# COMMODORE NOTES

## DEREK MASON ERA UNDERWAY ON VANDERBILT CAMPUS

**Derek Mason** became the 28th head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history after serving a superb four-year tenure as a key assistant at Stanford where he helped guide the Cardinal to a 45-8 overall record and four straight BCS postseason games from 2010-13, including appearances in the last two Rose Bowls.

Named as Vanderbilt's head coach on Jan. 17, the former Cardinal Associate Head Coach and Willie Shaw Director of Defense directed his first game on the sidelines in Nashville when the Commodores hosted Temple on Aug. 28 and captured his initial Vanderbilt victory in against UMass on Sept. 13.

Mason is one of 20 new head coaches in NCAA FBS this season, and one of just five FBS coaches entering their first year as a head coach.

## MCCRARY MATCHES TEAM PASSING MARK DURING PERFORMANCE VS. OLD DOMINION

**Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr., QB) became just the third Commodore ever to toss five touchdown passes in a game during Vanderbilt's victory over Old Dominion on Nov. 1.

McCrary's effort matched previous performances by a pair of Vanderbilt legendary quarterbacks, **Jay Cutler** and **Bill Wade**, in just the second start of his Commodore career. Cutler threw for five TDs (all to **Earl Bennett**) vs. Kentucky in 2005 while Wade tossed five TDs vs. Auburn in 1950.

McCrary became first SEC freshman to throw for five TDs in a game since Missouri's Maty Mauk accomplished the feat at Kentucky in 2013.

McCrary solidified his hold on the team's starting role by completing 20-of-29 passes for 281 yards. He connected with five different receivers for touchdowns: WRs **Latevius Rayford** and **C.J. Duncan**, and TEs **Steven Scheu**, **Nathan Marcus** and **Davis Dudchock**.

McCrary's 281 passing yards are the most by Commodore QB since Austyn Carta-Samuel threw for 338 yards vs. Missouri in 2013. It marks the highest passing total by a Vanderbilt freshman since Nov. 16, 1985 when **John Gromos** threw for 316 yards against Virginia Tech.

McCrary's 646 passing yards ranks seventh on the team's all-time freshman charts.

## VANDERBILT HAS WON LAST 10 GAMES PLAYED DURING NOVEMBER

Vanderbilt has become a superb late-season team.

Dating back to the 2011 finale, the Commodores have notched 10 consecutive November wins entering the Florida game.

Vanderbilt's 10-win November streak is a rarity for the program. It was last accomplished in the 1904-06 seasons.

From 2001-10, Vanderbilt was 3-32 in games played during November.

## WEBB PRODUCES CAREER EFFORT; CLOSES IN ON TEAM'S FRESHMAN RECORD

**Ralph Webb** is less than 40 yards shy of the team's freshman rushing record.

Webb, a graduate of Gainesville (Fla.) H.S., also comes off a record setting performance in Vanderbilt's 42-28 win over Old Dominion. Webb's 166 rushing yards on 31 attempts against ODU established new Vanderbilt freshman records.

For the year, Webb ranks sixth in the SEC with 760 rushing yards, trailing only Cameron Artis-Payne of Auburn (974 yards), Josh Robinson of Mississippi State (951 yards), Jonathan Williams of Arkansas (877 yards), Alex Collins of Arkansas (840 yards) and Mike Davis of South Carolina (819 yards).

Webb ranks third on Vanderbilt's freshman all-time rushing charts, trailing **Warren Norman** (783 yards, 2009) and **Kwane Doster** (798 yards, 2002).

Webb leads all SEC freshmen in rushing yards, ahead of Nick Chubb of Georgia (725 yards), Leonard Fournette of LSU (657 yards) and Jalen Hurd of Tennessee (598 yards).

Webb's 84.4-yard rushing yardage ranks 10th in the conference. He is averaging 4.5 yards per carry and has three rushing TDs.

Webb has also been a workhorse in the Commodore backfield. His 169 rush attempts ranks as the second highest total in the SEC.

Webb's 31 rush attempts vs. Old Dominion was the most by a Commodore back in nearly 20 years, dating back to a 35-carry effort by **Jermaine Johnson** in a 14-10 win over Kentucky on Nov. 4, 1995.

Webb's 166-yard rushing total was the most by a Commodore running back since career record holder and current St. Louis Ram **Zac Stacy** ran for 180 yards at Wake Forest on Nov. 24, 2012.

## MORE INFO ON THE FLORIDA SERIES

Vanderbilt's 34-17 victory last year broke a 22-game losing streak in the series dating back to a 24-9 Commodore victory in 1988.

The Commodores are 7-16-1 all-time against the Gators in Nashville, and are looking for their first home win vs. Florida since the 1988 game.

Vanderbilt controlled the series in its infancy, winning five of the first seven games played between the schools from 1945-1955.

Vanderbilt is seeking consecutive victories in the Florida series since the mid-1950s.

## TWELVE COMMODORES FROM FLORIDA

Twelve players on the Commodore roster hail from the state of Florida.

The only states more represented on the Vanderbilt roster than the Sunshine State are Tennessee (18) and Georgia (17).

Three Commodores who reside in Florida are expected to start against the Gators: OL **Will Holden** (R-So., Green Cove Springs), P/PK **Tommy Openshaw** (R-Fr., Jacksonville) and RB **Ralph Webb** (R-Fr., Gainesville). A fourth Commodore, FB **Kellen Williams** (Sr., Winter Garden), also has started this season in the offensive backfield.

Other Commodore players from Florida are QB **Wade Freebeck** (Fr., Davie), TE **Blake Fromang** (R-So., Orlando), WR **Josh Grady** (R-Jr., Tampa), OL **Kevin McCoy** (R-So., Tampa), RB **Jerron Seymour** (R-Jr., Hialeah), OLB **Jimmy Stewart** (R-Jr., Cape Coral), OLB **Landon Stokes** (R-Fr., Orlando) and ILB **Ja'karri Thomas** (R-So., Tallahassee).

## PREP TEAMMATES FACING EACH OTHER

Six Commodore players will face prep teammates this Saturday when Vanderbilt and Florida meet in Nashville.

- **Josh Grady** (R-Jr., WR) and **Kevin McCoy** (R-So., OL) were teammates at powerful Armwood HS near Tampa with Florida's **Matt Jones** (Jr., RB) and **Alvin Bailey** (R-Fr., WR).

- **Ralph Webb** (R-Fr., RB) starred at Gainesville (Fla.) HS. The school also produced three members of the hometown Gator squad: **Case Harrison** (R-Fr., WR), **Ryan McGriff** (R-Jr., QB) and **Chris Thompson** (So., WR).

- **Jay Woods** (R-Fr., DE) attended Jackson (Ga.) HS, the same school that produced Florida's **Neiron Ball** (R-Sr., LB).

## LAST TIME VS. FLORIDA

### COMMODORES NOTCH FIRST VICTORY IN THE SWAMP SINCE WORLD WAR II

**GAINESVILLE, Fla.** – Florida's injury-riddled season has reached a new low - and it likely will end without a bowl trip.

Tyler Murphy's four turnovers led to three touchdowns, helping Vanderbilt beat Florida 34-17 for the program's first win in Gainesville since 1945.

The Commodores snapped a 22-game losing streak in the lopsided series and moved a step closer to becoming bowl eligible for the third consecutive season.

It was another signature win for the Commodores, giving Vanderbilt victories over SEC powerhouses Georgia and Florida in the same season for the first time ever.

The Commodores scored after each of Murphy's three interceptions, building a 24-3 lead after getting the ball inside the 22-yard line three times. Vanderbilt finished with 12 first downs and 187 yards. Florida had 26 first downs and 353 yards.

## FIRST-YEAR COMMODORES LEAD TEAM IN PASSING, RUSHING, RECEIVING, TACKLES

Vanderbilt's leading passer, rusher, receiver and tackler are first-year contributors, lending more proof to a young 'Dore squad.

**Ralph Webb** (R-Fr., RB) ranks as the Southeastern Conference's freshman leader with a team-leading 760 rushing yards. **Dallas Rivers** (Fr., RB) is the team's second leading rusher.

**Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr., QB) leads the squad with 646 passing yards and eight touchdowns.

**C.J. Duncan** (R-Fr., WR) tops all receivers with 416 receiving yards and four touchdowns.

**Nigel Bowden** (R-Fr., ILB) leads the Commodore defense and all SEC freshmen with 68 total tackles.

## VANDERBILT: 26 FIRST-TIME STARTERS HIGHEST TOTAL OF ANY NCAA FBS TEAM

**Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr.) and **Zach Cunningham** (R-Fr.) became the 25th and 26th Commodores this season to earn their first collegiate starts when they opened the Missouri game at quarterback and inside linebacker, respectively.

The 26 first-time starters on Vanderbilt's roster ranks as the most of any team in the NCAA this season. The only other in the nation has more than 20 first-time starters this year is Southern Mississippi (22).

McCrary completed 17 of 31 passes for 196 yards and touchdowns to **Nathan Marcus** (R-Fr., TE) and **C.J. Duncan** (R-Fr., QB) in the start vs. Missouri. Cunningham has six tackles vs the Tigers.

In the team's previous game Oct. 11 against Charleston Southern, **Taurean Ferguson** (R-Fr., CB) and **Ja'kari Thomas** (R-So., ILB) made their first collegiate starts.

## VANDERBILT NEEDS TO KEEP WINNING IN QUEST FOR 4TH STRAIGHT BOWL TRIP

The Commodores cannot lose again if it intends to extend the program's three-year postseason run.

To reach bowl eligibility, the 3-6 Commodores have to reverse its early-season fortunes, and conclude the campaign with consecutive wins in its last three games.

The Commodores' schedule offers plenty of challenges. The team has two remaining home games – this Saturday vs. Florida which enters off an impressive win over Georgia, and vs. Tennessee on Nov. 29. Sandwiched between those games is a road trip to No. 1-ranked Mississippi State on Nov. 22.

Vanderbilt's current three-year postseason run is the longest in program history.

## FOUR STARTING QBs THIS YEAR; MCCRARY HAS STABILIZED POSITION

Superb play in recent week by **Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr.) has stabilized the Commodore quarterback position which has witnessed as many starters as any team in the nation.

McCrary has produced points (7 TDs passes) and yardage (477 passing yards) while starting the Commodores' most recent games against Missouri and Old Dominion. McCrary's performances have been the team's top two passing efforts of the year.

Due to injury, inconsistency and inexperience, McCrary is the Commodores' fourth starting quarterback this season. Utah State is the only other NCAA FBS team to witness four starting QBs.

Vanderbilt's most experienced signal caller, **Patton Robinette** (R-So.), has missed five games due to injuries.

Due to Robinette's absence, the Commodores didn't witness a quarterback starting consecutive games until **Wade Freebeck** (Fr.) earned starts at Kentucky Sept. 27 and Georgia on Oct. 4.

This year, Freebeck has four starts, McCrary and Robinette two each, and Stephen Rivers with one.

McCrary, in four appearances, leads the team with 47 completions, 646 yards and eight TDs. Robinette also has been productive, completing 23 of 32 passes for 240 yards and two touchdowns.

## EIGHT 'DORES HAVE STARTED EVERY GAME

Only eight Commodores have earned starting assignments in every game this season.

Offensive players who have started all nine games include **Steven Scheu** (R-Jr., TE), **Ralph Webb** (R-Fr., RB), **Joe Townsend** (Sr., center), **Spencer Pulley** (R-Jr., OG), **Jake Bernstein** (R-Jr., OG) and **Andrew Jelks** (R-So., OT).

Just two defensive players, **Nigel Bowden** (R-Fr., ILB) and **Darreon Herring** (Jr., ILB), have started all nine games.

## NOTES FROM THE OLD DOMINION GAME

• The Vanderbilt offense enjoyed plenty of success against Old Dominion, producing season highs in points (42), first downs (33), rushing yards (243), passing yards (281) and total yards (524).

It marked the most first downs since the Commodores' 2009 win over Western Carolina. It was also the most total offense since Vanderbilt produced 540 yards against UAB on Sept. 28, 2013.

• The win moves Vanderbilt to 27-4 all-time vs. current members of Conference USA.

• Vanderbilt ran 85 offensive plays to just 48 by Old Dominion, and owned a 27-minute advantage in time of possession (45:17-14:43).

• **Torren McGaster** (R-So., CB) and **Ja'kari Thomas** (R-Jr., ILB) paced the Vanderbilt defensive effort with five tackles each. They were supported by **Zach Cunningham** (R-Fr., ILB) and **Jahmel McIntosh** (R-Jr., safety) with four tackles each.

• The Commodores were 3-of-3 on fourth down conversions. They entered the game just 1-of-6 on fourth down tries.

The team's first fourth-down success resulted in a 7-yard TD pass from **Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr., QB) to **Nathan Marcus** (R-Fr., TE).

• Every Vanderbilt score resulted from a long drive. The Commodores' touchdown resulted from drives of 75, 86, 65, 73, 69 and 75 yards.

• The Vanderbilt defense limited Old Dominion to 45 rushing yards. The Monarchs were just 2-of-7 on third down conversions and failed to convert on a pair of fourth down tries.

• Vanderbilt's 28 points in the first half were the team's highest scoring output before intermission since a 38-point total vs. Austin Peay on Sept. 7, 2013.

• The 243 rushing yards are the most by the Commodores since a 410-yard total against Presbyterian in 2012.

**Ralph Webb** (R-Fr., RB) paced the rushing attack by setting freshman team records of 166 yards and 31 carries. It was the most rush attempts by a Commodore back since **Jermaine Johnson** had 35 carries against Kentucky in 1995.

**Dallas Rivers** (Fr., RB) gave Webb solid support in the running game, setting career highs with 73 yards on 17 carries.

• **Taurean Ferguson** (R-Fr., CB) notched his second interception of the season on the opening drive of the second half. It marked the team's fourth pick of the season.

• For the second straight week, the tight end position played an important role in the Commodore offense. Three tight ends – **Steven Scheu** (R-Jr.), **Davis Dudchock** (Grad.) and **Nathan Marcus** (R-Fr.) – combined for nine catches, 84 yards and three touchdowns.

• The passing game produced five explosive plays of 20 yards or more.

• Eight different receivers hauled in a catch from McCrary, who finished 20-of-29 for 281 yards and 5 TDs. It marked the seventh time this season the Commodores have completed passes to at least seven receivers.

**Latevius Rayford** (So., WR) topped the receiving corps with five catches for 79 yards and his first career TD.

**C.J. Duncan** (R-Fr., WR) moved into the team's all-time Top Ten for freshmen receivers with four catches, good for 65 yards. Duncan's 25 receptions ranks seventh on the team's freshman list.

## YOUTH MOVEMENT: 34 FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS EARLY THIS SEASON

Thirty-four newcomers, including 31 true or redshirt freshmen, have contributed for the Commodores this year.

The newest first-time contributor was **Curtis Graves** (So., WR), who saw his first action on special teams against Missouri Oct. 25.

Three Commodores – **Trey Ellis** (Fr., PR), **Wade Freebeck** (Fr., QB) and **DeAndre Woods** (R-Fr., WR) – saw their initial active vs. UMass on Sept. 13. One week before that vs. Ole Miss, six first-time players contributed – **Jalen Banks** (R-Fr., DB), **Delando Crooks** (R-Fr., OG), **Chandler Dorrell** (R-Fr., WR), **Tommy Openshaw** (R-Fr., kicker), **Trent Sherfield** (Fr., WR) and **Emmanuel Smith** (Fr., safety).

Twelve of the Commodore newcomers are true freshmen.

Thirteen of the 34 newcomers have played on offense, including transfers Dorrell, **Stephen Rivers** (Sr., QB) and **David Dudchock** (Grad., TE).

Rivers is one of three first-time players at quarterback, joining Freebeck, and **Johnny McCrary** (R-Fr.), who started the Commodores' most recent game at Missouri.

Two young backs, **Ralph Webb** (R-Fr.) and **Dallas Rivers** (Fr.), rank first and third on the team in rushing yards, topped by Webb's 594 yards.

Four newcomers have participated as wide receivers: **C.J. Duncan** (R-Fr.), **Caleb Scott** (Fr.), Sherfield and Dorrell. Duncan leads the team with 351 receiving yards and three TD catches. Dorrell has six catches for 85 yards. Scott also has four receptions.

Dudchock and **Nathan Marcus** (R-Fr.) have seen action at tight end. They have combined for eight receptions and a TD.

Crooks and **Sean Dowling** (R-Fr., OT) are new to the offensive line.

Seventeen Commodores have witnessed their first action on defense.

**Nigel Bowden** (R-Fr.) has seen the most action of any newcomer in the linebacking corps. He leads the team with 32 solo tackles and 65 total tackles as an inside linebacker. **Zach Cunningham** (R-Fr., ILB) also has become a key contributor, ranking seventh on the team with 32 tackles. **Jonathan Wynn** (R-Fr.) has two starts at outside linebacker.

**Landon Stokes** (R-Fr.) and **Hawkins Mann** (Fr.) have also contributed.

On the defensive front, **Jay Woods** (R-Fr.) has four consecutive starts and contributed 23 tackles. **Nifae Lealao** (Fr.) has seven total tackles and a fumble recovery as a reserve nose tackle.

The defensive backfield has featured nine first-year players, including starters **Oren Burks** (R-Fr., safety), **Taurean Ferguson** (R-Fr., CB), **Tre Bell** (R-Fr., CB), and **Ryan White** (R-Fr., NB). Tarpley and Smith also have seen action at safety.

Openshaw and **Hayden Lekacz** (Fr.) have handled the kicking duties.

## SIMS, SCHEU NAMED TO PHIL STEELE'S MIDSEASON ALL-SEC TEAM

**Darrius Sims** (So., KR) and **Steven Scheu** (R-Jr., TE) were named to *Phil Steele's* 2014 Midseason All-SEC Team on Oct. 20.

Sims was recognized as a first team SEC kick returner by *Phil Steele's*. Scheu was named as a second team tight end.

Sims achieved one of the most remarkable games ever by a SEC return specialist on Sept. 20 against South Carolina. The sophomore became the league's first player – and only the 18th in NCAA FBS history – to return two kicks for touchdowns against the Gamecocks. Sims went virtually untouched for 91 yards on the opening kickoff, then took a third quarter kick for 100 yards. The second return matched the longest in team history earlier set by **Preston Brown** (at Ole Miss, Oct. 22, 1977).

Scheu is having a career year. He has established new single-season highs with 28 catches, 368 receiving yards and two TDs.

Woestmann leads all active Commodores with six forced fumbles, is tied for the lead with 12 career quarterback sacks and ranks second with 18.5 tackles for loss.

In the team's latest game, Sims was back on defense as a nickel back against spread-oriented Old Dominion.

Earlier this year, Sims scored three touchdowns for the Commodores without playing offense. He returned two kicks for TDs against South Carolina on Sept. 20 and took an interception 13 yards for a score at Kentucky on Sept. 27.

Sims' 14-yard reception at Georgia came on his first career snap as an offensive player.

On Sept. 20, Sims achieved one of the most remarkable games ever by a SEC return specialist.

Sims went virtually untouched for 91 yards on the opening kickoff, then took South Carolina's initial kick of the second half for a 100-yard score. The 100-yard return matched the longest in team history earlier set by **Preston Brown** (at Ole Miss, Oct. 22, 1977).

Sims became the first NCAA FBS player to notch two kick return TDs in a game since Reggie Dunn (Utah) and Quincy McDuffie (Central Florida) accomplished the feat against different foes on Oct. 27, 2012.

### 2014 VANDERBILT (Head Coach)

Introduced Jan. 17, 2014 as the 28th head coach in Commodore history... Notched first career victory as head coach in dramatic style, guiding team to 34-31 win over UMass on Sept. 13... Directing one of nation's youngest teams, with 31 true or redshirt freshmen seeing action.

### 2013 STANFORD (Willie Shaw Director of Defense)

Promoted to position of Willie Shaw Director of Defense, Mason guides one of the nation's top defenses as Cardinal goes 10-3 overall, wins Pac-12 crown and plays in second straight Rose Bowl... Stanford finishes year ranked No. 10 on strength of four victories over ranked opponents... The defense ranks third in NCAA in rushing defense, 10th in scoring defense and 16th in total defense... Unit again ranks among Pac-12's best in numerous defensive categories... ## LEADERSHIP, PRODUCTION EXPECTED FROM EXPERIENCED OFFENSIVE LINE UNIT

The Vanderbilt offensive line, one of the SEC's most veteran units, is a strength of the Commodore squad.

The unit four returning starters and a fifth player with previous starting experience. The returning starters are senior center **Joe Townsend**, junior guards **Jake Bernstein** and **Spencer Pulley**, and sophomore tackle **Andrew Jelks**. Also back is senior **Andrew Bridges**, who has 18 career starts at right tackle.

Collectively, the offensive line has 127 career starts, third highest total in the SEC behind only South Carolina (135) and Texas A&M (133).

Jelks has replaced departed left tackle **Wesley Johnson**, the All-SEC performer who finished his career by setting team records with 51 consecutive starts. With Jelks moving to left tackle, **Will Holden** (R-So.) and Bridges have both started at right tackle.

With Townsend, Bernstein and Pulley, the Commodores are veteran interior blockers who have experienced plenty of success. The trio has combined for 83 career starts at center and guard.

## NEW STARTERS THROUGH SECONDARY

Vanderbilt's new-look defensive secondary features new starters are every position.

**Andrew Williamson** (R-Jr.), **Oren Burks** (R-Fr.) and **Jahmel McIntosh** (R-Jr.) are new starters at the safety positions.

Williamson has eight starts, and has contributed 21 solo stops. He also ranks sixth on the team with 36 total tackles. McIntosh has earned six straight starts and is the team's seventh leading tackler with 35 stops. Despite missing four games, Burks has 22 tackles and remains the team leader with six defended passes.

At cornerback, **Torren McGaster** (So.), **Taurean Ferguson** (R-Fr.) and **Tre Bell** (R-Fr.) have earned first-time starting assignments.

McGaster ranks second on the team with 34 solo tackles and 49 total tackles. Ferguson is the team leader with two interceptions and has 14 tackles. Bell has contributed 17 tackles.

**Ryan White** (R-Fr.) has started at nickel back. He has contributed 19 solo tackles, 33 total tackles and 3.5 tackles for loss.

## SLOW STARTS HURTING VANDERBILT CHANCES FOR VICTORY

Scheu leads the Commodores with 28 receptions, ranks second with 368 receiving yards and has two TD catches. Duncan tops the receiving corps with 416 receiving yards and four TD catches on 25 receptions, including acrobatic 30-yard score late in the ODU game.

The other 'Dore to reach double digits in receptions is **Latevius Rayford** (So., WR). He has 21 receptions for 226, including single-game highs of five catches, 79 yards and his first career TD against ODU.

The youth of Vanderbilt's receiving corps is exhibited by the fact that the team's top eight targets have posted career-best totals this year.

The Commodores are trying to fill a receiving void left by the graduation of current Philadelphia Eagles' WR **Jordan Matthews**, who set numerous SEC and Vanderbilt career and single-season marks, including a conference standard of 112 receptions last year.

Scheu, Duncan and Rayford combined for 12 catches, 162 yards and three TDs in Vanderbilt's 42-28 victory over ODU.

## MASON TIES TO COORDINATORS DATE TO PLAYING DAYS, EARLY COACHING ROLES

Coordinators **Karl Dorrell** and **David Kotulski** played influential roles in the early coaching development of **Derek Mason**.

The relationship between Mason and Dorrell dates to the early 1990s when both were at Northern Arizona University – Mason as a cornerback practicing daily against NAU receivers coached by Dorrell.

Much of Mason's experience on the 3-4 defensive scheme dates to 1999-2000 when Kotulski hired him to coach DBs at Bucknell. In 2012, Mason brought Kotulski to Palo Alto to mentor Stanford inside linebackers.

Mason also has long ties with new offensive assistants **Gerry Gdowski** and **Keven Lightner**. Ten years ago, Mason, Gdowski and Lightner were members of the offensive staff at New Mexico State, then joined Frank Solich's Ohio University staff for the 2005-06 seasons.

## SEC NETWORK AIRS 'SEC STORIED' DOCUMENTARY ON GAINES, MULLINS

The SEC Network debuted the "SEC Storied" series episode "It's Time" Sept. 4. The 70-minute documentary chronicles the incredible relationship that developed between former Vanderbilt fullback Brad Gaines and the late former Ole Miss defensive back Chucky Mullins.

The emotional episode premiered on the Vanderbilt campus on Sept. 2, with Gaines, former Ole Miss coach Billy Brewer and several of Mullins' Ole Miss teammates in the audience.

"It's Time" depicts the aftermath of a bruising hit by Mullins on Gaines during the Vanderbilt-Ole Miss game on Oct. 28, 1989. During the play near the Ole Miss goal line, Mullins suffered a broken neck, leaving him a quadriplegic. But in that heartbreaking moment, a friendship was born that lasted another two years, until Mullins died of a blood clot in a Memphis hospital room, with Gaines at his side.

The tragedy took a tremendous toll on Gaines, who befriended Mullins and his family, and Mullins' coaches and teammates at Ole Miss. Each year, Gaines attends a spring banquet on the Oxford campus when one Ole Miss player is honored to wear Mullins' No. 38 jersey the following year. Gaines also continues to care for Mullins' gravesite in Russellville, Ala.

Gaines, several members of the Gaines family, and former Commodore quarterback John Gromos, the current color analyst for Vanderbilt football games who threw the pass intended for Gaines, are interviewed in the film. Interviews with Mullins' guardians, former *Tennessean* sportswriter Larry Woody, Coach Billy Brewer and several Rebel teammates also are included in the production.

## 'SEC NATION' SHOW AT LP FIELD SEPT. 6

The SEC Network's two-hour Saturday morning college football show, *SEC Nation*, aired from LP Field prior to the Ole Miss-Vanderbilt game.

*SEC Nation* is the SEC Network's live pre-game show designed similar to ESPN's highly popular *College GameDay* production.

The set The *SEC Nation* set also was next to Vandyville, Vanderbilt's official tailgate location for the game just outside the south gates of LP Field.

*SEC Nation* will feature ESPN play-by-play announcer Joe Tessitore hosting the stage with several prominent SEC Network and Southeastern Conference football personalities, including 2007 Heisman Trophy winner Tim Tebow, former LSU and Dallas Cowboys defensive lineman Marcus Spears, sports talk provocateur Paul Finebaum.

## 'DORES ARE 19-10 IN LAST 29 GAMES; TIED FOR SEC'S 8TH BEST RECORD

Vanderbilt sports an 19-10 overall record since October 2012.

The 'Dores' 19-10 overall record in its last 29 games dating back to a victory over Auburn on Oct. 20, 2012.

The stretch includes a season-ending five-game win streak in 2013 and seven-game win streak in 2012.

Among SEC teams, the Commodores' record during the span is tied for eighth with Ole Miss behind Alabama (26-3), Auburn (22-7), LSU (22-7), Texas A&M (22-7), Missouri (21-8), Georgia (20-9) and South Carolina (20-9).

Twelve of the Vanderbilt victories have come against power conference affiliates: Auburn, Kentucky (twice), Ole Miss, Tennessee (twice), Georgia and Florida from the SEC, Wake Forest (twice) and N.C. State from the ACC, and Houston from the American Athletic Conference.

## SEVERAL COMMODORE COACHES BRING NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

Five coaches with National Football League experience are among the 10-person staff assembled by first-year Vanderbilt head coach **Derek Mason**.

Mason also brings NFL experiences to the Commodore staff. Prior to joining Jim Harbaugh's Stanford staff in 2010, Mason worked three years as a defensive backs assistant coach in Minnesota, helping the Vikings to NFC North titles in 2008 and 2009.

Defensive secondary coach **Brett Maxie** has the most pro experience. Maxie joined Mason's staff after a two-year run as defensive backs coach with the cross-town Tennessee Titans. Prior to the Titans' role, Maxie coached 14 years in the NFL, with stops in Dallas, Miami, Atlanta, San Francisco and Carolina.

Offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Karl Dorrell** has spent nine total years in the NFL, as well as serving as head coach at UCLA from 2003-07. In 2012-13, Dorrell coached quarterbacks in Houston. From 2008-11, he worked as a wide receivers and quarterbacks coach in Miami. East, a first-year graduate student from Indianapolis, becomes the second Commodore recently named to the prestigious Allstate-AFCA Good Works Team. Former placekicker **Carey Spear** was recognized last year in 2013.

The Good Works Team will be honored at the upcoming Sugar Bowl.

A two-time Commodore team captain, East has been on numerous Spring Break and church-led mission trips as a Vanderbilt undergraduate, including working with youth in Mexico, Peru and Haiti.

East also frequently visits with ailing youngsters recuperating in the Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt. He has addressed and mentored local elementary school classes, and been involved in numerous community service efforts in the Nashville area, including Room at the Inn that assists homeless residents.

East graduated in engineering in May 2014, and is enrolled in graduate courses at Vanderbilt's Owen School of Management.

## TEAM'S TOP RETURNING SACK SPECIALISTS ATTACKING QB'S FROM NEW POSITION

## 2015 FOOTBALL SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

The 'Dores will open the 2015 football season with consecutive home games against Western Kentucky, Georgia and Austin Peay, Vanderbilt and the Southeastern Conference announced Oct. 14.

Vanderbilt's 2015 schedule also features additional SEC encounters in Vanderbilt Stadium against Missouri, Kentucky and Texas A&M.

The schedule includes road dates for the Commodores at Ole Miss, Middle Tennessee, South Carolina, Houston, Florida and Tennessee.

The Commodores and Western Kentucky, a new member of Conference USA, will open the season Sept. 5 in Vanderbilt Stadium. It marks the first game between the schools since 1938.

Vanderbilt's conference home opener against Georgia on Sept. 12 is the earliest the SEC East rivals have played in a season since the mid-1960s.

The Commodores conclude their early home schedule Sept. 19 with a meeting against Austin Peay. The two teams have met once previously, with Vanderbilt claiming a win in 2013.

After the three-game home stretch to open the season, five of Vanderbilt's next six games come on the road, starting with a trip to Oxford, Miss., to face Ole Miss on Sept. 26. The Commodores then travel down Interstate 24 to Murfreesboro on Oct. 3 to face Conference USA member Middle Tennessee.

After an open date on Oct. 10, the Commodores play a third straight game off campus - against South Carolina in Columbia on Oct. 17.

The Commodores return back to campus Oct. 24 to face Missouri, then return to the road against Houston of the American Athletic Conference on Oct. 31 and Florida on Nov. 7.

The Commodores last two home games come against SEC competition: Kentucky on Nov. 14 and Texas A&M on Nov. 21. It will mark the first visit ever to Nashville by the Aggies.

Vanderbilt closes the regular season against cross-state Tennessee for the second straight year with the game in Knoxville on Nov. 28.

## BANKINS: LONE COACHING HOLDOVER

**Charles Bankins**, responsible for some of the most impressive special teams in Vanderbilt program history, is the lone holdover on Derek Mason's Commodore staff. Bankins also serves as Mason's running backs coach in 2014 after working with Commodore tight ends from 2011-13.

## NEW INDOOR FACILITY BENEFITING COMMODORES PRACTICE SCHEDULE

## VANDERBILT IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

Vanderbilt has won 12 of its last 13 games against non-Southeastern Conference opponents after a 42-28 victory over Old Dominion Nov. 1.

Since the 2011 opener, Vanderbilt is 14-2 against non-SEC teams in regular season action, and 16-3 overall against non-SEC foes including postseason bowl appearances. In the last decade, the 'Dores are 29-13 against all non-SEC teams.

## TAYLOR, BUTLER TOP DEFENSIVE LINE

Vanderbilt's defensive front will build around a pair of linemen who return with starting experience from a year ago: **Vince Taylor** (Sr.) and **Adam Butler** (R-So.).

Taylor, who enjoyed 10 starts at tackle in 2013, has played well this season at nose tackle. Recognized as Tim Tebow's "Freak of the Week" for his strength on Sept. 6, Taylor has contributed 29 tackles, a QB sack, two tackles for loss, and two fumble recoveries this year after registering 18 total tackles in 2013. Taylor has also started eight of the Commodores' nine games.

Butler earned six starts at tackle as a redshirt freshman, and has a single-season high of 26 tackles, 1.5 quarterback sacks and 4.5 tackles for loss this year. Last year, he registered 25 total tackles.

**Caleb Azubike** (Jr., DE), **Jay Woods** (R-Fr., DT/DE) and **Barron Dixon** (Sr., DT.) provide more interior support.

Azubike has a career-high 36 tackles, including four QB sacks and 6.0 tackles for loss in five total starts, including three on the line. Woods has compiled 23 total tackles in five starts. Dixon have added 13 tackles.

## THREE TRANSFERS ADD TO TEAM DEPTH

Vanderbilt's overall depth has improved due to the transfers of three student-athletes this fall.

**Davis Dudchock** (Grad., TE) and **Chandler Dorrell** (R-Fr., WR) both transferred to Vanderbilt from Stanford. **Stephen Rivers** (Grad., QB) enrolled in graduate courses at Vanderbilt after graduating from LSU.

Dudchock has eight catches for 133 yards and a touchdown while Dorrell has seven catches for 98 yards.

Rivers is 25-of-63 passes for 334 yards in three appearances.

Rivers led a touchdown drive in the second quarter before leading the Commodores to a field-goal drive to open the second half.

Georgia star tailback Todd Gurley ran for 163 yards and two touchdowns and surprised the Commodores by completing a 50-yard pass to set up another touchdown.

"I look at Jay Cutler all the time," McCrary said. "I try to study any quarterback in the NFL. When you have a line like I did and you have wide receivers that make plays like I did, of course you're going to break some type of record."
