No. 12 Vanderbilt Faces No. 24 Tennessee in SEC Quarterfinals

The No. 12 Vanderbilt women's tennis team opens up play in the Southeastern Conference Women's Tennis Tournament on Friday as it faces No. 24 Tennessee in the quarterfinals at 2 p.m. at the Yarbrough Tennis Center.

Vanderbilt enters the match with a 17-4 overall record and a 7-4 mark in conference matches. The Commodores earned a first round bye in the conference tournament due to their fourth place finish in the regular season standings. Vanderbilt closed out the regular season with a dramatic 5-2 comeback victory over No. 23 Kentucky.

Tennessee enters the quarterfinals of the conference tournament with a 14-8 overall record. The Lady Vols defeated Mississippi State 4-0 in the first round of the tournament on Thursday. Tennessee sophomore Caitlin Whoriskey was honored with All-SEC second team honors on Wednesday night.

The Commodores and Lady Vols met earlier in the season with Vanderbilt earning a 7-0 victory. The Commodores failed to drop a set as they played one of their best matches of the season.

Tennessee leads the all-time series against Vanderbilt 28-18. However, the Commodores have won four straight in the series, including a victory earlier in the season.

2008 Vanderbilt Women's Tennis Match Notes



The Coaches

Vanderbilt: Geoff Macdonald enters his 14th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt women's tennis program. Under his direction, the Commodores have made 13 consecutive NCAA Tournaments and have been to the round of 16 in the last nine tournaments. Macdonald owns a 298-94 record at Vanderbilt, making him the winningest coach in Commodore history. He has been named Coach of the Year three times, including earning that recognition from the SEC in 2000. Macdonald recently picked up his 400th career victory in Vanderbilt's 4-3 victory over Notre Dame. His career record stands at 412-130.

Tennessee: Mike Patrick and Sonia Hahn-Patrick serve as co-head coaches for the Lady Vols. Mike Patrick is in his 21st season at Tennessee. He has led the Lady Vols to 13 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 17 winning seasons. He was named SEC Co-Coach of the Year in 2001 and has earned Southeast Region Coach of the Year three times. Sonia Hahn-Patrick is in her 11th season at Tennessee. She was named ITA National Co-Coach of the Year in 2001 and UT has reached the NCAA Tournament each year during her coaching tenure.

Scouting Tennessee

Tennessee enters the quarterfinals of the conference tournament with a 14-8 overall record. The Lady Vols defeated Mississippi State 4-0 in the first round of the tournament on Thursday. Tennessee sophomore Caitlin Whoriskey was honored with All-SEC second team honors on Wednesday night.

Whoriskey is the only Lady Vol ranked in singles, coming in at No. 47. The tandem of Whoriskey and Zsafia Zubor are ranked 13th nationally in doubles competition.

Series History vs. Tennessee

Tennessee leads the all-time series against Vanderbilt 28-18. However, the Commodores have won four straight in the series, including a victory earlier in the season. Vanderbilt played one of its best matches of the season in its 7-0 win over Tennessee on April 4.

Last Time vs. Tennessee

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The No. 13 Vanderbilt women's tennis team moved into a tie for third place with an impressive 7-0 sweep of No. 17 Tennessee on Friday afternoon at the Currey Tennis Center. The Commodores improve to 16-3 overall and 6-3 in the Southeastern Conference, while the Lady Vols drop to 13-6 and 6-3 in league play.

"We played really well today," Vanderbilt women's tennis head coach Geoff Macdonald

said. "I think Tennessee's a little dinged up right now and things broke our way. The doubles point was very important to get. I thought we played a really, really good match."

Vanderbilt took an early 1-0 lead in the match by capturing the doubles point. Taka Bertrand and Keilly Ulery were the first Commodore team to register a win in doubles play by defeating Jennifer Meredith and Connor Vogel 8-2 at the third position.

Caroline Ferrell and Catherine Newman clinched the doubles point for the 'Dores with an 8-5 victory at the No. 2 position with an 8-5 triumph over Rosalia Alda and Ghizela Schutte.

The most competitive doubles match came at the first position between the 11th-ranked team of Caitlin Whoriskey and Zsafia Zubor and VU's 54th-ranked duo of Amanda Taylor and Courtney Ulery. Down 7-5, Taylor and Ulery battled back to even the match at seven and force a tiebreaker. In the tiebreaker, the Commodores jumped out to an early 2-0 lead and never looked back, winning 7-4 to sweep all three doubles matches.

"We've really worked hard on our doubles play," Macdonald said. "If you look at some of the matches earlier in the year, some of those we lost by just a couple of points. I'm very proud of the team."

It didn't take long for the Commodores to extend their lead to 2-0. Playing at the second singles position, No. 47 Newman easily dispatched of Schutte in straight sets, 6-1, 6-1. The win was the fifth for Newman in SEC play and improved her overall dual match mark to 13-6.

Freshman Keilly Ulery brought Vanderbilt within one game of clinching the match with a 6-3, 6-1 win over Alda at No. 5 singles. The win was the third consecutive singles victory for Ulery and improved her dual match record to 12-5.

No. 61 Courtney Ulery secured Vanderbilt's eighth straight victory with a win over Zubor at the fourth singles position. Ulery won the opening set 6-3, and jumped out to a 4-1 lead in the second set before cruising to a 6-3 victory.

No. 96 Bertrand extended her singles winning streak to 11 with a win over Samantha Orlin. After seeing a 5-2 lead in the first set disappear, Bertrand responded by winning a tiebreaker 7-4 to claim the first set 7-6. The Great Falls, Va., native had no trouble in the second set, claiming a 6-1 victory to improve her dual match record to an impressive 17-2 and 8-1 in conference matches.

No. 23 Taylor extended the lead to 6-0 with a 7-6 (3), 6-3 victory over No. 51 Whoriskey at No. 1 singles. The win improved Taylor's overall record to 15-4 and 6-3 in the SEC.

In Our Last Match...

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Trailing 2-0, the No. 12 Vanderbilt women's tennis team won the next five singles matches to secure a stunning 5-2 comeback victory over No. 23 Kentucky on a blustery Saturday afternoon at the Currey Tennis Center. With the win, Vanderbilt improves to 17-4 and 7-4 in SEC play, while Kentucky drops to 14-8 and 5-6 in league play.

"It was about as close a match as you can have," Vanderbilt women's tennis head coach Geoff Macdonald said. "It could have easily gone 5-2 in Kentucky's favor. I commend Kentucky. They competed really, really well. They played like a top-15 team. It was a neat moment for Amanda Taylor to get the fourth point against a really good opponent."

The win was also important for the Commodores because it secures a bye in next week's SEC Tournament. Vanderbilt will open up postseason play on Friday, April 18 against either the fifth seed or the 12 seed.

Vanderbilt dropped the doubles point for the first time since its March 7 match against Arkansas. Kentucky grabbed an early advantage at No. 1 as Carolina Escamilla and Christine Johnston defeated the 54th-ranked tandem of Amanda Taylor and Courtney Ulery 8-5.

On Court 2, the Kentucky duo of Megan Broderick and Alaina Trgovich jumped out to a commanding 6-0 lead. However, Vanderbilt's Caroline Ferrell and Catherine Newman stormed back to win the next seven games to grab a 7-6 lead. The Wildcats fought back winning the next three games to take the match 9-7 and clinch the doubles point.

Kentucky closed out the sweep of the doubles matches at the No. 3 position as Whitney Spencer and Lauren Meier got past Taka Bertrand and Keilly Ulery 8-6.

The Wildcats extended their lead to 2-0 with a win at No. 6 singles. Meier defeated Ferrell in straight sets, winning 6-3, 6-1.

Vanderbilt got on the board at No. 4 singles as No. 61 Courtney Ulery was about to defeat Alaina Trgovich 6-4, 6-4. The win improves Ulery's dual match record to 15-6 and 5-6 in conference matches.

Bertrand got the Commodores even with a win at No. 3 singles. The Great Falls, Va., native defeated Kentucky's Johnston 6-4, 7-5. With the win, Bertrand closes out the regular season with an 18-3 dual match record and a 9-2 mark in SEC matches.

"I was up 5-3 (in the second set) and then I got really nervous," Bertrand said. "I was really struggling to break her serve. Fortunately,

I got the break at 5-5 and was able to serve out the match. I didn't want to go to a third set."

On Court 2, No. 47 Newman gave Vanderbilt its first lead of the day. After losing the first set 6-2, Newman came back to only give up three games in the next two sets, winning 6-1, 6-2.

Playing in her last regular season home match, No. 23 Taylor secured the comeback win for Vanderbilt at No. 1 singles. Kentucky's Broderick won the opening set 6-4. The Vanderbilt senior mounted an incredible comeback, winning the second set 6-4 and capturing the decisive third set 7-5 to seal the victory for the Commodores.

"It was really special to have a chance to clinch the match," Taylor said. "More than anything, I was just thinking about my teammates and how hard they had fought. I never really felt all that great out there today. More than anything, it was about helping my team and fighting for them."

Keilly Ulery closed out the match with a three-set victory at No. 5 singles. Ulery dropped the opening set 7-5, but came back to win the next two sets 6-1, 7-5. With the victory, Ulery improves to 9-2 in conference matches and 14-5 in dual match play.

Vanderbilt at the SEC Tournament

The Commodores will be looking for their first SEC Tournament championship this week. Vanderbilt has advanced to the title match once, falling to Florida in the 2004 tournament. Last season, the 'Dores defeated Kentucky 4-2 in the quarterfinals before falling to Florida 4-1 in the semifinals.

Doubles Point Critical for 'Dores

The doubles point has proven critical for the Commodores in 2008. The Black and Gold has won the doubles point 14 times during the season. Vanderbilt is 13-1 in matches where it wins the doubles point, with its only loss coming to No. 10 Georgia.

Reaching the Century Mark

Two of Vanderbilt's seniors have reached the 100 singles wins mark in their Vanderbilt career. Taka Bertrand is the all-time leader in singles wins with 120, while Amanda Taylor has won 104 matches in her four-year Vanderbilt career. Bertrand is also nearing the 100-win mark in doubles play, as she currently has 97 doubles victories in her career.

Bertrand Sets Vanderbilt All-Time Singles Wins Record

of Bertrand's career, surpassing the previous record of 114 held by Julie Ditty. Bertrand's career record is 120-34.

Four Commodores Earn SEC Weekly Honors

Junior Courtney Ulery, seniors Taka Bertrand and Amanda Taylor and freshman Keilly Ulery have all earned weekly honors from the SEC this season. Ulery received the honor after her performance against No. 23 Michigan and No. 9 Notre Dame. Ulery, who opened the spring season with seven straight victories, defeated No. 88 Colleen Rielley to even the match against the Fighting Irish. Ulery also partnered with Amanda Taylor to down the 50th-ranked doubles team of Kali Krisik and Rielley 8-5 in Vanderbilt's win over Notre Dame.

Bertrand received the award on March 12 after picking up three singles victories the week before. One of those victories was an 6-2, 6-3 upset win over No. 33 Kirsten Flower of Georgia Tech. The award marked the third time in her career that she had received the recognition.

Taylor received the award a week later on March 19. She defeated two ranked opponents, including No. 88 Liset Brito. After dropping the first set 6-4 to Brito and falling behind 5-2 in the second set, Taylor came back to win the second set 7-5 and won a 10-point tiebreaker 10-2 to clinch the match.

Keilly Ulery earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors after her performance in the season finale against Kentucky. Ulery came back to defeat Whitney Spencer. Ulery was down 5-2 in the third set, before coming back to win the next five games to win the set 7-5 and capture the match.



'Dores Make History in Albuquerque

The 2008 Vanderbilt women's tennis team made history with the pair of victories it picked up in Albuquerque, N.M. With the wins, the 2008 squad became the first Vanderbilt team to win a match in the Mountain Time zone. The 'Dores defeated New Mexico 5-2 and bettered Colorado 7-0.

Closing in on 300

Vanderbilt head coach Geoff Macdonald stands just two victories shy of 300 in his career as the Commodore head coach. Macdonald's 298-94 record at Vanderbilt makes him the winningest coach in school history. Macdonald also picked up another milestone against No. 9 Notre Dame, picking up his 400th career victory. Vanderbilt Picked Third in SEC East By Conference Coaches

The Vanderbilt women's tennis team was picked to finish third in the SEC East by the league coaches in a poll released January 16. Florida was selected to win the overall league title.

The Commodores are ranked 16th in the preseason poll released last week by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association. The 'Dores return five letterwinners and four starters from a team that finished 19-9 last season and advanced to the NCAA round of 16 for the 10th consecutive year.

Florida received 67 points in the poll and eight votes as the overall league champion. Perennial power Georgia was picked to finish second in the eastern division, with 59 points and two votes as overall league champion. The Commodores were selected third by the coaches, receiving two votes for overall league champion and 46 points overall. Rounding out the predicted eastern division standings was South Carolina, Tennessee and Kentucky.

In the west, Arkansas was predicted to win the division, followed closely behind by LSU. Auburn was picked third in the division, while Ole Miss was expected to finish fourth. Alabama and Mississippi State were predicted to finish fifth and sixth, respectively.

The preseason poll is voted on by the SEC

women's tennis coach and is based on a 6-5-4-3-2-1 tally.

Familiar Face Joins Commodore Coaching Staff

Former Vanderbilt standout Aleke Tsoubanos joins the Commodore coaching staff this season as an assistant coach. Tsoubanos enjoyed one of the most decorated careers in Vanderbilt women's tennis history. She earned NCAA All-American honors from 2002-04, was a three-time ITA All-American and was a first-time All-SEC selection. Tsoubanos still holds the record for most doubles victories in a season and in a career. Before returning to Vanderbilt, she played three years of professional tennis and most recently played for the St. Louis Aces in World Team Tennis.

A Perfect 13

Junior Courtney Ulery (Wellington, Fla.) enjoyed a breakout fall season, finishing with a perfect 13-0 record. Ulery won her singles flight at the Furman Fall Classic, the Hoosier Classic, the June Stewart Invitational and the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic. During her run, Ulery defeated three nationally ranked players. Because of her success, the previously unraked Ulery stormed into the rankings, earning a No. 13 ranking in the first national poll released by the ITA.

Vanderbilt Signs Three in Fall

Vanderbilt women's tennis head coach Geoff Macdonald announced that Chelsea Preeg, Heather Steinbauer and Jacqueline Wu have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play women's tennis for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2008.

"I'm thrilled to sign these three players," Macdonald said. "They are future stars at Vanderbilt and great student-athletes. They were widely recruited across the country. We're thrilled to be able to land what I think is one of the best recruiting classes in the country."

Preeg from Naples, Fla., has been one of the top ranked junior players in the United States for the past eight years. Currently ranked sixth in the girls 18 and under division, Preeg has won numerous junior championships and has been ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation. Preeg captured the Florida State Girls 18 and under Championships when she was only 14 years old. She chose Vanderbilt over Clemson, Duke and North Carolina.

A native of The Woodlands, Texas, Steinbauer currently attends The Woodlands College Park High School. She is ranked No. 36 in the country according to tennisrecruiting.net and is the No. 2 ranked player in the state of Texas. Steinbauer has finished highly in several national events, including winning the girls' 18 division at the 2007 Houston Coca-Cola SCMZ and finishing second at the 2007 USTA National Opens. She chose Vanderbilt over Florida State, Georgia Tech, North Carolina and TCU.

Wu from Holmdel, N.J., is ranked 59th in the country and is the top ranked player in her state, according to tennisrecruiting.net. She advanced to the semifinals at the 2007 International Grass Court Championships. Wu was also a member of the victorious East team at the 2006 USTA National Girls' 18 Team Championship.

Four Commodores Ranked Nationally in Singles

Vanderbilt has four players ranked nationally in singles in the latest poll released by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

Senior Amanda Taylor is the highest-ranked Commodore, coming in at No. 23. Taylor has a 17-4 dual match record and has won nine of her last 10 matches.

Sophomore Catherine Newman is ranked 46th in the latest poll. Newman is 14-7 on the season in singles play.

Junior Courtney Ulery is the third Commodore ranked in singles, coming in at No. 62. Ulery has a record of 15-6 in singles.

Senior Taka Bertrand checks in at No. 118 in the latest singles poll. Bertrand has the best singles record on the Commodore squad, with a 18-3 mark.

The doubles tandem of Taylor and Courtney Ulery are also ranked in the latest doubles poll. The Commodore duo is ranked 29th in the country. They have a record of 14-6 in dual matches, including a 7-3 mark in SEC

matches.

Commodores Seek 10th Consecutive Sweet 16

The Commodores enter the 2008 season looking for their 10th consecutive appearance in the NCAA round of 16. Last season, the Commodores made it nine in a row by easily dispatching of Murray State and Tennessee in the opening two rounds played at the Currey Tennis Center. The Commodores fell in the round of 16 to perennial power Stanford. The Commodores have made the NCAA Tournament in each of Geoff Macdonald's 13 years with the team, advancing as far as the national championship match in 2001.

SEC Title For Newman

Sophomore Catherine Newman (Greensboro, N.C.) finished the fall season in style, winning the singles 'A' flight at the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic in Auburn, Ala. Newman, who was ranked No. 28 in the fall by the ITA, defeated three ranked players to win the title, including No. 17 Megan Alexander of Florida in the semifinals and South Carolina's Gira Schofield, ranked 36th, in the finals. Newman also won three matches at the ITA Southeast Indoor Championships. For the fall season, Newman finished with a 10-3 record.

Beating No. 1

The highlight of senior Amanda Taylor's fall came at the Riviera/ITA All-American Championships. In the opening round of the main singles draw, Taylor defeated No. 1 Megan Falcon of LSU in straight sets 6-2, 6-3. Assistant coach Aleke Tsoubanos called Taylor's performance "some of the most flawless tennis I've ever seen her play." Taylor went on to fall in the second round of the tournament, dropping a hard-fought, three-set match to No. 14 Laura Vallverdu of Miami (Fla.).

Geoff Macdonald enters his 14th season as the head coach of the women's tennis team. During the previous 13 seasons, the two-time SEC Coach of the Year has placed the Commodores among the nation's elite programs on a consistent basis.

Since Macdonald joined the Vanderbilt staff in 1994, the Commodore tennis program has developed a reputation for rapid player improvement, strong commitments to coaching, and unmatched excellence on the court and in the classroom.

Before Macdonald's arrival, the Vanderbilt women's tennis program had never been ranked higher than No. 28 in the nation. Under his leadership, the Commodores have finished no lower than No. 16 in each of the past nine years, including a school record No. 2 ranking at the end of the 2004 season. Vanderbilt has ranked in the top three of the Southeastern Conference eight of the past 10 years, and has cultivated several nationally ranked players and doubles teams.

Last season may have been one of Macdonald's finest coaching jobs. After starting off the season 2-5, the Commodores rebounded to win their next 12 matches. The Commodores finished third in the Southeastern Conference with a 9-2 record and advanced to their 13th straight NCAA Tournament. Vanderbilt easily disposed of Murray State and Tennessee in the first two rounds of the tournament before falling to perennial powerhouse Stanford in the round of 16. The Commodores finished the year with a 19-9 record and were ranked 16th by the ITA.

While Macdonald's leadership continues to improve the Commodore program every season, Macdonald's impact was felt immediately in his very first year at Vanderbilt in 1995. The team finished the year 16-8, including an 8-3 mark in the SEC and advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time in school history.

Once Vanderbilt began its rise to the top, the achievements kept coming. In 1996, the Commodores posted a 24-7 record, finished second in the SEC, advanced to the SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time and, once again, earned a berth in the NCAA Championships, advancing to the Round of 16. The team's 24 wins were the third most in the nation that year.

The team continued to improve with each successful season and in 2001 the 'Dores finally found themselves in the national spotlight as they competed in the NCAA finals. The event marked the first time that any Vanderbilt sports team had played for a national championship. Despite falling to the Stanford Cardinal, Macdonald's squad ended the season with a 26-5 record and a No. 4 national ranking, while three singles players and two doubles teams earned individual bids to the NCAA championships.

The following season, Macdonald not only matched the success of the previous year, but led the 'Dores to a record setting 27 wins. The team also advanced to the finals of the National Team Indoors tournament, which features sixteen of the top ranked teams in the country. Following the season, Sarah Riske and Aleke Tsoubanos were both named ITA All-Americans.

In 2003, Macdonald oversaw the final year of Sarah Riske's career, who became a two-time All-American in both singles and doubles. Riske left VU as the winningest doubles player, but Tsoubanos has since grabbed that title.

In 2004, the Commodores returned to the Final Four in the NCAA Tournament where they lost to undefeated Stanford, the eventual national champions. The 2004 Commodore team included All American, All Academic and ITA Scholar Aleke Tsoubanos who is entering her first year as an assistant for the women's tennis team. Other honors achieved by Commodores included Annie Menees' All Academic and ITA Scholar awards, while Audra Falk and Kelly Schmandt landed All-American honors.

In 2006, the Commodores posted a 23-5 record en route to the team's eighth consecutive NCAA Sweet 16 appearance, despite the young team's lack of senior representatives. Following the season, junior Amanda Fish became the seventh

Commodore under Macdonald to receive ITA All-American honors.

Macdonald has earned three Coach of the Year honors, including SEC recognition for his 2000 team, which included four ITA ranked singles players. He previously earned the title at Duke and Louisiana State University, where he began his coaching career in 1988.

Before coming to Nashville, Macdonald was the head coach at Duke University. Macdonald was honored with ACC Coach of the Year honors in 1992. While in Durham, he guided the Blue Devils to three conference championships and three appearances in the NCAA tournament, where Duke made two appearances in the quarterfinals and one semifinal appearance.

During his three years with the Tigers, Macdonald took LSU from last in the SEC to the NCAA Championship as the No. 13 seed in just three years. Following the Tigers' 1991 season, Macdonald was named the SEC Coach of the Year. Macdonald amassed a 50-24 record while at the helm of the LSU women's tennis program.

As a player at the University of Virginia, Macdonald capped off a successful collegiate career by winning the ACC singles title in 1981. He advanced to the NCAA Championship, where he defeated David Pate in the first round.

Macdonald was named the ACC's Most Valuable Player and also won the league's Sportsmanship Award. He finished second to basketball great Ralph Sampson in the Athlete of the Year voting at Virginia in 1981.

After his collegiate career, Macdonald played professionally for three years. Macdonald scored wins over David Pate, Wally Masur, Jacob Hlasek and Juan Aguilera. He also gained Grand Slam experience, playing in the U.S. Open. Among his victories was the Florida State Closed Men's Singles Championship.

Following his pro playing career, Macdonald became a private instructor until being named head coach at LSU. And now, as a Commodore, Macdonald believes the climate at Vanderbilt is right to produce national championship caliber teams. And, toward that end, he adheres to a simple coaching philosophy: Hard work and hours of individual attention for each player every week.

Macdonald is married to Kate Daniels, a highly acclaimed English professor at Vanderbilt, who also has taught at Wake Forest, LSU, Virginia, UMass and Bennington College. They have three children – Sam, 21; Gus, 16; and Jane, 14.
