## OLE MISS QUICK HITS

- Ole Miss continued to be ranked nationally in week eight of competition, topping out in the charts at No. 16 (NCBWA, USAToday/ESPN Coaches, Perfect Game), while coming at No. 17 in Baseball America. Collegiate Baseball slid Ole Miss to 19th.
- The Rebels improved to 19-1 in non-conference games with a midweek win over Arkansas State last week.
- RHP Aaron Greenwood continued to be solid in relief, working 5.1 scoreless innings with four strikeouts and no walks.
- Greenwood retired 10 straight batters in his relief appearance at Florida on Sunday after taking the mound.
- Relief pitching was solid for the Rebels on the weekend, allowing one earned run through 12.0 IP at Florida.
- Ole Miss relievers also allowed only two-of-nine inherited runners to score for the weekend series vs. the Gators.
- Rebel baserunners came up big in the Friday night win at Florida, scoring two runs on a wild pitch and a throwing error off a sac bunt attempt. Will Jamison went 2B to home on a wild pitch and Lance Wilson went from 2B to home on a sac bunt from Jamison when the throw to third got away from the pitcher, allowing Wilson to advance safely.
- Wilson's run was the game-winning run in the 11-inning series opener against the Gators.

- Wahl makes his eighth start on the season Friday night and holds a 6-0 record with a 1.80 ERA through 45.0 IP.
- The Rebels are undefeated when Wahl starts this season, despite him taking no decision last weekend at Florida.
- In the start at UF, Wahl worked 7.1 IP, allowing 3 runs - 2 earned - with two walks and a strikeout on seven hits.
- Wahl has posted a team-leading 37 strikeouts and has walked only 19 batters in his time on the mound.

NOTING SMITH:

- Smith last made a weekend start in game two of a Sunday doubleheader against Texas A&M.
- The sophomore holds a 2-0 record with a 3.51 ERA and has 13 strikeouts with seven walks in 25.2 IP.

## REBELS vs. VANDERBILT

Ole Miss and Vanderbilt first faced each other in the 1900 season and the two teams have played each other 113 times since the first meeting that was played in Oxford at the turn of the century.

- The Rebels hold a 59-52-2 lead in the all-time series between the two teams for a .531 winning percentage.
- Under head coach Mike Bianco, the Rebels lead the series 20-15 and did not play in the 2010, 2011 seasons.
- In the Bianco era, the Rebels are 10-2 vs. Vanderbilt in Oxford with three series sweeps (2002, 2004, 2008).
- Ole Miss leads the series 30-17 all-time in games played in Oxford between the Rebels and Commodores.

**A LOOK AT VANDERBILT**

Vanderbilt enters the weekend series with an overall record of 26-4 and holds an 8-1 mark in South-eastern Conference play. The only loss came at the hands of Florida in the series opener two weeks ago. Vanderbilt is coming off a series sweep of Tennessee on three come-from-behind victories and a midweek win at Middle Tennessee State.

- Vanderbilt enters the weekend hitting at a .295 clip with 191 RBI and 15 home runs so far this season.
- Tony Kemp leads VU at the plate with a .375 average to go along with 19 RBI and is 14-of-23 on steals.
- Connor Harrell is the top run producer for Vanderbilt with five home runs and 37 RBI through 30 games.
- The VU pitching staff holds a 2.44 ERA with 260 strikeouts and 126 walks with a .211 opponent batting average.
- Friday starter Kevin Ziomeck has a complete-game shutout with a 5-1 record with 62 strikeouts and 15 walks.
- RHP Tyler Beede is 7-0 so far with 44 strikeouts, 31 walks with a 0.99 ERA and a .151 opponent batting average.

**FAST STARTS KEY REBEL SUCCESS**

Quick starts to games have been a key to Rebel success this season and played a part in the 23-6 start. Through the first four innings, Ole Miss is outscoring its opponents by a whopping 104-to-37 margin. Ole Miss is 18-1 when scoring first this season and is 12-1 when scoring in the first inning.

**ANDERSON TOUGH TO STRIKE OUT**

Through 29 games and 109 at bats this season, Austin Anderson has struck out only three times. His first strikeout came in the final at bat of the first game at #11 Arkansas, 20 games into the season. Anderson ranks first nationally in the NCAA as toughest hitter to strikeout entering the week.

**MULTIPLE-HIT AND MULTIPLE-RBI GAMES**

Stuart Turner does a little bit of everything for the Rebels and currently leads the team in multiple-hit games and multiple-RBI games. To date, Turner has posted 15 multiple-hit games and 11 multiple-RBI games. Ten Rebels have posted multiple-hit games in 2012, while 10 Rebels have also posted multiple-RBI games this season. Austin Anderson (11), Will Allen (9) and Auston Bousfield (9) behind him in multiple hit games this season.

**STREAKING REBELS TO WATCH**

It was a tough finale at the plate for the Rebels in the series against Florida, with very few players keeping hit streaks alive in the final two games against the Gators. Heading into this Tuesday night's game, six Rebels hit safely in their last game with Will Allen, Austin Anderson, Cameron Dishon, Christian Helsel, Preston Overby and Stuart Turner all looking to start new hit streaks.

**TURNER POSTS 19-GAME HIT STREAK THIS SEASON**

Junior C Stuart Turner put together a 19-game hit streak earlier this season, which was sixth all-time in Ole Miss history. The longest hit streak all-time was set by Brian Pettway across the 2004 and 2005 seasons. Pettway hit safely in the final game of 2004 and the first 27 games of 2005.

**REBELS PUT TOGETHER EFFICIENT, OPPORTUNISTIC OFFENSE**

While the Rebels are hitting at a .286 clip through seven weeks of play. It's been the efficiency and opportunistic nature of the offense that's been the big boost to the Rebels. In 16-of-29 games, the Rebels have scored a run total that came within three spots of the team's hit total for the game. In 4-of-6 losses, the Rebels have not managed near the offensive efficiency produced in those wins, while Ole Miss' opponents have produced run totals within three of their hit total for the game.

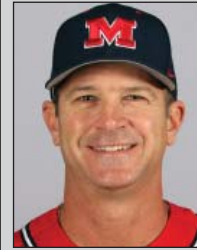
**REBELS POST BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY**

The Rebels posted a 19-1 start to the season through the first 20 games, setting the best start to a season in program history. With the Friday night win at Arkansas, the Rebels became the first team to post the 19-1 record, passing three teams that started 18-2 to the season. Ole Miss started 18-2 in 1960, 1964 and 2004.

**TURNER NAMED TO BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST**

Junior Stuart Turner has been named to the initial watch list for the 2013 Bench Award by the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission, it was announced on Monday. The Bench Award is presented annually to the nation's top catcher and the initial list is comprised of 48 players to watch.

## TEAM 114

When you look in the dugout this year, you may see a t-shirt with "Team114" printed on it and wonder what it means. The simple slogan for the team is indicative of the fact that this is the 114th team to play at Ole Miss and reminds the players that how this individual team will be remembered is up to them and how they compete each day. This team will only be together as it is for one season with veteran players departing and new players coming in next season, so each individual has to make the choices and play the game for today and this season to determine what the legacy of Team 114 will be in Rebel baseball lore.

## REBELS SWEEP FOUR STRAIGHT WEEKENDS TO OPEN SEASON

When the Rebels picked up a series sweep over Rhode Island on Sunday, February 24, it gave the Rebels series sweeps in back-to-back weekends to open the season. It's the first time the Rebels have opened the year with back-to-back series sweeps since the 2008 season when the Rebels swept Minnesota and Indiana State to open the season.

Ole Miss continued the sweeps in the third weekend of play at Florida International, sweeping the Panthers in a three-game set. The Rebels followed it up with a sweep of Lipscomb in week four. It marks the first time Ole Miss had posted four consecutive weekend sweeps to open the season since the 2004 campaign.

## THROUGH 29 GAMES IN 2012

Through 29 games in the 2012 season, the Rebels were three games behind the current pace in 2013 with a 20-9 record on the season and coming off a series-opening loss at the Kentucky Wildcats. Ole Miss was hitting at a .313 clip with 24 home runs and 189 RBI and were 26-of-36 on steal attempts. As a pitching staff, the Rebels held to a 3.11 ERA with 243 strikeouts and 57 walks while allowing 110 runs (89 earned runs). The Rebels were fielding at a .970 clip with 33 errors.

## TOP OF THE REBEL COACHING RANKS

While he is closing in on the 500 win mark at Ole Miss, Bianco hit another milestone in his coaching career during the Lipscomb series. On March 9, Bianco became the all-time wins leader at Ole Miss when he picked up his 486th coaching victory as head coach of the Rebels. With the win, Bianco passed former Rebel All-America, MLB player and head coach Jake Gibbs who posted 485 wins as head coach from 1972-1990. Bianco currently holds 494 wins as Ole Miss head coach and 594 wins for his head coaching career.

## PROMOTIONS ABOUND AT SWAYZE FIELD IN 2013

Visitors to Oxford-University Stadium this season will have plenty to look forward to besides just some of the most exciting baseball in the country. Ole Miss Marketing has gameday promotions lined up throughout the course of the season that are sure to please the crowds. Next weekend is Armed Forces Weekend against Vanderbilt honoring those who have served in our nation's military. Friday night will feature a Survival Bracelet giveaway, while Saturday will feature free car magnets to fans. Sunday's game will feature the second set of baseball cards for the 2013 season.

Junior Bobby Wahl became the most recent Rebel to find himself as a candidate for the Golden Spikes Award Watch List when he was announced as one of the 50 preseason members of the list by USA Baseball. He joins recent Rebels Alex Yarbrough (semifinalist, 2012) and Drew Pomeranz (finalist, 2010) as part of a long line of Rebel players on the watch list for the nation's top collegiate player.

## REBELS ENJOY HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE UNDER BIANCO

Ole Miss has enjoyed success on the home field under head coach Mike Bianco over the course of 13 seasons. The excitement and energy generated by Rebel fans has helped the squad post a record of 323-119-1 at Swayze Field for a .730 winning percentage in that time.

## SWAYZE TOUGH PLACE FOR TOP-RANKED FOES

Oxford-University Stadium hasn't been a kind place to the nation's top-ranked team when it comes calling under head coach Mike Bianco in recent years. The Rebels have faced the nation's top-ranked team three times in the last four seasons at home and walked away with the series win in all three meetings - vs. #1 Georgia in 2009, vs. #1 South Carolina in 2011 and vs. #1 Florida in 2012.

In fact, it's been a tough place for top-10 teams to play over the last decade. Dating back to the 2003 season, the Rebels have hosted a top-10 team in a regular season series 15 times. Ole Miss has won the series in 11-of-15 meetings.

## WAHL NAMED SEC PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Junior right-hander Bobby Wahl was named the Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Week following the opening weekend of play as he set the tone for a series sweep of the 12th-ranked Horned Frogs. It was the fourth combined shutout of Wahl's career and second over a nationally-ranked team. Wahl also posted a shutout of then No. 1 Florida in the series opener during the 2012 season in Oxford. Against TCU, Wahl worked 6.1 innings and allowed only three hits with three walks and eight strikeouts.

## TURNER DOMINANT BEHIND THE PLATE

Opposing base runners have had trouble stealing bases with Stuart Turner behind the plate this season, as the junior college transfer has thrown out 13-of-21 base runners on steal attempts this season. Turner started the season 7-for-7 on catching base stealers. Of the eight successful steal attempts against Turner, the junior catcher did not attempt a throw on the play on three of them.

## TURNER LEADS HIGHLIGHT REEL OF DEBUTS

Stuart Turner has led a highlight reel of Rebel debuts through the first four games of competition in 2013. The catcher posted a grand slam for his first hit at Ole Miss to clinch a series sweep of #12 TCU in the opening weekend. Since then, several other Rebels have had solid first outings for Ole Miss.

Freshman Matt Denny struck out four and allowed one hit in 2.0 innings of work against UT-Martin (2/20), while Brady Bramlett struck out the side in order in his 1.0 inning of work against the Skyhawks. Austin Blunt, Scott Weathersby and Jeremy Massie also turned in scoreless outings in their first appearances on the mound for the Rebels in the first full week of play.

## SWEEP OF RANKED TCU A FIRST FOR REBELS IN OPENING WEEKEND

When the Rebels posted a series sweep of #12 TCU in the opening weekend of competition this season, it was a first for the program. Ole Miss is no stranger to winning series against ranked foes, or even posting sweeps of ranked opponents, but it was the first time the Rebels had swept a ranked opponent to open the season. It was also the first sweep of a ranked foe since sweeping then No. 5 LSU in the 2010 season.

## REBELS PRODUCE MLB TALENT

The Rebels have a long tradition of producing Major League talent and connections with the highest level of professional baseball. Starting with the legendary Casey Stengel who coached Ole Miss in 1914, the Rebels have sent 39 players to the big leagues all-time. Most recently, the Rebels had four players on active rosters on opening day: Chris Coghlan (Miami), Zach Cozart (Cincinnati), Lance Lynn (St. Louis) and Seth Smith (Oakland). Two more on the 40-man roster and expected to be called up as the season progresses: Drew Pomeranz (Colorado) and Alex Presley (Pittsburgh).

Last season, the Rebels had seven players active on opening day rosters in the 2012 season leading the talent-rich SEC with players in the Major Leagues on opening day last season. Rebels in the Majors last season included: Chris Coghlan (Florida), Zack Cozart (Cincinnati), Lance Lynn (St. Louis), Matt Maloney (Minnesota), Drew Pomeranz (Colorado), Alex Presley (Pittsburgh) and Seth Smith (Oakland).

## REBELS HAVE SIX MORE DRAFTED IN 2012

The Rebels continued the trend of sending players to the professional ranks in 2012 with six players drafted in 2012 - five of whom went on to the professional ranks. Tanner Mathis, who was drafted in the 27th round by Houston, returned to Ole Miss for his senior season. It started with Alex Yarbrough (5th round - Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim) and continued with Matt Snyder (10th round - New York Yankees). Dylan Chavez (14th round - Boston), R.J. Hively (19th round - Arizona) and Zach Kirksey (29th round - Detroit) rounded out the draft picks in 2012.

## ALL-SEC PERFORMER RETURNS

Ole Miss returns an All-SEC performer from a year ago when junior right-hander Bobby Wahl takes the mound this season. Wahl posted a 7-4 record a year ago and started the season strong, going to 5-0 on the year before suffering his first loss of the season at Mississippi State. Wahl struck out 104 batters, leading all returning pitchers in the SEC this season, and finished in the top 10 of five categories last season in the SEC (ERA, Opposing Batting Average, Innings Pitched, Strikeouts and Wins).

## NEW REBELS

Ole Miss welcomes 13 newcomers to the squad for the 2013 campaign. The new faces on the squad belong to a group of five junior college transfers and eight true freshmen. That group of newcomers also includes six pitchers (3 LHP, 3RHP), a trio of catchers, three infielders and one outfielder.

## REBELS ON TV 11 TIMES IN 2013

The Rebels have been tabbed for television 11 times this year for broadcast across the Southeast and the entire United States. Ole Miss will be televised at home five times this season, while six road contests will be televised to give Rebel fans a chance to see the team away from home. The Rebels will be carried by ESPNU (3 times), CSS (3 times), Fox Sports (3 times) and Cox Sports Television (2 times).

## SEC PRESEASON POLL ANNOUNCED

The Arkansas Razorbacks were the unanimous pick to win the Southeastern Conference championship in the 2013 season in a vote of the league's coaches, the SEC office announced on Tuesday. The Razorbacks were picked to win the Western Division and the consensus choice for the regular season title. LSU was picked second in the Western Division, followed by a tight preseason poll finish between Mississippi State, Ole Miss and Texas A&M for third, fourth and fifth, respectively. Alabama and Auburn rounded out the division prediction in that order. Vanderbilt was picked to win the Eastern Division. Points are awarded on a 7-6-5-4-3-2-1 system based on predicted finish.

With one out on the board, a one-run lead and the bases loaded in the ninth TCU sent Kevin Daniels to the plate to pinch hit. Daniels connected and sent the ball to the right side of the infield where Sikes Orvis scooped the ball and threw to second for the out on the lead runner, Dylan Fitzgerald.

Austin Anderson snagged the throw from Orvis and went to throw to first when Fitzgerald slid and was called for interference, putting the third out on the board and clinching the shutout win for the Rebels.

Bobby Wahl (1-0) picked up the win, working 6.1 scoreless innings with three walks and eight strikeouts. He allowed only three hits on the afternoon.

Brandon Finnegan (0-1) took the loss as he allowed one unearned run through 6.0 innings of work with two walks and four strikeouts. Ole Miss tallied five hits off Finnegan in the outing.

"It looked like a Friday night in the SEC tonight," said Ole Miss head coach Mike Bianco. "We had two aces really battling it out. Bobby (Wahl) was sensational tonight. (Brandon) Finnegan really matched him pitch for pitch. He's a tough guy to face to start the season. We were able to manufacture a run. Sikes (Orvis) had a great at bat and base running. I'm proud of (Brett) Huber for hanging in there. You come out there to save the game, and you throw the ball in the strike zone like you're supposed to. He shows why he is the all-time saves leader."

TCU threatened early with a double to open the game and put a second man on with a one-out walk, but Wahl responded with back-to-back strikeouts to squelch the rally. Both pitchers quickly found a groove and its came at a premium for the whole night and both teams managed only three base runners through the first four innings of play.

The fifth inning saw fortunes change, as Orvis reached on a single up the middle to lead things off before taking second on a groundout to third from Andrew Mistone. A passed ball advanced Orvis to third before he came home to score when Will Jamison put down a squeeze bunt to put the Rebels on the board.

TCU looked to make a move in the next half inning, getting a lead-off single to left to start the sixth, but a double play ended any hope of a rally and the Rebels held on to the lead.

Ole Miss would threaten again in the bottom half of the sixth, loading the bases with one out, only to have Finnegan work out of the jam and keep the score at 1-0 in favor of the home team.

Neither team would threaten again until the Horned Frogs loaded the bases in the ninth inning with an error, a bunt single and an intentional walk before Ole Miss got out of the jam and seized the win.

Will Jamison then lay down a sac bunt, but the pitcher threw the ball away allowing one run to score and Allen and Jamison to move into scoring position. Overbey then singled down the third base line to drive in two more runs before the Warhawks would get out of the inning.

ULM got on the board in the fifth inning when Jeff Fuller singled up the middle to drive in Dalton Herrington from third. Herrington reached on a double to right and stole third to set up the score on the Fuller hit. The Rebels led 5-1 after the fifth.

Ole Miss added to the lead in the sixth with a three-RBI double from Austin Anderson. The hit took his active streak out to 12 games, one game shy of Turner's team-leading 13-game hit streak that was also extended earlier in the evening.

The Warhawks got two runs back in the seventh inning, capitalizing on a pair of miscues to cut into the Rebel lead. A walk and a double started for the home team as the Rebels made a pitching change and brought in left-hander Matt Denny to relieve Laxer.

Denny got a groundball to short, but a throwing error allowed the batter to reach as a run came home and left men at the corners with one out. A wild pitch to the next batter brought a second run home in the inning and moved Chris Dudley, who reached on the error, to second base. Dudley then stole second before a sac fly to center cut the lead to 8-4.

The Rebels got out of the inning still in front by four runs when Denny struck out the next batter to end the seventh.

Ole Miss got a chance to extend the lead again in the eighth, loading the bases with one out. The Warhawks would win the chess match of pitching changes and pinch hitters, however, and get out of the inning without surrendering a run.

The Rebels would return the favor, holding ULM off the board the rest of the way while adding a pair of runs in the ninth on doubles from Bousfield and Holt Perdsock to give Ole Miss the 10-4 victory.

MONROE, La. — Jake Overbey delivered a big two-out, two-RBI double in the eighth inning to give the Rebels some wiggle room as No. 6 Ole Miss (18-1) defeated ULM (8-9) by a score of 8-3 to close out a midweek series.

With the win, the Rebels tied the best start to a season in the Bianco era, matching the 18-1 start set by the 2004 squad. Stuart Turner and Austin Anderson extended their hit streaks to 14 and 13 games, respectively. Turner went 3-for-5 with two runs scored, while Anderson went 1-for-3 with two walks. Jake Overbey made the most of his one at-bat, fighting back from an 0-2 count to deliver the two-RBI double that took the game from a one-run contest in the eighth and put it comfortably in the hands of the Rebels.

Bramlett (3-0) picked up the win, working 5.0 innings and striking out a season-high nine batters. He allowed two runs on three hits with three walks.

Jared Dye (1-2) suffered the loss for the Warhawks as he allowed four runs — three of them earned — on eight hits with two walks and two strikeouts.

The Warhawks struck first in the Wednesday night contest, pushing home a run in the first inning on a groundout to short from Justin Stawychyn. ULM got off to a good start with a walk and a double to open the home half of the first before Bramlett would get a strikeout for the first out. The Stawychyn grounder gave Ole Miss the second out, but put a run on the board for the Warhawks as the Rebels traded the out for the run.

ULM added a second run in the inning on a wild pitch before Bramlett would coax another groundout to end the inning with the Rebels trailing 2-0.

Ole Miss erased the deficit in the second inning with three straight hits to open the frame. A single from Turner and a double to the wall in right from Mistone put two men in scoring position before Sikes Orvis singled up the middle to bring them both home. The Rebels would go on to load the bases, but were unable to get another run home as ULM squashed the rally with three consecutive outs.

Ole Miss moved in front in the third inning on back-to-back hits from Turner and Mistone for the second consecutive inning. Turner came up with a one-out single before Mistone doubled to right center, allowing Turner to score from first. The Rebel third baseman was thrown out at third trying to stretch the hit into a triple for the second out. ULM would strike out the next Rebel batter to end the inning, but Ole Miss held the 3-2 lead.

The Rebels extended the lead to two runs in the fifth inning on an RBI single up the middle from Austin Anderson. Auston Bousfield reached on a fielding error in the previous at bat, sending a fly ball to shallow left center that was dropped, allowing him to reach and take second on the play to set up the RBI hit for Anderson.

The Warhawks cut the lead to one in the sixth inning when Logan Fiasco successfully lay down a sac bunt to bring home Chris Dudley. Dudley reached on a single up the middle and then went first to third on a single to left field in the next at bat to set up the score on the Fiasco bunt.

The Warhawks threatened again in the seventh, getting a man to third with one out. The Rebels squashed the rally with a foul fly snagged by Turner against the backstop and a groundball to short to strand the runner and keep Ole Miss in front 4-3.

Ole Miss responded with a successful two-out rally in the eighth on a two-RBI double to the wall in right center from the younger Overbey that put the Rebels on top 6-3. Tanner Mathis extended the lead with a single to right to bring Overbey home and Ole Miss was on top by four runs after the top of the eighth.

The Rebels added a final run in the ninth inning when Mistone hit into a fielder's choice that brought Anderson home from third. Anderson reached on a walk before moving to third on a single up the middle from Turner to get into scoring position for Mistone. The run provided the Rebels with the 8-3 final margin of victory.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — Sixth-ranked Ole Miss (19-1, 1-0 SEC) posted the best start in program history on Friday night, using 10 hits and a pair of long balls to defeat No. 11 Arkansas (13-6, 0-1 SEC) by a score of 7-1 in the conference opener at Baum Stadium.

Ole Miss had previously started a season 18-2 through the first 20 games in 1960, 1964 and 2004.

Preston Overbey went 2-for-4 on the night with a second-inning grand slam to power the Rebels to the early lead. Sikes Orvis then helped extend things in the fifth with his first home run of the season, a solo shot, that helped spark a three-run innings as Ole Miss took the 7-1 lead that would hold for the final margin of victory.

Bobby Wahl (5-0) picked up the win, allowing one run on three hits with five walks and five strikeouts through 7.0 innings of work. It was the longest outing of the season for the junior right-hander.

Trey Killian (2-2) took the loss as the freshman allowed seven runs on five hits with two walks through 3.0 innings of work. He did not strike out a batter in the start.

Arkansas struck first turning a lead-off double into a run in the first inning to take the early lead on the Rebels. Jacob Mahan doubled down the third base line to start things off and took third on a groundout to second from Dominic Fiocciello. He then scored when Tyler Spoon singled to left center to give the Razorbacks the 1-0 edge.

Ole Miss responded in a big way in the top of the second, loading the bases with two outs before Preston Overbey delivered a grand slam to left. A one-out single from Andrew Mistone put the first man on, before a two-out single from Will Allen and a walk of Will Jamison would load the bases. Overbey then took the 2-1 pitch and sent it deep over the wall in left field to put Ole Miss on top 4-1.

Arkansas threatened in the bottom of the inning by loading the bases with two outs, but the Rebels got out of the inning with no damage on a fly ball to center to end the attempted rally by the Razorbacks.

Ole Miss extended the lead in the fourth, kicking things off with a solo home run from Orvis to start the inning before plating two more runs down the stretch. Following the lead-off shot from the Rebel first baseman, Allen and Jamison again reached on a single and a walk to put two men on. A wild pitch moved both into scoring position to set up an RBI groundout from Tanner Mathis and a double to left from Auston Bousfield to take the lead to 7-1.

Wahl continued to hold the Razorbacks off the board through the seventh inning, allowing only three base runners total from the third through the seventh. Scott Weathersby then took the mound to finish out the game, pitching the eighth and ninth with one walk, three strikeouts and did not allow a hit.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — A day after using the long ball to pick up a win in the series opener, small ball and miscues did in the Rebels as No. 6 Ole Miss (19-2, 1-1 SEC) fell to No. 11 Arkansas (14-6, 1-1 SEC) by a score of 10-1.

Ole Miss got nine hits on the afternoon, paced by a 3-for-4 day from Auston Bousfield, but the Rebels were never able to string hits together to answer Arkansas runs. The loss ended the weekend series at a game each after Ole Miss won the first game 7-1 on Friday night.

Mike Mayers (2-1) suffered the loss for the Rebels, allowing seven runs — five of them earned — on nine hits with three walks and five strikeouts through 5.1 innings of work.

Randall Fant (1-1) picked up the win as he held the Rebels to one run on seven hits with five strikeouts through 6.0 innings on the mound.

For the second straight day, the Razorbacks struck first with a single run in the first inning. A lead-off walk put Jacob Mahan on base before a sac bunt and a groundout would move him to third. Mahan then scored on a ground ball to first when it was ruled that Mayers missed the bag with his foot for the third out, allowing the batter to reach and the run to score. The Rebels ended the inning with a groundout back to the mound but trailed 1-0.

Brady Bramlett (4-0) picked up the win in relief, working 1.2 scoreless innings with a strikeout and got the Rebels out of a tight spot in the sixth to allow Ole Miss the chance to rally.

Bramlett entered the game with one out and men at second and third with Arkansas State already having pushed two runs home in the inning to take the 4-2 lead. The right-hander got Alex Potts to hit a grounder to first and the Rebels turned a 3-6-5 double play to erase the two lead runners and get out of the inning with no more damage.

The freshman was then retired all three batters faced in the sixth before Ole Miss rallied in the seventh to take the lead for good.

Seth McWilliams (3-5) suffered the loss for Arkansas State, entering the game in the sixth inning and getting the Red Wolves out of a bases-loaded jam, but surrendered the lead in the seventh. McWilliams allowed five runs on four hits with a walk and two strikeouts to take the loss.

Ole Miss scored first, pushing a run home in the first inning on a sac fly from Stuart Turner only to see Arkansas State answer with a pair of runs in the second inning move in front of the home team.

The Rebels answered in the bottom of the frame, tying the game with a two-out single from Preston Overbey that brought Sikes Orvis home from second base. Orvis had reached on a single to center and moved to second on a balk to set up the tying run on the Overbey hit.

Arkansas State grabbed the lead again with the two-run sixth inning. The Red Wolves capitalized on a single and a throwing error on a sac bunt attempt to put two men in scoring position. Arkansas State then used a pair of RBI singles to left to bring the two runs home before Ole Miss would bring in Bramlett and get out of the inning down only two runs.

The Rebels then posted the five-run seventh inning to reclaim the lead and added three more runs in the eighth to grab the 10-4 victory.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. — The Rebel offense took advantage of chances and manufactured runs on Friday night as No. 11 Ole Miss (23-4, 4-3 SEC) picked up a 4-3 win over Florida (11-16, 2-5 SEC) in 11 innings at McKethan Stadium.

In his homecoming, junior Will Allen delivered the big hit in the top of the 11th with a leadoff double to set up the go-ahead score for the Rebels. Following the hit to left center, Lance Wilson entered the game to run for Allen.

Ole Miss' Will Jamison put down a sac bunt to move Wilson to third, but Florida relief pitcher scooped and misplaced the throw, allowing Wilson to slide in safely and then come home as the ball scooted away from the Gators' third baseman and Ole Miss took the 4-3 lead.

Brett Huber then picked up his seventh save of the season, closing out the game for the Rebels in the 11th as Ole Miss picked up the win in the series opener.

Aaron Greenwood (3-0) picked the win in relief as he worked 2.0 innings with one hit and a strikeout after entering the game with a man on and no outs in the ninth.

Florida closer Johnny Maglozzi (2-1) took the loss, working the final 2.2 innings but surrendered the winning run, albeit an unearned run because of the throwing error on the Jamison bunt.

Florida put together an eighth inning rally with a one-out double from Taylor Gushue that sent the Rebels to the bullpen for Bailey. A chop grounder to third died on the infield to put men at first and second before a bloop single to shallow center brought Gushue and tied the game at three.

Ole Miss would get out of the inning with a groundout and a strikeout from reliever Matt Denny to keep things tied at three heading to the ninth.

The Rebels moved back into the lead in the 11th when Lance Wilson came home on a throwing error by the pitcher off a sac bunt from Jamison. Wilson, who had gone to third on the sac bunt attempt, came home when the throw to the bag was off and scored to put Ole Miss in front 4-3.
