A LOOK AT VANDERBILT

Vanderbilt is off to a 27-7 start as the reigning national champions, including 10-2 in SEC play. The Commodores saw their six-game losing streak come to an end on Tuesday in a 3-1 non-conference loss to Lipscomb. Three different national polls have Vanderbilt ranked as the top team in the country behind a pitching staff that holds opposing hitters to a .215 average, a mark that leads the SEC. The weekend rotation of right-handers Carson Fulmer, Walker Buehler and Jordan Sheffield boast a combined record of 11-1. At the plate, four Commodores are hitting over a .340 clip with junior Dansby Swanson's .368 average pacing the VU bats. Swanson also has a team-high 12 steals as Vanderbilt leads the conference with a total of 56. Zander Wiel and Rhett Wiseman have both hit six home runs this season and nine doubles this season.

NOTHING NEW VERSUS NO. 1

Facing the No. 1 team in the country is nothing new for Ole Miss this season. The Rebels opened up the first two weekends of SEC play against top-ranked teams, going a combined 3-3 against LSU and Florida. At the time of both series, the two conference foes were ranked No. 1 in at least one national poll. Ole Miss took one-of-three from LSU on the road, the victory being a 14-inning thriller on SEC Network that got Sikes Orvis and his mustache trending on Twitter. One week later, the Rebels protected Swayze Field by defeating No. 1 Florida twice to claim the series.

JUNIOR COLLEGE TRANSFERS CALLED UPON

Mitchel Babb and Connor Cloyd, a pair of junior college transfers, have stepped up their respective games when called upon by head coach Mike Bianco. In six of his seven appearances (9.1 innings), Babb has not surrendered a run. Over his last three outings, Babb has struck out nine opposing hitters through seven innings, including a career-high four versus Tennessee, April 4. On the offensive side, Cloyd has produced his first three multi-hit games of his Ole Miss career in his last three games, going 7-for-12 with five runs and two RBI. Getting the start in the last five games he has played in for the Rebels, Cloyd has reached base in every one of them. Cloyd's season batting average is .423 (11-for-26), and the Maple Valley, Wash. native currently has a four-game hitting streak to his credit.

BORTLES REACHES BASE

Sophomore Colby Bortles currently has reached base in the past 11 games, the second time this season he has produced a streak in double digits. Earlier this season, Bortles reached base in 15 consecutive games. While he recorded hits in eight of the past 11 games, including three multi-hit contests, Bortles found other ways to get on base to keep his streak alive. In the five games over the past eight days, the Oviedo, Fla. native is batting at a .400 clip.

LEADOFF HITTER LEADS THE WAY

The Rebels' primary leadoff hitter happens to lead the team in batting average, and he is just a freshman. Will Golsan is hitting at a .313 clip in the 29 games he's played in this season, including 20 starts between second base, third base and designated hitter. The Columbus, Miss. native is also third on the team in runs batted in with 18 of them. Golsan led Ole Miss at the plate in two victories last week, tying his career high with three hits in both wins. He reached base four times against Memphis to help spark a comeback victory and continued his hot hitting to open up the series versus Tennessee. In the win over the Volunteers, Golsan went 3-for-5 with two doubles and a career-high four RBI to help Ole Miss record its highest hit and run output of SEC play.

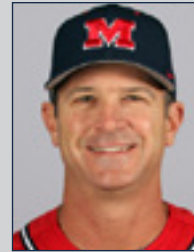
MLB REBELS

The 2015 Major League Baseball season is now underway, and six former Rebels earned spots on Opening Day rosters. Chris Coghlan (Chicago Cubs), Zack Cozart (Cincinnati Reds) and Seth Smith (Seattle Mariners) either started or are slated to start on opening day for their respective teams. Lance Lynn (St. Louis Cardinals) and Drew Pomeranz (Oakland Athletics) will begin the season in the starting rotation for their respective teams, while Aaron Barrett will play a key role in the bullpen for the Washington Nationals.

TENNESSEE SWING

The Rebels are currently in a stretch of playing eight-of-nine games against teams from the state of Tennessee. Following the midweek victory over Memphis, Ole Miss hosted the University of Tennessee for three games. Tuesday's game against Southern Mississippi served as a buffer between another

school from the Volunteer State as Ole Miss travels to Vanderbilt for SEC play this weekend. Rounding out the Tennessee swing, the Rebels welcome UT-Martin to Swayze Field for a non-conference affair, April 15.

TIMELY HITTING

Ole Miss had clutch at-bats by several Rebels to lift the team past Memphis. The Rebels went 6-for-17 at the dish with runners on base, good for a .353 clip. With two outs, Ole Miss went 7-for-15 (.467) throughout the game. The timely hitting continued into Friday night's win over Tennessee. As a team, the Rebels were 6-for-14 with two outs, 7-for-20 with runners on and 4-for-11 with runners in scoring position, scoring five of their 10 runs with two outs in the inning.

SHORT'S STUFF

Sophomore southpaw Wyatt Short has been a shutdown reliever out of the Ole Miss bullpen this season. In 13 appearances, Short has a 3-1 record, five saves, an impressive 0.81 ERA, 27 strikeouts, only seven walks and just two earned runs over 22.1 innings. His win total and number of saves are team highs out of Rebel relievers as he had held opposing hitters to a low .190 average at the plate. Short has earned the save in each of the Rebels' last three victories. Against Tennessee, the Southaven, Miss. native entered the game with the bases loaded and the tying run at the plate, but he pitched out of the jam, allowing just one of the inherited runners to score. Over his last 17 innings spanning 10 appearances, Short has surrendered just one run. When the game is on the line and the Rebels need to get out of the inning, Short has been the primary guy called upon by head coach Mike Bianco.

NEW BALL, NEW ERA

When the NCAA decided to modify the baseball going into the 2015 season, opting for a flat-seamed baseball, over the raised-seamed baseball that has been used in the past, changes were expected. The NCAA has conducted a midseason statistical analysis to determine difference in stats this season compared to last year. According to the report, runs scored in a game are up five percent, and the batting average is basically flat from .268 in 2014 to .269 in 2015. However, this season, strikeouts have risen from 6.64 per nine innings in 2014 to 7.34 per nine innings in 2015, an increase of 10.5 percent. The biggest statistical change from 2014 to 2015 is an increase in home runs that is up more than 39 percent from 0.36 per game in 2014 to 0.50 per game in 2015.

WEATHERING THE STORM

One of two captains, senior Scott Weathersby has been a leader to a youthful Ole Miss baseball team. On the mound this season, Weathersby has posted a 2.70 ERA in 10 appearances. Through 23.1-innings of work, he has struck out 25 batters, while only walking five. Perhaps the most impressive statistic of all by the Hattiesburg, Miss. native is that he is holding opposing hitters to just a .163 average at the plate. Weathersby's veteran presence on the mound showed against No. 1 Florida, March 20, as he retired each of the eight batters he faced, stranding the inherited runner in the seventh and working a perfect eighth and ninth to earn his second save of the season. In his most recent outing, Weathersby pitched two scoreless innings against Tennessee, April 5.

THE GAUNTLET

The Rebels have gone through the gauntlet thus far with a difficult non-conference schedule as well as facing two teams ranked No. 1 to begin SEC play. According to NCAA statistics, Ole Miss has had the nation's second-toughest schedule to this point as the Rebels' opponents are a combined 246-142-1 (.634) this season. Through 33 games, 11 of those contests came against top-15 teams, including six against No. 1 teams. The Rebels are 5-6 in games against ranked teams, but recently took two-of-three from No. 1 Florida. Ole Miss went through a stretch of playing 8-of-11 games against teams ranked in the top 10, posting an even 4-4 record in those matchups. The brutal schedule has forced a young Ole Miss team grow up fast, and the Rebels could benefit from the pressure as the season rolls along. The gauntlet will continue this weekend as Ole Miss faces its third No. 1 team of the season in Vanderbilt.

ON THE HORIZON

To break up a pair of SEC weekend series on the road, the Rebels return home to host Tennessee-

First pitch versus the Skyhawks is set to begin at 6:30 p.m. CT from Swayze Field. The non-conference contest will be broadcast on SEC Network+ as well as the Ole Miss Radio Network.

THREE IS A MAGIC NUMBER

The number three proved to be the magic number for Ole Miss in its victory over Memphis, Tuesday. Ole Miss used a pair of three-run innings to help get the non-conference win. The Rebels also had three doubles, three hits with runners in scoring position and three walks. Three Rebels recorded three hits apiece to tie their career highs in a single game. Freshman Will Golsan recorded three singles on his way to reaching base four times as the team's leadoff hitter. Along with their three hits, sophomore Colby Bortles smacked in a team-high three RBI and fellow classmate J.B. Woodman crossed the plate three times throughout the night.

PROTECTING SWAYZE AGAINST THE BEST

Swayze Field has proven over the years to be a tough place to play for some of the nation's top teams, and No. 1 Florida became the latest team to experience the difficulty of facing the Rebels on their home turf. Ole Miss won the first two games against the Gators to clinch the series, improving to 4-0 in home series against No. 1 teams over the past seven seasons. The stretch also included series wins over No. 1 Georgia in 2009, No. 1 South Carolina in 2011 and No. 1 Florida in 2012. With the most recent series win, Ole Miss has won 12 of its last 18 home series against top-10 teams, dating back to 2003.

GOLSAN NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Freshman Will Golsan was named SEC Freshman of the Week, the conference office announced Monday, March 23. The honor is the first for Golsan in his young Ole Miss career as well as the Rebels' first weekly accolade of the 2015 season. Golsan led Ole Miss with a .389 average at the plate this past week. He recorded three multi-hit games throughout the week and scored a team-high four runs as the Rebels went 3-1, including taking 2-of-3 from No. 1 Florida. Golsan started the week by helping spark a ninth-inning rally before scoring the game-winning run against UAPB, March 18. In the two victories over the top-ranked Gators, the Columbus, Miss. native went a combined 5-for-9 at the dish. Golsan also recorded the first two steals of his career during the week. The freshman has worked his way into the lineup, moving from DH to the starter at third base over the past eight games. Golsan is now leads the team in batting average this season, hitting at a .304 clip and an even better .333 average during SEC play.

DIAMOND REBELS LAND ON SPORTSCENTER

In the first road game of the 2015 season, Ole Miss shortstop Errol Robinson flashed the leather to prevent a big inning for No. 15 UCF. With one out and the bases full of Knights, Robinson fully extended to his left to catch a hard-hit line drive. From the ground, the sophomore flipped the ball to freshman Tate Blackman at second to catch the runner leading off the bag and complete the inning-ending double play. The incredible play was recognized by ESPN, and Robinson's highlight was No. 2 on Sportscenter's Top 10 Plays for Friday, Feb. 27. Three weeks later, sophomore J.B. Woodman made the highlight reel by robbing a home run in deep center field at Swayze Field. Facing Arkansas-Pine Bluff, the Ole Miss center fielder raced back to the wall and perfectly timed his jump to make an incredible catch. The play proved to be vital as the Rebels rallied in the ninth to defeat UAPB, 7-6. Senior first baseman Sikes Orvis joined the group of Rebels to appear on Sportscenter as he reached over the rail and into the stands to make an incredible catch in foul territory versus Arkansas.

LET'S PLAY TWO

Through the first six weeks of the season, although not originally scheduled, Ole Miss has played a doubleheader on five of those six weekends. Following the pair of games against UAB, the sixth doubleheader of the season, the Rebels are 6-6 on doubleheader days. Over the weekend, Ole Miss split a twinbill against No. 1 Florida, winning the first contest to clinch the series. Playing so many doubleheaders is not familiar territory for the Rebels; the last time Ole Miss played at least six doubleheaders in one full season occurred in 1993 when the Rebels played eight twinbills throughout the year.

A FRESH TRIO

With three freshmen and three sophomores in the everyday lineup, the Rebels are an extremely young team. It was the youthful freshmen that led Ole Miss to a comeback victory against Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Wednesday. The three freshmen combined for seven of the Rebels' 10 hits on the evening. Tate Blackman drove in the game-winning hit as part of a career day for the young Rebel. The Ole Miss second baseman tallied three hits and drove in three runs, both career highs. Two other freshmen came up big as well as Kyle Watson and Will Golsan both went 2-for-5, scoring two and three runs, respectively. Golsan also added two RBI to his stat line. For the season, Watson leads the team with seven doubles and a .339 average at the plate.

RALLY REBELS

The Diamond Rebels have become the Rally Rebels as of late; their last two victories have occurred with coming back from deficits in the ninth inning. Against No. 1 LSU in a nationally-televised game, Ole Miss gave the nation's leader in saves, Jesse Stallings, his first blown save of the season thanks to a double by Sikes Orvis in the top of the ninth. Five innings later, the senior knocked in the game winning run as the Rebels went on to win, 5-3, in 14 innings. On Wednesday, March 18, Ole Miss trailed by two with their last chance at the dish against UAPB. The Rebels put on the rally caps as Cameron Dishon singled and Kyle Watson nearly left the yard before settling for a double off the left field wall. Golsan kept the momentum going, driving a base hit past the diving second baseman, scoring Dishon along with Watson after a throwing error. Following a J.B. Woodman sacrifice bunt and an Orvis intentional walk, Blackman drilled the second pitch he saw into the left-center gap to score Golsan before being mobbed by his teammates rounding first.

TATE THE GREAT

Tabbed as D1Baseball's Preseason SEC Freshman of the Year, Ole Miss second baseman Tate Blackman has started to live up to the lofty expectations after struggling at the beginning of the season. Blackman produced career highs with three hits and three RBI, including the game-winning base hit in the bottom of the ninth. After intentionally walking Sikes Orvis, Blackman made the Golden Lions pay with a drive into the left-center field gap to score the winning run and lift the Rebels to victory.

FEAR THE STACHE

Senior Sikes Orvis had the Twitter world buzzing as he and his March mustache came through in clutch situations against No. 1 LSU in front of a national television audience. The first baseman delivered the game-tying RBI in the top of the ninth before doubling in the game-winning run in the top of the 14th to lift Ole Miss baseball to a 5-3 victory the top-ranked Tigers. The Orlando, Fla. native recorded three of the Rebels' seven hits, including two doubles and his two big RBI. Orvis proved why he is a team captain and senior leader in the Ole Miss victory, driving in runs at the dish while also making plays with his glove at first base. He also snagged a line drive in the bottom of the 10th and caught the go-ahead run off of third for a game-saving double play. In the series finale, Orvis belted a three-run homer that traveled an estimated 431 feet over the bleachers in right field, drawing a standing ovation from even the hometown LSU fans.

STOKES SAVES

Ole Miss freshman Will Stokes picked up two saves against a pair of top 10 teams this season. The right-hander pitched a season-high five innings, allowing just one run on two hits to go along with a career-high four strikeouts, collecting the save against No. 8 Louisville. Stokes followed that performance by entering the game vs. No. 1 LSU in a pressure-packed situation on national television. In the bottom of the 14th, the Rebels held a two-run lead, but LSU had the tying run on base and the winning run at the plate with one out. However, Stokes was able to bear down and get a key strikeout before forcing a flyout to left field to end the thrilling ballgame. This season, the Meridian, Miss. native leads the Rebels with three saves while holding opponents to a .227 average at the plate.

AN INSTANT CLASSIC

The Rebels delivered a thrilling victory in their first appearance on national television this season, taking down No. 1 LSU, 5-3, in 14 innings on SEC Network. Senior Sikes Orvis tied the game in the top of the ninth before his opposite field double in the 14th brought J.B. Woodman around to score from first in what would be the game-winning run. The two conference foes battled it out for four hours and 15 minutes before freshman Will Stokes got LSU's Jake Fraley to fly out to fellow classmate Kyle Watson with the bases full of Tigers. The 14-inning affair was not only the first extra-inning game of the season for Ole Miss, but it was also the longest game the Diamond Rebels have played since going 17 innings against Mississippi State, April 29, 2007. The 14-inning game also tied for the fifth-longest

game in Ole Miss Baseball history.

A START FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

It's hard to put into words the kind of start to a career that Christian Trent has had at Ole Miss. In his first 21 starts over the past two seasons, the junior southpaw posted a 12-0 record with a 2.21 ERA over 134.1 innings. With 12 straight victories to start his career, Trent is believed to have had the best start to a career out of any pitcher in Ole Miss Baseball history. Diving deep into the archives, Buddy Wittichen started off his historic career with 10 consecutive wins before falling to Florida in the 1956 SEC Championship series. Wittichen finished his career with seven more victories and boasts the best winning percentage in program history with a career record of 17-1 (.941).

THE 12 K'S OF BRAMLETT

Sophomore right hander Brady Bramlett struck out a career-high 12 batters to cap off a doubleheader sweep of Stetson on Saturday, March 7. The 12 punchouts were the most in a game by an Ole Miss pitcher since Drew Pomeranz struck out 15 in a win over Georgia on April 9, 2010. It was his second double-digit strikeout game of the season, becoming the first Rebel to record multiple double-digit strikeout games, also since Pomeranz in 2010. Bramlett worked six scoreless innings to earn the win, scattering three hits with one walk, to go along with the 12 strikeouts. He faced four over the minimum and struck out three batters in each of the first, second and sixth innings, including a perfect first inning to start his outing. For the season, Bramlett leads the SEC in strikeouts with 34, including 13 looking which is also the best in the conference.

REBELS DAZZLE IN DEBUT

Although Ole Miss did not claim the in-state battle against Southern Miss on Wednesday, a few Rebels were bright spots in debut performances. Finishing the game on the mound, a pair of Rebel arms made their Ole Miss debuts and did not disappoint. Junior college transfer Mitchel Babb pitched a scoreless seventh inning, while freshman John Wesley Ray retired the side in the eighth. Although it wasn't his first career game in an Ole Miss uniform, another Rebel made his first career start as Will Golsan got the nod at second base. The freshman started two double plays to get Ole Miss out of jams, and he also recorded one of the Rebels' five hits throughout the night.

A WEEK OF NAILBITERS

The Rebels are coming off a rare week in which every game they played was decided by a single run. Ole Miss went 2-2 in those contests, beating Arkansas State by a 2-1 margin before winning one-of-three against No. 15 UCF. In the series opener, Ole Miss saw the Knights roar back from a four-run deficit to claim a 5-4 victory. In the Sunday doubleheader, UCF edged out a 3-2 decision in game one, but the Rebels countered with a 4-3 win in the series finale. Going back to the previous weekend against Wright State, Ole Miss closed out that series with a 3-2 victory. Therefore, the Rebels have played in five consecutive one-run games, resulting in a 3-2 record. Last season, Ole Miss finished with a 13-9 mark in one-run affairs, including two that occurred at the College World Series.

FLORIDA GUYS GET RBI

It was fitting that the Rebels responsible for handing No. 15 UCF its first loss of the season came from Florida natives on the Ole Miss baseball team. All four runs in the Rebels' 4-3 win over UCF on Sunday were produced by guys who call the Sunshine State their home. Tate Blackman, Colby Bortles and Sikes Orvis all knocked in at least one run in the win. Blackman doubled in the first run of the game, and Bortles hit his second homer of the season. Orvis also played long ball with a solo shot of his own to right field early in the game before drawing a bases-loaded walk in the top of the ninth that brought in the winning run.

HOMETOWN HEROES

Ole Miss had a road trip that has brought some Rebels back to or near their hometowns. Tate Blackman, Colby Bortles, Sikes Orvis and J.B. Woodman all experienced the feeling of playing in front of local family and friends when the Rebels traveled to Orlando, Fla. to battle No. 15 UCF last weekend. Orvis and Woodman are from Orlando, while Blackman hails from Altamonte Springs, Fla. and Bortles is native of nearby Oviedo, Fla. For the game against Southern Miss in Hattiesburg, seniors Austin Knight and Scott Weathersby returned to play in front of a hometown crowd. Freshman Calder Mikell is also from the area, growing up in Petal, Miss.

FEBRUARY SUCCESS

Last week, the Rebels wrapped up play in February, a month where they have found a ton of success under head coach Mike Bianco. Throughout the past 15 seasons under Bianco, Ole Miss is 94-26 during the second month of the calendar year, leading to a .783 winning percentage. During this decade, the Rebels have been even better in February, posting a mark of 42-8 (.840) over the past six seasons.

BRADY'S BACK

After sitting out all of 2014 due to injury, Ole Miss sophomore right hander Brady Bramlett made his first start since 2013 and did not disappoint in the series finale versus William & Mary. He faced 22 batters in six innings of work, both career highs. The Barlett, Tenn. native held opposing hitters to just a .182 average, while giving up just two runs on four hits. Bramlett nearly recorded a career-high in strikeouts, punching out eight to fall just one shy of his personal best. To go along with his eight strikeouts, Bramlett also did not surrender a walk in his victory over William & Mary.

Bramlett was fantastic once again in his weekend start versus Wright State. Although he had to settle for the no decision, the sophomore allowed just one hit and one walk, while striking out a career-high 11 hitters over six innings of work. Bramlett became the first Rebel to record double digits in strikeouts since Bobby Wahl struck out 10 batters, March 9, 2012. He limited opposing hitters to just a .056 average at the dish.

DOUBLES IN THE DOUBLEHEADER

It was only fitting that the Rebels busted out nine two-base hits in the Saturday doubleheader versus William & Mary. Combined with the two from the season opener on Friday evening, Ole Miss is tied for the SEC lead with 11 doubles through the first weekend of the 2015 season. The Rebels smacked six doubles in the series finale against the Tribe, including three from sophomore centerfielder J.B. Woodman. With his three two-baggers in one game, Woodman became the first Rebel to accomplish that feat since Alex Yarbrough did it against Arkansas, April 20, 2012.

SOPHOMORE SLUGGERS

With the series tied heading into the finale, three sophomores made sure that Ole Miss would continue its success in series openers over the years. Third baseman Colby Bortles, shortstop Errol Robinson and center fielder J.B. Woodman combined to go 10-for-14 at the dish to lead the Rebels to a 16-2 victory. The trio also combined for nine RBI and seven runs in the contest. Woodman had three doubles, while Robinson added two of his own. Capping off the Ole Miss scoring, Bortles drove a ball to deep left-center field in the bottom of the seventh that cleared the fence for the Rebels first home run of the season.

SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS

Ole Miss has enjoyed success in season-opening games under head coach Mike Bianco, posting a 14-1 record in games to open the season over the past 15 years. That trend continued with a 9-4 victory in the season opener Friday night, Feb. 13. The Rebels proceeded to take down William & Mary in two of the three contests to capture its 11th season-opening weekend series in the 15 years of the Bianco era.

ORVIS NAMED PRESEASON FIRST TEAM ALL-SEC

Ole Miss senior first baseman Sikes Orvis was named to the 2015 Southeastern Conference baseball coaches preseason All-SEC First Team, the league announced Thursday morning, Feb. 12. Orvis returns for his fourth season with the Rebels after finishing last year with a .294 batting average, 14 homers, 53 RBI and 40 runs scored in 2014 to capture First Team All-SEC honors. While helping the team to the College World Series, Orvis hit for an average of .305 with six runs scored and nine RBI during the Rebels' NCAA Tournament run.

TRENT RECOGNIZED ON GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD WATCH LIST

Ole Miss left-handed pitcher Christian Trent found his name on the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award preseason watch list, when the annual release was announced Wednesday, Feb. 10. The junior southpaw was one of 50 baseball student-athletes throughout the nation that was selected to the watch list for the award given to baseball's top amateur athlete. Trent had a breakout year in his first season as a Rebel, going 9-0 on the mound with a 2.05 ERA. He struck out 86 batters, while only walking 20 over 110.0 innings of work. In the 2014 College World Series, the Madisonville, La. native helped the Rebels stay alive by working 8.0 scoreless innings in an elimination game versus Texas Tech.

BLACKMAN NAMED PRESEASON SEC FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Freshman infielder Tate Blackman was named D1Baseball's Preseason SEC Freshman of the Year. The Altamonte Springs, Florida, native was selected in the 20th round of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Milwaukee Brewers. Blackman is expected to start at second base on opening day for the Rebels. The 50th-ranked prospect in the country by Perfect Game, Blackman played summer ball for the Orlando Scorpions, the same program that produced fellow teammates Sikes Orvis and J.B. Woodman.

KNIGHT STEPS IN BEHIND THE PLATE

One of five seniors on this year's team, catcher Austin Knight steps into a starting role behind the plate, having played behind two Johnny Bench Award finalists in Will Allen and Stuart Turner, who won the award in 2013. The Hattiesburg, Mississippi, native has appeared in 74 games, drawing the start in 16 games, over the last three years. As a junior, Knight played in 21 games, starting eight, including two at the College World Series, and hit .303 on the year with 10 doubles.

DIAMOND REBELS TABBED FOR 12 TELEVISION APPEARANCES

The Ole Miss baseball team will be featured 12 times on television in the inaugural season of ESPN's SEC Network's baseball coverage. In addition, 33 games, including all home games, will be SEC Network+ events available to stream on SECNetwork.com and WatchESPN.

LUCKY NUMBER SIX

The Rebels were picked to finish sixth in the SEC West as the annual conference preseason poll voted by the league's 14 baseball coaches. While that spot may be disappointing for Ole Miss fans, note that the Rebels were also picked to finish sixth when the SEC preseason poll was released in 2014, a year in which the team made its first trip to the College World Series in 42 seasons.

CLEMENT JOINS STAFF

A new face will be on the Ole Miss baseball coaching staff this season as Mike Clement takes over as the new Rebels' hitting coach. Clement joined the Ole Miss coaching staff over the summer after spending the last two seasons coaching at Kansas State University. In his two years at K-State, he helped vault the Wildcats to success with Kansas State claiming the Big 12 Championship and coming within a game of the College World Series in 2013 and ranking in the top 10 nationally in six offensive categories, including second nationally in batting average.

MEDIA SERVICES AND GUIDELINES

PARKING

The press parking area is located next to the main athletics building in a marked lot off Gertrude Ford Parkway parallel to Oxford-University Stadium/Swayze Field (see map below). The media entrance into the press parking area is off Gertrude Ford Parkway. Media members who request parking privileges in advance will have their names placed on a media parking list which will be given to the traffic control personnel at the entrance approximately two hours prior to first pitch.

Space is limited and is on a first-come, first-served basis in the lot.

Media parking passes are only applicable on game-day. Media members that attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events during the week should make arrangements with campus parking by visiting olemiss.edu/parking/media.html.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Still photographers may shoot from the film deck behind home plate or inside the camera wells down both base lines. Photographers are not allowed to shoot from within the dugout area. Any photographer not following the guidelines may have his credentials revoked at any time. Credentials must be clearly and properly displayed at all times. To request a credential, please contact Bill Bunting in the Ole Miss Athletics Media Relations office.

RADIO

Please contact the Athletics Media Relations Office for credentials. The visiting radio booth is behind home plate on the first base side of the plate. Space for a crew of four is allowed for each broadcasting medium. As required by the SEC, Ole Miss provides phone lines for visiting radio.

INTERNET ACCESS

The press area is equipped with secured wireless internet access for use by the media for sending stories and photographs. A limited number of ethernet lines are available in the press box.

MEDIA SERVICES

Complete pregame notes with team and individual statistics and rosters are available in the press box. During and after the game, media relations personnel will provide assistance along with final box scores following the game.

Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live without prior consent of the athletics department. Audio/video use of content from press conferences and media opportunities is limited to five minutes per individual (coach or student-athlete) per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Athletics.



EXTENSIVE COVERAGE ON SEC NETWORK

The Rebels will have 12 games scheduled on ESPN's television platforms this season while an additional 33 games will be SEC Network+ events available to stream on www.SECNetwork.com and the WatchESPN apps. As the SEC Network kicks off its TV and online coverage of college baseball, Ole Miss is excited to announce that all home games will be televised on SEC Network+.

The SEC will receive unprecedented coverage, with 80 games expected to air on the network dedicated to Southeastern Conference sports, part of more than 100 planned across television networks (ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU or SEC Network). In addition to the nationally televised contests, more than 350 matchups will be digitally exclusive SEC Network+ events. In all, more than 450 SEC baseball games will be available to fans during this season.

Rebel great David Dellucci will serve as an analyst on locally produced broadcasts.
