### Quick Hits

- This marks the first 0-2 start for Upstate since the 2007-08 campaign. The Spartans fell to Kentucky 74-59 Nov. 10, 2007 and lost to Wake Forest 58-51 Nov. 13, 2007.
- Wednesday night's contest against Vanderbilt is the first of two Southeastern Conference foes for the Spartans this season. Upstate travels to Auburn Nov. 27 for a 2 p.m. (CT) game.
- The last time Upstate faced a SEC team, the Spartans fell 87-53 at Mississippi State in the season-opener Nov. 12, 2010.
- Last Sunday's (Nov. 13) game against No. 20/19 North Carolina is the first of two Atlantic Coast Conference opponents on the docket for Upstate this season. The Spartans will make the trip from Spartanburg to Durham, N.C., for a 2 p.m. tip-off at No. 8/8 Duke Dec. 11.
- Upstate head coach Tammy George begins her seventh season at the helm of the Spartan program. Overall, George has won 125 games in eight seasons as a head coach.
- Last season, Upstate earned a postseason berth into the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI), which marked the university's first Division I Postseason appearance. This season, the Spartans are eligible for the Atlantic Sun Basketball Championship as well as an NCAA Tournament berth.
- The Spartans return six players from last season's squad and welcome eight newcomers. Upstate welcomes five freshmen to the team [Hikeya' Davis, Maddie Herr, Shelby Hicks, Briana Robinson and Paulina Zaveckaite] and a trio of junior college transfers [Hannah Ohl, Erin Pinkett and Tyra Smith].
- The Spartans were picked to finish seventh in the A-Sun Preseason Coaches' Poll and fifth in the A-Sun Preseason Media Poll.
- Junior guard Tee'Ara Copney was a unanimous Preseason All-Conference Team pick, after averaging 15.1 points per game last season. She also averaged 4.1 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.4 steals per contest.

**Wednesday's Opponent - Vanderbilt**

After going 20-12 last season with a 10-6 mark in Southeastern Conference play, Vanderbilt starts the 2011-12 campaign receiving votes in both the Preseason AP Top 25 Poll and the Preseason ESPN/USA Today Poll.

The Commodores finished third last year in the SEC and earned a berth to the NCAA Tournament. Vandy dropped an 81-62 decision to BIG EAST Conference foe Louisville in the first round.

Vanderbilt returns seven players from the 2010-11 squad, including three starters, while welcoming four newcomers. Vandy returns its leading scorer from last year in Jasmine Lister, who averaged 11.8 points per game. Stephanie Holzer (11.1 ppg) is back for the Commodores as well as is Tiffany Clarke (7.6 ppg). Holzer led the team in rebounding last season, averaging 6.0 snags per game, while Clarke was second on the team with 5.4 boards per contest.

In their first two games this season, Lister contributes to top the scoring efforts for the Commodores. She averages 18.5 point per game. Christin Foggie is averaging 13.5 points per contest, while Clarke has 12.0 per outing.

This is the first meeting between Upstate and Vandy. The Commodores opened the season with an 86-55 win over Alabama A&M Nov. 11 and a 95-51 victory against Western Illinois Nov. 14.

**Looking back at at North Carolina**

The USC Upstate women's basketball team (0-2) fell to No. 20/19 North Carolina (2-0) 91-34 Sunday, Nov. 13 at the historic Carmichael Arena.

The Spartans dropped their first of two contests against Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) opponents this season. Upstate travels to No. 8/8 Duke Dec. 11 for a 2 p.m. tip-off. This was the Spartans' first contest against a ranked opponent this season.

Upstate was led by junior Tee'Ara Copney (Asheville, S.C.) with 16 points and two assists, while junior Hannah Ohl (Danville, Ill.) put up seven. Junior Tyra Smith (Lawrenceville, Ga.) posted four assists, grabbed two steals and collected two rebounds. Freshman Paulina Zaveckaite (Gainesville, Fla.) snagged a team team-high eight rebounds, while classmate Shelby Hicks (Greenville, Tenn.) contributed four boards. Zaveckaite also recorded four points and three steals for the day.

North Carolina was led by Brittany Roundtree with 15 points and five assists, while Laura Broomfield registered a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. She'la White helped with 13 points, while Latifah Coleman and Megan Buckland contributed 11 and 10 points, respectively.

UNC took a 48-12 point lead into the locker room at halftime. The second half was more promising for Upstate, recording 22 points. The Spartans shot 2-for-6 (33.3) from the charity stripe, compared to the Tar Heels' 15-for-27 (55.6). From the floor Upstate shot 24.1 percent, while UNC was 54.8 percent.

**Looking back at North Greenville:**

Despite trailing by one at half time, the USC Upstate women's basketball team (0-1) opening the 2011-12 season, dropping a 75-57 decision to North Greenville (1-0) tonight at the Hodge Center.

The Spartans kept it close in the first half, shooting 41.4 percent from the floor. Upstate headed into the locker room down 32-31. However, the Spartans' shooting hit a cold spot as the Crusaders heated up in the second half. Upstate shot 21.2 percent in the second stanza, while North Greenville was 50 percent from the floor.

Sophomore Kim Roach (Columbia, S.C.) led the Spartans offensively with 18 points, going a perfect 10-for-10 from the free throw line. She also snagged six rebounds, while junior Tee'Ara Copney (Asheville, N.C.) posted 14 points and a team-high seven rebounds for the night.

Upstate junior Tyra Smith (Lawrenceville, Ga.) also registered double-digits with 10 points, while grabbing five boards and collecting four steals. Junior Erin Pinkett (Cambridge, Md.) contributed six points off of two three-pointers for Upstate.

North Greenville was led by a quartet of players, scoring in double-digits. Christina Carlis tallied a game-high 27 points, while Krisceda Cotton helped with 12 points. Karly Stache and Erin Gray added 11 and 10 points, respectively for the Crusaders.

Cotton recorded a game-high eight rebounds on the night for North Greenville, followed by Gray and Courtney Friddle with six boards each. Defensively, Carlis and Raven Wamer each collected five steals for the Crusaders.

The Crusaders won the battle of the boards, snagging 45 rebounds compared to Upstate's 34. North Greenville registered 30 points in the paint, while the Spartans put up 24 points in the paint. The Spartans sent the Crusaders to the charity stripe 30 times as North Greenville went 24-for-34 from the line, compared to Upstate's 14-for-15 mark. The Spartans committed 22 team fouls and 29 turnovers, while the Crusaders had 13 team fouls and turned the ball over 26 times.

#### Tee'Ara Crowned All-Conference

USC Upstate junior guard Tee'Ara Copney (Asheville, N.C.) was a Preseason all-conference selection for the 2011-12 campaign. Copney was one of four unanimous Preseason All-Atlantic Sun Team picks. She was named to the All-Conference Second Team last season after averaging 15.1 points per game and 4.1 rebounds per contest. As a sophomore, Copney dished out 4.0 assists per game, while collecting 2.4 steals per outing. She also earned All-Freshman Team honors during the 2009-10 campaign, registering 11.6 points per game and snagging 3.2 boards per contest.

#### Spartans Earn A-Sun Player of the Year Accolade

With a target put on her back as the A-Sun Preseason Player of the Year, post player Chelsea McMillan lived up to the billing and was named the 2010-11 A-Sun Player of the Year by the league's coaches. McMillan leads the A-Sun in scoring (18.0 ppg) and rebounding (11.7 rpg), while ranking among the league leaders in seven statistical categories overall. She was also the only unanimous first team all-conference selection.

#### An All-Conference First

With Chelsea McMillan and Tee'Ara Copney earning all-conference honors last year, 2010-11 marks the first time since the 1994-95 season that the women's basketball team has had more than one selection to any all-conference team.

#### George Becomes Winningest Coach in Program History

With an 81-76 victory at Lipscomb on Feb. 21, 2011, Upstate head coach Tammy George became the program's all-time leader in wins. She tied Peggy Sells (1992-95) with 80 wins on Feb. 19, 2011 after the Spartans' 63-53 victory at Belmont. The win at Lipscomb gave her 81 wins to put her atop the all-time list at Upstate. She now has 82 in her career following Upstate's thrilling 75-74 victory over Florida Gulf Coast.

When Tammy George inherited the USC Upstate women's basketball team in 2005-06, the program hadn't had a winning season in seven years. As she enters her sixth season as head coach in 2010-11, George has guided the Spartans to a NCAA Division II Tournament appearance and has also led the team to its best year in 15 years, as the 2009-10 Spartans won 20 games in just their third year of Division I play.



In just seven seasons as a head coach, George has established herself in both the NAIA and NCAA, having coached both Brevard and Upstate to berths in their respective national tournaments. In addition, she has coached three conference Players of the Year: Upstate's Yakeeshia Ross in 2005-06 and Brevard's Kris May Richardson and Ayana McWilliams, Co-Players of the Year in 2004-05. She has also coached an A-Sun Freshman of the Year and won two A-Sun Coach of the Years.

An offensive guru, in five years at Upstate, George has helped six players finish in the Top 10 in their conference in scoring, including the A-Sun scoring leader in Courtney Hawkins in 2007-08.

In 2010-11, Upstate posted a 17-13 record, marking its second-straight winning season. The Spartans finished tied for third in the Atlantic Sun standings after going 13-7 in conference play. Upstate earned a postseason berth into the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI), which marked the university's first Division I postseason appearance. The Spartans dropped a 103-72 decision in the WBI to Elon. George also coached the 2010-11 A-Sun Player of the Year in Chelsea McMillan.

The Spartans made some dramatic leaps in 2009-10, with George leading Upstate to a 20-9 overall record and a 14-6 finish in the A-Sun, good for third in the league to help George earn A-Sun Coach of the Year honors. Along the way, the Spartans beat all 10 teams in the conference, including conference champion ETSU. The team also featured the first All-A-Sun First Team selection in McMillan and the A-Sun Freshman of the Year in Tee'Ara Copney.

Success in the classroom followed the team's success on the court, with a school-record tying nine players earning A-Sun All-Academic Team honors and the team posted a 3.112 Team GPA during the academic year.

With an extremely young team in 2008-09 thanks to a seven-member recruiting class, George led the team to a remarkable improvement in its second go-round in Division I. From 5-24 in 2007-08 to 13-16 in 2008-09, an eight-win improvement - the 20th best in all of Division I. A final RPI of 321st of 338 teams in 2007-08 to a final RPI of 242nd in 2008-09. The 79-team jump was the 32nd best improvement in Division I, a leap that helped them finish among the top 10 percent of all DI schools. From a 1-15 A-Sun record to an 8-12 record, the Spartans made a leap of seven wins and five spots up the conference ladder from last to seventh. It was the fifth-most dramatic turnaround in A-Sun history.

The Spartans also grouped together a few firsts during the season, as it won its first A-Sun game on the road, it's first Division I non-conference game at the Hodge Center and it had its first Preseason All-A-Sun selection in Hawkins. Kendra Wallace also became the first player in school history to earn A-Sun All-Freshman honors. The team also set two new school records, as it posted a .715 free throw percentage and notched 114 blocked shots. In the classroom, the Spartans also set new high marks, as nine players earned A-Sun All-Academic Team honors, besting the mark of eight set in 2003.

George guided the Spartans into the waters of Division I in 2007-08, leading the team to five wins. Injuries plagued the team, cutting short the seasons of the team's point guard and power forward. However, Hawkins still won the league scoring title.

George helped the 2006-07 team to an 11-17 record and kept the team in the pack in the Peach Belt Conference, finishing the regular season in fifth place at 6-10.

She had a tremendous first season with USC Upstate in 2005-06, leading the Spartans to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1994-95 season and coaching Yakeeshia Ross to Peach Belt Conference Player of the Year honors. USC Upstate finished with a 16-14 overall record, including a 12-8 mark in the Peach Belt Conference and the No. 2 seed in the Peach Belt Tournament.

George came to USC Upstate from Brevard where she spent two years as the head coach of the Tornados women's hoops team. Her brief stint at Brevard was successful, leading the team to a 21-1 conference record and the regular season conference championship in 2004-05 after being picked to finish fifth in the preseason poll. She earned Appalachian Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors and guided Brevard into the NAIA Division II National Tournament. She coached the league's co-Players of the Year (Richardson and McWilliams) and the Defensive Player of the Year. Richardson and McWilliams each earned Honorable Mention All-American honors as well. She compiled a 43-21 record over her two seasons at Brevard.



Prior to her stint at Brevard, George was an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I schools. She served as an assistant at UNC Asheville from 2002-03 where she helped coach two of the top 11 scorers in the Big South Conference. As an assistant at Wofford College from 2001-02, she helped guide the Lady Terriers to its best Division I record in winning 16 games, advancing to the semifinals of the Southern Conference Tournament, and helped coach the Southern Conference Player of the Year. As an assistant at Gardner-Webb from 2000-01, she helped sign the top rated recruiting class in the history of the program. Prior to her stint on the college level, she served as the junior varsity coach at her alma mater East Henderson High School where she guided the squad to three division titles and a 47-15 record in three years from 1996-99.

George is a former member of Charlotte's women's basketball team, where she played from 1989-93, leading the 49ers in assists, steals and three-pointers as a senior in 1992-93. She owns Charlotte's all-time 3-point field goal percentage record and is among the all-time leaders in steals and assists. She competed in the 1993 National College Slam Dunk/Three-Point Shootout shown nationally on ESPN during the Men's Final Four in New Orleans, La. She finished third in the 3-point shooting portion of the contest. She graduated from UNC Charlotte in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in child and family development.

A native of Henderson County, N.C., George was a standout and three-year starter at point and shooting guard on the East Henderson High School squad. She helped lead the Lady Eagles to the 3-A State Championship game in 1988. As a senior in 1988-89, she averaged 24 points and eight rebounds per game en route to being named the Western North Carolina Player of the Year by the Asheville Citizen Times. She garnered first team all-state and Converse All-America honors in 1989 and was named Henderson County Player of the Year in 1988 and 1989. She also earned Tournament Most Valuable Player honors at the State Regionals in 1988. Her jersey was retired in 2008 after becoming the school's all-time leader in points, steals and assists.

George was a member of the Asheville Rage/Smoky Mountain Swarm traveling exhibition basketball teams from 1996-2000, playing several exhibition games against Division I opponents.

George and her husband David, who is an engineer for General Electric, live in Zirconia, N.C.
