What's On Tap

Vanderbilt will open its 2007 campaign in what is most likely the toughest collegiate tournament in the country at the Houston Astros College Classic this weekend in Houston. The Commodores take on No. 1 ranked Rice to open things on Friday at noon at Minute Maid Park. VU will then take on No. 6 Arizona State on Saturday at noon, before closing things out against No. 20 Baylor on Sunday at 2:30 p.m.

Scouting Rice

Rice is 1-1 on the year after dropping a 3-2 decision to Texas State on Tuesday. The Owls opened the season with a 5-0 win over Central Missouri last Saturday. Rice returns seven starters off of last year's team that went 57-13 and advanced to the semifinals of the College World Series.

The Commodores will face junior college transfer Chris Kelley on Friday. The righthander went 16-4 with a 2.37 ERA in two years at San Jacinto College.

Shortstop Brian Friday is one of the top returners from the offensive side after hitting .353 with nine homers and 57 RBI. Infielder Aaron Luna is the top returning power source after hitting .322 with 16 homers and 50 RBI en route to Freshman All-America honors.

Scouting Arizona State

Arizona State is 3-0 after sweeping Southern Utah over the weekend. ASU outscored its opponent 61-8 and blasted 20 doubles and six homers in the three games. The Sun Devils went 37-21 in 2006 and finished second in the Pac 10. Eight position starters return, headlined by sophomore slugger Ike Davis who opened this season on fire going 9-for-11 against Southern Utah with four doubles and nine runs scored. Outfielder Matt Spencer was named National Hitter of the Week after going 7-for-9 with two doubles, two homers and 13 RBI in his ASU debut.

The Commodores will face junior southpaw Josh Satow on Saturday. He picked up the win on Feb. 3 after giving up three runs, one earned, on five hits with seven strikeouts and two walks in five innings of work.

Scouting Baylor

Baylor returns five starters from last year's 37-26 team that reached the NCAA Houston Regional finals before falling to Rice.

Sophomore shortstop Beamer Weems is the top returning power source after hitting .297 with eight homers and 47 RBI a year ago.

Junior righthander Jeff Mandel will get the start on the hill against VU on Sunday. He went 2-3 in 2006 with a 4.40 ERA and struck out 38 in 57.1 innings. The Bears will take on Houston and Rice before taking on the Commodores.

National Expectations Highest Ever To Start Season

It started last summer when *Baseball America* tabbed Vanderbilt as one of the early favorites to reach the 2007 College World Series. The early buzz resulted in the Commodores being ranked the highest they have ever been to start the season.

With eight position starters returning along with a veteran pitching staff, Vanderbilt will find out quickly how the team stacks up against some of the premier programs in the country.

Price along with sophomore slugger Pedro Alvarez starred for Team USA last summer and along with head coach Tim Corbin helped guide the squad to a gold medal at the FISU World Championships last August.

Both players are preseason All-Americans and are on the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List, recognizing the top player in the country by the College Baseball Foundation.

The schedule is favorable after the season opening tournament as the Commodores will play 18 of their next 20 games at home.

Commodores Picked To Finish Second in SEC East By Coaches

Southeastern Conference coaches predicted Vanderbilt to finish second in the Eastern Division in a vote done prior to the season.

Two of the 12 league coaches voted the Commodores as their pick to win the regular season championship. South Carolina received seven of the 12 championship votes in the poll and Arkansas received three votes.

The Gamecocks received 63 of a possible 66 points to win the Eastern Division, while the Commodores were second with 54 points.

Arkansas was the unanimous predicted winner in the Western Division with a total of 66 points. Ole Miss, last season's SEC Tournament champion, was second with 53, while Alabama finished third with 47.

Price Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

David Price was named to the preseason Roger Clemens Award Watch List, recognizing the top pitcher in college baseball.

Price was a three-time National Pitcher of the Week honoree in 2006 and finished the year with a 9-5 record and a school record 155 strikeouts in 110.1 innings. His 12.6 strikeouts per nine innings was third best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC. He was named BA's Summer Player of the Year after going 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks in 44.0 innings for Team USA. He is widely considered to be among the top prospects in next June's amateur baseball draft.

The finalists for the 2007 Roger Clemens Award will be selected in voting by a national panel that includes: all Division I head baseball coaches, a selection of national media who cover collegiate baseball, the 16 winners of the R. E. "Bob" Smith Award, which was presented to the top player in the country in Houston in 1988-2003.

In addition, the 10 previous finalists for the Clemens Award are also issued ballots. The 2007 award will be presented at a gala dinner next July. The event is administered by the Greater Houston Baseball Association, which has donated more than \$300,000 to the charities from the net proceeds from the first three dinners.

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt is 2-2 in season openers under Tim Corbin and is 53-42-2 all-time in season openers according to school records ... After this weekend's tourney the Commodores will play 19 of 20 games in Nashville (18 at home, one vs. Belmont) and the other game is just an hour away against Western Kentucky ... All eight position starters returning hit over .300 last season ... Sophomores Nick Christiani and Brett Jacobson will be making their first weekend starts this weekend ... Also in the tournament this weekend are Texas A&M and Houston ... In it's College Baseball Preview, *Baseball America* broke down the SEC and rated Pedro Alvarez as the conference's best pure hitter with the best strike-zone discipline. He also was rated as the top defensive third-baseman in the league. David Price was their pick for SEC Pitcher of the Year.

Price and Alvarez Named Preseason All-Americans

Sophomore third baseman Pedro Alvarez and junior pitcher David Price continue to pick up pre-season plaudits as both were named first-team preseason All-Americans by *Baseball America* and *Rivals.com* this week. Both players also picked up preseason All-American honors by *Collegiate Baseball* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Alvarez finished the 2006 season with a .329 batting average to go along with a school record 22 homers and 64 RBI. His homer total was third most nationally and second best in the Southeastern Conference. Alvarez had a torrid summer with the USA Baseball National Team that captured a gold medal at the World University Championships in Cuba. The New York City resident led the collegiate all-star squad with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI. *Baseball America* listed him as the No. 2 prospect off of the USA team that was coached by Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin.

Price is expected to be one of the top picks in this June's amateur draft.

The last time Vanderbilt was in Texas was in the 2004 Super Regionals against Texas.

Record Watch

Head Coach Tim Corbin



In four seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has raised expectations of the baseball program into one that is expected to be among the nations best on an annual basis.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

This past summer he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba in August. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee in September.

Those results were probably to be expected, as Corbin has taken Vanderbilt to heights it has rarely seen in its long baseball history.

His overall record of 144-95 (.602) is the fourth best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Last year he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

With virtually the entire team back, Corbin knows the expectations are there to build upon that success and take the Commodores to their first College World Series in school history. It is a goal that he and his coaching staff are determined to achieve in the near future.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 29 players have been drafted over the last three years including 13 in 2005.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up a school-record 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State

for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) — all of which were bettered in 2004. Three different players earned conference Player of the Week honors (the most for VU in a single season), and the team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.

Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort instead of the product of one dominant player on the mound. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson.

During his time there (1994-2002) the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that laid dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.
