THE VANDERBILT WOMEN ...

- Made **15 consecutive appearances** in the **NCAA tournament (2000-2014)**, including 12 straight under head coach Melanie Balcomb (2002-2014).
- Have won at least one NCAA Tournament game in 10 of the past 13 seasons during the Balcomb Era.
- Rank **No. 2** in the SEC in **all-time home wins**, trailing only LSU.
- Have made 27 all-time appearances in the NCAA Tournament, the third most among SEC teams (behind only Tennessee and Georgia)
- Were one of only eight schools to make it to the NCAA Tournament every year from 2000-2014, along with UConn, Duke, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Stanford and Tennessee.



Head Coach Melanie Balcomb ...

- Is the **all-time wins leader** in the Vanderbilt WBB history.
- Is the **SEC's active leader in conference wins**. (Balcomb's SEC record: 115-79)
- Has won 20 or more games in 11 of her 13 seasons in Nashville.
- Has led Vanderbilt to **three SEC Tournament championships** and **four trips** to the **Sweet 16**.
- Has directed her teams to a top-50 national finish in field goal percentage and three-point percentage in all 13 of her seasons at Vanderbilt.
- Was one of only five coaches to lead their teams to the NCAA Tournament each season from 2014-15. The others were: Geno Auriemma (Connecticut), Tara VanDerveer (Stanford), Joanne P. McCallie (Mich. State/Duke), Muffet McGraw (Notre Dame) and Andy Landers (Georgia).

PLAYER PROFILES

Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb enters the 2015-16 campaign as the SEC's active leader in conference wins -- and considering the large amount of talent and experience on this year's team, it appears she'll have a great chance to pad those numbers.

The Commodores charge into the season with seven upperclassmen on the roster, and the veterans will join together with numerous rising young stars and several new faces to give the team a potentially dangerous blend.

The talented cast includes seniors Morgan Batey and Jasmine Jenkins, who are two of the battle-tested leaders on the squad, and junior Marqu'és Webb, who has emerged as one of the SEC's most-dominating inside players. Also, redshirt sophomore Rebekah Dahlman, who was an SEC All-Freshman honoree last season, and newcomer Minta Spears, a transfer from Texas Tech, are expected to make big contributions for the Commodores.

Here's a closer look at the Commodore roster:

RETURNEES

GUARDS

REBEKAH DAHLMAN

One of the most explosive players in the conference, Dahlman earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team last year after leading the Commodores in scoring at 10.3 points per game. She also led the Commodores in minutes played (30.4 per game), 3-pointers (43) and free throws (71) while ranking second on the team in steals (36 total) and third in rebounding (4.0 rpg). Dahlman -- who was given a medical redshirt for the 2013-14 campaign after missing most of the season with a bloodclot -- scored in double figures in a team-high 14 games last season.

RACHEL BELL

A local product who starred at Creek Wood High, Bell is expected to be an impact player for the Commodores in her second season in the SEC. She produced a fine freshman season, averaging 7.0 points and 2.0 rebounds per game while seeing action in 30 of the team's 31 games. (She missed one game due to illness). Bell reached double figures in 10 games and shot 83 percent from the foul line, making 35 of 42 attempts.

JASMINE JENKINS

Among the most experienced players on the roster, Jenkins has seen action in 87 career games as she heads into her senior season. Jenkins played in all 31 games last season, including making 22 starts, while averaging 3.9 points per game. She ranked second on the team -- and 15th in the SEC -- in assists per game at 2.7.

MORGAN BATEY

Batey, a highly versatile playmaker and tenacious rebounder, has been a consistent force for the Commodores during her career. She has led the team in rebounding in each of the past three seasons, and she ranked second on the team in scoring last season (8.5 ppg). Batey saw action in all 31 games, and was the only player on the VU roster to start every game of the regular season. She reached double figures in 13 games, and posted three double-doubles.

CHRISTA REED

A deadly sharpshooter who can score points in bunches, Reed averaged 6.0 points and 1.9 rebounds per game last year before missing the final 15 games of the season with an ankle injury. She had two of her finest games against top-level competition, going 7-of-10 from the floor while scoring a career-high 17 points against No. 3 UConn on Nov. 29 and scoring a team-high 13 points against Tennessee on Jan. 5.

POST PLAYERS

MARQU'ÉS WEBB

Despite being slowed by injuries during her first two college seasons, Webb has emerged as one of the most dominating inside players in the conference. She saw action in 27 games, making 17 starts, last season and shot a team-high 59.5 percent from the floor, marking the second consecutive year she has led the team in that department. Webb also ranked second on the team in rebounding (4.9) and third in scoring (8.0). She put together some amazing numbers down the stretch, shooting 68.2 percent -- going 28-of-41 -- during the final six games of the season.

KRISTEN GAFFNEY

Having battled back from two knee injuries that caused her to miss all of the 2012-13 season and most of 2013-14, Gaffney has emerged as a key contributor for the Commodores. She played in 24 games last season, including making five starts, and shot 50.9 percent from the floor. Gaffney, who scored the game-winning basket with six seconds remaining in a win over Ole Miss on Feb. 5, reached double-figures in seven games.

KENDALL SHAW

After enduring a series of injuries, Shaw enters the 2015-16 season with high expectations from the Commodore coaches. The tallest player on the roster, she gives the team a bona fide shoot-blocker and is a powerful force on the boards. She saw action in eight games last season, averaging 2.3 points per game. She was named to SEC's Community Service team and was nominated for the 2015 Allstate WBCA and NABC Good Works Team.

RAYTE'A LONG

Having proved herself to be a relentless rebounder and strong defender, Long is likely to play a key role for the Commodores this season. The hard-working senior, who was selected as Vanderbilt's recipient of the A.D. Hancock-Walter Nipper Sportsmanship Award last season, played a season-high 15 minutes in a win over Alabama in last year's SEC Tournament. She played in 22 games, averaging 1.4 points and 1.3 points per game.

NEWCOMERS

MINTA SPEARS

A transfer from Texas Tech, Spears was accepted into graduate school at Vanderbilt and joined the Commodore WBB program in May of 2015. As a grad student, she is eligible to play for VU this season and has two years of eligibility remaining. She played in 62 games -- including making 51 starts -- over the past two seasons at Texas Tech, where she averaged 7.4 points, 2.2 rebounds and 1.9 assists per game. She was an Academic All-Big 12 First Team honoree during her time at Texas Tech and was a Parade All-American during her prep career at Bullard (Texas) High.

MYKA DANCY AND MIAYA SEAWRIGHT

The duo joined the Commodore roster as walk-ons, and the athletic pair will provide depth to the Commodores' backcourt.

TODAY'S PREVIEW/ 2014-15 REVIEW

HOW DO WE LOOK?

Before officially opening the 2015-16 season, the Vanderbilt women's basketball team will get a "dress rehearsal" with today's exhibition game against Clayton State at Memorial Gym.

The contest will give VU fans their first look at this year's team -- and will also give players, coaches and fans their first taste of the new rules that are being implemented in women's basketball this season. (For more on the new rules, visit vucommodes.com.)

Vanderbilt enters the season looking to bounce back from last year's injury-riddled campaign, when the Commodores posted a 15-16 record and missed the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1999.

SCOUTING CLAYTON STATE

Head coach Kaleena Coleman, a former star at CSU, enters her second season at the helm after guiding the team to a 17-12 record last year. The Lakers are an experienced team, with 13 upperclassmen on the 15-player roster.

DaQuenna Moore, a 6-1 senior post player, is among the key returnees. She averaged 9.6 points and 9.5 rebounds per game. Another player to watch is Kenisha Jones-Barrett, a 5-8 senior guard, averaged 12.1 points, 4.0 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 2.6 steals per game.

LOOKING BACK

The 2014-15 season turned out to be anything but business as usual for the Vanderbilt women's basketball team. Hit hard by injuries, the Commodores endured their first losing season in 16 years, finishing with a 15-16 overall record and missing the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1999.

A total of seven players -- among the 13 on the roster -- were sidelined during various (and often overlapping) stages of the season. As a result, head coach Melanie Balcomb had her full roster available for only two games the entire campaign. The barrage of injuries took a toll on the Commodores down the stretch, as the team dropped eight of its final 11 games and finished in a tie for 11th place in the SEC standings.

Still, the season had plenty of memorable moments, including an impressive 78-62 victory over previously-unbeaten Mississippi State in early January. It snapped the Bulldogs' 18-game winning streak and marked one of just five losses for MSU during the regular season.

DAHLMAN NAMED SEC ALL-FRESHMAN

Vanderbilt redshirt freshman Rebekah Dahlman was named to the SEC's All-Freshman Team by the conference's coaches at the end of the regular season.

Dahlman finished the season averaging 10.3 points per game, which led the Commodores and ranked 26th in the SEC.

Dahlman -- who missed most of the 2013-14 season after being diagnosed with a blood clot and undergoing multiple surgeries -- was VU's leader in 3-pointers (43) and ranked second in steals (36). She scored in double figures in 14 games, including five of the final eight, and posted two double-doubles.

THE TRADITION CONTINUES

Vanderbilt was once again among the best-shooting teams in the nation during the 2014-15 campaign. The Commodores shot 45.4 percent from the floor for the season, which ranked 10th in the country and second in the SEC.

It was the 12th time in the past 13 years -- which spans head coach Melanie Balcomb's tenure -- that Vanderbilt has ranked among the Top-20 nationally in field-goal percentage.

MARQU'ES DOESN'T MISS

Sophomore Marqu'és Webb finished last season shooting a team-high 59.5 percent from the floor, marking the second straight year that she has led the Commodores in that department. (She shot 54.2 percent as a freshman).

Webb put together some amazing numbers down the stretch, shooting a sizzling 68.2 percent -- going 28-of-41 -- during the final six games of the season.

She averaged 12.3 points per game during that six-game stretch, and reached double figures five times. She matched her career high with 18 points in the season-ending loss to Kentucky in the second round of the SEC Tournament.

Although she dealt with nagging knee and back injuries throughout the season, Webb proved that she is among the best players in the SEC when she is healthy. In the six games last season in which she played 25 or more minutes, she produced outstanding numbers, averaging 14.8 points and 8.5 rebounds per game while shooting 64.5 percent (31-of-48) from the floor.

CHALLENGE AFTER CHALLENGE

The Commodores' strength of schedule for the 2014-15 campaign was ranked No. 13 in the nation according to RPIratings.com, and was ranked among the Top-5 for much of the season. And it's not hard to see why.

More than half of Vanderbilt's games -- 16 of 31 -- came against teams that went on to advance to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores posted a 5-11 record in those 16 games, with wins against Green Bay, James Madison, Mississippi State, Minnesota and Arkansas, and losses to South Carolina, UConn, LSU, Dayton, Kentucky (twice), Mississippi State, Tennessee (twice), Texas A&M and Arizona State.

Overall, the Commodores played 10 games against Top-25 foes, which included four games against Top-10 opponents. Although Vanderbilt posted a 1-9 record against ranked opponents -- with the victory being a 78-62 win over previously-unbeaten Mississippi State on Jan. 19 -- the Commodores defeated five teams that were ranked among the Top-50 in RPI.

SHARING THE WORKLOAD

Prior to the season, head coach Melanie Balcomb said she believed the Commodores' offense could come from a wide variety of sources.

And oh, how right she was.

Vanderbilt had six different players lead the team in scoring during the first six games of the season, and, by season's end, nine of the 13 players on the roster had earned or shared game-high scoring honors at least once.

That trend represented a big change from the previous season, when the Commodores had two primary go-to players -- seniors Christina Foggie and Jasmine Lister -- who combined for 45.7 percent of the team's scoring and 80.1 percent of the team's 3-pointers.

LONG-RANGE NUMBERS

Traditionally one of the most prolific outside shooting teams in the conference, the Commodores saw their 3-point numbers taper off in 2014-15. Although Vanderbilt shot a respectable 31.8 percent from long range -- which ranked sixth in the conference -- the Commodores produced some un-Vanderbilt-like numbers in regard to the frequency of their attempts.

They averaged only 10.6 attempts per game, which was a sizeable drop off from the previous two seasons: They averaged 13.3 attempts per game in 2013-14, and 14.3 attempts per game in 2012-13.

Vanderbilt converted only 3.2 three-pointers per game in SEC play this season, which ranked 11th in the conference.
