Vanderbilt Returns Home For Game With Valparaiso

Vanderbilt returns home from the road after a victorious trip to Toledo, where the Commodores raced out to an early 18-0 lead and came away with a 77-70 win over the Rockets at Savage Hall. The win improved VU's record to 2-0 on the season.

Senior wing man Shan Foster scored a team-high 21 points and was the team's leading rebounder with eight on the night to lead VU. Foster was tabbed as the SEC Player of the Week for his exploits against the Rockets by the league office, the first player of the week honor in his four-year career.

Freshman A.J. Ogilvy also tallied 20 points on nine-of-12 shooting from the floor and added two blocks for the Commodores in the winning effort. Foster and Ogilvy were the only Vanderbilt players to score in double figures for the Commodores. Vanderbilt shot 58.3% (28-48) from the floor for the game, including 66.7% (14-21) in the second half, and had 19 assists on 28 made baskets.

Vanderbilt and Valparaiso will meet for the second time in the history of the two schools, with the Commodores winning the only matchup, 74-66, on November 20, 1996 in the Preseason NIT. Tuesday's game will be the second game for the Commodores in the South Padre Invitational after defeating Austin Peay in the tournament and season-opener for VU, 81-67, on November 10. Vanderbilt will play the final two rounds of the tournament Friday and Saturday in South Padre Island, Texas, where they will play Utah State on Friday and either Iowa or Bradley on Saturday.

Scouting Valparaiso

Valparaiso enters the game with the Commodores with a 2-0 record after defeating Grace College in their opener and IPFW on Thursday night. The Crusaders topped the Mastodons Thursday on their home floor, 74-64, behind Jake Diebler and Jarryd Loyd's 10point efforts. Valparaiso shot 50% from the floor and 60% from three on the night, and only committed ten turnovers against IPFW.

Vanderbilt Wins First Game In South Padre Invitational; Valparaiso Next

Saturday's win over Austin Peay marked the first game of the South Padre Invitational for Vanderbilt. The Commodores, along with Utah State, Bradley, and Iowa, will host the first two rounds on campus, and then gather in South Padre Island, Texas, on November 23 and 24. Vanderbilt's other home game in the tournament comes on November 20 against Valparaiso.

VU will take on Utah State on the 23rd and then either Iowa or Bradley on the 24th in South Padre Island.

Next Game: Utah State

The Commodores head to South Padre Island, Texas, to take on Utah State in semifinal round of the South Padre Invitational. Tip-time is at 9 p.m. CT and will be televised by CSTV.

Vanderbilt owns a 1-0 series lead all-time against the Aggies.

Foster Moves Up Career Scoring List

Senior Shan Foster, with his 21-point performance vs. Toledo Tuesday night, is now in 15th place on the Vanderbilt all-time scoring list with 1,362 career points

after passing Commodore greats Butch Feher and Billy McCaffrey. Also, with four made threes against the Rockets, he now has 244 made three pointers, only two behind Barry Booker for sixth place all-time for career three-pointers in the Vanderbilt annals.

Foster Named SEC Player of the Week

Foster was named as the SEC Player of the Week for the week of Nov. 12-19 for his 21-point, eight-rebound performance in Vanderbilt's 77-70 win at Toledo on November 13. The award was the first for Foster in his four-year career, and the first for a Vanderbilt player since Derrick Byars won the award on February 19, 2007.

Ogilvy Solidifying Paint For 'Dores

Freshman A.J. Ogilvy, from Canberra, Australia, made his collegiate debut against Austin Peay with 18 points and nine rebounds in 24 minutes of action, and followed that with a 20-point performance against Toledo in the Commodores' most recent time out.

Ogilvy's 18-point collegiate debut is the most for a Vanderbilt freshman since Phil Cox scored 30 points to open his college career at Duke in a game the Commodores won 76-75 in double overtime to begin the 1981-82 campaign.

Ogilvy, a 6'10 center, played in the FIBA Under-19 World Championships this summer for his native Australia and averaged 22.3 points and 9.8 rebounds in nine games. He finished third in scoring at the event and posted six double-doubles, including a 32-point, 11-rebound effort against Spain.

Ogilvy Named SEC Freshman Of The Week

Ogilvy was named the SEC Freshman of the Week Nov. 5-12 for his performance against Austin Peay. Ogilvy is the first Commodore freshman to win the award since it began in 2005-06.

'Dores Hot In 2007-08

Through two games of the 2007-08 season, Vanderbilt has shot 56.3% (58-103) from the floor, tops in the SEC, and 48.8% (20-41) from three. Commodores Alex Gordon and A.J. Ogilvy are also near the top of the SEC rankings in field goal percentage, with each shooting at a 71.4% clip in the early goings of the season.

How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

Six Letterwinners Return From Last Year's Team

Six letterwinners and three starters return from last year's Sweet 16 team, which ended the year at 22-12. Shan Foster, Alex Gordon, and Ross Neltner are the returning starters, and Jermaine Beal, George Drake, and Alan Metcalfe return as letterwinners. In all, 53.3% of last year's total points, 50.7% of total rebounds, and 60.6% of total assists return in 2007-08.

SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Commodores Among Nation's Best Versus Ranked Opponents In 2006-07

Vanderbilt's six wins against nationally ranked foes (AP poll) ranked among the most in the nation during the regular season in 2006-07. Vanderbilt won a school record five consecutive games against ranked teams in 2006-07 -- including three in an eight-day stretch against then-No. 10 Alabama (94-73); at then-No. 25 Kentucky (72-67) and at then-No. 21 LSU (64-53) -- before losing at top-ranked Florida on Jan. 31. The previous school record for one season was three set four times, last during the 2000 campaign.

3-Point Streak Continues In 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 666 consecutive games entering the 2007-2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (670#) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (578) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Historic Memorial Gymnasium In 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is reknown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also enter this season with a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10 in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 651-184 (.779) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- Vanderbilt was 14-3 in the gymnasium in 2006-07, marking the 20th time in the past 21 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games.
- Vanderbilt has won 90 of its last 96 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 137-13 non-conference record at home (.913 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 70-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home.

Nwankwo Remains A Valued Commodore

Davis Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md., will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbing 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.

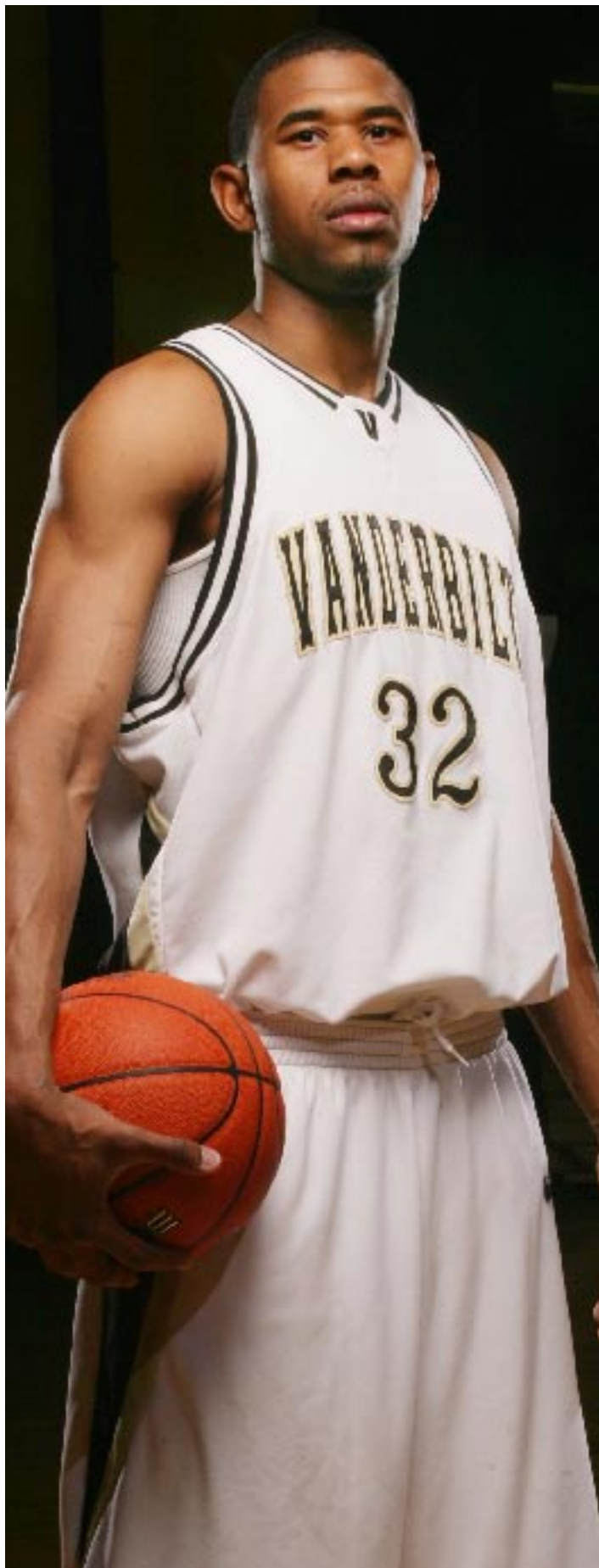

Shan Foster scored 21 points to lead Vanderbilt to an 81-67 victory over Austin Peay in the season opener for both teams.

Foster tied his career-high with seven three-pointers, including three straight in the second half, to help the Commodores lead by as much 18 points.

The Governors used a 13-4 run, capped by an inside basket by Drake Reed, to cut the lead to 67-59 with 6:36 remaining.

Alex Gordon answered for the Commodores, hitting a three-pointer to push the score to 70-59. Vanderbilt led by no less than 10 points the rest of the game.

Gordon added 19 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 18 points and nine rebounds for Vanderbilt. Todd Babington led Austin Peay with 21 points, while Fernandez Lockett recorded 14 points and 12 rebounds.

The Commodores shot 60.0 percent from the field in the second half and 54.5 for the game. The Governors shot only 32.4 percent in the second half and finished at 34.5.

Babington opened the second half with a three-pointer, trimming Vanderbilt's lead to 43-35. Ogilvy scored six straight points inside, keeping the Commodores ahead 49-37.

Moments later, Foster swished three straight treys, pushing the lead to 60-42, the largest of the game.

Vanderbilt raced to an 18-3 lead to open the game, highlighted by two three-pointers by Foster. Austin Peay did not score its second basket until the 10:50 mark.

The Commodores made eight of 15 three-pointers in the first half and 50 percent from the field. The Governors shot 37.5 in the first half.

Shan Foster scored 21 points to lead Vanderbilt to a 77-70 win over Toledo on Tuesday night.

The Commodores (2-0) led 35-29 at halftime and shot 67 percent (14 of 21) in the second half to pull away.

"It was an interesting game to say the least," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "We got off to a great start, but they got back into it. I thought we responded with a young team for our first game on the road."

Foster, one of three returning starters from last season's team that made it to the NCAA Sweet 16, also had eight rebounds.

A.J. Ogilvy, a 6-11 center from Australia who had 18 points in his college debut Saturday against Austin Peay, scored 20 points against the Rockets (1-1).

Jonathan Amos led Toledo with 23 points. Jerrah Young scored 16, Tyrone Kent added 14 and Ridley Johnson had 11.

The Rockets shot 44 percent (23 of 52) for the game.

"They are a tough match up," Stallings added. "They have big wings and small posts, and it provides some problems. I thought we did a pretty good job against Kent (UT's leading scorer). We tried to focus on that."
