### THIS WEEK'S MATCH-UP

The Pioneers end their three-game road trip this weekend as they travel to Nashville, Tenn., to take on SEC-power and No. 22 Vanderbilt at 6 p.m. MT on Friday. Last season, the Pioneers pulled off arguably the biggest victory in the Erik Johnson-era by defeating the Commodores 70-65 in Magness Arena.

"We were able to sneak up on them last year. It was a huge win and our first win over a ranked opponent in program history," said head coach Erik Johnson. "I don't think Vanderbilt overlooked us, they're too well coached to do that but let's just say they will have some extra motivation on Friday."

The Pioneers, who are ranked No. 20 in the latest Mid-Major poll, are off to their second 5-1 start in two decades. The 1992-93 Pioneers began their season with a 5-1 mark and went on to finish the season 24-4 and 14-0 as a member of the NCAA's Division II Colorado Athletic Conference.

the lone victory over the SEC-power on Dec. 5, 2010 in a marquee victory for head coach Erik Johnson and the Pioneers. The 70-65 victory marked the beginning of a four-game win streak in 2010-11 and was also the program's first victory over a ranked opponent.

## KNOW THE FOE: VANDERBILT

The Commodores were picked to finish fifth in the SEC Preseason coaches' poll and fourth in the media poll. Vandy comes into its match-up with the Pioneers with a perfect 7-0 mark with wins over Alabama A&M (66-55), Western Illinois (95-51), USC Upstate (88-42), Sam Houston State (79-56), Lipscomb (81-39), Oklahoma (78-66) and Austin Peay (83-51). The Commodores are averaging 84.3 points per game, while holding their opponents to just 51.4 per game. Christina Foggie leads Vandy with 14.7 points per game and a 43.0 shooting percentage from the field.

## STEALING AWAY

So far this season, the Pioneers have been dominating on the offensive end due to the defensive effort they've been showcasing on the court. Through six games, DU is averaging 10.3 steals per game and has forced 18.8 turnovers per game.

## SMITH AND WESSON

Junior Emiko Smith has continued her lethal play from the beginning of the 2011-12 season. Smith's vision and ball control has killed Denver's competition early on this season and has earned DU the top spot in the SBC in assist-to-turnover ratio. Smith is also top-40 in the year's newly released national polls for assists per game (5.6). Her stellar assist-to-turnover ratio was somewhat slighted this past weekend after UTEP isolated the ultra-quick point guard, but her 8.2 points per game and 4.2 rebounds per game is still third-best for the Pioneers this season.

## SUN BELT SHOW-OFFS

The Pioneers have been at the top of nearly every major statistical Sun Belt Conference category so far this season. Among others, they are first in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.0) and assists (14.8), second in steals (11.2) and fourth in scoring offense (62.4), scoring defense (59.4) and scoring margin (+3.0).

## MAGNESS MAGIC

The Pioneers have won more than 70 percent of their home games during the Erik Johnson era. Denver owns a 34-11 home record in Magness Arena with Johnson at the helm, which included the program's first victory over a ranked opponent as the Pioneers defeated No. 23 Vanderbilt on Dec. 5, 2010. The Pioneers have played one game since Coach Johnson's arrival in Hamilton Gymnasium, owning a 1-0 record. Overall, DU is 35-11 when playing at home.

### LAST TIME OUT

Career-nights from freshman Jordan Johnston (Waterloo, Iowa) and junior point guard Emiko Smith (Los Angeles, Calif.) helped guide the Pioneers to a 66-57 victory over Northern Colorado Wednesday night at the Butler-Hancock Sport Pavilion. The win improves the Pioneers to 5-1 and drops UNC to 4-3 on the season.

"I'm proud of the fight our girls showed tonight," said head coach Erik Johnson. "For a period there in the first half, it seemed we didn't score for a whole 10 minutes. But we were able to regroup and gain the much-needed victory."

This victory is the second-straight over the Bears as the Pioneers are now 2-1 against UNC in the Erik Johnson-era. Smith led all players with a career-high 17 points (2-of-5 from three-point), including six assists. Johnston contributed her own career-high with 13 points, all coming in the second half. A closely played first half saw two lead changes and one tie. Fortunately for the Pioneers, Murdoch and Smith were converting as the two scored a combined 14 points in the first half on 5-of-8 shooting.

Denver and UNC traded buckets again to begin the second half, as no team took a lead larger than four points for the first 14 minutes of action. Johnston and freshman Morgan Van Riper-Rose (Eden Prairie, Minn.) gave DU the energy it needed late in the second half as the two combined for 15 of DU's 41 total points in the final period. A 9-2 run for the Pioneers in the final two minutes, including five points from sophomore Quincey Noonan (Broomfield, Colo.), sealed the victory for DU. Noonan finished with a season-high 15 points.

### PRESEASON ALL-SBC SELECTION

For the third-straight season, sophomore Kaetlyn Murdoch was tabbed a preseason All-SBC selection, this time earning Co-Player of the Year honors along with Middle Tennessee's Ebony Rowe. After leading the team in scoring and ranking top-five in the nation in field-goal percentage, Murdoch is poised for an All-America 2011-12 campaign.

Junior Emiko Smith who led the Pioneers in assists last season joins Murdoch on the preseason All-SBC team. Smith hopes to emerge as one of the premier point guards in the SBC after ranking 17th in the nation in assists in 2010-11.

### PIONEERS PICKED TO FINISH FIRST

Following a trip to the 2011 Women's National Invitation Tournament last season, the University of Denver women's basketball team was selected to finish first in the SBC West Division Preseason poll, as voted on by the league's coaches. Arkansas State and Arkansas Little-Rock were projected to finish second and third respectively in the West Division, while Middle Tennessee was selected to win the SBC East.

### INCOMING RECRUITING CLASS

On Wednesday, Nov. 9, DU head coach Erik Johnson announced that Michaela Neuhaus (Lone Tree, Colo.), Kelly Preston (Waunakee, Wis.), Paige Bradley (The Woodlands, Texas) and Kailey Edwards (Broomfield, Colo.) signed National Letters of Intent to play for the Pioneers beginning in 2012-13. The Pioneers' incoming class was ranked No. 16 among mid-major schools by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz.

"We have three guards and a post coming in to join next year's team," Johnson said. "All four play our style of basketball and all are great kids. We couldn't be happier to have this group come and join us."

Space will be provided for the official radio station of the visiting team; others will be accommodated as space permits. Phone lines must be arranged for all stations in advance.

### **Directions to DU:**

Take I-25 to the South University Boulevard exit. Proceed south to the first stop light (Buchtel Boulevard). Go through the Buchtel Boulevard intersection to the next block south (Jewell Avenue). Take a right on Jewell and proceed west approximately one-half block to the east entrance to the Ritchie Center. Media parking is just east of Joy Burns Arena (the easternmost part of the Ritchie Center) in lot 401.

Denver was the only Sun Belt Conference program represented in ESPN.com's poll, and is one of two Western Athletic Conference schools. According to HoopGurlz, Bradley is a three-star guard who can stretch defenses with her shooting ability. Edwards is described as an athletic wing guard who has the ability to get to the basket, while Preston's size and length will complement DU's quickness and versatility in the backcourt.

### **HONORING DAVIS JAMES JOHNSON**

Throughout the 2011-12 season, the DU women will be wearing a "DJJ" patch on their jerseys in memory of Davis James Johnson, the four-year-old son of Coach Johnson and his wife Laura, who passed away unexpectedly on May 6, 2010 due to an undiagnosed precondition known as intestinal malrotation, which caused a catastrophic twisting of Davis's small intestine. "It has been tough because of how close he was to the team," says Coach Johnson. "They are grieving, too. This patch will be a nice way for them to show how much they care for Davis and my family." Members of the coaching staff and support staff will be wearing pins with the initials "DJJ" to show their support as well.

### **PIONEERS JOINING THE WAC**

The University of Denver has accepted an invitation to join the Western Athletic Conference (WAC), effective for the 2012-13 athletic season. The Pioneers will move from the Sun Belt Conference (SBC) to the WAC for 10 of their NCAA Division I sports programs. The Pioneers will join the WAC for men's and women's basketball, women's soccer, gymnastics, men's and women's golf, men's and women's tennis, volleyball, and women's swimming & diving.

The move to the WAC reflects the achievements of all Divisions of the University of Denver. The affiliation with the WAC will lead to increased attendance, fan interest and support, media exposure and awareness for all 17 of Denver's sports NCAA Division I programs on the national scene. The Pioneers returned to NCAA Division I in all 17 sports in 1999-2000, when they joined the SBC. Denver claimed 29 Sun Belt Conference championships and 221 All-SBC selections since 1999. Denver has enjoyed its 11-year partnership with the SBC.

## HEAD COACH ERIK JOHNSON

Erik Johnson enters his fourth season as the head coach of the University of Denver women's basketball team for the 2011-12 season, having compiled three winning

seasons for the Pioneers since his tenure began. Under Johnson's instruction, the Pioneers finished within the top three in the Sun Belt Conference West Division Standings each of his three years, and for the first time since the 2000-01 season, the team earned a trip to the postseason, taking part in the 2010-11 Basketball WNIT.

During his time at Denver, Johnson has compiled an overall record of 53-40 for a .569 winning percentage and a Sun Belt Conference record of 33-18 for a .647 winning percentage. As a head coach, he has also helped place five players on the SBC's All-Conference Teams, including Freshman of the Year and two-time All-SBC honoree Kaetlyn Murdoch. He has had four players earn SBC Player of the Week honors, three players named to the Preseason All-Conference Teams and two players honored as Sportswomen of Colorado.

Johnson's 2010-11 team finished the season ranked No. 10 in the nation and No. 1 in the Sun Belt Conference in field-goal percentage, shooting 45.7 percent from the floor. Denver also finished 25th nationally and first in the Sun Belt with a 35.8 three-point field goal percentage. Furthermore, among many notable victories for the Pioneers, was their win over No. 23 Vanderbilt, which was the first win over a top-25 opponent in program history. In the past two years, the team has ranked in the top-10 nationally in field goal percentage, and in the top-25 in three-point field goal percentage.

Beyond the court, Johnson has promoted excellence in academics. The Pioneers have placed 15 players on the SBC Honor Roll and nine players on the SBC Commissioners list since 2008. Also under Johnson's direction, the Pioneers have ranked within the top-25 of the WBCA in team GPA for the last two seasons.

Johnson graduated from the University of California-San Diego in 1994 with

## HEAD COACH ERIK JOHNSON'S COMMENTS...

On coaching and playing in marquee games...

"We have a saying on our team for big games and it goes, "If you can't get up for a game like this," and everyone puts their two fingers on their neck, "then you better check your pulse." This is what we signed up for. I love these games. I'd much rather coach against Vanderbilt, even though they're a scouting nightmare.

On the reasoning behind scheduling games of this magnitude...

"This is the level we want to be at, and if we want to be at this level you have to play at this level and you have to learn to win at this level. The reason we have CU, Oregon and Minnesota and all these teams are because that's how you get better. That's how you get ready to beat Middle Tennessee in the conference championship game and that's how you get ready to win an NCAA Tournament game.

On key contributions from freshmen...

"They've been giving us good minutes all year, the difference is we need to find a way to channel their points, especially from the perimeter and that's where Jordan Johnston came up so big against Northern Colorado. Teams are going to have a plan for Kaetlyn Murdoch, they know she is a 20-point scorer, preseason player of the year in the conference and an All-American candidate. So now they're going to make us make those shots from the perimeter, they're going to make us have multiple threats. When Emiko Smith, Quincey Noonan and Jordan have games like they had Wednesday night, now teams can't congest on our star player inside and now we have a balanced attack and I think we can be a pretty successful basketball team if we continue to do that."
