Vanderbilt Opens Season Against Ohio Valley Conference Favorite Austin Peay

The Vanderbilt men's basketball team opens the 2007-08 campaign against Ohio Valley Conference preseason favorite Austin Peay, Saturday, November 10, at 7 p.m. CT in a game that will be televised live by Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast.

The Commodores are coming off an 80-79 win over Tusculum in their only exhibition game of the season. Vanderbilt held on to win the game when senior Alex Gordon nailed a free throw with two seconds remaining to give the Commodores a one-point win over a game Tusculum squad. Gordon and freshman A.J. Ogilvy paced the Vanderbilt effort with 17 points and seven rebounds apiece. The Commodores shot 41.7% from the floor and only 26.7% from three, while the Pioneers used their prowess from beyond the arc to make the game interesting, making 13-of-35 shots from three.

The Governors played two exhibition games this fall, and came away with victories against Rhodes and Lambuth. Forward Drake Reed paced Austin Peay's effort, averaging 18 points per game in the two games. Todd Babington also averaged 15 points per game, including a 19-point effort against Rhodes College.

Vanderbilt will play its 32nd season opener at Memorial Gym Saturday night, and has posted a 28-3 record all-time in those games. Georgetown, last year's season opening opponent, entered the game ranked #8 in the nation and knocked off the Commodores, 86-70, at Memorial Gym on November 15.

coaches, leads the way for the Commodores. Foster, an All-SEC second team member in 2006-07 and a first team member in 2005-06, averaged 15.6 points and 4.6 rebounds per game a year ago.

Vanderbilt leads the all-time series, 12-1, and has a record of 10-1 against the Governors in Nashville.

Scouting Austin Peay

The Vanderbilt men's basketball team opens the 2007-08 campaign against Ohio Valley Conference preseason favorite Austin Peay, Saturday, November 10, at 7 p.m. CT in a game that will be televised live by Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast. Austin Peay returns all five starters from last year's team which finished 21-12 and 16-4 in the OVC. The Governors won the regular season title but lost in the OVC Tournament to Eastern Kentucky, 63-62, but advanced to the Postseason NIT, where APSU lost to Air Force, 75-51, in the first round.

First Game In South Padre Invitational

Tonight's matchup with Austin Peay marks the first game of the South Padre Invitational for Vanderbilt. The Commodores, along with Utah State, Bradley, and Iowa, will host the first two rounds on campus, and then gather in South Padre Island, Texas, on November 23 and 24. Vanderbilt's other home game in the tournament comes on November 20 against Valparaiso.

VU will take on Utah State on the 23rd and then either Iowa or Bradley on the 24th in South Padre Island.

Vanderbilt In Season Openers

The Commodores own an 88-32 all-time record in season openers and 28-3 all-time in season openers at Memorial Gymnasium. Last year's season-opening 86-70 loss to #8-ranked Georgetown snapped a 10-game season opening winning streak, but the Commodores have still won 14 of their last 16 season-openers. Prior to last year's loss to the Hoyas, the last time VU dropped a season opener was to start the 1995-96 campaign. Vanderbilt fell short in a 71-63 decision against North Carolina in the opening round of the Maui Invitational.

At Memorial Gym, Vanderbilt is 28-3 in season openers, with their only setbacks coming to Louisville (82-74) on Dec. 1, 1970, Arkansas (107-70) in preseason NIT action on Nov. 14, 1990, and last year's decision to Georgetown.

The Commodores are 7-1 when opening the season at home under head coach Kevin Stallings, with the only loss coming to Georgetown a year ago.

How Sweet It Is - Two Sweet 16's In Last Four Years

The Commodores, after last season's Sweet 16 appearance, have now made two NCAA Sweet 16's in the last four years, one of only two programs in the Southeastern Conference to accomplish the feat (Florida).

In fact, Vanderbilt is only one of 16 teams in the nation to do that. Besides Vanderbilt and Florida, UCLA, North Carolina, Georgetown, Memphis, Kansas, Pittsburgh, Duke, West Virginia, Texas, Villanova, UConn, Washington, Illinois, and Oklahoma State are the only teams to advance to two or more Sweet 16's in the last four years.

Vanderbilt Posts 15th 20-win Season in school History

Vanderbilt recorded the 15th 20-win season in school history with a 99-90 overtime win at South Carolina on Feb. 28. It marked the third 20-win campaign under eighth-year head coach Kevin Stallings. Only Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76) has posted more 20-win seasons with six.

Commodores Among Nation's Best Versus Ranked Opponents In 2006-07

Vanderbilt's six wins against nationally ranked foes (AP poll) ranked among the most in the nation during the regular season in 2006-07. Vanderbilt won a school record five consecutive games against ranked teams in 2006-07 -- including three in an eight-day stretch against then-No. 10 Alabama (94-73); at then-No. 25 Kentucky (72-67) and at then-No. 21 LSU (64-53) -- before losing at top-ranked Florida on Jan. 31. The previous school record for one season was three set four times, last during the 2000 campaign.

SEC Preseason Polls

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days October 24-25 in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 98 points in the poll to finish behind Tennessee (180), Kentucky (142), and Florida (103). Georgia was chosen fifth (69), and South Carolina was chosen sixth (38).

Arkansas was chosen to win the SEC West with 168 votes, 20 votes better than Mississippi State.

Tennessee received 28 out of the 30 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received the other two votes.

Vanderbilt's Shan Foster was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

Next Game: At Toledo

The Commodores will make their first ever trip to Toledo to take on the Rockets at Savage Hall Tuesday night. Tip-time is 6 p.m. CT.

Vanderbilt needed overtime to defeat the Rockets last year at Memorial Gym, 99-93, on December 2, 2006. Then-freshman Jermaine Beal made a driving layup and free throw with 4.4 seconds remaining in overtime to push the Commodores to the victory.

Recapping the Exhibition Win

Senior guard Alex Gordon sank his first of two free-throw attempts with 2.2 seconds to play, giving Vanderbilt an 80-79 win over Tusculum in exhibition play on Monday at Memorial Gym.

Led by four players in double figures, including a team-high 17 by Gordon and freshman A.J. Ogilvy, who was making his college debut, the Commodores led by as many as 21 points in the second half but were unable to hold their advantage over the Pioneers, who made 13 three-pointers compared to just four by the Commodores. The Pioneers were also sparked by the play of sophomore Kyle Moore, who finished with a game-high 30 points, including 18 in the second half, on 10-of-18 shooting.

After taking an 18-point lead with 7:37 to play following a pair of free throws by Gordon, Tusculum came roaring back to move within 3, 75-72, following a three-pointer by Ryan Troutman with 4:03 to play.

Subsequently, the Commodores were able to extend their lead to 6, 79-73, following a basket by Ross Neltner with 1:42 to play. Unfortunately, the cushion was short lived, as the Pioneers scored the next six points to knot the game at 79 apiece following a three-pointer by Tusculum's Jordan Lear with 30 seconds to play.

Following the three-pointer, the Commodores let the clock run down to five seconds before getting the ball to Gordon at the top of the key, where he drove into the paint and was fouled in the act of shooting with 2.2 seconds to play. Gordon made his first free-throw attempt before missing his second. Tusculum's last-second shot from beyond halfcourt caromed off the rafters, securing Vanderbilt's win.

The competitiveness and intensity of the game boiled over in the second half, as Tusculum head coach Jim Boone received a technical foul and was ejected with 8:37 to play. Following Boone's ejection, Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings also received a technical with 5:40 to play.

In addition to leading the team in points, Gordon and Ogilvy also led the Commodores in rebounding with 7 apiece. Also scoring in double figures were seniors Ross Neltner and Alan Metcalfe, who each added 10. Vanderbilt shot 40 percent from the floor, while forcing 18 turnovers by Tusculum.

Leading 35-25 at the break, the Commodores opened the second half on fire, scoring 11 straight points on 4-of-4 shooting in addition to a free throw to expand their lead to 21, 46-25, with 17:10 to play. Ogilvy scored seven of the Commodores first 11 points of the half.

Vanderbilt's lead would be short lived, as Tusculum quickly cut into the Commodores' lead by going on a 20-8 run to pull within 9, 54-45, with 11:58 to play. Tusculum's charge was led by Moore, who scored 11 of the Pioneers' 18 points during the run.

Following the run by the Pioneers, Vanderbilt was able to expand its lead to 18, 71-53, with 7:37 to play before Tusculum came charging back again.

In the first half, Vanderbilt led from the start but was clinging to a one-point advantage, 15-14, with 9:30 to play, before a pair of free throws by Gordon spurred a 20-11 drive to end the half, giving Vanderbilt a 35-25 lead at the break.

The Commodores led by as many as 13 (35-22) during the half, while forcing 12 Tusculum turnovers. Vanderbilt was led at the break by Gordon and Ogilvy, who each poured in nine points.

3-Point Streak Concludes 20th Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 664 consecutive games entering the 2007-2008 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (667#) for the longest streak in Division I basketball.

Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (576) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Foster Joins 1,000-Point Club

Shan Foster joined the 1,000-point club with a bang, with 29 points in Vanderbilt's 74-69 win at Rice on Jan. 2.

Foster netted 26 of his 29 points in the first half, an output that nearly surpassed Rice's point total for the half of 27. For the game, Foster shot 11-of-17 from the field, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range.

The junior from Kenner, La. joined the 1,000-point club in his 78th game as a Commodore, tying Perry Wallace for 17th among the fastest players to join the elite club.

Among Commodores who played during or since the adoption of the 3-point line (1986-87), Foster is the second fastest Commodore to reach 1,000 points, behind only Billy McCaffrey. The Duke transfer joined the club after only

50 games as a Commodore.

Historic Memorial Gymnasium Begins 56th Season

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is beginning its 56th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball this season. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is reknown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last three home games against the top team in the country, most recently, an 83-70 victory over defending national champion Florida on Feb. 17. The Commodores also enter this season with a four-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster followed a Derrick Byars miss with a putback just before the buzzer as Vanderbilt topped then-No. 16 Tennessee 82-81 on Jan. 10 in Nashville.

- The Commodores have posted a 650-184 (.779) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- Vanderbilt was 14-3 in the gymnasium in 2006-07, marking the 20th time in the past 21 seasons the Commodores have won 10 or more home games.
- Vanderbilt has won 89 of its last 95 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 136-13 non-conference record at home (.913 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 69-6 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home.

Nwankwo Remains A Valued Commodore

Davis Nwankwo (Wonk-woh), a 6-10 forward from College Park, Md. and high school teammate of Georgetown's Roy Hibbert, will watch today's game from the Vanderbilt bench after a heart condition — detected following his collapse at a practice in March of 2006 — concluded his college playing career.

Nwankwo, played in 23 games, scoring 12 points and grabbing 30 rebounds during the 2005-06 season as a redshirt freshman for the Commodores.

Nwankwo was advised to give up his athletic playing career following diagnosis of an enlarged heart condition known as hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. He suffered cardiac arrest during a practice session on March 6, 2006 leading up to Vanderbilt's appearance at the SEC Tournament.

Former Vanderbilt athletic trainer Mike Meyer revived Nwankwo after administering one shock from an automated external defibrillator (AED) and two rescue breaths. For his quick and steady response Meyer later was named the "Above and Beyond" Division I Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA).

Nwankwo is believed to be only the second college athlete revived with this heart condition.

Considered a medical hardship, Nwankwo remains a student at Vanderbilt and has attended Commodore practices and all of Vanderbilt's games home and away.

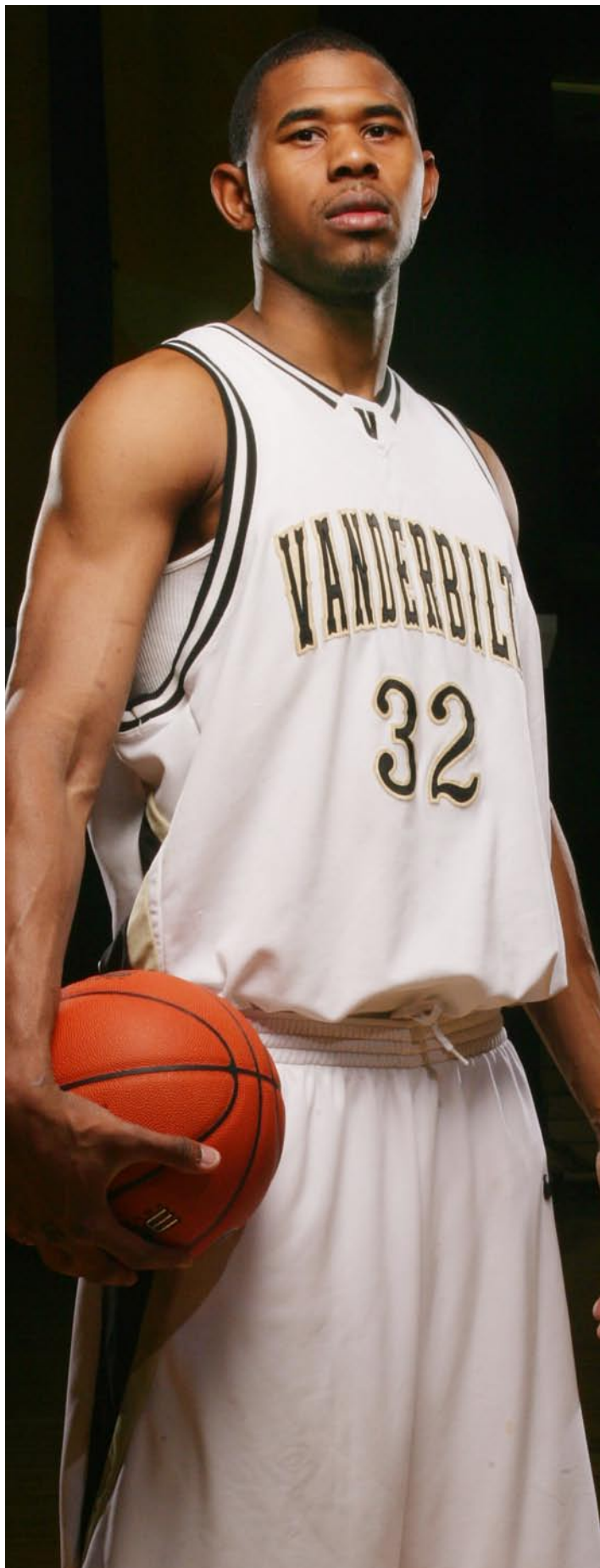
