## VU DEFENSE: NCAA INTERCEPTION LEADER

The Vanderbilt defense continues to lead the nation in interceptions. Through five games, the Commodore secondary has 14 interceptions, two more than the South Carolina, Ohio, North Carolina State and Rutgers.

The Commodores did not have an interception in the loss at Alabama.

On Sept. 24, the defense registered four interceptions in a loss to ranked South Carolina.

In its two SEC games, Vanderbilt picked off nine opponent passes.

**Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) and **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) are team leaders in interceptions with four and three, respectively. Both rank among the NCAA Top Ten in the category.

**Javon Marshall** (R-So., safety), also has two picks.

The Commodores also are making the most of the interceptions. For the first time in team history, Vanderbilt players registered an interception return for touchdown in three consecutive games. Only one other NCAA team can top the Commodores' three-TD total (La.-Lafayette, 5).

It also marks the first time in modern day history that Vanderbilt has scored on three interceptions in a season.

Leading the way is Wilson, who became only the second Commodore to have two pick-sixes in one season with returns vs. Ole Miss and Elon.

The 14 picks surpasses the team's interception total from the last two years. It is also higher than 16 of Vanderbilt's last 20 season totals.

## DEFENSE RANKS AMONG SEC LEADERS

The Commodore defense has performed well under a new coaching staff directed by first-year coordinator **Bob Shoop**.

In addition to leading the nation in interceptions, the veteran unit ranks high in the SEC and NCAA in other areas, including scoring defense, rushing defense, red zone efficiency and passing efficiency.

The defense Vanderbilt has limited opponents to 19.4 ppg. The average is fifth in the SEC and 23rd in the NCAA. The unit also ranks high in total defense, rushing defense, pass defense, tackles for loss, and red-zone efficiency.

The unit also has been stellar inside the 20-yard line, ranking second in the conference and third nationally in red zone efficiency (50%).

## VANDY REVAMPS OFFENSIVE LINE

The Commodores revamped their offensive front for the Alabama game, switching the entire left side of the line.

After starting four games at center, **Wesley Johnson** (R-So.) moved back to left tackle, the position he started all 12 games of the 2011 season.

**Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr.) moved from left tackle to left guard, giving the Commodores a more physical presence at the position.

The ability to move Johnson and Seymour came as **Logan Stewart** (So.) returned to full health. Stewart, who started at center as he did in 2010, is fully recovered from a preseason illness.

## HOLDING EDGE IN TURNOVER MARGIN

Vanderbilt has started the season the way it wanted in turnover margin, a stat that has been a proven indicator of team success.

The Commodores are +5 in turnover margin through five games, picking off 14 passes and forcing two fumbles. On offense, Vanderbilt has lost 11 turnovers: five fumbles and six interceptions.

Though the defense did not force an Alabama turnover, the unit picked off nine passes facing Ole Miss and South Carolina. Vanderbilt's five-interception total against Ole Miss was the most against an SEC opponent since the Commodores picked off five Kentucky passes on Nov. 6, 1982.

After five games, the 'Dores share second with South Carolina in the SEC in turnover margin. They are also tied for 15th in the NCAA.

Since arriving on campus, Coach Franklin has talked about the importance of holding an edge in turnovers. In 2010, his Maryland Terrapins' squad rode a positive turnover margin (+15) to a 9-4 record and Military Bowl victory. In 2008, the Commodores' 7-6 season and Music City Bowl victory were aided by a positive turnover margin (+9).

## IMPORTANCE OF THIRD DOWN SUCCESS

The Commodores' struggle on third downs has impacted the unit's overall effectiveness.

The offense has converted just 12 of 65 third down tries through five games. The poor success rate has forced the unit off the field, resulting in a disadvantage in time of possession (33:08-26:52) and first downs (85-58).

The Commodores converted just one of 12 third down attempts against Alabama.

## PRODUCING POINTS ON DEFENSE

For the first time in modern history, Vanderbilt has returned interceptions for touchdowns in three straight games.

Each of the scores were pivotal to victories. **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) scored on returns of 21 yards vs. Elon and 52 yards vs. Ole Miss. **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) tallied from 50 yards vs. Connecticut. All three scores provided Vanderbilt with either the winning and tying points.

This marks just the second time since World War II that Vanderbilt has tallied defensive TDs in three consecutive games. The only other time it happened came against The Citadel, Mississippi State and Georgia in 1999.

## NINETEEN GEORGIA RESIDENTS ON VANDY ROSTER

Nineteen players on the Commodore roster, including eight possible starters this week, hail from the state of Georgia.

Georgia is represented more than any other state on the Vanderbilt roster. Following the Peach state are Tennessee and Florida with 14 each.

Commodores with ties to the Peach state that could appear in the starting lineup Saturday include TE **Brandon Barden** (R-Sr., Lincolnnton), WR **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., Roswell), CB **Casey Hayward** (Sr., Perry), punter **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., Marietta), WR **Jonathan Krause** (So., Snellville), safety **Kenny Ladler** (So., Stone Mountain), OL **Ryan Seymour** (R-Jr., Kingsland), and WR **Udom Umoh** (R-Sr., Fort Valley).

Another Georgia product, DT **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Sr., Lawrenceville) has 12 career starts.

Two former Commodore starters not expected to play against the Bulldogs also hail from Georgia, RB/RS **Warren Norman** (Jr., Stone Mountain) and LB **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., Loganville).

**ATHENS, Ga.** – Carlton Thomas ran for the first two touchdowns of his career, Aaron Murray passed for two touchdowns and Georgia welcomed new mascot Uga VIII by beating Vanderbilt 43-0.

Washaun Ealey led Georgia with 17 carries for 123 yards and a touchdown.

Georgia (3-4 overall, 2-3 SEC) took its second straight lopsided win after four straight losses.

Blair Walsh kicked two field goals for Georgia but missed from 31 yards in the fourth quarter to keep the Bulldogs from taking their largest margin of victory in the series.

# Commodore Notes

## BARNES BECOMES NINTH FIRST-TIME STARTER

**Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB) became ninth Commodore player to enjoy his first career start this season when he was in the opening lineup at Alabama.

Barnes is one of four defensive players have enjoyed initial career starts. The others are **Chase Garnham** (So., LB), **Javon Marshall** (So., safety) and **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB).

First-time offensive starters are **Chris Boyd** (WR, R-Fr.), **Mylon Brown** (R-So., OG), **Fitz Lassing** (TE/FB, So.), **Wesley Tate** (R-So., WR) and **Chase White** (OL, R-Fr.). Brown is the only one to start all five games.

## THIRTEEN FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS

Thirteen underclass Commodores have seen their initial action during the first four games.

Five defensive players have played their first snaps this year: **Robby Barbieri** (R-Fr., LB), **Reggie Ford** (So., DB), **Thomas Ryan** (R-Fr., DE), **Vince Taylor** (R-Fr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Fr., DE). First-time offensive players are **Chris Boyd** (R-Fr., WR), **Andrew Bridges** (R-Fr., OT), **Trent Pruitt** (R-Fr., WR), **Spencer Pulley** (Fr., OG), **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB), **Jerron Seymour** (Fr., RB) and **Joe Townsend** (Fr., C). **Andrew East** (R-Fr.) is in his first year as the primary snapper.

## FOUR TRUE FRESHMEN SEE EARLY ACTION

Four true freshmen have played early in the 2011 season.

**Jerron Seymour** (RB) is the team's second leading rusher and has a pair of rushing TDs. **Spencer Pulley** (OG) and **Joe Townsend** (C) have played on the offensive front. **Dillon van der Wal** saw his first action vs. Connecticut at tight end.

## NOTES FROM THE ALABAMA GAME

★ **Chase Garnham** (So., LB) matched a career-high with 10 tackles. In his first year as a starter, Garnham ranks second on the team behind Chris Marve (R-Sr., LB) with 19 solo stops and 33 total tackles.

★ **Wesley Tate** (R-So., WR) set a career-best with 46 receiving yards. It was the most by any Commodore receiver.

★ **Richard Kent** (R-Jr., punter) placed an effort inside the opponent's 20-yard line for the 17th consecutive game. For the year, Kent has 10 punts inside the 20-yard line, 11 of 50 yards or more, and just one touchback.

★ **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Jr., QB) posted career highs in completions (11), attempts (18), passing yards (104) and rushing yards (23) while enjoying the most playing time of his career.

★ Neither the Commodores nor their opponents are trying many field goals. Vanderbilt has converted 3-of-5, with opponents just 2-of-4.

★ **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE) matched a career high in tackles (5) and posted two tackles for loss, pushing his season total in that category to a team-high seven stops.

★ Several other defensive players matched or established personal highs in tackles, including **Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB), **Jovan Marshall** (R-So., safety) and **Colt Nichter** (R-Jr., DT). Barnes posted eight tackles in his first starting assignment. Marshall and Nichter added five tackles each.

★ **Jerron Seymour** (Fr., RB) set a career high with three catches and 45 receiving yards.

## TE JOHNSTON THIRD 'DORE TO MISS SEASON WITH INJURY

**Mason Johnston** (R-So., TE) became the third key Commodore player to prematurely exit the season when he left the Alabama game after a lower leg injury.

Johnston has had tough luck with injuries at Vanderbilt. He also sustained a season-ending leg last year at Kentucky.

Other contributors who are not expected

to return this season due to injury are **Tristan Strong** (R-Jr., LB) and **Jabo Burrow** (R-Jr., OG).

In the midst of his first year as a starter and ranking among the team's top tacklers, Strong went down at South Carolina with a leg injury. Burrow was forced to stop his career in September due to injury concerns.

Vanderbilt's 23-point victory over Ole Miss (30-7) on Sept. 17 marked the widest winning margin by the Commodores in Southeastern Conference play since it defeated Mississippi State 49-19 on Sept. 25, 1971.

## QUICK TURNAROUND FOR 'DORES

Vanderbilt was the only team in America that has surpassed its 2010 win total through the first three games of 2011.

In fact, the Commodores' 3-0 start also surpasses the win total from the 2009 campaign.





## 2011 CAPTAINS: MARVE, HAYWARD, SMITH, FISCHER, SPEAR GET TEAMMATES' VOTE

In late August, Vanderbilt players voted five teammates to serve as 2011 captains: **Kyle Fischer, Casey Hayward, Chris Marve, Larry Smith** and **Carey Spear**.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) will serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams.

Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time co-captains. Marve served in the role last year.

**FISCHER:** A 30-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer accepted a greater leadership role last spring. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard as a junior.

**HAYWARD:** The latest in a string of excellent Vandy defensive backs, Hayward ranks among the SEC active leaders in INTs (12) and enters the season with a team-leading 29 consecutive starts.

**MARVE:** A three-year starter and candidate for numerous postseason defensive awards, Marve is the SEC's active leader with 346 career

tackles. He also has a team-high 41 starts.

**SMITH:** The fifth-year senior has shown determination to improve technique since Franklin's arrival. Smith has jumped into the team's all-time Top Ten in passing early in the season.

**SPEAR:** After earning the placekicking duties in preseason, Spear is 3-5 this year in field goals, including a 31-yard game winner vs. UConn.

The 'Dores also name additional captains prior to each game.

## VANDY VICTORIOUS IN CONFERENCE OPENER

Vanderbilt's 30-7 victory over Ole Miss in Nashville on Sept. 17 was the Commodores' third win in its last seven Southeastern Conference openers.

The Commodores are not 6-19 in their last 25 SEC openers. Other recent victories are a 24-17 home win over South Carolina in 2008 and 28-24 win at Arkansas in 2005.

## 'DORES EARNED TOP 25 VOTES WITH 3-0 START

Prior to dropping their first road game to South Carolina, the Commodores received Top 25 consideration in national polls after starting the season 3-0.

In separate releases Sept. 18, Vanderbilt notched 11 votes in the USA Today Coaches Poll, and eight votes in the Associated Press ballot.

It marked the first Top 25 consideration for the Commodores since mid-October 2008.

Vanderbilt did not earn votes in either poll this week.

## FRANKLIN: NORMAN EXPECTED TO REDSHIRT

**Warren Norman**, the 2009 Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Year and the Commodores' starting running back for much of 2010, could miss the entire season.

Norman, the team's active career rushing leader (1,242 yards) and a former All-SEC kick returner who holds the school record with three returns for touchdowns. has not played in the 'Dores' 3-2 start as he recovers from a leg injury.

Coach **James Franklin** hinted at a possible redshirt for Norman Oct. 5.

## HAYWARD: OFF TO SENSATIONAL CAMPAIGN

Off to an sensational season, **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) ranks among the national leaders in interceptions and is on pace to challenge the team's all-time leader in picks. Hayward shares the SEC lead with four picks.

Hayward set a single-game career high with two interceptions against South Carolina.

Hayward's performance allowed the season to tie former standout Corey Chavous for fifth all-time with 12 career interceptions.

Hayward's next pick will move him into a second place tie with D.J. Moore (2006-08) and Ken Stone (1970-1972), just two behind all-time team leader Leonard Coleman (15 INTs, 1980-83).

A two-time defensive captain who has worked in Vanderbilt's Admissions Office, Marve garnered 80 stops last year while nursing an injury. He posted more than 100 tackles as a freshman and sophomore.

The team's second leading tackler, **Sean Richardson** (Sr., safety) had five tackles against Alabama. He needs 40 tackles to reach the career top 25.

Local media photographers and videographers can shoot either the opening minutes of practice Tuesday-Thursday, or shoot the final 10 minutes of practice on Wednesday (approximately 6:05 p.m.).

There is no availability to the head coach, staff or players on Tuesday and Thursday. The Tuesday and Thursday practices are closed after the opening periods. Besides television production obligations, Vanderbilt coaches and players are not made available on Fridays.

## RECORDS FOR FIRST-YEAR COMMODORE COACHES

**James Franklin**, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt gridiron history, became the first coach to register victories in his first three games since World War II. He guided Vanderbilt to a 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3, a 24-21 come-from-behind win over UConn on Sept. 10, and an impressive 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

Franklin's 'Dores have dropped their last two games to ranked opponents on the road, South Carolina and Alabama.

The last new coach to guide Vanderbilt to wins in his first three games was E.H. Alley in 1943. Before that, the last new coach to duplicate Franklin's 3-0 mark was Dan McGugin in 1904.

Franklin has matched or bettered the first-year win total of the four previous Vanderbilt head coaches.

Nine Commodore returnees are trying to achieve something no other Vanderbilt letterwinner can claim: become the team's first players to make multiple postseason bowl appearances.

The current players – **Brandon Barden** (TE), **Tim Fugger** (DE), **T.J. Greenstone** (DT), **Casey Hayward** (DB), **Josh Jelesky** (OL), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Sean Richardson** (safety), **Larry Smith** (QB) and **Udom Umoh** (WR) – played in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, a 16-14 victory over Boston College.

Several of the current 'Dores played pivotal roles in the postseason win. It marked the first career start for Smith at quarterback. Marve also started and finished with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game in place of an injured **D.J. Moore**. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

# ★ Coach James Franklin

## FRANKLIN FACTS

- When announced as the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, Franklin also became the first African-American to hold the Commodore position.
- Franklin is the first Vanderbilt coach to start his Commodore career 3-0 since the World War II Era.
- As a quarterback at East Stroudsburg, Franklin was a finalist for the NCAA Division II National Player of the Year.
- Regarded as a top recruiter, Franklin has been named among the nation's Top 25 recruiting coaches on multiple occasions by Rivals.com.
- Franklin is recognized as a noted quarterback mentor, having worked closely with Josh Freeman at Kansas State, and Danny O'Brien among others at Maryland. He also worked with several other top QBs, including Dan Marino and Donovan McNabb as a participant in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship and Brett Favre as a Green Bay WR coach in 2005.
- Franklin's Kansas State offense in 2006 featured a rare triple accomplishment, producing a 1,000-yard rusher, 3,000-yard passer and 1,500-yard receiver.
- Franklin pupil Danny O'Brien earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2010 after throwing for 2,438 yards and 22 touchdowns.

## KEY MARYLAND STAFFERS JOIN FRANKLIN

Franklin enticed four key staffers from the University of Maryland to help turnaround the fortunes of Vanderbilt football.

- **DWIGHT GALT, Director of Performance Enhancement**  
For years, Galt and Franklin talked about how they would manage a football program if given the opportunity. When Vanderbilt hired Franklin, the lifetime Maryland man jumped at the chance to join him. For 27 years, Galt poured his passion into the Terp program. Since 1993, he had served as its director of strength & conditioning.
- **JEMAL GRIFFIN, Chief of Staff**  
Griffin served as Maryland's Director of Football Operations for the last three years. He worked closely with Franklin, the Terps' assistant head coach/offensive coordinator during the same period.
- **JOHN DONOVAN, Offensive Coordinator**  
For the last three years, Donovan and Franklin spent many hours together, orchestrating the Maryland offensive attack.
- **CHARLES BANKINS, Special Teams Coordinator**  
Bankins joined Franklin and Donovan in 2009, working as the tight ends coach and special teams coordinator.

## Franklin...Building Interest Since Arriving on Campus

### FRANKLIN INTRODUCED IN NASHVILLE ★ Dec. 17, 2010

James Franklin is introduced as Vanderbilt's 27th head football coach in a press conference held in the Board of Trust Room at Sarratt Student Center. At 39, the former assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Maryland becomes the youngest Vandy head coach in nearly two decades.

*FRANKLIN: "It's time that this football program starts reflecting everything else on this campus, and that's a commitment to excellence. I'm not a six-and-five guy, and I'm not a seven-and-five guy. There's going to be high expectations from day one. There is no part of this program that will settle. Everything we do will be about championships."*

### FRANKLIN ANNOUNCES OFFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 13, 2011

The head coach announces the hirings of his offensive coaches, including new coordinator John Donovan, and Dwight Galt, the man who will guide the Commodores' conditioning program. He also names key administrators in the football office.

*FRANKLIN: "We're really laying the foundation right now with the offensive staff, the administrative staff, the strength coach, to put together what my focus is on, which is to build the best staff in the country. When I say that, I'm talking about people that are passionate about being at Vanderbilt."*

### FRANKLIN INTRODUCED AT BASKETBALL GAME ★ Jan. 20, 2011

Franklin takes the floor during halftime of the men's basketball game against Ole Miss in Memorial Gymnasium, asking students and fans for their support for the football team in the coming months.

*FRANKLIN: "We have a plan; we have a vision for what this program could be, but we can't do it alone. We need everybody's support. We need this community, we need this campus to come together and unite more than it ever has before."*

### FRANKLIN NAMES DEFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 31, 2011

Four defensive coaches are named to fill out Franklin's staff: defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop, linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator Brent Pry, secondary coach Wes McGriff and defensive line coach Sean Spencer.

### NATIONAL SIGNING DAY ★ Feb. 2, 2011

Fueled by a strong finish to recruiting, Franklin lands 21 signees coming from 13 states. The class, which includes a pair of 4-star prospects, is touted as Vanderbilt's most talented class in years.

*FRANKLIN TO AUDIENCE OF FANS: "Basically, this staff was not going to take 'no' for an answer. We told every recruit that. We would go into their homes and tell them reasons they should come and tell their family. In the end, we would look them in the eye and tell them we weren't taking 'no' for an answer and they were coming to Vanderbilt."*

### FRANKLIN STAGES STUDENT TRYOUTS ★ Feb. 15, 2011

After visiting dorms and fraternity row, Franklin personally conducts tryouts for the Vanderbilt student body to make the team's spring roster. Seventeen students participated in the tryouts. Eventually, six students would join the team for spring drills.

### FRANKLIN GUIDES SPRING DRILLS ★ March 18, 2011

Franklin oversees his first spring practice as head coach at the John Rich Practice Facility on campus. During the ensuing 14 practices, Franklin puts his stamp on the Commodore program: upbeat, energetic, disciplined, physical and positive.

### THOUSANDS ATTEND SPRING GAME ★ April 17, 2011

The 'Dores conclude a month of drills with the Black and Gold Spring Game in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Black Team comes away with a 19-7 victory in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd. It marks the first spring intrasquad game on campus in more than 10 years. A fireworks display caps the spring finale.

### OPENS FIRST PRESEASON AS HEAD COACH ★ Aug. 5, 2011

Pushing for an ultra-competitive atmosphere, Franklin tells team that every starting job will be decided during preseason camp. High energy is the theme through team's August drills. Franklin eyes a bigger picture – changing the expectations of all associated with Vanderbilt football.

### POSTS WINS IN FIRST THREE VANDY GAMES ★ September, 2011

Franklin becomes the first new Vandy coach to win his opening three games since World War II.

## Franklin's Career At a Glance

### **2008-10 MARYLAND (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)**

On December 23, 2007, Ralph Friedgen sways Franklin back to Maryland as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

### **2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)**

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps the Wildcats to a 7-6 record in 2006, including a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. Kansas State also plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason appearance in three years... In 2007, under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... QB Josh Freeman (eventual 2009 first-round pick of Tampa Bay) sets numerous school records, including 3,353 passing yards... WR Jordy Nelson becomes an All-America player by catching 122 passes, and is a high draft pick of the Packers... In 2011, he starts on Green Bay's world champion squad.

### **2005 GREEN BAY PACKERS-NFL (assistant coach/wide receivers)**

Assisting Head Coach Mike Sherman, Franklin mentors a strong receiving arsenal that includes Donald Driver, Javon Walker and Robert Ferguson catching passes from Brett Favre... Despite an injury to Walker, the Packers rank sixth in team receiving yards... Driver sets career highs with 86 receptions for 1,221 receiving yards.

### **2000-04 MARYLAND (wide receivers/recruiting coordinator)**

Franklin helps Maryland to three consecutive bowl appearances starting with the 2001 squad... Maryland also achieves three straight seasons of 10 wins or more (2001-03), including appearance in 2002 FedEx Orange Bowl... Terps followed Orange Bowl berth with 30-3 victory over Tennessee in 2002 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and 41-7 win over West Virginia in 2003 Toyota Gator Bowl... Promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2003, Franklin delivers back-to-back recruiting classes that were ranked among the nation's Top 25.

### **1999 IDAHO STATE (wide receivers)**

As receivers coach, Franklin helps ISU finish ninth nationally in total offense.

### **1998 WASHINGTON STATE (graduate assistant coach/tight ends)**

Franklin joins highly successful Cougar Coach Mike Price as grad assistant.

### **1997 JAMES MADISON (wide receivers)**

Franklin mentors James Madison wide receivers... Junior receiver Earnest Payton finishes his career as the school's leader in receptions with 185.

### **1996 EAST STROUDSBURG (defensive backs)**

Franklin returns to his alma mater, Division II East Stroudsburg.

### **NFL MINORITY COACHING FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM**

Franklin participates in the program in 1998, serving an internship with Miami. He also enjoyed stints with Philadelphia in 1999 and Minnesota in 2008.





# Commodore Notes



## WILSON, JOHNSON EARN SEPT. 17 SEC AWARDS

**Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) and **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., center) were named SEC Defensive Player and Offensive Lineman of the Week for their efforts in Vanderbilt's 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

Wilson picked off two Rebel passes, returning one for a 52-yard TD. He also contributed three defended passes in the stellar performance.

With two picks returned for touchdowns, Wilson becoming the 'Dore to achieve the feat in a single season since Jay Chesley in 1974.

Johnson anchored an offensive line effort that helped produce 281 rushing yards for the Commodores. It was the team's highest rushing total against an SEC opponent since 1994.

Johnson also won the league's offensive line award last year for his performance playing tackle against Ole Miss.

## LOHR GETS SEC D-LINE AWARD ON SEPT. 10

**Rob Lohr** (R-Jr., DT) earned Southeastern Conference Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his performance in Vanderbilt's 24-21 victory over Connecticut on Sept. 10.

Lohr, who contributed four tackles for loss in the victory, was selected over several SEC standouts. Two other Commodores, **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Fr., DE), also were nominated for the award.

Lohr's four tackles for loss ties for the most by a Commodore defender since linebacker Jamie Winborn contributed five tackles resulting in losses during a 43-20 against No. 6 Florida on Nov. 4, 2000. **Casey Hayward** also accomplished the feat at LSU in 2009.

Lohr became the first Vanderbilt defensive player to earn SEC weekly honors since defensive back **D.J. Moore** was recognized after the Commodores' 31-24 victory over Kentucky on Nov. 15, 2008.

## VANDY, UMASS TO PLAY FOUR-GAME SERIES

Vanderbilt and Massachusetts have finalized an agreement to play a four-game series in football starting in 2012.

The Commodores and Minutemen will play twice in Nashville, the first coming on Oct. 27, 2012, and twice in Gillette Stadium. Starting next year, the venue near Boston will join as home to both UMass and the New England Patriots.

The teams will play in consecutive years through 2015. Besides the 2012 game, other series dates include Sept. 21, 2013 in Foxborough, Mass., Oct. 4, 2014 in Nashville, and Oct. 29, 2015 in Foxborough.

In April, UMass announced a jump to NCAA's Football Bowl Championship division (FBS), as a member of the MAC Conference.

## STRONG RUSHING EFFORT VS. OLE MISS

Vanderbilt produced 281 rushing yards in its victory over Ole Miss. The performance ranks as the team's fifth highest rushing total against a Southeastern Conference team in the 30-year history of Vanderbilt Stadium, trailing just four games from 1990-92.

The effort against Ole Miss was topped by 169 yards by **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB). Stacy's total equals the team's 10th best rushing performance since World War II, and the most against an SEC foe since **Lew Thomas** ran for 173 against Auburn in 2001.

In the last 30 years, the 281-yard rushing total ranks as the Commodores' eighth highest rushing total against an SEC foe – and the most since Vanderbilt rushed for 286 yards at Kentucky on Nov. 5, 1994.

## FORMER COACH MACINTYRE HONORED SEPT. 10

Former Vanderbilt Head Coach **George MacIntyre** was honored during halftime of the Connecticut game for his incredible contribution to the legacy of Commodore football and also to assist in raising awareness within the Commodore community for finding a cure to multiple sclerosis.

Coach MacIntyre, a longtime resident of Nashville, was known throughout his coaching career as a powerful motivator and infectious personality. Those qualities have never been more apparent than in his current battle with multiple sclerosis.

More than 50 of MacIntyre's former players joined Vanderbilt Athletics officials during the on-field ceremony.

"Coach Mac," as he's been known throughout much of his career, served as head coach of the Commodores from 1979-1985 and led Vanderbilt to some of the university's biggest victories. In 1982, MacIntyre's team upset 14th-ranked Florida 31-29 and went on to finish the season 8-3 with an appearance in the Hall of Fame Bowl. That year, he received the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award, the *Sporting News* College Football Coach of the Year and the SEC Coach of the Year. The eight wins posted in 1982 were the most wins posted by a Commodore team since 1955 and a mark that has not been matched since.

After leaving Vanderbilt, MacIntyre went on to a successful business career before returning to the coaching ranks as an assistant coach at Liberty University when in 1997 he was forced to retire after being diagnosed with primary progressive multiple sclerosis. In the subsequent years, Coach Mac has continued to serve as an inspiration to his former players and fellow coaches.

A group of those former players came together earlier this year with the hopes of honoring MacIntyre for his contributions to Vanderbilt and the local community. In conjunction with the National Multiple Sclerosis Society and the athletic department, this group of former players and colleagues has worked to raise awareness and money in Coach Mac's honor in the fight against MS.

The infectious personality and strong will continue to resonate today from Coach Mac, who still serves as a motivator and inspiration for former players, coaches and friends that visit him at his home in Nashville.

On defense, seven starters from a year ago should be in the starting unit vs. Elon. They are **Tim Fugger** (DE), **Rob Lohr** (DT), **Colt Nichter** (DT), **Chris Marve** (LB), **Casey Hayward** (CB) and **Sean Richardson** (safety).

Four other starters – **Zac Stacy** (RB), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Austin Monahan** (TE) and **Jhonnell Thomas** (DE) – also started games last year.

A number of other position players that played key roles for the Commodores in the opener also have multiple career starts, including **John Cole** (WR), **Jonathan Krause** (WR), **Eddie Foster** (CB), **T.J. Greenstone** (DT), **Andre Hal** (CB) and **Kenny Ladler** (safety).

## VANDERBILT VS. RECENT NON-SEC OPPONENTS

After defeating Elon (45-14) and Connecticut (24-21) this season, Vanderbilt is 11-8 against non-Southeastern Conference opponents in the last five years.

In 2010, the 'Dores were 1-3 vs. non-SEC foes: defeating Eastern Michigan while falling to Northwestern, UConn and Wake Forest.

In the last decade, Vanderbilt is 19-17 in games against non-SEC teams. Vanderbilt still hosts Army (Oct. 22) and plays at Wake Forest (Nov. 26).

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Larry Smith threw for two touchdowns and ran for another score, and Vanderbilt beat Elon 45-14 Saturday night in coach James Franklin's debut with the Commodores.

Franklin showed his willingness to gamble with the team considered the worst in the Southeastern Conference, going for it on fourth down three times to keep drives alive scoring 17 points. Smith converted the second on fourth-and-3, running 16 yards for a TD.

The win snapped a seven-game skid for the Commodores who scored more points than they did in all but two games last season. When Trey Wilson picked off a pass and ran it 21 yards for a TD after Smith's second score, Vandy had almost as many points in 14 seconds as the Commodores averaged (16.9) per game in 2010.

Carey Spear kicked a 31-yard field goal with 2:56 left, and the Commodores rallied from 21-14 down in the fourth quarter and beat the Connecticut Huskies 24-21 Saturday night for their first winning streak since 2008.

The victory gives Franklin a 2-0 start, the first by a Vandy coach since Fred Pancoast in 1975.

Tim Fugger had two of Vanderbilt's five sacks, and the Commodores forced four turnovers, all by Johnny McEntee. Senior Casey Hayward picked off a McEntee pass at midfield, then weaved his way back across the field to finish off a 50-yard return. His first career interception return for a TD tied it at 21 apiece with 6:45 left.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Larry Smith ran for a touchdown, and Trey Wilson returned one of his two interceptions for a 52-yard TD as Vanderbilt scored 21 straight in the second quarter and beat Mississippi 30-7 Saturday in making James Franklin the first new Commodores coach to start 3-0 since World War II.

The win marks Vanderbilt's first 3-0 start since 2008 when the Commodores won their first bowl since 1955. The Commodores also beat Mississippi (1-2) in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams for their fifth win in seven years in this series.

Vanderbilt picked off five passes, all off Zack Stoudt, and Wilson's interception return for a TD is the Commodores' third this season.

The Commodores outgained Ole Miss 387-234 in total offense. Jerron Seymour's 9-yard TD run capped the second-quarter scoring for Vandy, and Zac Stacy also ran for 169 yards, including a 77-yard TD run.

COLUMBIA, S.C. – For the first time in his seven years at South Carolina, Steve Spurrier team is 4-0. But like most of his Gamecocks teams, he can't get the offense where he wants it.

No. 12 South Carolina (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat Vanderbilt 21-3 on Saturday night. But Stephen Garcia threw four interceptions, Marcus Lattimore was held under 100 yards rushing and all-SEC receiver Alshon Jeffery caught just two passes for 34 yards.

Spurrier had no problem admitting his defense bailed this one out. The Gamecocks held the Commodores (3-1, 1-1) to 77 yards and just five first downs. South Carolina recovered two fumbles, both forced by freshman defensive end Jadeveon Clowney, and sacked Vanderbilt's quarterbacks six times. It was the fewest yards allowed by a South Carolina team since holding Wake Forest to 66 yards in November 1987.
