What's On Tap

No. 1 Vanderbilt opens Southeastern Conference play this weekend as Ole Miss comes to town for a three-game series. Friday's game is set for a 7 p.m. start, while Saturday's game is at 2 p.m. and Sunday's finale is at 1 p.m. Season tickets are sold out as are single game reserved tickets for Friday and Saturday. General admission tickets will be made available on game day for \$5.

Scouting Ole Miss

Ole Miss is 14-5 on the year after taking two of three against UCLA in Oxford last weekend. The team wrapped out a season high 21 hits in a 14-1 win over Arkansas State on Tuesday.

Junior second baseman Justin Henry leads the team with a .451 batting average and seven stolen bases in nine attempts. His brother Jordan, a freshman outfielder, is right behind him with a .389 average while infielders Andrew Clark and Cody Overbeck are the top power sources with three homers each. As a team Ole Miss is hitting .323 with 13 homers and 104 runs scored in 19 games (5.5 per game).

Junior right-hander Will Kline (3-0, 1.87 ERA) will get the start on Friday night for Mississippi. Sophomore right-hander Lance Lynn (1-2, 2.67 ERA) will take the hill on Saturday, while sophomore southpaw Brett Bukvich (3-1, 2.10 ERA) is expected to start in Sunday's finale. Juco transfer Scott Bittle (1-1, 0.75) is the closer and leads the SEC with six saves in 10 appearances on the year. The sophomore right-hander has 24 strikeouts and only four walks in 12 innings pitched. As a team, Ole Miss sports a 2.33 ERA with 180 strikeouts and 54 walks in 166.0 innings. Of Note: Junior shortstop Zack Cozart, a native of Collierville, Tenn., was a member of the US National Team over the summer coached by Tim Corbin ... The teams last met in the SEC tournament championship game a year ago with the Commodores falling short by a 9-3 count.

Commodores Remain No. 1 For Fourth Straight Week, Off To Best Start Ever

Vanderbilt remained No. 1 in three polls this week Collegiate Baseball, the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. Baseball America and Rivals.com had VU at No. 2 for the second straight week.

The Commodores at 19-0 are off to the best start of any sport in school history, besting the 17-0 start of the 1993 women's basketball team.

The baseball ranking joins women's basketball and women's golf as the only NCAA sports to achieve a No. 1 ranking at Vanderbilt. The 1993 women's hoops squad was ranked No. 1 by the AP for six weeks, including the final regular season poll prior to postseason play. The women's golf team was ranked No. 1 for a time in 2004.

Price Picks Up Third National Pitcher of the Week Honor

For the second straight week, junior lefthander David Price was named one of Collegiate Baseball's National Players of the Week, this time after his 16-strikeout performance against Illinois-Chicago last Friday.

It is the third time this season and sixth time in his career the Murfreesboro native has won the national honor. In addition he picked up SEC Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time this year and sixth time in his career.

Price struck out 16 in a four-hit complete game effort in a 2-1 win over Illinois-Chicago last Friday. He gave up a solo homer in the second, and then retired the next 12 batters, seven via strikeout. After giving up his only walk in the sixth, Price then retired the next seven in order, five by strikeout. Two of the four hits were infield singles in the ninth.

He also earned College Baseball Foundation's Weekly Honor Roll plaudits for the third time.

Matt Meingasner Leads Vanderbilt To 15-7 Win Over Belmont

Matt Meingasner had four hits and six RBI to lead Vanderbilt to a 15-7 win over Belmont Wednesday afternoon at Greer Stadium.

Vanderbilt led 9-2 in the fifth before Belmont scored the next five runs in the game, capped off by a three-run homer by Derek Wiley in the seventh to cut the lead to 9-7.

The Commodores then responded with six runs in the top of the eighth to put the game away. David Macias and Dominic de la Osa had back-to-back walks with two outs and scored on a RBI double by Pedro Alvarez to make it 11-7. Ryan Flaherty walked and both runners advanced on a wild pitch before Shea Robin brought them in with a single up the middle. Andrew Giobbi was hit by a pitch and both runners advanced again on a wild pitch before Meingasner came through with a two-run single to center to make it 15-7.

Meingasner staked VU to a 2-0 lead in the second with a homer to left, his second circuit clout of the year.

Belmont rallied to tie the game in the bottom of the second on a RBI single by Brandon McCall and a RBI groundout by Brady Manifold.

Dominic de la Osa got the lead back in the third with a solo homer to left, his fourth of the year. VU added three more runs in the fourth as Shea Robin, Andrew Giobbi, Matt Meingasner and Alex Feinberg started the inning off with consecutive singles. Brad French reached on a hit by pitch with the bases loaded and David Macias added a groundout RBI to make it 6-2.

The Doers added three more in the fifth to make it 9-2. Meingasner had a RBI single and Brad French added a two-run double to key the inning.

Shea Robin had three hits and Alex Feinberg had two to help lead the way.

Cody Crowell (1-0) pitched 1.2 innings of scoreless relief with two strikeouts to pick up his first win of the year. Mike Minor gave up two runs on four hits in four innings in the start with one strikeout and two walks.

David Macias, Brian Harris, Pedro Alvarez, Ryan Flaherty and Shea Robin each had two hits on the day.

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt's 19-0 start is the best start of any VU sport in school history, besting the 17-0 start of the 1993 women's basketball team ... The Commodores won the regular season series last year for the second straight year against Ole Miss, prior to that OM had won seven straight series dating back to 1997 ... Andrew Giobbi has a nine-game hitting streak going into the series, the longest on the team ... Clutch hitting has been the trademark this season as the team has 69 two-out RBIs (out of a possible 140), including eight in the 15-7 win over Belmont on Wednesday ... All four Vanderbilt starting pitchers have ERAs under 2.60 and are a combined 14-0 ... Shea Robin has thrown out seven of 12 base runners on the season ... With 16 strikeouts last week David Price became only the third pitcher in VU history to break the 300 strikeout mark in their careers. Mike Willis struck out 350 in four seasons from 1969-72, Jeremy Sowers struck out 327 in his three years from 2002-04 ... Last week, the team sported a 2.00 ERA this week with 44 strikeouts and nine walks in 36 innings ... Offensively the squad hit .326 with 12 doubles, a triple, two homers and 12 runs scored in the four games ... VU starters picked up all four wins on the week ... Freshman Mike Minor gave up two runs in 5.2 innings against Western Kentucky, David Price pitched a complete game, allowing a run with 16 strikeouts against Illinois-Chicago, Nick Christiani pitched 7.1 shutout innings against UIC on Saturday, and Brett Jacobson allowed a run in six innings of work on Sunday ... Casey Weathers, Ty Davis, Stephen Shao and Tyler Rhoden did not allow an earned run in six innings of relief work ... Alex Feinberg got back on track at the plate, as his average jumped from .286 at the start of the week to .349 entering the weekend. He was 6-for-11 (.545) with three doubles and three runs scored last week ... Shea Robin raised his average from .250 to .302 after going 5-for-14 with two doubles and four RBI last week and recording three hits on Wednesday ... David Macias went 6-for-16 (.375) with two RBI ... Dominic de la Osa was 5-for-13 (.385) with a homer and two RBI ... Junior Adam Cronk belted his first career homer in Sunday's 14-5 win ... The Commodores recorded a season high 18 hits in Sunday's game ... UIC's six runs on the weekend all came via homer, two solo shots and a grand-slam ... Vanderbilt has come from behind in 10 of 19 games.

Record Watch

Two Vanderbilt records worth watching this season are the school's career strikeout mark and the career homer mark. With 16 strikeouts against Illinois-Chicago last Friday, David Price vaulted into third place on the career list with 304. He trails record holder Mike Willis by 46 strikeouts and second place Jeremy Sowers by 23. With seven homers this year, Pedro Alvarez moved into a tie with Jeff Martin for 10th on the homer list with 29.

Commodores Picked To Finish Second in SEC East By Coaches

Southeastern Conference coaches predicted Vanderbilt to finish second in the Eastern Division in a vote done prior to the season.

Two of the 12 league coaches voted the Commodores as their pick to win the regular season championship. South Carolina received seven of the 12 championship votes in the poll and Arkansas received three votes.

The Gamecocks received 63 of a possible 66 points to win the Eastern Division, while the Commodores were second with 54 points.

Arkansas was the unanimous predicted winner in the Western Division with a total of 66 points. Ole Miss, last season's SEC Tournament champion, was second with 53, while Alabama finished third with 47.

Price Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

David Price was named to the preseason Roger Clemens Award Watch List, recognizing the top pitcher in college baseball.

Price was a three-time National Pitcher of the Week honoree in 2006 and finished the year with a 9-5 record and a school record 155 strikeouts in 110.1 innings. His 12.6 strikeouts per nine innings was third best nationally and No. 1 in the SEC. He was named BA's Summer Player of the Year after going 5-1 with a 0.20 ERA with 61 strikeouts and only seven walks in 44.0 innings for Team USA. He is widely considered to be among the top prospects in next June's amateur baseball draft.

The finalists for the 2007 Roger Clemens Award will be selected in voting by a national panel that includes: all Division I head baseball coaches, a selection of national media who cover collegiate baseball, the 16 winners of the R. E. "Bob" Smith Award, which was presented to the top player in the country in Houston in 1988-2003.

In addition, the 10 previous finalists for the Clemens Award are also issued ballots. The 2007 award will be presented at a gala dinner next July. The event is administered by the Greater Houston Baseball Association, which has donated more than \$300,000 to the charities from the net proceeds from the first three dinners.

Price and Alvarez Named Preseason All-Americans

Sophomore third baseman Pedro Alvarez and junior pitcher David Price continue to pick up preseason plaudits as both were named first-team preseason All-Americans by Baseball America and Rivals.com this week. Both players also picked up preseason All-American honors by Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Alvarez finished the 2006 season with a .329 batting average to go along with a school record 22 homers and 64 RBI. His homer total was third most nationally and second best in the Southeastern Conference. Alvarez had a torrid summer with the USA Baseball National Team that captured a gold medal at the World University Championships in Cuba. The New York City resident led the collegiate all-star squad with a .379 batting average to go along with five homers, 12 doubles and 43 RBI. Baseball America listed him as the No. 2 prospect off of the USA team that was coached by Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin.

In four seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has raised expectations of the baseball program into one that is expected to be among the nations best on an annual basis.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

This past summer he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba in August. The .919 winning percentage was the highest ever for a national team and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee in September.

Those results were probably to be expected, as Corbin has taken Vanderbilt to heights it has rarely seen in its long baseball history.

His overall record of 144-95 (.602) is the fourth best in terms of wins, and first in terms of win percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

Last year he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters either freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

With virtually the entire team back, Corbin knows the expectations are there to build upon that success and take the Commodores to their first College World Series in school history. It is a goal that he and his coaching staff are determined to achieve in the near future.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a brand new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. These recent upgrades reinforce the excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers two decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay off last fall as the 2005 recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by Baseball America.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 29 players have been drafted over the last three years including 13 in 2005.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up a school-record 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State

for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.

That squad set school records for fielding percentage (.972), fewest errors in a season (60), most saves in a season (15) and fewest walks allowed in a season (168) — all of which were bettered in 2004. Three different players earned conference Player of the Week honors (the most for VU in a single season), and the team notched series victories over nationally-ranked conference foes LSU, Auburn and Florida, each of which was ranked among the top 15 at the time.

Plus, on May 6, 2003, Vanderbilt recorded the first perfect game in school history, which was a collective effort instead of the product of one dominant player on the mound. Four different pitchers contributed to the 4-0 victory over Western Kentucky University.

Corbin came to Vanderbilt following nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson.

During his time there (1994-2002) the Tigers had more victories than all but four programs. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and reached the College World Series four times (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002). The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin was head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. There he restarted a baseball program that laid dormant for several years. He directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to NCAA Division II status and had a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, the Blue Hose made three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93), and Corbin earned South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.
