VANDERBILT LACROSSE GAME NOTES

COACH CATHY SWEZEY

In 17 years at the helm, Cathy Swezey has put Vanderbilt lacrosse on the map. She has led the Commodores to six NCAA Tournaments, including a 2004 trip to the Final Four.



She has coached 13 All-Americans at Vanderbilt. And, in 2012, Ally Carey wrapped her brilliant career as a first-team IWLCA All-American for the third consecutive season — a program first — and retained her spot on the U.S. women's national senior team. In the classroom, 27 of Swezey's student-athletes have been named to the IWLCA Academic Honor Roll.

A native of Moorestown, N.J., and a three-time Division III national champion, Swezey was hired as Vanderbilt lacrosse's second varsity head coach in 1997. Swezey has played a large part in the growth of the sport of lacrosse both at Vanderbilt and throughout Tennessee. Swezey was the first to bring a team from outside of the Eastern time zone to the NCAA Final Four. Her Commodores earned four consecutive berths in the NCAA Tournament between 2007 and 2010.

Swezey's coaching career began at her alma mater, Trenton State College (now the College of New Jersey). She was a graduate assistant coach for both field hockey and lacrosse from 1994-1996. During that time, the lacrosse team earned two NCAA championship titles, and the field hockey team earned the title in 1995. While coaching, Swezey earned her master's degree in teaching with a health education specialization.

The three-time All-American had an impressive two-sport career at Trenton State. Swezey started for Trenton State's national championship lacrosse teams in 1991, 1992 and 1994, and for the 1990 national runner-up squad.

Swezey was named to the NCAA Final Four All-Tournament team in 1992 and 1994, and earned the Attack Player of the Year award from the South Jersey Lacrosse Club her senior season. She became a member of the U.S. Lacrosse squad upon graduation in 1994.

Swezey, husband Scooter Gross, and their three children reside in Nashville.

VANDERBILT LACROSSE GAME NOTES

TOUGH SCHEDULE

When Vanderbilt plays Northwestern it will be its 12th game against a team ranked in the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association weekly poll: Florida (3), North Carolina (4), Northwestern (5), Penn State (7), Johns Hopkins (8), Ohio State (10), Massachusetts (13), Penn (15), Louisville (17), Stanford (18) and Denver (20).

To put that in perspective, only five of Vanderbilt's 16 regular-season foes this year were unranked. Of the top 20 teams in the country, the Commodores have played more than half of them. Twice this season, Vanderbilt received votes in the IWLCA poll.

The ALC Tournament doesn't offer a reprieve. Five teams — Florida, Northwestern, Penn State, Johns Hopkins and Ohio State — are ranked in the top 10 in the country.

The Commodores snapped a 15-game losing streak against ranked foes with a 15-14 win over then-No. 13 Stanford on March 2. They also handed then-No. 9 Johns Hopkins its first loss of the season. It was VU's first win over a top 10 team since defeating Duke 7-5 in the 2012 season opener.

Thanks to the tough strength of schedule, Vanderbilt has earned respect in the RPI rankings. The Commodores are currently ranked 37th but were as high as No. 32 earlier in the season.

SCORING TRIFECTA

Spearheading the Vanderbilt offense is a three-pronged attack — senior attacker Abby Wheeler, sophomore midfielder Kelly Chandler and sophomore attacker Mallory Schonk.

The trio has combined for 89 goals — nearly half of the team's 179. Wheeler leads the team with 38 goals. Chandler is right behind with 26 and Schonk has 25 goals in addition to a team-high 26 assists. Between them, they have 26 multi-goal games this season.

Chandler, who is expected to return against Northwestern after missing the past two games with a leg injury, scored a career-high five against Louisville on March 19.

Schonk tied a career high with four goals against UMass in the second game of the season on Feb. 9. She has heated up lately with seven goals in the past three games.

Wheeler has scored four goals or more five times this season. She notched a career-high seven goals, including two in the final 35 seconds of overtime, in a win against Stanford on March 2. The seven goals were the most for VU this season and second-most in program history.

EXPERIENCE RETURNS

Freshmen and sophomores account for 17 of the team's 28 players, but the Commodores aren't low on experience. They returned 20 lettermen and 14 played in at least 11 games in 2013. Five (Mallory Schonk, Alexa Kunowsky, Brandi Byner, Alyssa Dunlap and Alex Duckenfield) started all 17 games.

In addition, three of last year's top scorers returned, including Abby Wheeler (28 goals), Schonk (25 goals and 10 assists) and Kunowsky (19 goals). Wheeler was tabbed a preseason ALC player to watch.

HERALDED FRESHMEN

Vanderbilt's eight freshmen were ranked as the eighth-best recruiting class in 2013, according to Inside Lacrosse. Midfielders Caroline Peters and Jill Doherty were Top 50 recruits by ESPNHS. Identical twins Shelby and Sydney Trentzsch played together for Sky Walkers Club. Doherty, Callan Kent and Abby Quirk played together for Mass Elite Lacrosse. Eliza Clemens and MacKenzie Lange were teammates with TLC Lacrosse in Maryland.

All eight have played, with five appearing in at least 10 games. Doherty has played in all 16 games and made 13 starts. The midfielder

leads all VU freshman in goals, assists, points, ground balls, draw controls and caused turnovers. Peters has played in 16 games and Trentzsch has played in all but one. Both are tied for the second-most goals among VU freshmen with seven. Lange has played in 13 games. Kent has made two starts in goal, including making three saves in Vanderbilt's big win over then-No. 9 Johns Hopkins on March 29.

FRESHMAN SURGE

Jill Doherty has provided a huge lift in her first collegiate season. The freshman midfielder from Reading, Mass., leads all VU rookies in all offensive and defensive categories.

In 13 starts, she has 15 goals, 16 assists, 31 points, 26 draw controls, 16 ground balls and 16 caused turnovers. She has notched six multi-goal games and on five occasions she has dished out two or more assists in a game. Against Michigan in the final regular-season game on April 19, she tied a career high with three assists. One game before, she matched a personal-best with three goals against Jacksonville.

SENIOR CAPTAINS

The senior captain trifecta of Brandi Byner, Alyssa Dunlap and Abby Wheeler has been an integral part of the 2014 season. Not only have the three provided tremendous leadership, but the good friends have been extremely productive on the team.

Wheeler, an attacker from Charlottesville, Va., leads the team with 38 goals in addition to seven assists. Byner, a defender from Franklin, Tenn., leads the team and ranks third in the conference with 22 caused turnovers. She also ranks second with 28 ground balls. Dunlap, a defender from Villanova, Pa., is second on the team with 30 draw controls. She consistently fills up the box score as she also has 27 ground balls and 15 caused turnovers.

Combined the trio has made 160 starts in their four years. All three have started all 16 games this season. Dunlap has started all 64 games of her career, Byner has made 61 starts and Wheeler has started 35.

FOUR EARN WEEKLY HONORS

Four Commodores have earned weekly accolades from the ALC office this season — the most in one year for VU since 2010. Mallory Schonk was named the offensive player of the week the first week of the season. Jill Doherty collected rookie of the week honors the following week. In March, Abby Wheeler was named offensive player of the week after she scored a career-high seven goals against Stanford. Kelly Chandler collected the same honor in April.

DUNLAP CLIMBS UP CHARTS

Alyssa Dunlap has been playing some of her best defense the last few weeks. The senior, who has started all 64 games of her career, is also moving up the VU career charts. With 27 ground balls this year she now has 116 in her career to tie Michelle Allen for seventh-most. Dunlap also has 65 draw controls, which is eighth-most at VU. She is five ahead of sophomore Kelly Chandler, who ranks ninth.
