### GAME 25 SET-UP

■ #12/10 Tennessee (19-5/10-1 SEC) and Vanderbilt (16-8/6-5 SEC) meet on Sunday at 5:15 p.m. Eastern at Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville. This marks the 70th time these programs have gotten together.

■ Sunday's contest is the annual "Live Pink, Bleed Orange" game, held as part of the Play 4Kay women's basketball initiative - in support of the Kay Yow Cancer Fund®, in partnership with the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and The V Foundation.

■ To help bring awareness to the day's importance, both teams will wear pink uniforms, with Tennessee donning a lighter shade of pink and Vandy wearing more of a hot pink hue.

■ The UT-VU tilt will be televised live on ESPN2 and will be offered on the WatchESPN.com app, as well as on Sirius/XM Satellite Radio on Sirius 123 / XM 199.

■ The Lady Vols enter on the heels of a dominant 97-68 victory over Ole Miss in Knoxville last Sunday, maintaining their hold on a share (with Texas A&M) for first place in the league standings with a 19-5 overall record and 10-1 league mark.

■ Tennessee is seeking to win its 20th game in a season for the 37th-straight year in program history.

■ Vanderbilt is coming off a 62-46 home victory over Missouri on Thursday night, winning for the third time in five outings since last playing UT on Jan. 24.

■ Tennessee has triumphed in 14 of its last 15 games vs. SEC foes, dating back to last season, including six in a row at home and seven of its last eight on the road.

■ Tennessee was the SEC runner-up a year ago (27-9/12-4 SEC) and was picked to finish fourth this season by the media and fifth by the coaches.

■ Vanderbilt finished seventh in the SEC last season (23-10/9-7) and was predicted to place third in the 2012-13 league standings by the media and fourth by the coaches.

■ Tennessee is 476-71 (.870) all-time vs. schools who are current members of the Southeastern Conference, including 327-45 (.879) in the regular season.

### THINK PINK, BLEED ORANGE

■ Fans of both teams are encouraged to wear pink to Sunday's game, and 11,000 t-shirts will be given away to help create an all-in atmosphere.

■ Gates open at 4 p.m., but the UT ticket office will open at 2 p.m. to give fans an opportunity to arrive early on game day and purchase or pick up tickets. There is free parking

Generally, the best time to conduct an interview is following a designated day with an open portion of practice and pre-practice media opportunity. The Media Relations Office will help with all requests.

### MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media outlets interested in obtaining credentials to cover Lady Vol basketball home games must apply for those online via Sports Systems. To apply, please visit: <http://www.sportssystem.com/seccredentials>. Applications for single-game credentials should be submitted five days prior to a game. Once you receive your approval letter via email, you will be provided options for credential pick-up.

### PHOTOGRAPHER CREDENTIALS

Credentials will be issued only to accredited photographers or those individuals on special assignment. During regular season games, work area includes the floor area at both ends of the court and alongside the corners of the playing floor opposite the team benches. Special arrangements for strobes or catwalk access must be made through the Media Relations and Arena Management Offices no later than one week in advance of the game. UT's arena security policy requires that all photographers placing strobes will go through a screening process and must be accompanied by a UT police officer or representative when placing strobes.

Megan Schmidt and Rhonda Mullins, meanwhile, will serve as Lady Vol Guest Coaches for the game.

### CHAMPIONS FOR A CAUSE

■ UT Head Coach Holly Warlick has been a long-time advocate for breast cancer awareness and research, starting her own fundraising foundation called Champions For A Cause.

■ Warlick was inspired to start the foundation after her grandmother passed away as a result of breast cancer.

■ The illness once again touched Warlick's family, when her sister, Marion Ferrill, was diagnosed. Ferrill is a cancer survivor who attends UT games and occasionally travels with the team to road contests.

■ Champions For A Cause Foundation is a non-profit (501(c)-3) fundraising organization started by Tennessee Lady Vol Basketball Head Coach Holly Warlick and LSU Women's Basketball Head Coach Nikki Caldwell. Their mission is to advance and support the cause of charitable organizations who advocate and act to better the quality of life and health for individuals at risk or in need.

■ The Champions Foundation has raised and donated thousands of dollars to help support the fight against breast cancer through our motorcycle events: TN4Pink - a two day motorcycle ride from Memphis to Knoxville and Cruisin' - a long haul motorcycle ride. The money raised through these events supports efforts such as the University of Tennessee Breast Health Outreach Program, The Kay Yow Cancer Fund, and The Wellness Communities of Tennessee.

### TROPHY TRIBUTE CONTINUES

■ Tennessee's 1998 NCAA National Championship trophy will be on display on the concourse behind section 116 prior to the Vanderbilt game.

■ During the season's final eight games, one of Tennessee's eight NCAA trophies, appearing chronologically, will be on display for fans to photograph.

### A LOOK AT THE ALL-TIME SERIES

■ Tennessee holds a 61-8 all-time record vs. Vanderbilt, dating back to Jan. 18, 1976.

■ The Lady Vols own a 27-0 mark vs. the Commodores in Knoxville.

■ The Lady Vols are 24-6 all-time in Nashville vs. Vanderbilt, but they are 3-2 in their last four trips to Memorial Gymnasium, including an 83-75 victory vs. the Commodores earlier this season on Jan. 24.

■ UT and VU played three times in 2011-12, with each team holding serve on its home court and the #13/10 Lady Vols prevailing over the #25/NR Commodores in the Southeastern Conference Tournament second round in Nashville's Bridgestone Arena, 68-57, on March 2, 2012.

■ The #6/7 Lady Vols brought their "A" game in Knoxville last season, taking an 87-64 decision on Jan. 15, 2012.

■ A 21-4 run over a six-minute span midway through the second half helped lift UT to that win in 2012.

■ Seniors Shekinna Stricklen (20 pts.), Glory Johnson (16 pts., 13 rebs.) and Vicki Baugh (16 pts.) led the way in that win.

■ In last year's game, Meighan Simmons had 10 points, while Ariel Massengale had a career-high 12 assists, fifth-most in Tennessee history.

## PREP TEAMMATES

■ Tennessee sophomore Cierra Burdick and Vanderbilt redshirt sophomore Clair Watkins were high school teammates while growing up in Charlotte, N.C.

■ Both attended Butler High School and helped their team win the 2010 North Carolina 4A state championship.

## MOST RECENT UT-VU GAME

■ Meighan Simmons and Taber Spani combined for 47 points, Tennessee's guards went 10-for-10 at the line in the final minute and the No. 9 Lady Vols withstood Vanderbilt's second-half surge to take an 83-75 win on Jan. 24 at Memorial Gymnasium.

■ Spani scored 24 points and Simmons added 23 points a day before her birthday as Tennessee remained undefeated in conference play. Spani was big in the first half with 15 points, and Simmons' intensity helped squash Vandy's second-half runs.

■ The Lady Vols enjoyed a 46-43 rebounding edge and had good production from their bigs. Bashaara Graves had 16 points and eight boards, and Isabelle Harrison chipped in eight points and nine rebounds.

■ Christina Foggie led Vanderbilt with 22 points but fouled out with 41.3 seconds left in the game. Tiffany Clarke had 19 points and 10 rebounds for the Commodores.

■ In the final five minutes, Tennessee committed to working the paint to match the Commodores' continued drives inside. Graves and Harrison combined for eight straight points before Spani, Simmons and Ariel Massengale made 10 straight free throws to ice the game. The Lady Vols would not let Vanderbilt draw any closer than five points the rest of the way.

## TOUGH PLACE TO PLAY

■ Thompson-Boling Arena has long had a reputation as a difficult venue for visiting teams.

■ UT began its 26th season in the venue with 353-23 record, good for a nation-leading

winning percentage of 93.9%.

■ The Lady Vols are 11-2 at home thus far in 2012-13, moving the overall mark to 364-25 (93.6%).

■ Tennessee has posted 11 seasons with no losses in the facility but is coming off a campaign with its most-ever home losses at 12-3.

■ UT has won 12 or more games every year at TBA, so the Big Orange women stand one win shy of hitting that mark for the 26th-straight time with three regular-season games to play in Knoxville.

## LEADING THE NATION AGAIN

■ Fans in Big Orange Country are highly supportive of their sports teams.

■ Tennessee is the only school to rank in the top five for attendance in football and women's and men's basketball.

■ UT has led the nation in home women's basketball attendance average 17 times, including nine-straight seasons and in 15 of the past 16 years.

■ The Lady Vols lead the NCAA in home attendance at 11,857, followed by Iowa State in second at 9,689.

■ A crowd of 12,512 came for the "We Back Pat" Alabama game on Jan. 20, 12,347 turned out for Rutgers on Dec. 30 and 12,319 were on hand for Georgia on Jan. 6.

## IN THE NEWS THIS WEEK

■ UT Head Coach Emeritus Pat Summitt received the New York Athletic Club Winged Foot Legends' Award on Feb. 12. She joined Dean Smith, John Wooden, Lou Carnasecca, Al McGuire, Ray Lumpp and Bob Knight in that exclusive club.

■ Signees Mercedes Russell and Jordan Reynolds were selected to play in the McDonald's High School All-American Game in Chi-

cago on April 3.

■ Russell previous was selected a WBCA All-American and will play in that organization's all-star game in New Orleans on April 6. Reynolds was a WBCA All-America honorable mention choice.

■ Former Lady Vol Paula (Towns) Jones passed away last weekend at the age of 51. She started 85 games for UT from 1980-84 and had a career average of 9.5 points and 6.5 rebounds. She scored 1,104 points during her career and earning All-SEC acclaim in 1981-82 as a sophomore while averaging 14.2 ppg. and 7.9 rpg.

## LAST TIME ON THE COURT (UM)

■ Led by junior Meighan Simmons who finished with 24 points, the Tennessee women's basketball team jumped out to an early lead and never looked back, finishing with a 97-68 victory over Ole Miss in front of a crowd of 11,727 at Thompson-Boling Arena last Sunday.

■ It was the ninth wire-to-wire win of the season for the Lady Vols (19-5, 10-1) and their fourth in conference play.

■ Five Tennessee players tallied double-digit scoring for the sixth time this season en route to a 59.4 shooting percentage, the highest of the season.

■ The Lady Vols shot 66.7 percent from the field in the second half, putting up 57 points in the frame on the scoreboard, the most in any half this season and the most since a 58-point first half against Alabama on Jan. 6, 2011, a game UT won 110-45.

■ With her team-leading 24 points, Simmons moved into 26th place on the all-time scoring list, finishing the day with 1,319 points to pass Tonya Edwards (1,309).

■ It was the eighth time this season that Simmons registered over 20 points and the 18th time in her career.

■ Bashaara Graves notched her ninth double-double of the season with 19 points and 11 boards, tying Tamika Catchings for fourth-most double-doubles by a Lady Vol freshman. Fellow freshman Nia Moore notched 12 points, a career-high, in just 10 minutes of play.

■ Aiding Simmons was sophomore Ariel Massengale, who dished out eight assists, one off of her season high (9) while Kamiko Williams added five helpers, one off of her career high (6).

■ The Lady Vols began the game off on a 16-2 run and cruised the rest of the way holding Ole Miss to just one field goal in the first seven and a half minutes of play.

## PUTTING UP THE POINTS

■ Up-tempo Tennessee ranks No. 1 in the SEC and No. 5 in the nation for points per game average at 79.0 points per contest (allowing 62.9 ppg).

■ The Lady Vols have been held below 70 only vs. #1/1 Stanford, #2/3 Notre Dame, #3/3 Baylor, Rutgers, Missouri and LSU, and they have crossed the 100-point threshold on two occasions and the 90-point mark six times.

■ Tennessee's Bashaara Graves and LSU's Danielle Ballard appear to be the top candidates for SEC Freshman of the Year, and fans got to see them on the same court Thursday night.

■ Graves got the upper hand in this battle, delivering 17 points, four steals, four rebounds and an assist, including the game-winning basket with .8 left on the clock.

■ Graves is the top freshman scorer (14.6) and rebounder (8.7) in the league this season.

■ She ranks third of all players in the league in double-doubles (9), has scored in double figures 21 times and ranks eighth overall in the SEC in scoring while standing third in rebounding.

■ Graves is shooting 51.2% from the field and 70.4% from the free throw line.

■ Graves has started 23 of 24 games and has played against the SEC's toughest schedule, including the top three teams in the nation, all returning NCAA Final Four squads.

### BEAST AMONG NCAA FROSH LEADERS

■ Bashaara Graves is rolling up numbers that put her in strong contention for SEC Freshman of the Year, among other awards.

■ Her teammates affectionately call her a "beast" for her productive play, yet this young lady dabbled in ballet as a youngster. Perhaps that explains her balance, agility and ability to finish plays around the hoop.

■ After coming off the bench in the opener, Graves has been a staple in the starting lineup.

■ Graves is fourth nationally among all

freshman at 14.6 points per game, sixth in rebounding among rookies at 8.7 rpg and second in field goal percentage (51.2%).

■ Graves is the team leader in rebounding (8.7 rpg) and ranks second for UT in scoring (14.6 ppg.) and minutes (30.4), and third in steals per contest (1.3).

■ She has been UT's scoring leader seven times (18 vs. Ga. Tech/20 vs. Miami/15 vs. Stanford/16 vs. Davidson/23 vs. Georgia/19 vs. Alabama/19 vs. Notre Dame) and paced UT's rebound effort on 13 occasions, including vs. Georgia Tech, Middle Tennessee, Texas, Stanford, Davidson, Rutgers, Georgia, Florida, Auburn, Alabama, Notre Dame, Missouri<sup>2</sup> and Ole Miss, posting double-doubles (nine) of 18/12 in UT's first win of the season vs. GT, 15/12 vs. Middle Tennessee, 14/10 vs. Texas, 15/12 vs. Stanford, 16/10 vs. Davidson, 11/14 vs. Rutgers, 17/12 vs. Florida, 19/13 vs. Notre Dame and 19/11 vs. Ole Miss.

■ Graves' efforts led to her being named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Nov. 12, Dec. 3, Dec. 31 and Jan. 14.

### NO MERCY VS. FAMILY

■ Holly Warlick is 2-0 as head coach vs. teams directed by former Lady Vols and 5-0 overall against teams with former UT staffers on the basketball staff payroll.

■ Tennessee beat Alcorn State (90-37), which was led by former UT player Tonya Edwards as the Lady Braves' head coach.

■ The Lady Vols toppled Middle Tennessee (88-81 ot), which employs former Lady Vol Alex Fuller as an assistant coach and former UT video coordinator Dustin Edwards as director of operations.

■ UT also handled North Carolina, 102-57, with former Lady Vol graduate assistant Sylvia Hatchell at the helm for the Tar Heels.

■ The Lady Vols went on the road and handled South Carolina, which had former Lady Vol Nikki McCray on the sideline as assistant.

■ Warlick added to her perfect record with a 64-62, last-second road victory on Feb. 7 over LSU, which employs former Lady Vols in head coach Nikki Caldwell and assistant Tasha Butts as well as former UT practice players Tony Perotti and Michael Scruggs.

### INJURY BUG IS WEARING US OUT

■ In all, the Lady Vols have had a total of 39 missed games by four different players

through the Ole Miss contest.

■ Kamiko Williams, who sprained her right ankle vs. Missouri, was questionable for the LSU game but played 28 minutes and recorded eight points, six rebounds and a key inbound pass to Bashaara Graves for the game-winner vs. the Lady Tigers.

■ Williams, who already had 14 points vs. Missouri by halftime, left the game with a sprained right ankle with 17 minutes remaining in the second half.

■ Jasmine Jones went down with an injured right knee vs. Mizzou. She returned to practice on the following Tuesday and didn't miss a beat.

■ Cierra Burdick is still shaking the rust off and regaining her strength after missing eight games with a broken right hand from Dec. 31 to Jan. 30. She played limited minutes vs. Mississippi State and Missouri, but she tallied nine points, nine rebounds, three assists and a block vs. LSU, including a game-tying free throw with 7.1 seconds remaining. She saw 24 minutes vs. Ole Miss, tallying six points, three rebounds and two assists.

■ Freshman guard Andraya Carter (right shoulder surgery on Dec. 13) is out for the season and sophomore post Isabelle Harrison is out indefinitely after undergoing left knee surgery on her lateral meniscus on Feb. 1.

■ Harrison reinjured her left knee on Jan. 28 vs. Notre Dame after a previous incident that could not be pinpointed.

■ Cierra Burdick got the cast off her fractured right hand on Jan. 28 and saw 16 minutes of duty vs. Mississippi State on Jan. 31 after being out eight games since Dec. 31.

■ Combined with losing five starters to graduation last season, that means UT will have seen more than its share of attrition for one season.

■ Tennessee lost its second starter this season, when it was learned on Jan. 1 that Cierra Burdick broke a bone in her right hand (fourth metacarpal on shooting hand) and would be out until the first week in February.

■ Sophomore Isabelle Harrison injured her right ankle late in the Texas game and missed the Baylor game before returning.

■ Sophomores Ariel Massengale and Jasmine Phillips missed both exhibition contests due to injury, but Massengale has played in every regular season game.

■ Massengale was held out of the preseason



slate as a precautionary measure after experiencing Achilles tendinitis (left foot).

■ Phillips was dealing with a strained quad in her left leg during the preseason and missed the first two games of the regular season.

■ Starting with the Middle Tennessee game on Nov. 28 and ending when she appeared in the South Carolina game on Jan. 3, Phillips missed six games to focus on her school work, per a directive from coach Warlick.

### WORKING THE BOARDS

■ The Lady Vols have outrebounded their opponents in 18 of 24 games, with Miami, Baylor, South Carolina and Florida being the only squads to win the battle vs. the Big Orange, and Stanford and Missouri equaling UT's total of 41 boards.

■ Freshman Bashaara Graves is leading the way, pulling down 8.7 per contest.

■ Sophomore Isabelle Harrison is second, averaging 8.3 per contest, while sophomore Cierra Burdick is tallying 6.2 per outing.

■ Harrison had a career-high 15 boards vs. Missouri and grabbed 14 vs. South Carolina, 12 vs. Chattanooga and Rice, and 11 vs. North Carolina, Rutgers and Auburn.

■ Graves posted 14 vs. Rutgers, 13 vs. Notre Dame, 12 vs. Georgia Tech, Middle Tennessee and Stanford, 11 vs. Florida, Auburn and Ole Miss, and 10 vs. Texas and Davidson.

■ Jasmine Jones had 11 against Alcorn State.

■ Burdick posted 10 vs. Miami, North Carolina and Davidson.

■ Kamiko Williams had 13 vs. Mississippi State and 10 vs. Baylor.

### SIMMONS REDISCOVERS FROSH FORM

■ Meighan Simmons was the SEC Freshman of the Year and an AP Honorable Mention All-American in 2010-11 after scoring 13.5 points per game and leading UT in scoring.

■ After seeing her numbers dip a bit last

season (11.5 ppg.), Simmons has bounced back and is producing the finest season of her career and building a strong case for postseason accolades.

■ She leads Tennessee with averages of 17.5 points, 1.5 steals and 31.8 minutes per game.

■ She is hitting at a 19.5 scoring clip in SEC play, scoring 23 or more points on four occasions, including 27 at Florida (Jan. 13), 29 at Auburn (Jan. 17), 24 vs. Ole Miss and 23 at Vanderbilt (Jan. 20).

■ Simmons ranks second in the SEC in scoring (17.5), is sixth in overall FG% (43.8) and would be No. 1 in FT% (85.5) if she had enough attempts.

■ Simmons has scored in double figures 21 times this season and has hit 20 or more points on a career-best eight occasions after hitting it five times in each of her first two seasons.

■ She is the only player on the UT roster to start every game.

### SIMMONS RANKED ON UT JUNIOR LIST

■ Meighan Simmons owns the ninth-best all-time scoring average by a UT freshman at 13.5, and she currently ranks sixth on the junior season scoring list at 17.5. She's in pretty good company on that list.

■ Since Cierra Burdick went out with a fractured hand on Dec. 31 (and even since she returned), Taber Spani stepped into the starting lineup and has continued to deliver.

■ The senior is averaging 12.5 points and 5.2 rebounds over 11 SEC games.

■ In those games, Spani is shooting 47.3% from the field, 38.6% from three-point land and 89.5% from the free throw line and averaging 31.3 minutes per game.

■ For the entire season, Spani is averaging 9.7 points and 4.4 rebounds and is shooting 41.9% FG, 34.1% 3FG and 82.9% FT.

■ She produced a career-best 24 points on Jan. 24 at Vanderbilt, hitting 8-14 FG (3-5 3FG) and grabbing six rebounds.

■ Until missing one vs. Notre Dame on Jan. 28, Spani had not missed a free throw since Nov. 18 at Miami. It halted a streak of 22-straight charity shots.

■ Spani is 17 of 19 on free throws in SEC play.

### LET'S TALK ABOUT IT

■ After defeating Ole Miss, the Lady Vols are now 16-1 when leading at halftime. The only game they dropped was vs. Missouri after holding a 37-34 halftime advantage.

■ UT is 16-0 when it wins points in the paint totals and is 3-5 when it does not, triumphing despite being on the short end vs. Auburn, Vanderbilt and LSU.

■ Kamiko Williams has a team-best 3.1 assist/turnover ratio, playing effort-free ball for the 12th time this season in the Ole Miss game.

■ Tennessee limited its opponents last week (LSU, Ole Miss) to 39.8% shooting from the field and 17.2% on threes (5-29) while hitting 54.6% and 44.0% respectively.

■ Tennessee owns a 8-3 record on the road in 2012-13, with its losses coming at the hands of unranked Chattanooga, 80-71 in the season opener, vs. No. 1 Baylor, 76-53, on Dec. 18 and vs. unranked Missouri, 80-63, on Feb. 3.

■ Prior to the setback to Missouri on Feb. 3, the last time UT lost to an SEC foe on the road was on Feb. 9, 2012, at Vanderbilt.

■ Freshman Bashaara Graves had 10 offensive rebounds vs. Notre Dame, the most by a Lady Vol since Glory Johnson had 10 at home vs. Mississippi State on Jan. 27, 2011, and Nicky Anosike had 10 vs. Rutgers in the NCAA Championship game on April 3, 2007.

age that would rate No. 1 in UT history.

■ Taber Spani is approaching 1,000 points in her career at 899 entering the Vandy game.

■ Ariel Massengale's assist average of 4.6 per contest would place her fourth among all UT sophomores behind Dawn Marsh (5.6), Lea Henry (5.4) and Holly Warlick (5.0).

■ Taber Spani (24) and Meighan Simmons (23) each broke the 20-point plateau vs. Vanderbilt in the first meeting this season, marking the first time two UT players had accomplished that feat in a game since Glory Johnson (25) and Shekinna Stricklen (20) on March 4, 2011 vs. Florida.

■ Graves' total of nine double-doubles ties her for fourth with Tamika Catchings among freshman in UT history and ties her for 27th all-time among all Lady Vols.

■ The four Lady Vols ahead of Graves on the freshman list are: Chamique Holdsclaw (16), Sheila Frost (11) and Candace Parker (10).

■ With an average of 44.6 rebounds per game, the 2012-13 Lady Vols currently would rank seventh all-time at UT with that figure.

■ The triumph over Florida on Jan. 13 by three points was Tennessee's first by fewer than five points since a 61-58 win at Ole Miss on Feb. 11, 2010, and UT had a second one at LSU on Feb. 10, 2012, edging the Lady Tigers, 64-62 with a bucket from Bashaara Graves with 0.8 seconds remaining on the clock.

■ It's a different time, with different expectations, but Holly Warlick already has guided her squad to 18 wins.

■ Pat Summitt guided her first two teams to 16-win seasons before producing a 28-5 record in year three.

■ Tennessee players have recorded 19 double-doubles this season, including Bashaara Graves (9), Isabelle Harrison (6), Cierra Burdick (2) and Kamiko Williams (2).

■ Meighan Simmons is the only Lady Vol to start every game this season.

■ Five different UT players have led the team in scoring and six different Lady Vols have paced the squad in caroms in 2012-13.

■ Tennessee came from 12-down to defeat a team for the second time this season when the Lady Vols escaped with a 75-66 win over Auburn. The other was vs. Middle Tennessee.

## ■ NO. 2 SIGNING CLASS

During the early signing period, Tennessee grabbed the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation, according to Dan Olson Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. Hoop-Gurlz/ESPNU has UT signing the No. 1 player (Mercedes Russell, 6-6, post, Springfield, Ore.), the No. 8 player (Janah Tucker, 6-0, guard, Randallstown, Md.) and the No. 42 player (Jordan Reynolds, 5-11, guard, Portland, Ore.). Tennessee signed the No. 5 class in 2012 and its group of players in 2011 earned a No. 3 overall rating.

Simmons is fifth (46.9%).

■ UT leads the SEC and ranks No. 5 nationally in scoring offense at 79.0 per contest and is tops in league games only at 80.0 ppg as well.

■ Meighan Simmons has scored 1,319 points, the third-highest total of any active SEC player. She ranks just behind Georgia Jasmine James in second (1,321).

■ The Lady Vols are on top of the league for rebounds per game at 44.6 for all games and are first at 42.9 during SEC games.

■ UT leads the SEC in free throw percentage in all games at 74.7.

■ During 11 SEC games, the Lady Vols are averaging 39.5% from three-point land, which ranks second in the league.

■ Meighan Simmons is the league's leading scorer in 11 SEC games, averaging 19.5 points per contest.

■ She has two of the five highest single-game scoring totals in the league this season with 33 vs. UNC and 29 vs. Auburn.

■ "Speedy" also ranks second for most 20-point games by an SEC player this season with eight.

■ Simmons has the conference's third-best three-point shooting percentage in 11 league contests, nailing 42.9 percent.

■ Ariel Massengale rates fifth in the SEC with a 4.6 assists-per-game average during league play and her assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.8 ranks fifth as well.

### KAMIKO GETS HER GROOVE BACK

■ Senior Kamiko Williams, who overcame ACL surgery prior to her junior season to return, has gotten her groove back as a senior.

■ She produced double-figure scoring efforts in three of her last four games.

■ Williams had 11 points, five assists and four rebounds in 21 minutes vs. Ole Miss.

■ Against Missouri, she finished with 14 points, six rebounds, three steals, two assists and a block in 17 minutes, most of that coming before halftime in a game she left early in the second half with a sprained right ankle.

■ Getting her first start since the Mississippi State game on Jan. 27, 2011, of her sophomore year, Kamiko Williams put on a show vs. MSU again a little more than two years after that last start.

■ Williams delivered a tough in-bounds pass to Bashaara Graves that the fellow Clarksville native put in the basket with .8 remaining on the clock for a 64-62 Lady Vol win over LSU in Baton Rouge.

■ UT’s first loss to a top-25 squad came on Dec. 18, as #3/3 Baylor prevailed, 76-53.

■ Stanford handed the Big Orange a second setback to a ranked foe, triumphing, 73-60, in Knoxville on Dec. 22.

■ UT opponents with young teams include 5. Florida (9.09), t6. North Carolina (1.000), 13. Georgia Tech (1.067), 14. Texas (1.069), 19. Rice (1.083) and 39. South Carolina (1.250).

■ The Lady Vols have five newcomers, including four freshmen, on their roster.

■ Tennessee has only two seniors this season, including 6-1 guard/forward Taber Spani and 5-11 guard Kamiko Williams. Both missed time with injuries last season.

### PHILLIPS PLAYS IN HOME STATE

■ After sitting out seven games, sophomore guard Jasmine Phillips returned to the lineup at South Carolina.

■ The Hartsville, S.C., native played two minutes, hitting one of two free throw attempts and grabbing a rebound in her home state.

■ After not dressing for the Middle Tennessee and North Carolina games, Phillips travelled with UT to the Texas and Baylor games. She did not play, but has been practicing with the team since then.

■ Holly Warlick held Phillips out of workouts and games, starting just before the Middle Tennessee contest, requiring her to make a stronger commitment to her academic work.

■ Phillips also suffered a strained left quad in the preseason that has limited her to only two game appearances, coming vs. Rice and Alcorn State.

### CHANGES AT THE SUMMITT

■ Pat Summitt attended both of UT's exhibition contests and the season opener at Chattanooga, but she was not in the crowd at Georgia Tech on Nov. 11.

■ It marked the first time the NCAA's all-time winningest coach was not at a Lady Vol game since Margaret Hutson was on the bench for UT in 1974.

■ The home opener vs. Rice marked the first time someone other than Summitt has been head coach for the Lady Vols in a regular season home game since the 1974 campaign.

■ Summitt also did not attend the game at Miami, as her son Tyler, an assistant coach for the Marquette women's team, was in Atlanta for the Golden Eagles' game vs. Georgia Tech.



She was on hand for that contest.

■ Summitt was in Milwaukee for Marquette's "We Back Pat" game on Dec. 15, so she was not on the Texas/Baylor trip and has not been at any UT road games other than the opener at Chattanooga on Nov. 9 and UT's game at Vanderbilt on Jan. 24, when she sat with Governor Bill Haslam.

■ She attends all of UT's home games and sits behind the TV broadcast position in section 121 at halfcourt, cross-court from the team benches.

### FIRST OPENER LOSS SINCE 1999

■ Tennessee opened its campaign on Nov. 9 at Chattanooga, dropping an 80-71 decision to the Lady Mocs in front of 8,468 at McKenzie Arena.

■ UT outrebounded UTC, 53-31, but 26 turnovers and 38-percent shooting from the field (3-16 from 3FG) could not be overcome.

■ The loss in the opener was the Lady Vols' first initial-game loss since No. 2/2 UT fell at home to No. 6/6 Louisiana Tech, 69-64, on Nov. 14, 1999, in the State Farm Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic at Thompson-Boling Arena.

■ The loss vs. Chattanooga was UT's first to the Lady Mocs since Jan. 26, 1973, a 58-55 setback in Knoxville.

■ Tennessee is now 25-7 all-time vs. UTC.

### SUMMITT DROPPED OPENER TOO

■ Not that it's any solace for Lady Vol coach Holly Warlick, but her mentor, Pat Summitt, also dropped her first game as UT head coach.

■ Summitt's 1974-75 squad fell to Mercer in Knoxville on Dec. 7, 1974, by a score of 84-83.

■ The troops were rallied by Summitt, UT won the next six games and the squad went on to a 16-8 mark that season.

■ Tennessee had five seniors and a junior on that 1974-75 squad, while the 2012-13 edition includes two seniors and a junior.

■ While Summitt's unit reeled off six straight wins after its opening-day loss, Warlick's club one-upped that year's team, ripping off seven in a row before faltering again.

### TAKE THE BATON AND LET'S GO!!

■ UT head coach Holly Warlick, who arrived at UT in 1976 as a scholarship track & field athlete, walked on and later earned a basketball scholarship and became a three-time All-American on the hardwood, used a well-known track & field prop to demonstrate to her team what the expectations are and what needs to be done in this time of transition.

■ During a team meeting in August, Warlick gave everyone involved with the program a white baton with inscriptions providing a simplified explanation of what is occurring, emphasizing that the program's values remain the same and encouraging everyone to hit the ground running.

■ "TENNESSEE LADY VOLS Tradition...All we are doing is passing the baton."

■ "NEW TEAM, NEW STAFF, NEW GOALS... SAME HEART, SAME PRIDE, SAME FIGHT."

■ "TAKE THE BATON AND LET'S GO!!"

### UT RANKINGS HISTORY

■ Tennessee has been in every AP rankings list since the 14th poll of the 1984-85 season.

■ After week one, the Lady Vols fell outside the AP top 20 (24th), however, for the first

time since the 13th poll of 1984-85.

■ UT began the campaign ranked No. 20 in the Associated Press Preseason Poll and No. 16 in the USA Today Coaches Preseason Poll.

■ It marked UT's lowest preseason AP Poll position since not being ranked in the inaugural AP Poll in 1976-77, Holly Warlick's freshman season at Tennessee.

■ The previous regular season low before this season came when Tennessee dropped to 19th in the 16th AP Poll of the 2008-09 campaign before finishing in 18th position.

■ The Lady Vols concluded the 2011-12 campaign at No. 9 in the AP Poll and No. 7 in the USA Today/ESPN Poll.

### COACHING ALMA MATER TO TOP 25

■ Holly Warlick is the 30th women's coach to play for and coach a team ranked in the AP Poll.

■ She's just the seventh at the same school.

### SEC PRESEASON POLLS, ACCOLADES

■ Tennessee was picked to finish fourth in the SEC by the media and fifth by the coaches in the preseason polls.

■ UT ranked behind Kentucky, Georgia and Vanderbilt in the media poll and was picked to wind up behind Kentucky, Georgia, Texas A&M and Vanderbilt by the coaches.

■ In SEC media poll history, fourth is the lowest the Lady Vols have been predicted behind nods for third in 1990-91, 1995-96 and 1996-97, all years in which Tennessee won NCAA titles.

■ Junior guard Meighan Simmons was a Preseason All-SEC First Team selection by the coaches and a second-team choice by the media, while the coaches put Ariel Massengale on the second team.

### GOLDEN ARCHES CLUB

■ Freshman Bashaara Graves adds to the current list of Tennessee players who were McDonald's All-Americans during their high school days.

■ Also in the club are Cierra Burdick, Ariel Massengale, Meighan Simmons & Taber Spani.

### HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

■ Head coach Emeritus Pat Summitt and former Lady Vol player Michelle Marciniak were inducted into the Tennessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame on Nov. 2.

■ There is a 10-year post-career waiting period for student-athletes and a five-year period for coaches and staff, but the selection committee voted to waive that requirement for Summitt.

■ Summitt and Marciniak join Holly Warlick and a host of other hoops heroines in UT's women's sports hall.

■ Warlick was inducted as a player in 2002.

### RETIRED #22 JERSEY FOR HOLLY

■ Holly Warlick already had her #22 jersey retired at UT, and she added another retired #22 this fall.

■ On Oct. 26 at a home football game, Knoxville's Bearden High School retired her basketball jersey.

■ A number of family, friends, colleagues, basketball staff and players and former high school coach Buddy Fisher were on hand for the special occasion.

■ Warlick was a two-sport star who graduated in 1976 and came to UT on a track scholarship. She walked on to the basketball team and went on to become a three-time All-American on the hardwood for Pat Summitt.

### NEW FACES, NEW ROLES

■ In addition to Holly Warlick filling the head coaching position and Pat Summitt working in the role of head coach emeritus, there are other changes to the staff.

■ Former Lady Vol player (1996-2001) Kyra Elzy returned to UT as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator after spending the past four seasons coaching at Kentucky and serving as recruiting coordinator.

■ Former Iowa standout and Harlem Globetrotter Jolette Law is UT's second new assistant coach. Known as a key contributor to Rutgers' success during her 12 seasons there, Law most recently served as head coach at Illinois from 2007-12.

■ Elzy and Law fill the spots previously occupied by Warlick and Mickie DeMoss, who left after last season to take an assistant coaching job with the WNBA's Indiana Fever.

■ Veteran assistant Dean Lockwood is back for his ninth year with the Lady Volunteers.

### SENIORS GRADUATE EARLY

■ Seniors Taber Spani and Kamiko Williams already have earned their degrees.

■ Spani completed her degree in communication studies in August and now is pursuing a master's in kinesiology with a concentration in sports psychology and motor behavior.

■ Williams earned a degree in sociology/criminal justice in spring 2012 and is working on a second degree in psychology.

■ Both kept UT's 100-percent graduation rate perfect.

### SEC GROWS, TOURNAMENT EXPANDS

■ The SEC welcomed Missouri and Texas A&M into the conference this season, bringing the total of league teams to 14.

■ Each program is playing a 16-game slate.

■ The 2013 SEC Tournament will be held in Duluth, Ga., at the Arena at the Gwinnett Center, March 6-10.

■ The tournament, which had been a four-day event featuring 12 teams, has expanded to 14 teams, adding an extra day of competition. The tournament will now typically begin on Wednesday with two additional games that feature seeds 11 and 12 and 13 and 14.

■ With Ole Miss self-imposing a postseason ban in 2012-13, there will be only one Wed., game, a matchup between seeds 12 and 13.

## A LOOK BACK TO 2011-12

### UT FINISHES IN ELITE EIGHT

■ During a difficult and emotionally-charged season, with speculation in the air about how much longer Pat Summitt would coach, Tennessee was somehow able to focus on the task at hand and finish with a 27-9 overall record and 12-4 SEC mark, good for second in the league standings.

■ The Lady Vols recorded their 36th-consecutive campaign with 20 or more wins and made the NCAA tournament field for the 31st-



straight season.

■ The Lady Vols reeled off NCAA tournament wins over UT Martin (72-49) and #23 DePaul (63-48) in Chicago NCAA First/Second Round games.

■ Tennessee advanced to the Des Moines Regional, where the Big Orange turned back Kansas, 84-73, in the Sweet 16.

■ Appearing in its 25th NCAA Regional Final, Tennessee saw its season, and Summitt's head coaching career as it turned out, come to an end in the Elite Eight. Eventual NCAA champ Baylor proved too much to overcome, prevailing, 77-58, in Des Moines.

■ The Lady Vols ended the year ranked number nine in the AP poll and seventh in the USA Today/ESPN rankings.

■ Seniors Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen were named to the NCAA All-Regional Team for their play in Des Moines.

#### SEC TOURNAMENT CHAMPS AGAIN

■ For the third-consecutive season, Tennessee reigned as SEC Tournament champions, defeating LSU in the final, 70-58, in front of a partisan Big Orange crowd of 12,441 at Nashville's Bridgestone Arena.

■ It marked the 16th tourney trophy that UT had won since the event first was held in 1980.

■ The Lady Vols also knocked off #25 South Carolina in the semifinals, 74-58, and defeated Vanderbilt, 68-57, in the quarterfinal round.

■ Seniors Glory Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen were named to the SEC All-Tournament Team, and Johnson walked away as the SEC Tournament Most Valuable Player.

■ Johnson's MVP recognition marked the third-straight year a Lady Vol won, as she followed Stricklen in 2011 and Alyssia Brewer in 2010.

#### FOUR TAKEN IN WNBA DRAFT

■ Lady Vols Shekinna Stricklen, Glory Johnson and Kelley Cain (finished UT career in

2010-11) were all taken in the first round and Vicki Baugh was selected in the third round of the 2012 WNBA Draft presented by Boost Mobile, on Monday, April 16, at the ESPN headquarters in Bristol, Conn.

■ It was the best first-round showing ever in the draft for Tennessee with three players taken. The Lady Vols had two first-round selections in 1997, 1999, 2003 and 2008.

■ In all, 15 UT players have been first-round WNBA picks on draft day.

■ Stricklen was taken by Seattle with the second pick, Johnson went to Tulsa on the fourth pick, and Cain was taken by New York at No. 7. Baugh was drafted by Tulsa in the third round with the event's 25th selection.

■ Johnson, a 6-3 forward, made the 2012 WNBA All-Rookie Team. She averaged 11.5 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.2 steals per contest while playing in 34 games and starting 28.

#### WBCA ALL-AMERICAN NO. 21

■ Glory Johnson became the 21st Lady Vol all-time to receive kudos and earned UT's 36th total WBCA/State Farm/Kodak All-America honor when she was named in 2012.

■ Johnson averaged 14.2 points and 9.9 rebounds per game, starting all 36 contests.

#### SEC ACCOLADES

■ Glory Johnson was named 2012 SEC Defensive Player of the Year and was a member of the SEC All-Defensive Team for the second season in a row.

■ Johnson and Shekinna Stricklen were members of the first team of both the AP and Coaches All-SEC squads.

■ Stricklen led UT in scoring (15.4 ppg.) and was third in rebounding (6.6 rpg.), while Johnson was UT's second-leading scorer (14.2 ppg.) and top rebounder (9.9 rpg.).

■ Johnson also earned a spot on the SEC Community Service Team.

■ Point guard Ariel Massengale was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team after tallying a UT freshman record of 162 assists and leading the SEC with a 2.1 assist-to-turnover ratio.

#### FIVE PLAYERS END CAREERS

■ Briana Bass, Vicki Baugh, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and Shekinna Stricklen concluded their careers at Rocky Top, with the quintet accumulating four NCAA Tournament bids, three SEC Tournament titles, an SEC regular-season crown and a record of 114-26.

■ Baugh, Johnson and Manning completed their undergraduate degrees early and began work on master's degrees during their final season at Tennessee.

#### ACADEMIC ACCLAIM

■ Glory Johnson was a 2012 Capital One Academic All-America Women's Basketball First Team honoree, posting a 3.60 grade point average while working on a master's in communication and information studies.

■ Johnson and Taber Spani were named to the Capital One Academic All-District 3 Women's Basketball Team.

■ Briana Bass, Vicki Baugh, Glory Johnson, Alicia Manning and Taber Spani made the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

■ Cierra Burdick and Isabelle Harrison were named to the SEC Freshman Acad. Honor Roll.

## ▶ PASSING THE BATON: PAT SUMMITT HANDS OFF TO HOLLY WARLICK

#### SUMMITT STEPS INTO NEW ROLE

■ On April 18, 2012, the all-time wins leader among NCAA basketball coaches, Pat Summitt, announced in a press conference at Thompson-Boling Arena that she was stepping away from her head coaching position and into the role of head coach emeritus after 38 seasons (1974-2012) at the helm of the Tennessee Lady Vols.

■ Summitt will report to Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Dave Hart and will serve in a variety of endeavors. In that capacity, she will continue to serve the women's basketball program and its coaching staff and as a liaison to the director of athletics, remain involved in on-campus recruiting and serve as a personal mentor to players, including life skills coaching.

■ Summitt finished her head coaching career at Tennessee with a 1,098-208 record and an .841 winning percentage.

■ The Lady Vols won an unparalleled eight national championships under her leadership (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007, 2008) and played in 13 national championship games.

■ Tennessee also won the SEC Championship and SEC Tournament title 16 times

each, and Summitt was named SEC Coach of the Year eight times and NCAA Coach of the Year in seven seasons.

■ Her sixth national championship team, the 1997-98 team, finished a perfect 39-0.

■ "It is extremely difficult to adequately express what Pat Summitt has meant to the University of Tennessee, the sport of basketball and the growth of women's athletics nationally," said Hart. "She is an icon who does not view herself in that light, and her legacy is well-defined and everlasting. Just like there will never be another John Wooden, there will never be another Pat Summitt. I look forward to continuing to work with her in her new role. She is an inspiration to everyone."

#### WARLICK CHOSEN TO LEAD UT

■ After Summitt's announcement was made, associate head coach Holly Warlick, a long-time assistant on the Tennessee staff and a three-time All-American as a player for the Lady Vols, was named Summitt's successor by Dave Hart.

■ Warlick, who in 2011-12 completed her 27th season as an assistant coach for Tennessee and her 31st overall with the pro-

gram as a player or coach, is the first head coach of the Lady Vols other than Summitt since 1974, when Margaret Hutson completed a four-year tenure as the leader of the program (1971-74).

■ Named associate head coach before the 2005-06 season, Warlick has been on the Tennessee coaching staff for all eight NCAA titles, and as a player or assistant, she had a role in 949 of Summitt's 1,098 victories at Tennessee.

■ "Holly Warlick has earned the opportunity to be the head women's basketball coach at the University of Tennessee and to lead the Lady Vol program she has embraced as a player and a coach," Hart said. "I watched Holly grow tremendously as a coach throughout this past season. Under unique circumstances, the job she did away from the glare of the lights and crowds was as impressive as the job she did during game action. At this time in our historic program, which Pat Summitt built from scratch, Holly Warlick, the former player and long-time assistant coach, is deserving of the head coaching position. Her mentor will be available for insight and advice, but this is Holly's team now."

For more than three decades, Holly Warlick has been instrumental in the phenomenal success story that is Tennessee Lady Vols basketball. Her impact on the program stretches from her ground-breaking days as a three-time All-America point guard at UT (1976-80), to her 27 highly-productive years as a loyal assistant for Hall of Fame coach Pat Summitt, to her ascension to the head coaching position at UT.

Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Dave Hart named Warlick head coach of the Lady Vols on April 18, 2012, as Summitt stepped into the role of head coach emeritus. In a touching and symbolic gesture at a press conference announcing the changes, Summitt presented her coaching whistle to her long-time aide and former floor general.

While Warlick helped shape the direction of Lady Vol basketball on Summitt's staff for more than a quarter of a century, the pupil took on greater responsibility and oversaw daily supervision of the basketball office during the 2011-12 season. She also handled a large measure of the media obligations after Summitt's Aug. 23 announcement regarding the diagnosis of early onset dementia, "Alzheimer's Type."

Providing an excellent example of how people rally around each other, the Tennessee staff members pulled together remarkably in the face of that adversity. The end result was a 27-9 overall record, a league-best 16th SEC Tournament Championship and advancement to the NCAA Regional Final.

As Warlick embarks on her 28th season on the staff at Tennessee, it is important to note that she was by Summitt's side, either as a player or an assistant, for 949 of the coach's NCAA-record 1,098 wins and all eight NCAA National Championships. Her value to the program has been evident for some time, as she has held the role of associate head coach since the 2005-06 campaign.

The WBCA also recognized Warlick's contributions to Tennessee's success through the years, naming Warlick the nation's top assistant coach after she helped lead UT to its seventh national title in 2007. The NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches also recognized Warlick as one of the nation's top assistants in 1998, ranking her prominently in The Women's Basketball Journal poll.

In addition to the NCAA title and coaching honor in 2007, Warlick also teamed up for the first time with former fellow Lady Vol player and assistant Nikki Caldwell, the current head coach at LSU, to pursue her other passion. That pursuit is riding a motorcycle and raising money for the fight against breast cancer.

Warlick and Caldwell created the Champions For A Cause Foundation, a long haul motorcycle ride dedicated to raising funds and awareness for a cure for breast cancer. The charitable organization has raised and donated more than \$125,000, and in the spring of 2011 the

duo led a fifth annual trip - this time from the Badlands to Las Vegas. Past trips include the inaugural ride from San Francisco to Knoxville as well as trips to Key West, Fla., New Orleans and Niagara Falls.

On Feb. 10, 2008, Warlick and Caldwell presented a \$10,000 check to the late N.C. State Head Coach Kay Yow and the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund.

With all of her accomplishments in coaching and in her charitable endeavors it might be easy to overlook the fact that Warlick left just as powerful a mark on women's hoops as a player at UT. It doesn't seem that long ago that the charismatic Knoxville native was flying up and down the court as a Lady Vol All-America point guard.

For more than three decades, Warlick has been considered the finest point guard to ever play for the Lady Vols. In addition to being selected to the CONVERSE/Lady Vol Team of the Decade for the 1980s in January of 1994, five different halls of fame opened their doors to her.

On Feb. 27, 2004, she was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame. In October 2002, she became a member of the University of Tennessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame in the second class of inductees. In June 2001, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame selected Warlick as one of 10 inductees into the Hall for the Class of 2001. For the hometown girl, who grew up in the Rocky Hill section of Knoxville and graduated from Bearden High School (where her No. 22 basketball jersey was retired on Oct. 26, 2012), it was a dream-come-true.

In the summer of 1994, Warlick gained admission to her first hall of fame. She was honored as one of the City of Knoxville's finest all-time athletes with her inclusion in the Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame.

Including this season, Warlick has invested 32 years in the program, having helped shape UT into a national powerhouse with tenure as both a player and a coach. Warlick's expertise and major contributions to the team have come from her work with the guards. In 2010-11, freshman point guard Meighan Simmons was the SEC Rookie of the Year, and guard Shekinna Stricklen was the 20th Lady Vol named to the WBCA/State Farm All-America Team.

Additionally, Warlick has been a highly-successful recruiter for the backcourt, attracting some of the nation's finest players to UT to continue the excellence she helped establish as a player. The Lady Vols welcomed another top flight guard to the Orange and White for 2010-11 when she landed McDonald's All-American Ariel Massengale.

As a rookie in 2011-12, Massengale lived up to her billing, earning Full Court Freshman All-America and SEC All-Freshman Team honors. The point guard posted a UT freshman record of 162 assists, ranking second in the SEC in that category, and leading the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.1.

Warlick's tutelage also helped to strengthen the game of four-time All-SEC selection Angie Bjorklund, Kodak All-American and four-time Lady Vol All-SEC performer Kara Lawson and three-time All-SEC selection Shanna Zolman. That trio accounts for the school records for most of UT's three-point marks.

Warlick's association with the Lady Vols started in 1976 when she joined the program as a scholarship 400-meter track athlete who walked on to the basketball team. Soon, she would become the most prolific player in the history of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball. Warlick was the first player in Tennessee athletics (men or women) to have her jersey retired (No. 22) at the end of her career in 1980.

Known as a play-making wiz during her four years as UT's point guard, Warlick was once tabbed the "best player in the South." As a rookie, Warlick helped lead the Lady Vols to their first Final Four appearance in school history in 1977. She had no trouble adjusting her enthusiasm and knowledge of the game into the coaching role.

In 19 of the past 31 years Warlick has been affiliated with UT, she has found herself at the Final Four as a player (1977, 1979, 1980) or as a coach (1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). Her best Final Four showing as a player was national championship runner-up in her senior season. As a coach, she has helped the Lady Vols grab the brass ring all eight times (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).

A three-time All-American while playing for Summitt from 1976-80, Warlick previously held UT records for most assists in a game (14), most steals in a contest (nine), most assists in a season (225) and most games in a career (142). She continues to hold the Lady Vol

single-season steals record with 141 in 1978-79.

Warlick brings vast international experience to the Lady Vols as well. A member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic basketball team, Warlick also participated in the Jones Cup, Pan American Games and World Championship competition. In addition, she was a WPBL All-Star, leading the Nebraska Wranglers to the championship of the Women's Professional Basketball League in 1981. She has served as a player representative on the USA BASKETBALL council and was a member of the USOC Advisory Council for Basketball.

In recognition of being a former Olympian, Warlick earned the honor of running the Olympic torch through Knoxville on its way to the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff for the 1985-86 season, Warlick gained experience at two other stops on the coaching circuit. She was an assistant coach at Virginia Tech from 1981-83 and an assistant from 1983-85 at Nebraska.

A native of Knoxville, Warlick earned her B.S. in marketing from Tennessee in 1981 and her master's degree in athletic administration from Virginia Tech in 1983. Warlick added "biker" to her vitae in 2001. To commemorate her induction into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, a number of Warlick's friends got together and presented her with a Harley-Davidson "Sportster" motorcycle. Just six years later, Warlick already was using her love of the bike towards a greater cause, establishing the Champions For A Cause Foundation with Caldwell.
