MAKING QUICK PROGRESS

The records of just two BCS-member teams have improved more in one year than James Franklin's Vanderbilt squad.

Vanderbilt's improvement from 2-10 in 2010 to 5-5 this year is topped among BCS schools by Cincinnati (4-8 to 7-2) and Clemson (6-7 to 9-1).

CREATING EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

To the surprise of many, Vanderbilt's offense enters today as the SEC leader in producing plays of at least 40 yards.

According to cfbstats.com, the Commodores have 14 plays of 40 yards or more yards, one more than Arkansas and Auburn. Vanderbilt also ranks second to Arkansas with 26 plays of 30 yards or more.

The added big plays have resulted in a scoring average of 26.1 points, nine points higher than the team's 2010 scoring average.

2011 'DORES IMPROVED OVER 2010 EDITION

The 2011 Commodores are scoring more and allowing less points than the 2010 squad.

James Franklin, in his first year at the helm of Vanderbilt football, also has the 'Dores with a better record (5-5) than the 2010 team (2-8).

In a comparison of the 2010 and 2011 teams thru 10 games, the current edition is improved over the 2010 product in virtually every way.

The 2011 offense is averaging more points (26.1-18.8), more rushing yards (162.4-138.9), more total yards (334.9-280.3) and more first downs (16.8-12.9) than the 2010 squad.

The defense is also vastly improved this year. The unit is giving up less points (21.6-31.6), total yards (327.6-437.2), rushing yards (122.9-196.2), passing yards (204.7-241.0) and first downs (18.0-20.5).

The 'Dores have been even more impressive in the red zone, scoring more TDs (19-12) and allowing less TDs (12-23) inside the 20-yard line.

The unit is improved in all rushing categories, averaging more yards per carry (4.4-4.0) while allowing less yards per attempt by opponents (3.3-4.4).

The 2011 defense also has eight more interceptions, helping the team with plus-6 in turnover margin.

OFFENSE PRODUCING MORE BIG PLAYS

Vanderbilt is producing more big plays under offensive coordinator **John Donovan**.

Through 10 games, the offense has 74 explosive plays (rush of 12 or more yards; pass of 15 or more yards). The total is 20 more than through the ninth game last year.

More big plays are coming from both the running and passing game. The unit has 39 rushes of 12 yards or more, 10 more than the 2010 season total. It has 35 passes of 15 yards or more: in 2010, the unit had 25 such passes through 10 games.

SEEKING TWO POSTSEASON APPEARANCES

Nine Commodore returnees are trying to achieve something no other Vanderbilt letterwinner can claim: become the team's first players to make multiple postseason bowl appearances.

The current players – **Brandon Barden** (TE), **Tim Fugger** (DE), **T.J. Greenstone** (DT), **Casey Hayward** (DB), **Josh Jelesky** (OL), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Sean Richardson** (safety), **Larry Smith** (QB) and **Udom Umoh** (WR) – played in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, a 16-14 victory over Boston College.

Several of the current 'Dores played pivotal roles in the postseason win. It marked the first career start for Smith at quarterback. Marve also started and finished with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game in place of an injured **D.J. Moore**. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

HAYWARD: THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALIST

Casey Hayward (Sr., DB) was announced as one of 15 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award on Oct. 31. The award is given annually to the nation's top defensive back.

Hayward is tied for sixth nationally with five INTs and fifth with 14 defensed passes. He also ranks as the SEC's active leader with 13 picks.

Last Saturday, Hayward had six tackles against Kentucky, one week after posting three tackles for loss and a defensed pass against Florida Nov. 5.

In mid-October, Hayward was listed as a first-team midseason All-America by SI.com and a second-team All-America by CBSSports.com.

Hayward's 13 career picks is tied for second all-time among 'Dores with former standouts **D.J. Moore** (2006-08) and **Ken Stone** (1970-72). The team's career leader is **Leonard Coleman** (15 INTs, 1980-83).

Only eight Commodores have ever intercepted more passes in a season than Hayward's current five-INT total.

RODGERS IMPRESSING AS STARTING QB

Jordan Rodgers (R-Jr, QB) has blossomed since being inserted as a starter in mid-October.

In his four career starts, Rodgers has accounted for 10 TDs – six passing and four rushing.

During the four-game stretch, Rodgers ranks among Southeastern Conference leaders in total offense (285.3-yard avg.). He is passing for 235.5 yards and rushing for 52.8 yards as a starter. The yearly average for SEC's total offense leader, Tyler Wilson of Arkansas, is virtually the same as Rodgers' average as a starter.

Rodgers' 297 passing yards at Florida is the most by a Commodore since Chris Nickson threw for 446 yards vs. Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2006.

STACY: SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK RECIPIENT

Zac Stacy (Jr., RB) earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors today for his 135-yard, three-TD performance in Vanderbilt's win over Kentucky.

Stacy's pushed his season rushing total to 891 rushing yards with the effort. With two games left in the regular season, Stacy's total ranks as the fifth highest single-season rushing total in team history. It is also the most by a Commodore back since **Jermaine Johnson** had 1,072 yards in 1995.

Stacy scored three rushing TDs for the second game this year. He has eight rushing TDs in the last five games – and nine for the season. It is the highest single-season rushing TD total by a Commodore running back since **Jamie O'Rourke** scored 12 TDs in 1974.

Stacy moved up to No. 12 on the team's career rushing list during the performance. He has 1,700 rushing yards and 15 TDs on 311 career carries. He passed **Kwane Doster** (1,621 yards, 2002-04) and **Tom Moore** (1,606 yards, 1957-59) during the Kentucky game. Stacy needs 18 rushing yards to pass **Phil King** (1,717 yards, 1955-57) into 11th place on the team's career list.

In reaching 891 rushing yards last Saturday, Stacy passed single-season totals posted by **Warren Norman** (783 yards, 2009), **Doster** (798 yards, 2002), **Frank Mordica** (830 yards, 1979), **Doug Mathews** (849 yards, 1969) and **Jermaine Johnson** (877 yards, 1994). He needs 43 rushing yards to pass **Jamie O'Rourke** (933 yards, 1974) into fourth place on the yearly list.

Earlier in the year, Stacy also produced one of the finest rushing performances in team history, gaining 198 yards and scoring three TDs in Vanderbilt's victory over Army on Oct. 22. The 198-yard effort ranks third all-time by a Commodore – and is the most in 33 years dating to the school-record 321-yard effort by **Frank Mordica**.

OFFENSE SCORING TOPS RECENT TOTALS

In just 10 games, the 2011 'Dores have surpassed the team's scoring totals from each of the last five years. Vanderbilt has scored 261 points, just three less than the Commodores scored in 2006.

The team's 26.1-point average ranks as the highest since the 2005 season (27.2 ppg). The current average is higher than every other season in the last three decades except 2005.



COMMODORE OFFENSE STARTING TO CLICK

The Vanderbilt offense has shown improvement in virtually every area in the last month.

Since facing the nation's No. 1 defense at Alabama, the unit has more than held its own in a five-game stretch against Georgia, Army, Arkansas, Florida and Kentucky. The unit has

averaged 32 points and 425.6 yards in the five-game stretch.

Offensive production is coming from different directions. **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB) is averaging 285 yards of total offense and has accounted for 10 TDs during the stretch. **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR) and **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR) have produced impressive receiving totals, with Matthews compiling 452 receiving yards and three TDs in the last three games. Backed by a retooled offensive line, **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) has averaged 115.3 rushing yards and tallied eight rushing TDs over the last five games.

DEFENSE: LIMITING RUSHING YARDS

The Vandy defense has limited eight of its nine Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foes to less rushing yards than they average.

Last week, the 'Dores limited Kentucky to just 32 rushing yards, 105 yards under the Wildcats' season average entering the game.

The defense has held five teams – Elon, Connecticut, Ole Miss, Arkansas and Kentucky – under 100 rushing yards.

COREY HARRIS: VANDERBILT'S 2011 LEGEND

Former Commodore standout **Corey Harris** will be honored as Vanderbilt's legend during the SEC Football Championship Weekend Dec. 2-3 in Atlanta.

Harris will be one of 12 legends recognized at this year's SEC "Weekend of Champions." He will be presented at the SEC Legends Dinner on Dec. 2 at the Hyatt Regency Atlanta and introduced prior to the SEC Championship Game.

Harris became one of Vanderbilt's most versatile and gifted players from 1988-91. He was a consensus all-SEC pick in 1991, setting a team record with 1,103 rushing yards. He also led the 'Dores in receiving and kickoff returns.

Harris' 180-yard rushing performance against Army still ranks as the No. 6 effort in team history.

Harris went on to a 12-year NFL career at safety that was capped by a Super Bowl championship with the Baltimore Ravens.

FUGGER GETS MIDSEASON RECOGNITION

The superb early-season performance by **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE) hasn't gone unnoticed. Fugger was the lone Commodore to garner first team midseason All-SEC honors by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview*.

Fugger ranks among the SEC leaders with 12.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 QB sacks. He has also set a new single-season career high with 26 tackles.

Two other standouts, **Chris Marve** (R-Sr., LB) and **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) were named to Phil Steele's second team midseason All-SEC team.

2011 VANDY FOOTBALL: AGGRESSIVE, INNOVATIVE

James Franklin is living up to his pledge of bringing an aggressive, innovative style to all three aspects of Commodore football.

Franklin's promise to bring exciting football to West End was on full display in Vanderbilt Stadium where the Commodores finished 5-2.

Vanderbilt fans witnessed Franklin's daring calls Oct. 29 as the underdog Commodores played the No. 8 Razorbacks to a near draw with the use of several crowd-pleasing plays.

More of the same was on display Nov. 5 in Gainesville when Vanderbilt rallied from a 17-0 halftime deficit and Nov. 12 when an imaginative offense produced more than 400 total yards in a win over Kentucky.

Here's a sample of what fans have seen recently from Franklin's 'Dores:

SPECIAL TEAMS:

★ **FAKE PUNTS** The latest fake punt – from the Vandy 23-yard line – resulted in a 25-yard rush vs. Arkansas. One of the most unique fake punts in recent team history – a pass from **Ryan Fowler** (R-Jr., punter) to **Andrew East** (R-Fr., snapper) – worked to perfection against Georgia, gaining 35 yards on a 4th & 10 from the Vanderbilt 22-yard-line.

★ **BRINGING THE HOUSE** With seconds left against Georgia, a 10-player rush resulted in a blocked punt by **Udom Umoh** (R-Sr., WR).

★ **ONSIDE KICKS** After a TD closed the UGA score to 10-7 early in the game, the 'Dores tried a short pooch kick just behind the Bulldog front wall.

OFFENSE:

★ **HALFBACK PASSES** **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) has tried five passes, with one resulting in a 43-yard TD toss to **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR).

★ **MULTIPLE REVERSES** **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) is averaging 19.0 yards on three reverses.

★ **FOURTH DOWN ATTEMPTS** Vandy has succeeded on 12 of 16 fourth downs, including earning first downs on recent 4th-&-1 situations in the first half of three SEC games.

DEFENSE:

★ **MULTIPLE BLITZ PACKAGES** The Commodores have developed numerous schemes aimed at creating offensive mistakes with added pressure. Four different defensive backs had tackles for loss.

★ **OPPORTUNISTIC** Playing with confidence, the aggressive unit has accumulated 15 interceptions, 22 QB sacks, and 69 tackles for loss.

SCORING POINTS ON DEFENSE

For the first time in modern history, Vanderbilt has returned interceptions for scores in three straight games.

This marks just the second time since World War II that Vanderbilt has tallied defensive TDs in three consecutive games. The only other time it happened came against The Citadel, Mississippi State and Georgia in 1999.

NOTES FROM THE KENTUCKY GAME

★ The Commodore offense amassed 28 first downs, its highest total this season. It is the team's highest single-game total since posting 30 first downs against Kentucky on Nov. 10, 2007.

★ The Vanderbilt defense held the Wildcats without a single third-down conversion. The Kentucky offense was 0-12 in third-down attempts.

It marks the first time Vanderbilt has held an opponent without a conversion since Western Carolina went 0-13 in its third-down attempts on Sept. 5, 2009.

★ Vanderbilt's 38 points are the most against an SEC foe since the Commodores tallied 43 points vs. Kentucky on Nov. 12, 2005.

The Commodores also amassed 407 yards of total offense. The unit has posted at least 349 yards against its last four SEC opponents.

★ The Vanderbilt defense limited Kentucky to a season-low 32 rushing yards. The Wildcats also compiled just nine first downs and 211 total yards in the loss.

★ **Jordan Matthews** (So., WR) is enjoying the finest stretch of his young Vanderbilt career.

Matthews continued his hot streak against Kentucky, hauling in six receptions for 131 yards, including a career-long 49-yard TD from QB **Jordan Rodgers**.

The performance was Matthews' third straight game with more than 100 receiving yards, following a 170-yard effort at Florida and 151-yard game vs. Arkansas. He is the first Vandy receiver to put together three consecutive 100-yard games since **Dan Stricker** accomplished the feat early in the 2000 season.

Matthews is averaging 7.5 catches and 150.5 yards during the last three games. He now has set single-season highs in receptions (29) and receiving yards (589).

★ The win broke a two-game losing streak to Kentucky and narrowed the all-time series record to 39-41-1.

★ The 30-point winning margin was the Commodores largest in SEC action since Vanderbilt beat Mississippi State 49-19 on Sept. 25, 1971.

★ Vanderbilt's 24-0 halftime lead marks the largest over a SEC opponent in three decades. It was the team's largest lead at intermission since the Commodores were up 31-3 against Eastern Michigan in 2010.

★ **Wesley Johnson** (R-So.) started at left guard, and has now started at all three offensive line positions.

Johnson started the season at center, then moved to left tackle in the fifth game when **Logan Stewart** returned from illness.

★ **Austin Monahan** (R-Jr., TE) grabbed a career-long, 23-yard reception late in the first quarter. The completion moved **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB) beyond the 1,000-yard passing mark on the year.

★ **Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB) contributed four solo tackles, including one resulting in an 8-yard QB sack.

Barnes also forced his second fumble when he knocked the ball loose on a Kentucky kick return in the second quarter. The fumble was recovered by **Steven Clarke** (So., DB).

★ **Ryan Fowler** (R-Jr., PK) made his first field goal of the season – a 32-yarder with :39 remaining in the first half.

★ The Commodores rushed for over 200 yards for the fifth time this season. The unit is averaging 250 yards rushing during the last five home games. Vanderbilt rushed for over 200 yards against all four SEC opponents at home.

VANDERBILT SOLID IN DEFENSIVE STATS

The Commodore defense continues to perform well under a new coaching staff directed by first-year coordinator **Bob Shoop**.

In addition to ranking among NCAA leaders with 15 interceptions (T-7th in NCAA), the veteran-laden unit ranks high nationally in several statistical categories, including total defense, rushing defense and passing efficiency.

Through 10 games, the defense has limited opponents to 21.6 ppg, tying for 31st in the NCAA. The unit also ranks high in total defense (22nd), rush defense (32nd), pass defense (39th), defensive pass efficiency (32nd) and tackles for loss (T-25th).

MARVE, HAYWARD TOP SQUAD IN STARTS

Chris Marve (R-Sr., LB) has started more games than any other position player on the current Commodore roster. The two-time All-SEC performer and defensive co-captain made his 46th career start in the win over Kentucky Nov. 12.

Brandon Barden (R-Sr., TE) ranks second on the team with 37 starts. Barden is followed by **Kyle Fischer** (R-Sr., OL) with 35 starts. Two other veterans – **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) and **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) – have at least 31 career starts.

Hayward leads the team with 34 consecutive starts entering this season. He is followed by Richardson (28) and Fischer (27). Three other Commodores – **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., OL), **Rob Lohr** (R-Jr., DT) and **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., punter) – have started 22 consecutive games.

BARDEN TOPS 100 CAREER RECEPTIONS

Brandon Barden (TE, R-Sr.) surpassed the 100-catch plateau for his career vs. Florida Nov. 5.

Barden had one catch for 14 yards against Kentucky on Nov. 12. He had four catches for 51 yards against the Gators.

Barden also surpassed the 1,000-yard plateau for career receiving yards earlier this season.

Barden missed two games earlier this year due to a leg injury.

For his career, Barden has 102 receptions, good for 1,130 yards. He ranks 17th on the team's all-time catches list.

Barden is second all-time among Vandy tight ends, and needs 13 catches to surpass **Allama Matthews'** team record.

STATS: VANDERBILT MOST IMPROVED IN SEC

Statistically speaking, the Commodores are the Southeastern Conference's most improved team.

Vanderbilt has shown more progress under first-year coach James Franklin on both offense and defense than any other team in the conference. A close comparison of 2011 SEC stats through Week 10 and the final 2010 stats shows the Commodores rank No. 1 in the league in scoring offense differential (+9.2 pts.), scoring defense (-9.6 pts.) and rushing defense (minus-70.1 yards). The Commodores also are most improved in turnover margin (+7 turnovers).

Franklin's squad also enjoys the second most improvement in several other key stats, including total offense (+36.7 yards), total defense (-91.6 yards), pass efficiency and defensive pass efficiency.

The Vandy defense ranks among the NCAA leaders in interceptions.

The unit has 15 picks, ranking second in the SEC behind South Carolina and tied for fifth nationally.

Despite the total, Vandy has posted just one pick in its last five games.

On Sept. 24, the defense registered four interceptions in a loss to ranked South Carolina. In Vanderbilt's first SEC game, the 'Dores nabbed five picks during a win over Ole Miss.

Casey Hayward (Sr., CB) and **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) are team leaders in interceptions with five and three, respectively. Both rank among the NCAA leaders in the category.

The Commodores also are making the most of the interceptions. For the first time in team history, Vanderbilt players registered an interception return for

touchdown in three consecutive games. It also marks the first time that Vanderbilt has scored on three interceptions in a single season.

Wilson also became only the second 'Dore to have two pick-sixes in a season with returns vs. Ole Miss and Elon.

VANDERBILT'S NARROW LOSSES

The Commodores could easily feature a record better than 5-5.

Only eight teams in the nation have more losses of eight points or less than Vanderbilt (3). All of Vandy's close losses have come vs. SEC opponents.

JELESKY EARNS FIRST CAREER START

Josh Jelesky (R-Jr., OG) became the 13th Commodore to enjoy his first career start in Vanderbilt's narrow loss at Florida on Nov. 5.

Jelesky is the eighth first-time offensive starter this season. Others are **Chris Boyd** (WR, R-Fr.), **Andrew Bridges** (R-Fr., OT), **Mylon Brown** (R-So., OG), **Fitz Lassing** (TE/FB, So.), **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB), **Wesley Tate** (R-So., WR) and **Chase White** (OL, R-Fr.).

Five defensive players also have earned their initial starts this year. They are **Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB), **Chase Garnham** (So., LB), **Javon Marshall** (So., safety), **Al Owens** (R-Jr., LB) and **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB).

FIVE TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Five true freshmen have played during the 2011 season, including **Barron Dixon** (Fr., DT). Dixon's initial action came against Georgia on Oct. 15 where he rotated in on the 'Dore defensive front.

Other true freshmen contributing are **Jerron Seymour** (RB), **Spencer Pulley** (OG), **Joe Townsend** (C) and **Dillon van der Wal** (TE).

Seymour is the team's No. 2 rusher with 207 yards on 54 carries. He also has four rushing TDs. Pulley and Townsend have played on the offensive front. Van der Wal saw his first action vs. Connecticut.

In 2010, the Commodores played 13 true freshmen.

REVAMPED O-LINE PRODUCING

Vanderbilt's revamped offensive front is showing positive results.

The unit, retooled five weeks ago, helped produce 462 total yards and four touchdowns against Arkansas. It marked a season high yardage total for the Commodores against an SEC opponent. Last week, the front helped Vanderbilt amass 407 yards and 38 points in a win over Kentucky.

The offense also gained 530 total yards and 344 rushing yards against Army on Oct. 22, and 349 total yards vs. Georgia on Oct. 15.

After a sub-par effort at South Carolina, coaches moved starters **Wesley Johnson** (R-So.) and **Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr.) to new positions and inserted **Logan Stewart** (So.) into the starting unit. Johnson moved from center to LT, Seymour moved inside from LT to LG, and Stewart took the center role.

VANDY FEATURED IN SPORTS ILLUSTRATED

First-year Head Coach **James Franklin** and the Vanderbilt football program were featured in a mid-September edition of *Sports Illustrated*.

SI staff writer Michael Rosenberg attended SEC Media Days, then spent three days on campus during camp doing research for the in-depth look at the program Franklin intends to build in Nashville.

THREE 'DORES OUT FOR YEAR WITH INJURIES

Mason Johnston (R-So., TE) became the third Commodore to prematurely exit the season when he suffered a leg injury at Alabama.

Johnston has had tough luck with injuries at Vanderbilt. He also sustained a season-ending leg injury last year at Kentucky.

Other contributors who will not return this year due to in-season injuries are **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB) and **Jabo Burrow** (R-Jr., OG).

In the midst of his first year as a starter, Strong went down at South Carolina with a leg injury. Burrow was forced to stop his career in September due to injury concerns.

POINT PRODUCTION VS. SEC FOES

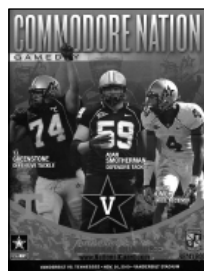

NASHVILLE – Tauren Poole rushed for 99 yards and the game-clinching touchdown and Tennessee kept its bowl hopes alive with a 24-10 win.

Vanderbilt (2-9, 1-7 Southeastern Conference) threatened with a late touchdown, but Tennessee (5-6, 2-5) sent the Commodores to their sixth straight loss when Poole took advantage of a failed onside kick to rip off a 28-yard touchdown run with 1:11 remaining.

Tennessee won its third straight game for the first time since 2007.

Bray completed nine of his first 10 passes and gave the Volunteers a 14-0 lead midway through the second quarter with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Justin Hunter in the first quarter and a 20-yard scoring pass to Denarius Moore. He killed Tennessee's next two drives with interceptions, though, then had trouble connecting with his receivers the rest of the way, finishing 16 of 27.

MARVE: 10TH ALL-TIME COMMODORE TACKLER

Chris Marve, a two-time All-SEC linebacker, joined the team's all-time Top Ten for career tackles during the win over Kentucky.

Marve had six tackles in the victory, upping his team high for the season to 71 total stops.

Marve's final tackle vs. the Wildcats pushed him into a tie with **Jamie Winborn** (1998-2000) into 10th place on the career list. He left the Kentucky game with 377 total tackles.

Marve also has 27 tackles for loss for his career. His next tackle for loss will tie **Broderick Stewart** (2006-09) for No. 8 all-time in the category.

A senior, Marve is not expected to challenge the team's top three career tacklers: **Andrew Coleman** (458), **Joe Staley** (457) and **Chris Gaines** (440).

The Memphis product is under consideration for several honors, including the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus and Bednarik awards, and the Lott IMPACT Trophy.

A two-time captain, Marve garnered 80 stops last year while nursing an injury. He posted more than 100 tackles as a freshman and sophomore.

The team's second leading active tackler, **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) had two tackles vs. Kentucky. He needs 10 tackles to join the team's all-time career top 25 list.

RECORDS FOR FIRST-YEAR VANDERBILT COACHES

James Franklin, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, became the first coach to register victories in his first three games since World War II.

Franklin guided Vanderbilt to a 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3, a 24-21 come-from-behind win over UConn on Sept. 10, and an impressive 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17 to open the season.

The last new coach to guide Vanderbilt to wins in his first three games was E.H. Alley in 1943. Before that, the last new coach to duplicate Franklin's 3-0 mark was **Dan McGugin** in 1904.

Franklin also coached his fifth victory with the Commodores last Saturday (38-8 over Kentucky). The last first-year Vanderbilt coach to post five victories prior to Franklin was **Gerry DiNardo** in 1991.

The only first-year coach to register more than five win since McGugin went 9-0 in 1903 was **Fred Pancoast**, who earned seven victories in 1975.

FRANKLIN FACTS

- When announced as the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, Franklin also became the first African-American to hold the Commodore position.
- Franklin is the first Vanderbilt coach to start his Commodore career 3-0 since the World War II Era.
- As a quarterback at East Stroudsburg, Franklin was a finalist for the NCAA Division II National Player of the Year.
- Regarded as a top recruiter, Franklin has been named among the nation's Top 25 recruiting coaches on multiple occasions by Rivals.com.
- Franklin is recognized as a noted quarterback mentor, having worked closely with Josh Freeman at Kansas State, and Danny O'Brien among others at Maryland. He also worked with several other top QBs, including Dan Marino and Donovan McNabb as a participant in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship and Brett Favre as a Green Bay WR coach in 2005.
- Franklin's Kansas State offense in 2006 featured a rare triple accomplishment, producing a 1,000-yard rusher, 3,000-yard passer and 1,500-yard receiver.
- Franklin pupil Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2010 after throwing for 2,438 yards and 22 touchdowns.

KEY MARYLAND STAFFERS JOIN FRANKLIN

Franklin enticed four key staffers from the University of Maryland to help turnaround the fortunes of Vanderbilt football.

- **DWIGHT GALT, Director of Performance Enhancement**
For years, Galt and Franklin talked about how they would manage a football program if given the opportunity. When Vanderbilt hired Franklin, the lifetime Maryland man jumped at the chance to join him. For 27 years, Galt poured his passion into the Terp program. Since 1993, he had served as its director of strength & conditioning.
- **JEMAL GRIFFIN, Chief of Staff**
Griffin served as Maryland's Director of Football Operations for the last three years. He worked closely with Franklin, the Terps' assistant head coach/offensive coordinator during the same period.
- **JOHN DONOVAN, Offensive Coordinator**
For the last three years, Donovan and Franklin spent many hours together, orchestrating the Maryland offensive attack.
- **CHARLES BANKINS, Special Teams Coordinator**
Bankins joined Franklin and Donovan in 2009, working as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

Franklin...Building Interest Since Arriving on Campus

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED IN NASHVILLE ★ Dec. 17, 2010

James Franklin is introduced as Vanderbilt's 27th head football coach in a press conference held in the Board of Trust Room at Sarratt Student Center. At 39, the former assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Maryland becomes the youngest Vandy head coach in nearly two decades.

FRANKLIN: "It's time that this football program starts reflecting everything else on this campus, and that's a commitment to excellence. I'm not a six-and-five guy, and I'm not a seven-and-five guy. There's going to be high expectations from day one. There is no part of this program that will settle. Everything we do will be about championships."

FRANKLIN ANNOUNCES OFFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 13, 2011

The head coach announces the hirings of his offensive coaches, including new coordinator John Donovan, and Dwight Galt, the man who will guide the Commodores' conditioning program. He also names key administrators in the football office.

FRANKLIN: "We're really laying the foundation right now with the offensive staff, the administrative staff, the strength coach, to put together what my focus is on, which is to build the best staff in the country. When I say that, I'm talking about people that are passionate about being at Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED AT BASKETBALL GAME ★ Jan. 20, 2011

Franklin takes the floor during halftime of the men's basketball game against Ole Miss in Memorial Gymnasium, asking students and fans for their support for the football team in the coming months.

FRANKLIN: "We have a plan; we have a vision for what this program could be, but we can't do it alone. We need everybody's support. We need this community, we need this campus to come together and unite more than it ever has before."

FRANKLIN NAMES DEFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 31, 2011

Four defensive coaches are named to fill out Franklin's staff: defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop, linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator Brent Pry, secondary coach Wes McGriff and defensive line coach Sean Spencer.

NATIONAL SIGNING DAY ★ Feb. 2, 2011

Fueled by a strong finish to recruiting, Franklin lands 21 signees coming from 13 states. The class, which includes a pair of 4-star prospects, is touted as Vanderbilt's most talented class in years.

FRANKLIN TO AUDIENCE OF FANS: "Basically, this staff was not going to take 'no' for an answer. We told every recruit that. We would go into their homes and tell them reasons they should come and tell their family. In the end, we would look them in the eye and tell them we weren't taking 'no' for an answer and they were coming to Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN STAGES STUDENT TRYOUTS ★ Feb. 15, 2011

After visiting dorms and fraternity row, Franklin personally conducts tryouts for the Vanderbilt student body to make the team's spring roster. Seventeen students participated in the tryouts. Eventually, six students would join the team for spring drills.

FRANKLIN GUIDES SPRING DRILLS ★ March 18, 2011

Franklin oversees his first spring practice as head coach at the John Rich Practice Facility on campus. During the ensuing 14 practices, Franklin puts his stamp on the Commodore program: upbeat, energetic, disciplined, physical and positive.

THOUSANDS ATTEND SPRING GAME ★ April 17, 2011

The 'Dores conclude a month of drills with the Black and Gold Spring Game in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Black Team comes away with a 19-7 victory in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd. It marks the first spring intrasquad game on campus in more than 10 years. A fireworks display caps the spring finale.

OPENS FIRST PRESEASON AS HEAD COACH ★ Aug. 5, 2011

Pushing for an ultra-competitive atmosphere, Franklin tells team that every starting job will be decided during preseason camp. High energy is the theme through team's August drills. Franklin eyes a bigger picture – changing the expectations of all associated with Vanderbilt football.

POSTS WINS IN FIRST THREE VANDY GAMES ★ September, 2011

Franklin becomes the first new Vandy coach to win his opening three games since World War II.

On December 23, 2007, Ralph Friedgen sways Franklin back to Maryland as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps the Wildcats to a 7-6 record in 2006, including a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. Kansas State also plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason appearance in three years... In 2007, under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... Maryland also achieves three straight seasons of 10 wins or more (2001-03), including appearance in 2002 FedEx Orange Bowl... Terps followed Orange Bowl berth with 30-3 victory over Tennessee in 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and 41-7 win over West Virginia in 2003 Toyota Gator Bowl... Promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2003, Franklin delivers back-to-back recruiting classes that were ranked among the nation's Top 25.

As receivers coach, Franklin helps ISU finish ninth nationally in total offense.

1998 WASHINGTON STATE (graduate assistant coach/tight ends)

Franklin joins highly successful Cougar Coach Mike Price as grad assistant.

Franklin mentors James Madison wide receivers... Junior receiver Earnest Payton finishes his career as the school's leader in receptions with 185.

1996 EAST STROUDSBURG (defensive backs)

Franklin returns to his alma mater, Division II East Stroudsburg.

RYAN SEYMOUR EARNS SEC O-LINE AWARD

Ryan Seymour (R-Jr., LG) was recognized as the Southeastern Conference's Offensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 24 for his strong play in the Commodores' 44-21 win over Army.

The Kingsland, Ga., native was named for his role in Vanderbilt's line play that paved the way for a season-high 530 yards and 344 rushing yards. Of the rushing yards, **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) gained 198 of them. Stacy's total was the third-highest rushing total in school history by a Vanderbilt player.

Seymour registered seven knockdown blocks in just his third game at left guard after starting the season at left tackle. Seymour and the O-Line also did not allow a quarterback sack and helped Vanderbilt own an eight-minute advantage in time of possession.

WILSON, JOHNSON EARN SEPT. 17 SEC AWARDS

Trey Wilson (Jr., CB) and **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., center) were named SEC Defensive Player and Offensive Lineman of the Week for their efforts in Vanderbilt's 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

Wilson picked off two Rebel passes, returning one for a 52-yard TD. He also contributed three defended passes in the stellar performance.

With two picks returned for touchdowns, Wilson becoming the 'Dore to achieve the feat in a single season since Jay Chesley in 1974.

Johnson anchored an offensive line effort that helped produce 281 rushing yards for the Commodores. It was the team's highest rushing total against an SEC opponent since 1994.

Johnson also won the league's offensive line award last year for his performance playing tackle against Ole Miss.

LOHR GETS SEC D-LINE AWARD ON SEPT. 10

Rob Lohr (R-Jr., DT) earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his effort in Vanderbilt's 24-21 victory over Connecticut on Sept. 10.

Lohr, who contributed four tackles for loss in the victory, was selected over several SEC standouts.

Lohr's four tackles for loss ties for the most by a Commodore defender since linebacker **Jamie Winborn** contributed five tackles resulting in losses during a 43-20 against No. 6 Florida on Nov. 4, 2000. **Casey Hayward** also accomplished the feat at LSU in 2009.

Lohr became the first VU's defensive player to earn SEC honors since **D.J. Moore** was named after the 'Dores' win over Kentucky on Nov. 15, 2008.

Franklin, regarded as one of the nation's top offensive minds following successful coordinator tenures at Maryland and Kansas State, was named as Vanderbilt's 27th head coach last December.

Franklin is also one of two new head coaches in the Southeastern Conference, joining Will Muschamp of Florida.

2011 CAPTAINS: MARVE, HAYWARD, SMITH, FISCHER, SPEAR GET TEAMMATES' VOTE

In late August, Vanderbilt players voted five teammates to serve as 2011 captains: **Kyle Fischer**, **Casey Hayward**, **Chris Marve**, **Larry Smith** and **Carey Spear**.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams. Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time co-captains. Marve served in the role last year.

FISCHER: A 35-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer accepted a greater leadership role this year. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard as a junior.

HAYWARD: The latest in a string of excellent Vandy defensive backs, Hayward ranks among the SEC active leaders in INTs (13). The senior has a team-high 34 consecutive starts entering the Kentucky game.

MARVE: A three-year starter and Marve is the SEC's active leader with 378 career tackles. He also has a team-high 46 starts.

SMITH: The fifth-year senior showed determination to improve technique since Franklin's arrival. Smith has jumped into the team's all-time Top Ten in passing early in the season. In the last month, he has been a supportive teammate to current starter **Jordan Rodgers**.

SPEAR: After earning the placekicking duties in preseason, Spear is 4-7 this year in field goals, including a late-second game winner vs. UConn.

The 'Dores also name additional captains prior to each game.

SMITH: CAREER MILESTONES REACHED

Larry Smith (R-Sr., QB) has surpassed three career passing milestones this season: 300 completions, 600 attempts and 3,000 yards.

Smith completed his 300th career pass against Georgia.

Smith ranks seventh all-time in pass attempts (611) and completions (301). He is 10th in career passing yards (3,036).

IMPORTANT OF TURNOVER MARGIN TO SUCCESS

The 'Dores continue to perform well in the key turnover margin stat.

The Commodores are +3 in turnover margin through 10 games, picking off 15 passes and recovering nine fumbles. On offense, Vanderbilt has lost 21 turnovers: 13 interceptions and eight fumbles.

Through 10 games, the 'Dores rank fourth in the SEC and 41st in the NCAA in turnover margin.

Vanderbilt and Kentucky split the category, with each team getting one turnover. In recent close SEC losses, the Commodores held a 1-0 advantage at Florida despite losing 26-21. In its 31-28 loss to Arkansas, Vanderbilt trailed 3-2 in turnovers.

While Vanderbilt held a big advantage in turnover margin getting out to a 3-0 start. Earlier this season, the defense picked off nine passes facing Ole Miss and South Carolina. Vanderbilt's five-interception total against Ole Miss was the most against an SEC opponent since the Commodores picked off five Kentucky passes on Nov. 6, 1982.

Since arriving on campus, Coach Franklin has talked about the importance on keeping an advantage in turnover margin.

KENT AMONG VANDERBILT'S TOP TEN PUNTERS

In little more than a year as the 'Dores' punter, **Richard Kent** (R-Jr.) ranks among team's all-time best. Kent's 41.8-yard average is fourth all-time on the team's punting charts.

Kent averaged 41.3 yards on three punts in the victory over Kentucky.

Thankfully for Kent, he is less active this season, averaging just 4.9 punts. Last year, Kent was the NCAA's most active punter, averaging 7.0 attempts.

FOURTEEN FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS

Barron Dixon (Fr., DT) became the 14th underclass Commodore to see their initial action this season when he played against Georgia on Oct. 15.

Dixon is one of six defensive players have played their first snaps this year. Others are **Robby Barbieri** (R-Fr., LB), **Reggie Ford** (So., DB), **Thomas Ryan** (R-Fr., DE), **Vince Taylor** (R-Fr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Fr., DE).

First-time offensive players are **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR), **Andrew Bridges** (R-Fr., OT), **Trent Pruitt** (R-Fr., WR), **Spencer Pulley** (Fr., OG), **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB), **Jerron Seymour** (Fr., RB) and **Joe Townsend** (Fr., C). **Andrew East** (R-Fr.) is in his first year as the primary snapper.

Thirty players saw their initial action as Commodores in 2010.

VU-KY GAME: HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

The Kentucky-Vandy game last Saturday marked the first time in SEC history that both teams will be guided by African-American head coaches.

While the 'Dores are guided by first-year head coach **James Franklin**, the Wildcat are directed by second-year head coach **Joker Phillips**.

NASHVILLE – Larry Smith threw for two touchdowns and ran for another score, and Vanderbilt beat Elon 45-14 Saturday in coach James Franklin's debut with the Commodores.

Franklin showed his willingness to gamble with the team considered the worst in the Southeastern Conference, going for it on fourth down three times to keep drives alive scoring 17 points. Smith converted the second on fourth-and-3, running 16 yards for a TD.

The win snapped a seven-game skid for the Commodores who scored more points than they did in all but two games last season. When Trey Wilson picked off a pass and ran it 21 yards for a TD after Smith's second score, Vandy had almost as many points in 14 seconds as the Commodores averaged (16.9) per game in 2010.

NASHVILLE – Larry Smith ran for a touchdown, and Trey Wilson returned one of his two interceptions for a 52-yard TD as Vanderbilt scored 21 straight in the second quarter and beat Mississippi 30-7 Saturday in making James Franklin the first new Commodores coach to start 3-0 since World War II.

The win marks Vanderbilt's first 3-0 start since 2008 when the Commodores won their first bowl since 1955. The Commodores also beat Mississippi (1-2) in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams for their fifth win in seven years in this series.

Vanderbilt picked off five passes, all off Zack Stoudt, and Wilson's interception return for a TD is the Commodores' third this season.

The Commodores outgained Ole Miss 387-234 in total offense. Jerron Seymour's 9-yard TD run capped the second-quarter scoring for Vandy, and Zac Stacy also ran for 169 yards, including a 77-yard TD run.

COLUMBIA, S.C. – For the first time in his seven years at South Carolina, Steve Spurrier team is 4-0. But like most of his Gamecocks teams, he can't get the offense where he wants it.

No. 12 South Carolina (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat Vanderbilt 21-3 on Saturday night. But Stephen Garcia threw four interceptions, Marcus Lattimore was held under 100 yards rushing and all-SEC receiver Alshon Jeffery caught just two passes for 34 yards.

Spurrier had no problem admitting his defense bailed this one out. The Gamecocks held the Commodores (3-1, 1-1) to 77 yards and just five first downs. South Carolina recovered two fumbles, both forced by freshman defensive end Jadeveon Clowney, and sacked Vanderbilt's quarterbacks six times. It was the fewest yards allowed by a South Carolina team since holding Wake Forest to 66 yards in November 1987.
