SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

Louisville owns an overall record of 5-2 and is ranked 10th in the nation by the IWLCA poll and 12th in the Inside Lacrosse Poll. The Cardinals are 4-1 at home this season with wins over Cincinnati, Canisius, Duquesne, and William & Mary. As a team, Louisville is ranked 10th in the nation in scoring offense, averaging 14.86 goals per game and allowing just 7.29 goals per contest. Additionally, the Cardinals rank fourth in the nation in draw controls, averaging 15.71. Kaylin Morissette ranks second in the nation in draw controls, averaging 10.71 per game, while also grabbing 17 ground balls. Morissette and Faye Brust lead the team with 30 points apiece, with Morissette scoring 25 goals and adding five assists and Brust scoring 24 goals and adding six assists. Morissette currently ranks eighth in goals per game with 3.57, while Brust ranks 15th with 3.43. Cortnee Daley (20 goals and six assists) has totaled 26 points, while Hannah Koloski (23 goals and two assists) has totaled 25 points.

SCOUTING THE COMMODORES

Vanderbilt enters Saturday's matchup on a four game skid and an overall record of 3-4. The Commodores currently average 14.43 goals per game. Most recently, Vanderbilt fell to No. 9 Penn State 17-10 on the road. The Commodores have lost the previous four matches to ranked opponents, Denver, Penn, Stanford and Penn State. Individually, Mallory Schonk ranks 34th in the nation in points with 28, averaging 4.00 per game. Jill Doherty adds 27 points for the Commodores with 15 goals and 12 assists on the season. Defensively, Callahan Kent has a save percentage of .440 and has 37 saves on the season.

LOUISVILLE EARNS TOP 10 RANKING

The University of Louisville women's lacrosse team cracked the top 10 of two major polls on March 16 for the first time in school history that the Cardinals have been ranked in the top 10. The Cards dropped two hard-fought games last week. Louisville was edged by No. 3/4 Boston College in overtime before falling to No. 4/3 Duke, 10-8. The narrow margin helped the Cards prove they can be a contender in the ACC. Louisville moved into 10th in the in the latest IWLCA poll and 7th in the Lacrosse Magazine poll. They also moved up two spots to 12th in the Brine Division I women's media poll.

FIRST SHUTOUT IN SCHOOL HISTORY

The Cardinals earned their first shutout in school history against Duquesne on March 4. Louisville defeated the Dukes 17-0. Goalkeeper Ashley Peacock became the first keeper in school history to earn a shutout.

MORISSETTE BREAKS CAREER DRAW CONTROLS RECORD

Junior Kaylin Morissette broke the career draw controls record in the first game of the season. Morissette opened the season, tying her record of 14 draw controls in a game. Just seven games into the season and the midfielder has 75 draw controls.

BRUST AND MORISSETTE SCORE 100TH GOALS

Senior Faye Brust became the sixth player and junior Kaylin Morissette became the seventh player in school history to score 100 goals. Brust's second goal in the Canisius game put her over the century mark for her career. She currently has 116 goals and is fifth on the all-time scoring list for the Cardinals. Morissette became the seventh player in school history to score 100 goals with her fifth goal against Duquesne and is sixth on the all-time scoring list with 111 goals.

MORISSETTE NAMED TO THE TEWAARATON AWARD WATCH LIST

The Tewaaraton Foundation has announced that Louisville's Kaylin Morissette was one of 50 players named to the watch list. The lists include the top players across all three divisions of NCAA lacrosse and highlight the early contenders for the 2015 Tewaaraton Award, presented by Under Armour.

Morissette leads the team in scoring this season with 25 goals and five assists for 30 points. She also leads the team in draw controls with 75 on the season.

KOLOSKI STEPS UP

Hannah Koloski made an immediate impact this season. The sophomore led Louisville with a career-best six goals in the season opener against Cincinnati. She is currently third on the team in goals with 23 this season. She ranks fourth on the team with 25 points on the year.

ACC PRESEASON POLL

The University of Louisville lacrosse team was picked to finish seventh in the ACC Women's Lacrosse Preseason Poll. North Carolina and Syracuse have been selected as the preseason favorites.

The Orange and the Tar Heels each received four first-place votes and 59 points in the balloting among the ACC's eight head coaches. Two points separated the third, fourth and fifth place teams selected in the predicted order of finish as Duke was picked third (40), Virginia fourth (39) and Boston College (38) fifth. Notre Dame (29) was picked to finish sixth, ACC newcomer Louisville (16) seventh and Virginia Tech (8) eighth.

PRESEASON ALL-ACC

Junior midfielder Kaylin Morissette was one of six returning First- and-Second Team IWLCA All-Americans as selected to the preseason All-ACC Team. The 2014 BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year, Morissette broke the school's single-season record for draw controls just 10 games into the season and finished the year with 169. Nationally, she ranked second in the category with 8.45 per game. She also tallied 43 goals and 12 assists, while collecting 33 ground balls. Morissette was named a second team IWLCA All-American. She needs just 12 draw controls to become the school's career leader in the category. Through her first two seasons, the Bowmanville, Ontario, native has totaled 100 points that includes 86 goals.

BRUST AND DALEY NAMED CAPTAINS

Head coach Kellie Young announced that Faye Brust and Cortnee Daley will serve as Louisville's 2015 team captains. as the Cardinals look to build off the momentum from last year for another record-breaking season.

"I'm excited to announce this year's captains," said Young. "We are happy about the players' selection of captains and believe in their ability to guide their teammates. Their cohesive passion is remarkable and will be a driving force behind our team's success this spring.

PRESEASON OUTLOOK

Louisville returns seven starters from the 2014 team that finished with its highest ranking in program history at No. 11 by the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association. The Cardinals set a program record for wins (16) in addition to capturing their first conference regular-season and tournament titles. Louisville ran through league play, boasting a 7-0 record against conference foes. Louisville secured its first berth to the NCAA Tournament, where it defeated 10th-ranked Ohio State in double overtime and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16.
