No. 14 Vanderbilt Faces Defending National Champions

The No. 14 Vanderbilt women's tennis team looks to snap a two-match losing streak on Wednesday as it travels to Atlanta to face defending national champion and second-ranked Georgia Tech.

The Commodores are coming off a pair of losses to SEC foes this past weekend. The 'Dores dropped a 5-2 decision at No. 7 Florida on Friday, and lost a hard-fought 4-3 contest at No. 30 South Carolina on Sunday.

Vanderbilt owns a 9-2 advantage over Georgia Tech in the series history. Last season, Vanderbilt upset No. 3 Georgia Tech 5-2 in Nashville. The Commodores have won seven of the last eight meetings between the two schools.

Georgia Tech enters the match with a 9-2 overall record and a 1-0 mark in ACC play. The Yellow Jackets, ranked second in the country by the ITA, recently won their second-consecutive ITA National Women's Team Indoors Championship.

The Yellow Jackets have seven players ranked nationally in singles, including two in the top six. Amanda McDowell is ranked fourth nationally in singles, while Kristi Miller is ranked sixth in the country. Georgia Tech also has two doubles teams that are nationally ranked. The team of Miller and Kirsten Flower are ranked 16th nationally in doubles.

After Wednesday's match, Vanderbilt returns home for a five-game home stand. The Commodores host a pair of ranked SEC foes this weekend at the Currey Tennis Center. No. 26 Arkansas comes to town on Friday, while No. 34 LSU visits Music City on Sunday.

The Coaches

Vanderbilt: Geoff Macdonald enters his 14th season at the helm of the Vanderbilt women's tennis program. Under his direction, the Commodores have made 13 consecutive NCAA Tournaments and have been to the round of 16 in the last nine tournaments. Macdonald owns a 288-91 record at Vanderbilt, making him the winningest coach in Commodore history. He has been named Coach of the Year three times, including earning that recognition from the SEC in 2000. Macdonald recently picked up his 400th career victory in Vanderbilt's 4-3 victory over Notre Dame. His career record stands at 402-128.

Georgia Tech: Bryan Shelton is in his ninth year as the head coach for the Yellow Jackets. Shelton has turned Georgia Tech into a perennial powerhouse as the Yellow Jackets have finished first in the ACC the last three years and earned their first national championship in 2007. Shelton was named USTA/ITA National Coach of the Year and ACC Coach of the Year in 2007. He was inducted into the Georgia Tech Hall of Fame in 1993 and the Georgia Tennis Hall of Fame in 2002.

Scouting Georgia Tech

A member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, Georgia Tech enters Wednesday's match with a 9-2 overall record, including a 1-0 mark in conference play. The Yellow Jackets are ranked second by the ITA. Earlier in the spring, Georgia Tech captured its second-consecutive ITA National Women's Team Indoors Championships.

Georgia Tech has seven players ranked nationally in singles, including two in the top six. Amanda McDowell is the highest ranked Yellow Jacket, coming in at No. 4. Kristi Miller is ranked sixth in the country in singles. The Yellow Jackets also have two doubles teams ranked in the top 20 nationally. Miller and Kirsten Flower are ranked 16th in the country in doubles, while Miller and Whitney McCray are rated 19th.

All-Time Series vs. Georgia Tech

Vanderbilt leads the all-time series against Georgia Tech 9-2, including last year's 5-2 upset victory. The Commodores have won seven of the last eight meetings between the two schools.

Last Time vs. Georgia Tech

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Vanderbilt women's team earned their first upset of the season with a 5-2 win over No. 3 Georgia Tech Thursday evening at the Currey Tennis Center.

The No. 25 Commodores (4-5) started with a 2-1 doubles win and followed with singles victories from Catherine Newman, Amanda Taylor, Taka Bertrand and Courtney Ulery to clinch the win.

The Commodores overpowered No. 3 Georgia Tech Thursday with an impressive 5-2 win at the Currey Tennis Center.

The Yellow Jackets (6-2) were recently named ITA Indoors champions when they snapped No. 1 Stanford's 89-match win streak to take the title in early February. Thursday's loss marks their second dropped contest of the season.

Bertrand and Newman quickly downed Yellow Jacket opponents 8-1 in doubles. GT then split the contest with an 8-2 win at No. 2. VU sophomores Ulery and Liberty Sveke charged ahead with a 6-2 lead over Kirsten Flower and Ashley Craddock at No. 3, but the Yellow Jackets fired back with three wins to trail the 'Dores by just one game at 6-5. Ulery and Sveke then clinched the win 8-6.

Freshman Newman led the Commodore singles charge with a 6-2, 6-2 win over Tarryn Rudman at No. 4 to put VU up 2-0. Amanda Taylor followed minutes later with a straight set win over No. 22 Kirsten Flower at No. 2, putting the Commodores within in one match of the win.

Senior Amanda Fish played her second singles contest of the season against Georgia Tech's No. 11 Kristi Miller. It was clear Fish was still playing through pain from a nagging ankle injury, but continued to battle Miller at No. 1. Fish eventually fell 6-2, 6-2, marking GT's first singles match win of the night.

Junior Bertrand finished the Yellow Jacket extermination with a 6-2, 6-4 win over No. 38 Alison Silverio.

"I'm so happy the team won," Bertrand said. "It was really good for our confidence. Everyone was really pumped because we believed we could win. We knew they were highly ranked and this would be a great opportunity for an upset."

Freshman Courtney Ulery notched her first ranked singles win of the season when she followed Bertrand with a 7-5, 6-3 win over No. 54 Amanda Craddock. Junior Caroline Ferrell played a tight contest with GT's Amanda

McDowell, but was edged 6-4, 7-5 to end the evening's action.

Last season the Commodores were swept by the Yellow Jackets in Atlanta, marking VU's only shutout of the 2006 season.

"This is becoming a great rivalry," Vanderbilt Head Coach Geoff Macdonald said. "Tech plays great matches with superb sportsmanship. To beat them is a real accomplishment considering the injuries and other problems we've had to deal with. To hang together and come through says a lot about the character of our team."

In Our Last Match...

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The No. 14 Vanderbilt women's tennis team comeback bid fell just short as No. 30 South Carolina recorded a 4-3 win at the Maxcy Gregg Tennis Center in Columbia, S.C on Sunday afternoon. The win drops Vanderbilt to 7-2 and 0-2 in Southeastern Conference play while South Carolina improves to 7-2 and 1-1 in league play.

The Commodores lost the doubles point for the second-straight match. USC's Suzanna Mansour and Megan McGavock defeated Caroline Ferrell and Keilly Ulery 8-3 at the No. 3 doubles position. The 17th-ranked team of Gira Schofield and Ana Zubori clinched the doubles point for the Gamecocks with an 8-2 victory over No. 33 Taka Bertrand and Catherine Newman at No. 1 doubles. Vanderbilt's Amanda Taylor and Courtney Ulery picked up the lone doubles win for the Commodores, recording an 8-6 victory over Miljana Jovic

and Natasa Vuckovic at No. 2 doubles.

Keilly Ulery pulled the Commodores even at one, registering a 6-2, 7-5 win over Jelena Rajic at the No. 5 singles position. At the third singles position, Vuckovic put the Gamecocks back on top 2-1 with a 6-2, 7-6 (6) win over No. 48 Courtney Ulery.

Bertrand evened the match at two at the No. 4 singles position with a 6-1, 6-2 straight set win over Jovic. Ferrell gave the Commodores their only lead of the match with her 6-4, 7-6 (3) win at the sixth singles position over McGavock.

South Carolina's No. 56 Zubori defeated No. 43 Newman at the second singles position to even the match at three. Newman won the opening set 7-6 (5), but Zubori came back to win the second set 6-2. Zubori won the deciding third set 7-5 to square the match.

The match came down to the No. 1 singles position between No. 29 Taylor and No. 35 Schofield. VU's Taylor captured the first set 7-6 (7), before dropping the second set 6-4. The final set was even the entire way and came down to a tiebreaker, which Schofield won 7-4 to claim the third set 7-6 (4).

Bertrand Nears Vanderbilt All-Time Singles Wins Record

Senior Taka Bertrand is just six wins shy of becoming the all-time leader in singles wins in a career in Vanderbilt history. Bertrand currently has a 109-33 record in her four-year career at Vanderbilt. The record is currently held by Julie Ditty (1997-01). Ditty won 114 singles matches over her Commodore career.

'Dores in Midst of Tough Five Game Stretch

Vanderbilt is in the middle of its toughest five game stretch of the season. The 'Dores opened the string with a pair of conference losses, falling 5-2 at No. 7 Florida and dropping a hard fought 4-3 contest at No. 30 South Carolina. Next, Vanderbilt travels to defending national champion and second-ranked Georgia Tech. The Commodores close out the stretch at home this weekend against No. 26 Arkansas and No. 34 LSU.

'Dores Make History in Albuquerque

The 2008 Vanderbilt women's tennis team made history with the pair of victories it picked up in Albuquerque, N.M. With the wins, the 2008 squad became the first Vanderbilt team to win a match in the Mountain Time zone. The 'Dores defeated New Mexico 5-2 and bettered Colorado 7-0.

Closing in on 300

Vanderbilt head coach Geoff Macdonald stands just 12 victories shy of 300 in his career as the Commodore head coach. Macdonald's 288-91 record at Vanderbilt makes him the winningest coach in school history. Macdonald also picked up another milestone against No. 9 Notre Dame, picking up his 400th career victory. Vanderbilt Picked Third in SEC East By Conference Coaches

The Vanderbilt women's tennis team was picked to finish third in the SEC East by the league coaches in a poll released January 16. Florida was selected to win the overall league title.

The Commodores are ranked 16th in the preseason poll released last week by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association. The Commodores return five letterwinners and four starters from a team that finished 19-9 last season and advanced to the NCAA round of 16 for the 10th consecutive year.

Florida received 67 points in the poll and eight votes as the overall league champion. Perennial power Georgia was picked to finish second in the eastern division, with 59 points and two votes as overall league champion. The Commodores were selected third by the coaches, receiving two votes for overall league champion and 46 points overall. Rounding out the predicted eastern division standings was South Carolina, Tennessee and Kentucky.

In the west, Arkansas was predicted to win the division, followed closely behind by LSU. Auburn was picked third in the division, while Ole Miss was expected to finish fourth. Alabama and Mississippi State were predicted to finish fifth and sixth, respectively.

The preseason poll is voted on by the SEC women's tennis coach and is based on a 6-5-4-3-2-1 tally.

Familiar Face Joins Commodore Coaching Staff

Former Vanderbilt standout Aleke Tsoubanos joins the Commodore coaching staff this season as an assistant coach. Tsoubanos enjoyed one of the most decorated careers in Vanderbilt women's tennis history. She earned NCAA All-American honors from 2002-04, was a three-time ITA All-American and was a first-team All-SEC selection. Tsoubanos still holds the record for most doubles victories in a season and in a career. Before returning to Vanderbilt, she played three years of professional tennis and most recently played for the St. Louis Aces in World Team Tennis.

A Perfect 13

Junior Courtney Ulery (Wellington, Fla.) enjoyed a breakout fall season, finishing with a perfect 13-0 record. Ulery won her singles flight at the Furman Fall Classic, the Hoosier Classic, the June Stewart Invitational and the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic. During her run,

Ulery defeated three nationally ranked players. Because of her success, the previously unraked Ulery stormed into the rankings, earning a No. 13 ranking in the first national poll released by the ITA.

Vanderbilt Signs Three in Fall

Vanderbilt women's tennis head coach Geoff Macdonald announced that Chelsea Preeg, Heather Steinbauer and Jacqueline Wu have signed National Letters of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play women's tennis for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2008.

"I'm thrilled to sign these three players," Macdonald said. "They are future stars at Vanderbilt and great student-athletes. They were widely recruited across the country. We're thrilled to be able to land what I think is one of the best recruiting classes in the country."

Preeg from Naples, Fla., has been one of the top ranked junior players in the United States for the past eight years. Currently ranked sixth in the girls 18 and under division, Preeg has won numerous junior championships and has been ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation. Preeg captured the Florida State Girls 18 and under Championships when she was only 14 years old. She chose Vanderbilt over Clemson, Duke and North Carolina.

A native of The Woodlands, Texas, Steinbauer currently attends The Woodlands College Park High School. She is ranked No. 36 in the country according to tennisrecruiting.net and is the No. 2 ranked player in the state of Texas. Steinbauer has finished highly in

several national events, including winning the girls' 18 division at the 2007 Houston Coca-Cola SCMZ and finishing second at the 2007 USTA National Opens. She chose Vanderbilt over Florida State, Georgia Tech, North Carolina and TCU.

Wu from Holmdel, N.J., is ranked 59th in the country and is the top ranked player in her state, according to tennisrecruiting.net. She advanced to the semifinals at the 2007 International Grass Court Championships. Wu was also a member of the victorious East team at the 2006 USTA National Girls' 18 Team Championship.

Commodores Well Represented in National Rankings

The Vanderbilt women's tennis team has three players ranked nationally in singles and one doubles team ranked in the latest poll released by the ITA.

Senior Amanda Taylor jumped up five positions to No. 29 in the latest singles poll. Taylor has opened the year with a 6-1 record, while playing all her matches at the No. 1 singles position.

Sophomore Catherine Newman is ranked 43rd in singles. Newman also sports a 6-1 overall record, including a win over Notre Dame's Brook Buck.

The third Commodore ranked in singles is junior Courtney Ulery, who is ranked 48th. Ulery has put together a stellar start to the spring 2008 campaign, winning her first seven matches. Dating back to last fall, Ulery has won 20 consecutive matches, which is the longest singles winning streak in Vanderbilt history.

The 'Dores also have one doubles team ranked as Taka Bertrand and Newman make their first appearance of the season in the doubles rankings, coming in at No. 33. Bertrand and Newman have only lost once this year, falling to the highly ranked duo of Brook Buck and Kelcy Tefft.

Commodores Seek 10th Consecutive Sweet 16

The Commodores enter the 2008 season looking for their 10th consecutive appearance in the NCAA round of 16. Last season, the Commodores made it nine in a row by easily dispatching of Murray State and Tennessee in the opening two rounds played at the Currey Tennis Center. The Commodores fell in the round of 16 to perennial power Stanford.

The Commodores have made the NCAA Tournament in each of Geoff Macdonald's 13 years with the team, advancing as far as the national championship match in 2001.

SEC Title For Newman

Sophomore Catherine Newman (Greensboro, N.C.) finished the fall season in style, winning the singles 'A' flight at the Fall SEC Coaches' Classic in Auburn, Ala. Newman, who was ranked No. 28 in the fall by the ITA, defeated three ranked players to win the title, including No. 17 Megan Alexander of Florida in the semifinals and South Carolina's Gira Schofield, ranked 36th, in the finals. Newman also won three matches at the ITA Southeast Indoor Championships. For the fall season, Newman finished with a 10-3 record.

Beating No. 1

The highlight of senior Amanda Taylor's fall came at the Riviera/ITA All-American Championships. In the opening round of the main singles draw, Taylor defeated No. 1 Megan Falcon of LSU in straight sets 6-2, 6-3. Assistant coach Aleke Tsoubanos called Taylor's performance "some of the most flawless tennis I've ever seen her play." Taylor went on to fall in the second round of the tournament, dropping a hard-fought, three-set match to No. 14 Laura Vallverdu of Miami (Fla.).

Geoff Macdonald enters his 14th season as the head coach of the women's tennis team. During the previous 13 seasons, the two-time SEC Coach of the Year has placed the Commodores among the nation's elite programs on a consistent basis.

Since Macdonald joined the Vanderbilt staff in 1994, the Commodore tennis program has developed a reputation for rapid player improvement, strong commitments to coaching, and unmatched excellence on the court and in the classroom.

Before Macdonald's arrival, the Vanderbilt women's tennis program had never been ranked higher than No. 28 in the nation. Under his leadership, the Commodores have finished no lower than No. 16 in each of the past nine years, including a school record No. 2 ranking at the end of the 2004 season. Vanderbilt has ranked in the top three of the Southeastern Conference eight of the past 10 years, and has cultivated several nationally ranked players and doubles teams.

Last season may have been one of Macdonald's finest coaching jobs. After starting off the season 2-5, the Commodores rebounded to win their next 12 matches. The Commodores finished third in the Southeastern Conference with a 9-2 record and advanced to their 13th straight NCAA Tournament. Vanderbilt easily disposed of Murray State and Tennessee in the first two rounds of the tournament before falling to perennial powerhouse Stanford in the round of 16. The Commodores finished the year with a 19-9 record and were ranked 16th by the ITA.

While Macdonald's leadership continues to improve the Commodore program every season, Macdonald's impact was felt immediately in his very first year at Vanderbilt in 1995. The team finished the year 16-8, including an 8-3 mark in the SEC and advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time in school history.

Once Vanderbilt began its rise to the top, the achievements kept coming. In 1996, the Commodores posted a 24-7 record, finished second in the SEC, advanced to the SEC Tournament Championship match for the first time and, once again, earned a berth in the NCAA Championships, advancing to the Round of 16. The team's 24 wins were the third most in the nation that year.

The team continued to improve with each successful season and in 2001 the 'Dores finally found themselves in the national spotlight as they competed in the NCAA finals. The event marked the first time that any Vanderbilt sports team had played for a national championship. Despite falling to the Stanford Cardinal, Macdonald's squad ended the season with a 26-5 record and a No. 4 national ranking, while three singles players and two doubles teams earned individual bids to the NCAA championships.

The following season, Macdonald not only matched the success of the previous year, but led the 'Dores to a record setting 27 wins. The team also advanced to the finals of the National Team Indoors tournament, which features sixteen of the top ranked teams in the country. Following the season, Sarah Riske and Aleke Tsoubanos were both named ITA All-Americans.

In 2003, Macdonald oversaw the final year of Sarah Riske's career, who became a two-time All-American in both singles and doubles. Riske left VU as the winningest doubles player, but Tsoubanos has since grabbed that title.

In 2004, the Commodores returned to the Final Four in the NCAA Tournament where they lost to undefeated Stanford, the eventual national champions. The 2004 Commodore team included All American, All Academic and ITA Scholar Aleke Tsoubanos who is entering her first year as an assistant for the women's tennis team. Other honors achieved by Commodores included Annie Menees' All Academic and ITA Scholar awards, while Audra Falk and Kelly Schmandt landed All-American honors.

In 2006, the Commodores posted a 23-5 record en route to the team's eighth consecutive NCAA Sweet 16 appearance, despite the young team's lack of senior representatives. Following the season, junior Amanda Fish became the seventh

Commodore under Macdonald to receive ITA All-American honors.

Macdonald has earned three Coach of the Year honors, including SEC recognition for his 2000 team, which included four ITA ranked singles players. He previously earned the title at Duke and Louisiana State University, where he began his coaching career in 1988.

Before coming to Nashville, Macdonald was the head coach at Duke University. Macdonald was honored with ACC Coach of the Year honors in 1992. While in Durham, he guided the Blue Devils to three conference championships and three appearances in the NCAA tournament, where Duke made two appearances in the quarterfinals and one semifinal appearance.

During his three years with the Tigers, Macdonald took LSU from last in the SEC to the NCAA Championship as the No. 13 seed in just three years. Following the Tigers' 1991 season, Macdonald was named the SEC Coach of the Year. Macdonald amassed a 50-24 record while at the helm of the LSU women's tennis program.

As a player at the University of Virginia, Macdonald capped off a successful collegiate career by winning the ACC singles title in 1981. He advanced to the NCAA Championship, where he defeated David Pate in the first round.

Macdonald was named the ACC's Most Valuable Player and also won the league's Sportsmanship Award. He finished second to basketball great Ralph Sampson in the Athlete of the Year voting at Virginia in 1981.

After his collegiate career, Macdonald played professionally for three years. Macdonald scored wins over David Pate, Wally Masur, Jacob Hlasek and Juan Aguilera. He also gained Grand Slam experience, playing in the U.S. Open. Among his victories was the Florida State Closed Men's Singles Championship.

Following his pro playing career, Macdonald became a private instructor until being named head coach at LSU. And now, as a Commodore, Macdonald believes the climate at Vanderbilt is right to produce national championship caliber teams. And, toward that end, he adheres to a simple coaching philosophy: Hard work and hours of individual attention for each player every week.

Macdonald is married to Kate Daniels, a highly acclaimed English professor at Vanderbilt, who also has taught at Wake Forest, LSU, Virginia, UMass and Bennington College. They have three children – Sam, 21; Gus, 16; and Jane, 14.
