TEAM NOTES

Bull's-Eye: Division II Bulletin ranked Bellarmine 13th in its preseason poll. The Knights are the highest-rated team from the Great Lakes Valley Conference, which also features Lewis (No. 15) and Drury (No. 19) among the top 25. DII Bulletin chose Bellarmine as the favorite to win the GLVC East Division.

Feeling the Love: In addition to the high regard from DII Bulletin, Bellarmine has been chosen by the GLVC's coaches as the preseason favorite to win the East Division. The Knights received 10 first-place votes and garnered 115 total points in the poll to edge Lewis, which raked in six top votes and 110 points.

Front and Center: Bellarmine's Sarah Galvin was named as a preseason All-American by DII Bulletin and tabbed as its favorite to capture GLVC Player of the Year accolades. The senior forward last season earned first-team All-GLVC and All-Midwest Region plaudits while also claiming GLVC Tournament MVP honors. In the conference tournament, she averaged 22.3 points and 9.7 rebounds while shooting 54.3 percent from the floor. In the title game, she racked up 25 points on 10-of-14 shooting with nine rebounds in an 89-78 triumph over No. 22 Quincy.

Trio Returns Intact: Senior forward Sarah Galvin, junior guard Raven Merriweather and senior guard Destony Curry were each selected to the All-GLVC teams last season and all are back with the Knights this season. Galvin was a unanimous first-team selection, Merriweather made the second team and Curry was chosen to the third team. It was the first time since 2008-09 that the Knights had at least three players on the all-conference teams.

Back for More: Bellarmine returns 88.4 percent of its scoring from last season, including its top six point producers in Sarah Galvin (17.8), Raven Merriweather (9.5), Whitney Hartlage (8.9), Destony Curry (8.9), Beth Bowers (7.7) and Kelsey Adwell (6.6). All six are upperclassmen.

Put a Bing on it: Former University of Louisville standout and WNBA draft pick Candyce Bingham has joined Bellarmine's coaching staff as an assistant. Bingham was a graduate assistant at Louisville under Jeff Walz in the 2012-13 season when the Cardinals advanced to the finals of the NCAA Tournament for the second time in program history. As a senior at Louisville in the 2008-09 season, Bingham earned first-team All-BIG EAST accolades after averaging 12.5 points and 7.3 rebounds per game. Starting every game, she helped guide the Cardinals to a

34-5 record that included victories over No. 1 seeds Maryland and Oklahoma in the NCAA Tournament en route to a first-ever title game appearance against Connecticut.

A Welcome Return: Last season, Bellarmine made its 15th appearance in the DII NCAA Tournament but first since 2008. Bellarmine's deepest run in the NCAA Tournament occurred in 1994, when the Knights advanced to the Final Four. Bellarmine also advanced to the Elite Eight in 1986, 1990 and 1991. The Knights earned berths in the NCAA Tournament seven times in the 1990s, missing the cut only in 1992, 1995 and 1998.

Landmark Title: With its 89-78 victory over Quincy last season, Bellarmine captured its first GLVC Tournament championship since the conference tourney's inception in the 1997-98 season. The title appearance was the first for the Knights since 1999 when they fell 74-72 to Northern Kentucky. Bellarmine emphatically ended a long dry spell of achieving victory in the GLVC Tournament — BU had not won there since a 68-55 quarterfinals victory over SIU Edwardsville in 2007. Bellarmine's most recent championship marked its fourth "GLVC title." Before the GLVC Tournament was instituted, the Knights were credited with conference titles in 1986, 1994 and 1996.

History Made: By finishing with a 24-4 record last season, Bellarmine tied the best winning percentage (85.7) in program history. The Knights also went 24-4 in 1995-96. Bellarmine finished one victory shy of tying the most wins in program history as the Knights tallied 25 in 1989-90, 1990-91 and 1993-94.

Top of the Heap: At the conclusion of last season's GLVC Tournament, Bellarmine ranked first in the conference in a slew of categories, including assists (16.7 per game), steals (9.9), offensive rebounding (14.4), three-point percentage defense (26.3) and turnover margin (plus-3.2).

WBCA Ranking: Bellarmine entered the NCAA Tournament last season with its highest national ranking of the season at No. 20. The Knights were ranked in the top 25 on four other occasions, placed at No. 24 or 25 each time.

Titles Guiding Two Teams: Coach Chancellor Dugan won her first GLVC Tournament title at Bellarmine last season, but it was her second overall. She led Southern Indiana to the 1997-98 title in the inaugural year of the conference tourney.

Bellarmine Women's Basketball
Head Coach

On June 22, 2012, Chancellor Dugan became the sixth head coach in Bellarmine University women's basketball history and, in her fourth season, guided the Knights to their first-ever Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament title.

In 2015-16, Dugan's squad returned to the prominence not witnessed in the program since the 1990s, tying the program record for best win percentage in a season (85.7) after finishing 24-4. The Knights' 15-3 mark in the GLVC tied its best output among its 18-game conference seasons. Dugan guided BU to an unprecedented GLVC Tournament championship after her squad upset No. 10 Drury, 80-77, in the semifinals and claimed the title with an 89-78 victory over No. 22 Quincy in the finals. That set the stage for a Selection Sunday in which it was announced that Bellarmine earned its first NCAA Tournament berth since 2008. The Knights entered the Big Dance ranked 20th in the nation.

Dugan made an immediate impact on the team in her first season. Inheriting a program coming off two losing seasons, she turned the Knights around in 2012-13 and led the team to a 19-11 record that included a 10-1 start to her tenure. Dugan has guided BU into the GLVC Tournament in each season of her term and overseen seven All-GLVC selections, including 2014-15 co-Freshman of the Year Raven Merriweather.

Dugan, a Sacred Heart Academy graduate, spent 13 seasons as head coach at Division I Florida Atlantic University before taking the helm at Bellarmine. At FAU, she led the Owls to their respective conference postseason tournament each year. In 2005-06, FAU captured the Atlantic Sun championship and earned the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to her stint at FAU, Dugan was head coach at GLVC rival University of Southern Indiana, where she coached the Screaming Eagles to four NCAA Tournament appearances in eight seasons from 1991-99 including an appearance in the 1997 NCAA Division II national championship game. Dugan guided USI to a 30-2 record in 1997 that included 29 straight wins.

In 1997-98, Dugan picked up GLVC Coach of the Year honors for the second consecutive season, leading USI to another regular-season title and capturing the inaugural GLVC Tournament at Roberts Stadium in Evansville, Indiana.

Dugan's players have accumulated a combined eight first-team all-conference (GLVC, TAAC/Atlantic Sun, Sun Belt) selections, 12 second team, 13 third team/honorable mention, four conference Players of the Year, one Defensive Player of the Year and two Freshman of the Year awards.

A four-year letter winner for Eastern Kentucky University (1978-82), Dugan was a three-year starter and finished her junior and senior seasons as the Lady Colonels' leading rebounder and second-leading scorer. She earned a bachelor of science in physical education from EKU and a master of arts in physical education from Morehead State University.
