# COMMODORE NOTES

## SEALAND GETS 1ST START VS. AUSTIN PEAY; JOINING SIX OTHER FIRST-TIME STARTERS

**Jake Sealand** (So., LB) earned his first career start in a Commodore uniform in the 38-3 victory over Austin Peay last Saturday.

Sealand joins six other Vanderbilt players who have registered their initial collegiate starts in the Commodores' early-season games against Ole Miss and Austin Peay.

Others making their first collegiate starts in the opener were **Steven Clarke** (Sr., CB), **Vince Taylor** (R-Jr., DT), **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE), **Darreon Herring** (So., LB), **Adam Butler** (R-Fr., DT) and **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL).

Sealand contributed two tackles, including one for a loss, during a limited performance against Austin Peay.

Several of the others posted superb stats in their first start. Woestmann enjoyed a career performance, contributing a pair of quarterback sacks among seven total tackles while adding a QB hurry. Taylor also set a single-game career high with four total tackles. Herring posted five tackles, including a quarterback sack, and two defended passes. Clarke notched three tackles and a defended pass.

Butler, who moved from offensive line to defensive tackle during spring drills, contributed one tackle against Ole Miss.

Jelks started vs. Ole Miss lined up at tight end as a tackle eligible.

## SIXTEEN COMMODORES HAVE EARNED INITIAL COLLEGIATE ACTION THIS YEAR

Sixteen underclassmen have experienced their initial action in a Commodore uniform during Vanderbilt's two early-season games.

First-time players on offense were **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., WR), **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL), **Barrett Gouger** (R-Fr., OL), **Will Holden** (R-Fr., OL), **Blake Fromang** (R-Fr., OL), **Latevius Rayford** (Fr., WR) and **Patton Robinette** (Fr., QB).

First-time defensive players included **Torey Agee** (R-Fr., DT), **Ladarius Banks** (R-Fr., DT), **Ja'karri Thomas** (R-Fr., LB), **Harding Harper** (R-Fr., LB), **Torren McGaster** (R-Fr., CB), **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB), **Darrius Sims** (Fr., CB) and **Stephen Weatherly** (R-Fr., DE).

**Taylor Hudson** (R-So., punter) is the only specialist participating for the first time.

## THREE TRUE FRESHMEN HAVE PLAYED

Three Vanderbilt true freshmen have participated in the Dores' two early-season games.

In the win over Austin Peay last Saturday, **Latevius Rayford** (WR) was the only new true freshman to see action. He posted one catch for 24 yards against the Governors.

Freshmen **Jordan Cunningham** (WR) and **Darrius Sims** (CB) have played against both early opponents. Cunningham had a team-high seven passes for 67 yards in the win over Austin Peay. Sims contributed an impressive 34-yard kickoff return late in the opener against Ole Miss.

## SCORING 35 POINTS IN A QUARTER

Vanderbilt's 35-point explosion in the second quarter appears to be a modern day high for the 'Dores. Vanderbilt tallied 28 points in a quarter on three times in the last two decades: UMass (2012), MTSU (2001) and The Citadel (1999).

## FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

**James Franklin** is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years than Franklin was Hall of Famer Dan McGugin, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 16-12 overall. His .571 winning percentage is the best by a Vanderbilt mentor since Steve Sloan posted the same percentage in 1973-74 leading teams to a 12-9-2 mark.

## VANDY STAFF: FULLY INTACT FROM 2012

Vanderbilt is the only SEC team that has its entire coaching staff intact from last year.

It also marks the first time since 2009 that the Commodore staff remained intact.

Vanderbilt is one of nine schools from the NCAA's FBS subdivision that will return intact staffs. The others are Baylor, Louisville, Maryland, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Notre Dame and Ohio State.

## OL WESLEY JOHNSON RANKS AS TEAM LEADER WITH 40 CAREER STARTS

**Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OL) paces all active Commodore position players with 40 career starts.

Johnson has started every game of his Commodore career, seeing assignments at four line positions: center, right and left tackle, and left guard. He has started at left tackle against Ole Miss and Austin Peay.

If Johnson starts every game this year, he will become the all-time team leader in career starts. **Chris Marve** (LB, 2007-11) and **Brian Stamper** (OL, 2003-07) share the mark with 48 starts.

## MORE ON THE SOUTH CAROLINA SERIES

This marks the 23rd meeting on the gridiron between Vanderbilt and South Carolina, with the Gamecocks holding a 18-4 edge in the series. The teams met once before South Carolina joined the SEC, with the Gamecocks earning a 23-7 road win over the Commodores in 1961.

The teams have met every season as Eastern Division foes since 1992, when South Carolina (along with Arkansas) moved into the conference. The Gamecocks have taken the last four contests in the series, with Vanderbilt's last win coming in 2008 in Nashville. The Commodores also scored victories in 2007 and 1998-99.

The series has been close in recent years. Since 2007, the average margin of victory is less than a TD.

Historically, the 'Dores have struggled against Steve Spurrier's teams. Vanderbilt is 2-18 all-time vs. Spurrier's squads.

## LAST TIME VS. SOUTH CAROLINA

### FOURTH QUARTER RALLY DOOMS 'DORES

**NASHVILLE** – No.9 South Carolina and coach Steve Spurrier got a big scare to open the season. Marcus Lattimore and Connor Shaw helped the Gamecocks grind their way past the Vanderbilt.

The Vanderbilt offensive performance was paced by junior wide receiver Jordan Matthews, who had eight catches for 147 yards, including a career-long 78-yard touchdown.

Lattimore ran for two touchdowns and 110 yards in his first game back after tearing his left ACL, and Shaw ran for 92 yards while playing the second half with an injured shoulder as No. 9

### GAME 1

**AUG. 30, 2012**

**NASHVILLE**

South Carolina rallied for a 17-13 victory against Vanderbilt during the Thursday night opener.

But Shaw bruised his right, throwing shoulder late in the first half and missed the first two series of the third quarter before

returning. The junior drove the Gamecocks for the go-ahead touchdown and ran 12 yards to the Vandy 1 before rolling in pain in the end zone.

## MATTHEWS POSTS SECOND STRAIGHT GAME OF MORE THAN 100 RECEIVING YARDS

**Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) continues to impress early in the 2013 season as one of the top receivers in the SEC and NCAA.

After opening the year with a 10-catch, 178-yard, 1-TD performance against Ole Miss, Matthews came back last weekend with another effort of more than 100 receiving yards against Austin Peay.

Playing in just the first half, Matthews had six catches for 111 yards, including an over-the-head grab that went for 39 yards and a touchdown.

Matthews has now registered a receiving TD in seven straight games.

Matthews set his first team career record in the win. It was the 12th game of at least 100 receiving yards for Matthews, one more than the total of **Dan Stricker** (1999-2002).

Matthews has 19 career TD catches, just two shy of Stricker's all-time record. Matthews remains well short of the team's career marks: of 236 catches (**Earl Bennett**, 2005-07) and 2,964 receiving yards (**Boo Mitchell**, 1985-88).

Matthews' performance in the opener against Ole Miss may have been the finest of his collegiate career. Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high in receiving yardage against the Rebels. Matthews 178-yard effort was the most by a Vanderbilt receiver since **Earl Bennett** amassed 223 receiving yards against Richmond on Sept. 1, 2007. It also equalled the No. 11 effort in team history.

The SEC's active leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews has been superb against conference foes. In his last 13 games against SEC teams, Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards on nine occasions. In those 13 games, Matthews has amassed 1,581 receiving yards – an average of 121.6 yards per outing.

Matthews' 10 receptions against Ole Miss also matched a career best set previously against both UMass and Wake Forest during the 2012 season. He has posted at least seven catches in 10 of the last 14 games.

## HUDSON PERFORMING WELL AS PUNTER

In two short weeks, junior walk-on **Taylor Hudson** has earned the respect of Commodore teammates.

Hudson, from the Columbus, Ohio suburb of Powell, has been superb replacing graduated 2012 All-SEC punter **Richard Kent**.

Hudson earned the team's Specialist of the Week against Austin Peay after averaged 48.2 yards on four punts. Three of his punts landed inside inside the Governors' 20-yard line.

Hudson's first punt went for 63 yards, the longest by a Commodore since Kent's 67-yarder at Northwestern last September.

The former prep quarterback who has aspirations of becoming a neurosurgeon is averaging 43.7 yards this year, fourth best in the SEC. Vanderbilt's excellent net punt average with Hudson of 40.7 yards ranks fifth in the conference.

## MORE STATS AND FACTS FROM DORES' WIN OVER AUSTIN PEAY

★ The Commodores have now scored at least 38 points in their last five consecutive games – and in seven of their last eight games. The only scoring total under 38 points since Vanderbilt's 49-7 victory over UMass on Oct. 27, 2012 was the Commodores' 27-point total that came in a come-from-behind win at Ole Miss Nov. 12, 2012.

The last time Vanderbilt produced a scoring streak of five straight games with at least 38 points came nearly a century ago. It was last accomplished when Dan McGugin's 1915 squad started the year scoring at least 47 points in six consecutive games.

In the team's last eight games dating back to midseason in 2012, the the Vanderbilt offense has averaged 40.4 points. The opposition has included four Southeastern Conference teams and two Atlantic Coast Conference squads.

★ **Jimmy Stewart** (R-So., DE) earned the team's Defensive Player of the Week recognition after becoming the second Commodore defender in as many weeks to register two quarterback sacks.

Stewart's two sacks doubled his career total.

★ **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., WR) registered a game-high seven catches, good for 67 yards.

Cunningham's receptions total was the most by a Commodore true freshman since **Jordan Matthews** posted the same total in the 2010 finale vs. Wake Forest.

★ The Vanderbilt defense put together one of the best overall performances in recent Commodore history.

The unit held Austin Peay without a first down in the first half, and ended the game allowing only six first downs and 139 total yards.

It was the fewest first downs and total yards allowed by Vanderbilt since Sept. 12, 2009 when Western Carolina managed just four first downs and 115 total yards in a 45-0 Commodore win.

★ Before the season started, offensive coaches promised a three-player approach at running back following the graduation of current St. Louis Rams' RB **Zac Stacy**. That's exactly what Commodore fans have witnessed in the early season.

The team's leading rusher, **Jerron Seymour** (R-So.), hasn't started against Ole Miss or Austin Peay. He has 84 yards and two TDs on just 14 carries.

**Brian Kimbrow** (So.) and **Wesley Tate** (R-Sr.) trail Seymour with 78 and 56 rushing yards, respectively.

All three backs have tallied rushing TDs this season.

★ For the second straight week, the Commodore offense scored points on all five of its red-zone possessions. They tallied four TDs and a 25-yard field goal by **Carey Spear** on those possessions.

For the season, the Vanderbilt offense is 10-of-10 on red-zone scoring. The unit has produced nine touchdowns from the 10 possessions.

★ **Kellen Williams** (Jr., LB) was the Commodores' leading tackler against Austin Peay, setting career highs with four solo stops and nine total tackles.

Williams also contributed a tackle for loss, defended pass and quarterback hurry.

★ Two reserve quarterbacks, **Josh Grady** (R-So.) and **Patton Robinette** (R-Fr.), both completed passes in their initial collegiate action. Robinette was 4-of-5 for 41 yards.

★ **Paris Head** (R-Fr., CB) notched his first career turnover, recovering a Austin Peay fumble caused by **Casey Hughes** (Jr., LB). It also marked Hughes' first career forced fumble.





## CARTA-SAMUELS FOLLOWS 300-YARD EFFORT WITH SECOND STRONG PERFORMANCE

**Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB) followed one of the team's top passing performances ever in a season opener with another solid effort in Vanderbilt's 38-3 victory over Austin Peay.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at QB during the 2009-10 seasons for the University of Wyoming, threw for 223 yards and a TD during limited action against the Governors. He completed 14 of 22 attempts while playing in the first half.

For the second straight outing, Carta-Samuels targeted senior wide-outs **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**. The duo combined for eight catches and 171 receiving yards against Austin Peay. He also found a new receiver, connecting with **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., WR) on five passes.

Carta-Samuels' 261-yard passing average ranks fourth in the SEC and 30th in the NCAA. He also is fourth in the conference in total offense with a 276.5-yard average.

Carta-Samuels' performance vs. Ole Miss in the opener ranked among the best ever by a Vanderbilt QB. He became only the team's second QB to reach 300 passing yards in an opener. It was last achieved when **Greg Zolman** threw for 300 yards the 2001 opener vs. MTSU as a senior.

The 2009 Mountain West Conference Freshman of the Year narrowly missed his single-game high for passing yards in the effort vs. Ole Miss. He threw for 319 yards in Wyoming's 2010 season opener.

Early in the season, Carta-Samuels is connecting on 60.3 percent of his passes (35-of-58). He has three touchdown passes, two to Matthews and one to **Steven Scheu** (R-So., TE).

## SPEAR COMING OFF ALL-SEC YEAR

**Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) enters 2013 off arguably the best season ever produced by a Vanderbilt kicker.

Spear was voted All-SEC by the Associated Press in 2012 after establishing a new Vanderbilt single-season record with 20 field goals.

Spear, a Groza Award candidate, was 1-of-2 on field goals against Austin Peay, connecting from 25 yards and missing from 38 yards. He is 10-of-10 on extra point tries.

In 2012, Spear ranked among the SEC's most accurate kickers, converting 83.3 percent of his FG attempts (20-of-24).

Spear is serving as a Commodore team captain for the third straight season. The only other recent Vanderbilt player in recent years to serve a third-year captain's tenure was quarterback **Jay Cutler** (2003-05).

## KRAUSE AMONG SEC'S BEST RETURNERS

Senior **Jonathan Krause** is back after ranking among the SEC's top punt returners last year. His 2012 average of 11.2 yards is second to Missouri's Marcus Murphy among active SEC return specialists.

Krause's average is the third highest by a 'Dore since the early 1980s, trailing **D.J. Moore** (14.4-yd. avg., 2008) and **Jeff Brothers** (12.3-yd. avg., 1992). He also became the team's first to return two punts for TDs since 1968.

Krause is averaging 5.7 yards on six returns this year.

## NINE COMMODORES NAMED CAPTAINS

The Commodores will feature nine team captains this season.

Head Coach James Franklin announced Aug. 26 that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

Team captains are **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB), **Andrew East** (R-Jr., snapper), **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Sr.,

CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

## SUMMARY OF THE COMMODORE CAPTAINS

### AUSTYN CARTA-SAMUELS, R-Sr., QB

The Wyoming transfer is averaging 261.5 passing yards and 276 yards of total offense in two QB starts.

### ANDREW EAST, R-Jr., SN

A two-year starter, East ranks among the SEC's top all-purpose snappers. He serves as the team's primary snapper in all roles.

### CHASE GARNHAM, Sr., LB

Ranked among SEC LB leaders in 2012 with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss as a junior. Garnham did not play against Austin Peay.

### ANDRE HAL, Sr., CB

Jim Thorpe Award contender has 11 total tackles, including one for a loss, and three passes defended early in the season.

### WESLEY JOHNSON, R-Sr., OT

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection earned his team-high 40th consecutive career start against Austin Peay.

### JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 11 total tackles.

### JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Trophy candidate has topped 100 receiving yards in both early-season games, and leads the SEC with 16 receptions and 289 receiving yards.

### WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

Part of a five-player rotation, May has a QB sacks and QB hurry to go with four tackles.

### CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior, coming off the best year ever produced by Vandy kicker, is 1-of-2 on field goals and 10-of-10 on extra point tries.

## 'DORES FOLLOWING A YEAR OF HISTORIC GRIDIRON ACHIEVEMENT

### TYING TEAM RECORD FOR VICTORIES IN SEASON

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

### MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING 2012 MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

### SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

### UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

### WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

### FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

### FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

### DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

## FACTS ON COMMODORE OL WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate Wesley Johnson has started 38 games and played four offensive line positions along with tight end. But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

- ★ Johnson has never been called for a single holding penalty.
- ★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 6.5 sacks on 1,045 career pass attempts, or one sack every 158 pass plays.
- ★ Johnson did not allow a single quarterback sack in 2012.
- ★ Johnson has produced 152 knockdown blocks, 37 intimidation blocks and 106 blocks that led to a Commodore touchdown or first down.
- ★ Johnson has been on the field for every Vanderbilt touchdown and PAT for the last 3+ seasons.
- ★ Johnson has played 2,474 career snaps: 1,682 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 67 at tight end. He has played 98.3 percent of the team's snaps over the last three years.

## 'DORES HAS WON 5TH STRAIGHT NON-SEC GAMES

Vanderbilt notched its fifth straight victory against a non-Southeastern Conference member by defeating Austin Peay 38-3 on Sept. 7.

Since falling at Northwestern in early September last year, the 'Dores have defeated Presbyterian 58-0, UMass 49-7, Wake Forest 55-21, N.C. State 38-14 in the 2012 Music City Bowl, and Austin Peay this year.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 8-1 in regular season action against non-SEC teams, and 9-2 overall against non-league foes. The team's 2011 unblemished out-of-conference mark was Vanderbilt's first since 1994.

## MATTHEWS HOLDS RECEIVING MARKS; CHASING SEVERAL TEAM, RECORDS

**Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) has established himself as one of the finest receivers to ever wear the Black & Gold. In 2013, he's starting to make a case for inclusion alongside legendary receivers in the Southeastern Conference.

After producing one of the finest seasons ever by a Vanderbilt receiver in 2012, Matthews has started the 2013 in similar fashion. Through two games, Matthews leads the SEC's with 16 receptions and 289 receiving yards.

He opened the year by catching 10 passes for 178 yards and a touchdown against Ole Miss.

Matthews now needs 518 receiving yards to break the all-time receiving yards record held by former Georgia standout Terrence Edwards. He also needs 71 catches to surpass the SEC and Vanderbilt career record of 236 set by Earl Bennett from 2005-07.

A 2013 Biletnikoff Award candidate,

Matthews posted staggering numbers last year en route to becoming a First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America selection. Matthews' 94-reception total is tied for the second most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks fifth on the SEC all-time charts.

The fifth Hall of Fame Dinner took place at the Vanderbilt Student Life Center Sept. 6 to kick off Hall of Fame Weekend on Sept. 6-7 included. The class also was recognized at Vanderbilt's football game against Austin Peay on Sept. 7.

The inaugural Hall of Fame class was enshrined in 2008. This marked the first program's first Hall of Fame class since 2011.

### BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL

When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to West End High School star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level and Vanderbilt's program became one of the best in the SEC.

- First player to score 1,000 career points at Vanderbilt
- Team captain 1949-50; All-SEC three years (1948-50)
- School's first basketball All-American (1950)

### JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL

Jamie Duncan was a high school football star in Wilmington, Del., recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. Since his NFL days, Jamie has been involved with a variety of businesses, and currently partners with former Commodore Ronnie Gordon in an enterprise that brings quality dental care to low income populations in the U.S.

- Amassed more than 300 tackles in his Vanderbilt career
- Twice earned All-America recognition
- Honored as one of the SEC's Legends in 2009
- Seven-year vet of the NFL, playing with Tampa Bay, St. Louis and Atlanta

### JOSIE EARNEST • WOMEN'S BOWLING

Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her decision to attend a young Vanderbilt bowling program surprised some but it has paid dividends ever since. Her mere presence was a catalyst for other bowling stars to also choose Vanderbilt and she went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year.

### DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE

Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

- Phi Beta Kappa Vanderbilt student and recipient of university's "Bachelor of Ugliness" (highest undergraduate honor awarded)
- Member of ODK and four years on student council
- Captain of Vanderbilt basketball team, 1941; All-SEC first baseman
- Became team's chief medical consultant upon returning to Nashville, serving in role from 1948-1990
- One of first surgeons in USA to reconstruct ACL knee injuries
- He was also a Clinical Professor of Orthopedics, training and mentoring dozens of Vanderbilt residents in Orthopedics and Sports Medicine

### JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE

A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

- Earned All-America honors from the IWLCA in 2004
- Helped 'Dores win two ALC championships and advance to the NCAA Tournament twice—including an NCAA Final Four berth in 2004
- One of only 10 Commodores with more than 100 career goals
- Member: 2004-05 U.S. development team, 2006-07 U.S. elite national team

### CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite.

- Vanderbilt's SEC Great representative in 2011.
- Won NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue, becoming the only African-American coach to win an Division I women's basketball title.
- Served three seasons as head coach/GM of the WNBA's Orlando Miracle.
- Head coach at University of Florida for five years.

### JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL

Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom recruited by Roy Mewbourne who became the first ace of the Tim Corbin Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth.

- Was named to 2002 Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America team
- Two-time all-SEC as a sophomore and junior
- Ranks in Top 10 of numerous Vanderbilt single-season and career pitching records, including wins, strikeouts and innings pitched
- Selected by the Indians with the 6th overall pick in the 2004 MLB Draft

**NASHVILLE (AP)** – Mississippi coach Hugh Freeze may have a highly-rated crop of freshmen to coach. Senior Jeff Scott made sure his new teammates left their first college game as winners.

Jeff Scott ran 75 yards for a touchdown with 1:07 left, and Mississippi rallied twice Thursday night to beat Vanderbilt 39-35 in a wild season opener for both teams.

### Game 1 Aug. 29, 2013 Nashville

Vanderbilt went up 35-32 on a 34-yard TD pass from Austyn Carta-Samuels to Steven Scheu with 1:30 left. But Scott beat the Commodores for a TD and the fourth lead change.

Vanderbilt had a final chance to extend the Southeastern Conference's longest winning streak, but Cody Prewitt intercepted a pass off Jordan Matthews' hands with 26 seconds left. That allowed the Rebels to snap a three-game skid to Vanderbilt, the last a painful 27-26 loss in Oxford last year.
