaround by his squad in that department proved a key to the victory.

Gaynor hit the game-winning shot on a baseline jumper with 52 seconds left in regulation. The Bulldogs then got the critical stop on the defensive end as Kelia Shelton committed a charging foul.

MSU was unable to score on its final possession but Louisiana Tech could not either. Britany Lewis missed a heavily-contested 3-point shot as time expired for the Lady Techsters.

The Maroon and White only had two first-half leads. Louisiana Tech scored seven-straight points to build an early 10-5 lead. A 3-pointer by Gaynor brought MSU within 17-16 with 7:04 left in the half, but Louisiana Tech responded with the game's next six points.

The Lady Techsters shot 50 percent from the field in the first half and led 33-23 at halftime.

The Bulldogs fell down 12 points at 37-25 before beginning their rally. A big reason for the comeback was a 45.2-percent field-goal percentage over the final 20 minutes. It was the best half shooting the basketball by a Bulldog squad since last season's team shot 53.1-percent in the second half to knock off Auburn.

A jumper by Katia May brought the Maroon and White within 38-33 with 13:59 left in the contest.

MSU still trailed 46-40 before taking its first second-half lead with eight straight points. A layup by Grant pushed the Maroon and White on top 48-46 with 7:33 left.

Things stayed nip-and-tuck, with the Bulldogs finally pushing to a two-point lead again at 55-53 when Martha Alwal scored and drew a foul with 1:47 left. Schaefer called that score "the biggest basket in the game" despite Alwal not completing the 3-point play.

Lewis tied the contest for Louisiana Tech with a basket at the 1:24 mark, paving the way for Gaynor's go-ahead shot on the other end of the floor.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 22 of 61 shots from the field (36.1 percent), 3 of 8 shots from 3-point range (37.5 percent) and 10 of 17 shots from the foul line (58.8 percent). The Lady Techsters hit 20 of 47 shots from the field (42.6 percent), 1 of 5 shots from 3-point range (20.0 percent) and 14 of 22 shots from the foul line (63.6 percent).

Louisiana Tech held a 44-33 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had 11 assists and a season-low 13 turnovers, while the Lady Techsters had 13 assists and 23 turnovers. MSU forced its opponents into 20 or more turnovers for the second-straight game.

Louisiana Tech received a double-double from Lewis (20 points, 10 rebounds) and 14 points from Kelia Shelton.

November 20, 2012 — Puerto Vallarta, Mexico

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico — Mississippi State dropped a 61-59 heart-breaker to Winthrop in a women's basketball game played at the Harwood Tournament of Hope Tuesday afternoon.

Dequesha McClanahan assured victory for the Lady Eagles when she hit a baseline jumper as time expired. Winthrop moved the ball the length of the court in 3.9 seconds after MSU's Martha Alwal had tied the game with a basket on the Bulldogs' offensive end.

After a nip-and-tuck first half, the Bulldogs actually built a nine-point advantage midway through the second half. A big rally to end the half had pushed the Maroon and White into a 26-23 advantage at halftime.

In the early stages of the second half, MSU (2-2) stretch the lead to four on a Darriel Gaynor 3-point basket. The Lady Eagles (2-1) battled back for two ties before the Bulldogs surged ahead again.

Alwal scored four of her team's six points during a 6-0 run as MSU climbed to a 37-31 lead. After Winthrop whittled the lead back down to two, the Bulldogs took the game's longest lead at 51-42 with 6:47 remaining.

A layup by Carnecia Williams created the nine-point push. A basket by Katia May kept the Bulldogs in that lead at 53-44.

Winthrop then took control of the contest with the game's next 13 points. The Lady Eagles moved the ball inside and made their way to free throw line. After hitting 1-of-7 free throws in the first half, Winthrop hit six straight to start the 13-0 run.

A 3-pointer by Diana Choibekova placed Winthrop on top at 55-53 with 3:31 left in regulation.

The Bulldogs would fall down four at 59-55 before mounting one final push. A layup by Sherise Williams brought MSU within two with 1:08 left. The Bulldogs followed with back-to-back defensive stops, setting up Alwal's game-tying shot.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 22 of 66 shots from the field (33.3 percent), 4 of 9 shots from 3-point range (44.4 percent) and 11 of 13 shots from the foul line (84.6 percent). The Lady Eagles hit 22 of 56 shots from the field (39.3 percent), 5 of 13 shots from 3-point range (38.5 percent) and 12 of 21 shots from the foul line (57.1 percent).

Winthrop held a 41-38 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had 16 assists and 16 turnovers, while the Lady Eagles had nine assists and 20 turnovers.

Alwal posted a double-double for MSU with 23 points and 13 rebounds. Kendra Grant followed with nine points.

Winthrop placed four players in double figures. Choibekova had 17 points, followed by McClanahan and Samiya Wright with 13 points apiece. Schaquilla Nunn posted a triple-double with 10 points, 13 rebounds and 10 blocked shots.

November 21, 2012 — Puerto Vallarta, Mexico

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico – Mississippi State went 18-for-18 from the free-throw line, but the Bulldogs struggled from the field as they dropped a 60-43 decision to UC Santa Barbara at the Hardwood Tournament of Hope.

The perfect tally from the stripe is the best percentage in school history for the Dawgs, who lead the SEC at the line this season. It betters the previous best of 95.5-percent set against Texas in 2009 and Delta State in 1978.

Despite the stellar showing from the stripe, the Bulldogs were unable to overcome a season-low 22.4 percent from the field, including a 3-of-14 afternoon from 3-point range.

The Bulldogs scored the game's first six points on back-to-back 3-point baskets by Kendra Grant and Jessy Ward. MSU then went better than eight minutes without scoring another field goal.

UCSB pushed ahead at 7-6 on a jumper by Destini Mason. The Lady Gauchos would eventually score 11 straight before MSU's Martha Alwal hit a pair of free throws. UCSB ran the lead to six points before MSU closed within two at 16-14 on a pair of free throws from Darriel Gaynor.

MSU got back within one on two free throws by Alwal with 1:35 left in the half. UCSB scored the final five points of the half to take a 26-20 lead at the break.

In the opening half, the Bulldogs only hit 5-of-25 shots from the field, including only 2-of-9 shots from 3-point range.

In the second half, the Bulldogs could not battle back from another prolonged scoring drought. UCSB scored the second half's first six points and held MSU scoreless for better than three minutes.

An old-fashioned 3-point play by freshman Sherise Williams brought the Maroon and White within 34-25. UCSB scored the game's next six points and would extend the lead to 20 on four occasions and 22 once.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 11 of 49 shots from the field (22.4 percent), 3 of 14 shots from 3-point range (21.4 percent) and 18 of 18 shots from the foul line (100 percent). The Lady Gauchos hit 24 of 45 shots from the field (53.3 percent), 0 of 2 shots from 3-point range (0 percent) a 12 of 16 shots from the foul line (75 percent).

UCSB held a 33-23 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had six assists and 15 turnovers, while the Lady Gauchos had nine assists and 17 turnovers.

Alwal and Grant each had 10 points for the Bulldogs. Alwal had a team-high five rebounds and was 6 for 6 from the free-throw line.

UCSB received 13 points from Sweets Underwood and Melissa Zornig. Angelei Aguirre added 11 points and Destini Mason added 10 points. Sweets had a double-double, as she also pulled down 12 rebounds, with nine of those coming on the defensive end.

CENTRAL FLORIDA 64

November 22, 2012 — Puerto Vallarta, Mexico

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico – Martha Alwal posted her third double-double of the season with 19 points and 11 rebounds, and Kendra Grant also scored 19 points as Mississippi State fell 64-56 to Central Florida in the final game of the Hardwood Tournament of Hope.

Alwal and Grant, both sophomores, combined to hit 12-of-25 shots from the field, including 13-of-17 shots from the foul line.

In the tournament, Alwal and Grant averaged 17.3 and 12.7 ppg, respectively. Alwal also hauled in 9.7 rebounds per contest while blocking 1.7 shots over the three games.

In the Thanksgiving Day contest, the Bulldogs (2-4) struggled out of the gate with early turnover troubles. MSU gave away possession five times, as Central Florida scored the game's first 11 points. The Bulldogs slowly answered with the game's next nine points, including six by Alwal.

MSU closed within one on two occasions before a layup by Andrea Hines capped a 9-2 run for Central Florida. That spurt pushed the Golden Knights to a 25-17 advantage.

The Bulldogs trailed by four on two more occasions before Central Florida eased out to a 30-23 advantage at halftime.

MSU posted its highest first-half shooting percentage, 47.8 percent, but was plagued by 12 turnovers.

Central Florida scored the first eight points of the second half to extend the advantage to 33-23 advantage. The Bulldogs broke the scoring drought with an Alwal free throw, and MSU closed within 41-29 on a 3-point play by Grant.

With 8:58 remaining, Grant hit two free throws to pull MSU within 10 at 45-35. Falling down again by as many 15, the resilient Bulldogs made one final push. A 3-pointer by Jerica James brought MSU within 57-51, and a trey by Grant made it 59-54 with 2:19 left.

UCF, however, answered with a 3-point play by Erika Jones to push the lead to eight, 62-54.

Darriel Gaynor cut the deficit to six with 1:33 left, but the Golden Knights added a pair of free throws to clinch the win.

"I was proud of the kids. They played hard and showed resilience today. We finally got into a little bit of a rhythm offensively in the second half, something that has been a struggle for us all year," Schaefer said. "Rebounding continues to be a thorn in our side, but hopefully after a trip like this we can fix some things with a couple days of practice before we play Wednesday."

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 20 of 52 shots from the field (38.5 percent), 2 of 12 shots from 3-point range (16.7 percent) and 14 of 19 shots from the foul line (73.7 percent). The Golden Knights hit 22 of 57 shots from the field (38.6 percent), 6 of 16 shots from 3-point range (37.5 percent) and 14 of 23 shots from the foul line (60.9 percent).

Central Florida held a 39-34 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had nine assists and 19 turnovers, while the Golden Knights had 16 assists and 16 turnovers.

The Golden Knights received 17 points from Gevenia Carter and 13 from Kayli Keough.

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Carnecia Williams scored a career-best 26 points, and sophomore Kendra Grant notched her first double-double with 16 points and 15 rebounds as Mississippi State defeated Savannah State 70-55 Wednesday night at Humphrey Coliseum.

Williams and Grant paced an MSU squad that shot a season-best 48.1-percent from the floor to win at home for the third time this season.

Grant's 15-rebound effort was six better than her previous high of nine set in the season-opening win against Houston.

The Bulldogs (3-4) shot 56 percent from the field in the opening half but were plagued by 13 turnovers. Savannah State (2-4) held a handful of leads, none larger than three points. The Lady Tigers led 22-21 before MSU answered with seven-straight points.

After SSU came right back with seven points of its own, MSU scored the final seven points of the opening half to take a 35-29 lead to the intermission.

The Bulldogs extended the run to 14-0, thanks to the first seven points of the second half. Carnecia Williams had six points during that opening burst. The Maroon and White continued the defensive pressure to keep a comfortable lead.

MSU led 54-42 with 9:27 remaining after four-straight points from Grant. The duo of Carnecia Williams and Sherise Williams took over the contest, scoring 10 of the squad's next 14 points as the lead ballooned to 68-51 with 1:11 remaining.

Sherise Williams finished one rebound shy of the double-double, adding 10 points to go along with her nine rebounds. Junior Katia May tallied a career-best six assists.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 26 of 54 shots from the field (48.1 percent), 0 of 6 shots from 3-point range (0 percent) and 18 of 26 shots from the foul line (69.2 percent). The Lady Tigers hit 18 of 49 shots from the field (36.7 percent), 0 of 4 shots from 3-point range (0 percent) and 19 of 28 shots from the free throw line (67.9 percent).

MSU held a 43-23 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs matched a season high with 16 assists. The Lady Tigers had five assists and 17 turnovers.

HATTIESBURG, Miss. – Mississippi State had nine players score, including 10 from sophomore Kendra Grant, but the effort wasn't enough as an Ance Celmina basket with six seconds left rallied Southern Mississippi to a 61-59 win Saturday afternoon at Reed Green Coliseum.

Celmina's winner came just seconds after MSU's Jerica James tied the game with at 3-point basket with 21 seconds.

James scored nine points on a trio of long-range baskets. Freshman Sherise Williams and red-shirt sophomore Carnecia Williams added nine points each as well.

The Bulldogs (3-5) led by nine at halftime and stretched that lead to as many as 13 in the early stages of the game's final half. Still, Southern Miss (4-2) found a way to rally and snap a four-game losing streak in the series between the longtime rivals.

Both teams struggled offensively in the early stages of the game. The Bulldogs finally eased to a 14-9 advantage on a jumper by Jessy Ward at the midway mark of the opening half. Southern Miss scored the game's next five points for a 14-14 tie.

The Lady Eagles battled ahead at 18-17 on a pair of free throws by Jamierra Faulkner. MSU answered with back-to-back 3-point baskets by James.

MSU scored the final eight points of the half and led 33-24 at the intermission.

The Lady Eagles eventually rallied. The lead was cut to seven at 49-42. Minutes later, Southern Miss scored seven straight points to force a 52-52 tie with 5:01 left. MSU again built a 56-53 lead on two Marthia Alwal free throws. However, that lead would not hold.

MSU held a 50-33 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had 15 assists and 35 turnovers, while the Owls had 11 assists and 15 turnovers.

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State continued its strong play in the Humphrey Coliseum as the Bulldogs knocked off Florida A&M 67-57 in women's basketball action Sunday afternoon.

The Bulldogs improved to 5-5 overall, including a 5-1 mark at home this season. Sunday's victory was the second game in a five-game homestand to round out 2012.

After scoring 15 points against Florida Atlantic last Friday, freshman Sherise Williams used a size advantage down low to score 21 points on Sunday. Williams connected on 10-of-16 shots from and also added seven rebounds. Defensively, Williams had three of her squad's eight blocked shots. Kendra Grant added 12 points, while Martha Alwal fell a point shy of her fifth double-double with nine points and 11 rebounds. Alwal also added a block to tie LaToya Thomas for third in school history with 109 for her career.

Like several other games this season, the contest was nip-and-tuck throughout. The Bulldog posted their second-largest margin of victory this season in a contest that featured six ties and 10 lead changes.

A layup by May tied the contest. A steal by Darriel Gaynor led to two free throws by Gaynor, as the hosts grabbed the lead for good. MSU eventually scored the game's next 10 points, building a 63-55 lead with 1:36 left in the contest.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 25 of 53 shots from the field (47.2 percent), 1 of 4 shots from 3-point range (25.0 percent) and 16 of 18 shots from the foul line (88.9 percent). The Rattlers hit 22 of 74 shots from the field (29.7 percent), 6 of 23 shots from 3-point range (26.1 percent) and 7 of 8 shots from the foul line (87.5 percent).

Florida A&M held a 40-38 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had 19 assists and 20 turnovers, while the Rattlers had 15 assists and 18 turnovers. The 19 assists for the Bulldogs included five by May and four each by Alwal and Gaynor. Gaynor also had three of her squad's nine steals.

Florida A&M received 18 points from Jasmine Grice, 13 points from Cristal Liriano, 10 points from Patrice Collie and 10 points from Kimberly Sparkman.

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State looked to its bench for a spark Thursday night.

Shamia Robinson delivered that spark. Robinson posted her first career double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds as the Bulldogs rallied past Jacksonville State 69-54 in a women's basketball game played at the Humphrey Coliseum.

MSU (6-5) battled past a sluggish first half, falling down by as many as 12 points. The Bulldogs used an 11-0 run in the second half to take control of the game. The victory was MSU's fifth straight at home.

The Bulldogs closed within four on two free throws by Carnecia Williams. A 3-point basket by MSU's Darriel Gaynor tied the game at 24 with 3:54 left before halftime. The Bulldogs eventually scored nine straight points and took a 30-24 lead.

MSU forced 19 first-half turnovers and led 32-28 at halftime.

In the second half, the Gamecocks trimmed the lead to three before MSU took control with a 9-2 run. A layup by Katia May placed the Maroon and White on top 43-33 with 13:23 left before halftime.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 24 of 65 shots from the field (36.9 percent), 2 of 9 shots from 3-point range (22.2 percent) and 19 of 31 shots from the foul line (61.3 percent). The Gamecocks hit 19 of 54 shots from the field (35.2 percent), 1 of 8 shots from 3-point range (12.5 percent) and 15 of 26 shots from the foul line (57.7 percent).

Jacksonville State held a 45-43 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had nine assists and 22 turnovers, while the Gamecocks had eight assists and 35 turnovers.

Grant added 15 points for MSU.

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State women's basketball coach Vic Schaefer talked about pride and playing hard at halftime Friday night.

The Bulldogs got the message loud and clear.

After a lackluster first half, MSU found a second gear in the second half, easily rolling past Northwestern State 65-49 at the Humphrey Coliseum.

Northwestern State (4-6) started the game strong, building a quick 13-4 advantage. The Lady Demons maintained a healthy advantage for most of the half. A layup by Jasmine Upchurch ran the Lady Demons' lead to 24-14.

The Bulldogs did end the first half with a 9-2 run. A pair of free throws by Katia May ran out the half as MSU trailed 31-29 at the intermission.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 24 of 60 shots from the field (40.0 percent), 4 of 9 shots from the 3-point range (44.4 percent) and 13 of 22 shots from the foul line (59.1 percent). The Lady Demons hit 15 of 54 shots from the field (27.8 percent), 3 of 10 shots from 3-point range (30.0 percent) and 16 of 22 shots from the foul line (72.7 percent).

MSU held a 43-42 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had 14 assists and 12 turnovers, while the Lady Demons had six assists and 20 turnovers.

Alwal posted her fifth double-double of the season with 10 points, 13 rebounds for MSU. Carnecia Williams led the way with 16 points. May added a season-high 11 points while dishing out six assists.

Jasmine Bradley led the Lady Demons with 15 points and 11 rebounds.

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Martha Alwal scored 21 points and Carnecia Williams added 20 as Mississippi State closed the non-conference slate with a convincing 82-60 win against Troy.

Mississippi State (8-5) scored a season-high points total while limiting Troy (3-9) to its second-lowest output of the season.

After a sluggish start on Friday night, the Bulldogs made a statement in the opening half and claimed a 48-27 halftime lead that it would not relinquish.

Alwal scored 17 of her 21 points in the first half, and Darriel Gaynor added 12 of her career-best 15 points as the Bulldogs shot 48.6 percent from the floor for the opening stanza.

With the game tied at four three minutes in, State out-scored the Trojans 20-6 over the following seven minutes. An Alwal bucket sparked the streak that included three of Gaynor's four 3-pointers in the half. Jerica James capped it with a pair of free throws to put MSU in front by 14 at 24-10.

Alwal converted an old-fashioned 3-point play to put MSU up 30-13 with 8:01 left, and she added a layup with 6:49 remaining to give the Bulldogs a 21-point advantage.

After a Kourtney Coleman 3-pointer put Troy within 15 with 5:02 left, State used a 9-0 run to extend the lead to as much as 24 before taking a 21-point advantage to the locker room.

Williams sparked the Bulldogs over the final 20 minutes, scoring 14 of her 20 points in the second half.

The Memphis native opened the half with six-straight points as the Bulldogs extended the halftime advantage to 54-27.

The Trojans gained some momentum and cut the Dawgs' lead to 16 with 11:17 to play, but Williams regained the edge for State, scoring eight-unanswered points to push the lead to 68-44 with 8:13 to go.

Troy would get no closer than 21 the rest of the way as Mississippi State won its seventh-straight game at Humphrey Coliseum.

Alwal and Williams both recorded double-doubles, adding 12 and 10 rebounds, respectively.

Against Troy, the Bulldogs hit 31-of-69 shots for 44.9 percent. State was 5-of-15 (33.3 percent) from 3-point range while knocking down 75 percent of its free-throw attempts (15-of-20).

State limited the Trojans to 37.9 percent from the floor, including a 21.4-percent tally from 3-point range, and claimed a 48-35 advantage on the boards. Mississippi State forced 25 turnovers, its third-most of the season, while committing 18. The Bulldogs dished out a season second-highest 18 assists.

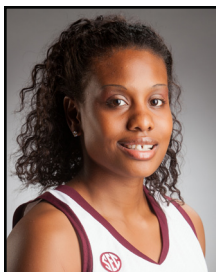
