SEC OPENER

Ole Miss (1-1, 0-0) vs. Vanderbilt (1-1, 0-1)



DATE: Saturday, September 15, 2007

TIME: 6 p.m. CT

SITE (CAPACITY): Vanderbilt Stadium (39,773); Nashville, Tenn.

TV: The game will be offered as a live pay-per-view telecast through TeleSouth Communications. Persons wishing to purchase the telecast should contact their local cable and satellite providers for availability. A CSS replay of the game will be Sunday at 1 p.m.

RADIO: Ole Miss Radio Network (David Kellum, play-by-play; Pete Cordelli, color analyst; Stan Sandroni, sideline reporter). XM Satellite Radio channel 114 (Vanderbilt broadcast).

POLLS: Neither team appears in the top-25 rankings.

SERIES INFO: This game will be the 82nd meeting between Ole Miss and Vanderbilt dating back to 1894. The Rebels lead the series 46-33-2 and have won 12 of the last 14 meetings since 1992, including last year's 17-10 victory in Oxford. The Commodores hold a 25-20-2 lead in games played in Nashville, although the Rebels have won five of the last six meetings at Vanderbilt Stadium. The Dores took the last meeting in Nashville, 31-23 in 2005 (*see All-Time Series Results and Last Five Meetings on page 2*).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR: The game at Vanderbilt will mark the Rebels' 2007 Southeastern Conference opener ... Ole Miss is looking to snap a streak of three straight losses in SEC openers ... The average margin of victory in the last eight meetings with Vanderbilt is 5.9 with a pair of overtime games ... This game fea-

tures the SEC's leading tacklers in Rebel junior LB Ashlee Palmer and VU sophomore DB D.J. Moore, each averaging 12.0 stops per game ... Ole Miss and Vanderbilt are one and two in the conference in fewest penalty yards at 33.0 and 39.5 ypg, respectively ... In his first two starts, Rebel QB Seth Adams has thrown for 506 yards and four touchdowns with only one interception.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH ED ORGERON: Ed Orgeron (Northwestern State, 1984) is in his third season as the Ole Miss head coach, having been hired on Dec. 16, 2004. He has a career coaching record of 8-17. Ole Miss is Orgeron's first career head coaching position, although he possesses over 20 years of college coaching experience, most recently as an assistant head coach on USC's 2003 and 2004 national champion teams. Orgeron is 1-1 against Vanderbilt.

VANDERBILT HEAD COACH BOBBY JOHNSON: Bobby Johnson (Clemson, 1972) is in his sixth year as the head coach of the Commodores. He is 16-44 at Vanderbilt and has a career mark of 76-80 in his 14th season as a collegiate head coach. Prior to coming to Vanderbilt, Johnson spent eight seasons at Division I-AA Furman, guiding the Paladins to a 60-36 record with four trips to the Division I-AA playoffs. Johnson is 2-3 against Ole Miss.

VANDERBILT SCOUTING REPORT: After beginning the year with a 41-17 route of Richmond, Vanderbilt opened SEC play last Saturday with a 24-10 setback to Alabama. The Commodores first four games of the season are in Nashville. The VU offense is averaging 339.0 yards per game, including 229.5 through the air. Junior QB Chris Nickson is leading the attack again

this year, completing 24 of 44 passes for 351 yards and four TDs with one interception. Two-time All-SEC WR Earl Bennett is easily the primary target with 17 grabs for 275 yards and three scores. No other Commodore receiver has more than three catches. Handling the rushing load is junior Jeff Jennings and senior Cassen Jackson-Garrison. Jennings has 20 rushes for 99 yards and a TD, while Jackson-Garrison has picked up 50 yards on 13 carries. The Commodore defense is allowing 185.0 yards on the ground and 155.5 in the passing game. Sophomore DB D.J. Moore is tied for the SEC lead in tackles at 12.0 per game and averages 11.5 solos with two pass break-ups and an interception. Junior LB Jonathan Goff was a second team All-SEC pick last year and boasts 16 total tackles and an interception this season. DEs Curtis Gatewood and Steven Stone have each notched 10 stops and three TFLs. Junior K Bryant Hahnfeldt has connected on three of four field goals and all six PAT attempts.

PREVIOUS MEETINGS

September 17, 2005 - Ole Miss 17, Vanderbilt 10 at Oxford
BenJarvus Green-Ellis ran for 101 yards and two second-quarter TDs and Charles Clark had a game-saving interception in a 17-10 Ole Miss victory. Vandy QB Chris Nickson was 11-of-13 for 95 yards and directed the 'Dores to their only TD before leaving late in the first half with an ankle injury. Ole Miss LB Rory Johnson had 16 tackles, forced three fumbles and broke up a pass.

September 17, 2005 - Vanderbilt 31, Ole Miss 23 at Nashville
Jay Cutler threw for 314 yards and ran for another 58, leading Vanderbilt to a 31-23 victory over Ole Miss. Vanderbilt came into its home opener after winning two road games and looked ready to rout the Rebels, leading 24-3 at half. But Ole Miss scored 20 straight points in the second half and had a chance to tie the game after Mike Espy's 51-yard punt return for a touchdown.

September 18, 2004 - Ole Miss 26, Vanderbilt 23 (OT) at Oxford
Jonathan Nichols drilled a 35-yard field goal in overtime as the Rebels scored 16 unanswered points to rally for a 26-23 victory over Vanderbilt. QB Ethan Flatt was 4-of-4 for 39 yards to engineer a 10-

56-yard drive that resulted in Nichols' 34-yard field goal with 2:23 remaining in regulation to tie the game at 23-23. RB Vashon Pearson netted 111 yards on 17 carries, including a 54-yard TD run that gave the Rebels a 10-3 lead. After Pearson's TD run, Vanderbilt scored 20 straight points to build a 23-10 lead with 7:20 left in the third quarter, when the Rebels began their comeback.

August 30, 2003 - Ole Miss 24, Vanderbilt 21 at Nashville
Jonathan Nichols' 54-yard FG with 3:52 left capped 10 unanswered points by Ole Miss as the Rebels rallied for a 24-21 win in the season opener. Vanderbilt took a 21-14 lead early in the fourth quarter before the Rebels tied it on Eli Manning's 23-yard TD pass to Mike Espy with 9:53 remaining.

September 21, 2002 - Ole Miss 45, Vanderbilt 38 at Oxford
Junior RB Ronald McClendon scored on a 23-yard run with 3:12 remaining to lift Ole Miss to a 45-38 win, after the Commodores had rallied for 21 straight points to erase a 38-17 deficit entering the fourth quarter. QB Eli Manning threw for 386 yards on 24-of-41 passing with two TDs.

PRACTICES: All Ole Miss practices are closed to the media and public, unless announced otherwise. Head coach Ed Orgeron will be available to media after each practice.

OLE MISS ON THE INTERNET: For updated statistics, rosters, game notes and depth chart on the internet, go to the official Ole Miss athletics website at OleMissSports.com.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS: Working space in Ole Miss' Vaught-Hemingway Stadium press box will be allotted on the following basis: (1) Daily newspapers covering for Sunday publication and television stations covering for weekend news programs; (2) Sports editors of Mississippi daily newspapers; (3) Radio personnel for an originating broadcast; (4) Official school daily, one seat only; (5) Television sports directors and approved special coverage; (6) Press and TV working photographers. Weekly press representatives, non-broadcasting radio representatives and on-line services **MAY NOT** be accommodated because of space limitations. We ask that you write early, on company letterhead, to acquire working credentials for Ole Miss home games. If time permits, we will mail your passes. If not, they will be available at the Vaught-Hemingway Stadium media "Will Call" table next to the press box elevators.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCES: Ole Miss head coach Ed Orgeron will hold a press conference/teleconference at the IPF team meeting room Mondays starting at 11:30 a.m. (CT). In addition, Orgeron is on the SEC teleconference each Wednesday at 11:49 a.m. Contact the conference office for phone number, and replays are available on SECSports.com.

REBEL NOTEBOOK

- Ole Miss is 30-40-3 in SEC openers ... The Rebels are 14-25-3 in SEC openers on the road ... The last league-opening win came in 2003 in Nashville, 24-21 over the Commodores.
- The Rebels are five wins short of 600 ... The program boasts an all-time record of 595-453-35 (.566 winning percentage).
- This is the 113th football season at The University of Mississippi dating back to 1893 ... Ole Miss did not field teams in 1897 due to an epidemic of yellow fever, and also in 1943 when football was abolished at all Mississippi state-supported institutions by the Board of Trustees.
- Ole Miss returned 44 lettermen and 18 starters from last year's squad.

DEBUTS: Ole Miss has had 14 players make their Rebel debuts this year, including five true freshmen in **Colby Arceneaux** (DB), **Lionel Breaux** (DB), **Johnny Brown** (DB), **Fon Ingram** (DB) and **Chris**

Strong (LB). Other players seeing their first action this fall include **Christian Albarracian** (Sr., K); **Derrick Davis** (RFr., RB); **Tony Fein** (Jr., LB); **Reggie Hicks** (RFr., RB); **Ashlee Palmer** (Jr., LB); **Jamie Phillips** (So., LB); **Justin Sparks** (So., P); **Allen Walker** (RFr., LB) and **Josh Zettergren** (Sr., WR).

FIRST-TIME STARTERS: **Tony Fein** (Jr., LB) earned his first career start against Missouri. Below lists those Rebels that have made their first starts this year.

CAPTAINS: Serving as captains for Saturday's Missouri game were **Jamarca Sanford** (Jr., DB); **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** (Sr., RB) and **Dustin Mouzon** (Sr., DB).

HARDY'S EVERYWHERE: Sophomore **Greg Hardy** continues to put his versatility on display. As a receiver, he recorded his third career touchdown Saturday against Mizzou on a three-yard pass from Seth Adams. It marked the third game in a row for Hardy to notch a TD, dating back to the Mississippi State game in 2006. As a defensive end, Hardy is leading the team in TFLs with four and is tied for second in total tackles with 20. Last year, he was a First Team Freshman All-American D lineman in the fall and later competed in 15 games with the Ole Miss basketball team, earning a start at LSU.

GREEN-ELLIS' CAREER DAY: **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** followed up his 79-yard performance at Memphis with a monster day against Mizzou. The senior tailback went over 200 yards for the first time in his career, finishing with a career-high 226 yards on 33 carries with a touchdown. It was the sixth-most yards on the ground in school history. It also marked Green-Ellis' fifth career game with at least 100 yards and thrust him into second in the SEC in rushing after week two at 152.5 per game.

ADAMS CONTINUES STRONG START: After being named the starter eight days before the season opener, senior QB **Seth Adams** has impressed in the first two games. In Memphis, he turned in the Rebels' first 200-yard passing performance since 2005, and against Missouri, he registered the team's first 300-yard outing since 2004. On Saturday, Adams finished 23-of-41 for 305 yards with three TDs and one interception. He currently ranks third in the SEC in passing yards per game (253.0 ypg) and total offense (249.5 ypg) and sixth in passing efficiency (134.8). A 6-foot-4, 225-pounder from Holly Springs, Miss., Adams walked on at Ole Miss in January of 2006 after transferring from Hinds (Miss.) Community College and appeared in six games last season as Brent Schaeffer's back-up, completing 17-of-31 passes for 177 yards. He is now on scholarship.

OTHER OFFENSIVE NOTES

- The Rebels' 534 total yards against Missouri was the most in the **Ed Orgeron** era, and the most since 567 total yards against Wyoming in 2004 ... Ole Miss and Mizzou combined for 1,093 total yards, the most since the 2003 Texas Tech game, when the two teams totaled 1,291 yards.
- The Missouri game marked the first time since the 2004 Wyoming game that Ole Miss has had a 100-yard rusher (**BenJarvus Green-Ellis**, 226) and 100-yard receiver (**Mike Wallace**, 136) ... In that game Vashon Pearson had 133 yards rushing and Mario Hill had 142 yards receiving.
- Junior WR **Mike Wallace** had career highs of 136 receiving yards on 7 receptions with a TD against Missouri ... The 136 receiving yards are the most by a Rebel since Mario Hill had 187 against Memphis in 2005.
- Wallace's 68-yard TD catch on Saturday was the longest reception of his career, and marked his third career TD ... It marked the longest pass since a 77-yard touchdown throw from Eli Manning to Chris Collins in the 2002 Mississippi State game.
- Sophomore WR **Shay Hodge** notched his first career touchdown, a five-yard catch from Seth Adams in the second quarter of the Saturday's game ... Hodge finished with a career-high five receptions, going for 47 yards.
- For the second straight game, sophomore WR **Marshay Green** matched his career best of five receptions ... His 57 receiving yards was two short of his high of 59 also in the season opener ... Including 146 kick return yards, Green tallied 208 all-purpose yards against the Tigers.
- Ole Miss returned 23 letterwinners on offense, including nine starters ... The only starters lost were OG Andrew Wicker and TE Lawrence Lilly.
- The Ole Miss line has four of five starters back from last year, including all-star honorees **Michael Oher** and **John Jerry** ... The Rebel roster boasts a total of 74 career starts on the O line.

- The receiving corps returns players who accounted for 130 of the team's 134 receptions in 2006 ... Four of the five on the receiving depth chart are sophomores, while junior **Mike Wallace** was the club's leading receiver a season ago with 24 grabs for 410 yards and two TDs.

PALMER LEADS SEC: With just two D1 games under his belt, junior LB **Ashlee Palmer** is tied for the SEC lead in tackles per game with a 12.0 average. A JUCO transfer from Compton, Calif., Palmer topped the team with 12 tackles, including three TFLs, and notched an interception in the season opener against Memphis. He followed up with 12 stops with seven solos and a pass break-up in Saturday's Mizzou game.

OTHER DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Junior DB **Jamarca Sanford** led the team with career highs of 13 tackles and eight solo stops against Missouri ... It marked his third career game with double-digit tackles.
- Sophomore DB **Kendrick Lewis** notched a career-best nine tackles against Mizzou ... He is averaging 8.5 tackles and 5.0 solos per game.
- Sophomore LB **Jamie Phillips** was credited with his first tackles in a Rebel uniform on Saturday, posting five total stops.
- In his first start, junior LB **Tony Fein** registered four tackles, including three solos.
- In the win over Memphis, the Rebels intercepted four passes for the first time since the 2004 Wyoming game ... Ole Miss totaled three interceptions the entire 2006 season.
- The Rebels returned 18 letterwinners and six starters on defense ... All four starters are back on the defensive line.
- Ole Miss has some experience in the defensive backfield with 32 career starts between **Jamarca Sanford's** 17 nods at strong safety, **Nate Banks' 12** starts at cornerback and **Terrell Jackson's** one start

as a nickle back. However, the Rebels graduated three DBs that accounted for 77 career starts.

SPECIALTY NOTES

- Sophomore **Marshay Green** notched career highs of six kickoff returns for 146 yards in the Mizzou game.
- Junior **Mike Wallace** had his longest career kick return with a 21 yarder against the Tigers.
- Ole Miss has yet to have a true punt return through the first two games ... Of Missouri's five punts on Saturday, two were touchbacks, two were fair catches and one was downed.
- Ole Miss blocked a punt for a TD at Memphis for the first time since 1995's Indiana State game (LeMay Thomas' 6-yard TD off Mark Smith's block) ... Sophomore DB **Kendrick Lewis** scored the first TD of his career ... Junior DB **Jamarca Sanford** blocked a punt for the first time in his career.
- Ole Miss returns several key positions on special teams in kicker **Joshua Shene**, punter/holder **Rob Park** and long snapper **Preston Powers**. In addition, **Marshay Green** handled all 20 punt returns, while 29 of the 43 kick returns were taken by returnees.
- Sophomore **Marshay Green** ranked second in the SEC in kick return yardage last year (25.2 avg.) and fourth in punt return yardage (14.7 avg.).

Both OL **Thomas Eckers** and DL **Jeremy Garrett** have completed their B.B.A in management, and TE **Robert Hough** has his B.S in criminal justice.

OLE MISS VS. SEC EAST

- Since the SEC started divisional play in 1992, Ole Miss is 25-19 versus the SEC Eastern Division.
- Entering the game with Vanderbilt, the Rebels have won 10 of their last 15 games versus the SEC East, dating back to Ole Miss' 45-38 win over Vanderbilt to open the 2002 SEC portion of the schedule.
- Last year, Ole Miss was 1-2 against SEC East opponents, defeating Vanderbilt 17-10 and falling to

REBELS ON WATCH LISTS: Three Rebels have been named to preseason watch lists for some of college football's most prestigious awards. Junior **Michael Oher** has been listed as an early candidate for both the Rotary Lombardi Award and the Outland Trophy. The Lombardi

Award recognizes the nation's top lineman, while the Outland Trophy honors the best interior lineman. Senior **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** was named to Watch Lists for the Maxwell Award, which is presented to the outstanding collegiate football player in America, and the Doak Walker Award as the top running back. Senior **Corey Actis** was in the field of 54 on the updated Watch List for the Dave Rimington Trophy, which is in its eighth year of recognizing the most outstanding Center in the country.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD: DL **Jeremy Garrett** has been selected as the 2007 recipient of the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a rising senior defensive player each year. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away on May 6, 1991. Garrett, who wears No. 54, will have the honor of wearing a "38" patch on his jersey during his senior campaign. Mullins wore No. 38 as a player at Ole Miss.

SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior DB **Dustin Mouzon** was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 3 following his performance against Memphis. He is the first Rebel to earn weekly honors by the league since LB Rory Johnson following last year's Vanderbilt game. Against the Tigers, Mouzon intercepted two passes and returned the second 99 yards for his first career TD. He became the first Rebel with two interceptions in the same game since Von Hutchins against Arkansas State in 2002. Mouzon had only one pick previously in his career. He also collected a career-high six solo stops and recovered a fumble against the Tigers.

RECORD RETURN: Junior DB **Dustin Mouzon** tied the third-longest interception return in school history with his 99-yard TD at Memphis. It was the longest by a Rebel since Louis Guy's 103-yard return in a 19-6 win over Tennessee en route to Ole Miss' only undefeated season in 1962. The Rebels' last interception return for a score was Trumaine McBride's 48-yarder in the 2004 LSU game.

GREEN-ELLIS AIMS ALL-AMERICAN SEASON: **BenJarvus Green-Ellis** is coming off a 2006 campaign in which he earned first team All-SEC honors. Green-Ellis topped Ole Miss in rushing in all 12 games with a career-high 135 in the Rebels' loss to Georgia. Green-Ellis posted his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season with 116 yards on 14 carries in Ole Miss' win over Northwestern State. He ranked second in the SEC with 83.3 yards per game. With 1,000 yards in 12 games, the New Orleans native became Ole Miss' first 1,000-yard rusher since Deuce McAllister recorded 1,082 yards on 212 rushes during the 1998 season. During the 112 years of Ole Miss football, the Rebels have only had three players go over 1,000 yards rushing in Green-Ellis (1,000 yards in 2006) McAllister (1,082 yards in 1998) and Kayo Dottley (1,355 yards in 1949 and 1,057 yards in 1950).

CLOSE CALLS: The Rebels are coming off a 4-8 campaign that came so close to being 8-4. Ole Miss lost four games by six points or less, including two in overtime at Alabama and LSU. The Rebels suffered a five-point setback to Georgia and a six-point decision to Auburn. Eight of the 12 opponents in 2006 went to bowl games.

SOPHOMORE STUDS: Ole Miss is looking for a handful of talented sophomores to build on strong rookie years. Four Rebel freshmen received All-America honors in 2006. Defensive linemen **Greg Hardy** and **Marcus Tillman** were both named first team freshman All-Americans by Rivals.com and second team selections by Scout.com. Offensive lineman **John Jerry** and kicker **Joshua Shene** were both honored as first team freshman All-Americans by Scout.com and second team picks by Rivals.com.

NEWCOMERS THROWN INTO ACTION: During the 2006 season, 22 members of the 2006 signing class saw game action, including 17 true freshmen. Ole Miss tied for second in the country with its 17 true freshmen seeing action. Temple had 19 first-year players see action and Illinois also fielded 17.

BIG SHOES TO FILL: The Rebels lost all three starters in the linebacking corps and are replacing a pair currently in the NFL ranks in **Patrick Willis** and **Rory Johnson**. A consensus All-American, Willis is the most decorated defensive player in Rebel football history. The 2006 Butkus Award and Lambert Trophy winner completed his four-year Ole Miss career by leading the Rebels in tackles his final two seasons, including 137 during his senior campaign. Willis also led the Southeastern Conference in tackles both years and was a two-time SEC Defensive Player of the Year.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Ole Miss are facing seven teams that went to bowl games last year, including BSC national Champion Florida. In addition, the Rebels encounter Missouri (Sun), Georgia (Peach), Alabama (Independence), Arkansas (Capitol One), Auburn (Cotton) and LSU (Sugar).
- For the second straight year, Ole Miss plays seven home games, hosting Missouri (Sept. 8), Florida (Sept. 22), Louisiana Tech (Oct. 6), Alabama (Oct. 13), Arkansas (Oct. 20), Northwestern State (Nov. 3) and LSU (Nov. 17).

OLE MISS IN SEPTEMBER

- Ole Miss is 139-69-7 (.663 winning pct.) all-time during the month of September.
- The Rebels are 43-34-1 (.558 winning pct.) in

September SEC games, including a 11-6 (.647 winning percentage) record in games played in Oxford.

- Ole Miss is 96-35-6 (.723 winning pct.) all-time versus non-conference opponents during the month.
- The Rebels have an all-time mark of 52-44-4 (.540 winning pct.) in road games during September.
- Ole Miss is 87-25-3 (.770 winning pct.) in September home games (including home contests played in Memphis and Jackson), including a 62-12-2 (.829 winning percentage) mark in September games played in Oxford.
- The Rebels went 1-4 in September last season (Memphis, W, 28-25; at Missouri, L, 7-34; at Kentucky, L, 14-31; Wake Forest, L, 3-27; Georgia, L, 9-14). Prior to 2003, Ole Miss posted at least a .500 record in 14 consecutive Septembers.

2008 SCHEDULE, TEXAS SERIES ANNOUNCED: Athletics Director Pete Boone recently announced the addition of a two-game football series between the Rebels and the University of Texas. The first game in the Ole Miss-Texas series is set for Sept. 15, 2012 in Oxford, while the return game to Austin is scheduled for Sept. 14, 2013. The addition of Texas follows an earlier announcement that Ole Miss had added home-and-home series with Georgia Tech (2010 & 2011) and Clemson (2015 & 2016).

Boone also announced Thursday the complete Ole Miss schedule for 2008. The Rebels will open the season at home on Aug. 30 against the University of Memphis. Other home dates will be with Samford, Vanderbilt, South Carolina, Auburn, Louisiana-Monroe and Mississippi State. Road trips in 2008 will be to Wake Forest, Florida, Alabama, Arkansas and LSU, with open dates scheduled for Oct. 11 and Nov. 8. Below is the complete 2008 Rebel slate:

HALL OF FAME REBEL: On Aug. 4, former Rebel **Gene Hickerson** was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. The 6-foot-3, 248 pounder lettered three years at Ole Miss (1955-57) before anchoring the Cleveland Browns' offensive line for 15 seasons. Drafted in the sixth round in 1957,

Hickerson was named an All-Pro five straight years (1966-70) and was voted to the Pro Bowl six consecutive seasons (1966-71). During his time in Cleveland, the Browns never had a losing record. Hickerson's son, Bob, accepted on behalf of his father, before Gene was brought onto the stage in a wheelchair guided by former teammates Jim Brown, Leroy Kelly and Bobby Mitchell — all running backs he helped get into the hall.

- Of Ole Miss' three TDs, one was on offense, one on defense and one on special teams.
- The Rebels' 20-0 halftime lead was their largest since a 24-0 edge on Mississippi State in 2003 ... Ole Miss was 1-3 when leading at halftime a season ago.
- Making his first career start, senior QB **Seth Adams** turned in the Rebels' first 200-yard passing performance since 2005, finishing 19-of-30 for 201 yards with one TD and no interceptions.
- Junior DB **Dustin Mouzon** intercepted two passes and returned the second 99 yards for his first career TD ... He also collected a career-high six solo stops and recovered a fumble against the Tigers.
- Sophomore **Greg Hardy** caught his second career pass, and like the first, it was for a touchdown ... As a defensive end, Hardy had career bests of 11 total tackles and eight solos.
- Ole Miss blocked a punt for a TD for the first time since 1995 ... Sophomore DB **Kendrick Lewis** scored the first TD of his career ... Junior DB **Jamarca Sanford** blocked a punt for the first time in his career.
- Sophomore WR **Marshay Green** posted career highs of five catches for 59 yards.
- Ole Miss had 14 players make their Rebel debuts at Memphis, including five true freshmen.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- Despite its best offensive showing in four years, Ole Miss could not complete a second-half rally in a 38-25 loss to Missouri in the home opener.

BenJarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 226 yards and Seth Adams threw for 305 and three TDs, as the senior duo turned career days for the the Rebels (1-1).

Chase Daniel accounted for a career-high 396 total yards and threw five touchdowns passes as Missouri sprinted to a 28-point lead then held on for the win.

The Tigers (2-0) built a halftime lead of 28-7 with four touchdowns and 245 yards passing. Daniel then seemed to put the Rebels away with a 38-yard touchdown pass to Greg Bracey just 1:12 into the third quarter that gave the Tigers a 35-7 lead.

But Adams led the Rebels' push, completing 23 of 41 passes in his second start. His scoring passes of 68 yards to Mike Wallace and 3 yards to Greg Hardy in the third quarter cut Missouri's lead to 38-19.

Green-Ellis cut it to 38-25 with a 2-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter. But failed conversions cost Ole Miss 5 points, and the Rebels couldn't overcome their first-half mistakes, including Green-Ellis' fumble at the Missouri 7.

Ole Miss' 534 total yards is the most in the Ed Orgeron era, and the most since 567 total yards against Wyoming in 2004. Wallace joined in the career performances with 136 receiving yards on 7 receptions, while Hardy recorded a TD catch for the third straight game. All three of his career grabs have gone for scores.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) - BenJarvus Green-Ellis ran for 101 yards and two scores and Charles Clark had a game-saving interception for Ole Miss in a 17-10 victory over Vanderbilt.

Clark intercepted Mackenzi Adams' pass inside the Ole Miss 10 on the games final play as the Rebels (2-3, 1-3 Southeastern Conference) snapped a six-game losing streak in Southeastern Conference play. Green-Ellis had 24 carries and scored two in the first quarter.

Vanderbilt (2-4, 0-3 SEC) turned the ball over six times and was dominated in the kicking game. The Commodores missed a pair of field goals, fumbled a punt return and took a sack by the punter that led to an Ole Miss touchdown.

Vandy quarterback Chris Nickson was lost to an ankle injury late in the first half and did not return. Nickson was 11-of-13 for 95 yards and directed the Commodores to their only touchdown.

Adams was 10-of-20 for 176 yards in a relief role, but the Commodores managed only a 38-yard field goal by Bryant Hahnfeldt on four scoring opportunities in the fourth quarter.

Ole Miss linebacker Rory Johnson was the decisive defensive factor.

Johnson stripped Adams of the ball and recovered the fumble to stop a drive that carried inside the Ole Miss 5. Johnson, a junior college transfer making his second start, had 16 tackles, forced three fumbles and broke up a pass.

Johnson set up the first Ole Miss touchdown on a 28-yard return after a fumble by Vanderbilt receiver George Smith. Three plays later, Green-Ellis scored on a 2-yard run for a 7-0 lead.

On the ensuing series, Vanderbilt punter Brett Upson was forced to hold the ball at the Commodore 17-yard line to avoid a blocked punt. Four plays later, Green-Ellis scored on a 1-yard run to give the Rebels a 14-0 lead with 1:26 left in the first period.

Ole Miss took a 17-7 third quarter lead on a 32-yard field goal by Joshua Shene on the opening possession of the second half. Brandon Jenkins recovered a fumble by Commodore running back Cassen Jackson-Garrison at the Vanderbilt 42-yard line to set up the score.

MEMPHIS (AP) - Dustin Mouzon returned one of his two interceptions 99 yards for a touchdown and Ole Miss stopped Memphis' potential game-tying 2-point conversion with 31 seconds left in a 23-21 victory Saturday.

Martin Hankins connected with Duke Calhoun on an 8-yard touchdown to pull Memphis within two points. But Hankins' pass was incomplete as Ole Miss (1-0) won its third straight in the series that dates to 1921. Rebel coach Ed Orgeron has never lost to the Tigers.

Seth Adams threw for 201 yards and another touchdown for the Rebels.

Hankins finished with 343 yards on 41-of-60 passing.

Mouzon's scoring return late in the first half was one of two Ole Miss touchdowns not by the offense. The Rebels' special teams got on the board in the first half when they blocked a Memphis punt and recovered the loose ball in the end zone.

Turnovers were aplenty as Memphis (0-1) committed five and the Rebels had three fumbles.

Ole Miss led 20-0 at the half. Adams completed his first seven passes, one of them a 16-yard scoring toss to Greg Hardy on the first Ole Miss possession.

Mouzon was providing the defensive strength for Ole Miss, intercepting Hankins twice and recovering a fumble. On the second interception, Mouzon stepped in front of Calhoun near the end zone, and sprinted down the left sideline for a touchdown late in the half.

Between Hardy's touchdown catch and Mouzon's return, the Rebels benefited from another Tigers' mistake. Jamarca Sanford blocked a Memphis punt and the ball was recovered in the end zone by Kendrick Lewis for an Ole Miss touchdown.

Memphis rallied in the second half as Joseph Doss scored on a 1-yard run late in the third period, and reserve quarterback Matt Malouf added a 4-yard run in the fourth to set the stage for the final Memphis drive and Calhoun's touchdown catch.

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) -- Despite its best offensive showing in four years, Ole Miss could not complete a second-half rally in a 38-25 loss to Missouri in the home opener.

BenJarvus Green-Ellis rushed for 226 yards and Seth Adams threw for 305 and three TDs, as the senior duo turned career days for the the Rebels (1-1).

Chase Daniel accounted for a career-high 396 total yards and threw five touchdowns passes as Missouri sprinted to a 28-point lead then held on for the win.

The Tigers (2-0) built a halftime lead of 28-7 with four touchdowns and 245 yards passing. Daniel then seemed to put the Rebels away with a 38-yard touchdown pass to Greg Bracey just 1:12 into the third quarter that gave the Tigers a 35-7 lead.

But Adams led the Rebels' push, completing 23 of 41 passes in his second start. His scoring passes of 68 yards to Mike Wallace and 3 yards to Greg Hardy in the third quarter cut Missouri's lead to 38-19.

Green-Ellis cut it to 38-25 with a 2-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter. But failed conversions cost Ole Miss 5 points, and the Rebels couldn't overcome their first-half mistakes, including Green-Ellis' fumble at the Missouri 7.

Ole Miss' 534 total yards is the most in the Ed Orgeron era, and the most since 567 total yards against Wyoming in 2004. Wallace joined in the career performances with 136 receiving yards on 7 receptions, while Hardy recorded a TD catch for the third straight game. All three of his career grabs have gone for scores.
