## Vanderbilt Travels To Atlanta To Take On Georgia Tech

Vanderbilt hits the road for their first officially designated road game this Saturday when the Commodores take on Georgia Tech in Atlanta. The game will be televised by FSN, and the game can be heard on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson on the call.

The Commodores dropped a 74-55 decision to UIC on Wednesday at Memorial Gym, their second loss of the season at home. Flame guards Josh Mayo and Robo Kreps scored 30 and 23 points, respectively, in the loss, while sophomore A.J. Ogilvy and freshman Jeffery Taylor led the way for Vanderbilt with 14 points apiece. VU had only one lead in the game, which came at the 17:02 mark in the first half, and the Commodores allowed UIC to shoot 63.2% from three (12-19) with Mayo and Krebs making 11 of those 12.

Vanderbilt shot 20-59 (34%) from the field while UIC was 30-67 (45%), the lowest percentage for the Commodores this season, and the Commodores were also cold from three, making 4-of-24 shots (16.7%). Vanderbilt gave up a season-high 74 points to UIC, and the 19-point loss was the worst home loss since the Commodores lost to Kentucky by 22 (74-52) back on January 14, 2003. The loss was also the worst home loss to a non-conference opponent since Vanderbilt fell by 21 points (89-68) to Stanford on December 30, 1988.

Ogilvy leads the Commodores in scoring at 15.1 points per game, with freshmen Jeffery Taylor (13.6) and Brad Tinsley (12.4) next in scoring for Vanderbilt, and Jermaine Beal adding 10.7 points per contest.

Saturday's contest is the last game of a four-game series - VU lost 76-67 in Atlanta during the 2005-06 season, and the Commodores won at home in 2006-07 (73-64) and 2007-08 (92-79).

### Scouting Georgia Tech

Georgia Tech enters the game with a 4-1 record after losing their most recent game at home against Penn State, 85-83. Sophomore forward Gani Lawal leads the Yellow Jackets, averaging 22.2 points and 11.2 rebounds per game. Alade Aminu (14.4), Iman Shumpert (11.6), and Zachery Peacock (11.2) also average double figures for Georgia Tech.

### VU Goes 4-0 In Cancun Challenge, Claims Tournament Title

Vanderbilt went 4-0 at the Cancun Challenge and captured the tournament title at the Moon Palace Resort on November 30 with a 71-66 win over VCU. The Commodores defeated Drake, 72-57, in Cancun, and won their first two games of the Cancun Challenge against Morehead State November 16, 74-48, at Memorial Gym, and Central Arkansas, 83-62, on November 26. Sophomore A.J. Ogilvy was named the tournament MVP, with Jermaine Beal also being named to the all-tournament team.

### Vanderbilt Plays With Only Eight Scholarship Players In Cancun

Vanderbilt played without four key players over the weekend in Cancun because of varying circumstances. Sophomore Andre Walker is out for the season with a torn

ACL in his right knee that he suffered November 24 against Middle Tennessee State. Redshirt freshman Festus Ezeli missed Cancun because of family matters, true freshman Steve Tchiengang finished serving an NCAA mandated suspension, and freshman Lance Goulbourne was diagnosed with mononucleosis in late November and is out until mid-December.

### Freshmen Making An Impact

Three out of the five leading scorers on this year's team are freshmen, with 6'7 forward Jeffery Taylor leading the way among the freshmen at 13.6 points per game. 6'3 guard Brad Tinsley averages 12.4 points per contest, and 6'7 forward Lance Goulbourne added 11 points in his first game against Morehead State. Goulbourne, who was diagnosed with mononucleosis on November 19, missed the Illinois game and is out for a month. Taylor and Tinsley have scored in double digits in every game of their college careers.

### Balanced Scoring

The Commodores have had eight players score in double figures this season, and three (Ogilvy, Taylor, Tinsley) who have scored in double-figures in every game thus far.

### Vanderbilt Regains Two Players After Missing Finals Of Cancun Challenge...

Redshirt freshman center Festus Ezeli and freshman forward Steve Tchiengang returned to action Wednesday evening after missing some early season action. Ezeli, who had played in four games and started two before Cancun, missed the semifinals and finals of the Cancun Challenge in Mexico because of family matters, and Tchiengang was held out of the first six games of the regular season by the NCAA due to a policy that involves some first-year international students. Ezeli scored three points and Tchiengang added two in the game versus UIC.

### ...But Loses One For The Season

Sophomore forward Andre Walker was lost for the season with a torn ACL in his right knee after suffering the injury against Middle Tennessee State on November 24. Walker was averaging 4.7 points and 4.7 rebounds and had started two games.

### Stallings Closing In On 300 Career Victories

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is quickly approaching the 300 victory mark in his 16-year head coaching career. He now has 298 career wins after two wins in Cancun, and 175 in his ten-year career at Vanderbilt. Stallings ranks third all-time in Vanderbilt coaching wins behind Roy Skinner (278; 1959, 1962-76) and Bob Polk (197; 1948-58, 1960-61).

### Starting Lineups

The Commodores have started five different starting lineups this season, with the only repeat being Jermaine Beal, A.J. Ogilvy, Darshawn McClellan, Jeffery Taylor, and Brad Tinsley. That lineup has a record of 2-1.

### International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from five different countries. A.J. Ogilvy is from Australia, Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang is from Cameroon. Of the 341 NCAA Division I teams, only eight have players from five countries, and only Vanderbilt and Northwestern hail from BCS leagues.

## SEC PRESEASON POLLS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 22-23 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 88 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (172), Florida (143), and Kentucky (130). South Carolina was chosen fifth (56), and Georgia was chosen sixth (41).

Alabama was chosen to win the SEC West with 151 votes, only four votes better than LSU (147).

Tennessee received 23 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Florida received five votes, and Kentucky received two.

Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

## Commodores Have Record-Breaking Year In 2007-08

Becoming a constant on the national collegiate basketball scene, the 2007-08 edition of the Vanderbilt Commodores solidified that stance with another appearance in the NCAA Tournament, a perfect 19-0 record at home in Memorial Gym, and the SEC's Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. The Commodores also tied a school record for regular season wins (26) and set a new mark to begin the season with 16 straight wins.

## Ogilvy Named Preseason First Team All-SEC, Sets Freshman Scoring Record In 2007-08

Sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy was named as a pre-season All-SEC 1st team member at the SEC Media Days in Birmingham in late October and by the league's coaches in early November.

The Sydney, Australia native scored 20 or more points 11 times in 2007-08, and reached double-digits in 32 of his first 34 games as a collegian. Against Alabama on March 8, he tallied 17 points to overcome Mike Rhodes for the top spot on the freshman single-season scoring list, and ended the season with 578 points, a new Vanderbilt freshman scoring record. He also ended the 2007-08 season with the ninth-best scoring average in the nation for a freshman (17.0).

Ogilvy is the third leading returning scorer in the SEC, behind LSU's Marcus Thornton (19.6 ppg) and South Carolina's Devan Downey (18.4).

## More Accolades For Ogilvy

Ogilvy was named to the John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 list in mid November, and was also recently named the second best center in the nation by Rivals.com, behind only Haseem Thabeet of Connecticut.

## Double-Digit Man

Ogilvy has scored in double-figures in 39 out of 41 games as a collegian.

## Beal Adding Scoring To His Repertoire

Junior Jermaine Beal led the Southeastern Conference in Assist-to-Turnover Ratio with a 3.06 mark in 2007-08, which also ranked him third nationally in the category. Beal also tallied 158 assists during the 2007-08 campaign, a new record for Vanderbilt sophomores. In his junior season, Beal has seen his scoring go up to 10.7 points per game, and he is hitting the boards at 4.0 rebounds per contest. He is also averaging 3.7 assists per game this season.

## Drake Sets Career High In Points, Rebounds, and Assists Against Central Arkansas

Redshirt junior George Drake tallied a career high in points (14), rebounds (8), and assists (6) in the game against Central Arkansas on November 26.

## Memorial Gym Winning Streak Snapped

Illinois, with their 69-63 win over Vanderbilt on November 20, snapped a 20-game Memorial Gym winning streak, which dated back to March 3, 2007. The winning streak was the seventh longest in the nation. The longest winning streak in the 57-year old facility is 26 games - from February 5, 1955, to January 26, 1957.

## Percentage Returns

40.7% of the 2007-08 offensive production returns this year, 61.3% of the team's rebounding total returns, and 45.2% of the assist total is back in 2008-09.

## Smart To Redshirt

Freshman Jordan Smart, a 6'6 shooting guard from Lexington, Ky., has decided to redshirt the 2008-09 season.

## How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Five Years

The Commodores, after the 2006-07 Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last five years, one of only three programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida, Tennessee).

## Vanderbilt Signs One In Early Signing Period

6'4 shooting guard John Jenkins, one of the nation's top shooters, inked a National Letter of Intent with the Commodores in the early signing period and will be eligible for the 2009-2010 campaign.

Jenkins, from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn., averaged 21 points per game as a sophomore and 30.9 points per contest as a junior, and was named the Class AA Mr. Basketball for the state of Tennessee in March of 2008 after his junior season at Station Camp. He is a consensus top 40 player in most national recruiting databases and is ranked as the eighth-best shooting guard in the nation by ESPN.com and Rivals.com. He was also a Nike Chosen Ones selection, an honor that goes to the nation's top 50 players, regardless of class.

## 3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 704 consecutive games after the 2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (711) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (602) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

5-11 sophomore guard Jamie Graham, who played in 15 games last season as a true freshman, will return to the hardwood after the conclusion of the Commodore's 2008 football season. The only SEC student-athlete to compete in both sports in 2007-08, is having a stellar first season on the gridiron, where he is competing as a redshirt freshman. He has played in every game and has contributed as a wide receiver for the Vanderbilt offensive attack. He is the first Vanderbilt football player to play on the basketball team since 1994-95 when Fred Baker played for both squads.

## Vanderbilt Posts 16th 20-win Season in School History

Vanderbilt recorded the 16th 20-win season in school history with a thrilling, 66-65, win over South Carolina on February 9, 2008. It marked the fourth 20-win campaign in the last five years under head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted more 20-win seasons with six.

# 2007-08 At A Glance

## 'Dores Win 20

Vanderbilt reached the 20-win plateau for the 16th time in the program's history, and it marked the quickest a Commodore team has gotten to 20 wins. The 1973-74 SEC championship team held the previous record, getting their 20th win on February 16. This year's team got its 20th win in 24 games, but the 1973-74 team got to 20 wins in only 21 contests.

Combined with the 2006-07 22-12 finish, it marked the fifth time Vanderbilt has had consecutive 20-win seasons. Previously, the Commodores put up four straight years with 20 wins or more (1964-65 through 1967-68), then had back-to-back 20-win campaigns in 1972-73 and '73-74, 1992-93 and '93-94 and 2003-04 and '04-05.

## Regular Season Wins

The 2007-08 edition of the Commodores won 25 regular season games, the most of the Stallings era and tied for the most single regular season wins in Vanderbilt history (1992-93 team).

## Back-to-Back Winning SEC Seasons

With the win over Mississippi State, Vanderbilt reached the ten-win mark in SEC play, making it the first time Vanderbilt has had two consecutive over .500 records in conference play since the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons, and the first time since 1987-88 and 1988-89 that the Commodores have posted back-to-back 10-win seasons in SEC play.

## Stallings Gets 150th Win As VU Coach, Gets To 20 Wins For Fourth Time

Kevin Stallings got his 150th win as head coach of Vanderbilt after the Commodores' 91-88 win over South Alabama on November 29, and against South Carolina, Stallings passed the 20-win mark for the fourth time in his nine years at Vanderbilt. He's only the third coach in Commodore history to record at least 150 victories, and only legendary VU coach Roy Skinner has had more 20 win seasons (six).

## Dores' Perfect At Home In 2007-08

Vanderbilt finished the year 19-0 at home on the season, the first perfect home season for Vanderbilt since the 1992-93 season and the sixth perfect season in Memorial Gym history. Vanderbilt also registered perfect records at home in the 1955-56, 1960-61, 1964-65 and 1966-67 seasons. It was also the most single season wins in the history of the 57-year old facility.

## Back-To-Back NCAA Tournament Years

Vanderbilt's advancement to the 2008 NCAA Tournament marked the first time since the 1988 and 1989 seasons that the Commodores have advanced to consecutive NCAA Tournaments. The Commodores have never reached three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.

## Helpers Galore...

Vanderbilt ranked first in the SEC in assists per game at 17.8 and ranked sixth nationally. The Commodores had an assist on 65.8% of their baskets last season.

## Team Three's

Vanderbilt's 303 made 3-pointers in 2007-08 ranked as the second-most in school history behind only the 2006 squad (322).

## Dynamic Duo

Senior Shan Foster and freshman A.J. Ogilvy ended the season ranked one and eight, respectively, in scoring in the Southeastern Conference. Foster poured in 20.3 points per contest, while Ogilvy added 17.0 points per game, and led all SEC freshmen. The Foster-Ogilvy combination was the top scoring duo in the Southeastern Conference (37.3 ppg).

## Vanderbilt Begins Season 16-0

The Commodores started the 2007-08 season with a 16-game winning streak, capturing the South Padre Island Invitational and knocking off back-to-back ACC foes (Georgia Tech and Wake Forest) along the way. Vanderbilt defeated Austin Peay and Valparaiso at Memorial Gym as a part of the SPI, and knocked off Utah State and Bradley on South Padre Island to capture the tournament title. Jermaine Beal and A.J. Ogilvy were named to

the All-Tournament team, and Shan Foster was named the SPI MVP.

The 16-game winning streak tied an all-time program record which dated back to the 1926 and 1927 campaigns

## Commodores Ranked For 16 Consecutive Weeks

The Commodores were ranked for 16 consecutive weeks in 2007-08, a streak that began with the week of December 3rd. Vanderbilt reached its highest point in the rankings on January 7, when VU was 13th in the Associated Press Poll and 12th in the ESPN/USA Today rankings. The 16 consecutive weeks ties a Vanderbilt school record for consecutive weeks ranked in the polls (1965-66, 1973-74 seasons).

## Shan Foster Wins SEC Player Of The Year Award

'06 senior wing Shan Foster was named the SEC's Player of the Year by the league's coaches and media for his exploits in 2007-08. Foster became the first SEC player to win the league's Player of the Week honor four times in one season, and led the SEC in scoring (20.3 ppg), three-pointers made (134), and three-point field goal percentage (.469). In fact, his 134 threes made were the most ever in the SEC in a single season, beating the previous mark of 117 set by Jamel Bradley of South Carolina in the 2002 season. Foster also scored 2,011 points in his four-year Commodore career, becoming the first Vanderbilt player to surpass the 2,000-point barrier and leaving the school as the program's all-time leading scorer.

## Foster Has Historical Night Vs. Mississippi State

Shan Foster scored 42 points in the Commodores' 86-85 overtime win over Mississippi State on March 5, which tied for the second-most points scored in a game in Vanderbilt history. Bo Wyenandt also scored 42 points against Alabama on February 20, 1967. Foster is the first person to score 40 points in a game since Tom Hagan tallied 44 against Mississippi State on March 8, 1969.

The 42-point performance was also the best single-game scoring output in the SEC this season.

## Shan Sets Single Season Three-Point Mark

With Shan Foster's six three pointers against Tennessee on February 26, he eclipsed the Vanderbilt school record of 103 threes in a season by Frank Seckar (1995-96). He made 134 during the 2007-08 season, which also set a new SEC mark by 17 threes (Jamel Bradley, South Carolina, 2002).

Josh Mayo made eight 3-pointers and scored 30 points as Illinois-Chicago defeated Vanderbilt 74-55 at Memorial Gym.

"Mayo can shoot the ball," said UIC coach Jimmy Collins. "Everybody talks about the guys who are shooting from the main conferences and they just overlook Josh Mayo. Everybody saw in this building that he's a tremendous player as well as a tremendous shooter."

Mayo's big night from beyond the arc was the most 3-pointers ever by a visiting player at Memorial Gymnasium, and one short of the Flames' (4-2) single-game record. The Horizon League's preseason player of the year made two 3-pointers in an 11-0 first-half run that broke an 18-18 tie and put the Flames ahead to stay. Mayo was 5-for-5 on 3-point shots in the second half.

"We were severely outplayed, outfought, and out-hustled tonight," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "It was a very disappointing and embarrassing performance."

"It was a combination of our lack of shooting and their great defense," added Vanderbilt center A.J. Ogilvy, who tied with Jeffery Taylor for a team-high 14 points on the night. "We didn't have the defensive effort required to keep their score to a minimum. We just didn't play well enough to win. That's what it comes down to."

Robo Kreps added 23 points, including three 3-pointers, as the Flames won their third straight game.

Overall, the Flames made 12 of 19 (63.2 percent) 3-point attempts. Vanderbilt (5-2) was 4-for-24 (16.7 percent) from beyond the arc.

## NOTES FROM VANDERBILT'S LAST TIME OUT Vs. UIC

### First Half Notes:

- With AJ Ogilvy's three-pointer at the 18:49 mark in the first half, Vanderbilt extended its streak of consecutive games (705) with a three-pointer, dating back to when the three-point line was established in the 1986-87 season. The Commodores streak ranks second only to UNLV (713) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.
- UIC jumped out to a 15-8 advantage after Josh Mayo's three-point basket with 14:21 remaining in the first half
- Ogilvy made his third consecutive three-pointer at the 18:49 mark. He was 2-2 from beyond the arc against VCU (11/30/08). Prior to the VCU game Ogilvy was 0-5 in his career.
- Vanderbilt's Steve Tchiengang scored his first points of his collegiate career with a lay-in at the 10:45 mark in the first half
- Vanderbilt went on a 6-0 run to narrow UIC lead to one (15-14) with 9:21 remaining in the half.
- With Beal's two free throws, Vanderbilt tied the game (18-18) with 7:46 to go in the first half. The tie was the only one of the game. Vanderbilt's only lead of the first half came at the 17:02 mark (7-6)
- UIC went on an 11-0 run to take its largest lead of the game (29-18) with four minutes to go in the half.
- Vanderbilt's nine-point deficit at the half is the largest of the season. The only time Vanderbilt had trailed at halftime prior to tonight was when they trailed Illinois by one. The nine-point deficit at the half is the largest since Vanderbilt trailed Siena by 12 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Vanderbilt and UIC each pulled down 20 rebounds in the first half
- Last season Vanderbilt's largest deficit at home at the half was two points against Tennessee State (12/27/07)
- Vanderbilt committed 10 first half turnovers while UIC only had four
- Vanderbilt was 1-of-8 (13%) from beyond the arc in the first half while UIC was 5-11 (46%)

- Vanderbilt gave up a season-high 74 points to UIC
- Vanderbilt shot 20-59 (34%) from the field while UIC was 30-67 (45%). The 34 percent field goal percentage is a season-low for the Commodores
- Vanderbilt had three players score in double figures. Jeffery Taylor and A.J. Ogilvy led Vanderbilt with 14 points a piece while Brad Tinsley added 11. Ogilvy and Tinsley have scored in double figures in all seven games this season, while Taylor has scored in double figures six times in seven games.
- Vanderbilt shot a season-low 4-24 (17%) from three-point range while UIC was 12-19 (63%) from beyond the arc. The twelve three-pointers by UIC is the most an opponent has had against Vanderbilt this season.
- Vanderbilt was outrebounded 39-38. The Commodores are 0-2 when being out rebounded by its opponent.

### Historic Memorial Gymnasium Enters 57th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is entering its 57th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt and the venerable old facility saw its most successful season in 2007-08, when the Commodores went a perfect 19-0 and defeated another number one ranked team. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008. The Commodores also have a six-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster scored 42 points, including a three with 1.7 seconds remaining, in an 86-85 Vanderbilt win on March 8, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 671-186 (.783) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0, marking the 21st time in the past 22 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games. It also marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 103 of its last 110 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 150-15 non-conference record at home (.909 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 83-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

- In 30 seasons as a player and coach, his teams have made 25 tournament appearances, including 16 NCAA berths and three Final Fours.
- He has posted 20-win seasons 21 times and has won 12 conference championships.
- Stallings has posted just one losing season in 30 seasons as a player and coach.
- Stallings ranks third among the winningest coaches in Vanderbilt history with 170 victories.
- Stallings is the first Vanderbilt coach to lead two Commodore squads to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 since the field expanded to as many as 64 teams in 1985.
- Stallings is only the second coach in Vanderbilt history to register four 20-win seasons (Roy Skinner - six).
- All 23 of his seniors at Vanderbilt have earned their degree.
- One of only three Vanderbilt coaches with 150 or more wins.
- Led 2007-08 team to a perfect 19-0 record at home, the most single-season home wins in the history of the program.

Another freshman, Jeffery Taylor, added 15 points, while junior Jermaine Beal chipped in 14 points, and sophomore center A.J. Ogilvy notched 13 points, all in the second half.

The Commodores, who trailed early by two points early in the contest, never trailed after that and held a comfortable margin the rest of the way. Vanderbilt led by as many as 23 in the second half, and had many players who had not seen considerable playing time in their careers step up and contribute significant minutes in the game.

The Commodores shot 46.2% on the night, and was 45.5% from three and 82.4% from the charity stripe, and held Drake's leading scorer, guard Josh Young, to only 10 points, 12 under his average, on only 1-of-9 shooting. Bulldog forward Jonathan Cox led the team with 12 points on the night.

Vanderbilt sophomore A.J. Ogilvy scored 25 points to lead four Commodore players in double figures in route to a 71-66 win over VCU in the finals of the Cancun Challenge at the Moon Palace Resort in Cancun, Mexico. Ogilvy was named the tournament's MVP, and junior guard Jermaine Beal was named to the Cancun Challenge All-Tournament team.

The Commodores led for most of the contest, but VCU made the game interesting in the second half behind their frenzied defense and clutch shooting Ram guard Eric Maynor, who ended the game with 31 points, 23 of those in the second half. Vanderbilt, who saw its lead balloon to as many as 18 early in the second half, struggled with the quickness of the VCU guards in the period, and had its lead cut to one, 48-47, with 11:11 to play in the game. VU responded and pushed its lead back up to seven, but once again VCU came back, this time cutting the deficit to two points with 1:19 to play in regulation.

Free throw shooting, a strong point for the Commodores in the tournament, came through again in the waning moments, as Beal knocked down two shots and sophomore forward Darshawn McClellan made one-of-two with 30 seconds remaining to give VU the winning margin of 71-66. On the night, Vanderbilt was 26-for-30 from the charity stripe (86.7%).

Ogilvy ended the night with 25 points and seven rebounds, Beal scored 14 points and added six assists, while freshman Brad Tinsley continued his double-digit streak with 13 points in 37 minutes of action. Freshman forward Jeffery Taylor also added double figures with 10 points.

Josh Mayo made eight 3-pointers and scored 30 points as Illinois-Chicago defeated Vanderbilt 74-55 at Memorial Gym.

"Mayo can shoot the ball," said UIC coach Jimmy Collins. "Everybody talks about the guys who are shooting from the main conferences and they just overlook Josh Mayo. Everybody saw in this building that he's a tremendous player as well as a tremendous shooter."

Mayo's big night from beyond the arc was the most 3-pointers ever by a visiting player at Memorial Gymnasium, and one short of the Flames' (4-2) single-game record. The Horizon League's preseason player of the year made two 3-pointers in an 11-0 first-half run that broke an 18-18 tie and put the Flames ahead to stay. Mayo was 5-for-5 on 3-point shots in the second half.

"We were severely outplayed, outfought, and out-hustled tonight," said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "It was a very disappointing and embarrassing performance."

"It was a combination of our lack of shooting and their great defense," added Vanderbilt center A.J. Ogilvy, who tied with Jeffery Taylor for a team-high 14 points on the night. "We didn't have the defensive effort required to keep their score to a minimum. We just didn't play well enough to win. That's what it comes down to."

Robo Kreps added 23 points, including three 3-pointers, as the Flames won their third straight game.

Overall, the Flames made 12 of 19 (63.2 percent) 3-point attempts. Vanderbilt (5-2) was 4-for-24 (16.7 percent) from beyond the arc.
