VANDERBILT LOOKS TO CONTINUE NOVEMBER SUCCESS FROM A YEAR AGO

Vanderbilt hopes to continue the November success it experienced in 2012.

One year ago, the Commodores notched a perfect 4-0 November, defeating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest in consecutive weeks.

It marked Vanderbilt first undefeated November since 1982.

COMMODORES ARE 11-4 IN LAST 15 GAMES

The Commodores own an 11-4 record in their last 15 games.

The 15-game stretch includes a seven-game winning streak to conclude the 2012 season and a victory over N.C. State in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

In those 11 wins, Vanderbilt's margin of victory is 22 points. Eight of the victories have come against BCS teams: Missouri, Auburn, Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Georgia from the SEC and Wake Forest and N.C. State from the ACC.

Three of Vanderbilt's four losses in the stretch have come to teams currently ranked in the Associated Press Top 25: No. 9 Missouri, No. 11 Texas A&M and No. 13 South Carolina. The fourth loss came to Ole Miss, another squad receiving votes in the AP Poll.

COMMODORES ON RECORD POINTS STREAK

The Commodores have now scored at least 24 points in 14 consecutive games after producing that tallying that total against against Texas A&M.

The scoring streak ranks as a new standard for the Commodore program. Never in the 124-year history of Vanderbilt football, including the early 1900s when Dan McGugin's teams routinely averaged 40+ points, have the Commodores duplicated the current scoring streak.

SPEAR FIRST COMMODORE NAMED TO ALLSTATE-AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Carey Spear (Sr., PK) became the first Vanderbilt player ever named to the Allstate/American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team when he was named to the 2013 national squad.

Spear, from Mayfield Village, Ohio, was recognized by Allstate officials during a ceremony Oct. 23 at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital on the Vanderbilt campus. Spear and several teammates were visiting young patients at the hospital when he was surprised with a Good Works Team trophy from the sponsors.

Spear also is considered among the nation's leading placekickers. An All-SEC recipient in 2012, Spear is 6-of-8 on field goals this year.

Spear also has been nominated for two other prestigious postseason awards, the Senior CLASS Award and Wuerffel Trophy. Both awards recognize football, academic success in the classroom, and community service.

Spear, is expected to graduate this May with a degree in Human & Organizational Development.

Last month, Spear was a finalist for the Vanderbilt Outstanding Senior Award, recognized as the top honor bestowed on a Vanderbilt undergraduate.

FRANKLIN ACCOMPLISHMENT: MOST WINS IN FIRST TWO SEASONS SINCE 1904-05

James Franklin is off to one of the most successful coaching starts in Vanderbilt history.

No Vanderbilt coach since before the World War I era has posted more victories in the first two years of his tenure than Franklin's 15 wins.

The only coach to guide Vanderbilt to more victories in his first two years than Franklin was Hall of Famer

Dan McGugin, who posted 16 wins from 1904-05.

Under Franklin, the Commodores are 19-15 overall. His .559 winning percentage is the best by a Vanderbilt mentor since **Steve Sloan** directed the Vanderbilt sidelines in the mid-1970s.

SAFETY LADLER PLAYING AT ALL-SEC LEVEL; TOPS LEAGUE IN TWO DEFENSIVE CATEGORIES

Senior **Kenny Ladler** is putting together a superb final season from the Commodore secondary.

Ladler, a three-year starter, tops the SEC in solo tackles and forced fumbles.

The senior has 46 solo stops, six more than runnerup Georgia's **Ramik Wilson**. He also has four forced fumbles, one more than Florida's **Dante Fowler**.

Ladler also ranks fifth among all SEC defenders with 68 total tackles.

Ladler is the team's active career leader with 268 total tackles, 183 solo tackles, six interceptions and six forced fumbles.

Since official defensive records began in the 1970s, only two former 'Dores, LB **Jamie Duncan** in 1996 and LB **Shelton Quarles** in 1991, have registered more forced fumbles in a season than Ladler's current total.

OFFENSE HAVING MORE RED-ZONE SUCCESS

The Vanderbilt offense ranks among the most improved in the SEC and NCAA in its success on third downs and inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

This season, the 'Dores have scored on 30 of 34 red-zone possessions, resulting in an 88% success rate. Through eight games last year, the 'Dores were successful at a 70% rate (21 of 30).

More importantly, Vanderbilt is scoring TDs on red-zone drives at a much higher percentage than last year. The 'Dores have scored TDs on 24 of the 31 possessions, a

77% rate of success. Through eight games last year, the offense was only half as successful, tallying TDs on just 12 of 30 possessions (40%).

MORE ON THE FLORIDA SERIES

The Gators has captured the last 22 games played between the schools, dating back to a 24-9 Commodore victory in 1988. Vanderbilt is 2-19-1 all-time in games played against the Gators in Florida.

Vanderbilt controlled the series in its infancy, winning five of the first seven games played between the schools from 1945-1955. From 1974-1988, Vanderbilt captured three of six games played in the series. All three victories came in Nashville.

FOURTEEN COMMODORES FROM FLORIDA

Fourteen players on the Commodore roster, including three possible starters this Saturday, hail from the state of Florida.

The only states more represented on the Vanderbilt roster than the Sunshine State are Georgia (20) and Tennessee (18).

Among the team's Florida residents probable to start Saturday are CB **Steven Clarke** (Sr., Lauderdale Lakes), WR **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., Fort Lauderdale) and RB **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., Hialeah).

Other Commodore players from Florida are LB **Larry Franklin** (R-So., Vero Beach), OT **Blake Fromang** (R-Fr., Orlando), QB **Josh Grady** (R-So., Tampa), OL **Will Holden** (R-Fr., Green Cove Springs), OL **Kevin McCoy** (R-Fr., Tampa), P/PK **Tommy Openshaw** (Fr., Jacksonville), DE **Jimmy Stewart** (R-So., Cape Coral), DE **Landon Stokes** (Fr., Orlando), Ja'karrri **Thomas** (R-Fr., Tallahassee), RB **Ralph Webb** (Fr., Gainesville) and LB **Kellen Williams** (Jr., Winter Garden).

PREP TEAMMATES FACING EACH OTHER

Five Commodore players will face prep teammates this Saturday when Vanderbilt and Florida meet in Gainesville.

- **Larry Franklin** (R-So., LB) and Florida's **Todd Fennell** (R-So., punter) were classmates at Vero Beach (Fla.) HS.
- **Derek King** (R-So., RB) was a teammate at Brentwood Academy just south of Nashville with Florida's **Max Staver** (Fr., QB).
- **Josh Grady** (R-So., QB) and **Kevin McCoy** (R-Fr., OL) were teammates at powerful Armwood HS near Tampa with Florida's **Matt Jones** (So., RB) and **Alvin Bailey** (Fr., WR).
- **Ralph Webb** (Fr., RB) starred at Gainesville (Fla.) HS, the same school that produced four current Gators – **Case Harrison** (Fr., WR), **Ryan McGriff** (R-So., QB), **Dallas Stubbs** (R-So., punter) and **Chris Thompson** (Fr., WR).

RB CORPS PROTECTING THE BALL

The Vanderbilt running back corps is doing a superb job protecting the football. The unit tops the SEC – and ranks second nationally behind NCAA leader Florida State – with just two fumbles lost through eight games.

On defense, the 'Dores have recovered eight opponent fumbles.

LAST TIME VS. FLORIDA

COMMODORES CAN'T CONTAIN DRISKEL, GATORS EXIT WITH 31-17 VICTORY

NASHVILLE – No one will overlook Jeff Driskel again, not after the Florida quarterback ran the ball better than even Tim Tebow.

Driskel ran for 177 yards and three touchdowns, and the No. 4-ranked Gators beat Vanderbilt 31-17 to stay undefeated going into their big showdown with No. 3 South Carolina.

Driskel ran only 11 times, and the sophomore set the Florida record for rushing yards by a quarterback.

Vanderbilt watched Gators running back Mike Gillislee so closely that Driskel didn't even think the Commodores laid a hand on him on any of his TD runs.

The Gators (6-0, 5-0 SEC) scored 21 straight points, including 11 in the second quarter where they took the lead for good.

MATTHEWS PACES SEC IN RECEPTIONS; CLOSING IN ON SEVERAL RECORDS

MORE ON MATTHEWS CAREER ACCOMPLISHMENTS, PAGE 9

After setting a new Southeastern Conference standard for career receiving yardage, **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) is on pace to establish another league record for career receptions.

Matthews needs just 20 catches to eclipse the SEC mark of 236 career

receptions set by former 'Dore **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews ranks among the leading candidates for the Biletnikoff Award, given annually to the nation's top receiver.

The senior posted eight catches for 92 yards at Texas A&M on Oct. 26. In the performance, he broke the SEC all-time receiving yardage record previously held by former UGA standout WR **Terrence Edwards** (3,093 yards, 1999-2002). Matthews has 3,172 receiving yards for his career entering the Florida game.

Matthews holds four team receiving marks for the Commodores. In addition to the career receiving yardage record, he is the team leader with 22 all-time touchdown catches, 1,323 receiving yards in a season, and 15 games of 100+ receiving yards.

This year, Matthews ranks as the conference leader with 66 receptions. His 111.2-yard receiving average is third best in the league behind only Texas A&M's **Mike Evans** and LSU's **Odell Beckham**.

Matthews also surpassed 100 receiving yards in five of eight games this year. He has amassed at least six catches and 76 receiving yards in every game as a senior.

Matthews' performance in the season opener against Ole Miss may have been the finest of his Vanderbilt career. Despite needing fluids in the second half to combat muscle cramps, Matthews posted a career high with 178 receiving yards against the Rebels.

The conference's active career leader in virtually every receiving category, Matthews continues to post superb stats against SEC opponents. He has surpassed 100 receiving yards in 11 of his last 17 games against SEC teams, averaging 117.2 yards during the span.

He has posted at least seven catches in 16 of his last 20 games.

ADDITIONAL NOTES AND STATS FROM ROAD ENCOUNTER AGAINST TEXAS A&M

★ **Kenny Ladler** (Sr., safety) possibly enjoyed his finest game as a Commodore in the Texas A&M game.

Ladler was superb, contributing eight solo stops, two assisted tackles, two forced fumbles and an interception in the defensive effort.

In his last three appearances – facing ranked opponents in Missouri, Georgia and Texas A&M – Ladler has accumulated 25 solo tackles, 33 total tackles, four forced fumbles and an interception.

★ The defeat came in Vanderbilt's first appearance on Texas A&M's campus in College Station.

★ **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) topped the Commodore rushing attack with 53 yards on 16 carries. Seymour's ninth rushing TD of the season narrowed the margin to 28-17 entering halftime.

In his first year as a starter, Seymour leads the Commodores in rushing yards (481), carries (94) and rushing TDs.

★ **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) notched a pair of sacks on Aggie quarterback Johnny Manziel during the second quarter.

Woestmann's 4.5 sacks tops the Commodores this season.

★ The Vanderbilt defense forced five Texas A&M turnovers, the most of any opponent this year. Unfortunately, the Commodores only tallied seven total points on drives after the Aggie turnovers.

It was the team's most forced turnovers since N.C. State also committed five miscues in Vanderbilt's 2012 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl win.

★ The Commodores have scored at least 24 points against each of their five SEC opponents this year and are averaging 29.6 points in conference play.

★ **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR) broke the Southeastern Conference career receiving yardage record at Texas A&M during an 8-catch, 92-yard performance.

Matthews has at least eight receptions in six of eight games this year. He also has at least 75 receiving yards in every game.

★ **Darreon Herring** (So., LB) continues to show improvement as a first-year starter.

Herring, second on the team with 57 total tackles and third with 27 solo stops, contributed nine total tackles against the Aggies.

★ **Jonathan Krause** (Sr., WR) averaged 29.7 yards on three receptions, including a 30-yard TD catch and another that went for 44 yards.

Krause has become a solid No. 2 receiver behind Jordan Matthews. He has set new season highs with 32 catches, 608 receiving yards and 3 TDs.

★ After guiding the Commodores to a second half comeback win over Georgia, **Patton Robinette** (R-Fr., QB) earned his first career start in hostile Kyle Field. Robinette connected on 15-of-28 passes for a career-high 216 yards and 1 TD.

★ **Karl Butler** (R-Sr., LB) matched a career high with seven total tackles and notched his first fumble recovery of the year in his second game back from injury.

★ Two redshirt freshmen cornerbacks, **Torren McGaster** and **Paris Head**, earned their first career starts in the Commodore secondary.

★ Early in the second quarter, **Kris Kentera** (R-So., TE) recovered a surprise onside kick by the Commodores. The recovery helped set up the Vanderbilt's second score of the day.





2013 OFFENSE ON PACE TO REGISTER ONE OF TOP SEASONS IN MODERN TEAM HISTORY

The Vanderbilt offense is on pace to produce one of the finest campaigns in modern team history.

Through eight games, the unit is averaging 32.1 points, which would rank as the team's highest single-season average since Dan McGugin's potent Commodore teams in the World War I era.

The offense established a modern day scoring standard in 2012 with a 30.0-point average.

The Commodores also are averaging 402 total yards – 260.5 passing and 141.5 rushing. The last Commodore offense to average more than 400 yards came in 1974.

The comparative chart shows an improved Commodore unit over each of the first two Franklin seasons – and one vastly improved over the previous offense before Franklin took over as head coach.

Through eight games, the current offense is averaging 8.5 points and 25.4 yards more than the 2012 unit that eventually featured a 2,500-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver.

SUPERB KICKOFF COVERAGE TOPS VALUABLE SPECIAL TEAMS CONTRIBUTION

Vanderbilt's frequent advantage in field possession through eight games partially can be tracked to the NCAA's best kickoff coverage unit.

The 'Dores rank No. 1 in the NCAA in the stat, holding opponents to a measly 13.9-yard average on kickoff returns.

Plenty of credit goes to **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK), a 2012 All-Southeastern Conference recipient who has enjoyed improved leg strength during his final campaign. This year, 31 of Spear's 44 kickoffs have resulted in touchbacks. In 2011-12, only 33 of 134 kicks by Spear were downed in the endzone.

Spear also has been accurate as a placekicker, making 6-of-8 field goals, including two attempts of at least 50 yards.

Kickoff coverage represents just one area of special teams where the Commodores have witnessed superb results. Vanderbilt has received solid punting from first-year starter **Taylor Hudson** (R-So.), excellent coverage of opposing punt returners, and exciting kickoff returns by **Darrius Sims** (Fr.).

The combined play from Commodore special teams proved a key factor in the team's victory over Georgia Oct. 19. During the game, Vanderbilt special teams registered a touchdown resulting from a fake field goal, recovered a fumbled Bulldog punt return and yielded zero yards on five UGA kickoff returns. In the closing minutes, the team's punt return unit provided a final big play by tackling the Georgia punter deep in Bulldog territory following a bobbled snap.

HAL, WOESTMANN, SAFETIES TOP DEFENSE

Senior safeties **Kenny Ladler** and **Javon Marshall** are the tackle leaders for the Commodore defense.

Ladler paces the unit with 38 solo tackles and 58 total stops. He had 10 tackles in the win over Georgia. Herring is second in total stops and third behind **Jovan Marshall** (safety) in solo stops.

DE **Caleb Azubike** has the most tackles for loss (7.5) while DE **Kyle Woestmann** has the team lead in QB sacks (2.5).

Andre Hal (Sr., CB) owns the team lead with eight passes defended.

'DORES AMONG SEC LEADERS IN PENALTY STATS

Vanderbilt ranks among the NCAA leaders in fewest penalties and penalty yards. The Commodores and Tennessee share the SEC lead by averaging just 36.6 penalty yards per game.

Vanderbilt is averaging just 4.5 infractions per game, second only to Arkansas in the SEC.

NINE COMMODORES NAMED CAPTAINS

The Commodores feature nine team captains this season.

Head Coach James Franklin announced Aug. 26 that four defensive players, three offensive performers and two specialists would serve as Commodore captains for the 2013.

Team captains are **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Sr., QB), **Andrew East** (R-Jr., snapper), **Chase Garnham** (Sr., LB), **Andre Hal** (Sr.,

CB), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT), **Javon Marshall** (R-Sr., safety), **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Walker May** (R-Sr., DE) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK).

Spear becomes the team's first three-year captain since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected from 2003-05. For Johnson, May and Marshall, this marks the second straight year that they will be serving as team captains.

AUSTYN CARTA-SAMUELS, R-Sr., QB

The Wyoming transfer QB is averaging 238.9 passing yards and 252.9 yards of total offense in seven starts. He did not play against Texas A&M.

ANDREW EAST, R-Jr., SN

A two-year starter, East ranks among the SEC's top all-purpose snappers. He serves as the team's primary snapper in all roles.

CHASE GARNHAM, Sr., LB

Ranked among SEC LB leaders in 2012 with seven QB sacks and 12.5 tackles for loss as a junior. He has been out of the lineup since the opener.

ANDRE HAL, Sr., CB

Jim Thorpe Award contender has 29 total tackles, including 3.5 for losses, and a team-high 10 passes defended.

WESLEY JOHNSON, R-Sr., OT

The versatile OL and 2012 Honorable Mention All-SEC selection earned his team-high 45th consecutive career start against Georgia.

JAVON MARSHALL, R-Sr., Safety

The team's co-leading tackler from a year ago, Marshall ranks among the SEC leaders with 29 solo stops and 52 total tackles.

JORDAN MATTHEWS, Sr., WR

The Biletnikoff Award candidate has topped 100 receiving yards in five of seven games, leads the SEC with 66 catches and ranks 3rd with 890 receiving yards.

WALKER MAY, R-Sr., DE

Part of a five-player rotation, May has 1.5 QB sacks to go with 24 total tackles.

CAREY SPEAR, Sr., PK

The senior, coming off the best year ever produced by Vandy kicker, is 6-of-8 on field goals this year, including two of 50 yards or more. He also scored on a TD on a fake FG vs. Georgia.

ROBINETTE, HEAD, MCGASTER NEWEST COMMODORES TO GET FIRST CAREER STARTS

Three redshirt freshmen became the latest Commodores to earn their first career collegiate start against Texas A&M on Oct. 26.

Vanderbilt's newest first-time starters are **Patton Robinette** (QB), **Paris Head** (CB) and **Torren McGaster** (CB).

Robinette was 15-of-28 for 216 yards and a TD vs. the Aggies. Head and McGaster contributed three and two tackles, respectively.

The trio joins 12 other Vanderbilt players who have registered their initial collegiate starts in the first eight games of the season.

Adam Butler (R-Fr., DT), **Steven Clarke** (Sr., CB), **Andrew Jelks** (R-Fr., OL), **Darreon Herring** (So., LB), **Taylor Hudson Jr.**, punter), **Vince Taylor** (R-Jr., DT) and **Kyle Woestmann** (R-Jr., DE) made their first collegiate starts in the opener against Ole Miss.

Jake Sealand (So., LB) earned his first start against Austin Peay, with **Jerron Seymour** (R-So., RB) and **Jordan Cunningham** (Fr., WR) enjoying their first career start at South Carolina. **Larry Franklin** (R-So., LB) also received his first start at UMass, and **Barrett Gouger** (R-Fr., OL) started against Georgia.

Several of the other first-time starters posted superb stats in their first start. Woestmann enjoyed a career performance, contributing a pair of quarterback sacks among seven total tackles, and a quarterback hurry against Ole Miss. Taylor, Clarke, Herring and Hudson also played well against the Rebels: Taylor setting a single-game career high with four total tackles, Clarke notching three tackles and Herring posting five tackles, including a quarterback sack, and two defended passes. Hudson averaged 40.0 yards on five punts against the Rebels.

Sealand had two tackles against Austin Peay. Seymour had 39 rushing yards, including a 1-yard TD rush, vs. South Carolina.

Jelks and Gouger lined up at tackle eligible in their initial starts.

Taylor Hudson (R-So., punter) and **Colby Cooke** (R-Fr., PK) is the only specialists participating for the first time.

Sims has impressed as a big-play kick returner and continues to get action in the Commodore secondary. Cunningham had a team-high seven passes for 67 yards in the win over Austin Peay.

Rayford also posted one catch for 24 yards against the Gobs.

No new true freshmen has played in the team's last four games.

MORE ON COMMODORE O-LINEMAN WESLEY JOHNSON

Vanderbilt All-SEC candidate **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) has started 46 games and played four offensive line positions along with tight end. But here's a few tidbits you probably didn't know about one of the SEC's top linemen.

Here's a few facts about Johnson's impressive Commodore career.

★ Johnson has been flagged for just two holding penalties during his 46-game career.

★ Facing elite SEC players, Johnson has given up just 7.5 sacks on 1,201 career pass attempts, or one sack every 160 pass plays.

★ Johnson did not allow a single QB sack in 2012. He has allowed two sacks this year.

★ Johnson has produced 201 knockdown blocks, 64 intimidation blocks and 124 blocks that led to a Commodore TD or first down.

★ Johnson has been on the field for all but two offensive TDs for the last 3+ seasons.

★ Johnson has played 2,906 career snaps: 2,017 at left tackle, 457 at center, 252 at right tackle, 108 at left guard and 72 at tight end. He has played 98.6 percent of the team's snaps over the last 3+ years.

JOHNSON TEAM'S FIRST SEC POY RECIPIENT THIS YEAR

Wesley Johnson (R-Sr., OT) earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors Oct. 21 for his blocking effort in Vanderbilt's 31-27 victory vs. nationally ranked Georgia.

Johnson, who contributed four blocks that led directly to Commodore touchdowns in the performances, is the first Vanderbilt player this year to earn the SEC weekly recognition.

Johnson has been recognized by the SEC more than any Vanderbilt player. The post-Georgia honor marked the fourth time the SEC has honored Johnson.

COMMODORE OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION REMAINS HIGH; SCORING AVERAGE OUTPACING 2012 TOTALS

Vanderbilt's offensive point production through eight games ranks favorably with the highest season averages in team history.

The Commodores rank eighth in the SEC with a 32.1-point scoring average.

The current scoring average is 2.1 points higher than in 2012 when the Commodores totaled 390 points.

The 30.0-point average in 2012 was the program's highest single-season total since the 1915 Commodore squad averaged 51.4 points.

The increased scoring continues a trend the Commodores started at midseason one year ago. In its last 15 games, the Vanderbilt offense is averaging 36.5 points.

Vanderbilt seniors **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause** rank among the SEC's second most productive receiving tandem.

Collectively, Matthews and Krause are averaging 187.1 receiving yards each game.

The Matthews-Krause duo trails only one receiving tandem in the conference: **Odell Beckham** and **Jarvis Landry** of LSU (210.1 yards). The third ranked tandem is **Mike Evans** and **Malcome Kennedy** of Texas A&M (184.1 yards).

While Matthews ranks No. 1 in the SEC with 66 receptions and third with 890 receiving yards, Krause also is enjoying a break-through season. The three-year starter has established new season highs with 32 catches, 608 receiving yards and three touchdown catches.

SEC career receiving yardage record previously held by former Georgia standout **Terrence Edwards** (1999-2002). He has 3,172 receiving yards.

Matthews is quickly approaching another important SEC career mark. He needs 20 catches to break the existing conference record of 236 receptions held by former Vanderbilt standout **Earl Bennett** (2005-07).

Matthews also set the Vanderbilt team record Oct. 5 against Missouri with his 22nd career touchdown catch.

Matthews, from Madison Academy near Huntsville, Ala., is among the leading contenders for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award. No Commodore has ever won the award, which is given to the nation's leading receiver.

Through eight games, Matthews is on pace to improve on his 2012

totals of 94 catches and a team-record 1,323 receiving yards.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in five games this year, extending his school career record to 15 games of at least 100 receiving yards. He also opened the year with a gutsy 10-catch, 178-yard effort vs. Ole Miss, and added 106 yards at South Carolina.

He has also produced 123 receiving yards against Missouri and 111 yards vs. Austin Peay.

Matthews has been sensational against SEC competition this year. He has 44 catches for 588 receiving yards in five conference games.

Matthews posted staggering numbers during a superb junior campaign when he earned First Team All-SEC and Third Team All-America recognition. Matthews' 94-reception total in 2012 is tied for the second most catches ever by a SEC player. His 1,323 receiving yardage total ranks sixth on the SEC single-season charts.

RARE OFFENSIVE FEAT VS. UAB: 300-YARD PASSER, 100-YARD RUSHER; PAIR OF 100-YARD RECEIVERS

In the 52-24 victory over UAB on Sept. 28, the Commodores achieved a collective offensive feat never witnessed before in program history.

The performance marked the first game ever that the Vanderbilt offense produced a 300-yard passer in **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, 100-yard rusher in **Jerron Seymour** and two 100-yard receivers in **Jordan Matthews** and **Jonathan Krause**.

Carta-Samuels, Seymour and Krause also established new single-game career highs in the outburst.

Vanderbilt has enjoyed previous offensive games with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver, most recently at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2005 when QB **Jay Cutler**, RB **Jeff Jennings** and WR **Erik Davis** accomplished the feat. But the UAB performance was the first when a second receiver surpassed 100 yards.

The individual performances were part of an offense that produced 540 total yards. It was the team's most total offense since a 558-yard performance against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 9, 2010.

A three-year letterwinner from Montgomery Bell Academy in Nashville, Lassing has started five games this season. He is a stellar student in the classroom, working toward a major in economics from the College of Arts of Science. He maintains a 3.9 GPA.

Lassing, the Commodores' starting fullback, was seeking to become Vanderbilt's fifth recipient of the NFF post-graduate scholarship award. Past Vanderbilt recipients are **Hunter Hillenmeyer**, 2002; **Andrew McCarroll**, 1989; **Douglas Martin**, 1974; and **Wade Butcher**, 1961.

FRANKLIN'S COMMODORES ARE 10-1 IN NON-SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE PLAY

Vanderbilt captured its sixth straight regular season win against a non-SEC member when it defeated UAB 52-24 on Sept. 28.

Besides UAB, the 'Dores have 2013 victories against Austin Peay and UMass, and wins last year vs. Presbyterian, UMass and Wake Forest. Vanderbilt also won the 2012 Music City Bowl over N.C. State.

Since James Franklin arrived on campus, the Commodores are 10-1 in regular season action against non-SEC teams, and 11-2 overall against all non-league foes including bowl results. The team's 2011 unblemished out-of-conference mark was Vanderbilt's first since 1994.

In the last decade, VU is 22-14 against regular season non-SEC teams.

SPEAR SETS THIRD TEAM FIELD GOAL RECORD; UNDER CONSIDERATION FOR LOU GROZA AWARD

Coming off the best season ever by a Vandy placekicker, senior **Carey Spear** has continued his excellent form in 2013.

The Groza Award candidate set a school record vs. UAB by becoming the first Vanderbilt kicker to make four field goals of 50 or more yards during his career. His 50-yarder vs. UAB was his second of the year after a 54-yarder at South Carolina. The effort, which had plenty of distance to spare, was Spear's career long and equalled the third longest in team history.

Spear was 1-of-2 vs. Georgia, converting a 40-yarder and missing from 45 yards. He also scored a TD on a fake FG attempt.

Spear, an Associated Press All-SEC recipient in 2012 after setting team records with 20 field goals and 87 points scored by a kicker, is 5-of-7 on FG this year. He was 1-of-2 on FGs vs. Georgia. He also ran for a 3-yard TD on a fake FG against the Bulldogs.

Spear is a two-year starter as the team's placekicker and four-year starter as its kickoff specialist. He is also the first Commodore player to be voted captain for three consecutive seasons since quarterback **Jay Cutler** was selected in 2003-05.

The former prep quarterback is averaging 42.5 yards. He also has a solid net punt average of 39.3 yards. Hudson, named as a Ray Guy Award semifinalist on Oct. 23, averaged 37.4 yards on five punts at Texas A&M.

Hudson has punts of 50 yards or more in five of eight games.

PLAYING ON THURSDAY NIGHTS

Vanderbilt missed a chance to move to .500 all-time on Thursday nights when it lost a thriller to Ole Miss in the opener Aug. 29.

The Ole Miss game marked Vanderbilt's eighth Thursday night appearance, dating back to a 1996 home stint against nationally ranked Notre Dame.

Vanderbilt is now 3-5 in Thursday night games.

The Commodores have opened with SEC opponents on Thursday night the last two years. Both games resulted in narrow losses: 39-35 to Ole Miss this year and 17-13 to South Carolina in 2012.

Vanderbilt student-athletes and coaches, as well as staffers wore "Green Dot" patches at the Aug. 29 opener. Student representatives also handed out "Green Dot" stickers to fans attending the season opener.

"We believe that together we can send a message that we are a caring community that is committed to treating one another with respect and dignity," VSG President Isaac Escamilla said in an email Aug. 28 to fellow students and a letter to *The Hustler* student newspaper.

The green dot is the symbol and name of a national program designed to provide a comprehensive approach to violence prevention that capitalizes on the power of peer and cultural influence.

During the 2013-2014 academic year, all Vanderbilt Athletics teams will wear a green dot on their uniforms during their seasons.

2014 VANDERBILT SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED; EIGHT GAMES ON CAMPUS SLATED

Home games with Ole Miss, South Carolina, Florida and Tennessee will highlight Vanderbilt's 2014 football schedule.

The 2014 Vanderbilt schedule features eight home games, including the first four contests of the season. The 'Dores will conclude the regular season against Tennessee, reviving a season-ending rivalry that existed for 67 years until being interrupted in 2007.

The 2014 season opens against Temple on Thursday, Aug. 28 and is followed by Ole Miss, which will be visiting for the second straight year, on Sept. 6. UMass and South Carolina follow to cap the month-long home stand.

The Commodores then hit the road for back-to-back games against Kentucky and Georgia before returning Oct. 11 to host Charleston Southern.

The opening seven weeks of action is broken Oct. 18 with an open date before traveling to Missouri on Oct. 25. Vanderbilt returns to Nashville Nov. 1 against Old Dominion and Nov. 8 with Florida.

After another open date Nov. 15, the Commodores conclude by going to Mississippi State on Nov. 22 and hosting Tennessee Nov. 29.

DEFENSIVE UNIT PUTS TOGETHER BEST EFFORT OF THE YEAR VS. GEORGIA

The Vanderbilt defense registered its best performance of the year in the 31-27 win over Georgia Oct. 19.

Facing one of the SEC's most potent attacks, the unit held Georgia to season lows in every virtual offensive category, including rushing yards (107), first downs (16), total yards (221) and points scored (27).

Even UGA QB **Aaron Murray**, the league's all-time leader in passing yardage, struggled against the Vanderbilt defense. He threw for only 114 yards, his third lowest total in a 47-game career, and failed to complete a TD pass for just the third time in his last 29 appearances.

Trailing by 10 points at intermission, the 'Dore defense frustrated Murray and the Bulldog offense in the second half. Georgia managed just five first downs and 80 total yards after halftime. The Bulldogs' only second-half points came on a 23-yard field goal.

The 221 yards of total offense was the fewest Vanderbilt has allowed to an SEC opponent since Auburn managed just 212 yards in a 17-13 'Dore victory on Oct. 20, 2012.

The Commodores face an even greater challenge this Saturday when Vanderbilt journeys to play the high-powered Aggies. Fueled by reigning Heisman Trophy winner **Johnny Manziel**, the A&M offense ranks No. 1 in the SEC – and No. 4 in the NCAA – with a 46.9-point scoring average.

QB CARTA-SAMUELS IMPRESSIVE; POSTED CONSECUTIVE 300+YARDS

Austyn Carta-Samuels (R-Sr., QB) ranks among the SEC leaders in passing yards and total offense.

Carta-Samuels, who transferred to Vanderbilt after starting at QB in 2009-10 at the University of Wyoming, is averaging 238.9 passing yards and 252.9 yards of total offense in seven starts. He has also completed 10 TD passes and ran for five more scores. He has been extremely accurate, hitting on 65.5% of his passes.

Carta-Samuels did not play at Texas A&M.

He threw for 338 yards and two TDs against Missouri on Oct. 5, one week after throwing for 334 yards and two TDs in a win over UAB on Sept. 28.

Carta-Samuels opened the season by becoming just the second Commodore QB ever to reach 300 passing yards in the opener vs. Ole Miss. That performance ranked among the best ever by a Vanderbilt QB.

FOUR COMMODORES EARN COACHES' RECOGNITION

For the first time in recent years, three Commodore standouts have earned preseason First-Team All-SEC recognition from the league's 14 head coaches. A fourth Vanderbilt player received second team honors.

The coaches' ballot, the last preseason unit named prior to the season opener, includes **Jordan Matthews** (Sr., WR), **Andre Hal** (Sr., CB) and **Carey Spear** (Sr., PK) as first team recipients. A fourth Commodore, **Wesley Johnson** (R-Sr., OT) also was named as a Second-Team All-SEC member by the coaches.

It marks the most Commodores to be recognized in the coaches' preseason ballot since 2009 when five Vanderbilt players were named.

Vanderbilt's nine wins in 2012 tied the single-season team record that has been accomplished just twice before – in 1915 and 1904.

MAKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES FOR 1ST TIME; THEN WINNING 2012 MUSIC CITY BOWL IN NASHVILLE

Vanderbilt's 8-4 regular season allowed the team to appear in back-to-back postseason bowls for the first time in its 123-year football history. The Commodores made the best of the opportunity, defeating N.C. State 38-24 in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Dec. 31.

SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK TO END THE SEASON

Vanderbilt ended the season riding a seven-game win streak, the team's longest since a similar streak in 1948. The last year Vanderbilt put together six wins to conclude its season was 1948.

UNDEFEATED NOVEMBER

The Commodores were 4-0 in November, beating Kentucky, Ole Miss, Tennessee and Wake Forest by a combined 163-65 margin. It was the first time since 1982 that Vanderbilt enjoyed an undefeated November.

WINNING ON THE ROAD

The Commodores under James Franklin won four road games in the 2012 season, including three in SEC action. This marks the most road victories by a Vanderbilt squad since 1948.

FIVE VICTORIES IN SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt was 5-3 in SEC play last year. The only other Vanderbilt squad to reach five league victories in a season was the 1935 Commodores.

FIVE OFFENSIVE GAMES WITH 40+ POINTS

The Vanderbilt offense tallied more than 40 points against five foes this year. It was the first time since 1915 the Commodores put together that many 40+ point games. The team's 30.0-point average also was the highest season average since World War I.

DECISIVE VICTORIES IN SEC PLAY

Under Franklin, Vanderbilt has won four SEC games by 23 or more points, including Tennessee this year by a 41-18 margin. From 1957-2010, Vanderbilt had four total wins against SEC opponents by 23+ points.

MODERN DAY HIGH: 35 POINTS IN A QUARTER

Vanderbilt's 35-point explosion in the second quarter against Austin Peay appears to be a modern day record for the Commodores.

The Commodores have scored 28 points in a quarter on three times in the last two decades: vs. Massachusetts in 2012, vs. Middle Tennessee State in 2001 and vs. The Citadel in 1999.

VANDERBILT ANNOUNCES FIFTH ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS

Vanderbilt Athletics officials announced the school's fifth Hall of Fame class July 22. The seven-person Class of 2013 was honored Sept. 6-7 on campus.

Six sports are represented in the class, as well as one physician. The class includes: **Billy Joe Adcock** (men's basketball), **Jamie Duncan** (football), **Josie Earnest** (bowling), **Dr. Brant Lipscomb** (team medical consultant), **Carolyn Peck** (women's basketball), **Jess Roguski Onheiser** (lacrosse) and **Jeremy Sowers** (baseball).

BILLY JOE ADCOCK • MEN'S BASKETBALL When Vanderbilt made a decision in the mid-1940s to put more resources into its basketball program, Bob Polk was hired as head coach. His first move was to offer a scholarship to local star Billy Joe Adcock. The rest is history; Adcock became a star on the national level, the school's 1st basketball All-America and three-time All-SEC recipient.

JAMIE DUNCAN • FOOTBALL Jamie Duncan was a high school star in Delaware, recruited by the nation's most powerful programs. It was his family's focus upon education, however, that attracted him to Vanderbilt, where he became an impact player. While he was a central figure in Vanderbilt's outstanding defensive units, his academic journey was not always as smooth but he kept his promise to his mother to earn a degree. He was the 1997 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and two-time All-America.

JOSIE EARNEST • WOMEN'S BOWLING Josie Earnest was the No. 1 recruit in the nation as a senior in Vandalia, Ill., where she often did her homework at her family's bowling center. Her mere presence on a young Vanderbilt bowling program was a catalyst for other future bowling stars. She went on to become the most honored female student-athlete in school history, the only Commodore to be voted her sport's national Player of the Year. She was a four-time All-America.

DR. BRANT LIPSCOMB • DISTINGUISHED SERVICE Dr. Brant Lipscomb was a two-sport star at Vanderbilt prior to World War II but it was his pioneering work and leadership in the field of sports medicine that paved his way into the school's Hall of Fame. "Pinky" Lipscomb was widely regarded as one of the nation's best orthopedic surgeons of his era with patients coming from all corners of the U.S.

JESS ROGUSKI ONHEISER • WOMEN'S LACROSSE A two-time team captain in the early 2000s, Jess Roguski led the Commodores to their first two NCAA tournaments. She ranks in Vanderbilt's all-time Top 10 in goals, points, caused turnovers and draw controls, but her greatest asset may have been the tremendous leadership that was an integral part of Vanderbilt's 2004 run to the NCAA Final Four.

CAROLYN PECK • WOMEN'S BASKETBALL Carolyn Peck came from Jefferson City, Tenn., as a Parade All-American and one of the nation's top recruits. She didn't disappoint, becoming a team leader, key performer and its first All-America candidate. During her time the Lady Commodores won the 1984 WNIT and earned the school's first NCAA Tournament bid. By the time she graduated, Carolyn had helped establish Vanderbilt's program as one of the nation's elite. She won a NCAA national title as head coach at Purdue.

JEREMY SOWERS • BASEBALL Jeremy Sowers was a Kentucky prep phenom who became the first ace of the Tim Corbin Era. The left-hander could have turned pro out of high school as the 20th overall selection by the Reds but was attracted by Vanderbilt's combination of high academics and a quality SEC schedule. He was instrumental in the Vanderbilt's surprising 2004 NCAA Regional Championship and first-ever Super Regional berth. He was a two-time All-SEC recipient and the 6th overall pick of the 2004 MLB Draft.
