VANDERBILT WELCOMES MEYER, NORTHERN STATE FOR EXHIBITION CONTEST

Vanderbilt plays host to former Lipscomb head coach Don Meyer and his Northern State (S.D.) Wolves Wednesday, Nov. 1, at Memorial Gymnasium. The Commodores lone exhibition game of the preseason is set to start at 7 p.m. The contest will not be televised.

The Commodores return seven letterwinners from the 2005-06 campaign led by junior swingman Shan Foster, who recently was named First Team All-Southeastern Conference by the league's coaches and Second Team All-Conference by SEC Media.

Foster ranks as the SEC's third-leading returning scorer after averaging 15.9 points last year. Considered among the league's best 3-point shooters last season, Foster ranked second in 3-pointers per game (3.00) and fourth in 3-point shooting (41.5 percent).

Foster combines with senior guard/forward Derrick Byars to form arguably the best wing duo in the SEC. Byars ranked second among conference newcomers a year ago, averaging 12.4 points. The Memphis native and Virginia transfer, led the Commodores in assists with 3.2.

Other returning lettermen include junior guard Alex Gordon (5.7 ppg, 2.6 apg), who started 18 games at the point last season, including four of Vanderbilt's six road victories. Senior guard Dan Cage (5.9 ppg) boasts outstanding perimeter shooting skills, making 46.1 percent of his 3-point tries (35-of-76) last season. Fifth-year senior center Ted Skuchas (3.0 ppg, 2.1 rpg) started 16 games last season. Junior post player Alan Metcalfe (2.2 ppg, 2.1 rpg) showed potential inside as the 2006-07 campaign concluded. Junior walk-on guard Aubrey Hammond returns for his third year. The crowd favorite

has seen limited action as a Commodore.

Four newcomers look to make an impact. Versatile junior transfer forward Ross Neltner sat out last season after departing LSU. The 2003 Kentucky Mr. Basketball averaged 2.9 points and 2.8 rebounds as a sophomore in Baton Rouge playing behind the 2005 SEC Player of the Year Brandon Bass and SEC Freshman of the Year Glen Davis. Neltner averaged 20.2 points and 10.6 rebounds as a senior at Fort Thomas Highlands.

Athletic redshirt freshman George Drake was named the Alabama 2A Player of the Year his sophomore through senior seasons at Calera High School. He averaged 22.6 points and 8.5 rebounds as a senior.

Freshman Jermaine Beal is multi-faceted guard who finished his high school career as DeSoto's all-time leading scorer while averaging 21.5 points, 6.0 assists and five rebounds.

Freshman forward JeJuan Brown is an energetic post player from Biloxi who averaged 18 points and 10 rebounds as a senior.

The Commodores were picked to finish fourth in the Eastern Division by media attending last week's SEC Media Days in Birmingham, Oct. 25-26.

Wolves mentor Don Meyer coached at Lipscomb 24 years where he led the Bisons to 13 national tournament appearances and the 1986 NAIA title.

Wednesday's game marks the fourth exhibition meeting between the two schools. All games have been played in Nashville with Vanderbilt winning each contest: 87-70 on Nov. 5, 2005; 86-57 on Nov. 6, 2003; and 72-59 on Nov. 11, 2001.

SCOUTING NORTHERN STATE

Northern State plays its first exhibition game of the pre-season Wednesday when it visits Memorial Gymnasium to battle Vanderbilt. The Wolves will travel to play at North Carolina State on Friday, Nov. 3, before wrapping up its pre-season slate at home against Mayville State on Nov. 11.

The Wolves were picked to finish second in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Athletic Conference behind reigning NCAA Division II champion Winona State.

Northern State returns three starters and 10 lettermen from last season's squad that finished with an 11-3 league mark and 27-6 overall record. Four of the Wolves' six defeats came against Winona State. Northern State's top three scorers were lost to graduation.

Tabbed in the preseason as a player to watch, junior guard Craig Nelson is shooting 44.1 percent from 3-point range and 87.1 percent from the foul line for his career. Nelson averaged 9.2 points, 2.3 assists and 2.2 rebounds last year.

Legendary head coach Don Meyer is in his eighth season at Northern State (139-67) and his 34th overall (841-287). Meyer is the fifth winningest coach in college basketball history (at four-year colleges).

NEXT GAME: GEORGETOWN

Vanderbilt opens the 2006-07 regular season at home against nationally ranked Georgetown, Wednesday, Nov. 15 at 8 p.m. The game will be televised regionally by FSN. Vanderbilt won last year's meeting, 68-61, in Washington D.C. on Nov. 26.

COACHES TAB FOSTER FIRST TEAM ALL-SEC

Vanderbilt junior swingman Shan Foster was named Preseason First Team All-Southeastern Conference by the league's coaches.

Foster, who earned a similar postseason award from the coaches last year, ranks as the league's third-leading returning scorer, averaging 15.9 points a year ago. Foster finished his sophomore campaign ranked among the SEC's leaders in 3-pointers per game (second with 3.00), 3-point shooting percentage (fourth at .415), and field goal percentage (ninth at .451).

"Shan is very deserving of the award," head coach Kevin Stallings said. "For the better part of two years he has been very consistent and has proven to be one of the league's best players.

"Preseason awards are nice but postseason honors have more meaning. I wouldn't be surprised if both Shan and Derrick (Byars) were on the list at the end of the season."

Foster is shooting 42.7 percent from 3-point range for his career - fourth best in school history. The Kenner, La. native ranks ninth at Vanderbilt with 159 career 3-pointers. His 90 3-pointers made a year ago tied for third place all-time at Vanderbilt.

The coaches' preseason All-SEC first and second teams consist of a minimum eight players on each squad. No ties were broken and no predicted order of finish was made.

SEC MEDIA PICKS COMMODORES FOURTH IN EAST

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the SEC Eastern Division by media attending the league's annual media days, Oct. 25-26, in Birmingham, Ala.

The Commodores received 138 points to finish behind defending national champion Florida (30), Kentucky (62) and Tennessee (84). South Carolina (146) was chosen fifth while Georgia (149) ended up sixth. Florida earned 28 of 29 first-place votes to win the division and 21 votes to be crowned the overall champion.

Alabama edged LSU in voting to win the Western Division title. The Crimson Tide received 16 votes to LSU's 13 votes.

FOSTER LOOKING TO CLIMB CHARTS IN JUNIOR SEASON

Vanderbilt junior swingman Shan Foster enters the new season looking to climb the Commodore Top 10 list for 3-pointers made and attempted and 3-point shooting percentage.

The Kenner, La. native led the Commodores a year ago in 3-pointers made (90) and attempted (217). His 217 attempts from beyond the arc ranked fourth in the SEC. Foster's .427 career 3-point shooting percentage (159-of-372) ranks fourth at Vanderbilt. He ranks ninth in career 3-pointers made (159) and 10th in 3-pointers attempted (372).

3-POINT STREAK ENTERS 20TH SEASON; VU ONE OF THREE TEAMS TO HIT A TREY IN EVERY GAME SINCE 1986-87 SEASON

Vanderbilt's streak of consecutive games with a made 3-pointer will enter the 2006-07 season at 630 games. The Commodores are one game behind UNLV (631) for the longest current streak in college basketball.

The Commodores are one of three teams to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the rule was implemented for the 1986-87 season. Princeton (548) also has made a 3-pointer in every game since the line was adopted.

- Stallings has posted just one losing season in **28 seasons as a player and coach**.
- He has posted 20-win seasons **19 times** and has won **12 conference championships**.
- Stallings ranks as the **fourth-winningest coach in Vanderbilt history** with 122 victories. He needs eight wins this season to pass C.M. Newton for third place.
- Stallings became the **first active SEC coach to earn 100 wins at two schools** when Vanderbilt won at Auburn 67-43 on Feb. 16, 2005.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM ENTERS 55TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium enters its 55th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 800 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

- The Commodores own an all-time record of 636-181 (.778 win percentage) in Memorial Gymnasium since the building opened for the 1952-53 campaign.
- Vanderbilt has never finished a season with a losing home record.
- The Commodores have posted five undefeated seasons at home and won 10 or more games at the site in 19 of the past 20 seasons.
- Vanderbilt won a school record 17 home games during the 2004-05 season.
- Vanderbilt has won 82 of its last 86 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Last season's 92-83 setback to Cincinnati on Dec. 10 snapped a 28-game home winning streak against non-SEC foes.
- The Commodores are 62-4 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era (losses against Connecticut [76-70] on Dec. 1, 2002; Notre Dame [77-74] on Dec. 2, 2001; and Wake Forest [83-68] on March 14, 2000 in the NIT).
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 132-11 non-conference record at home (.923 win percentage).
- VU won 40 consecutive non-conference home games from the 1996 season to the 2001 campaign.

2005-06 SEASON REVIEW

- Advanced to postseason play for the third consecutive year and the fifth time in the last seven seasons.
- Swept Kentucky for the first time since 1974, claiming a 57-52 win in Lexington and 84-81 victory in Nashville.
- Recorded Vanderbilt's first win at Kentucky's Rupp Arena in series history (29 tries).
- Sophomore swingman Shan Foster received First Team All-SEC honors from the league's coaches and Second Team All-SEC recognition for the Associated Press.
- Foster was named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association All-District IV squad.
- Julian Terrell became only the second Commodore in school history - along with Will Perdue - to registered more than 600 rebounds and 100 blocks for his career.
