Vanderbilt Captures South Padre Invitational Title, Returns Home For 10 Out Of Next 11 Games

The 5-0 Vanderbilt Commodores return home to Memorial Gym for a non-conference tilt with the South Alabama Jaguars, who enters the game with a 4-2 record, Thursday night at 7 p.m. The game will be televised by Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast, with Willy Daunic and Drew Maddux on the call.

VU returns to Nashville after a successful trip to South Padre Island, Texas, where the Commodores knocked off Utah State and Bradley to capture the South Padre Island Invitational on November 23 and 24. Senior wing Shan Foster was named the tournament's MVP, while freshman A.J. Ogilvy and sophomore guard Jermaine Beal, a DeSoto, Texas native, made the All-Tournament team.

The Commodores led from the opening tip in the final against Bradley, and heading into the half, Vanderbilt held a comfortable 53-35 lead. VU's lead, which had ballooned to as many as 24 with 1:33 to go in the first half, quickly evaporated in the second half, as the Braves chipped away at Vanderbilt's lead, and closed the gap to one point with 2:40 to play on a Theron Wilson layup to make the score 85-84 in favor of the Commodores.

After Foster missed a three on VU's next possession, and senior forward Ross Neltner missed the put back, Bradley's Andrew Warren had a good look at a three but his chance rimmed out, and after another empty Vanderbilt possession, the Braves' leading scorer, Daniel Ruffin, missed a jumper to give Bradley the lead. Alex Gordon then made a jumper in the paint with 51 seconds remaining to push the Vanderbilt lead to three, 87-84.

On the ensuing Braves possession, Ruffin missed a three, and after an offensive rebound by Jeremy Crouch, Warren saw his game-tying three-point attempt rim out. Gordon grabbed the defensive rebound, and on his charge down the court, was

intentionally fouled by Wilson. Gordon made both free throws, and the Commodores converted on their next six charity stripe opportunities to close out the Braves.

Bradley capitalized on 13 second-half turnovers to get back into the game and made 10 threes in the closing stanza at a 41.7% clip (10-24), while also converting on 51.4% of its shots from the floor in the half.

Vanderbilt had its free throw shooting stroke working in the key statistic of the championship game, knocking down 28 of 31 shots, a 90.3% clip. Also, the Commodores attempted and made 22 more free throws than the Braves.

The Commodores also continued its hot shooting from the floor, making 51.7% of its shots for the game.

This will be the first meeting between Vanderbilt and South Alabama.

Scouting South Alabama

South Alabama enters Thursday's contest with a 4-2 record after defeating Chattanooga, 84-67, in Anaheim, Calif., at the Anaheim Classic. The Jaguars went 2-1 at the Anaheim Classic, defeating Chattanooga and San Diego, and losing to Miami (Ohio).

Demetric Bennett, a transfer from SMU, leads the Jaguars in scoring, averaging 19.3 points per game. DeAndre Coleman leads South Alabama on the glass, averaging 8.3 rebounds per game. In an interesting note, the starting five against Chattanooga have all transferred to USA from a four-year college.

Head coach Ronnie Arrow is in his first season of his second go around with the Jaguars. Arrow is 118-95 in eight years with South Alabama, and 252-186 in 17 years overall as a head coach.

Media Availability

Beginning this Monday, December 3, and to remain in affect for the rest of the season, Vanderbilt men's basketball coaches and players will be available for interviews only twice weekly on Mondays and Thursdays prior to practice. While this policy is new to Vanderbilt men's basketball, it is one commonly used by the majority of schools in the SEC and is intended to channel the increasing number of media interview requests into a manageable format for Commodore players and coaches.

There will be an exception for the Commodores' games December 31 to January 5 due to the amount of games that week, and in the weeks of the Tennessee game in Knoxville and the game versus Kentucky in Nashville, because those games are on a Thursday and Tuesday, respectively. Media schedules for these weeks of the season will be emailed the week before the games take place.

Please make note of this new policy. Emails will be sent out on Monday and Thursday mornings with the exact time for player and coach availability.

Stallings Versus South Alabama

Commodore head coach Kevin Stallings has never faced South Alabama as a head coach.

Vanderbilt Captures South Padre Island Invitational Title

The Commodores captured the South Padre Island Invitational title with wins over Utah State and Bradley at the South Padre Convention Center. **Shan Foster** won MVP honors for the tournament, while freshman **A.J. Ogilvy** and sophomore **Jermaine Beal** were named to the All-Tournament team.

Vanderbilt last won a regular season tournament in November of 2000, when the Commodores won the America's Youth Classic, which was held at Memorial Gym. VU defeated South Carolina State, Western Carolina, and St. Joseph's that year.

Foster Moves Up Career Scoring List

Senior Shan Foster, after his 22-point performance against Utah State, is now in 13th place all-time in scoring at Vanderbilt with 1,414 career points. He is also now in fourth place all-time in threes made in a career with 253 made threes.

Foster Named SEC Player of the Week

Foster was named the SEC Player of the Week for the week of Nov. 12-19 for his 21-point, eight-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's 77-70 win at Toledo on November 13. The award was the first for Foster in his four-year career, and the first for a Vanderbilt player since Derrick Byars won the award on February 19, 2007.

Ogilvy Solidifying Paint For 'Dores

Freshman A.J. Ogilvy, from Canberra, Australia, made his collegiate debut against Austin Peay with 18 points and nine rebounds in 24 minutes of action, the most for a Vanderbilt freshman since Phil Cox scored 30 points to open his college career at Duke in a game the Commodores won 76-75 in double overtime to begin the 1981-82 campaign.

In the Commodores' game against Valparaiso, Ogilvy scored 21 points, 19 of which came in the second half. Overall, Ogilvy is ranked in the top 20 in the Southeastern

SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Conference in five categories, and is the league's leading freshman scorer by nearly three points per game. So far this season, he has scored 20 or more points in three games.

Ogilvy, a 6'10 center, played in the FIBA Under-19 World Championships this summer for his native Australia and averaged 22.3 points and 9.8 rebounds in nine games. He finished third in scoring at the event and posted six double-doubles, including a 32-point, 11-rebound effort against Spain.

Ogilvy Named SEC Freshman Of The Week

Ogilvy was named the SEC Freshman of the Week Nov. 5-12 for his performance against Austin Peay, when he scored 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds. Ogilvy is the first Commodore freshman to win the award since it began in 2005-06.

'Dores Hot In 2007-08

Through three games of the 2007-08 season, Vanderbilt has shot 51.8% (144-278) from the floor, which is near the top of the SEC, and 45.2% (38-84) from three, which is also near the top of the SEC.

Free Throw Shooting Carries 'Dores Past Bradley

In the South Padre Island Invitational finals against Bradley, Vanderbilt made 28 out of 31 free throws, a 90.3% clip. It was VU's best percentage of the season, and the first time the Commodores were 90% or better from the free throw line since January 17, 2007, when Vanderbilt was 9-of-10 at the free throw line.

Speaking of the Charity Stripe...

Vanderbilt's 28 made free throws is the most for a Commodore squad since December 30, 2000, when VU made 29 in a 97-74 loss at Boston College. Additionally, Vanderbilt has made more free throws (91) this season than its opponents have attempted (84), and goes to the line an average of 25.2 times a game.

Point Guard Play A Plus

Sophomore point guard Jermaine Beal has raised his level of play this year, and really sharpened his game at the South Padre Invitational. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, had ten assists against one turnover in the two games on the island, averaged 13.5 points per game, and was named to the All-Tournament team. His backup, freshman Keegan Bell has not scored yet this season, but he has 14 assists to only four turnovers in 55 minutes of action in 2007-08.

Home Sweet Home

Ten out of the next 11 games for Vanderbilt will be in the friendly confines of Memorial Gymnasium, with the only road game coming on December 12 at Big East member DePaul. Other than the matchup with the Blue Demons, Vanderbilt does not hit the road again until SEC play, when the Commodores travel to Kentucky on January 12.

How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

Six Letterwinners Return From Last Year's Team

Six letterwinners and three starters return from last year's Sweet 16 team, which ended the year at 22-12. Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner are the returning starters, and Jermaine Beal, George Drake, and Alan Metcalfe return as letterwinners. In all, 53.3% of last year's total points, 50.7% of total rebounds, and 60.6% of total assists return in 2007-08.

Vanderbilt Posts 15th 20-win Season in School History

Vanderbilt recorded the 15th 20-win season in school history with a 99-90 overtime win at South Carolina on Feb. 28. It marked the third 20-win campaign under eighth-year head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted more 20-win seasons with six.

Commodores Among Nation's Best Versus Ranked Opponents In 2006-07

Vanderbilt's six wins against nationally ranked foes (AP poll) ranked among the most in the nation during the regular season in 2006-07. Vanderbilt won a school record five consecutive games against ranked teams in 2006-07 -- including three in an eight-day stretch against then-No. 10 Alabama (94-73); at then-No. 25 Kentucky (72-67) and at then-No. 21 LSU (64-53) -- before losing at top-ranked

Florida on Jan. 31. The previous school record for one season was three set four times, last during the 2000 campaign.

3-Point Streak Continues In 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 669 consecutive games entering the 2007-2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (674) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (581) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is reknown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combina-

tion gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also enter this season with a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10 in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 652-184 (.780) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- Vanderbilt was 14-3 in the gymnasium in 2006-07, marking the 20th time in the past 21 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games. VU is 2-0 so far in 2007-08.
- Vanderbilt has won 91 of its last 97 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 138-13 non-conference record at home (.914 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 71-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home.

Nwankwo Remains A Valued Commodore

Davis Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md., will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbing 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.

Commodores Sign Two In Early Signing Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that forwards Lance Goulbourne and Steve Tchiengang have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall 2008.

"We are extremely excited to add Lance and Steve to our program," Stallings said. "Not only do I feel strongly about their playing ability and versatility, but they are the kind of young men we want to have at Vanderbilt. They both come from excellent families and are diligent students."

Goulbourne, from Brooklyn, N.Y., and currently attending The Hun School in Princeton, N.J., is a 6'7, 215 pound small forward averaged 12 points and eight

rebounds per game his junior year in 2006-07. He also stood out this summer at the Nike Global Challenge in Beaverton, Oregon, an elite tournament for high school rising seniors where his team went 5-3 against international competition. Goulbourne was ranked 90th by Rivals.com and was rated 18th among small forwards.

"I just felt comfortable there, and my family loved it," Goulbourne said. "It was just one of those feelings that came to me. I just felt like Vanderbilt was where I needed to be. They really have a good program academically and athletically."

Goulbourne chose Vanderbilt over Marquette, Rutgers, Louisville and Notre Dame.

Steve Tchiengang is a 6'9, 235 pound power forward from Montverde Academy in Florida. Originally from Cameroon, Tchiengang is rated No. 81 by Rivals.com and is the 25th best prospect at the power forward position. He chose the Commodores over Baylor, Georgia Tech, Notre Dame and Oklahoma.

"I felt comfortable that Vanderbilt is the place that God wanted me," Tchiengang said. "The coaching staff did a great job of recruiting me and making me feel wanted. I feel there is a great opportunity there and I get to play in a great Conference. I am very excited."

"We targeted these young men very early in the recruiting process, even before their junior year of high school began," Stallings said. "We are thrilled they have chosen Vanderbilt and feel they will be great additions to our team."

The Governors used a 13-4 run, capped by an inside basket by Drake Reed, to cut the lead to 67-59 with 6:36 remaining.

Ogilvy scored 23 points to lead four Vanderbilt double digit scorers in Vanderbilt's 95-86 win over Bradley in the finals of the South Padre Island Invitational evening at the South Padre Island Convention Center. Shan Foster, who added 22 points for Vanderbilt in the win over the Braves, was named the tournament's MVP, with Ogilvy and sophomore guard Jermaine Beal joining Foster on the All-Tournament team.

The Commodores led from the opening tip, and heading into the half, Vanderbilt held a comfortable 53-35 lead. VU's lead, which had ballooned to as many as 24 with 1:33 to go in the first half, quickly evaporated in the second half, as the Braves chipped away at Vanderbilt's lead, and closed the gap to one point with 2:40 to play on a Theron Wilson layup to make the score 85-84 in favor of the Commodores.

After Foster missed a three on VU's next possession, and senior forward Ross Neltner missed the put back, Bradley's Andrew Warren had a good look at a three but his chance rimmed out, and after another empty Vanderbilt possession, the Braves' leading scorer, Daniel Ruffin, missed a jumper to give Bradley the lead. Alex Gordon then made a jumper in the paint to push the Vanderbilt lead to three, 87-84. VU made their last eight free throws of the game to keep the Braves at bay.

Vanderbilt had its free throw shooting stroke working in the key statistic of the championship game, knocking down 28 of 31 shots, a 90.3% clip. Also, the Commodores attempted and made 22 more free throws than the Braves.

Ogilvy led all Vanderbilt scorers with 23 points, with Foster chipping in 22. Beal added 13 points, and Alex Gordon tallied 10 points in the winning effort.
