**Final:** Cleveland State wins its lone exhibition game of the preseason, 88-58, over John Carroll.

**Defining Moment:** CSU closes the first half on a 16-3 run to turn a five point lead (34-29) into a 50-32 halftime advantage.

**Key Stats:** CSU shoots .500 (30-60) from the floor, holding JCU to .292 (19-65) shooting. The Vikings hold a 50-43 advantage on the glass.

**Performance Leaders:** Aaron Pogue finishes with 18 points and 14 rebounds, while Anton Grady has 10 points and 12 boards. Sebastian Douglas scores nine points in eight minutes.

**SETTING THE SCENE:** Cleveland State begins the 2011-12 regular season when the Vikings travel to No. 7 Vanderbilt on Sunday (Nov. 13) at 2:00 p.m. EST. The game will be broadcast live on ESPNU with Dave Neal and Jimmy Dykes on the call. The Vikings, who defeated John Carroll, 88-58, in an exhibition game on Wednesday (Nov. 9) are coming off a 27-9 season, the Horizon League Championship and an NIT appearance in which CSU advanced to the second round. Vanderbilt, which opens its season on Friday night against Oregon, was 23-11 last season.

**PREVIEWING THE VIKINGS:** Sixth-year head coach Gary Waters will combine an experienced group of upperclassmen with one of the most talented freshman classes in school history as the Vikings set out to win a second straight Horizon League title. The strength of the team is at the guards where seniors Trey Harmon and Jeremy Montgomery return after starting all 36 games last season. They will be joined in the backcourt by freshmen Sebastian Douglas and Charles Lee. Senior D'Aundray Brown returns to the lineup after missing last season with a finger injury to man the small forward spot with freshmen Marlin Mason and Ike Nwamu ready to step in and provide minutes. Senior Aaron Pogue returns as the starting center with junior Tim Kamczyc back at the power forward slot. Sophomores Devon Long and Luda Ndaye and freshman Anton Grady add depth, athleticism and length to the frontcourt.

**VIKINGS 22nd IN MID-MAJOR POLL:** Cleveland State is one of three Horizon League schools to earn a spot in the annual preseason CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll. The Vikings received 149 votes from the 31 voters to earn 22nd place. Butler is ranked second with 698 votes and seven first place votes, while Detroit is 15th with 309 votes. Milwaukee, Valparaiso and Green Bay were among the "Others Receiving Votes". Last season, CSU began the season ranked 25th in the poll before working its way up to the No. 1 ranking on Dec. 6 where the Vikings stayed for five weeks.



**FIRST CSU HOOPS LUNCHEON ON NOV. 14:** The first CSU Hoops Luncheon of the year will take place on Monday (Nov. 14) with Viking basketball fans having the opportunity to get monthly updates from CSU basketball head coaches Gary Waters and Kate Peterson Abiad throughout the 2010-11 season. Hosted by MunchBishop of WKNR, the luncheon will take place beginning at 11:30 a.m. on the fifth floor Viking Loge of the Wolstein Center annex. Future luncheons will be held on Wednesday, Dec. 14, Tuesday, Jan. 17 and Monday, Feb. 13. Cost of admission is \$12 with a reservation or \$15 at the door and includes a buffet luncheon and beverages. Tables for eight can also be reserved for \$96.00. Reservations can be made by calling (216) 687-5119.

**VIKINGS THIRD IN PRESEASON LEAGUE POLL:** Cleveland State was picked to finish third in the preseason Horizon League poll as voted on by the league's 10 head coaches, sports information directors and select media. Butler was chosen as the favorite in the preseason poll, garnering 28 first place votes and 468 points to edge out second place Detroit. The Titans received 19 first place votes and 453 points. Cleveland State earned two first place votes and 388 points to finish third in the voting, while Milwaukee received the final first place vote and 356 votes to place fourth. Valparaiso was fifth with 255 points and was followed by Green Bay (247), Youngstown State (195), Wright State (157), Loyola (145) and UIC (86).

**HARMON NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-LEAGUE TEAM:** Senior guard Trey Harmon was rewarded when he was one of five players named to the 2011-12 Preseason All-Horizon League first team. Harmon, the third leading returning scorer in the league, earned the preseason honor after averaging 13.2 points per game last season to rank 13th in the league. He was also seventh in minutes played (33.2) and eighth in three-point field goals made (1.7), while adding 4.0 rebounds and 1.3 assists. One of the top defenders in the league, Harmon was selected to the Horizon League All-Defensive and Mid-Major Defensive All-America teams last year after ranking fourth in the league in steals (1.5).

**PROTECTING THE ROCK:** The Vikings averaged a school-record low of 11.4 turnovers last season, the fourth time in head coach Gary Waters' tenure that CSU set a program low for turnovers per game. The Vikings had 11 single-digit turnover games in 2010-11, including a school-record low of four against South Florida (12/22/10). The 11 single-digit turnover games were the most in school history, breaking the old mark of seven in 2008-09.

**WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?:** The Vikings welcome back senior D'Aundray Brown to the lineup this year after he took last year as a redshirt after injuring his hand in preseason practice. In 2009-10, Brown earned Horizon League All-Defensive Team accolades, ranking 13th in the nation in steals. He has started 66 career games, including all 32 in 2010-11, averaging 6.9 points and 4.9 rebounds for his career. Brown scored 10 points with three rebounds, three assists and three steals in Wednesday's exhibition win over John Carroll. It was his first competitive action since being injured in a Horizon League first round game against Loyola on March 2, 2010.

**MONTGOMERY CLOSING IN ON 1,000:** Senior Jeremy Montgomery enters the 2011-12 season opener with 988 career points, needing 12 more to become the 19th player in school history to reach the 1,000 career point mark. He scored 149 points as a freshman, 421 as a sophomore and 418 last season.

**... AS ARE HARMON AND BROWN:** In addition to Jeremy Montgomery, the Vikings have another two players who have the 1,000 career point mark in their sights this year. Senior Trey Harmon has scored 923 points, while senior D'Aundray Brown has scored 616 points in his career. The CSU program has never had three players reach 1,000 career points in a season.

## SERIES NOTES vs. VANDERBILT

*Sunday's game will be just the second all-time meeting between Cleveland State and Vanderbilt. The Commodores won the only other meeting between the two schools, 93-64, during the 1994-95 season at the Arizona State Tribune Classic.*

**J-MO KEEPS PLAYING:** When Jeremy Montgomery takes the floor on Sunday afternoon, he will be playing in his 107th straight game at CSU. It is the ninth longest streak in school history and eight shy of taking over eighth place on the list at CSU. Montgomery, who has never missed a game in his career, is also slated to make his 57th straight start.

**A VERY GRADY START:** Freshman Anton Grady got his collegiate career off to a great start, notching a double-double of 10 points and 12 boards in Wednesday's (Nov. 9) 88-58 win over John Carroll.

**POGUE DOUBLES UP:** Aaron Pogue also notched a double-double of 18 points and 14 rebounds against John Carroll. Pogue, who had a double-double of 13 points and 14 boards in the NIT second round game against the College of Charleston last season, has dropped more than 20 pounds from last year, making him quicker and lighter on his feet. At Wednesday's postgame press conference, Pogue joked that it is the smallest he has been since eighth grade.

**CSU IN THE WOLSTEIN CENTER:** CSU is starting its 20th season playing in Henry Goodman Arena in the Bert L. and Iris S. Wolstein Center. The Vikings are 156-105 (.598) during that span, including winning records in nine of the last 13 seasons. CSU won a school-record 17 home games last year.

**FINISHING IT IN REGULATION:** Last year's season finale against the College of Charleston extended CSU's school-record streak of consecutive games without an overtime contest to 136. The last time CSU played an overtime tilt came on Nov. 17, 2007 when the Vikings topped Florida State, 69-66, at the Glenn Wilkes Classic in Daytona Beach, Fla. In the 136 games since, CSU is 88-48 (.650).

**FREE THROWS:** After setting a school record by shooting .749 from the foul line in 2009-10, CSU came back to shoot .731 from the line last year, the second highest percentage in school history. Included in last year's total was a 22-for-23 (.957) performance against Iona, the fourth-highest single game percentage in school history.

**FOR STARTERS:** Cleveland State was one of just three Division I teams to have the same starting lineup for every game last season as Norris Cole, Trey Harmon, Jeremy Montgomery, Tim Kamczyk and Aaron Pogue started all 36 games. Four of those players - all except Cole - are back this year. D' Aundray Brown, who redshirted last season after injuring his finger in preseason practice, is also back. He started all 32 games he played in during the 2009-10 season.

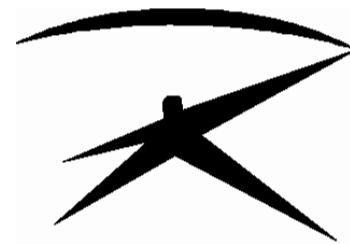
**TRIFECTADUO:** The duo of seniors Jeremy Montgomery and Trey Harmon continue to work their way up the three-point field goals made chart at Cleveland State. Montgomery is ranked fifth in school history with 151 three-pointers, while Harmon is 11th with 135 makes.

**FAMILY CONNECTION:** Freshman Anton Grady has some basketball in his bloodlines as he is the nephew of NBA player Earl Boykins. Grady joined the CSU program after earning first team All-Ohio honors and being named the Division III Player of the Year as a senior when he averaged 22.3 points, 14.8 rebounds, 4.4 blocks and 3.8 assists per game at Cleveland Central Catholic H.S., the same high school Boykins also played at. In addition, Boykins played at Eastern Michigan when Gary Waters was an assistant coach.

**... AND AN "EARL" IN THE PROGRAM:** Head coach Gary Waters has often compared freshman Charles Lee to Earl Boykins. The 5-foot-9 Lee is an attacking point guard who can score and also create opportunities for his teammates and is also a lock down defender. Lee played his final high school season at Huntington (W. Va.) Prep, leading the squad to a 22-3 mark and the No. 1 ranking in the state.

**THE BROWN'S & COACH GEE:** Senior D' Aundray Brown and his father, Aundra Brown, have both been coached by current CSU associate head coach Jayson Gee. Aundra Brown played at Youngstown State from 1987-91 and Gee began his coaching career at YSU in 1989, becoming one of the youngest Division I assistant coaches in the country. D' Aundray Brown arrived at Cleveland State in 2007 when Gee was in his second year on the CSU staff.

**SUCCESS 601:** The sixth edition of Success Class under Gary Waters is utilizing the book *Think Like a Champion* by Dave Dinunzio as the course text this year. Instituted at CSU in the summer of 2006, Waters uses Success Class to teach the Viking players the finer points of what it takes to succeed, both on the basketball court and in life. Success Class 101 used John Wooden's book, *The Pyramid of Success*. Waters relied on John Maxwell's book *Talent Is Never Enough* in 2007-08 and turned to former Indianapolis Colts head coach Tony Dungy's book, *Quiet Strength* in 2008-09. Waters returned to Maxwell in 2009-10, using *17 Essential Qualities of a Team Player* as the course text and again in 2009-10, using Maxwell's *Winning With People*. The non-credited class is taught weekly by Waters to the Viking players over the summer and preseason months.

**CLOSING IN ON 200:** With at least 32 games in 2011-12, Gary Waters will become the fourth coach in program history to coach in 200 career games for CSU. He will join Ray Dieringer (360), Kevin Mackey (211) and Rollie Massimino (203). Waters has coached in 171 games entering this season, posting a 100-71 mark at CSU. He trails only Dieringer (149) and Mackey (142) for most wins in school history.

**ADDING ASSISTANCE:** The trio of associate head coach Jayson Gee and assistant coaches Larry DeSimpelare and Jeremaine Kimbrough are in their sixth year serving for head coach Gary Waters on the Viking bench. It is the longest tenure for a trio of Viking assistant coaches in school history. Only the tandem of Mitch Buonaguro and Paul Molinari (1996-03) served longer as a unit.

**VIKINGS ADD THREE:** The Vikings added three high school student-athletes when the trio of *Bryn Forbes (Lansing, Mich.)*, *Junior Lomomba (Montreal, Ontario)* and *Malik London (Chillicothe, Ohio)* signed National Letters of Intent during the early signing period.

*Bryn Forbes* is a 6-foot-3 guard who averaged 13.6 points per game last season in helping Lansing Sexton H.S. to the Class B state title and a 26-2 overall record. He has helped this year's squad to a No. 19 preseason national ranking in the Hoopniks Terrific 30 and the No. 43 ranking in the Powerade Fab 50 preseason rankings. Forbes hit 41 three-pointers last season and was a Class B all-area honorable mention selection. He is ranked as the No. 3 shooting guard in Michigan by ESPN, the 12th best prospect in the state and the 80th best shooting guard in the country.

*Junior Lomomba* is a 6-foot-4 forward who is the No. 4 ranked player in Wisconsin and the 38th-ranked small forward in the country according to ESPN.com. A three-star recruit on ESPN.com, Rivals.com and Scout.com., Lomomba helped Madison Memorial H.S. (Wis.) win the state title last year. Lomomba, who averaged 17.0 points and 6.1 rebounds per game last year, earned first team all-state honors from the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association and second team all-state honors from the Associated Press. A preseason WBCA first team all-state selection this year, Lomomba is an active defender, strong slasher and versatile all-around player. He has spent two years on the Canadian junior national team, helping the squad to a bronze medal in the 2010 FIBA U17 World Championships.

*Malik London* is a 6-foot-8 forward who averaged 11.0 points, 11.0 rebounds and 7.0 blocked shots as a junior, helping Chillicothe H.S. to the regional final. He earned special mention All-Ohio accolades. The 67th-best power forward in the class of 2012 by ESPN and one of the top-10 ranked players in Ohio, London is a strong defensive player and has been evaluated as one of the top shot blockers in the country.

**UP NEXT:** Cleveland State opens its home season on Tuesday (Nov. 15) when the Vikings host Rio Grande at 7:00 p.m.

# GARY WATERS

6TH SEASON AS CSU HEAD COACH • 100-71 RECORD



- Owns a 15-year head coaching mark of 271-206 (.568), including a 100-71 mark in five seasons at CSU (.585). Has guided eight of his teams to post-season in his first 14 seasons, including three trips to the NCAA's.

- Was the 2011 mid-season recipient of the Hugh Durham Award, which is presented by collegeinsider.com to the top mid-major head coach.

- Is 50-38 in Horizon League play and 7-4 in the league tourney while at CSU, ranking second among Viking coaches with a .568 winning percentage in league play.

- Has led CSU to double figure win totals in league play in each of the last four years, a feat accomplished just once before (1984-85 to 1987-88).

- Ranks third in CSU history with 100 wins and second in winning percentage (.588). Trails Ray Dieringer (149 wins, 1969-83) & Kevin Mackey (142-69, .673) in wins.

- Has guided CSU to 20 wins or more in three of the last four seasons and is responsible for three of the eight 20-win campaigns in school history.

- Led CSU to a school-record 12-0 start in 2010-11 (the previous best start was 4-0 in 1963-64 and 1995-96).

- Used a 64-51 win at Akron on Nov. 24 to earn his 250th career victory.

- Led the Vikings to a school-record 14 wins before New Years in 2010-11, breaking the old mark of 11 in 1992-93.

- Guided CSU to a 26-8 record in the 2010 calendar year, the second highest win total in school history (29 in 1986).

- Teaches a non-credited "Success Class" to the Viking team members each year, using John Maxwell's *Winning With People* as the textbook. The class is in its fifth year, using John Wooden's *The Pyramid of Success* in 2006-07, Maxwell's *Talent Is Never Enough* in 2007-08, Tony Dungy's *Quiet Strength* in 2008-09 and Maxwell's *17 Essential Qualities of a Team Player* last year.

- Took over as the 14th head coach in CSU history on April 6, 2006 after coaching the previous five seasons at Rutgers.

- Only the second CSU head coach to lead a team to the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship.

- Horizon League Coach of the Year in 2007-08 after leading CSU to a 21-13 record and an NIT appearance.

- Is second coach in CSU history to lead team to 10 wins before New Year's Day, accomplishing it in 2008-09 and 2010-11.

- Compiled a 79-75 mark at Rutgers (2001-06), taking the Scarlet Knights to the NIT three times (2002, 2004 & 2006).

- Led Rutgers to a second place finish in the 2004 NIT.

- Was 92-60 in five seasons at Kent State (1996-2001), including a 70-25 mark over his final three seasons with two NCAA and one NIT bid.

- One of only three coaches in Mid-American Conference history to be named coach of the year in back-to-back seasons (1999 & 2000).

- Served as an assistant coach for 22 seasons, the first 15 at Ferris State (1974-89) and the final seven at Eastern Michigan (1989-1996). Worked with teams that posted a combined 394-231 record (.630) with six NCAA and one NIT berths.

- Lettered twice in basketball at Ferris State (1972-74), helping team to a 47-10 record and earning all-district honors.

- Honorable mention All-America selection as a sophomore at Oakland Community College in 1971-72.

- Is a member of the athletic hall of fame at both Ferris State (inducted in 2002) and Kent State (inducted in 2006).

- Attended preseason camp of the Detroit Pistons in 1974 and played that season professionally overseas.

- A native of Detroit, Mich., he and his wife of 36 years, Bernadette, have two children and four grandchildren.
